THATTA: The Sindh Department of Antiquities and Archaeology has made a landmark decision to waive all parking and entry fees for the renowned Makli Cemetery, effective immediately. This significant move aims to ensure that both local visitors and foreign tourists have unrestricted access to this historic site.

Director General Abdul Fattah Shaikh has directed the department's minister to implement the new policy promptly through an official memorandum. This decision comes in response to widespread public feedback expressing dissatisfaction with the previous fee structure, which many found to be prohibitive. Formerly, visitors were charged parking fees amounting to 200,000 rupees annually, in addition to entry fees of 500,000 rupees. These fees have now

What is good for the goose is good for the gander

Nawaz Sharif's unopposed re-election as the head of the PML-N raises significant questions about the consistency of standards applied to political party elections in Pakistan. Sharif's reinstatement, coming after his disqualification and subsequent acquittal, underscores a troubling inconsistency in the scrutiny of intra-party elections, particularly when contrasted with the treatment of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI).

The PTI has faced repeated nullifications of its intra-party elections, subjected to rigorous scrutiny by both the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and the Supreme Court. This scrutiny has often been cited as necessary to uphold democratic principles within party structures. However, Nawaz Sharif's

unchallenged return to the PML-N presidency appears to have bypassed this rigorous oversight. The PTI has rightfully demanded that the ECP and the



judiciary apply the same stringent criteria to the PML-N's internal elections as was applied to theirs. This demand highlights a fundamental principle of justice: what is good for the goose is good for the gander.

The lack of competing candidates against Sharif and the unanimous support from the party's election commission led by Rana Sanaullah raises concerns

about the democratic integrity of the PML-N's internal processes. It suggests a potential rubber-stamping of Sharif's leadership rather than a robust democratic contest. This contrasts sharply with the PTI's experience, where internal elections have been scrutinized to the point of invalidation, suggesting a double standard in the enforcement of electoral fairness.

The ECP and the judiciary must uphold impartiality and ensure that all political parties adhere to the same democratic standards. Failure to do so not only undermines credibility but also erodes public trust in the democratic process. Nawaz Sharif's unopposed election should be examined with the same diligence that has been applied to the PTI's intra-party elections. Only then can we ensure a truly fair and democratic political landscape in Pakistan.

What is good for the goose is good for the gander

Nawaz Sharif's unopposed re-election as the head of the PML-N raises significant questions about the consistency of standards applied to political party elections in Pakistan. Sharif's reinstatement, coming after his disqualification and subsequent acquittal, underscores a troubling inconsistency in the scrutiny of intra-party elections, particularly when contrasted with the treatment of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI).

The PTI has faced repeated nullifications of its intra-party elections, subjected to rigorous scrutiny by both the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and the Supreme Court. This scrutiny has often been cited as necessary to uphold democratic principles within party structures. However, Nawaz Sharif's

unchallenged return to the PML-N presidency appears to have bypassed this rigorous oversight. The PTI has rightfully demanded that the ECP and the



judiciary apply the same stringent criteria to the PML-N's internal elections as was applied to theirs. This demand highlights a fundamental principle of justice: what is good for the goose is good for the gander.

The lack of competing candidates against Sharif and the unanimous support from the party's election commission led by Rana Sanaullah raises concerns

about the democratic integrity of the PML-N's internal processes. It suggests a potential rubber-stamping of Sharif's leadership rather than a robust democratic contest. This contrasts sharply with the PTI's experience, where internal elections have been scrutinized to the point of invalidation, suggesting a double standard in the enforcement of electoral fairness.

The ECP and the judiciary must uphold impartiality and ensure that all political parties adhere to the same democratic standards. Failure to do so not only undermines credibility but also erodes public trust in the democratic process. Nawaz Sharif's unopposed election should be examined with the same diligence that has been applied to the PTI's intra-party elections. Only then can we ensure a truly fair and democratic political landscape in Pakistan.

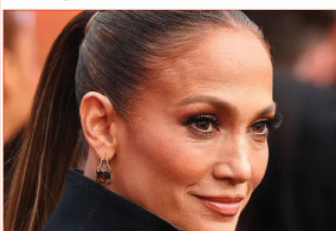

He was transferred to a rehab centre in mid-March to help him regain his motor and verbal skills. For the first three weeks

after the collapse, "I was basically dying," he told Swedish daily Aftonbladet. "I was not contactable and I have no memories from that time," he said, adding that he was now en route to a full recovery. "I've gotten through the worst part. I've had to think, be positive and have patience with everything," he said. Olsson, who is still in rehab, said he planned to play professionally again. "I feel great. I'm going to be able to play football again," he said, adding that it was still too early to say when that would happen. "Of course you want to be back as soon as possible... But I'm not stressing out about it, it will have to take time." "We'll see when it happens," Olsson was in the stands on Sunday when FC Midtjylland won the Danish championship. 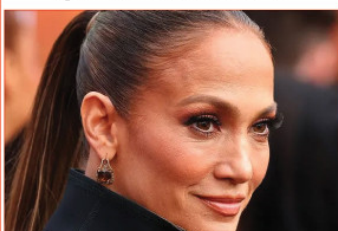

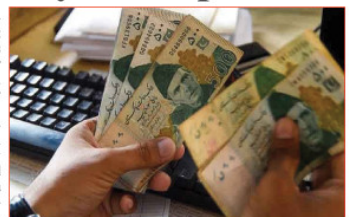

Govt Officials' Salaries And Pensions Expected To Be Hiked By 10-15 percent

ISLAMABAD: The government is working on different proposals for salary increases in the range of 10 to 15% for public sector employees in the upcoming budget for 2024-25.

Amid the wish of the government to strike a deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) under Extended Fund Facility (EFF) at a range of \$6 billion, the government will have to demonstrate its political will to place stringent fiscal measures including raising revenues of both Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) tax revenues and non-tax revenues as well as restricting the expenditures side.

The government is mulling over the options to fix the FBR tax revenue target of over Rs12.5 trillion in the coming budget. On the salaries front, the Ministry of Finance wants to raise the salary by just



10%. Still, there might be some pressures so that the government might be a fiscal adjustment to jack it up to 2.5% to a maximum of 5% to increase the salary increase in the range of 12.5 or 15% in the next budget.

There is another proposal under consideration to jack up monetisation of cars for higher grade officers of grades 20, 21, and 22 in the range of 20 to 25%.

The grade 20 officers

have been getting monthly salaries of cars in the range of Rs67,000 per month, grade 21 officers in range of Rs77,000 per month and grade 22 officers of Rs87,000 per month. Now it is being considered that it might be jacked keeping in view inflationary pressures. The officers who are enjoying both cars and monetisation amount argued that since inception of this policy in 2012 it was never jacked up.—RT/Agency

Navy Thwarts Significant Drug Smuggling Attempt In Arabian Sea

During a routine patrol as part of the regional maritime security patrol, the naval ship PNS Aslat seized a large quantity of narcotics. The confiscated drugs are estimated to be worth thousands of dollars in the international market.

On Saturday, the navy deployed the PNS Aslat to conduct regional maritime security patrols in the Indian Ocean. This deployment aims to safeguard merchant vessels entering and exiting Pakistani ports. Additionally, PNS Aslat's presence seeks to enhance the security of international shipping routes, ISPR said.

SHCC Accelerates Anti-Quackery Drive Across Sindh



SH HEALTH CARE COMMISS

KARACHI: In the third quarter of the financial year 2023-24, the Sindh Healthcare Commission (SHCC) Anti-Quackery Unit intensified its crackdown on quackery across the province in collaboration with the District Government and law enforcement agencies. Between January and March 2024, a total of 822 inspections and enforcement visits were conducted, resulting in significant actions against illegal healthcare establishments.

During this period, 528 quackery outlets were forcefully shut down and sealed under the law, while 187 warning notices were issued to non-compliant healthcare establishments (HCEs). Additionally, 107 extra inspections were carried out to ensure strict compliance with SHCC regulations.

To enhance coordination and effectiveness, targeted joint operations were conducted by the SHCC Directorate of Anti-Quackery in conjunction with district administration teams, supported by law enforcement agencies.

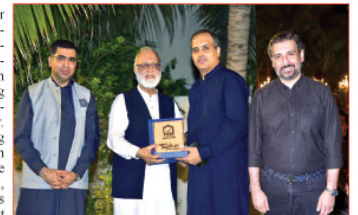
Last year, SHCC's Anti-Quackery Unit conducted over 7300 inspections, resulting in the closure of 2184 quack outlets and issuance of 2159 warning notices. Notably, 1876 practitioners were found to be operating in compliance with the law.

In a proactive move to enhance the sustainability of anti-quackery operations, SHCC Director Anti-Quackery S. Zeeshan A Shah initiated efforts to acquire accurate taluka-wise data on quackery from District Health Offices (DHOs), with the assistance of District Deputy Commissioners. This data-driven approach aims to reduce the recurrence of health crises, such as HIV outbreaks, by targeting unchecked and unregistered healthcare establishments province-wide.

Key support from the District Government, Inspector General (IG) Office, and Health Ministry has been pivotal in expanding operations under a wider scope, leveraging authenticated data intelligence and public awareness campaigns to reinforce the Anti-Quackery Drive across Sindh.—RT

Fundraising Event Held For Gaza Relief

KARACHI: Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman, President of the Al-Khidmat Foundation, announced that over 34,000 innocent people have been killed in Palestine, leaving hundreds of thousands without shelter, food, and water. He spoke at a fundraising event organized by Chairman Sehar Foundation and Justice of Peace, Danish Aman, Zahid Hameed, and Friends of Al-Khidmat. The event was attended by prominent figures including Dost Muhammad Rahimoon, Sindh Minister for Environment, Climate Change & Coastal Development, MPA Barrister Hallar Wassan, Additional I.G Police Javed Alam Odho, and other city elites.



Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman detailed the severe violence and oppression in Gaza, stating, "Gaza, covering just 365 square kilometers with 2.4 million residents, is heavily restricted, with limited access to travel and education." He explained the dire situation, noting, "60% of Gaza's electricity comes from Israel, while 40% is from generators. Water supplies and pipelines from Israel have been cut, and desalination and filtration plants destroyed. Food shipments have been halted since October 7. Out of 35 hospitals, 32 have been destroyed, and

70,000 tons of explosives, more than in Hiroshima and Nagasaki, have been dropped."

Highlighting Al-Khidmat's efforts, Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman said, "We are working with 11 NGOs in Turkey and Syria, and have partnered with the Red Cross in Egypt and Palestine to deliver supplies using funds from our overseas offices. Collaborating with the Foreign Office and Pakistan Army, we are sending supplies via air from Pakistan, and we plan to use naval ships with support from the Pakistan Navy."

He added, "So far, 2,080 tons of supplies have been sent, including 300 tons of medicine. We are also working on moving a field hospital from Ankara to Egypt and providing educational support for Palestinian children. Additionally, we plan to send 5 mobile hospitals, install 30

water filtration plants, and construct 5 schools, 1 hospital, and a residential building once a ceasefire is initiated."

Javed Alam Odho emphasized the need for collective effort, stating, "The global influence of the Jewish community comes from their focus on education, science, technology, and trade. We must translate our emotions into actions for Palestine, as Al-Khidmat and other NGOs are doing."

KARACHI: Pakistan People's Party (PPP) leaders Mukhtiar Lashari and Siddique Marri, accompanied by their counsel Advocate Liaquat Khan Gabol, held a press conference at the Malir Press Club, voicing serious concerns over alleged injustices and safety threats.

SHCC Accelerates Anti-Quackery Drive Across Sindh



SHCC Accelerates Anti-Quackery Drive Across Sindh

KARACHI: In the third quarter of the financial year 2023-24, the Sindh Healthcare Commission (SHCC) Anti-Quackery Unit intensified its crackdown on quackery across the province in collaboration with the District Government and law enforcement agencies. Between January and March 2024, a total of 822 inspections and enforcement visits were conducted, resulting in significant actions against illegal healthcare establishments.

During this period, 528 quackery outlets were forcefully shut down and sealed under the law, while 187 warning notices were issued to non-compliant healthcare establishments (HCEs). Additionally, 107 extra inspections were carried out to ensure strict compliance with SHCC regulations.

To enhance coordination and effectiveness, targeted joint operations were conducted by the SHCC Directorate of Anti-Quackery in conjunction with district administration teams, supported by law enforcement agencies.

Last year, SHCC's Anti-Quackery Unit conducted over 7300 inspections, resulting in the closure of 2184 quack outlets and issuance of 2159 warning notices. Notably, 1876 practitioners were found to be operating in compliance with the law.

In a proactive move to enhance the sustainability of anti-quackery operations, SHCC Director Anti-Quackery S. Zeehan A Shah initiated efforts to acquire accurate taluka-wise data on quackery from District Health Offices (DHOs), with the assistance of District Deputy Commissioners. This data-driven approach aims to reduce the recurrence of health crises, such as HIV outbreaks, by targeting unchecked and unregistered healthcare establishments province-wide.

Key support from the District Government, Inspector General (IG) Office, and Health Ministry has been pivotal in expanding operations under a wider scope, leveraging authenticated data intelligence and public awareness campaigns to reinforce the Anti-Quackery Drive across Sindh.—RT

Fundraising Event Held For Gaza Relief

KARACHI: Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman, President of the Al-Khidmat Foundation, announced that over 34,000 innocent people have been killed in Palestine, leaving hundreds of thousands without shelter, food, and water. He spoke at a fundraising event organized by Chairman Sehar Foundation and Justice of Peace, Danish Aman, Zahid Hameed, and Friends of Al-Khidmat. The event was attended by prominent figures including Dost Muhammad Rahimoon, Sindh Minister for Environment, Climate Change & Coastal Development, MPA Barrister Hallar Wassan, Additional I.G Police Javed Alam Odho, and other city elites.



Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman detailed the severe violence and oppression in Gaza, stating, "Gaza, covering just 365 square kilometers with 2.4 million residents, is heavily restricted, with limited access to travel and education." He explained the dire situation, noting, "60% of Gaza's electricity comes from Israel, while 40% is from generators. Water supplies and pipelines from Israel have been cut, and desalination and filtration plants destroyed. Food shipments have been halted since October 7. Out of 35 hospitals, 32 have been destroyed, and

70,000 tons of explosives, more than in Hiroshima and Nagasaki, have been dropped." Highlighting Al-Khidmat's efforts, Dr. Hafeez ur Rehman said, "We are working with 11 NGOs in Turkey and Syria, and have partnered with the Red Cross in Egypt and Palestine to deliver supplies using funds from our overseas offices. Collaborating with the Foreign Office and Pakistan Army, we are sending supplies via air from Pakistan, and we plan to use naval ships with support from the Pakistan Navy."

He added, "So far, 2,080 tons of supplies have been sent, including 300 tons of medicine. We are also working on moving a field hospital from Ankara to Egypt and providing educational support for Palestinian children. Additionally, we plan to send 5 mobile hospitals, install 30 water filtration plants, and construct 5 schools, 1 hospital, and a residential building once a ceasefire is initiated." Javed Alam Odho emphasized the need for collective effort, stating, "The global influence of the Jewish community comes from their focus on education, science, technology, and trade. We must translate our emotions into actions for Palestine, as Al-Khidmat and other NGOs are doing."

Abid Sheikh from Rescue 1122 also spoke at the event, commending the initiative taken by Danish Aman, Zahid Hameed, and Friends of Al-Khidmat. In his concluding remarks, Danish Aman expressed hope for future efforts to support Gaza, urging attendees to donate generously to Al-Khidmat for the Palestinian cause.—RT

Navy Thwarts Significant Drug Smuggling Attempt In Arabian Sea

KARACHI: The Pakistan Navy (PN) on Tuesday successfully intercepted a significant drug smuggling operation in the northern Arabian Sea, according to a statement from the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR).



During a routine patrol as part of the regional maritime security patrol, the naval ship PNS Aslat seized a large quantity of narcotics. The confiscated drugs are estimated to be worth thousands of dollars in the international market.

On Saturday, the navy deployed the PNS Aslat to conduct regional maritime security patrols in the Indian Ocean. This deployment aims to safeguard merchant vessels entering and exiting Pakistani ports. Additionally, PNS Aslat's presence seeks to enhance the security of international shipping routes, ISPR said.

Throughout its mission, the warship will engage in collaborative efforts with allied nations while also undertaking independent operations. Equipped with advanced weaponry and sensors, the warship is prepared to tackle diverse threats and execute various maritime missions effectively.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Invites Chinese Textile Firms To Establish Their Plants In Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif Tuesday invited Chinese firms, especially from the textile sector, to establish plants in Pakistan stressing that the government will provide all possible facilities to Chinese industrialists and investors.

"China is an important partner in Pakistan's economic development," PM Shehbaz said while chairing a high-level review meeting regarding increasing cooperation between the two nations in various fields.

Terming Beijing as a key partner of Islamabad in economic development, the premier expressed intention to boost bilateral cooperation in agriculture, information technology (IT) and energy sectors and increase exports of Pakistani products to China.

Speaking at the huddle, also attended by Federal Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb and other senior officials, the prime minister said that the government is ardently preparing for the second phase of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

"Gwadar port will be made a logistics hub with Chinese cooperation [...] the establishment of Agriculture Demonstration Zones will be an important project in the next phase of CPEC," he said.

Underlining that China can help Pakistan in setting up a strategy for increasing its exports, the PM also directed relevant ministries to prepare new projects aimed at enhancing Pakistan-China cooperation as well as undertake measures to promote business ties.

The review meeting comes as PM Shehbaz is set to undertake his maiden visit to China in the second week of June in response to President Xi Jinping's invitation.

On the issue of safety of Chinese citizens in Pakistan, PM Shehbaz said that foolproof security will be provided to Chinese nationals and that a comprehensive security plan has already been chalked up in this regard.

The prime minister's remarks come after Beijing, on Monday, reaffirmed its commitment to continue working with Pakistani authorities to strengthen security cooperation and ensure the safety and security of Chinese personnel.

Speaking at a press conference Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Mao Ning said that Beijing will continue supporting Islamabad in the investigation of the Dasu attack to hunt down and punish the perpetrators of the terrorist attack.

The spokesperson's comment came after Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi held a joint press conference with National Counter-Terrorism Authority (Necta) officials on the issue of Dasu officials' attack which saw at least six people, including five Chinese nationals, being killed after a suicide bomber rammed into their vehicle in Bisham.

During the presser, the minister called on Afghanistan to hand over the militants involved in the deadly attack. "Pakistan has formally" requested the interim government in Afghanistan to arrest the leadership of [banned] TTP," he said.

Meanwhile, Necta head Tahir Rai revealed that said that the explosive-laden vehicle that had hit the bus carrying the Chinese nationals reached Pakistan via Afghanistan. The official revealed that 11 suspects have been arrested in this case so far. Owing to the fatal attack, the federal cabinet has approved the Economic Coordination Committee's (ECC) decision regarding the disbursement of \$2.58 million as part of the compensation package for the families of the Chinese nationals killed in the Dasu attack. —RT/Agency

Shehbaz Accuses Imran Of Misleading Public And Slandering Military

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday accused former prime minister and PTI founder Imran Khan of misleading the public and tarnishing the reputation of the military and their families. His comments came during an address at the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) General Council meeting in Lahore.

"Imran Khan, who once bowed before the military, is now misleading people about the Fall of Dhaka. He is defaming the military and their families," said Shehbaz.

Shehbaz formally handed over his responsibilities back to the party, acknowledging Nawaz Sharif's return to leadership. "The trust the party placed in me, I now return with gratitude. God has reinstated Nawaz Sharif to his position. Efforts are underway to revive the economy under Maryam Nawaz in Punjab and Nawaz Sharif at the federal level."

He condemned those who conspired against Nawaz Sharif, stating, "The faces of the conspirators are blackened, and Nawaz Sharif stands vindicated. He was unjustly punished in the Panama case with an iqama."

The prime minister also criticised Khan for his comments regarding the military and national tragedies. "Imran Khan, who once sat at the feet of soldiers, is now comparing himself with Mujibur Rehman on the Fall of Dhaka. His remarks in London about our martyrs and veterans are unforgivable. If anyone watches that video, they would want to silence him. These soldiers made their children orphans to save millions of others."

Shehbaz warned of dire consequences if Pakistan's prosperity does not return. "If Pakistan does not progress, there will be no politicians or judges left. While many judges are patriotic, a few black sheep facilitated Imran Khan's \$190 million corruption. Khan sold gifts and watches. 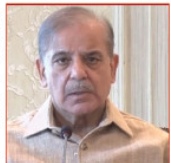
