Hamas' Armed Wing Claims 'Large Rocket Barrage' Fired At Tel Aviv

CAIRO/ JERUSALEM: Hamas said it launched missiles at Tel Aviv on Sunday, prompting sirens to sound in the Israeli city for the first time in four months as the Palestinian group sought to show military strength despite Israel's Gaza offensive.



The Israeli military said eight projectiles were identified crossing from the area of Rafah, the southern tip of the Gaza Strip where Israel kept up operations despite a ruling by the top UN court ordering it to stop attacking the city.

On Sunday, Israeli strikes killed at least five Palestinians in Rafah, according to local medical services.

The Israeli military said a number of the projectiles were intercepted. Israeli emergency services said they had received no reports of casualties.

Israeli tanks have probed around the edges of the city, close to the main southern crossing point into Egypt, but have not yet entered the city in force.

In a statement on its Telegram channel, the Hamas al-Qassam Brigades said the rockets were launched in response to "Zionist massacres against civilians".

Following the rocket salvo, Israel's headline public security minister Itamar Ben Gvir - who is not part of Israel's war cabinet - urged the army to hit Rafah harder.

Hamas-affiliated Al-Aqsa TV said the rockets were launched from the Gaza Strip.

Nearly 36,000 Palestinians have been killed in Israel's offensive, Gaza's health ministry says. Israel launched the operation after Hamas-led fighters attacked southern Israeli communities on Oct 7, killing around 1,200 people and seizing more than 250 hostages, according to Israeli tallies.

Rafah is located about 100 km (60 miles) south of Tel Aviv.

Efforts to agree a halt to the fighting and return more than 100 hostages still held in Gaza have been blocked for weeks but there were some signs of movement following meetings between Israeli and US intelligence officials and the prime minister of Qatar.

Israel says it wants to root out Hamas fighters holed up in Rafah and rescue hostages it says are being held in the area, but its assault has worsened the plight of civilians and caused an international outcry.

An official with knowledge of the matter said a decision had been taken to resume the talks this week based on new proposals from Egyptian and Qatari mediators, and with "active US involvement".

RAWALPINDI: Two soldiers, including a captain of the Pakistan Army, embraced martyrdom during an intelligence-based operation conducted by the security forces in Peshawar district's Hassan Khel area on Sunday, said the military's media wing in a statement.

These key findings were revealed in the Q1 2024 Security Report issued by Centre for Research and Security Studies (CRSS), detailing that the country witnessed at least 432 violence-linked fatalities and 370 injuries among civilians, security personnel and outlaws resulting from as many as 245 incidents of terror attacks and counter-terror operations.

A statement issued by the Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR) said that the operation was launched on the "reported presence of terrorists" in the area.

Among the 432 fatalities, 281 included that of civilians and security forces personnel. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Urges Afghanistan To Extradite TTP Terrorists Involved In Besham Attack

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Sunday demanded that Afghanistan take "action" against the terror group Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), including its so-called leader, for its role in recent terrorist attacks in the country, including a suicide bombing of a vehicle carrying Chinese nationals in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa's Besham.



"We demand that the interim Taliban government arrest the TTP leaders, including its chief, Noor Wali Mehsud and hand them over to Pakistan in order to maintain friendly relations between the two countries," Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi told a press conference in Lahore, along with senior security officials.

The Chinese engineers were en route to their camp in Dasu - the district headquarters of the Upper Kohistan district of K-P - from Islamabad. Their vehicle was hit by an explosive-laden vehicle, coming from the opposite direction, near Lahore Naha on the Karakoram Highway.

On March 26, a vehicle-borne suicide bomber targeted a convoy escorting Chinese engineers in the remote Besham area of Khy-

ber-Pakhtunkhwa, killing six people, including the vehicle driver.

ence of this," he said. Naqvi expressed serious concerns about the use of Afghan soil for attacks on Chinese nationals. "This is a matter of grave concern for us," he stated.

The interior minister said that Pakistan has raised the issue with Afghanistan's interim government, urging them to take action against these terrorists, but so far, there has been no positive response.

In light of these attacks, the minister said that Pakistan has intensified border surveillance, although terrorists still manage to find ways to infiltrate. "The government of Pakistan is well aware of the forces trying to undermine Pakistan-China relations," Naqvi noted.

He added that Pakistan has implemented new standard operating procedures (SOPs) and is enforcing them strictly, "We are taking all possible measures to ensure the safety of Chinese nationals." —RT/Agency

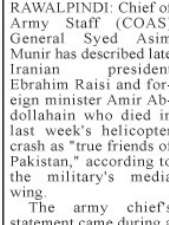

Conflict Erupts In PPP District Badin As Information Secretary Attacks UC President

BADIN: A significant altercation occurred in Badin yesterday when the Information Secretary of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) district Badin allegedly attacked the Union Council (UC) President in the presence of a party MNA and MPA. The incident took place at the residence of Sardar Haji Rasool Baksh Chaudhry, where several party leaders and workers had gathered.

MNA Haji Muhammad Ramzan Chaudhry and Taluka President Taj Muhammad Mallah were present when the fight erupted. The UC President, Sardar Haji Rasool Baksh Chaudhry, expressed his grievances over the recent appointment of Mir Mallah as the UC President of Muhammad Khan Bhurgari, which occurred during a program attended by the Chief Minister of Sindh in Hyderabad. Chaudhry argued that he was the rightful

president and that his replacement violated party protocols.

Dada Abro, the Information Secretary, denied the allegations, calling them a pre-planned conspiracy. The situation escalated into a physical confrontation, but other PPP leaders and workers intervened to prevent further violence.

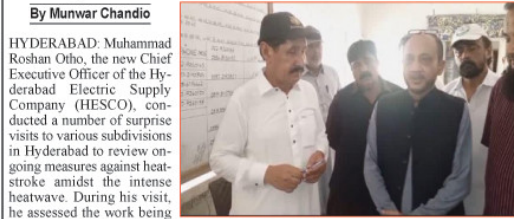
After the incident, Mr. Abro spoke to journalists, asserting that PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari had directed that development schemes should be managed by the presidents of all union councils. Abro accused a particular faction within the party of plotting to undermine his position and corrupt the party. He specifically mentioned Rafiq Jamali, brother-in-law of the Mir Mallah group, as being illegitimately appointed as president without proper procedure.

Abro filed a written complaint to the district and taluka presidents, alleging that Mir Mallah and Murtaza Jamali had threatened him, subjected him to severe violence, and attempted to kill him. He appealed to PPP Sindh President Nisar Ahmad Khuro and Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, emphasizing his long-standing loyalty to the party and decrying the humiliation and violence he faced in the presence of senior party members.

In response to the allegations, PPP leader Mir Mallah downplayed the incident, describing it as an internal party matter and not uncommon in PPP meetings. Despite the gravity of the situation, no official statement has been issued by the PPP leadership regarding the resolution of this conflict.

The incident underscores the internal strife and factionalism within the party, raising concerns about the stability and unity of the PPP in the Badin district.

HESCO CEO Reviews Anti-Heatstroke Measures During Surprise Visit To Hyderabad Subdivisions

HYDERABAD: Muhammad Roshan Otho, the new Chief Executive Officer of the Hyderabad Electric Supply Company (HESCO), conducted a number of surprise visits to various subdivisions in Hyderabad to review ongoing measures against heatstroke amidst the intense heatwave. During his visit, he assessed the work being carried out at the Latifabad Rizvi Subdivision and commended the dedication of HESCO officers and staff who were diligently performing their duties despite the extreme heat and it being a holiday.

CEO Otho issued directives to all the officers concerned to promptly address any issues related to faulty transformers or feeders in any subdivision, ensuring full relief to citizens. He emphasized the urgent repair of burnt-out transformers and made it clear that electricity theft would not be tolerated, warning that legal action would be taken against any-

Five Abducted Bank Employees Return Home

KANDHKOT: In a significant development, five employees of a micro-finance bank, who had been kidnapped from the Indus Highway last month, have safely returned home, it was reported on Sunday.

The return of the abducted employees has brought immense relief and joy to their families, who had been living in a state of constant fear and uncertainty. The families expressed their happiness and gratitude upon the return of their loved ones. Interestingly, the police appeared to be unaware of the return of the kidnapped employees, raising questions about their role and awareness in the matter.

Earlier, the families of the victims had revealed that the kidnapers had contacted them, demanding a ransom of Rs8 million for the release of the hostages. This revelation had added to the distress of the families, who were already grappling with the loss and uncertainty of their loved ones' whereabouts.

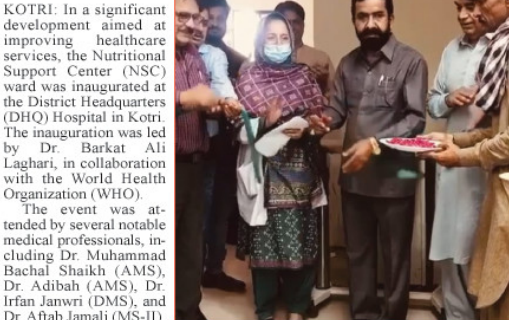
Sources have indicated that the release of the abducted individuals was facilitated by the involvement of political and tribal influential persons, along with the payment of the abandoned ransom. The specifics of the negotiations and the role of these influential figures remain unclear, but their involvement was crucial in securing the safe return of the bank employees.

The relatives of the kidnapped bank employees had previously taken to protesting by blocking a section of the Indus Highway in Kashmir. They expressed their frustration and anger over the police's failure to recover their loved ones. The protesters highlighted that the victims, Altaf Ahmad Golo, Alam Golo, Gulab Dahani, Farman Ali Langahi, and Shah Nawaz Nasseerani, who were working as recovery officers for the micro-finance bank, were abducted by bandits and taken to a riverine area (riverine forests) of Sindh has long been a notorious safe haven for criminals. These areas have recently seen an uptick in criminal activities, with bandits becoming increasingly bold in challenging authorities and engaging in kidnappings for ransom and other violent crimes. Despite the grave threat posed by these criminals to the safety and security of adjacent areas and inter-provincial traffic, the authorities have yet to effectively address and eliminate the menace. The return of the bank employees is a rare piece of positive news in an otherwise grim situation.

However, it underscores the need for a more robust and effective response from law enforcement agencies to tackle the rampant criminal activities in the katcha areas and ensure the safety of citizens.—RT

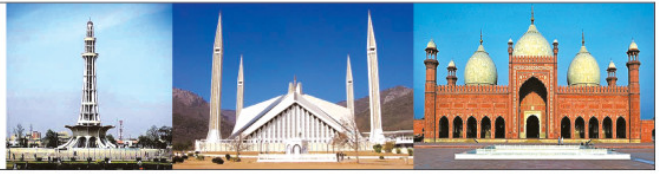

PTI's Yasmin Rashid Returns To Kot Lakhpat Jail Amid Controversy Over Early Discharge

LAHORE: PTI Punjab President Yasmin Rashid was discharged from Lahore's Services Hospital on Sunday after doctors were "pressured" to do so by a senior police officer, her lawyer Rana Mudassar alleged.

Rashid was hospitalised on Wednesday after she fell sick in Kot Lakhpat Jail, allegedly due to the lack of timely treatment.

She has been in prison for almost a year now in connection with multiple cases against her regarding the events of May 9, 2023, when nationwide protests and riots broke out after ex-prime minister Imran Khan's arrest.

Rashid was first detained on May 12 last year under the Maintenance of Public Order Ordinance and re-arrested the next day for alleged involvement in the May 9 riots.

On Wednesday, Rashid's lawyer had alleged that the 72-year-old senior PTI leader, who is a cancer survivor, was not provided treatment by jail authorities the previous day despite continuous vomiting and stomach issues.

Mudassar alleged today that neither Rashid's lawyers nor her family were allowed to meet her after she was hospitalised.

He told media that his client had been kept in a "very uncomfortable place" at the hospital. He said that Rashid had been incarcerated for the last one year but had only experienced back problems once during this time.



He alleged that the bed at the hospital was "uncomfortable and broken" and the conditions had aggravated her back pain.

Mudassar said that doctors had said Rashid was required to remain in the hospital for "another two to three days as further investigations were needed as the infection was major".

He added that while the PTI leader's condition was comparatively better, doctors had advised further tests.

"She was under treatment when, suddenly, it was reported yesterday that a journalist came to meet her on their own [...] it is not in our knowledge how they met," he said.

"I have come to know through various family and hospital sources that the deputy inspector general operations took [the matter] very seriously and aggressively, and 'managed' the doctors - more so pressurised (sic) rather than managed as the doctors were saying 'we will keep her for two to three days more' [...]. So today, despite it being a holiday, doctors called them in the morning at 8am and discharged her," he said.

The lawyer further said that they had waited for quite some time so that Rashid could be taken back in an ambulance but the officials "put her in the same van that was parked in the scorching sunlight and took her [back to jail]."

The lawyer lamented that the PTI leader was not being given her "basic rights", saying that it was the state's responsibility to do so.

He highlighted that Rashid's family was also concerned about her well-being and if she would be kept jailed in the same conditions, which may lead to a repeat of such an illness and "could potentially be deadly".

"Doctors are of the same opinion that taking care of her is very important," he said.

It should be noted that Rashid is on a judicial remand, which means that it is the Kot Lakhpat Jail's administration - and not the police - that is responsible for her custody.—RT/Agency

UK Scientists Plan Seabed Explosions To Solve Mystery Of Missing Flight MH370

Ten years after the disappearance of Malaysia Airlines Flight MH370, researchers at Cardiff University have come up with a new plan to crack the mystery. According to Metro, researchers believe audio signals captured at a hydroacoustic station off the coast of Australia could be key to locating MH370.



Notably, when an aircraft crashes into the water, it creates distinct acoustic signatures that can travel over 3,000km through the water. Dr Usama Kadri, a Reader at Cardiff University's School of Mathematics, explained that their analysis revealed clear pressure signals from previous aircraft crashes detected on hydrophones, even at distances exceeding 3,000 km.

The details of the Cardiff team's research were published in the journal Scientific Reports. The study was conducted based on more than 100 hours of data recorded by hydrophones following ten past aeroplane crashes including one submarine disappearance.

"In the case of MH370, official investigations concluded the aircraft must have crashed near the 7th arc - the point at which the last communication between the plane and INMERSAT occurred. The main search area at the 7th arc lies less than 2,000km away from the hy-

droacoustic station at Cape Leeuwin, Australia, with no impediments to filter out the signal. However, within the time frame and location suggested by the official search, only a single, relatively weak signal was identified," Dr Kadri said.

The team has proposed a series of controlled underwater explosions or air gunfire along the 7th arc to see whether they can isolate a more precise location for MH370.

"Similar exercises were performed in the search and rescue mission for the ARA San Juan, a submarine that vanished off the coast of Argentina in 2017. This shows us that it is relatively straightforward and feasible and could provide a means to determine the signal's relevance to MH370, prior to resuming with another extensive search. If found to be related, this would significantly narrow down, almost

pinpoint, the aircraft's location," Dr Kadri added.

Notably, flight MH370 with 227 passengers and 12 crew members on board disappeared after leaving Kuala Lumpur Airport in southern Malaysia en route to Beijing, China, on March 8, 2014. A nearly three-year search covering 120,000 square kilometres in the Indian Ocean found hardly any trace of the plane, with only some pieces of debris picked up. Despite the largest search in aviation history, the plane has never been found and the operation was suspended in January 2017.

However, following a renewed interest in the MH370 mystery, the Malaysian government announced on March 3 that they're considering resuming the search. A Texas-based company, Ocean Infinity, also proposed a "no find, no fee" deal to locate the aircraft.—Agency

4-Year-Old Emirati Girl Forgotten On School Bus By Staff: "Lucky To Get Our Child Alive"



A four-year-old girl in Sharjah was left alone on the school bus after the staff forgot to drop her off. According to the Khaleej Times, the girl, who fell asleep, was discovered crying by the bus conductor during the second trip taken by the bus for boys.

The girl was on the bus from 6 to 8:40 am and later became ill, following which she was taken to a hospital for a check-up.

Fortunately, the girl survived without any harm.

However, the girl's mother is now advising other parents to stay vigilant and regularly talk to bus drivers and conductors regarding their child's safety.

"At 7:30 am, the conductor called to inform me that my child fell asleep, was left behind on the bus, and couldn't reach the classroom. I told him to immediately drop her home, but he didn't.

It was only when I called her teacher that she came to know about the incident. We rushed to the school by 8.15

am, but my daughter hadn't reached the classroom or school yet," the girl's mother recalled her incident.

"My daughter said her head banged against the front seat. And as she woke up, there were all the big students, i.e. boys and senior students of the second trip. It was only when she started crying that the conductor realised she was left inside and then called me," she added.

The girl's parents have now withdrawn her from the school and complained to the local authorities, complaining that the staff downplayed it as a minor incident.

"I can't find the heart to send her to school until she is a bit older to look after herself.

I have studied in the same school, but I never expected my daughter to be treated this way.

Our trust has been broken. We are lucky to get our child alive; I pray no other parents and child undergo such a miserable situation," the woman further said.—Agency

"They're Coming In Coffins": Israeli Hostage Families Mourn Dead

Tel Aviv: The sister of an Israeli hostage whose body was recovered from Gaza last week struck a solemn tone Sunday as she laid him to rest after thousands attended his funeral.



"I feared this ending but I wanted so much for it to end differently," Avivit Yablonka told AFP at the funeral of her brother Chanan.

Chanan, 42, was murdered on October 7 in Hamas's unprecedented attack, while trying to escape from the Nova music festival where at least 364 people were killed.

His body was taken to the Gaza Strip by militants but was retrieved on Friday by Israeli troops after spending 230 days in captivity.

In the space of a week, the Israeli army has announced the death of eight hostages who had been presumed to be alive - five Israelis, two Thais and a French-Mexican dual national.

The army also retrieved seven bodies - including Chanan's - that had been held in Gaza since October 7.

Hopes have since faded among the families of other hostages whose whereabouts are unknown. Militants took 252 hostages during the attack, 121 of whom remain in Gaza, according to 37 Israeli army says are dead.

Dozens of hostage relatives gathered outside the home of Chanan's parents Sunday for a silent procession to Tel Aviv's Kiryat Shaal cemetery, accompanied by thousands waving Israeli flags. The Yablonka family had urged people to join the march in solidarity with the hostages.

"We have to bring everyone back - this march is for him and for the release of all the hostages," Avivit said.

The war in Gaza broke out after Hamas's attack on southern Israel, which resulted in the deaths of more than 1,170 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli official figures.

Israel's retaliatory offensive has killed at least 35,984 people in Gaza, mostly civilians, according to the Hamas-run territory's health ministry. Before she learned of her brother's death, Avivit, 48, attended the funeral of Ron Benjamin, who was found in the same tunnel complex in northern Gaza as her brother, according to the army.—Agency

KARACHI: The International Cricket Council (ICC) has confirmed that it would set up a fan park at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium to allow fans to enjoy the highly-anticipated T20 World Cup 2024 match between India and Pakistan while being 11,000 kilometres away from the match being played in New York's Nassau County International Cricket Stadium.

The ICC's decision will allow fans to feel the game's intensity and cheer for the Green Shirts via a big screen at the Rawalpindi stadium on June 9.

The match between arch-rivals will be shown at 10 different fan parks including Cedar Creek Park in Seaford, New York, hosted by Nassau County and the Indira Gandhi Indoor Arena in New Delhi, India.

The fan park in Rawalpindi will open for fans 90 minutes before the

start of the game and will remain open until 60 minutes after the end of the play.

"The ICC has announced a record number of fan parks to broadcast the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 with nine live sites in five different countries," read a statement released by the ICC.

The move, as per the international body, will bring the biggest cricket carnival to more communities than ever before in ICC World Cup history.

As many as 22 World Cup matches, the ICC said, will be shown in various locations including New York City, New Delhi, and Rawalpindi - the highest number of fan parks for an ICC World Cup ever. "The parks will feature live entertainment such as DJs, food and drink outlets, cricket ambassadors, and family activities, making it an unmissable experience for fans across the globe," the statement added.—Agency

PSG win French Cup final on Mbappe's farewell appearance

The most successful side in the history of the French Cup, PSG have now won the



trophy 15 times, including seven times in the last decade and four since Mbappe signed from Monaco as a teenager in 2017.

The victory allowed PSG to complete a domestic league and cup double in Luis Enrique's first season as coach, although the campaign remains overshadowed by their exit from the Champions League in the semi-finals against Borussia Dortmund.

"We played the final very well. We played with great intensity and were great on the ball," said Luis Enrique.

"I think we have had a very good season. We would

Ramiz Raja labels Saim Ayub 'undercooked' as opener



KARACHI: Former Pakistan captain Ramiz Raja has slammed opening batter Saim Ayub for his inconsistent performance and labelled him 'undercooked' after the Green Shirts' loss against England in the second T20I.

Saim Ayub continued his poor run, falling for only two runs while chasing 184. He has scored 286 runs in 19 T20I innings so far at a strike-rate of 127.67.

Speaking on his YouTube channel, Ramiz Raja questioned Ayub's place as an opener and urged Pakistan to revert to the opening pair of Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan.

"First, Saim Ayub coming as an opener. I don't think Pakistan should continue with Saim. He has been given too many chances and you have to do better in [international] cricket. He is undercooked," said Raja.

"You need to revert to the opening pair of Mohammad

Rizwan and Babar Azam because that is Pakistan's strength and they understand each other's game. The entire combination has been disturbed due to Saim."

The former chairman also advised pace bowler Shaheen Afridi to develop more variations to put more pressure on the batters irrespective of the conditions.

"Second, Shaheen Shah Afridi's bowling. Look if the ball isn't swinging and he bowls at full length, then he gets bashed," he added.

"He needs to develop length ball and change of pace especially when he is not getting much from the pitch. Even today, he didn't bowl perfectly with the new ball and [England] escaped pressure." Ramiz Raja also raised concerns over Azam Khan's batting against pace bowlers, stating that he needs to improve otherwise teams will exploit this weakness and will further trouble him.—Agency

Barca avenge Lyon defeats to win third women's Champions League

SPAIN: Aitana Bonmati and Alexia Putellas struck to earn Barcelona their third women's Champions League trophy, securing a 2-0 triumph over record eight-time winners Lyon.

The defending champions had never beaten the French giants, losing in the 2019 and 2022 finals against them, but finally succeeded in Bilbao to complete a spectacular quadruple this season in coach Jonatan Giraldez's last match in charge.

Bonmati pounced after 63 minutes and substitute Putellas finished the job in stoppage time to avenge Barcelona's prior defeats by Sonia Bompastor's side.

Securing their third Champions League trophy from five final appearances across the last six seasons,



Barcelona demonstrated that they are the new powerhouse of the women's game.

"(It's) a dream day, it is difficult to explain with words the feeling I have now. It is a special moment," said Giraldez.

"It is one of the happiest days of my life."

Barca's stars had insisted that this time they were capa-

ble of beating Lyon, adding experience and mental strength to their undoubted talent, and so it proved at a packed San Mames.

Backed by the vast majority of a 51,000 record crowd at a women's Champions League final, Bonmati and her side completed one of the few challenges remaining to them.

"It's the first time we've beaten Lyon. I'm proud of the team, and we know that with these fans we have, we can't fail," Bonmati told DAZN.

"It's incredible what we're living through as a team, I'm so lucky... to see we're creating that for so many people, the historic amount of fans we've brought, it's the proudest I've felt, I wouldn't change it for anything."

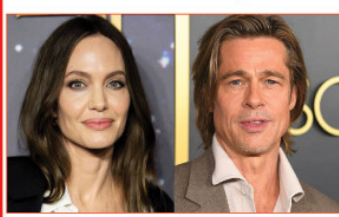

12 injured as Qatar Airways' plane suffers turbulence mid-air

DOHA: As many as 12 people were reported to be injured in mid-air turbulence while the airline was over Turkey bound for Dublin from Doha, days after a similar occurrence in Singapore that killed one person.



Dublin Airport in a statement said that the Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner experienced turbulence over Turkey, triggering an emergency response shortly after landing in Ireland.

The Qatar Airways flight QR017 landed before 13:00 local time, with the authorities saying that six passengers and six crew members were injured.

"The Dublin Airport team continues to provide full assistance on the ground to passengers and airline staff," the airport said, according to BBC.

The incident did not affect any operations at the airport.

According to the National Ambulance Service,

it received a pre-alert to attend the airport and is "currently on site facilitating and supporting the disembarkment of passengers".

Qatar Airways told BBC News NI in a statement that "a small number of passengers and crew sustained minor injuries in flight and are now receiving medical attention."

"The matter is now subject to an internal investigation," it added.

CNN reported that approximately 65,000 passenger aircraft suffer moderate-

level turbulence annually in the US. Around 5,500 witnessed severe turbulence, which is expected to grow. In 2022, Paul Williams, a professor of atmospheric science at the University of Reading in the United Kingdom, told the outlet that he believes climate change is modifying turbulence.

"We ran some computer simulations and found that severe turbulence could double or triple in the coming decades," Williams added.—Agency

Massive fire at family entertainment venue in India's Rajkot kills 27



GUJRAT: At least 27 people, including many children, were killed after a fire that broke out on Saturday evening in a family entertainment venue in Gujarat, India, a government official said.

According to Reuters, rescue efforts continued at the scene in the Rajkot district. "Our focus is on rescue operations and saving lives. We will ensure strict action is taken against the people who are responsible for this incident," Mayor Nayana Pedhadiya said.

Television images showed a massive fire engulfing the TRP game zone and thick clouds of smoke emanating from the site.

A police official at the local civil hospital said some of the bodies were charred

beyond recognition. In a post on social media platform X, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the local administration was working to provide assistance to those affected.

"Extremely distressed by the fire mishap in Rajkot. My thoughts are with all those who have lost their loved ones," Modi said in the post. "The cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained," the district's chief fire officer, IV Kher, told Reuters.

Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel said an investigation into the incident had been handed to a Special Investigation Team, and television reports said two people had been detained by Rajkot police in connection with the incident.—RT/Agency

Taiwan's president says he wants to work with China



TAIWAN: Taiwan's new president said on Sunday he was still ready to work with China, despite this week's military drills around the self-ruled island.

The drills began around Taiwan on Thursday, just three days after Lai Ching-te was sworn in, part of an escalating campaign of intimidation by China which views the island as part of its territory.

During the two-day drills, China vowed that what it described as "independence forces" would be left "with their heads broken and blood flowing".

Lai told reporters on Sunday that he wanted Taiwan and China to "jointly shoulder the important responsibility of regional stability".

"I also look forward to enhancing mutual understanding and reconciliation through exchanges and cooperation with China [...] and moving towards a position of peace and common prosperity," he said at an event in Taipei.

Communications between China and Taiwan were severed in 2016 after former president Tsai Ing-wen of the Democratic Pro-

gressive Party (DPP) took office, pledging to defend Taiwan's sovereignty.

Lai, also a DPP member, had vowed to maintain Tsai's policies of building up Taiwan's defence capabilities, while remaining open to dialogue with China and strengthening relations with the island's partners — particularly the United States.

Wen-ti Sung, a non-resident fellow at the Atlantic Council's Global China Hub, told AFP that Lai would "hold firm to project resolve" during this first interaction between his administration and Beijing.

"However he will no doubt be looking to leverage other international partners and friends to help facilitate more back-channel communications with Beijing," Sung said.—Agency

More than 670 feared dead in Papua New Guinea landslide

PAPUA: More than 670 people are assumed to have died in Papua New Guinea's (PNG) massive landslide, the United Nations' migration agency estimated on Sunday as rescue efforts continued.



Media in the South Pacific nation had previously estimated Friday's landslide had buried more than 300 people. But more than 48 hours later, the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) said the death toll may be more than double that, as the full extent of the destruction is still unclear and continuing dangerous conditions on the ground are hampering aid and rescue efforts.

Only five bodies have been retrieved from the rubble so far.

The agency based its death toll estimates on information provided by officials at Yambali Village in the Enga province, who say more than 150 houses were buried in Friday's landslide, Serhan Aktoprak, the chief

of the agency's mission in PNG said in an email statement.

"Land is still sliding, rocks are falling, ground soil is cracking due to constant increased pressure and groundwater is running, thus the area is posing an extreme risk for everyone," Aktoprak said.

More than 250 houses nearby have been abandoned by the inhabitants, who had taken temporary shelter with their relatives and friends, and some 1,250 people have been displaced, the agency said. "People are using digging sticks, spades, large

agricultural forks to remove the bodies buried under the soil," Aktoprak said. The IOM said an elementary school, small businesses and stalls, a guesthouse, and a petrol station were also buried. The UN's PNG office said five bodies were retrieved from an area where 50 to 60 homes had been destroyed, with several injured reported, including at least 20 women and children. IOM said the community in this village was relatively young and it's feared that the most fatalities would be children of 15 years or younger.—Agency

3 Injured In Knife Attack On Metro In France's Lyon, Attacker Arrested



Paris: At least three people were injured in a knife attack on the metro in the eastern French city of Lyon on Sunday, police said, adding that an attacker was arrested.

Separately, Lyon public prosecutor Thierry Dran told AFP that the attack left four people injured, adding their lives were not in danger.

A police source told AFP that two of the victims were wounded in the abdomen and a third in the arm.

An investigation was launched into "attempted

homicide", prosecutors said. "The national police questioned an individual following a knife attack near the Jean-Jaures metro station in Lyon," the Auvergne-Rhone-Alpes prefecture said on X.

"Three victims are being treated by emergency services", the regional prefecture added.

The incident occurred at around 2:40 pm on line B, near Place Jean-Jaures in the city's 7th district, according to a police source.—Agency

US expected to lift ban on sale of offensive weapons to Saudi Arabia

WASHINGTON: The United States is expected to lift a ban on the sale of offensive weapons to Saudi Arabia, potentially in the coming weeks, The Financial Times reported on Sunday.



The newspaper reported that Washington has already signalled to Saudi Arabia that it was prepared to lift the ban, citing a person familiar with the matter.

Soon after taking office in 2021, Biden adopted a tougher stance over Saudi Arabia's campaign against the Houthis in Yemen, which has inflicted heavy civilian casualties, and over Riyadh's human rights record, in particular the 2018 killing of Washington Post journalist and political opponent Jamal Khashoggi.

US arms customer, has chafed under those restrictions, which froze the kind of weapons sales that previous US administrations had provided for decades.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Wednesday said the US and Saudi Arabia were very close to concluding a set of agreements on nuclear energy, security and defence cooperation, the bilateral component of a wider normalisation deal with Riyadh and Israel.

However, lifting the ban on offensive weapons sales was not directly linked to these talks, FT said.

The White House and Saudi Arabia's government communication office did not immediately respond to a Reuters request for comment.—Agency

Cyclone hits Bangladesh as nearly a million flee inland for shelter



An intense cyclone smashed into the low-lying coast of Bangladesh on Sunday, with nearly a million people fleeing inland for concrete storm shelters away from howling gales and crashing waves.

"The severe Cyclone Remal has started crossing the Bangladesh coast," Bangladesh Meteorological Department Director Azizur Rahman told AFP, adding the raging storm could continue hammering the coast until at least the early hours of Monday morning.

"We have so far recorded maximum wind speeds of 90 kilometres per hour, but the wind speed may pick up more pace." Forecasters predicted gusts of up to 130km/h, with heavy rain and winds also lashing neighbouring India.

Authorities have raised the danger signal to its highest level.

Cyclones have killed hundreds of thousands of people in Bangladesh in recent

decades, but the number of superstorms hitting its densely populated coast has increased sharply, from one a year to as many as three, due to the impact of climate change.

"The cyclone could unleash a storm surge of up to four metres above normal astronomical tide, which can be dangerous," Bangladesh senior weather official Muhammad Abul Kalam Mallik told AFP.

Most of Bangladesh's coastal areas are a metre or two above sea level and high storm surges can devastate villages.

"We are terrified," said 35-year-old fisherman Yusuf Fakir at Kuakata, a town on the very southern tip of Bangladesh along the predicted route of the storm, speaking just before its arrival. While he had sent his wife and children to a relative's home inland, he stayed put to guard their belongings.—Agency

Fire kills six newborns at baby hospital in New Delhi

NEW DELHI: Six newborns have died in a fire at a baby care hospital in India's capital New Delhi, local authorities said on Sunday.



Television footage showed firefighters attempting to douse the fire which broke out late Saturday night and engulfed the hospital in the eastern part of the city.

The fire department told news agency ANI, in which Reuters owns a minority stake, that six more children were rescued and taken to a different hospital, with one on a ventilator. The fire has since been brought under

control. The owner of the baby hospital has fled, Delhi police said.

"The causes of the incident are being investigated

and whoever is responsible for this negligence will not be spared," Delhi's Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said in a post on social media platform X.—Agency

9 Killed As Tornadoes, Extreme Storms Hit Several US States

Washington: At least nine people were killed across the central United States as tornadoes and other extreme storms hit several states including Texas, Arkansas and Oklahoma, officials said Sunday.



Rescue efforts were ongoing and hundreds of thousands of people were without power after the storms struck the Southern Plains region beginning late Saturday.

In Texas, Cooke County Sheriff Ray Sappington told ABC affiliate WFAA that five people were dead after a tornado ripped through the Valley View area, north of Dallas.

"Sadly, I think that number will rise," Sappington told The Weather Channel, adding that search and rescue operations were ongoing.

The twister destroyed homes and a gas station and overturned vehicles on an interstate highway. Sappington called the damage "pretty extensive."

There had been "a lot" of injuries, though none there were life-threatening, he earlier told ABC affiliate WFAA.

In Oklahoma, at least two people were dead after a tornado hit Mayes County

late Saturday, the county head of emergency management Johnny Janzen told the Fox News affiliate in Tulsa.

And in northern Arkansas, two people were killed in storms in the early hours of Sunday, local authorities confirmed. As far north as Indiana, the start of the Indianapolis 500 was delayed Sunday due to storms in the area, with fans asked to exit the bleachers and seek shelter.—Agency

Over 18,000 Retailers Enroll In FBR's Tajir Dost Scheme

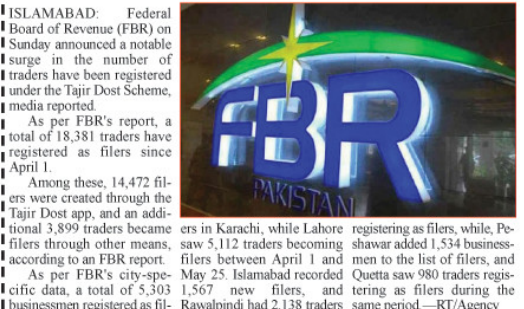

ISLAMABAD: Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training has issued the progress report on infrastructure improvement in government schools in Islamabad under the National Education Emergency.



According to the details, in this financial year, the works have been substantially completed including the upgradation of 252 washrooms in 63 schools, while 21 primary schools have also been renovated.

It was further informed that roof treatment was completed in 43 schools. Similarly, IT parks were established in five institutes, while 21 libraries were set up in primary schools.

The artwork was completed in 30 schools, with the remaining projects underway.
