Live Streaming Of Cases Involving Political Figures May Lead To Point Scoring: SC

ISLAMABAD: Justifying its rejection of the KP government's plan for live streaming the NAB amendments case hearing, the Supreme Court of Pakistan has stated that broadcasting of the court proceedings of cases involving politicians can be used for political "point-scoring".



The top court on Saturday issued a detailed verdict on Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government petition seeking live streaming of the hearing of the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) amendment case.

Referring to Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, the apex court stated that when the head of a political party wants to be heard, who is not an advocate of this court, there is a real probability that these hearings may be used for political purposes and point-scoring and in respect of matters which do not concern these appeals.

The application for the live streaming was rejected by the apex court in a 4-1 verdict on May 30 with Justice Athar Minallah disagreeing with the majority judgement.

The case was heard by a five-member SC larger bench headed by Chief Justice Qazi

Faez Isa and comprising Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Minallah and Justice Hasan Azhar Rizvi.

"This was a paramount consideration when we had dismissed the application. And, our apprehension proved correct later in the day. When Mr. Niazi [PTI founder Imran Khan] addressed this Court on (30 May 2024) he also mentioned other cases, the general elections held on 8 February 2023, a commission of inquiry and his incarceration. In these matters have nothing to do with the subject matter of these appeals. This cannot be permitted as it would thwart the proper administration of justice," read the order.

It further added that commenting on matters not under consideration may affect

public perception, and the rights of those who are not before us, including their fundamental right to fair trial and due process may also be affected. The application, in addition to being not maintainable, has no merit, the order said adding that the KP advocate general has also not stated "why the sudden interest, or desire, for live-streaming, when his Government did not join the hearings of CP No. 21/2022, let alone make a similar request when this Court was hearing the petition". In conclusion, we would like to add that while a request to live broadcast or live-stream may be submitted, and may also be objected to, it is clarified that this, as matters presently stand, is in the exclusive domain of this Court," it added.—RT/Agency

FIA Summons Top PTI Leaders Over Imran's Controversial Post On Fall Of Dhaka

A day after several Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leaders made contradictory remarks on the controversy surrounding a video about the 1971 fall of Dhaka posted from party founder's X account, the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) on Saturday issued notices to three more PTI leaders.

As per the notices, PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Khan, Secretary General Omar Ayub Khan and Information Secretary Raouf Hasan have been summoned before the probe agency at 11am on Wednesday.

The controversial post on X, formerly Twitter, was attributed to the deposed premier, which read: "Every Pakistani should study the Hamood ur Rahman Commission Report and get to know who was the true traitor, General Yahya Khan or Sheikh Mujibur Rahman."

On Thursday, the FIA's Cyber Crime Reporting Cen-



ter notified the PTI founder, who remains incarcerated at Adiala jail, of initiating an action against him over his controversial tweet and reached the prison later that night to question him.

However, the former premier had refused to meet the probe agency's anti-cyber-crime team and become part of the probe related to his controversial social media post.

The FIA had raised objection on the alleged "misuse" of Imran's verified X account through which "highly ob-

noxious and inciting content against state institutions" had been shared.

The notice, a copy of which is available with Geo News, stated that the said post was "likely to cause fear or alarm in the public and may induce/provoke anyone to commit an offence against the state or state institution or public tranquility".

The PTI trio was directed to appear in person before FIA Sub-Inspector Muhammad Monib Zafar to record their statements in their defence at the FIA Cyber Crime

Reporting Centre on Wednesday "in the interest of justice".

"In case of non-appearance, proceedings u/s 174 PPC, will be initiated against you," the notification said, referring to Pakistan Penal Code Section 174 (non-attendance in obedience to an order from public servant).

It may be noted that the PTI members including the three top leaders, Ali Muhammad Khan and National Assembly member Zain Qureshi seemed confused over its endorsement or a clear rejection of the controversial post from the founder's X handle.

Commenting on the questionable X post, the party's lawmaker Ali Muhammad Khan claimed on Friday that Imran was unaware of the post and decided to "personally approve" social media content in future.

The PTI lawmaker dissociated the imprisoned former premier from the controversial video posted on the latter's verified X account which drew severe criticism from all quarters, including Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

Meanwhile, Barrister Gohar said that the video was shared on Imran's X account in the current political scenario. On the other hand, Hasan first demanded the conducting of a probe and then retracted his statement by saying that he did not watch the video. After facing a strong wave of criticism, the party's core committee said in a statement a day earlier that they rejected the FIA probe into Imran's social media post. It added that the registration of a new case against the PTI founder based on a social media post would be unwarranted.—RT/Agency

Anti-Terrorism Court Orders Medical Examination Of Poet Ahmed Farhad

MUZAFFARABAD: An anti-terrorism court in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) Saturday ordered a medical examination of poet Ahmed Farhad by a team of doctors from the Abbas Institute of Medical Sciences.



The development came during the hearing of case involving Farhad whose counsel requested the court to have the Kashmiri poet medically examined.

Farhad, as per his lawyer Iman Mazari was transferred to Muzaffarabad from DhirKot under multiple sections of the Anti-Terrorism Act (ATA).

With the government's lawyer requesting time to submit his response, the court adjourned the case till June 3.

Farhad, known for his defiant prose, was allegedly abducted from his house on May 14 after which his wife Urooj Zainab moved the Islamabad High Court (IHC) seeking her husband's recovery along with requesting

the court to identify, investigate, and prosecute those responsible for his disappearance.

In response to IHC's directions to recover the missing poet, Attorney General of Pakistan (AGP) Mansoor Usman Awan on May 29, revealed that Farhad was arrested and in AJK Police's custody.

Following the development, the poet's family met him at the Kahori police station situated outside Muzaffarabad.

Following the meeting, the brother of the poet told reporters the condition of

Farhad was stable and they would now fight a legal battle in AJK.

A day earlier, the IHC turned down the federal government's plea to wrap up Farhad's recovery case till he appears personally in the hearing. IHC's Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kayani, while hearing a petition filed by the poet's wife, rejected the additional attorney general's plea stressing that the case would be concluded on the day when Farhad is produced before the court. The court then adjourned the case till June 7.—RT/Agency

PM Applauds FBR For Surpassing May Tax Collection Target



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif appreciated Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) officials for surpassing the tax collection target during May 2024.

In a statement, the prime minister said the FBR team had collected taxes of Rs 760 billion during May 2024 against the set target of Rs 745 billion, for which it deserved appreciation.

He highlighted that during the period July-May 2023-24, the tax collection witnessed an increase of 31% against same period of previous year while in May 2024, the tax revenue increased by 43% against same month of the year 2023.

"The significant increase in tax collection shows dedication and hard work by the FBR team," he added.

The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) exceeded its revenue target by collecting Rs760 billion during the month of May 2024 against the target of Rs745 billion.

The overall revenues grew by 31 per cent during the first eleven months (July-May) of the fiscal year 2023-24 as compared to the same period last year.

On year-on-year basis, the collections in May 2024 witnessed remarkable growth of 33% as compared to May 2023.

The growth in domestic taxes has been 43% during the month which is very impressive, the statement said adding it has been the policy of the government to mobilize more resources from the domestic taxes.—RT/Agency

Azam Tarar Advocates For Appointing Minority Judges In Higher Judiciary

LAHORE: Federal Minister for Law, Justice and Human Rights Senator Azam Tarar has expressed his aspiration for judges from minority communities to join Pakistan's higher judiciary.



Speaking at the Justice A.R. Cornelius Conference, he emphasised the importance of religious freedom and minority rights in Pakistan. The event was organized by the Bright Future Society and Implementation Minority Rights Forum Pakistan.

He highlighted that Pakistan's Constitution guarantees complete religious freedom, aligning with Islamic teachings on the rights of minorities.

He lamented the decline in religious tolerance post-Afghan war but reiterated Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah's vision of a united, tolerant society.

Azam Tarar mentioned the ongoing efforts to establish a Minority Rights Commission and proposed reserving quotas for minority law officers and legal advisors.

The Minister praised retired Justice Tassaduq Hus-

sein Jilani for his landmark decisions benefiting minorities, and lauded Justice Cornelius for his legacy of equal justice.

Supreme Court Justice Mansoor Ali Shah echoed Tarar's sentiments, noting the Constitution's protection of minority rights and advocating for the appointment of minority judges to the higher judiciary.

Speakers at the conference, including senior judges and legal experts, paid tribute to Justice Cornelius and discussed the constitutional protections for

minorities. They highlighted Justice Cornelius' impactful career and the 2014 Supreme Court guidelines under Justice Jilani aimed at safeguarding minority rights.

The conference concluded with the distribution of certificates to distinguished guests, attended by prominent figures including Supreme Court Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Dr. Syed Muhammad Anwar, Justice Ali Baqar Najafi, and retired Justice Tassaduq Hussain Jilani, among others.—RT/Agency

PTI Responds To Government's Offer Of Dialogue

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) reacted to the dialogue offer from Minister for Petroleum Division and PML-N leader Mudasir Khan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Governor Faisal Karim Kundi, media reported.



In a statement issued here, the PTI spokesman termed the offer, from those who have 'no authority or credibility' to mediate, as ridiculous.

The PTI spokesperson said that those who offered to hold talks were "imposed through fake mandate".

"National criminals do not have the authority to take decisions in the interest of the nation, nor is there room for reconciliation," it added.

The PTI made it clear that it would not hold talks with "mandate thieves" including Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, Pakistan People's Party, and Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan.

"Instead of propagating talks offer without having authority, this mandate they group should apologise to the nation and return the mandate to real representatives," the PTI spokesman added.

Earlier in the day, Minister for Petroleum Division Mudasir Khan said that there were always doors open in politics and PML-N leadership always called for reconciliation and dialogue. "Our party [PML-N] leadership always stressed the need for a charter of economy and democracy," he said while

addressing a press conference. The minister also noted that his party wants to move forward with all political forces. Malik further said that the PTI-led government put all PML-N leaders, including Khawaja Saad Rafique, Khawaja Asif and Shehbaz Shehbaz, behind bars. He also lamented PTI's "double standards" over holding dialogue, saying that they weren't interested in holding talks with PML-N. "They [PTI] want to talk to United States and Donald Lu," he alleged.—RT/Agency

LHC Petitioned Over Defiance Of PM's Directives On Petrol Prices

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court (LHC) moved on Saturday over defying Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif's directives of massive drop in petrol prices, media reported.

As per details, the petition was filed by Azhar Siddique, challenging the finance ministry's decision to ignore the Prime Minister's recommendation to reduce the price of petrol by Rs 15 per liter.

Despite a significant decline in global petroleum prices, the Ministry of Finance only reduced the price by Rs 4.74 per liter, the petition stated.

Siddique urged the court to order Finance Ministry to reduce the petrol prices as per the prime minister's recommendations.

Yesterday, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif directed the Ministry of Finance to cut



the price of petrol by Rs 15.4 per liter.

The Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif in a statement directed the finance minister to further slash the price of petrol by Rs 15.4 per liter and that of diesel by Rs 7.9 per liter.

However, the Finance Ministry reduced the prices of petrol by Rs 4.74 per litre and diesel by Rs 3.86 per litre. After a reduction of Rs 4.74, the new petrol price were fixed at Rs 268.36 per litre. The price of high-speed diesel (HSD) decreased by Rs 3.86 to Rs 270.94 per litre.—RT/Agency

Voices Within PML-N Raised Against NAB Ordinance: MQM-Pakistan's Khalid Maqbool

ISLAMABAD: The Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) Convener Dr Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui said that voices within PML-N being raised against NAB ordinance, ARY News reported.



Federal Minister Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui expressed his concerns about the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) ordinance, terming it "dangerous" and "flawed".

He stated that in civilized societies, the responsibility is on the accused to prove the innocence, but NAB's law is "unique" as it requires the accused to prove their innocence.

Siddiqui criticized the ordinance, saying it is being used to victimize political opponents which indicates the government failure.

The minister also hinted that the ordinance may not last for long. He revealed that even within the PML-N, voices are being raised against the NAB ordinance, and MQM also agrees that the ordinance needs to be reviewed.

He mentioned his conversation with the Governor of Sindh regarding the short-term kidnapping issue saying that the governor will discuss the issue with PM Shehbaz.

Earlier, acting President Yousuf Raza Gilani announced an ordinance to amend the existing law, empowering the NAB to keep an accused on physical remand for up to 40 days as

Before the ordinance, a person arrested by the NAB could be remanded into the bureau's custody for 14 days. However, under the amended law, the duration of physical remand has been increased to 40 days.

Furthermore, the punishment for NAB officials for making false cases has been reduced from 5 years to 2 years.

The ordinance was passed amidst a hearing of the NAB amendments case by the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan, challenged by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan.

The previous Pakistan Democratic Movement-led (PDM) government approved amendments to the National Accountability Ordinance 1999 in a bid to curtail the powers of the National Accountability Bureau (NAB).—RT/Agency

PIA's Hajj Flight Makes Emergency Landing In Riyadh

The Hajj flight took off at 10pm Saturday from the Jinnah International Airport in Karachi for Jeddah. But it was diverted to Riyadh for an emergency landing.

Earlier, a passenger told Geo News that an explosion was heard during the flight. As soon as the unexpected sound was reported, the plane was diverted to and landed in Riyadh.

Following the emergency landing, passengers were offloaded from the Boeing 777 plane and shifted to the lounge at the Riyadh airport.

A PIA spokesperson said



the pilot received a high temperature warning in the cargo cabin during the flight after the landing was made in the Saudi capital.

However, after inspection, it was found out that the warning was false and the flight departed to Jeddah following a quick check.

Several air incidents have recently made headlines around the world with passengers worried for their safety.

Just a week ago, one passenger died of a suspected heart attack and 30 were injured after a Singapore Airlines flight hit severe turbulence on May 21, furling passengers and crew around the cabin and forcing the plane to land in Bangkok.

Similarly, 12 people travelling on a Qatar Airways flight from Doha to Ireland were injured during a bout of turbulence, Dublin Airport said on May 26, adding that the plane landed safely and as scheduled. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Reports Fourth Polio Case In 2024

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Saturday reported the fourth poliovirus case of the current year, media reported citing sources within the Ministry of National Health.

A 2-year-old boy from Bharkhan union council in Sindh's Shikarpur district became the latest victim.

The health department official said the virus was de-

tected in stool samples collected from a child, adding that he had developed symptoms of paralysis on May 21.

This is the fourth polio case in 2024 as Pakistan had earlier reported three cases. All of the previous three cases reported this year were from Balochistan.

Pakistan and Afghanistan are the only two countries in

the world where the poliovirus, which causes paralysis and can be a life-threatening disease, is endemic.

Last year, six polio cases were reported in the country which included four from the northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province and two from the southern port city of Karachi. —RT/Agency

-Can you believe this madness? Power Tariff Increased By Rs 3.76 Per Unit

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has approved an increase of Rs 3.76 per unit in power tariff, media reported.

As per details, the power regulatory authority has forwarded the decision of power tariff hike to the federal government, who will issue the formal notification.

As a result of the latest hike in electricity prices, consumers will face higher electricity bills, with additional rates of Rs 1.90 per unit in June, Rs 1.93 per unit in July, and Rs 1.93 per unit in August.

Furthermore, this tariff hike will add an additional burden of Rs 46.61 billion on electricity consumers and will also be applicable to K-electric consumers.

Yesterday sources revealed, that Pakistan government is expected to unveil a new relief package aimed at small consumers who use up to 200 units of electricity monthly, media



reported

Sources said that PM Shehbaz Sharif directed that there should be no increase in power tariffs for those consuming 200-unit monthly consumers.

Sources from the Prime Minister's Office indicated that Shehbaz Sharif rejected the economic team's proposal to increase electricity rates for protected consumers.

Instead, a subsidy will be provided to these consumers, ensuring that approximately 20 million protected users will not face a hike in electricity tariffs in the upcoming fiscal year 2024-25. —RT/Agency

Ramesh Kumar Hints At Major Political Changes After The Budget

ISLAMABAD: People's Party leader Dr Ramesh Kumar has hinted at change in government and worsening political conditions in an interview with the media.

Dr Ramesh Kumar said, he was seeing worsening situation and change of the government this year. "The situation will further worsen after a difficult budget," talking to media he said.

"I am knowing things thus not seeing the PML-N government to remain in power," he said. "After difficult conditions where the game will head will clear in September and October," he said.

The fire has destroyed around eight kilometers of the forest as smoke causes breathing problems in the nearby localities.

Area residents have alleged that each year forests of Azad Kashmir set on fire, but the administration has failed to take any step to prevent it.

It is to be mentioned here that in Lower Dir district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa a forest fire could not be extinguished even after five days.



Fire also broke out in hilly terrain of Karak that could destroy trees, precious shrubs and wildlife in woods.

A wildfire again erupted at Margalla Hills National Park in Islamabad on Friday due to severe heatwave conditions in the region.

The fire broke out near Kalenjar village, which engulfed the Margalla Hills. Getting the information, CDA officials rushed to the scene to douse the fire. —RT/Agency

Muggers Rob Beauty Parlor, Steal Cosmetics

LAHORE: In a strange event, armed robbers took away cosmetic items from a beauty parlour in Okara district of Punjab, media reported.

According to details, three armed robbers held the women present at the beauty parlour hostage and mugged their mobile phones, cash, and other valuables.

The police said that the robbers also looted cosmetic items of the beauty parlour and managed to escape.

Meanwhile, the police have launched an investigation into the incident and are searching for the suspects.

Vietnamese Ambassador's Wife Found In Islamabad's F-9 Park After Going Missing

ISLAMABAD: The wife of the Vietnamese Ambassador to Pakistan Nguyen Tien Phong who went missing earlier, found in Islamabad's F-9 park, media reported on Saturday.

As per details, police officials said that the ambassador reported the incident, stating that his wife had left their residence at 11 am and had not returned.

According to police officials, the ambassador's wife was found sitting in the F-9 park in Islamabad.

important to note that while innocent civilians in Gaza have been cut off from necessities such as food and water for over six months, celebrities in the West spent upwards of \$75,000 on a ticket to the Met Gala in May.

It is unfathomable to scroll on social media and witness the dissonant combination of luxury and indulgence at the hands of public figures while families in Gaza are posting videos begging for donations needed to escape the war zone. The juxtaposition of these two worlds represents a grotesque reality that is worse than

world cup journey on June 6 against the hosts US in Dallas.

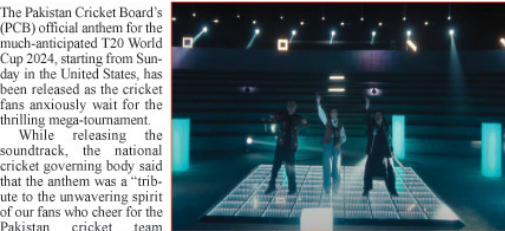
The Green Shirts will then face arch-rivals India on June 9 in New York, followed by their match against Canada (June 11) and Ireland (June 16).

The five-time Ballon d'Or winner was eventually led off the field but continued to be overcome with emotion as he sat on the sideline before collecting his runners-up medal.

Despite Ronaldo finding the net, Al Hilal triumphed on penalties to complete the league and cup double after the match ended 1-1 in regulation time and extra time

failed to provide a winner, ESPN reported.

The loss completes a frustrating and trophy-less season for Ronaldo and Al Nassr, finishing a distant second to Al Hilal in the league.

However, the Portuguese football legend achieved plenty of personal accolades, including a record of 35 goals in his first full Saudi Pro League season.

Al Hilal's success has come despite its star Brazilian forward Neymar missing almost the entire season after suffering a knee injury in October, shortly after transferring from Paris Saint-Germain.

Neymar was in attendance on Friday to cheer on his team from the stands.—Agency

RASHID LATIF WANTS MOHAMMAD RIZWAN BACK AS WICKET KEEPER



Pakistan's former cricketer Rashid Latif has expressed his wish to see Mohammad Rizwan back in his wicket-keeping role in place of Azam Khan.

Speaking on a local sports programme, Latif stressed that the biggest problem currently being faced by the Green Shirts is that of its wicketkeeper, a job currently being performed by Azam.

Karachi Weather To Get Cooler After Weeks Of Blistering Heat

KARACHI: Following days of blistering heat, temperature in Karachi is expected to drop from tomorrow (Sunday), the Met Office said on Saturday.

The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) said the maximum temperature in the metropolis was recorded at 38.4 degrees Celsius today, while the humidity in the air was 53%.

The Met Office said the temperature was expected to remain between 34°C to 36°C in the port city tomorrow.

Any drop in the temperature will bring relief to the Karachiites as the metropolis has been reeling under searing heat for the last few weeks.

The port city on May 29 witnessed the hottest day of 2024 with the temperature shooting up as high as 41.5°C.

It is noteworthy to mention that Karachi recorded the highest-ever temperature



at 48°C on May 9, 1938.

The weather experts had predicted that the heatwave condition was expected to subside in the metropolis after June 1.

Meanwhile, the PMD on May 30 forecast that many parts of the country would receive "extraordinary" monsoon rains from June to August.

This forecast, while Sindh might also receive torrential rains, it had said adding that Balochistan too was vulnerable to hits from extraordinary rainy weather.—RT/Agency

Commissioner Karachi Reviews Progress Of Development Projects

KARACHI: The 70 percent work on the rehabilitation of Hub Pumping Station project, will be completed this month while the remaining 30% will be completed by December. Once completed, the Hub Pumping Station project will resolve the long-standing water shortage issue to the citizens in the three districts, including district of West Keamari and Central, which was caused by the malfunctioning of the pumping station.

It provides 100 million gallons of water to the residents of West, Keamari and Central districts. The project consists of eight parts, including the rehabilitation of four motors, which have been installed and are ready to work efficiently.

Three parts of the project are still underway. This was briefed to the Commissioner Karachi Syed Hassan Naqvi by the officers of Water and Sewerage Corporation during his visit to the Hub Pumping Station to review the progress of rehabilitation work by the Corporation.

Meanwhile, Commissioner Karachi Syed Hassan Naqvi visited the deputy commissioner west office to review the progress of development projects in the districts. Deputy Commissioner West Ahmed Ali Siddiqui briefed the commissioner about the progress and the bottlenecks being faced by the executive agencies in some of their projects.

Later he visited the sites of development projects including Hub Pumping Station, a hospital project in



Mominabad and education Government Boys School Faqeer Colony, Orangi, Manghopir road, 4K chowringi road project being carried out by the KDA.

He also inspected the ongoing work on the 8.9 mile Mangopir road initiated by the SIDCL. The commissioner directed the officials to expedite the completion of these projects and ensure that they are finished within the given deadlines.

During his visit to the Hub Pumping Station he chaired a meeting to review the progress of the pumping station project. The chief engineer Intikhab Ahmed Rajput informed him that the project is divided into eight parts, four of which have been completed, and the remaining four will be completed by December. The commissioner also visited the 4K Chorangi North Karachi project site being undertaken by KDA, where he was briefed on the progress of the project by the Director General Shujaqat Hussain. He was informed that 8,400 feet road was being constructed from 4K chowringi North Karachi to Gulshane Maay-

mar Yousof goth. The commissioner was made presentation at the site of under construction of Government Boys School in Orangi Town. He was informed that 90% of the work has been completed. The presentation was made to the commissioner by the Assistant Commissioner Raana Sufyan saying that the project was initiated in 2021. 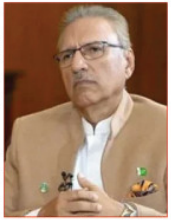

Supreme Court Sends Anti-Smuggling Law To Parliament For Review

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court of Pakistan has sent the Anti-smuggling Act 1977 to the Parliament for review with recommendation of amendment in the law, Media reported on Saturday.

The apex court in its verdict said that the anti-smuggling law has scores of lacunae. "The anti-smuggling law only allows accused the right to appeal," the decision read.

"Denying the right to appeal to government means the Anti-smuggling Act benefiting accused," the court observed.

The copies of the verdict, written by Justice Shahid Waheed and comprised of seven pages, have been dispatched to the Law and Justice Commission, Secretary Law and the Attorney General of Pakistan.

Referring a case, the court said that the Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF) in a complaint in year 1998 said that a man Ubaid Khan made property with smuggling. "The ANF has only a role of reporting



the special judge under the Anti-smuggling Act," decision read.

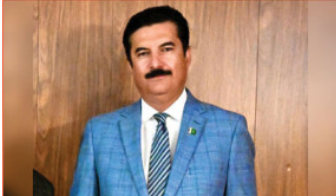
"The matter restricted before the judge and the accused after the accused present their stance. The complainant's role come to an end in the law after reporting the judge," verdict read. "The ANF will not be an affected party of the decision after its role ends with complaint. In the anti-smuggling act, the ANF of the state have not been given any right to appeal and only the affected party i.e. accused have right

to appeal under the law," according to the decision.

"The Peshawar High Court (PHC) dismissed the ANF's appeal against the court's decision in the case because 'it was not an affected party,'" verdict read. "The anti-smuggling laws, across the world, give the state or government the right to appeal. It will be appropriate if the parliament revisits the law to give the right to appeal to the state," the apex court verdict suggests.—RT/Agency

Ready To Talk With PTI If Its Leaders Apologize For Past Mistakes: Kundi

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Faisal Karim Kundi Saturday expressed willingness to talk with the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) if party apologises for past mistakes.
