Nation Gets Unprecedented Rs 10 Per Litre Petrol Price Drop

ISLAMABAD: In a major relief, the Pakistan government on Wednesday slashed the prices of petrol and high-speed diesel (HSD) for the next fortnight by Rs10.20 and Rs2.33, respectively.

According to details available with media, the new price of petrol is now Rs258.16 per litre, Rs10.20 down from the previous Rs268.36.

Similarly, high-speed diesel (HSD) will be available for Rs267.89 per litre, Rs2.33 down from the previous rate of Rs270.22 per litre.

A fortnight ago, the Pakistan government reduced the prices of petrol and high-speed diesel by Rs4.74 and Rs3.86 per litre, respectively.

With this latest reduction, the total relief provided to the public in



terms of petrol prices has reached Rs35 per litre. Earlier, it was reported that the government was expected to pass on the impact of lower international prices to consumers with a cut in the rates of petrol and high-speed diesel (HSD).

According to sources, the prices of petrol and HSD had declined in the international market by about \$3.75 and \$2.7 per barrel, respectively, in the last two weeks. Oil prices eased on Friday as markets evaluated the impact of U.S. interest rates staying higher for longer than anticipated. Brent crude futures were down 42 cents, or 0.5%, at \$82.33 a barrel.

West Texas Intermediate (WTI) U.S. crude futures lost 51 cents, or 0.7%, to trade at \$78.11 a barrel.—RT/Agency

Sindh Unveils Massive Rs 3.056 Trillion Budget Prioritizing Unparalleled Development and Social Welfare

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah on Friday presented a Rs3.056 trillion budget for the next fiscal year 2024-25, proposing up to 30% massive increase in the salaries of government employees.

Besides the salary hike, the budget also includes a significantly higher development expense of Rs959 billion, which accounts for 31% of the outlay.

The "balanced" budget mainly centers around the rehabilitation of flood-affected people and social protection for the poor. The majority of the total projected revenue for the province comes from the 62% federal transfers, followed by 22% provincial receipts.

As per the budgetary document released by the provincial government, the remaining receipts are through current capital receipts of Rs22 billion, foreign project assistance of Rs334 billion, other federal grants in the form of Public Sector Development Programme's (PSDP) Rs77 billion, foreign grants of Rs6 billion and a carryover cash balance of Rs55 billion.

Provincial receipts of Rs662 billion comprise sales tax on services of Rs350 billion, tax excluding GST of



Rs269 billion, and provincial non-tax receipts of Rs42.9 billion.

These funds are strategically allocated, a total of 63% or Rs1.9 trillion goes towards current revenue, 6% or Rs184 billion for current capital, and the remaining 31% or Rs959 billion is dedicated to the development expenditure.

Education receives the largest allocation at Rs519 billion, with Rs459 billion dedicated to current revenue expenditure.

Healthcare follows closely with a total allocation of Rs334 billion, with Rs302 billion earmarked for current expenses.

Local government rounds out the top three with a proposed budget of Rs329 billion.

Rs58 billion have been allocated for agriculture, Rs77 billion for energy, Rs94 billion for irrigation, Rs86 bil-

lion's commitment to strengthening the province's social safety net and fostering economic recovery.

The provincial budget extends its focus beyond immediate relief measures. Several new initiatives target the long-term development of the province's economy and social well-being.

Hari Card: An allocation of Rs8 billion will provide financial support to 12 million farmers, bolstering the agricultural backbone of Sindh.

Inclusive Enclave: Rs5 billion allocations to build a complex to offer education, rehabilitation, training, accommodation, clinical services, recreation and other facilities within a compound at Korangi along the Malir Expressway.

Fiscal Decentralisation in Police: For the first time 485 police station-specific budget has been allocated to enable them to meet their fuel, repair and maintenance, and day-to-day expenditures to serve communities.

Solarisation Initiative: Another Rs5 billion will be directed towards distributing solar home systems, and promoting clean energy access over five years.

Hub Canal Project: A dedicated Rs5 billion will fund the construction of a new canal to provide water to Karachi.

Mazdoor Card: A Rs5 billion welfare program will provide support for labourers in Sindh.

Pro-Poor Initiatives: To ensure social upward mobility, the budget allocates Rs11 billion to agriculture, Rs12 billion for social protection.

Meanwhile, another Rs3.2 billion have been allocated for Universities & Board, Rs2 billion for Housing & Town Planning, and Rs1.5 billion for Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPD).

The provincial budget prioritises investment in human capital through significant grants for education and healthcare. Major grants amount to a total of Rs190 billion, with Rs35 billion specifically earmarked for universities across Sindh.

These grants will also support major hospitals and medical institutes like Sindh Institute of Urology and Transplantation (SIUT), National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases (NICVD), Indus Hospital, Sindh Institute of Child Health & Neonatology (SICHN) and trauma centres.

This targeted funding aims to strengthen educational institutions and improve access to quality healthcare services for the people of Sindh.

Kashmiri Poet Ahmed Farhad Freed from Prison In Dramatic Bail Decision

MUZAFFARABAD: Kashmiri poet Ahmed Farhad was released from prison hours after the Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) High Court granted him bail weeks after his arrest.

The poet left for Islamabad after his release.

The AJK High Court approved Farhad's bail petition against a surety bond worth Rs200,000, earlier in the day.

Earlier this week, the Islamabad High Court (IHC) declared Farhad as a "missing person" until he returned to his home and termed his arrest "illegal".

The court's order read that the poet had been missing since May 15 and couldn't reach home, while a first information report (FIR) regarding his disappearance was registered with the Lohber Police Station in Islamabad under Section 427 and 365 PPC.

As per the order, the court was told that Farhad Ali was arrested by Police Station Dherkot Kashmir and was also wanted by the Saddar Police Station Muzaaffarabad in another case of terrorism.

It added that in the



above circumstances, the person couldn't be produced before the bench.

Therefore, the court reached a conclusion that he was forcibly disappeared and the institution concerned failed to recover him.

The court, in its order, mentioned that Farhad was currently in judicial custody, as per the investigation officer, and declared his arrest "illegal".

The court stated that the investigation officer of Lohber Police Station was bound to record the poet's statement under Section 164 before a judicial magistrate after his return and proceed with the investigation in light of his statement.

Farhad, a defiant poet from Kashmir, remained missing for 15 days last

month after which Attorney General for Pakistan Mansoor Usman Awan revealed that he was, in fact, arrested and in AJK police's custody.

The AGP's statement came on May 29, in response to IHC's directions to ensure Farhad's recovery.

The poet was arrested and transferred to Muzaaffarabad from Dherkot under multiple sections of the Anti-Terrorism Act (ATA).

His matter came into the spotlight after he allegedly went missing during protests in AJK in May following which his wife, Urooj Zainab, moved the IHC seeking her husband's recovery, requesting the court to identify, investigate, and prosecute those responsible for his disappearance.—RT/Agency

Nikah Case Bombshell: Judge Majoka Vows to Resolve Bushra Bibi's Appeal In Just 10 Days



ISLAMABAD: Additional session judge Afzal Majoka has adjourned the hearing of appeals filed by Bushra Bibi, founder of PTI, against her sentence in the 'Iddat Nikkah' case.

Bushra Bibi's legal team, including Khalid Yusuf Chaudhry and Usman Riaz Gul, appeared in court.

PTI lawyers submitted the written order of the Islamabad High Court on Thursday.

Usman Riaz Gul urged the court to keep the hearing for the following day, stating, "We are still available today, listen to us today."

"If I live, I will decide in 10 days. If the other party does not appear, I will hear you and decide," the judge remarked.

Judge Majoka concluded by saying, "I am writing the order. There will be something bigger than the notice; look at the history."—RT/Agency

Imran Says, Negotiating With 'Powerless' Government Is Useless

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan on Friday stated that there is no point in negotiating with a government that lacks authority.

During an informal conversation with the media during the hearing of the \$190 million reference at Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail, he accused the administration of pressuring judges who rule in favour of PTI and criticised the recent budget for burdening salaried individuals.

Khan alleged that a judge from Sargodha informed the Lahore High Court about pressure exerted by intelligence agencies. He claimed that the judge's household gas supply was cut off and that judges sympathetic to PTI face immense pressure.

"Journalists speaking in favour of PTI are being targeted, Raouf Hassan was attacked, and Ali Zaman was tortured," Khan asserted, implicating intelligence agencies in these actions.

Khan urged the Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faez Isa to uphold the rule of law amidst these interferences. Khan praised a judge from Sargodha, six judges from Islamabad High Court, and PTI avoids negotiations, he



recounted past dialogues during Pervez Musharraf's regime but pointed out that negotiations are futile when decisions are made by "higher authorities".

He mentioned an instance when PTI negotiated with PDM on ex-Chief Justice Bandial's request, only to be told that no elections would occur as long as Bandial was in office.

In a stern message to his party, Khan demanded an end to internal groupings, calling it a matter of life and death for Pakistan. "I will take strict action against anyone creating factions within the party," he warned when asked by a journalist if he wanted the establishment to appoint a representative for negotiations.—RT/Agency

Speaking at the swearing-in ceremony of the Supreme Court Press Association, CJ Isa said judicial reporting was a very challenging task. The chief justice administered the oath to the new members. Justices Athar Minallah, Jamal Khan Mandokhail, and Naqem Akhtar Afghan also participated in the ceremony. The chief justice said he and his mother, Saeda Qazi Isa, used to write articles years ago. In those days, writing



involved a lot of research, he said. "It has become very easy to say whatever comes to mind now," the top judge lamented. The chief justice said that he compiled media rules and published them in the form of a book. He noted that the Zulfikar Ali Bhutto case had been decided, so now opinions can be formed about it.

The Lahore High Court wrote 627 paragraphs and the Supreme Court wrote 963 paragraphs in judgments in the Bhutto case, he added.—RT/Agency

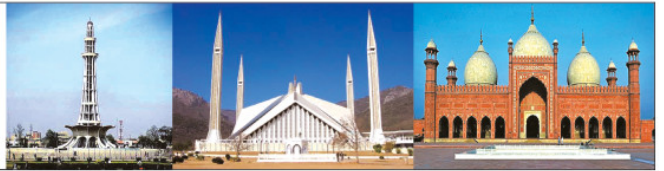

TDAP And Balochistan Agriculture Department Host Seminar On Cherry Export Potential

ISLAMABAD: The Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP), in collaboration with the Agriculture Department of Balochistan, successfully held a seminar on the "Export Potential and Packaging Issues of Cherries" in Ziarat. The event, attended by 75 growers and stakeholders, focused on enhancing cherry cultivation and export in Pakistan.



Cherries, a high-value crop, have substantial export potential in Middle Eastern markets such as the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Kuwait. Despite ideal growing conditions in Ziarat, Pakistan's contribution to the global cherry market remains minimal. The seminar addressed strategies to boost production, improve quality, and tap into these lucrative markets.

Key speakers included Zain-Ul-Abideen from TDAP, who emphasized the economic benefits of cherry cultivation and provided insights on regulatory requirements and effective branding. Shah Jahan, Deputy Director of the Agriculture Department, discussed technical challenges and government support mechanisms.

While Jahanzeb Khan from the Zimedar Action Committee covered quality standards for local and international markets, participants raised concerns about water planning, the need for a cherry association, and training in modern farming techniques. Recommendations included installing large-scale packing plants, upgrading testing labs, providing pruning equipment, and establishing demonstration farms. The seminar concluded with calls to establish a Cherry Growers Association, enhance government support, develop a unified branding strategy, and address supply chain issues. The collaborative efforts of TDAP, the Agriculture Department, and active participation from growers are crucial for developing a vibrant and sustainable cherry industry in Pakistan.—RT

Anchorperson Imran Riaz Released Following Discharge By Lahore Court In New Case

LAHORE: The Lahore police on Friday released anchorperson Imran Riaz Khan after a local court discharged him from a fresh case in which he was arrested a day ago. Riaz was taken into custody at the Allama Iqbal International Airport late on Tuesday night in a case of monetary fraud.



The visuals of the arrest, which showed the journalist clad in an ihram as he was departing for Saudi Arabia for Haj, had gone viral on social media, with the PTI calling for his release. The police had sought his seven-day physical remand in Wednesday's hearing before the Model Town court judicial magistrate.

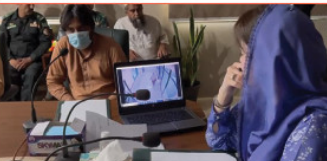
Kamran Zafar reserved the verdict and granted police Riaz's one-day physical remand. Announcing the verdict on Thursday, the judge had discharged the anchorperson from the fraud case.

The prosecutor had said that the anchorperson had borrowed Rs0.25 billion from the complainant but never returned the money. After hearing arguments from both sides, Judicial Magistrate Muhammad

was presented before Judicial Magistrate Hafiz Kashif while Advocates Mian Ali Ashfaq and Rana Maroof appeared as his counsels. The prosecution sought Riaz's physical remand of 10 days on the ground that remaining accused persons are to be arrested based on the anchorperson pointing them out. After hearing arguments from both sides and perusing the case record, the judicial magistrate discharged Riaz from the case.—RT/Agency

His legal representatives submitted a request for his absence from the hearing, citing his health condition. A medical certificate was also presented, indicating that doctors had advised him complete rest due to a rib fracture and underlying cardiovascular issues. Subsequently, the court, while granting Elahi's request for exemption, postponed further proceedings until June 27.

LAHORE: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has tightened its noose around PTI leader Moonis Elahi in money laundering case, declaring him a 'proclaimed offender' and submitting a supplementary challan in Lahore Court, media reported on Friday.

The investigation agency had earlier issued a red warrant for Elahi's arrest, which has already been sent to Interpol. Meanwhile, sources told media that the FIA declared six individuals, including Moonis Elahi, 'proclaimed offender' in the money laundering case.

The challan, submitted in the FIA's anti-money laundering court in Lahore, alleged that Farasat Ali Chatha deposited Rs1 billion into Moonis Elahi's company accounts, further implicating

him in the money laundering scheme. The agency has registered a case against the suspects under the Anti-Money Laundering Act. Moonis Elahi is also facing allegations of billions of rupees of corruption in development projects. It is pertinent to mention here that the Special Central Court in Lahore ordered to seize of all assets and bank accounts of former federal minister Elahi in a money laundering case on November 17.—RT/Agency

This includes better training for government employees, robust monitoring mechanisms, and public involvement in oversight processes. Only through genuine governance reforms can the budget's ambitious goals be realized, ensuring that the substantial funds allocated truly benefit the people of Sindh.

In conclusion, while the Sindh budget for 2024-25 is commendable for its comprehensive and people-friendly approach, its success hinges on addressing the endemic corruption and governance issues that have long plagued the province. Only with these changes can Sindh hope to achieve the prosperity and development envisioned in its budget.

PTI Greenlights Achakzai To Reach Out To PML-N, PPP, And MQM-P

ISLAMABAD: After the Pashtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP) chief was named as negotiator, the Imran Khan-founded Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has now "given the go-ahead to take forward mediation process with the ruling parties", media learnt on Friday.

The opposition alliance, Tehreek-e-Tahafuz Ayeen (TTAP) — formed by the former ruling party — has greenlighted the decision to initiate political talks with the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), Pakistan Peoples Party and Muttahida Quami Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P).

The sources added that the alliance would "formally contact the ruling parties after finalising the terms of references (ToRs)". Additionally, representatives of each party in the alliance would be included in the delegation. It was also learnt that Achakzai will also take Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) in confidence following the Eid ul Adha festival.

The well-informed insiders also confirmed that the incarcerated PTI founder would fully back the negotiation process led by Achakzai. Earlier this week, the PTI picked Achakzai to lead the negotiations with the opposition alliance's platform.

The PML-N chairman enjoys the full authority from the PTI to lead the talks with the government that will centre upon matters about the release of incarcerated leaders and workers, electoral transparency, and the constitutional boundaries of the judiciary, parliament and other state institutions. The PTI's political leadership will also be part of the negotiations with the government, sources said. PTI chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan told the media persons this week that the former prime minister wanted avenues of dialogue to be opened. He told journalists that Khan was ready to forgive what had happened to him for the sake of reconciliation. "The PTI founder has said many times that I am ready to forgive what happened to me," the PTI chairman said. When asked if the negotiations will take place at the behest of the Supreme Court's advice, Barrister Gohar said: "The option given by the SC is also under consideration." However, he emphasised that it was PTI's "own decision" to negotiate. "The PTI founder did not write any letter to the SC for negotiation. The PTI will also respond to its negotiation option."—RT/Agency

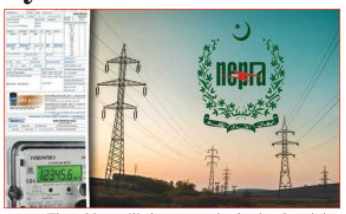

NEPRA Raises Base Power Tariff By 5.72 Per Unit

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) on Friday approved an increase of Rs 5.72 per unit in the basic electricity tariff for the financial year 2023-24.

The decision to raise the electricity tariff has been sent to the federal government for final approval. Following the Prime Minister's endorsement, the increase in the basic electricity tariff will be implemented from July 1, 2024. The average basic electricity tariff will rise from Rs 29.78 to Rs 35.5 per unit. Sources indicate that the federal cabinet will decide on the electricity price increase. The cabinet will also determine whether the raise will be applied all at once or gradually.

It is worth noting that in the current financial year, the federal government raised the basic electricity tariff by Rs 7.50 per unit, whereas in the last financial year, the basic electricity tariff was increased by Rs 7.91 per unit. For the financial year 2023-24, the basic electricity tariff was increased in a single lump sum, while in the financial year 2022-23, the tariff was increased in three phases.—RT/Agency

KATI Criticizes Federal Budget For Ignoring Industrial Sector

KARACHI: Johar Qandhari, President of the Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (KATI), has voiced strong criticism of the federal government's recent budget, highlighting a complete lack of facilities and incentives for the industrial sector. Qandhari expressed disappointment, noting that the budget fails to address the development needs of industries and does not provide any strategy to reduce production costs or energy prices.



Qandhari also criticized the budget's additional taxes on current taxpayers, driven by the IMF's demands, warning that such measures would only exacerbate inflation and push more people below the poverty line. He highlighted the complete tax exemption for the agricultural sector, which accounts for 20% of the GDP, as a concerning disparity.

Qandhari pointed out that the budget includes an unprecedented 40% lump sum tax increase on exports, raising significant concerns within the business community. He emphasized that the burden on existing taxpayers has increased without a corresponding effort to expand the tax net. The lack of measures to promote investment, combined with increased taxes and duties on raw materials, will lead to higher product prices and stifle industrial growth.

LHC CJ Foresees Imminent End to Establishment's Interference in Judiciary

RAWALPINDI: Lahore High Court (LHC) Chief Justice Malik Shehzad Ahmed Khan on Friday said he believes that interference of the establishment in the matters of the judiciary will end soon.

"Interference in the judiciary will have to be fought with faith that it will come to an end," said the LHC chief justice while addressing the opening ceremony of the judicial complex e-courts in Rawalpindi.

Justice Khan said there was an issue of establishment's interference in the judiciary's matters, adding that they receive letters claiming involvement in the judicial affairs.

"The establishment's interference in judiciary will



and my experience [tells me] that it will come to an end," said the judge, assuring that these difficulties will end if there is fear of God.

The LHC chief justice also said that he was happy that the judiciary was "fulfilling its responsibilities without any fear or greed".

The chief justice's com-

ments came after six Islamabad High Court (IHC) judges wrote a letter to the Supreme Court on March 25, accusing spy agencies of meddling in judicial affairs.

The IHC judges had demanded Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faiz Isa to convene the judicial convention to consider the matter of alleged interference of intel-

ligence operatives in the judicial functions or "intimidation" of judges in a manner that undermined the independence of the judiciary.

The six IHC judges — Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kayani, Justice Babar Sattar, Justice Arbab Muhammad Tahir, Justice Tariq Mahmood Jehangiri, Justice Sardar Ejaz Ishaq Khan and Justice Saman Rifat Imtiaz — had written a letter to the chief justice, who is also chairman of the Supreme Judicial Council (SJC).

Speaking about the issues in the judiciary, the LHC CJ said delay in verdicts of cases is the biggest problem. "Three generations [of a family] wait for verdicts and it [sometimes] take 30 years," he lamented.

Justice Khan maintained that the cases are delayed because of the unavailability of witnesses, adding that he has consulted with high court judges to solve the issues.

He said that the people living overseas had trouble appearing before the court and their properties in Pakistan are stolen.

The LHC chief justice said legal issues were also reviewed in the context of e-courts, adding that those abductees will not be allowed to appear via video link.

"Pakistanis living abroad will be able to get video link facility by coming to the embassy," he added. The LHC CJ also blamed the lawyers as the main reason for delay in cases. —RT/Agency

PTI Shocks with Sudden Reversal on Talks Offer with 'Three Parties'

ISLAMABAD: After a seeming change of heart in the PTI to reach out to the government to end the political impasse, the party on Friday walked back and said it would not talk with "three parties".

In February, PTI spokesperson Raouf Hasan had said that party founder Imran Khan had given instructions to initiate contact with all other political parties, except the PML-N, PPP and Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan.

The three parties are part of the coalition that is heading the government.

In an apparent U-turn from its earlier assertions that the former ruling party would only talk to "empowered" stakeholders and not the "toothless ruling" coalition, Imran on Tuesday had ordered the party's top brass to reach out to the government for a dialogue.

The change of heart came in light of remarks by the Supreme Court during a hearing of the graft laws amendments case, in which the bench observed that the PTI should initiate talks with the government and resolve its issues in parliament through dialogue.

Speaking to journalists outside Adiala Jail, PTI leader Gohar Ali Khan had said that Imran gave the go-ahead for the talks with the government. He had said the party would initially take its allies into confidence but



could also take a solo flight on the issue.

Gohar had said that the talks with the government could be initiated through the platform of the opposition's multi-party coalition alliance or by the PTI on its own.

He added that he had concluded that talks were the only option available to the party.

However, while addressing a press conference in Islamabad today with Leader of the Opposition in the National Assembly Omar Ayub,

Hasan said: "Regarding a controversy on the media that the PTI is moving to have negotiations with three political parties that are mandate usurpers, Imran has clearly told us that there is no situation like this."

He said Imran had asked for the three parties to first bring and show their "letter of authorisation from their sponsors and patrons" about whether they actually had any authority to negotiate with the PTI and if they would be able to deliver on any promises to the party.

"Our contention since the first day is that they have nothing and they're only mummies and dummies whose strings are controlled from elsewhere and they dance according to them."

He said Imran had clearly directed in "blunt words that we have no intention to negotiate with these three political parties at any stage".

Hasan said if there was any ambiguity left about the matter then it should be removed now.

Omar added that Imran said that if Tehreek-i-Tahafuz-i-Aain-i-Pakistan president Mahmood Khan Achakzai wanted to hold talks with anyone from the coalition alliance's platform then he was welcome to do so but such negotiations would only be on the movement's behalf.

"The PTI has a demand that they have to fulfill our prerequisites [and] eliminate all cases against Imran, Bushra Bibi and our officers and any talks will be held after that." —RT/Agency

Pakistan's Skyrocketing Debt Poses Dire Threat To Financial Stability

ISLAMABAD: Global rating agency Moody's on Friday said that the country's weak debt affordability drives high debt sustainability risks as it noted that the government spends more than half its revenue on interest payments.

In a comment regarding the newly finalized bill for the fiscal year (FY) 2025, it said: "The budget estimated debt servicing payments to have increased by about 18pc for fiscal 2025 compared with a year ago."

"The government spends more than half its revenue on interest payments, indicating very weak debt affordability which drives high debt sustainability risks" it said, adding that "about 55pc of fiscal year 2025 revenue (Rs9.8 trillion) is earmarked for interest payments on the government's debt".

Regarding the increase in expenditure, the rating agency said it reflected "lack of significant cost-containment measures and Pakistan's very high interest payments".

It was quick to note that the subsidies increased by 27pc to Rs1.4 trillion, "mainly driven by large increases in subsidies to the power sector" which reflected little progress in energy sector reforms.

Overall, the rating agency said that budget reflected "quicker fiscal consolidation, but ability to



sustain reforms will be key to easing liquidity risks".

Moreover, the agency echoed the same sentiments as experts as it highlighted that the finance bill "will likely support Pakistan's ongoing negotiations with the IMF for a new Extended Fund Facility (EFF) programme that will be crucial for the government to unlock financing from IMF and other bilateral and multilateral partners to meet its external financing needs".

However, it cautioned that the government's ability to "sustain reform implementation" will be key to meeting the budget targets and unlocking external financing, which is necessary for easing of liquidity risks. It highlighted that "a resurgence of social tensions on the back of high cost of living — which may increase because of higher taxes and future adjustments to energy tariffs — could weigh on reform implementation." Moreover, risks that the coalition government

may not have a sufficiently strong electoral mandate to continually implement difficult reforms remain," it commented.

In the budget, the government had announced a consolidated budget deficit of 5.9 per cent of the GDP for the fiscal year 2025 — from the previous year's estimated 7.4pc — with the primary balance set at a surplus of 2pc of GDP for the upcoming year, the report recounted. Additionally, the government has projected real GDP growth at 3.6pc and headline inflation at 12pc. It also sought to increase federal government revenue to an ambitious Rs17.8 trillion — 46pc higher than previous year's — through a "combination of new taxes and stronger nominal growth".

According to the comment, this showed that "the government seeks to achieve quicker fiscal consolidation mainly through increases in revenue, with little spending-containment measures" —RT/Agency

PM Declares Big Cut In Electricity Prices For Industrial Sector



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif announced a significant reduction in electricity tariffs for the industrial sector on Friday, cutting rates by Rs10.69 per unit.

This move aims to boost exports and industrial production.

Due to the prime minister's special efforts, the new electricity price per unit for the industrial and export sector is set at Rs34.99.

According to a statement from the PM Office, the National Electricity Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) recommended this reduction for industries.

The PM's package is expected to provide over Rs200 billion in relief to industries, enhancing their competitiveness in the global market.

The package aims to align the country's manufacturing costs with international markets, reducing production costs for industrial and agricultural commodities.

This is anticipated to lead to an increase in

exports. The tariff cut is also expected to accelerate industrial growth, create new job opportunities, and stimulate economic rates by Rs10.69 per unit.

It may be mentioned that NEPRA had proposed a reduction of Rs10.69 per unit in electricity prices for industries.

Prime Minister Shehbaz's special package is set to alleviate over Rs200 billion worth of burden from industries.

Sources indicate that this relief aims to make the cost of goods competitive in the global market.

It is also expected to reduce the production costs of industrial and agricultural products, leading to a significant increase in exports.

Experts believe that the prime minister's announcement will accelerate industrial development and rapidly increase employment.

The faster pace of industrial activity and the rise in exports will benefit the national economy. —RT/Agency

Parliamentary Committee Greenlights Judges' Names For Supreme Court Promotion

ISLAMABAD: The Parliamentary Committee on the Appointment of Judges Friday approved the names of judges proposed by the Judicial Commission of Pakistan (JCP) for elevation to the Supreme Court.

The development came after a meeting of the parliamentary committee was held in Islamabad today to take a decision on the appointment of apex court judges.

The committee approved all the names proposed by the JCP which included Lahore High Court Chief Justice Malik Shehzad Ahmad Khan, Sindh High Court Chief Justice Aqeel Ahmad Abbasi and LHC's Justice Shahid Bilal.

Last week, the JCP sent the names of three high court judges to be considered for elevation to the SC for final approval by the Parliamentary committee.

The names, recommended for appointment to vacant SC seats, were proposed during a meeting of the Judicial Commission held under chairmanship of Chief



Justice Qazi Faiz Isa, said the sources.

JCP Isa had, last month, convened the JCP meeting for deliberations over the appointment of three judges in the SC.

The JCP was constituted under the 18th Constitutional Amendment mandated to appoint judges in the superior judiciary.

It was tasked to consider names of nine judges, including LHC chief justice and SHC chief justice, for filling the three vacant posts in the apex court.

Chaired by the JCP, the meeting was to be attended JCP members — Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Munib Akhtar, Justice Yahya

Afridi, Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice (ret'd) Manzoor Ahmed Malik, Federal Minister for Law Azam Nazir Tarar, Attorney General Mansoor Usman Awan and Pakistan Bar Council representative advocate Akhtar Hussain.

As per the Constitution, the actual strength of judges of the Supreme Court is 17 while at present the apex court only has 14 judges including the JCP.

The three posts are to be filled after the retirement of former chief justice Umar Ata Bandial and resignations of Justice Ijazul Ahsan and Justice Syed Mazhar Ali Akbar Naqvi. —RT/Agency

ECP Sets Explosive Hearing Date for Contempt Case Against Imran and Fawad

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has rescheduled the hearing of the contempt case against PTI founder Imran Khan and Fawad Chaudhry for June 26, media reported on Friday.

The contempt case, filed against Imran Khan and Fawad Chaudhry for allegedly using derogatory language against the ECP, will be heard by the Election Commission Bench. Evidence will be recorded against the PTI leaders on the scheduled date.

This development comes

after a three-month hiatus in the case, which was previously stalled due to various reasons.

It is pertinent to mention that PTI founder Imran Khan and former federal minister Fawad Chaudhry were indicted in the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) contempt case on Jan 3, 2024.

The hearing of the contempt case was held in Adiala Jail — where the court currently holds the founder of PTI.

During the hearing, the accused in the case were formally charged through a read-aloud indictment, after which the hearing was adjourned till January 16.

In August 2022, the ECP issued notices to the founder of PTI and others for allegedly using "intemperate" language against Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Sikandar Sultan Raja and the electoral watchdog.

The political leaders repeatedly lambasted the commission and CEC Sikandar Raja and termed the electoral body a "subsidary of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz". —RT/Agency

Shehbaz To Chair ECNEC Instead Of Finance Minister

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif reconstituted the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC) with himself as the chairman, depriving Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb of heading the committee, media reported.

According to practice, the finance minister heads the ECNEC as during the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) government, first Miftah Ismail and then Ishaq Dar headed the ECNEC. During the caretaker setup, then Finance Minister Shamsah Akhtar headed the ECNEC, as per the practice. This time



around, the premier himself would head the ECNEC, while Deputy Prime Minister Khan Shero Khan and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb and Planning and Development Minister Ahsan Iqbal will also be the members of the committee.

Punjab Senior Minister Mariyum Aurangzeb, Sindh Irrigation Minister Jam Shero Khan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Provincial Advisor on Finance Muzamil Planning and Development Minister Ahsan Iqbal will also be the members of the committee. —RT/Agency
