Aurangzeb Highlights Agriculture's Role In Driving GDP Growth To 2.38%, While Other Sectors Fall Short

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb has unveiled the Economic Survey of Pakistan 2023-24 as part of an annual exercise before the presentation of budget. The Pakistan Economic Survey is an annual report that charts the country's economic progress for the outgoing financial year. For the next fiscal year, the National Economic Council (NEC) approved a massive increase in its Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) share. Addressing a press conference in Islamabad, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb announced that revenue collection for the fiscal year 2023-24 saw a 13 percent rise compared to the previous year. "Pakistan rupee depreciated by 29pc and the foreign exchange reserves went down to two weeks of import cover in fiscal year 2022-23 that is where we started off," said the finance minister at the start of his presser. The finance minister said the country started off its journey to launch reforms under the leadership of PM Shehbaz. He said the coalition government, upon assuming office last year, had to seek an emergency bailout package from the International Monetary Fund (IMF). "This IMF assistance is the reason why we are now able to discuss our economic targets," he remarked. "I was in the private sector before joining the finance ministry but at that time I was clear that Pakistan had



to go to IMF because we did not have any option and that's why its called lender of the last resort," he remarked. "If we had not been in the IMF programme, we would not have been discussing the targets here and would have been in a precarious situation," the minister highlighted. "The larger-scale manufacturing growth was affected due to the effects of the energy equation," he said, adding that agriculture was the "saviour" backed by the bumper crops. "Agriculture is going to remain a huge lever of growth as we go forward," he said. The growth rate of agriculture was 6.25 percent. The quarterly growth rates have been observed at 8.6 percent, 5.8 percent, and

3.9 percent in Q1, Q2, and Q3 of FY 2024, respectively. The sector's recovery is attributed to government initiatives, improved input supply, and increased credit disbursement to farmers. Important crops like cotton, rice, and wheat observed healthy growth, while sugarcane and maize experienced negative growth. However, the negative impact of sugarcane and maize was offset by the high growth of wheat, cotton, and rice. Livestock, a significant portion of the agriculture sector, showed resilience and maintained average growth. The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) tax collection grew by 30.6pc to Rs7,361.9 billion from July to April. The collection target for the 12-month period set by the government was Rs9,415bn. The collection was Rs5,637.9 billion in the year-ago period. He emphasised that while philanthropy can support schools, universities, and hospitals, the country's functioning relies on taxes. "That's one certain[ty]. That's the basic principle," he said. Aurangzeb stressed the need to increase the tax-to-GDP ratio and implement complex energy and power sector reforms. Total public debt was recorded at Rs 67,525 billion at end-March 2024. Domestic debt was recorded at Rs 43,432 billion while external public debt was recorded at Rs 24,093 billion (US \$ 86.7 billion). Public debt portfolio witnessed various posi-

tive developments during first nine months of outgoing fiscal year. On inflation, he noted that it had peaked at 48pc and had since decreased to 11.8pc in May. He highlighted the significance of core inflation and food inflation also coming down. The CPI inflation for the period July-April FY 2024 recorded at 26 percent against 28.2 percent during the same period last year. The other inflationary indicators like Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) recorded at 30.2 percent as against 31.7 percent last year. Wholesale Price Index (WPI) recorded at 22.4 percent in July-April FY 2024 compared to 34 percent same period last year. He highlighted that the GDP growth rate was 2.38%, falling short of the target due to ongoing economic challenges. The survey said the government is implementing a comprehensive set of administrative, policy, and relief measures to address inflation and proactively help the vulnerable members of society. The economic survey also indicated that the rupee depreciated by 29% during the fiscal year. The finance minister highlighted that the currency had witnessed stability due to, he mentioned, the policies of the caretaker government. The finance minister said the large scale manufacturing sector faced significant setbacks due to inflation, increased energy costs, and other issues.—RT/Agency

Imran Khan Has Given Approval For Talks With Government: Barrister Gohar

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar said Tuesday party's founder Imran Khan has given a green signal for talks with the government. "We told the PTI founder that dialogue is necessary, as the distance is widening. He agreed with us [on this]," said Gohar, when speaking with journalists outside the Adiala jail.



According to Gohar, Khan wants the avenues of dialogue to be opened. He told journalists that Khan is ready to forgive what has happened to him for reconciliation. "PTI founder has said many times that I am ready to forgive what happened to me," said the PTI chairman. When asked if the negotiations will take place at the behest of the Supreme Court's advice, Barrister Gohar said: "The option given by the SC is also under consideration." However, he emphasised that it is PTI's "own decision" to negotiate. "PTI founder did not write any letter to the SC for negotiation. PTI will also respond to its negotiation option." Gohar maintained the party will begin its negotiations after talking to Pash-tunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP) chief Mahmood Khan Achakzai. He said there is an alliance with Achakzai and other parties, that his party will take them into confidence. "Negotiations can also be held at the alliance level. PTI can also initiate itself," said the party's chief, reiterating that there is no option but negotiation. "We have never refused to negotiate. The ice is breaking. We want things to improve," said Gohar, insisting that PTI's negotiation offer should not be interpreted as a deal. The PTI chief's comment comes days after Khan decided to "step back" from his rigid stance, ordering his party leaders to establish contacts both inside and outside the Parliament to ease the ongoing political tension, sources told media. The sources said that the party's leadership was directed to hold talks with various political parties out-

side the Parliament, while its lawmakers were also asked to enhance its relations with parties in the ruling coalition government. Gohar told journalists that the party's founder met with lawyers today and informed them about not being allowed to talk to his sons. The PTI founder's decision came after his interaction with Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faez Isa when he appeared for a hearing before the Supreme Court. During the hearing pertaining to the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) law amendments, CJP Isa suggested that Khan go to the Parliament to help resolve Pakistan's problems "as the country needs to move forward." The former prime minister has given his party's three-member committee the authority to establish contact with the establishment, said the sources.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Holds Talks With President Zardari To Foster Budget Collaboration



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister of Pakistan Shehbaz Sharif Tuesday met with President Asif Ali Zardari to seek full support from him and the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) for the upcoming budget approval. Sources indicated that the meeting also covered discussions on the overall political situation and economic affairs of the country. Reportedly, the PPP will hold a meeting in the Parliament House this evening ahead of the budget session. The meeting between President Zardari and Prime Minister Sharif prior to the PPP gathering is seen as highly significant.—RT/Agency

Security Forces Neutralize 11 Terrorists Linked To Martyrdom Of Seven Soldiers In Lakki Marwat

RAWALPINDI: At least 11 terrorists, involved in the martyrdom of seven army men, have been killed during an intelligence-based operation in the Lakki Marwat district, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said Tuesday. In a statement, the military's media wing said that the IBO was carried out in response to the recent Improvised Explosive Device (IED) explosion that claimed the lives of seven brave soldiers to bring the perpetrators of the heinous act to justice. The martyred soldiers included Captain Muhammad Faraz Ilyas and Subedar Major Muhammad Nazir. During the conduct of the operation, own troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location, as a result of which eleven terrorists were successfully neutralised while multiple terrorist hideouts were also busted. A sanitisation operation is being carried out to elim-



inate any other terrorists found in the area as the security forces are determined to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country, it concluded. Last month, security forces conducted a series of intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province from May 26 to 27 and neutralised 23 terrorists. On May 26, an IBO was conducted in the general area of Hassan Khel, Peshawar district, where six terrorists were gunned down by the security forces and multiple hideouts were busted. The third engagement occurred in the general area of Bagh, Khyber district, wherein, the security forces killed seven terrorists and injured two terrorists. A large quantity of weapons, ammunition and explosives was also recovered from the killed terrorists, who remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against the security forces as well as the innocent civilians, the ISPR said.—RT/Agency

Supreme Court Directs For Closure Of All Restaurants In Margalla Hills, Including Monal



ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court on Tuesday ordered the closure of all the eateries in the Margalla Hills National Park (MHPN) including Monal Restaurant in Islamabad. The directives came in response to a March 11 court order in which it had sought the complete record of the land ownership of the restaurant. A three-member bench of the apex court, headed by Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, heard the petitions filed by Monal Restaurant, established in the Margalla Hills, as well as the Wildlife Department. Earlier on March 8, the apex court ordered the de-sealing of the eatery after suspending the Islamabad High Court (IHC) verdict. The court had asked the Capital Development Authority (CDA) to furnish original records about the 8,600 acres of the MHPN land. The additional attorney general had informed the court that the Military Estate Office claims the land as military-owned. However, the chief justice observed that there is no military-owned land; the land belongs to the government of Pakistan. He said that a simple question has been asked whether it is owned by the CDA or by someone else. During the hearing today, the top court summoned the CDA chairman on an immediate basis while rejecting the report submitted by the regulator. CJP Isa said that the court had sought the details of all constructions in Margalla Hills National Park. The CJP said that a sports club, Pak-China Friendship Centre and Arts Council National Monument are also included in the CDA report. "Is this the CDA's honesty?" questioned the chief justice, asking whether the SC building also falls under the jurisdiction of the national park.—RT/Agency

Khurshheed Criticizes Government For Not consulting PPP On IMF And China Agreements

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan People's Party (PPP) leader Khurshheed Shah said that they were not informed about the budget, and the government did not take them into confidence regarding agreements with the IMF and China. Speaking to the media outside the Parliament House, Shah remarked that in the past, the opposition was taken into confidence. Now, as allies, they too should have been consulted. Khurshheed Shah conveyed PPP's grievances to the government, highlighting that the People's Party made



many sacrifices in Parliament. He reiterated their commitment to ensuring that both parliament and the government function properly. He added that the Pak-

Dar Urges Urgent And Unconditional Ceasefire In Gaza

UNITED NATION: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister, Mohammad Ishaq Dar has called for an immediate and unconditional ceasefire in Gaza. He made the call during his meeting with the United Nations Secretary-General, Antonio Guterres in Jordan, on the sidelines of the high-level conference on prevailing situation in Gaza. The Foreign Minister also called for unimpeded humanitarian assistance to the besieged people of Gaza, return of the displaced Palestinians, and ensuring accountability for the war crimes and crimes against humanity being committed by Israel. He reiterated Pakistan's strong and unequivocal condemnation of the indiscriminate and brutal use of force by Israel against the Palestinians.—RT/Agency



India Commits To Addressing Border Issues With Pakistan And China

MUMBAI: India will focus on finding solutions to the border issues with Pakistan and China that have long strained ties between India and its neighbouring countries, Indian Foreign Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar said on Tuesday after assuming charge for a second straight term. Relations between India have worsened since a 2019 suicide bombing of an Indian military convoy in Indian-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IOJK) which India claims was traced to Pakistan-based militants, leading New Delhi to carry out an airstrike on what it said was a militant base in Pakistan. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi was sworn in on Sunday for a record-equaling third term at a grand ceremony at the Rashtrapati Bhavan, the president's palace in New Delhi, attended by leaders of seven regional countries, underlining the government's neigh-



bourhood first" policy. On Monday, leaders of the two countries engaged in diplomacy via X. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and his elder brother and former prime minister Nawaz congratulated Modi, in what was Pakistan's first response to the election results from across the border. "With Pakistan, we would want to find a solution to the issue of years-old cross-border terrorism. That cannot be the policy of a good neighbour," Jaishankar said. "With regards to China there are still some issues at the border and our focus will be on how to solve them," he said. India and China share a 3,800 km (2,400 mile) border - much of it poorly demarcated - over which the nuclear-armed nations also fought a war in 1962. They have engaged in a military standoff since July 2020 when at least 20 Indian soldiers and four Chinese troops were killed in the worst clashes in five decades.—RT/Agency

Tragedy Strikes: Three Sanitary Workers Perish Amidst Intense Cleanliness Campaign In TMK

TANDO MUHAMMAD KHAN: During the cleaning of city drains across the city, three sanitary workers of the municipal committee lost their lives. The three workers were busy completing their work as usual. During this time, one worker entered the manhole of the drain for cleaning and did not return. To rescue him, the second and then the third worker entered the drain but after a while, when none of them re-

turned, chaos ensued. After considerable effort, all three workers were pulled out of the drain and transferred to the hospital, but the doctors confirmed their deaths. The protesters chanted slogans fiercely against the administration. Later, Municipal Chairman Syed Shahnawaz Khan arrived at the protest site, negotiated with the protesters, and announced a compensation of three million rupees each and jobs for the heirs of the deceased sanitary workers. After this announcement, the protest was called off by the heirs. Vice Chairman Abdul Kareem Shaikh, CMO Aijaz Mallah, Shafiq Bhatti, Sikander Bhatti and others were also present on the occasion.

PSX Celebrates Listing Of Fast Cables Ltd. With Gong Ceremony



KARACHI: The Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX) held a gong ceremony to celebrate the listing of Fast Cables Limited (FCL), marking the fifth IPO on PSX in the fiscal year 2023-24. Fast Cables, a leading manufacturer of electrical cables and conductors in Pakistan, issued 128 million shares, representing 20.35% of its post-IPO paid-up capital.

The event was attended by key figures from Fast Cables, including Chairman Gulam Mustafa Kausal and Managing Director Kamal Amjad Mian, as well as senior management from AKD Securities Ltd., the joint lead managers of the issue. PSX MD & CEO Farrukh H. Khan welcomed the guests along with PSX board members and senior management.

The IPO, conducted via book building, offered shares at a floor price of Rs 23.5 with a maximum price of Rs 32.90. The issue was oversubscribed by 1.57 times, with a strike price of Rs 24.45 per share. In total, the IPO raised Rs 3,129.6 million, which will be used for constructing a state-of-the-art building, installing new machinery, and repaying debt.

Sindh IGP Announces Rs4.5 Billion Budget Allocation For SHOs In FY2024-25

KARACHI: Sindh Inspector General of Police (IGP) Ghulam Nabi Memon on Tuesday announced that station head officers (SHOs) in Sindh will get a budget of Rs4.5bn in FY2024-25.

In an exclusive interview with media, Sindh IGP Ghulam Nabi Memon said with the direct provision of budget, the SHOs are being made autonomous.

The Sindh government also desires a dedicated budget for the police force, the Sindh IGP said and added previously, a lump sum budget was directed to senior officers for police stations, but the new plan aims to send this budget directly to the police stations.

Memon further said the SHOs will now have the authority to utilize the budget directly, facilitating expenses such as vehicle maintenance and other operational costs.

Running police stations and conducting investigations require funds, and the



lack of money often leads to corruption issues. "This solution is expected to bring some improvement."

Sindh IGP Ghulam Nabi Memon also announced Rs5 bn package for police welfare. The plan includes providing medical facilities to Sindh Police, which were previously unavailable.

Each Sindh Police employee will now have an annual medical coverage of up to 1 million rupees. This coverage extends to their spouses, children, and parents, who can receive treatment at any hospital, the Sindh's top cop said.

Sindh IGP Ghulam Nabi Memon further said that a long-standing demand for the replacement of over 2,000 vehicles in the Sindh Police, some in use for over a decade, has been approved.

This replacement will be carried out in phases over the next three years, with a priority on allocating new vehicles to police stations where the need is greatest.—RT/Agency

Court Denies Bail Plea Of Sarim Burney In Human Trafficking Case

KARACHI: A local court in the metropolis Tuesday rejected the bail plea of social worker Sarim Burney in the human trafficking case.

The order by the court of Judicial Magistrate (East) Khaliq ul Zaman came after the arguments of Burney's lawyer and those of the Federal Investigation Agency's (FIA) counsel concluded.

During the hearing of the case, the agency's prosecutor told the court that more evidence is to be collected against the suspect.

"If the suspect is granted bail, it may affect the investigation," the FIA counsel said, adding that the accused is resorting to continuous lies.

He added that further revelations have been made during the investigation.

The FIA lawyer told the court that baby girl Haya's mother said she contacted the social worker to get her daughter back but he refused to return her.

Meanwhile, Burney's lawyer argued that the FIA did not conduct a proper inquiry into the matter.

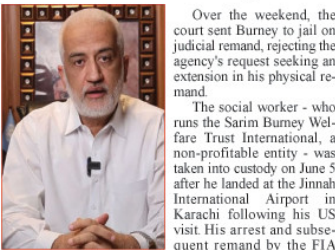
"The parents who adopted the baby from the hospital handed her over to the Sarim Burney Trust," he said during the arguments.

The social worker's counsel added that all legal requirements are met in the process of children's adoption.

"FIA made allegations, but could not provide evidence," the lawyer said.

Over the weekend, the court sent Burney to jail on judicial remand, rejecting the agency's request seeking an extension in his physical remand.

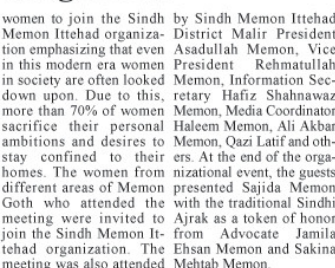
The social worker - who runs the Sarim Burney Welfare Trust International, a non-profitable entity - was taken into custody on June 5 after he landed at the Jinnah International Airport in Karachi following his US visit. His arrest and subsequent remand by the FIA charges on him which include human trafficking, smuggling and illegally sending children to the US after American authorities filed a complaint against him. Burney is accused of smuggling a newborn girl named Haya to the US, FIA said. The officials added that Burney bought the baby from her parents for Rs1 million and sent her to the US.—RT

PTI Won't Receive Any NRO, Asserts Kundi

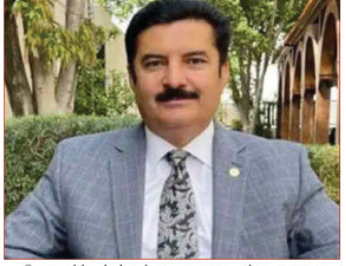
PESHAWAR: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Faisal Karim Kundi on Tuesday said he would perform his duties according to law and constitution, adding, "One thing is very much clear. There won't be any NRO for the PTI."

The statement about NRO comes with reference to PTI founding chairman Imran Khan who is in prison following his sentencing in multiple cases and booking in many others as well as his party's involvement in May 9 events.

Earlier on Monday, it was reported that Imran, who is known for his aggressive approach as reflected by the May 9 violence and the stance taken afterwards, may write a letter to the Supreme Court which should, according to him, convey his desire for talks to the relevant circles.

But Kundi told reporters on Tuesday that the PTI wasn't even a political party and holding talks with the grouping would be a wastage of time.

Blasting the provincial government over rise in terrorism and poor performance, he warned that Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur was losing control of the province and mentioned that [not a single meeting of the [Provincial] Apex Committee had so far been convened.



One could only laugh at the statements issued by Gandapur, the governor remarked and said that he didn't think Gandapur could attack Islamabad.

Responding to various questions, he was commenting on the repeated threats hurled by Gandapur that he would lead a march towards the federal capital if his demands are not met.

According to Kundi, the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa chief minister is passing such comments only to protect "his job" and they too would be saddened if Kundi becomes unemployed.

"I know how to protect the Governor's House [Peshawar] constitutionally," said Kundi and added that he had a complete understanding of his constitutional powers, the governor could visit any place in Pakistan, but the law and order situation was worsening day by day in the province, with people going missing and moving in convoys in his home district of Dera Ismail Khan.

"At least address the state of affairs in your own district," remarked Kundi who also hails from Dera Ismail Khan.

It is worth noting that the southern districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa are affected the worst after the then PTI government led by Imran decided to allow the TTP members to relocate, thus resulting in the return of terrorism since then.—RT/Agency

Babar Azam and Co's seven-wicket victory against newcomers Canada came as a breather for the side following their back-to-back losses against the United States (USA) and India in their first two matches of the mega-tournament.

Pakistan chased down the 107-run target to emerge victorious in the must-win clash at the Nassau County International Cricket Stadium.

Men in Green had a tough start as they failed to score a boundary in the first four overs. Saim Ayub soon departed for the pavilion after scoring just six runs, leaving



the Green Shirts 20-1 in 4.2 overs.

However, Pakistan continued to play with caution as Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan formed a 63-run partnership.

Azam lost his wicket for 33 runs but Rizwan (53 off 53) remained on the pitch and took Pakistan over the line by chasing the target in 17.3 overs.

Earlier, the day belonged to Pakistan bowlers as the Canadian batters had no answers to their attack. Mohammad Amir, Shaheen Afridi, Naseem Shah and Harris Rauf all did their part with the ball as the Green Shirts managed to restrict the opponents to 106-7 in New York.

Pakistan squad drew first blood against the opponents as Mohammad Amir bowled Canadian opener Navneet Dhaliwal (4) out in the third over.

The bowlers picked up wickets quickly after the first

dismissal, as Shaheen Shah Afridi, who couldn't take his first over wicket, made progress when Pragat Singh (2) was caught and bowled in the fifth over.

Harris Rauf conceded 13 runs in the 7th over without taking a wicket but Imad Wasim did the job for his mate as he dismissed Nicholas Singh for just two runs in a run out.

Pakistan looked dominant with five wickets in hand as Rauf sought a hat-trick after sending Ravinderpal Singh to the dugout the 10th over.

The video sparked outrage globally, with many in Pakistan condemning Akmal's offensive comment.

Former Indian cricketer Harbhajan Singh responded vehemently on social media, criticizing Akmal for his disrespect.—Agency

Pakistan team reaches Tajikistan hours before FIFA World Cup 2026 Qualifiers

Operation clean-up: Amir, Imad, Iftikhar, Azam may be axed; Wahab's post at risk

KARACHI: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) is likely to make significant changes in the team following its poor performance in the ongoing T20 World Cup 2024 with several players likely to be axed along with the team's senior manager and selection committee member Wahab Riaz, sources told media.

Players including Mohammad Amir, Imad Wasim, Iftikhar Ahmed, Azam Khan, and Usman Khan are likely to face difficulties in maintaining their place in the Green Shirts' squad in the future.

Furthermore, the team's senior manager and selection committee member Riaz's post is also at risk as there is a suggestion regarding changes in the board's selection committee.



The sources say that a group of three players in the Pakistan team were black-mailing the PCB officials at the behest of the players' manager, who represents all three players, and had pressured the board to secure a significant increase in the remuneration in the players' central contract.

The changes in the national side, the sources added, will be based on the reports of captain Babar Azam, head coach Gary Kirsten, Senior Manager Hafeez, and Assistant Coach Azhar Mahmood.

Furthermore, the report of former director Mohammad

Hafeez, who has previously accused the players of grouping and prioritising money over performance, will also be reviewed. The players and members of the selection committee, as per the sources, will be "sent home" following their T20 World Cup 2024 performance and the series held before the mega event. The development comes a day after PCB Chairman Mohsin Naqvi expressed disappointment in the Green Shirts after the loss against India and said that such poor performance indicated the need for a "major surgery".

Speaking to journalists after the Pakistan vs India match at Nassau County International Cricket Stadium, Naqvi said that the "defeat against India was disappointing in every sense".—Agency

Babar Azam, Shaheen Afridi, and Mohammad Rizwan are classified under Category A, each earning a monthly salary of Rs4.5 million.

Category B includes players such as Shadab Khan, Fakhar Zaman, Harris Rauf, and Naseem Shah, who earn up to Rs3 million per month.

In categories C and D,

monthly salaries range from Rs750,000 to Rs1.5 million. Imad Wasim is categorised under category C, while Iftikhar Ahmed, Hasan Ali, and Saim Ayub fall under category D.

Additionally, players receive fixed match fees and match awards for all three formats, which contribute to their overall earnings.

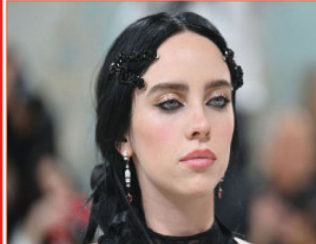

Government Plans To Implement 'Firewall' For Social Media Control

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan government is considering installing a firewall across the Internet Service Providers (ISPs) to control social media days after its largest province Punjab enacted the Defamation Law 2024, media reported on Tuesday, citing sources.

Sources told media that the government has decided to install a firewall to control social media and regulate internet traffic. The firewall will be equipped with deep packet inspection (DPI) technology, allowing for the monitoring of data up to seventh layer.

The firewall will enable the government to filter social media data, identify and block propaganda points, and restrict access to prohibited content. Internet service providers (ISPs) will be required to install the firewall, with the government bearing some of the costs.

Sources claimed that the firewall will have the capability to block data at the IP level, and ISPs will be bound to take measures to block illegal content under the licensing agreement.

The installation of the firewall falls under the authority of the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), according to the Ministry of IT. This move is seen as a significant step towards regulating social media and controlling the

spread of harmful content in Pakistan. However, concerns about censorship and privacy have already started to arise. The legislation about defamation became a provincial law on Saturday after acting Governor Malik Ahmad Khan - a PML-N member - signed the Punjab Defamation Act 2024 in the absence of PPP-nominated Governor Sardar Saleem Haider, who left for Dubai on leave. The Punjab Assembly passed the Defamation Bill, 2024 on May 20, rejecting all amendments proposed by the opposition amid protests by the PTI-backed Sunni Ittehad Council and journalists covering parliamentary proceedings.—RT/Agency

Khawaja Asif Advocates For Increased Defense Budget

ISLAMABAD: Due to the financial strain caused by the rising dollar rate and current inflation, the defense budget will need to be increased, Defense Minister Khawaja Asif said in an interview on Tuesday.

During an interview with foreign media, Asif emphasized that the depreciation of the rupee against the dollar significantly impacts the defense budget which is in PKR, however, there is necessity to increase the budget to recover the loss.

Responding to a question, the Defense Minister stated that the Pakistani delegation during China visit decided to promote investments over loans for business in the country. Regarding his visit to China, Asif highlighted the progress on the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Phase 2, with several projects were finalized, with the Karachi to Peshawar railway line project (ML-1) is on top priority. Asif addressed China's security concerns following the Dasu Dam attack, acknowledging their sensitivity to the matter. He assured that China would assist in ensuring robust security measures for Chinese nationals working in Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Man Fatally Bites Three-Year-Old Stepson

LAHORE: A spine chilling incident was reported where a step-father allegedly beat a three-year-old son to death in Lahore, media reported on Tuesday.

The mother in her detailed statement to the police revealed that her husband, Khabibur Rehman, is not the biological father of her deceased son and had a deep-seated dislike for her children from the previous marriage.

The mother of the deceased child in her statement claimed that the accused used to torture and bite the 3-year-old child with his teeth.

"Khabibur Rehman struck Arishman on the head with a stick, resulting in the death of the child," the mother claimed. The police have confirmed that Khabibur Rehman is currently in custody and will face severe legal consequences.—RT/Agency

FIA Arrest Four In Fraud Case Linked To Japanese Consulate Employees

KARACHI: In a significant crackdown on financial fraud, the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) apprehended four individuals on Tuesday, including two employees of the Japanese consulate and two officers from a private bank. The suspects, identified as consulate employees Obaid and Victor, along with bank officers Fahad and Zeshan, are accused of orchestrating a sophisticated scheme that defrauded millions of rupees using counterfeit documents.

The fraudulent operation involved the creation of two bank accounts under the name of a diplomat's wife, utilizing forged signatures and a fabricated introductory letter purportedly from the consulate. The suspects further exploited the scheme by using checks with forged signatures to withdraw money. Additionally, funds earmarked for the consulate's electricity bills and customs clearance were misappropriated. During the operation, the FIA's Commercial Bank Circle recovered substantial amounts, including \$121,000, Rs60,000 in cash, and shares of various companies valued at Rs600,000.—RT/Agency

Murad Orders For Restoration Of Old Waterways For Flood Disposal

Modest Interest Rate Cut Disappoints KATI

KARACHI: The Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (KATI) has expressed disappointment over the State Bank of Pakistan's decision to cut the interest rate by only 150 basis points, reducing it to 20.5% from 22%. This modest reduction comes despite inflation hitting a 30-month low of 11%.



KATI President Johar Qandhari highlighted the business community's longstanding demand for a significant interest rate cut. "With inflation dropping to 11%, we expected a substantial reduction to 7-8%," Qandhari said. "The 1.5% cut is insufficient, likely influenced by IMF pressures." Qandhari argued that Pakistan's high policy rate has increased production costs, inflated capital shortage for industrialists, and hindered economic growth. He emphasized that a more significant rate cut could stimulate industrialization, job creation, and overall economic growth. While praising the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) for a 33% increase in revenue collection, Qandhari noted that economists predict inflation will remain around 10-11% by year-end, with a potential trade balance surplus. Shehbaz Announces Upcoming Visit Of High-Level Chinese Delegation To Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said Tuesday that a high-powered delegation from China would soon visit Pakistan after his "successful" trip to Beijing as the South Asian nation seeks economic support from its brotherly nation.



"A high-powered Chinese delegation will be visiting Pakistan soon," PM Shehbaz said while briefing the federal cabinet members on his recently concluded five-day trip to China.

Shedding light on his trip, the premier revealed that the Chinese side, on multiple occasions, raised their concerns. However, he reassured that the government prioritised the security issue at every step whether it be discussions at government-to-government or government-to-business or other high-level forums.

Termining the visit "successful", the prime minister lauded the cabinet members for their efforts and for the fruitful trip to the neighbouring country.

The PM, who landed in China on June 5 last week,

held several delegation-level talks with Beijing and met Chinese leadership, including President Xi Jinping, during his trip.

The two sides, as per the joint statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), agreed to continue to work together in various domains including regional peace and stability and development.

During the trip, Pakistan reaffirmed its resolve to improve the security situation and take all necessary steps to ensure the safety and security of Chinese citizens and projects in the country.

Condemning the deadly Dasu suicide attack, wherein five Chinese nationals lost

their lives, both sides reiterated their commitment to fight against terrorism and work together with the international community to tackle the terror threat.

Furthermore, Islamabad and Beijing termed the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) as a key aspect of the latter's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and also agreed to explore ways to further strengthen the bi-lateral relations via sharing of experience in governance along with synergised development strategies. Moreover, China also reaffirmed its support for Pakistan with regards to its sovereignty, national independence and territorial integrity.—RT/Agency

World Bank Greenlights \$1 Billion Extra Funding For Dasu Project

ISLAMABAD: The World Bank on Tuesday approved \$1 billion in a second round of additional financing for Pakistan to fund the Dasu Hydropower Stage I (DHP I) Project.

This move by the global bank's Board of Executive Directors will support the country's transition towards clean and affordable energy.

"This financing will support the expansion of hydropower electricity supply, improve access to socio-economic services for local communities, and build the Water and Power Development Authority's (WAPDA) capacity to prepare future hydropower projects," read a statement released by the World Bank.

The World Bank's announcement comes just a day before Pakistan is set to



unveil its annual budget for fiscal year 2024-2025.

The federal government will also unveil the Economic Survey of Pakistan 2023-24 — a pre-budget document containing the details of major socio-economic achievements during the outgoing fiscal year — at 5pm today (Tuesday).

World Bank Country Director for Pakistan, Najib Benhassine, in a statement said that Pakistan's energy

sector suffers from multiple challenges to achieving affordable, reliable, and sustainable energy.

Benhassine added: "The Dasu Hydropower Project site is one of the best hydropower sites in the world and is a game changer for the Pakistan energy sector. With a very small footprint, the DHP will contribute to 'greening' the energy sector and lowering the cost of electricity."

In its statement, the World Bank mentioned that the DHP will have an installed capacity of 4,320-5,400 MW upon completion.

"The project is being built in stages. DHP-I has a capacity of 2,160 MW and will generate 12,225 gigawatt hours (GWh)/year of low-cost renewable energy. The DHP-II will add 9,260-11,400 GWh per year from the same dam," said the World Bank.

Commenting on the significance of the project, its Task Team Leader, Rikard Liden, said: "DHP-I is an essential project in Pakistan's efforts to reverse its dependence on fossil fuels and reach 60 percent renewable energy by 2031."

The second additional financing, Liden added, will facilitate the expansion of

electricity supply and potentially save Pakistan an estimated \$1.8 billion annually by replacing imported fuels, and offset around 5 million tons of carbon dioxide. "The annual economic return of DHP-I is estimated to be around 28 percent."

The World Bank maintained that the additional financing for the hydropower project will also support the ongoing socio-economic initiatives in the Upper Kohistan region, particularly making improvements in the education, health, employment, and transport sectors.

"Through this project adult literacy has increased by an estimated 30% since 2012, boys' schooling increased by 16% while girls' schooling has increased by 70% during this period," it added.—RT/Agency

Fazl To Unveil New Strategy Post-Eid, Open To Conflict If Necessary

ISLAMABAD: Maulana Fazlur Rehman, the chief of his own faction of Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F), has denied having any contact with the PTI founding chairman, Imran Khan, dismissing such claims as false. He also announced plans to unveil a new strategy after Eid, stating that his party is prepared to face all consequences.



Speaking at a press conference in Islamabad on Tuesday, Rehman asserted, "We believe in a positive democratic struggle and aim to make Pakistan an Islamic welfare state. We have chosen the path of peace and will continue to advance along this route."

He highlighted that global powers aim to control Pakistan economically and politically. "We will resist these global powers through our struggle," he added.

Rehman criticised intelligence agencies for becoming active during elections, stating that JUI-F rejected the results of 2018 and 2024 elections. He mentioned that the JUI-F's executive and advisory councils would meet after Eid ul Adha to devise their strategy.

Imran Criticizes Mohsin Naqvi, Accusing Him Of Benefitting From Favoritism



RAWALPINDI: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan on Monday called for action against Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Chairman Mohsin Naqvi, urging him to "undergo surgery" after he failed to conduct fair elections.

He was responding to Naqvi's remarks made a day earlier, in which he indicated that significant changes would take place in the national team following the six-run defeat to India in the T20 World Cup 2024.

The PCB chief remarked that a "major surgery" is now necessary. "Initially, I believed a minor surgery would suffice, but after this poor performance, it's clear that a major overhaul is needed. The nation will soon witness substantial changes," Naqvi said.

In an informal conversation with journalists at Adiala



Jail's courtroom today, Khan criticised the authorities, highlighting ongoing security issues. "Our soldiers are being martyred, and robberies are occurring in Islamabad, yet they do not care," Khan remarked.

He further added: "Mohsin Naqvi is the biggest beneficiary of favouritism."

Khan alleged that efforts are being made to silence him and cover up election rigging, criticising the Chief Election Commissioner for overseeing fraudulent activities. He also condemned actions against PTI members across Punjab, noting that gatherings were disrupted, and party members were detained wherever they held conventions. Cabinet Approves Establishment Of Digital Commission And Pakistan Digital Authority

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet on Tuesday principally approved the Digital Nation Pakistan Act 2024 providing for the establishment of the National Digital Commission and Pakistan Digital Authority besides ensuring digitisation of national economy and paperless governance.



The cabinet which met under the chair of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, asked the law ministry to carry out the required review of the Act, which also aimed at digitising the services sector in accordance with international standards.

Under the Act, the National Digital Commission would act as a policymaking organisation, to be headed by the prime minister and comprising federal and provincial members.

Moreover, a Pakistan Digital Authority would be established to achieve the objectives of Digital Pakistan.

Being a corporate entity, the Authority would have financial and administrative autonomy.

Apprising the members of his recent visit to China and his meetings with Chinese President Xi Jinping and Premier Li Qiang, the prime minister mentioned his conversation with Chinese leadership on second phase of CPEC-II. He said that a high-powered Chinese delegation would visit Pakistan to further expand the bilateral cooperation. He told the meet-

ing that B2B meetings were held between the businessmen and investors of Pakistan and China at the Pakistan-China Business Forum in Shenzhen. PM Shehbaz said the government would send around 1,000 youngsters to China for professional training in innovations and technology in the agriculture sector. Moreover, Huawei would also annually train 200,000 Pakistani youngsters in different fields of information technology, he added.—RT/Agency

IHC Questions Justification Behind Judge's Recusal In Iddat Case

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday questioned the validity of a judge's recusal from a case involving the marriage of Pakistan Tehreek Insaf (PTI) founding chairman Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi during her Iddat period, suggesting that the reason for withdrawal might not be justified.



IHC's Justice Miangul Hasan Aurangzeb presided over the hearing, which dealt with appeals against the sentences imposed in the case, alongside objections raised by the registrar's office.

In February this year, after a jail trial, senior civil judge Qudratullah sentenced former premier Imran and his wife to seven years in jail, along with a Rs5.5 million fine each, for "contracting marriage during the 'Iddat' (period of waiting)" of the

former first lady.

Previously, the registrar's office had objected to the high court's jurisdiction, given that the matter was pending before the sessions court. Shehbaz Orders For Nationwide Decrease In Load Shedding



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has directed provincial governments to join the campaign against power theft and minimise load shedding across the country amid rising temperatures.

According to media, Prime Minister Shehbaz chaired a review meeting on load shedding, prevention of electricity theft, and reforms in the energy sector.

The prime minister issued instructions to establish effective and active systems within distribution companies to facilitate timely registration of complaints regarding power outages. "Given the rising heat, there should be minimal load shedding," he said.

Prime Minister Shehbaz emphasised that the purchase of new transformers must strictly adhere to international standards. He also in-

structed relevant officials to utilise modern systems globally recognised for reforms in the energy sector.

Shehbaz called on provincial governments to fully support the campaign against electricity theft and ensure severe penalties for those involved. He also issued strict instructions to curb load shedding and overbilling. During the briefing, it was revealed that from April 1 to May 30, 134 cases had been registered against power thieves, and 90 employees involved in electricity theft had been arrested. The prime minister was briefed on the progress of the reorganisation of the National Transmission and Dispatch Company (NTDC). The next fiscal year's development budget includes a plan to meter 124,611 transformers as part of the energy sector reforms.—RT/Agency

IHC Restricts New Election Tribunals From Adjudicating PML-N Lawmakers' Cases

ISLAMABAD: After the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) greenlighted transferring the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leaders' cases, the Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday barred the new poll tribunals from hearing election petitions till further orders.

The orders were issued by IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq while hearing the petitions against the ordinance for the Election Act amendments today. The hearing was attended by counsels representing the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)-backed candidates and the ECP.

At the outset of the hearing, Justice Farooq expressed outrage over the ECP's order and remarked that the deci-

sion to change the election tribunals could not be upheld.

The high court questioned the election watchdog about grounds which led it to change the tribunals which were tasked to hear pleas against the ruling party's lawmakers' election victory. To this, the ECP lawyer argued that the previous tribunals did not follow procedures.

Justice Farooq remarked that the ECP was seemingly setting a new precedent by transferring the tribunals. He added that the commission's decision would not be considered legal until it proves "discrimination", otherwise, it could also lead to contempt proceedings.

"Justice Tariq Mahmood Jahangiri is a jurist of this

court who was deputed to the tribunal by the ECP over my request. Why did ECP transfer the cases without challenging an order? A case can be transferred on the grounds of discrimination but there is also a procedure which needs to be followed by requesting the concerned judge not to hear the case," the IHC CJ observed.

The jurist also asked the government about reasons for promulgating the Election Act amendments via an ordinance after dissolving the legal modifications in a hurried manner. He stressed that the ECP should have challenged the previous tribunals' orders first instead of transferring the cases.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Refuses Passports To Citizens Seeking Asylum

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan will not issue passports to its citizens who will get asylum in other countries, citing the interior ministry circular media reported on Tuesday.



The Ministry of Interior in a letter has said that all those Pakistani citizens who will get asylum in other countries, on whatever basis, would not be issued Pakistani passports.

The decision has been taken citing the national security reasons, sources said. Sources said that the passports of such citizens of the country will stand cancelled and will not be renewable.

Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi has issued instructions to the interior ministry. The Passport Office following the minister's

instructions, has issued a letter to this effect to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and other concerned authorities.—RT/Agency
