Country's Gas Transmission System At Risk Due To Line Pack Pressure

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's gas transmission and distribution system is at risk due to increasing line pack pressure which has surged to a dangerous level of 5.13 billion cubic feet (bcf) after May 5, media reported on Monday.



The pressure in the gas transmission system remained at a manageable level of 4.570-4.97bcf between May 5 and May 25 but has now soared to critical levels owing to the reduction in the use of Re-Gasified Liquefied Natural Gas (RLNG) by the power sector, a senior official told the publication.

ity generation owing to which the line pack pressure has increased to 1.530bcf, putting the gas transmission system under duress.

"Now, the gas system has come again under duress on May 25-26 mainly because of reduction in the use of RLNG by the power sector," the official said, adding that the pipeline could burst any time as the gas transmission system becomes more vulnerable if the gas pressure surges past 5bcf-mark.

Meanwhile, gas consumption in the fertiliser industry stands at 52 mmcf as compared to Saturday's consumption of 40mmcf by Fatima Fertiliser due to start up of their plant at 1900 hrs on May 24 after completion of their Annual Turn Around (ATA).

The power sector has slashed its RLNG use to 475mmcf as fuel for electric-

Further, system gas consumption by Engro Fertilizer was suspended at 2200 hrs on April 22 due to start up of Annual Turn Around of their plant for about 54 days of the year.

With the current RLNG consumption rate standing at 32 mmcf, the data warns extreme high-pressure condition prevails throughout the transmission network due to reduced offtake of RLNG by the power sector.

KP And Federal Governments Reconcile, Agree To Collaborate For Public Relief

ISLAMABAD: Following months-long tussle and exchange of heated arguments over arrears, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Centre have finally agreed to bury the hatchet and work together for public relief.



The development came during a meeting between KP's firebrand Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur and Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi in Islamabad on Monday. Federal Minister for Energy Awaiz Ahmad Khan Leghari and the federal interior secretary were also among the attendees of the meeting.

It is pertinent to mention here that the KP government and the Centre had been at odds over multiple issues, including the prolonged power cuts in the province with CM Gandapur even threatening to take control of the power distribution company, the Peshawar Electric Supply Company (Pesco) after decriing the excessive power outages in the province.

In addition to this, the KP government and Centre have been engaged in a verbal spat in recent days with the former complaining of dues that are owed to the province by the federal government.

In March, CM Gandapur threatened to take the Centre to court over the arrears issue.

Addressing a joint presser, following a "meaningful" dialogue, CM Gandapur said: "The federal and provincial institutions will work together [We] will work together to remove the causes of line losses."

He said, "The province itself is experiencing prolonged power cuts."

The chief minister further said that he engaged in talks to solve the problems being faced by the province. "We will have to come to the table for the rights and issues of the province."

Since KP itself generates electricity, he said, the people of the province wanted to end loadshedding and seek cheap electricity.

CM Gandapur also thanked the federal government for realising the griev-

ances of the people of the province.

Quoting PTI founder Imran Khan, he said that their "fight is not against the state's intentions".

On his part, the energy minister thanked Interior Minister Naqvi for playing a key role in defusing tensions between KP and Centre and bridging the gap between the two sides.

Without revealing details, the federal minister said: "We have found a solution to the problems."

A uniform model will be implemented in KP and other provinces, he added.

Referring to the decisions made in the meeting, the minister said that PTI, PML-N and allied parties have taken a "big step" to recover the economy and steer the country out of crisis.

Despite having a different political narrative, the energy minister said that they agreed on this agenda for the sake of the people and the country.

"We have found a solution to the problems. The solution will be applied to other provinces too."

He vowed to address the issues of power theft and line losses across the country.

The PTI and the PML-N have jointly taken this step to improve the country's economy.

Talking to journalists, the interior minister revealed that the meeting concluded with a "breakthrough". He, however, did not give details about the breakthrough and said that the session was held in a pleasant atmosphere.

Matters related to public relief were discussed in the meeting, he added. Ahead of the crucial holiday, Naqvi welcomed CM Gandapur upon his arrival at the Foreign Ministry. During his interaction with the media, the chief minister said: "Our cases are in the courts and we hope that we will get relief from the courts. I am sitting with them [federal ministers] to solve the problems of the people of his province. In political matters, different things should not be mixed."—RT/Agency

According to Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the army chief expressed this resolve after attending the funeral prayer of martyred soldiers in Peshawar.

COAS Asim Munir reached Peshawar today and offered funeral prayer of Sepoy Taimoor Shaheed, Sepoy Nadir Sagheer Shaheed, Sepoy Muhammad Yaseen Shaheed, Lance Naik Syed Danish Afkar Shaheed and Naik Ashfaq Butt Shaheed, who embraced martyrdom during an intense exchange of fire with terrorists at Bagh area of Khyber district.

Earlier in the day, ISPR reported that seventeen terrorists were killed and another two were injured in two separate operations conducted by security forces in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP).

A large number of military and civil officials also attended the funeral.

The army chief also visited Combined Military Hospital (CMH) Peshawar to inquire about the well-being of troops injured during the operation and appreciated their high morale.

Martyrs will be laid to rest with full military honor at their respective native towns.

23 Terrorists Killed, Seven Soldiers Martyred In KP IBOs

RAWALPINDI: At least 23 terrorists were killed and seven soldiers of the Pakistan Army were martyred in a series of intelligence-based operations (IBOs) conducted in Peshawar, Tank, and Khyber districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) province over two days, the military's media wing said on Monday.

UMERKOT: Mr. Yaseen Laghari received the Outstanding Student Provincial Award from Jiangsu, Government China, for his novel master's research work titled "Coastal Wetlands of Indus River Delta Are Under Risk Due to Reclamation: A Spatiotemporal Analysis During the Past 50 Years from 1972 to 2022." The award was presented by the College of Marine Science and Engineering at Nanjing Normal University, China. His research demonstrated a significant decline in the net area of coastal wetlands, which decreased by 26.1 km² between 1972 and 2022. During the same period, land reclamation for settlements and agriculture increased by 200.1 to 373.5 km². The study emphasizes that without timely conservation actions, this valuable wetland ecosystem will continue to degrade, endangering many animal and plant species. Mr. Yaseen, a native of a small village in Sakrand, Sindh province of Pakistan, was recognized for his re-

Karachi's Matric Exams Postponed Due To Public Holiday



KARACHI: The provincial authorities once again deferred the matriculation exams in Karachi slated for Tuesday as the country will observe national holiday tomorrow on account of Youm-e-Takbeer.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had announced a public holiday on Youm-e-Takbeer to mark the historic day when Pakistan conducted successful nuclear tests in the hills of Chaghal in 1998. Later, Sindh Universities and Boards Minister Mohammad Ali Malkani announced that the papers of IX and X classes will not take place in the metropolis tomorrow (Tuesday) due to the holiday. He said that a new date for tomorrow's papers will be announced later. It may be noted that the Board of Secondary Education Karachi (BSEK) had announced a new schedule for the matric exams, which had been deferred for almost a week due to extremely hot weather. The BSEK had postponed the remaining papers of the IX and X classes, which were supposed to be held between May 21-27, in the wake of an expected heatwave in Sindh. Meanwhile, University of Karachi also announced holiday tomorrow in line with the official announcement. The exams due to be held tomorrow in the varsity have been deferred.—RT/Agency

Seminar Advocates Net Metering For Philanthropy And Clean Energy

KARACHI: At a seminar organized by Hopewind, Moin M. Fudda, former Karachi Stock Exchange MD, proposed allowing well-off consumers with rooftop solar systems to donate excess electricity to charitable causes, benefiting under-served communities like Lines Area and Lyari. Fudda emphasized the positive impact on mosques, seminaries, and charities, and urged the government to facilitate large off-grid solar installations for industrialists. He suggested net metering for single-phase households to aid low-income consumers. Hopewind Regional Head, Syed Salman Mohiuddin, highlighted the need to increase Pakistan's renewable



energy capacity, currently at 5.4% of 40,000 MW. He advocated for promoting rooftop solar systems to meet the goal of 60% renewable energy by 2030 and opposed gross metering for domestic consumers. Clean energy expert Irfan Ahmed recommended provincial oversight of wind and solar projects and the creation of smaller grid companies. Mehfooz A. Qazi of SEEP confirmed no new taxes on solar equipment and stressed the importance of rooftop solar installations in public buildings.—RT

KARACHI: Sardar Yasir Ilyas Khan, a leading investor and former president of the Islamabad Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ICCI), announced that Saudi investors are ready to make extensive investments in Pakistan. He emphasized the need for joint ventures to boost local investor confidence.

noted Saudi interest in Pakistan's agro sector despite high production costs and significant export opportunities in the Saudi retail and meat markets. Sindh Introduces Third-Party System For Food Licensing



KARACHI: The Sindh government has introduced a third-party system for issuing food licenses to facilitate the business community. The decision was made during the 10th meeting of the Sindh Food Authority (SFA) board, chaired by Provincial Minister for Food Jam Khan Shoro at the Archives Complex in Clifton, Karachi. Attendees included Sindh Assembly member Ghanwar Isran, the Provincial Secretary for Food, the Director General of the SFA, and representatives from the business community and the Karachi Chamber of Commerce. The SFA aims to make the food authority's system more efficient and avoid unnecessary harassment of the business community. Providing quality food to the public is its top priority. Director General Agha Fakhar briefed the meeting on the SFA's performance, noting fines of Rs 103.057 million and fees of Rs 357.642 million collected from 2018 to 2024. The SFA has agreements with universities for internships and food testing laboratories. The SFA conducts over 100 raids and inspections daily to ensure food quality in the province. The meeting also discussed increasing the SFA's budget from Rs 200 million to Rs 600 million, which was approved. The authority continues to take strict action against those selling substandard food items.—RT

State Minister, FBR Assure Positive Consideration Of KCCI's Budget Proposals



KARACHI: Minister of State for Finance & Revenue Ali Perviz Malik and Chairman Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) Malik Amjed Zubair Tiwana, along with an FBR team, have pledged to give serious consideration to the Karachi Chamber of Commerce & Industry's (KCCI) proposals for the Federal Budget 2024-25.

During an online meeting via Zoom, the State Minister assured that proposals aimed at fostering a conducive business environment and supporting growth would be thoroughly reviewed for implementation in the upcoming budget. He committed to forwarding KCCI's recommendations to higher authorities for inclusion, despite fiscal constraints. The meeting, attended by KCCI officials including President Ifthikar Ahmed Sheikh and Senior Vice President Altaf Ghaffar, focused on addressing issues faced by the business community, such as high taxation rates and exorbitant energy tariffs. Chairman KCCI's Special Committee for Budget Proposals, Muhammad Ibrahim Kasumi, presented recommendations aimed at curbing malpractices, revenue leakages, and restoring fairness in the import sector. SHC Permits Reporters To Cover Court Proceedings

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) on Monday allowed court reporters to cover judicial proceedings, media reported. As per details, the court issued a stay on the notification issued by Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (Pema) that imposed restrictions on court reporting.

The Sindh High Court has also issued notices to Pema, the Ministry of Information, and others, seeking a response by June 6. Advocate Abdul Moiz Jaffer argued that Pema has no authority to issue such directives, and it is the judiciary's prerogative to decide what can be reported and what not. Chief Justice SHC Ahmed Ali Sheikh remarked that court reporters should also show responsibility in their reporting, as certain remarks sometimes can create a wrong impression. At this, the court adjourned the case until June 6 for further hearing.—RT/Agency

Do we have a bomb to save ourselves from our own follies and misplaced priorities?

The abrupt declaration of a public holiday on May 28th, Youm-e-Takbeer, symbolizes a profound misstep in the face of Pakistan's current economic crisis. Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif's announcement, meant to evoke national pride by commemorating our 1998 nuclear tests, instead underscores a troubling disregard for the urgent need for economic stability and productivity.

While the historical significance of Youm-e-Takbeer is undisputed, celebrating it with a sudden halt to business activities is imprudent. At a time when Pakistan is teetering on the brink of economic default, every working day is crucial. The private sector and financial institutions are already stretched thin, grappling with a precarious economic environ-

ment. Many leaders of the business community have rightly expressed concerns over the detrimental im-



act of this unplanned holiday. The halt in business activities, particularly those involving crucial financial transactions with the United States, exacerbates our economic woes by delaying much-needed cash inflows.

The government's decision reflects a misguided sense of bravado, prioritizing symbolic gestures over practical needs. As a nation facing severe financial challenges, our focus should be on bolstering productivity, enhancing exports, and stabilizing the

economy. This abrupt holiday not only disrupts business operations but also sends a worrying signal to potential foreign investors about the unpredictability of our economic policies.

In times of crisis, responsible governance demands decisions that prioritize economic resilience and stability. The sudden declaration of a holiday, at a moment when the nation requires relentless effort to avert default, is a stark example of misplaced priorities. We must recalibrate our focus towards constructive actions that genuinely support national prosperity, rather than indulging in symbolic acts that offer no tangible benefit. Our nuclear arsenal may secure our defense, but it is prudent economic policies and consistent productivity that will secure our future.

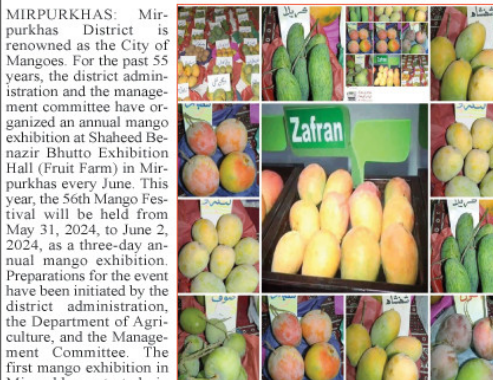
Education Dept holds an awards ceremony in Dadu

Mirpurkhas administration finalizes arrangements for 56th annual Mango Festival



MIRPURKHAS: Mirpurkhas District is renowned as the City of Mangoes. For the past 55 years, the district administration and the management committee have organized an annual mango exhibition at Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Exhibition Hall (Fruit Farm) in Mirpurkhas every June. This year, the 56th Mango Festival will be held from May 31, 2024, to June 2, 2024, as a three-day annual mango exhibition. Preparations for the event have been initiated by the district administration, the Department of Agriculture, and the Management Committee. The first mango exhibition in Mirpurkhas started in 1965 with the aim of fostering connections among farmers from distant areas of the province and the country, exchanging agricultural information and promoting the production and varieties of mangoes to improve mango cultivation in their regions. 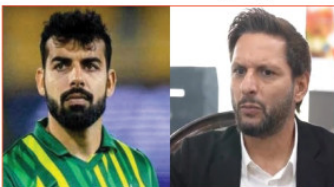
PAK vs ENG: Boom Boom reaches out to Shadab Khan after worst bowling figures in T20Is

We had a detailed chat yesterday, I asked him who is guiding him or if there is something he is not doing, how are you making such mistakes is there no one to tell you?" said Afridi.

He was then asked if there's some mental block with Shadab to which he said: "Is there any leg-spin coach with the team? Saeed Ajmal was there but he was an off-spinner. Ajmal should be asked if he guided Shadab and why is he not doing what he was told.—Agency

Cristiano Ronaldo could shatter jaw-dropping records at Euro 2024

Ronaldo is just two assists away from becoming the top assister in the history of the competition, to snatch the accolade from Karel Poborsky with eight assists.

Having already won one European Championship Golden Boot, Ronaldo could become the first player in history to win two of them, if he wins the Golden Boot this year.—Agency

"When you make mistakes, you learn from them and try not to repeat them. So, we'll work on it and will try to perform well in the coming matches and make a comeback."



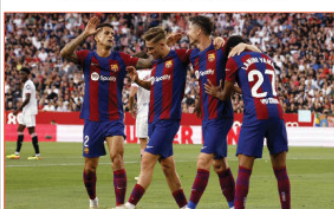

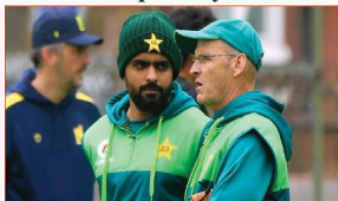

"It was a better option not to offer the position to anyone for the World Cup," the source added.

On Saturday, media, citing sources, reported that pacer Shaheen Afridi had declined the PCB's offer to become vice-captaincy for the national side.

Nadal bidding to avoid early French Open exit

PARIS: Rafael Nadal admits he will be facing "one of the toughest opponents possible" when he plays Alexander Zverev in the French Open first round on Monday.

This year's event was expected to be the 14-time champion's farewell to Roland Garros, but he has since insisted he could not confirm "100 percent" it would be his last appearance.

Nadal has only played four tournaments since January 2023 after suffering a hip injury and then a muscle tear.

That left him unseeded for the draw and vulnerable to a difficult opening round at a tournament where he has only lost three of his 115 matches.

World number four Zverev arrives in Paris as one of the favourites for the title.

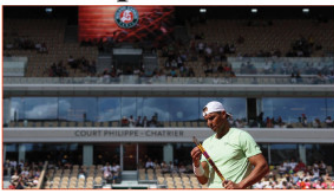
"Of course on paper it is not the best draw," Nadal said ahead of the match on Court Philippe Chatrier.

"I play against one of the toughest opponents possible, and at the same time, he came here winning the last event and it's a Masters 1000.

"It's not a small one. So what can I do? That's the draw. Just try to be ready for it."

Nadal, who turns 38 in a week's time, has shown flashes of his best form in the clay-court swing, but was thrashed 6-1, 6-3 by Poland's Hubert Hurkacz in the second round of his last outing in Rome.

He boasts a 7-3 winning record over Zverev ahead of their first meeting since the 2022 French Open semi-finals, when the German left



the court in a wheelchair near the end of the second set after injuring his ankle.

"I am not anxious. No, I am focused on trying to play well. That's it," said Nadal.

"Maybe I go there and I repeat the disaster of Rome. It's a possibility, of course. I don't want to hide that.

"But in my mind, is do something different and play much better and give myself a chance to play competitive."

Zverev did not play again in 2022 after that ankle injury but has climbed the rankings again in recent months. The 27-year-old has long been touted as a future Grand Slam champion but remains without one of tennis' four biggest titles.—Agency

The former federal minister said that nomination papers were issued from 9am to 5pm today which would also be continued before 12pm by tomorrow (Tuesday). "Scrutiny of the nomination papers will be performed at 1pm, whereas, candidates could withdraw their nominations by 2.30pm, tomorrow."



He added: "Overall, 11 nominations have been issued so far. At 3pm tomorrow, final lists of the candidates will be issued and a general council's session will be held afterwards."

He added that the party would organise the polls for electing its president at 4pm tomorrow. Sanaullah went on to say that Bashir Memon, Irfan-ul-Haque Siddiqui, Ishaq Dar, Raja Muhammad Farooq, Hafiz Hafeez-ur-Rehman and Shah Gulam Qadir have received their nomination papers today.

for taking part in the upcoming polls." Sanaullah further said that Nawaz transformed the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz into a popular public party after Quaid-i-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah that ruled the country four times.

"In case no candidates, the party's president would be elected unopposed, otherwise, polling will be held via a show of hands," he added. The politico said that Nawaz was not angry with someone and was fully active in national politics. He added that all decisions of the federal and the Punjab governments would be taken after Nawaz's approval.

He further said that lesser statements from the PML-N supremo would be ended, soon.

The premier's aide added that the ruling PML-N was considering recommendations to reshuffle the party positions. He said that Shehbaz

Sharif would be the next leader after Nawaz on which the entire party was agreed upon for the presidency. He praised Shehbaz, the incumbent prime minister, for making maximum efforts to pull the country out of the economic crisis.

To a question regarding the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Sanaullah replied that he would continue to warn the nation against the former ruling party's founder Imran Khan.

He added that he was continuously warning the nation that the ousted premier would push the country into a big turmoil. The former security czar said that he was unaware of sources pushing the incarcerated PTI founder for making political blunders, however, "stupidity" could be committed by any individual. "I would pray for the PTI founder not to face the same consequences as Sheikh Mujibur Rahman," he added.—RT/Agency

Raza Rabbani Advocates For Grand Dialogue To Prevent Institutional Overreach

ISLAMABAD: Former Senate chairman Mian Raza Rabbani has called for holding a grand intra-institutional dialogue, wherein, the institutions should agree on not to transgress into each other's domain.

Highlighting that the public exhibition of contradictions among institutes was casting long shadows on already fragile political system, Rabbani said, "The way forward is a grand intra-institutional dialogue, wherein, each institution agrees not to transgress into each other's domain, respecting the trichotomy of power envisaged in the Constitution."

In a press statement, the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) leader said Pakistan was engulfed in multiple crises, one being contradiction within ruling elite. The conflict of the ruling elite emanated from within and it had historical roots, he maintained. He alleged that Pakistan's establishment had, in history, been taking support of the judiciary.



"The extreme polarised political atmosphere has affected this equation within the ruling elite. This intra-class contradiction within the elite, is vitiating the functioning of state institutions," he said. Rabbani said in a democratic federal parliamentary system, parliament was the final arbiter for intra-elite disputes. Hence, he said, parliament should refrain from becoming a party to the intra-elite disputes. "The Committee of the Whole of the Senate of Pakistan should play its role in healing the situation," he suggested.

Taking a dig at non-implementation of the Constitution in its true spirit, the politico said the Constitution was being treated as a "nose of wax". "It is molded to legitimate the unconstitutional transgression of one institution into the affairs of the other." The PPP leader said all this had created a situation "where rule of law has ceased to exist and there appears to be a rule by law." It had shaken the constitutional foundations of the state, created structural and political instability, he said.—RT/Agency

Omar Ayub Vows To Advocate For Tribesmen's Concerns In National Assembly

ISLAMABAD: PTI leader, Omar Ayub Khan, on Monday assured the tribesmen that he would take up their issue to the National Assembly, media reported.

Leaders from South Waziristan, including members of the Mehsud tribe, met with opposition leader Omar Ayub, along with Mahmood Achakzai, head of the Pakistan Constitution Protection Movement, and other prominent figures such as Asad Qaiser.

The joint Jirga discussed the critical issues stemming from the closure of the Angur Ada border — the border between the South Waziristan of Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Afghanistan's Paktika Province.

During the meeting, the Jirga detailed the significant problems faced by the local population due to the border closure.

In response, Omar Ayub assured the leaders that he



would bring this issue to the National Assembly and the Ministry of Interior, stressing that the resolving the tribal people's problems is his top priority.

The opposition leaders also accepted an invitation to participate in a three-day tribal jirga in Islamabad. Omar Ayub stressed that failing to address these issues could wear away the people's confidence in the state. He vowed to raise his voice on every platform for the tribal districts' concerns. Asad Qaiser echoed this sentiment, highlighting the

sacrifices made by the people of the tribal districts for Pakistan. He emphasized that solving their problems is both a duty and a debt. Mahmood Khan Achakzai reiterated his commitment to fighting for tribal rights within and outside the assembly, acknowledging the tribalists' eternal sacrifices for the country. During the meeting, two resolutions submitted by the tribal leaders' jirga were unanimously approved, signaling a collective effort to address and resolve the pressing issues faced by the tribal districts.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Declares Public Holiday For Youm-e-Takbeer



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday declared a public holiday throughout the country on May 28 on account of Youm-e-Takbeer, the day when Pakistan's defence became impregnable after nuclear tests in the hills of Chagai, Balochistan in 1998. The announcement was made in a notification, a copy of which is available with media, issued by the cabinet secretariat.

Youm-e-Takbeer is observed on May 28, marking the historic day when Pakistan became an atomic power.

"Youm-e-Takbeer reminds how the entire Pakistani nation got united on that day to make the country's defence invincible," the prime minister said in a statement issued by the PM House.

On the day in 1998, he said, the nation decided that there would be no compromise on the country's integrity and defence by not yielding to any external pressure.

Both political and defence forces were united on the day under the National Flag to strengthen the country's defence, he said.

PM Shehbaz said it was the day of renewing the pledge that "we will always remain ready to thwart the nefarious designs of external and internal enemies, who want to endanger the country."

"May 28 is also the day of paying tributes to the steps taken by the then-prime minister Nawaz Sharif and the Pakistan Army to make the national defence invincible."

"We also pay tribute to Zulfikar Ali Bhutto for initiating the atomic programme and the scientists who played a key role in continuing it," the prime minister remarked.

He said on the day, the entire nation, including himself, resolved that the way the national defence was made invincible on May 28, 1998, "we will [similarly] make the country's economic stable and prosper through sheer hard work."

ECC Approves Over Rs 4 Billion For Country's Satellite Program

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the federal cabinet approved over Rs 4 billion for the Pakistan Space & Upper Atmosphere Research Commission (Suparco) to meet the requirements of the Pakistan Multi-Mission Satellite System PAK-SAT MM1, media reported.

The approval was given in the ECC meeting chaired by Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb on a request from the Strategic Plans Division. The ECC also okayed Rs 200 million rupees for the Intelligence Bureau Division

and 19.373 million rupees for the Ministry of Law and Justice. The ECC also allowed the SNGPL-based plants to operate for a period of six months starting from 31st March till 30th September this year to ensure a smooth supply of urea fertilizer for Kharif season.—RT/Agency

Ordinance Extends NAB's Remand Period

ISLAMABAD: The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) has been empowered to keep an accused on physical remand for up to 40 days as Acting President Yousuf Raza Gilani approved an ordinance to amend the existing law, media reported.

Before the ordinance, a person arrested by the NAB could be remanded into the bureau's custody for 14 days. However, under the amended law, the duration of physical remand has been increased to 40 days.

Furthermore, the punishment for NAB officials for making false cases has been reduced from 5 years to 2 years.

The ordinance was passed amidst a hearing of the NAB amendments case by the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan, challenged by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan.

The previous Pakistan Democratic Movement-led (PDM) government approved amendments to the National Accountability Ordinance 1999 in a bid to curtail the powers of the National Accountability Bureau (NAB).

Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar, who tabled the bill in lower house of parliament, said that multiple amendments were made in the accountability Ordinance to clip the pow-

ers exercised by the accountability bureau. Sharing details of the key amendments, he said that after fresh amendments, no arrests could be made before completion of the investigation process, and the suspect will have the right to obtain bail while 90-day remand is also abolished.

"90-day remand is for terrorists and we have now reduced the duration of remand to 14 days," he said and added that no defamatory campaign could be carried out unless the suspect is convicted in the case. The case could not be used for political purposes in the assets beyond means case, he said.—RT/Agency

Election Tribunals To Feature Retired Judges As Acting President Signs New Ordinance

ISLAMABAD: Acting President Yousuf Raza Gilani on Monday signed two new ordinances, the Election Act (Amendment) Ordinance 2024 and NAB (Amendment) Ordinance 2024.

After the promulgation of Election Act (Amendment) Ordinance 2024, the election tribunals will have the retired judges as its members besides the serving jurists.

Meanwhile, the NAB Ordinance extended the period of remanding accused in National Accountability Bureau (NAB) cases from 14 days to 40 days.

Moreover, the sentence duration for the officer convicted for framing cases



based on ill will has been reduced to two years from five years. The promulgation comes after the federal cabinet's approval of the amendments in the two ordinances.

The acting president signed the Election

(Amendment) Ordinance 2024 and NAB (Amendment) Ordinance 2024 on the advice of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, as President Asif Zardari is currently in Dubai.—RT/Agency
