PTI Struggles With Imran's Social Media Account Management

ISLAMABAD: After a controversial video regarding the Fall of Dhaka incident posted on Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder's official X handle, his party leaders were seemingly confused over its endorsement or a clear rejection.



Commenting on the questionable X (formerly Twitter) post, the party's lawmaker Ali Muhammad Khan claimed on Friday that Imran Khan was unaware of the post and decided to "personally approve" social media content in future.

The PTI lawmaker has dissociated the incarcerated former premier from the controversial video posted on the latter's verified X account which drew severe criticism from all quarters, including Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

Ali, while addressing a press conference in Islamabad today, clarified that Imran's point of view should be taken in a political context. He further said that the former ruling party was neither interested in discussing the 1971 incident or the elements behind it nor it was an appropriate time to recall them.

He went on to say that the Imran-founded party was still urging not to repeat the past mistakes of 1971 to 2018. The lawmaker, however, said that his party would always oppose the establishment's role in political affairs.

When a journalist questioned the politico of the person behind handling the deposed prime minister's social

media account, Ali did not name anyone and said that in future, social media content on the PTI founder's account would not be published without the latter's approval.

However, the party seemed confused over the matter as some of its leaders defended Imran's debatable X post.

Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, said that the video was shared on Imran's X account in the current political scenario.

On the other hand, PTI Central Information Secretary Raouf Hasan first demanded the conducting of a probe and then retracted his statement by saying that he did not watch the video.

Another PTI leader and a Member of the National Assembly (MNA) Zain Qureshi claimed during a private channel's programme that Imran's social media account was being handled by the party but not anyone from outside.

He also said that the party took approval from the incarcerated PTI founder before posting it to his social media accounts. To a question, Zain confirmed that

Imran's X posts were always shared by his approval and it would be endorsed as the party policy.

After facing a strong wave of criticism, the party's core committee said in a statement today that they rejected the Federal Investigation Agency's (FIA) probe into Imran's social media post. It added that the registration of a new case against the PTI founder based on a social media post would be unwarranted.

The controversial X post was attributed to the former premier, which read: "Every Pakistani should study the Hamood ur Rahman Commission Report and get to know who was the true traitor, General Yahya Khan or Sheikh Mujibur Rahman." Yesterday, the FIA's cyber-bertine wing decided to initiate action against Imran over his controversial tweet and reached Adiala Jail late Thursday night to question him.

However, the former premier refused to meet the intelligence agency's anti-cybercrime team and became part of the probe related to his controversial social media post.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Orders Reduction Of Petrol Price By Rs 4.74

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has reduced the price of petrol by Rs4.74 per litre in its third consecutive fortnightly review in light of a drop in the rate of global oil prices.



The new price of petrol has come down to Rs268.36 per litre from Rs273.10 per litre. Meantime, the high speed diesel also has been slashed by Rs3.86 per litre to Rs270.22 per litre from its previous price of Rs274.08 per litre. "The prices of Petroleum products have seen a decreasing trend in the international market during the last fortnight, states a notification from the finance ministry. "The Oil & Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) has worked out the consumer prices, based on the price variations in the international market." The new rates, which come as a relief for the inflation-hit masses, will be applicable from 12am on June 1, a notification from the Finance Division issued

on Friday read. In the last review, the federal government had approved a massive cut of Rs15.39 per litre in the petrol price and the price of diesel was reduced by Rs7.88 per litre. The prices of petroleum products are revised every 15 days in Pakistan adjusting them to the trend of global oil prices and the rupee's exchange rate to the dollar. The Pakistani rupee has held steady recently. About 85% of Pakistan's oil needs are imported,

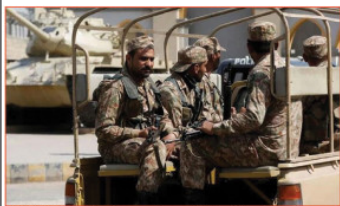
rate was estimated to be down by Rs0.25 per litre from the current rate of Rs274.08 per litre at the depot stage.

Officials said the price of petrol had gone down to about \$95 per barrel earlier in the international market, while the price of HSD had reduced to \$97 from \$99.12 per barrel. The prices of petrol and HSD had also dropped by Rs15.93 and Rs7.88 per litre, respectively, with effect from May 16.

The government has already achieved the Rs60 per litre petroleum levy — the maximum permissible limit under the law — on both petrol and HSD and collected Rs720 billion in the first nine months ending March 31. The government had set a budget target to collect Rs869bn as petroleum development levy (PDL) on petroleum products during the current fiscal year under the commitments made with the

International Monetary Fund. Higher petroleum and electricity prices have been fuelling inflation. Petrol is mostly used in private transport, small vehicles, rickshaws and two-wheelers and has a direct bearing on the budget of the middle and lower middle classes. On the other hand, HSD prices are considered highly inflationary as they are mostly used in heavy transport vehicles, trains, and agricultural engines like trucks, buses, tractors, tube wells, and threshers. They particularly add to the prices of vegetables and other eatables. Currently, the government charges about Rs82 per litre tax on petrol and HSD. Although the general sales tax is zero on all petroleum products, the government is charging Rs60 per litre PDL on both products. On the other hand, it is charging Rs50 per litre for high octane blending components and 95RON petrol.—RT/Agency

Terrorist Ringleader And Accomplice Killed In Peshawar IBO



RAWALPINDI: A terrorist ringleader and another militant were killed by the security force during an intelligence-based operation (IBO) in Peshawar district's general area Hassan Khel on Thursday night, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said.

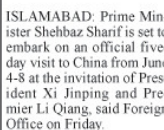
A brief statement issued by the military's media wing stated that the security forces effectively engaged the terrorists' location during the conduct of the IBO and gunned down terrorist ringleader Ayaz Muhammad and Ahmedy alias Koochi while injuring two others.

"The killed terrorists remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against security forces and killing of innocent civilians," the ISPR stated.

It said that weapons, ammunition, and explosives were also recovered from the slain terrorists.

The ISPR further stated that the successful anti-terrorist operation was appreciated by the area locals. The military's media wing reiterated the security forces' determination to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz To Begin Five-Day Visit To China On Tuesday



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif is set to embark on an official five-day visit to China from June 4-8 at the invitation of President Xi Jinping and Premier Li Qiang, said Foreign Office on Friday.

The FO, in its statement, said that during his visit, the prime minister will meet President Xi and hold delegation-level talks with Premier Li in Beijing.

He will also hold meetings with chairman of standing committee of the National People's Congress, Zhao Leji, and heads of key government departments.

PM Shehbaz will pay a visit to the economic and agricultural zones and will also address the Pakistan China Business Forum, added the FO spokesperson.

An important aspect of PM Shehbaz's visit will be meetings with corporate executives of leading Chinese companies dealing in oil and gas, energy, ICT, and emerging technologies, said the FO.

It added that the PM will also address the China-Pakistan Business Forum with leading businesspersons, entrepreneurs, and investors from both countries in Shenzhen. He will also visit Economic and Agricultural Zones in China.



The premier's visit is a manifestation of the ironclad Pakistan-China friendship characterised by frequent high-level exchanges and dialogue.

The two sides will undertake discussions to further strengthen the All-party Cooperative Partnership, upgrade China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, advance trade and investment, enhance cooperation in security and defence, energy, space, science and technology, and education, and promote cultural cooperation and people-to-people contacts, thus setting the future trajectory of Pakistan-China friendship.

Earlier today, PM Shehbaz also chaired a meeting to review the preparations for his upcoming visit to China, wherein he directed the formulation of comprehensive plans to hold result-

oriented business-to-business meetings between the two countries.

He instructed the relevant authorities to devise strategies for attracting Chinese industries to set up their units in Pakistan, assuring his government's all-out facilitation to the industrialists and investors.

The prime minister was also told that a delegation of industrialists, investors, and businessmen would accompany him to China's Shenzhen city.

The delegation would hold meetings with the Chinese business community to promote business-to-business linkages between the two countries.

The prime minister directed Pakistan's Ambassador to China Khalil Hashmi to extend all-out facilitation to the Pakistani business delegation during its visit there.—RT/Agency

Khawaja Asif Advises Imran To Refrain From Speaking To Reduce Tensions

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif Friday asked Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan to keep his "mouth shut" if he wants political tension in the country to lessen.



"I think founder PTI wants to increase tension," said the minister in an exclusive interview with media in the wake of the controversial social media post shared on Khan's official X — formerly Twitter — account.

A post on X was attributed to the former premier said: "Every Pakistani should study the Hamood ur Rahman Commission Report and get to know who was the true traitor, General Yahya Khan or Sheikh Mujibur Rahman."

Asif said the former prime minister, who remains incarcerated at the Adiala jail since August 2023, is trying again to create a situation like that on May 9.

The minister, commenting on the video in question, said attempts are being made

to retract the tweet related to the former Bangladeshi president.

"Barrister Gauhar [Khan] clarified that the social media team did not seek permission before tweeting," said the minister, adding that this was the first time that the party had to retract a post on their social media account.

Khawaja Asif said he has a different stand on the history of the Bangladeshi politician and the tragedy of East Pakistan. "By exaggerating the tragedy of East Pakistan today, you want to increase the tension," he said, slamming Khan and his

party. The minister maintained that whether it was in politics or sports, the former premier had stung everyone who had done good to him."

General [Qamar Javed] Bajwa's father, General Faiz [Hamid] was his uncle, now [he is] dumping all the debris at them," said Asif, commenting on Khan's relationship dynamics with the former military men when he was in power. Meanwhile, the Federal Investigation Agency's (FIA) cyber crime team on Thursday decided to initiate action against Khan over his controversial tweet on social media.—RT/Agency

Dr. Shahzad Baig Resigns As Head Of Pakistan's Polio Eradication Program



ISLAMABAD: Dr Shahzad Baig, coordinator of the National Emergency Operations Centre for Polio Eradication, announced his resignation from the post.

Dr Baig, who was recently included in the list of 100 most influential people across the world in the field of health in 2024 by Time magazine, confirmed the development, saying he had stepped down for "personal reasons".

The resignation of Mr Baig comes after the government decided to appoint a bureaucrat to lead the polio programme in the country.

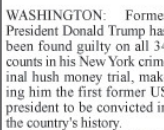
He has been facing criticism over the spread of the crippling disease in Pakistan, with the virus detected in at least 153 environmental sam-

ples across 39 districts. Pakistan has so far reported three polio cases in 2024. The third polio case of the year has been reported from Killa Abdullah district of Balochistan.

According to the Regional Reference Laboratory for Polio at the National Institute of Health, wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) was detected in stool samples collected from a child in Darozai union council of Killa Abdullah. The affected child developed symptoms of paralysis on April 20.

Meanwhile, reports said a bureaucrat would head the National Emergency Operation Centre (NEOC) for polio amid the resurgence of the virus in the country.—RT/Agency

Trump Found Guilty On All Charges In Hush Money Trial



WASHINGTON: Former President Donald Trump has been found guilty on all 34 counts in his New York criminal hush money trial, making him the first former US president to be convicted in the country's history.

The jury held deliberations for two days. The jury has set July 11 for his sentencing. New York Supreme Court Justice Juan Merchan allowed him to remain free without any need for bail.

The case centred on allegations that he falsified business records to hide a hush money payment to porn star Stormy Daniels ahead of the 2016 presidential election.



Prosecutors initially started deliberations on Wednesday. Donald Trump, while talking to the media, said, "Mother Teresa could not beat these charges. These charges are rigged. The whole country's a mess between the borders and fake

elections and you have a trial like this where the judge is so conflicted he can't breathe."

The 77-year-old said: "It's a disgrace. And I mean that. Mother Teresa could not beat these charges. But we'll see. We'll see how we do."

According to strategists, quoted by The Hill, said: "It is to Trump's benefit to create a narrative that the case is stacked against him, lowering the bar in the event he is convicted or allowing him to declare victory against a rigged system in the event he is found not guilty."

"So I'll stay around here. This is five weeks and five weeks of really essentially not campaigning, although I took a big lead in the polls over the last few weeks," he said.

"Something is going on. Because I think the people of this country see that this is a rigged deal."—RT/Agency

13 succumb to burn injuries after Hyderabad gas cylinder blast

—CM Murad enquires about health of victims

HYDERABAD: The incident involved a gas cylinder blast in a shop around 5:45 in Hyderabad. This caused a fire that quickly spread to the upper floor and adjacent buildings, resulting in significant burns for 50 people, including men, women, and children. Out of these, approximately 35 victims were seriously injured and were transferred via Sindh Integrated Emergency & Health Services (SIEHS 1122) ambulances to Karachi Patel Hospital and Civil Hospital Burn Wards, while the remaining 20 victims were taken to nearby health facilities in Hyderabad. Brigadier Tarique Quadir Lakhia, the Chief Executive Officer of SIEHS 1122, promptly directed the operation and command and control to align ambulances and paramedic staff for the incident. Thirty-five ambulances from Hyderabad, Matiari, Tando Allahyar, Tando Muhammad Khan, and Sujawal districts were deployed to the location to assist the victims. Of the 51 victims, 35 seriously injured individuals were transported to Karachi Civil and Patel Hospitals through SIEHS 1122 Ambulances, where they are currently under treatment. Commissioner Hyderabad Ahsan Ali Qureshi and DIG Hyderabad took notice of the incident and directed the Deputy Commissioner and SSP Hyderabad to visit the location and inquire about the victims. They also announced the formation of an inquiry committee to



investigate the incident, with the report to be submitted to the Chief Minister of Sindh. Upon the victims' arrival at Patel Hospital and Civil Hospital Karachi, Chief Minister Sindh Syed Murad Ali Shah and his cabinet visited the hospitals to inquire about the victims' health conditions. The CM emphasized the need for doctors to be vigilant and provide the best care to the victims. Tragically, one victim died en route to Karachi, and six others passed away in Patel Hospital and Civil Hospital Karachi. Their bodies were transported via SIEHS 1122 Mortuary Vans to Hyderabad. Additionally, six more victims succumbed to their injuries at

Hilal Ahmar Hospital Hyderabad. A collective funeral prayer was held for the deceased, and they were buried at Pretabad Graveyard, Tando Yousuf Graveyard, Sattar Shah Graveyard and Muslim Town Graveyard in Hyderabad city. Commissioner Hyderabad Ahsan Ali Qureshi, DIG Hyderabad Tarique Dharejo, Deputy Commissioner Zain-ul-Abdin, Nasir Hussain, MPA, Mayor Hyderabad Kasif Shoro, and other social, political, and religious figures participated in the funeral prayer. The explosion occurred in a cylinder shop located in Pretabad Hyderabad, which supplied gas to local residential areas.

Tando Allahyar brothel operating with impunity

Growers decry shortage of water in Nabisar Subdivision

KUNRI: In response to the severe shortage of agricultural water in the irrigation subdivision of Nabisar, hundreds of residents from the Kunri Canal tail-end area, led by Nazir Muhammad Chandio and Bahadur Khan Chando, organized a protest rally starting from Mir Mori. The demonstrators marched to American Chowk, where they staged a sit-in, blocking traffic from various cities. The protesters, holding placards and banners, chanted slogans against the irrigation staff, accusing them of corruption and mismanagement. The protesters highlighted that corrupt irrigation officials and influential large farmers were depriving tail-end areas of essential agricultural water. This severe shortage has prevented them from cultivating Kharif crops, and both humans and livestock are suffering from a lack of drinking water. The demonstrators demanded immediate intervention from senior officers of the Irrigation Department, urging them to address the water distribution issues. They warned that if their demands are not met, the scope of the protest would be expanded.

HESCO continues its operation for reducing circular debt and improving its facilities

HYDERABAD: The HESCO authorities on orders of the Prime Minister of Pakistan and the Chief Executive Officer, Muhammad Roshan Otho, aimed at reducing circular debt and enhancing recovery efforts to improve electricity provision across the region. The anti-theft recovery campaign has intensified, resulting in actions against electricity thieves and offenders without discrimination. Over 67,000 individuals have been found involved in electricity theft, with over 58,000 cases filed and more than 214 electricity thieves arrested, leading to recovery exceeding 12 billion rupees. Under the supervision of Muhammad Roshan Otho, HESCO's anti-electricity theft campaign continues successfully. During the past twenty-four hours, 485 connections were caught across

the region, leading to FIRs being filed against 463 of them. Furthermore, 10 commercial, 1 industrial, and 474 domestic connections were severed, with 237,173 units charged in detection bills amounting to 5,777,012 rupees. The campaign against electricity theft is being pursued vigorously, with directives to continue until complete eradication is achieved. Operations have led to the recovery of over 12 billion rupees from over 67,000 individuals involved in electricity theft. Additionally, 214 offenders have been arrested, while one employee has been dismissed, three others arrested, and 44 suspended. The operation aims to ensure 100% recovery against offenders, with instructions to continue operations until the complete eradication of electricity theft. Moreover, new connections are being facilitated, and any issues regarding electricity bills can be resolved by contacting the customer service centers. The campaign against electricity theft will persist until its complete eradication, with strict adherence to safety protocols. The Chief Executive Officer of HESCO appealed to consumers to fulfill their obligations promptly to ensure uninterrupted electricity transmission. He emphasizes that electricity theft is both a legal and moral offense, with offenders liable to face legal consequences, including FIR registration and prosecution. In summary, the directives emphasize the intensification of efforts to combat electricity theft, ensuring recovery, and facilitating new connections while underscoring the legal and ethical implications of electricity theft and the need for collective cooperation in eradicating it.

SPARK holds meeting on rights of brick kiln laborers

UMERKOT: A non-government organization organized an introductory meeting in Umerkot about the lives of brick kiln workers, providing them with legal knowledge, fulfilling legal requirements, and pursuing legal avenues with government officials. The meeting was attended by representatives from the Labor Department, Health Department, Education Department, 15 Police Helpline In-charge, Umerkot City SHO Syed Altaf Shah, Local Council Officer Umerkot Haresh Kumar Khatri, and representatives from the Bar Association, including Advocate Sharif Bheel, Advocate Islamuddin Rahmon, Advocate Sobdar Khan Khoso, and other civil society representatives. They mentioned that the SSP Office in Umerkot has a Bonded Labor and Child Labor Complaint Cell for the rehabilitation and liaison of laborers. Brick kiln workers should contact the police officers present in this cell and bring their issues in writing so that these problems can be resolved. SPARK, a research organization, works across the country to ensure the rights of brick kiln workers. According to their survey, there are approximately 65 brick kilns in Umerkot district, none of which are registered. SPARK's District Manager, Asif Bajir, stated that there are institutions available in the district to register brick



kilns. It is essential to register these kilns with the Labor Department and the Environment Department to provide basic facilities to the workers. Former Bar Association member Sobdar Khan Khoso said that the rehabilitation of freed laborers under Section 491 should be ensured, and existing laws should be implemented. The Labor Policy of 2002 should be amended to develop a comprehensive policy to improve their lives. Rano Mal Malhi, the Secondary Schools Officer of Umerkot Taluka, emphasized the need to educate the children of brick kiln workers and run awareness campaigns to enroll out-of-school children. Umerkot City's Senior Police Officer SHO Syed Altaf Shah suggested conducting a survey to determine the number of brick kilns in the district, the number of families working there, and the number of children engaged in labor. Collecting basic information about brick kiln workers across the district is crucial. Finally, several points were discussed activating the vigilance committee formed to eliminate forced labor, ensuring the protection and accurate record-keeping of brick kiln workers' issues, establishing non-formal education centers for the education of children working at the kilns, arranging identity cards for brick kiln workers, providing birth certificates (B-Forms) for their children, installing water pumps for clean drinking water, and organizing medical camps based on needs to address various diseases. SPARK monitoring officer Wajid Jagirani, Fahmida Chachar, Syed Yawar Shah, and others also participated in the meeting.

Four of a family killed in Kashmore's Bhangwar community clash

KASHMORE: In the jurisdiction of Bakhshapur Police Station, armed individuals on motorcycles indiscriminately fired at a car at the Indus Chikko Phatak, killing four members of the same family, including two brothers. Upon receiving the information, the police arrived at the scene and shifted the injured person and the bodies to the hospital. According to initial police information, the incident occurred due to an old feud between two groups of the Bhangwar community, which had started a few years ago over a marriage dispute. The victims include two brothers, Shaban, Shaukat, Shabbir Ahmed, and Majid Ali Bhangwar. The relatives of the victims placed the bodies on the Indus Highway and staged a protest, blocking the road to demand the immediate arrest of the culprits. 

Balochistan's Home Minister Announces Arrest Of Two Suspects In Gwadar Killings

while they were asleep in their residential quarters near the Gwadar Fish Harbour in the Sirbandar area in the coastal town earlier this month.

"I congratulate all our institutions who fulfilled their responsibility and the government's orders with their efforts and we have arrested two killers of the Gwadar labourers," Langau said while addressing a press conference in Quetta.

As per the statements taken from the suspects, the minister said, they were given orders to kill any Punjabi labourer.

He further stated that guns and weapons had been seized from the arrested suspects. —RT/Agency



Hyderabad's civic nightmare exposed!

The recent cylinder blast in Hyderabad's Paretabad area, which tragically claimed seven lives, including five children, is a grim reminder of the pervasive safety issues surrounding the unregulated use of gas cylinders in Pakistan. This incident, which left many others wounded and caused widespread panic, underscores the dire consequences of inadequate civic amenities and lax regulatory oversight.

Despite Mayor Kashif Shoro's vow to crack down on illegal LNG businesses, the incident highlights a deeper, systemic problem. The explosion's aftermath—marked by the late arrival of firefighters and the need to transfer critically injured victims to Karachi—exposes the city's unpreparedness for such emergencies. The residents' anger over the delayed response from emergency services is justified and reflects broader frustrations with the

city's infrastructure.

In Hyderabad and many other urban centers across Pakistan, citizens are often forced to improvise due to



the lack of reliable gas supply. This reliance on illegally operated LPG refilling shops is a dangerous improvisation, born out of necessity rather than choice. The tragic incident in Paretabad is not an isolated case but a symptom of a larger issue that plagues the nation. The government's failure to provide basic utilities safely and reliably drives people to seek alternative, often unsafe, solutions.

The mayor's actions to seal illegal cylinder shops are a necessary step, but they address only the symptoms rather than the root cause. For meaningful change, there must be a comprehensive overhaul of the gas supply infrastructure and stricter enforcement of safety regulations. This tragedy should serve as a wake-up call for authorities to prioritize the development of safe, reliable utility services and to ensure that no family has to suffer such a loss again.

In modern-day Pakistan, where civic amenities should be a given, the reality is starkly different. The words "modern-day" ring hollow when basic safety cannot be assured, and citizens are left to fend for themselves in a hazardous environment. This tragedy is a call to action for both local and national authorities to bridge this gap urgently.

Pakistan team recently impressed during the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup in Malaysia but lost in the final to Japan on penalty shootout.

Pakistan hockey was at an all-time low when they failed to qualify for the Olympics, where they won three gold medals, for the third consecutive time earlier this year. Additionally, the Green Shirts also failed to qualify for the World Cup, where they bagged gold four times in the past, last year.—Agency

West Indies thump Australia in T20 World Cup warm-up run-fest

PORT OF SPAIN: Nicholas Pooran and Rovman Powell scored swashbuckling half-centuries and lifted West Indies to down Australia in a high-scoring ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 warm-up match here on Thursday.

Put into bat first, West Indies racked up a mammoth total of 257/4 with Pooran and Powell leading the attack.

The hosts got off to a briefly flying start to their innings as they lost Shai Hope in the third over with 38 runs on the board. Hope scored 14 off eight deliveries.

Wicketkeeper batter Pooran then joined Johnson Charles in the middle and launched a belligerent attack on the Australian bowlers.

Pooran smashed five fours and eight sixes on his way to an astonishing 75-run knock from 25 deliveries before being dismissed by Adam Zampa in the 10th over.

Charles was then involved in another partnership for the West Indies when he added 48 runs for the third wicket with skipper Rovman Powell before finally perishing in the 14th over.

Sherfane Rutherford then took the reigns of West Indies' batting charge with a blistering cameo and scored an unbeaten 47 off 18 balls, bolstering the home team's total past the 250-run mark in the allotted overs.

Adam Zampa bagged two wickets for Australia but was expensive while Ashton Agar and Tim David made one scalp each.

In response, Australia finished at 222/7 despite a brisk half-century from Josh Inglis.

The right-handed batter top-scored for Australia with a 50-ball 55 with the help of five fours and four sixes while batting at No. 4.

Their opening partnership against England saw them surpass the likes of Chris Gayle and Virat Kohli, who had 23 fifty-plus scores for the Indian Premier League (IPL) franchise Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB).

Babar and Rizwan now have 3,227 runs as a pair in T20s and are only behind Kohli and AB de Villiers, who scored 3,175 runs as a duo for the RCB.

Earlier, Pakistan captain Babar Azam became only the second batter to complete 4000 runs in T20s.

FIA Karachi Owes Over Rs 3 Crores To K-Electric

KARACHI: K-Electric on Friday issued a warning to cut off electricity to Karachi's Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) complex building, if the dues - amounting to Rs 40 million - remain unpaid, media reported on Friday.



According to the details, the power distribution company, K-Electric, has issued a final notice demanding the remaining payment to be deposited in the account of the electricity bill by June 20.

The power distributor warned that the electricity connection would be disconnected if the payment is not made till the assigned date.

The complex reportedly has only one commercial meter installed for its four-storey structure.

The current bill for May stands at Rs 32,550,120 while the total outstanding amount is Rs 40 million.

However, the last payment towards the building's bill was made on June 21.

The significant departments of FIA complex in-

cluding the Cybercrime Wing, Counter-Terrorism Wing, and Anti-Money Laundering and VCFT Wing, with 50 rooms and more than four dozen air conditioners installed.

Last week, K-Electric issued a stern warning to cut off electricity to the departments of the Sindh government over remaining dues amounting to billions of rupees.

Sources close to the development revealed that the Government of Sindh and the Karachi Water and Sewerage Board (KWSB) have not made any payments to K-Electric since January.

The non-payment of dues has led to a financial

crisis for K-Electric, causing significant difficulties in network maintenance. In response to these unpaid dues, KE issued letters to key officials, including the Sindh Secretary of Finance and the Mayor of Karachi, urging immediate payment of the outstanding electricity bills. In May, K-Electric sent five letters to remind immediate payment of the remaining dues.

The Water and Sewerage Board alone owes K-Electric 5 billion rupees.

K-Electric has warned that if payments are not made soon, the network could fail, leading to prolonged power outages in the metropolis.—RT/Agency

Sindh To Develop Unified Labour Law: Murad

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah announced plans to develop a unified labour law by consolidating, simplifying, and rationalizing existing laws in consultation with social partners. He shared this during a meeting with a six-member International Labour Organisation (ILO) delegation led by Country Director Geir Tonsto at CM House.



Provincial ministers Nasir Shah, Saeed Ghani, Shahid Thahim, Chief Secretary Asif Hyder Shah, and other officials were present. Mr. Shah thanked the ILO for its technical assistance in drafting the Labour Code of Sindh. The draft consolidates 21 laws covering occupational safety, health, industrial relations, and working conditions.

The draft Labour Code incorporates ILO supervisory

bodies' comments on legislative amendments. The consolidation aims for modernization, efficiency, and fairness, rather than merely combining existing laws. The unified code will provide consistent rights and responsibilities for businesses and workers, simplifying navigation of legal provisions and ensuring clearer regulatory roles.

The CM noted that the unified code supports the province's targets under vari-

ous United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The 19 laws included in the Sindh Labour Code address issues from child labour to occupational safety. ILO Country Director Geir Tonsto emphasized the importance of social dialogue to finalize the draft Labour Code before parliamentary submission and suggested developing further regulatory frameworks to enhance compliance and provide capacity building for stakeholders.

Gadap City Police Seize 500 Liters Of Iranian Diesel

Three Arrested For Starting Forest Fires In Margalla Hills

ISLAMABAD: The district administration of federal capital on Friday took three people into custody on suspicion of Margalla Hills "arson" as authorities continued to battle the forest fires for the fourth consecutive day.

Since Tuesday, the fire has intermittently erupted in the Islamabad hills. Officials are yet to confirm if the fires are related to the high temperatures or due to arson.

Confirming the report Islamabad Deputy Commissioner Irfan Nawaz Memon said, "Three persons have been arrested on suspicion of setting fire on Margalla Hills."

He made the remarks during his interaction with journalists when he reached the spot to review the fire extinguishing process.

Precautionary measures have been taken to keep the fire away from the residential areas, he added. "Helicopters and firefighters are taking part in the fire extinguishing process."



Doubting about man-made fire, the DC said that cases had been lodged against 15 people two days ago. He further said that more arrests would be made in this regard in days to come.

He urged the people to identify the people involved in the fire. Meanwhile, a spokesperson of the Capital Development Authority (CDA) said that the fire broke out in South Asia sweltering in a hotter summer this year — a trend scientists say has been worsened by human-driven climate change.

Plumes of smoke could be seen rising from a raging fire in the hills of Islamabad with temperatures hitting 41 degrees centigrade on Friday afternoon.

"It is difficult to get a fire brigade there, rescue officials are trying how to douse the fire," a police official in Islamabad, Sohail Khan, told Reuters, adding that it was not certain if the fires were heat-related or cases of arson. A spokesman for the Islamabad police said they were investigating the reasons for the fire and a special team had been formed for the probe by the city's police chief.

A member of the Islamabad Wildlife Board, Waqar Zakaria, said the fire could be a case of "wilful arson", adding that high temperatures have continued longer than usual and May has been drier than normal, leading to fires spreading faster because of dry vegetation. An area in Punjab close to Islamabad,

Kallar Kahar, also saw fire engulf 25 acres of grassland, the province's disaster management (PDMA) said, adding that the flames, which had spread rapidly, had been contained. "The Kallar Kahar forest fire might be a heat-related eruption," PDMA spokesman Mazhar Hussain told Reuters. Forest fires were also seen in Lower Dir, 250km northwest of Islamabad, resident Mohammad Jilil told Reuters by phone, adding that the flames had begun engulfing hundreds of trees four days ago and were yet to be controlled. Pakistan is seen by global organisations as one of the most vulnerable countries to extreme weather and climate change.

In 2022, floods wreaked havoc in the country, killing over 1,700 people and displacing millions in India, at least 15 people died of suspected heat-stroke on Thursday with the region gripped by a debilitating heatwave expected to continue until Saturday.—RT/Agency

Pakistan And UK To Partner On Law Enforcement And Criminal Justice Matters

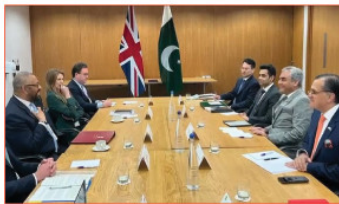
LONDON: The governments of Pakistan and the United Kingdom on Friday signed a letter of intent (LOI) to collaborate on law enforcement cooperation and criminal justice issues.

Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi and UK Home Secretary James Cleverly witnessed the signing of LOI between both governments. High Commissioner, Dr Mohammad Faisal signed the letter on Pakistan government's behalf.

The LOI specifically addresses the issues to tackle illegal migration and organised immigration crime and to exploring future opportunities that benefit both countries.

It will also facilitate liaison between UK and Pakistan law enforcement agencies, in support of joint efforts to tackle transnational crime, including narcotics control, investigations of serious criminality and organised immigration crime.

The cooperation, under the implementation mechanism, will be overseen by a joint steering committee, chaired by the Ministry of Interior (MOI) and comprising of representatives of Interior Ministry, National Police Bureau, British High Commission (supported by the Home Office), the programme team and other relevant agencies.



This agreement will help establish cooperation in the ability to share international criminal conviction data and analytics to prepare pre-emptive plans for crime prevention. Improving joint collaboration to tackle illicit finance threats, detecting criminality at air and sea borders, improving the ability to facilitate extradition requests between both countries.

The letter will also help in creating awareness and understanding of the mutual legal assistance process in both countries. One of its important parts is capacity building which encompasses exchange of information and knowledge, exchange of experts, field trips, training of staff, joint projects, conferences, workshops and provision of specific equipment.

Progress on achievements under the LOI would be undertaken through yearly review. Earlier, during the one-

on-meeting Minister for Interior, Mohsin Naqvi and Home Secretary of UK, James Cleverly discussed measures to further strengthen Pakistan-UK bilateral relations and collaborations to resolve issues jointly.

Naqvi said that UK is a long-term partner of Pakistan and that government to government and people to people contacts between both countries were at unprecedented levels. Meanwhile, Cleverly said that UK highly values relations with Pakistan and appreciated its support and cooperation in evacuating British citizens from Afghanistan.

He added that contribution of Pakistani diaspora in UK is extremely significant in the areas of cultural, social and economic domains. He lauded Naqvi's dedication to public service during his stint as caretaker chief minister of Punjab.—RT/Agency

Imran Khan in three cases of arson in Lahore's Jinnah House, Askari Tower and Shadmam police station. The court, while extending the PTI founder's interim bail until June 7 in the three cases, summoned the lawyers for arguments on next hearing.—RT/Agency

Law Minister And Attorney General Meet Chief Election Commissioner



ISLAMABAD: The federal law minister and the attorney general for Pakistan have met the chief election commissioner (CEC), Law Minister Azam Nasser Tarar met Chief Election Commissioner Sikandar Sultan Raja and discussed appointment of retired judges in the election tribunals. Budget allocation of various departments and other matters also were discussed in the meeting. After the meeting, the federal law minister stated that no discussion on Election Tribunal Ordinance was held and some parliamentary affairs and budget allocation of the Election Commission of Pakistan were discussed.—RT/Agency

US To Maintain 'Regional Security Dialogue' With Pakistan

WASHINGTON: The US State Department has reiterated its resolve to continue working with Pakistan on counterterrorism issues.

Addressing a press briefing in Washington, State Department Principal Deputy Spokesperson Vedant Patel said that the US has been in regular communication with Pakistani leaders on counterterrorism issues.

The spokesperson's statement came when responding to a question about the martyrdom of Pakistani soldiers conducting operations along the Afghan border.

"We're going to continue to discuss regional security in detail including through high level engagements, working level engagements and other extensive bilateral consultations," he said, responding to the query.

The question was asked in the wake of the Pakistan Army's intelligence-based operations (IBOs) conducted against terrorists in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa during which five brave soldiers were martyred.

At least 92% of all fatalities and 86% of attacks, including those related to terrorism and security forces operations, were recorded in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan provinces in the first quarter of 2024.

These key findings were revealed in the Q1 2024 Security Report issued by Centre for Research and Security Studies (CRSS), detailing that the country witnessed at least 432 violence-linked fatalities and 370 injuries among civilians, security personnel and outlaws resulting from as many as 245 incidents of terror attacks and counter-terror operations.

Patel also reiterated Washington's "deep relationship" with Islamabad over a number of key areas with regards to the country's economy and security.

"We'll look for ways in



which we can continue to deepen cooperation, particularly in the areas of the economy and security as well."

The spokesperson's statement came after he was questioned about the Dubai property leaks and Pakistan's dwindling economy in the wake of Islamabad's ongoing programme with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and other avenues of acquiring funds for keeping financial risks at bay.

The question to Patel was posed in the wake of the Dubai property leaks that saw the names of several Pakistani businessmen and politicians on the list of people who own properties in the United Arab Emirates' posh metropolis.—RT/Agency

IHC Declines To Conclude Case Without Poet Ahmed Farhad's Personal Appearance

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has turned down the federal government's plea for wrapping up Ahmed Farhad's recovery case until the Kashmiri poet's in-person appearance in the hearing.

IHC's Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kayani heard a petition filed by the missing poet Farhad's wife, Urooj Zainab, who was being represented by human rights lawyers Imaan Mazari and Hadi Ali, whereas, Additional Attorney General Munawwar Iqbal General Muzaffarabud under different sections of the Anti-Terrorism Act (ATA).

After listening to the arguments from both parties, Justice Kayani rejected the additional attorney general's plea. The jurist remarked that the case would be concluded on the day when Farhad is produced before the court.

Later, the court adjourned the hearing till June 14.—RT/Agency



On Wednesday, the Attorney General for Pakistan, Mansoor Usman Awan, Wednesday informed the high court that the poet has been "arrested and currently in police custody" in AJK.

Zainab, Farhad's wife who moved IHC on May 15, sought her husband's recovery and requested the court to identify, investigate, and prosecute those responsible for his disappearance. A report by the DhirKot Kashmir police station was also presented before the court.

Farhad, known for his defiant prose, was allegedly abducted from his house on June 14.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Calls On India To Cease Suppression Of Political Activists And Intimidation Of Kashmiris

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Friday reiterated its call for India to stop its ongoing campaign to suppress political activists and intimidate the Kashmiri public in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir.

"The headquarters of the All Parties Hurriyat Conference in Srinagar also remains sealed. India must stop its ongoing campaign to suppress political activists and intimidate the Kashmiri public. The people of Jammu and Kashmir should be able to freely exercise their right to self-determination as enshrined in the relevant UN Security Council resolutions," Foreign Office spokesperson Mumtaz Zahra Baloch said at the weekly press briefing here.

Highlighting the unabated Indian campaign to crush dissent in IIOJK and the confiscation of properties, the spokesperson said that earlier this week, the properties, including lands and a shop of two more Kashmiri youth, were sealed in Shopian district.

The Indian authorities have so far seized hundreds of properties across the occupied territory to punish Kashmiri activists, she

About Azeri Foreign Minister Jeyhun Bayramov's visit to Pakistan, Baloch said that during his visit from May 29-30, Minister Bayramov met Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Acting President Yousof Raza Gilani, besides holding in-depth talks with Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar.

She said that the two sides reaffirmed their commitment to further strengthen bilateral strategic relations and broaden the
