TTP leader 'killed' in Afghanistan's Kunar province

KUNAR: An important leader of the outlawed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan, Abdul Mannan alias Ha-keemullah, was killed in Afghanistan's northeastern province Kunar, sources told Geo News on Wednesday.

According to the sources, the terrorist — killed in district Asadabad in Afghanistan — was a member of TTP's Malakand Shura and was involved in target killing, landmine blasts in Bajaur, firing at security checkpoints and extortion.

He was the right hand of TTP leader Azmatullah Mehsud, as per the sources, and played a key role in shaping terrorist operations in Bajaur.

The sources added that the terrorist had joined the TTP in 2007 and took part in several actions against security forces and innocent civilians, said sources.

Mannan's brother, Tariq alias Asad, is also related to the outlawed TTP, according to the sources.

It should be noted that TTP is the leading terrorist



organisation in Pakistan. Meanwhile, the hideouts of Afghan terrorists are currently in Kunar, Nuristan, Paktika, Khost and other areas of the country.

Abdul Mannan's killing comes almost a week after law enforcement agencies conducted an intelligence-based operation (IBO) foiling the bids of TTP to set up offices in Balochistan.

According to the Counterterrorism Department (CTD), intelligence agencies also detained several dangerous terrorists, including those involving high-value and most wanted targets.

Authorities revealed that

among those captured include the notorious and most-wanted commander of the TTP Khawarij's Shura.

According to the preliminary investigation by the agencies, the arrested terrorists have been involved in several activities against Pakistan, alongside having linkages with domestic and international terrorists.

The CTD expected that crucial information would be obtained about the secret activities of such networks within the country, as law enforcers continue to investigate the arrested people. —RT/Agency

Gandapur raids grid station, restores power as load-shedding dispute escalates big time

PESHAWAR: The power loadshedding dispute in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) has reached a critical point, propelling Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur to gate-crash a grid station and forcibly restore the power supply on top of declaring his "very own" outage plan, Geo News reported on Wednesday.

In a decisive move to address the issue, Gandapur visited the Dera Ismail Khan (DI Khan) grid station to oversee the restoration of electricity.

On the occasion, CM Gandapur fixed the loadshedding duration at 12 hours.

"No area will face loadshedding beyond 12 hours. Assembly members should visit grid stations in their respective areas to ensure compliance with the loadshedding schedule," he said.

Earlier, addressing a press conference, CM Ali Amin Gandapur picked apart the federal government for withholding approximately Rs1,600 billion in dues and revenues owed to the provincial government.

"The federal government said it needs some



time to review the power system and asked for our support," he said. "However, the timeline given to the Centre has expired. I tried to contact Federal Minister for Energy (Power Division) Awais Leghari but received no response."

"This means you (the people) and we are free," he stated, urging everyone to follow his policy and spread it. "No one should damage any Wapda asset because it is our asset, made with our tax money."

Addressing the police, Gandapur said: "I have informed the KP police chief that no cases should be registered against anyone at Wapda's request. This is KP's police. It is not bound to Wapda. Wapda is committing in-

justice, and we are not getting our due rights. You have to act justly."

"Imran Khan has made me the chief minister of your province. As the chief executive, you must follow my instructions," he emphasised the need to follow his directives, ensuring personnel accompany lawmakers to oversee grid stations and ensure no faults and no loadshedding beyond 12 hours.

"It is the federal government's responsibility to resolve these issues, but it is failing, hence the criticism," Gandapur said. He announced plans to curtail the national power supply from the province. "I am also coming to Islamabad. Don't think I am saying this only from

my province. I will say all this in Islamabad too."

The police registered an FIR regarding this incident but did not name MPA Fazal Elahi in the prime minister called and spoke about the case.

Officials from Peshawar Electric Supply Company (PESCO) reported that MPA Elahi forcibly restored power to ten feeders with high line losses at 11 PM, causing a financial loss of Rs2.64 million to PESCO.

According to PESCO officials, these feeders have since been shut down again. The power company officials noted that Elahi's constituency was served by feeders with high losses, leading to 16-hour loadshedding in those areas. PESCO further clarified that in KP's rural areas with high line losses, 16-hour loadshedding was being implemented. However, in areas with no losses, no loadshedding is being conducted.

They added this incident came on the heels of the viral video of MPA Fazal Elahi, a member of the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC), strongarmed his way into the Rehman Baba grid station in Peshawar on Tuesday and restored power in his area.

Ahsan slams smear drive targeting Pakistan-China ties

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Planning Ahsan Iqbal on Wednesday accused "a political party" of spreading misinformation about Pakistan-China relations over the past few days, claiming that a smear campaign was underway to sabotage the strong ties between two time-tested friends.

"Trolling is being used to put pressure on critics, subjecting them to harassment," Iqbal said addressing a press conference in Lahore.

"While differences exist between the government and opposition, state institutions should not be targeted. Weakening these institutions jeopardises the stability of the state."

The minister pointed out that for the first time, Pakistan and China were advancing their relations in the space sector.

"China's participation will elevate the space programme to new heights. China has expressed readiness to enhance CPEC at an upgraded level," he reiterated.

The federal minister further added that "cooperation with China have also expanded into the space sector."

"After hearing joint statements, only a fool would claim that relations are deteriorating. Relations with China have improved after recent engagements."

Iqbal quoted the Chinese



President as saying that "they (China) want to deepen strategic relations".

The planning minister remarked that Pakistan-China relations would further strengthen, dismissing claims that China had downgraded its relations as enemy propaganda.

The minister emphasised that any attempt to toy with the interests of the state would be dealt with iron hands, and "we may have disagreements, but that doesn't mean we are playing for the state's interests".

Earlier on Sunday, in an apparent reference to the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Barrister Aqeel Malik, the federal government's spokesperson on legal affairs warned that the state would clamp on those involved in running anti-state campaign on social media in a bid to damage Pakistan's ties with friendly countries.

He urged the PTI to quit its "anti-state activities and

propaganda," and hold dialogue with the government on political issues to mull over solutions instead of damaging the nation's interest at global forums.

The spokesperson stated this while addressing a press conference to brief the media on the political party's anti-state activities abroad.

Barrister Malik said that there was no precedent to PTI's "enmity as it was perpetrating anti-Pakistan legislation in foreign countries".

"Pakistan is an independent country and does not take dictation from any nation. We want friendly relations with all nations."

"However, a concentrated smear campaign against Pakistan in foreign countries that started after the 2022 vote of no confidence which mounted the anti-Pakistan propaganda," he said, adding that the PTI had hired lobbyists and PR firms to promote anti-Pakistan campaign abroad. —RT/Agency

Chinese Minister Liu Jianchao to visit Pakistan



ISLAMABAD: Minister of the International Department of the Communist Party of China (IDCPC) and member of the Communist Party's Central Committee Liu Jianchao is set to visit Islamabad from 20-22 June 2024 on the invitation of Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar.

During the visit, Liu will co-chair with Dar the Third Meeting of the Pakistan-China Joint Consultative Mechanism (JCM) of the Political Parties on CPEC. He will also call on the senior civil and military leadership of Pakistan.

Established in 2019, the JCM of Political Parties on CPEC is a regular consultation mechanism between the Communist Party of China and the political parties of Pakistan. Previous meetings were held on 19 March 2019 in Beijing and on 20 August 2020 virtually. At the Third Meeting of the JCM, Pakistan and China will review the progress of CPEC projects, CPEC's contribution to Pakistan's socio-economic development, and its upgradation and extension for regional connectivity. The visit is a part of high-level exchanges between Pakistan and China including between the Communist Party of China and the political parties of Pakistan.

It reflects upon the importance attached by the two countries to further deepen their "All-Weather Strategic Cooperative Partnership", reaffirm mutual support on issues of respective core interests, advance high-quality development of CPEC and enhance communication and dialogue on important regional and global developments. —RT/Agency

Bilawal to meet Shehbaz to discuss reservations over federal budget

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan People's Party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari is likely to meet Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to discuss his party's reservations over the federal budget.

According to sources, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has conveyed Eid greetings to Bilawal Bhutto and invited him to visit the PM house.

The PPP chairman will discuss the issues related to the Punjab and centre during his meeting with the prime minister.

Bilawal Bhutto will also discuss his party's reservations about the federal budget.

Earlier, the PPP had attended the budget session only after a high-powered delegation of PML-N vis-



ited Bilawal Bhutto Zardari at his chamber in National Assembly.

MNA Shazia Marri of PPP had said that the PML-N violated its earlier commitments related to the PSDP and therefore they had decided not to participate in the budget session.

Senior PPP leader Syed Khurshid Shah had said that they were not informed

about the budget and the government did not take them into confidence regarding agreements with the IMF and China. Later, Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar and senior cabinet member Rana Tanveer Hussain had visited Bilawal Bhutto's chamber in NA to convince the PPP to participate in the budget session. —RT/Agency

Illegal deductions from BISP stipends continuing unabatedly in TMK

TANDO MUHAMMAD KHAN: In a disturbing turn of events at the Benazir Income Support Program (BISP) center established at Mono Technical College, there have been numerous allegations of illegal deductions from stipends meant for deserving women. The situation is further exacerbated by the reported humiliation of these women and improper behavior towards journalists who sought to cover the issue.



Multiple organizations have voiced their outrage over these incidents. The Sindh United Party, Tehreek-e-Labaika Pakistan (TLP), social organizations, and human rights groups have all demanded immediate legal action against BISP in-charge Faisal Morai and his associates. Suspension of power supply in JNA makes life difficult for locals

JAM NAWAZ ALI: Residents of Berani are expressing growing frustration as electricity supply has remained disrupted for the past three days due to a malfunctioning transformer in Shaikh Muhalla. In response, local residents have taken to the streets in protest against the prolonged outage. Protesters have blocked the main road in protest against what they perceive as practical negligence by the authorities. This blockade has resulted in severe traffic congestion, signifi-

cantly disrupting the flow of vehicles in the area. The protesters, including Asif Shaikh, Junaid Irfan, Ali Raza Shaikh, and others, voiced their grievances with loud slogans condemning the authorities for failing to address the issue promptly. Mushahid Hussain Sayed Becomes First Pakistani To Address BRICS Forum In Russia

VLADIVOSTOK: Mushahid Hussain Sayed made history as the first Pakistani to address the official International BRICS Forum, hosted by Russia in Vladivostok. The two-day event, organized by the ruling United Russia Party, highlighted the interest of 29 countries, including Pakistan, in joining BRICS, which represents nearly half the world's population and 30% of global GDP.



In his keynote speech, Mushahid Hussain, Co-Chairman of the International Conference of Asian Political Parties (ICAPP) and head of two think tanks in Pakistan, emphasized Pakistan's aspiration to join BRICS. He stated, "Pakistan hopes to join BRICS as part of the new emerging order of the Global South." He also noted Pakistan's upcoming role as a member of the UN Security Council in 2025-2026, promising a strong voice for peace and justice.

Mushahid criticized the unraveling post-World War II Western-propped global order and highlighted the importance of BRICS and the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in the new global order. He outlined three major trends for the future: Democratization of international relations; Promoting equality and the rule of law; Demilitarization of international relations; Criticizing Western Cold War hysteria and alliances like QUAD and AUKUS. De-dollarization of the international financial system: Noting the shift away from the US dollar, with 68 UN member states and Saudi Arabia trading in non-dollar currencies. Mushahid supported President Putin's call for a new Eurasian Security paradigm and President Xi Jinping's Global Security Initiative. He also thanked Russia and China for their stance on the Gaza situation, condemning Israel's actions as a crime against humanity and criticizing Western double standards.

Journalist Khalil Jibran Fatally Shot In KP's Landi Kotal



KHYBER. A senior journalist Khalil Jibran has been killed by unidentified gunmen near his residence in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Landi Kotal town, police said Wednesday. Jibran, who was associated with a private news channel - Khyber News - was targeted by unidentified miscreants on a motorcycle when he was heading towards his residence with his friend Sajjad Advocate, District Police Officer (DPO) Khyber Salim Abbas said. He detailed that the journalist's car developed a fault near his home when the gunmen surrounded him, dragged him out of his vehicle and opened fire at him. Jibran, who was also former president of the Landi Kotal Press Club, died on the spot and Sajjad got wounded, while the culprits fled from the scene. His body was shifted to a Landi Kotal hospital for post mortem, the police officer said. The incident took place in Mazreena area in the vicinity of Landi Kotal Police Station, he added. Abbas claimed that Jibran had also received threats from terrorists. —RT/Agency

Putin and Kim embrace in North Korea, vow new multi-polar world



Shortly after North Korean leader Kim Jong Un embraced Russian Vladimir Putin on his arrival at Pyongyang's airport on Wednesday, the two leaders shared their "pent-up inmost thoughts" and agreed to develop their nations' relations, North Korean state media said. Putin, who arrived in the pre-dawn hours, is on his first trip to the North Korean capital in 24 years, a visit likely to reshape decades of Russia-North Korea relations at a time when both countries face international isolation. The countries' partnership is an "engine for accelerating the building of a new multi-polar world" and Putin's visit demonstrates the invincibility and durability of their friendship and unity, North Korea's state news agency KCNA said. Russia has used its warming ties with North Korea to needle Washington, while heavily sanctioned North Korea has won political backing and promises of economic support and trade from Moscow. The United States and its allies say they fear Russia

could provide aid for North Korea's missile and nuclear programs, which are banned by UN Security Council resolutions, and have accused Pyongyang of providing ballistic missiles and artillery shells that Russia has used in its war in Ukraine. Moscow and Pyongyang have denied weapons transfers. Kim greeted Putin, shaking hands, embracing and talking beside the Russian leader's plane. The pair then rode in the same limousine to the Kumsusan State Guest House. "Passing through charmingly lit streets of Pyongyang at night, the two leaders exchanged their pent-up inmost thoughts and opened their minds to more surely develop the DPRK-Russia relations," KCNA reported, using the initials of North Korea's official name. Wednesday's agenda includes one-on-one discussions between the two leaders, as well as a gala concert, state reception, honour guards, document signings and a statement to the media, Russia's Interfax news agency quoted Putin's foreign policy adviser Yuri Ushakov as saying. In a signal that Russia, a veto-wielding member of the UN Security Council, is reassessing its entire approach to North Korea, Putin praised Pyongyang ahead of his arrival for resisting what he said was US economic pressure, blackmail and threats. —Agency

Application Filed For FIR Against MPA Fazal And Others Over 'Attack' On Grid Station

PESHAWAR. The Pesco has lodged an application with police for registration of an FIR against KP MPA Fazal Elahi and 45 others for storming a grid station and forcibly restoring power supply, causing over Rs2.6 million financial loss to the company. MPA Fazal allegedly entered Rehman Baba grid station and restored power to 10 feeders.



A video showing the MPA and dozens of other people forcibly entering the grid station has gone viral. MPA Fazal claimed that Pesco and the district administration had given a schedule for loadshedding, but they did not follow their own schedule and did unscheduled loadshedding, causing great inconvenience to the masses. He said he was forced to go to the grid station and restore the power supply. The Rashid Garhi Sub-Division SDO has filed an application in Rehman Baba Police Station. The complainant alleged that MPA Fazal Elahi and Jameel along with 45 people stormed the Rehman Baba grid station. —RT/Agency

North Korea Helping Russia Carry Out 'Mass Murder' Of Civilians: Ukraine



Kyiv: A senior Ukrainian presidential aide on Wednesday said North Korea was helping Russia kill Ukrainian civilians and called for greater international isolation of both countries. Russian President Vladimir Putin and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un on Wednesday signed a comprehensive strategic partnership, deepening military and political ties that have flourished since Russia invaded Ukraine. "There is no doubt that North Korea is actively cooperating with Russia in the military sphere today and deliberately provides resources for the mass murder of Ukrainians," the aide, Mykhailo Podolyak told AFP. The United States and its allies have accused North Korea of providing ammunition and missiles to help Russia's war and Ukraine has reported finding fragments of North Korean munitions on the battlefield. Deliveries of North Korean artillery shells to Russia were helping its forces maintain a "high intensity" of attacks, Podolyak said. "This has an impact on the course of events in the war as a whole and significantly increases the number of civilian casualties." The aide blasted the "absolute incapacity" of international sanctions on Russia and North Korea. "It is obvious that the restrictive measures imposed on Russia and North Korea are not enough. We need a more rigorous approach to their isolation," he said. During a state visit to Pyongyang, Putin called for a review of sanctions on North Korea and said the two countries were together fighting "US hegemony." —Agency

Canada Declares Iran's Revolutionary Guards A Terrorist Group



Ottawa: Ottawa on Wednesday listed Iran's Revolutionary Guards as a terrorist entity while calling on Canadians in the Islamic country to leave. "Our government has made the decision to list the Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps as a terrorist entity under the Criminal Code," Public Safety Minister Dominic LeBlanc told a news conference. Flanked by Canada's foreign and justice ministers, he accused the Iranian regime of "support for terrorism" and "having consistently displayed disregard for human rights both inside and outside of Iran, as well as a willingness to destabilize the international rules-based order." Foreign Minister Melanie Joly, noting that Ottawa broke off diplomatic ties with Tehran several years ago, urged Canadians against travel to Iran. "For those who are in Iran right now, it's time to come back home," she added. The terrorism listing bars members of the Guards from entering Canada and Canadians from having any dealings with individual members or the group. Any assets the Guards or its members hold in Canada may also be seized. Iranian expats and fami-

lies of the victims of Flight PS752, which was downed by Iran shortly after takeoff from Tehran in January 2020, killing all 176 passengers and crew, including 85 Canadian citizens and permanent residents, have long pressed Ottawa to designate the militia as a terrorist entity. MPs last month unanimously voted to do so. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's administration had, until now, expressed a reluctance, explaining that a terror listing could be too broad and inadvertently impact Iranians in Canada opposed to the regime. The Canadian blacklist includes nearly 80 entities including Al-Qaeda, Hezbollah, the Taliban, the Islamic State group and the Proud Boys, a North American neo-fascist militant group. Ottawa has previously listed the Quds Force, a branch of the Guards, as a terrorist entity, and in 2022 permanently denied entry to more than 10,000 Iranian officials, including members of the Guards. The United States listed the Guards as a foreign terrorist organization in April 2019. Earlier this month, the European Union also sanctioned the Guards for allegedly supplying drones to Russia and its allies in the Middle East. The decision to add the Guards to Canada's terror list comes amid tensions between Ottawa and Tehran. Canada and other nations have sued Iran at the International Court of Justice over the downing of Flight PS752. Tehran has claimed a missile strike on the aircraft was carried out by mistake. Ahead of the press conference, Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland described the Iran regime as "brutal, repressive, theocratic and misogynist." —Agency

Balochistan's Bugti Hopes For A Balanced Budget Amid Difficult Circumstances

QUETTA: Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Sarfraz Bugti said that they want to bring a balanced budget in difficult situations benefiting education, health, communication, and agriculture directly, all areas of public engagement. On the third day of Eid, the Chief Minister's Secretariat remained open to the public, and people from different walks of life met the Chief Minister. Provincial Minister Rahila Hameed Durrani, Bakht Kakar, Haji Muhammad Khan Lahri and others also met the CM. Chief Minister Balochistan further said that a task force will be formed to deal



with the pending issues related to solarization and electricity theft. Bugti said that a liver transplant hospital will be established in Naseerabad. He said that they want to provide relief to poor people by improving medical facilities. —RT/Agency

Four Indian spies quietly removed from Australia in 2020



Four Indian intelligence officers were quietly asked to leave Australia in 2020, according to a report by Australia's national broadcaster ABC. The ABC report published on June 16, 2024 is titled 'Infiltrating Australia.' It contends that the "long arm of the Indian state is reaching Australians and threatening national security." The report said the "Indian intelligence officers were trying to gain access to sensitive defence technology and airport security protocols." They also were suspected of targeting politicians, and monitoring the Indian-Australian community. This incident occurred against the backdrop of growing political and economic ties between Australia and India, including defence cooperation aimed at countering China's influence in the region. Despite these strengthening ties, Australian authorities had reportedly raised concerns about the

alleged activities of the Indian officers. In 2021, Australia's intelligence chief, Mike Burgess, confirmed his agency had dealt with a group of foreign spies, though he did not specify the country involved. The officers were expelled "quietly and professionally," according to Burgess. ABC's investigation found that at least four intelligence officers, some allegedly working as diplomats, left Australia. These expulsions were not publicly announced. Australian Senator David Shoebridge suggested that a public re-raise concerns about the might have strengthened ties with both India and the Indian-Australian community. Other sources indicated that this incident could position India alongside countries like Russia and China, known for their intelligence activities abroad. The report highlighted that since Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi came to power in 2014, he has "amped up India's intelligence operations." It added that the Indian diaspora is also monitored and targeted under pretext of "defending the country from separatist groups, which his administration has labelled 'terrorists'." —Agency

Rawalpindi Man Cuts Off Female Donkey's Ears In Latest Act Of Animal Cruelty

RAWALPINDI: Days after the horrific case of a landlord amputating a camel, a man in Rawalpindi chopped off the ears of a female donkey in another incident of animal cruelty in Rawalpindi. Police said that the culprit, who is an influential personality, resorted to physical violence against the pregnant donkey for entering his farms in the Rawat area. They said that a case was registered against the suspect on the complaint of donkey's owner, Tanveer Hussain.



As per the First Information Report (FIR), the complainant said that he had let his donkey lose to drink water after the wheat harvest at the farms but she entered the agricultural land of suspect, Arshad Mehmod. At this, the nominated suspect allegedly sliced both

Grow up you pathetic loser, Haris Rauf!

The recent incident involving Pakistani pacer Haris Rauf lunging at a Pakistani-American fan in the USA is a stark reminder of the deep-rooted dysfunction within the Pakistan Cricket Team (PCT). Rauf's unprofessional behavior, captured in a viral video, not only tarnishes his personal reputation but also reflects poorly on the entire team and the nation they represent. His actions during a public confrontation, where he lost his temper over a fan's criticism, are indefensible and highlight a severe lack of discipline and professionalism.

This incident occurred against the backdrop of the PCT's disappointing exit from the ICC T20 Men's World Cup 2024, a failure that has already angered fans. Instead of addressing their poor performance with humility and introspection, players

like Rauf are lashing out, exacerbating an already volatile situation. Rauf's excuse, claiming he will not tolerate criticism involving his family, does lit-



tle to justify his aggressive behavior. Public figures, especially sportsmen, must handle criticism with grace, understanding the high standards they are held to as ambassadors of their sport and country.

Moreover, Rauf's derogatory comment, suggesting the fan was "Indian," only fueled the confrontation, exposing an unsavory undercurrent of intolerance. This incident underscores the urgent need

for the PCT to instill a sense of professionalism and decorum among its players. Haris Rauf should face immediate consequences for his actions, including possible removal from the team. His behavior not only disrespects the spirit of cricket but also fails to embody the values expected of someone in his position.

The PCT must take this incident as a wake-up call. They need to enforce strict disciplinary measures and ensure that their players understand their roles as both sportsmen and representatives of Pakistan on the global stage. Anything less is a disservice to the game of cricket and to the nation they serve. Haris Rauf should consider himself fortunate that the fan chose not to press charges, and he owes a sincere apology to both the fan and the broader cricketing community.

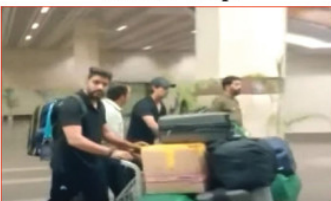

The global tournament proved challenging for the 'Green Shirts', who failed to progress beyond the league stage.

The team faced a surprising defeat at the hands of the United States and also conceded a match to India, a game that was initially in their favour.

This double setback prevented their advancement to the Super 8 round, marking a disappointing end to their campaign. —Agency

T20 World Cup 2024: South Africa end Team USA's Cinderella run with an 18 run victory in Super 8 match

NORTH SOUND: Team of South Africa defeated the United States by 18 runs in their T20 World Cup Super 8 match which was played at the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium, North Sound, on Wednesday.

The Proteas managed to defend the 195-run target with Kagiso Rabada starring for the winning side with his spell of 3/18 in four overs.

Chasing the target, the USA had a good start with Steven Taylor leading the attack against the Proteas' pacers but Rabada gave him the first breakthrough by removing the left-handed batter on just 24 runs.

Following Taylor's dismissal, the USA lost wickets at regular intervals with Nishit Kumar (8), skipper Aaron Jones (0), Corey Anderson (2) and Shayan Jabbar (3) all walking back to the pavilion without scoring big runs.

It looked nearly impossible for the USA to get back in the game but Andries Gous and Harmeeet Singh's 91-run target made things difficult for the Proteas as, at one point, the USA required 28 runs from 12 balls.

However, Rabada took the ball in the 19th over and, once again, eased his side's worries by removing Harmeeet on the first ball which halted the USA's attack. With Harmeeet (38 off 22) gone, things got difficult for USA and they eventually concluded their innings at 176-6 in 20 overs. Gous scored 80 off 47 with the help of 10 boundaries.

Earlier, South Africa posted a 195-run target for the United States in their



T20 World Cup Super 8 match which is being played at the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium, North Sound, on Wednesday.

South Africa didn't have the brightest start after being asked to bat first as Reeza Hendricks continued his bad form and returned to the pavilion after just scoring 11 runs, leaving his side 16-1 in 2.4 overs.

However, the Proteas recovered quickly after losing one wicket as Quinton de Kock decided to take charge of their innings and played his best knock of the tournament by scoring 74 runs on 40 balls with the help of seven fours and five sixes.

The 110-run partnership between skipper Aiden Markram and De Kock helped the Proteas get in the driving seat. —Agency

Cristiano Ronaldo once again marked his name in the history books of football as he became the first men's player to appear in six editions of the European Championship, the National reported.

The Portuguese striker's latest feat came as his national team defeated Czech Republic 2-1 in their Euro 2024 opener on Tuesday.

Ronaldo, 39, made his European Championship debut in 2004, in which Portugal lost in the finals to Greece. He has appeared in every tournament ever since.

The Al Nassr star, who broke the record for most goals in the Saudi Pro League with 35 goals for his team in the recently finished season, was a threat all through even though he was unable to surpass his record of 14 goals at the Euros.

Murray, 37, a record five-time champion at the London grass-court tournament, outlasted the 48th-ranked Australian 6-3, 3-6, 6-3 in the 1,000th Tour-level match of his career.

The British former world number one dropped the second set and appeared to be struggling physically, grimacing after every serve.

But he hit back in the third, a vintage cross-court winner and fist pump lifting the vocal crowd as he brought up break point before dispatching it with a clinical backhand on his way to victory in one hour and 51 minutes.

Murray, set to retire either after Wimbledon or the Olympics, said: "I've not got too many wins this year, it's been a difficult season, and I did want to come through in the end.

"Any win you can get is important, that's why we started what is likely to be weeks away I want to get some matches in my legs and some confidence. It's great to get another win here."

The three-time Grand Slam champion, who competes with a metal hip, has struggled with an ankle injury and a back issue this year.

The Scot, who has plummeted to 129th in the rankings, said: "I've felt better, but it was enough today."

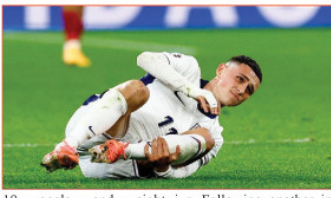
"My mum told me it was my 1,000th match and that's a lot of matches, a lot of wear and tear on the body and it's not easy, but I managed to push through it."

Spain's Alcaraz, who lifted his third Grand Slam at the French Open earlier this month, was not at his best but recovered from a mid-match dip to triumph.

The top seed committed just one unforced error in the first set to take a grip on the contest but his level dipped at the start of the second set and he trailed 2-5. —Agency

Southgate faces Foden dilemma ahead of England's Euro clash with Danes

FRANKFURT: Gareth Southgate must solve his Phil Foden conundrum as the England playmaker struggles to reproduce his brilliant Manchester City form at international level. While England can book their place in the last 16 of Euro 2024 by beating Denmark in Frankfurt on Thursday, Foden's latest underwhelming display for his country has sparked a debate about Southgate's use of such a sublime talent Foden laboured to make any impact on England's nervy 1-0 win against Serbia in their Group C opener in Gelsenkirchen on Sunday. The 24-year-old was voted the Premier League's Player of the Year after playing a key role in City's fourth successive title triumph with



19 goals and eight assists. Yet, in stark contrast to his excellence in a City shirt, Foden has never looked comfortable with England's Three Lions on his chest. He struggled during England's run to the Euro 2020 final, making subbed starts in the first two games and playing for only a further 25 minutes before missing the final defeat against Italy due to injury. Following another inconsistent contribution at the 2022 World Cup in Qatar, Foden has scored only once in his last 13 international matches.

Southgate's decision to play Jude Bellingham as England's number 10 and use Bukayo Saka on the right flank shunted Foden out to the left wing against Serbia.

Not for the first time, Foden seemed lost on that side of the three attacking midfield spots behind England striker Harry Kane.

At City, Pep Guardiola is completely comfortable with using Foden as the number 10, while he also operates on the right wing at times.

Guardiola has allowed Foden to dictate the champions' tempo and he has thrived more than ever this season after taking on an influential role in the absence of the injured Kevin De Bruyne.

But against Serbia there were few signs of the skill, deft passing and clinical finishing makes the 'Stockport Invicta' — named after former Barcelona and Spain legend Andres Iniesta — such a favourite of City fans. —Agency

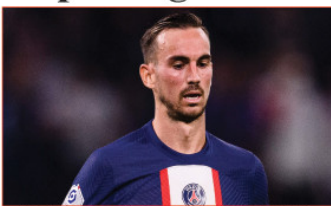
Ruiz ready to play starring role again for Spain against Italy

GERMANY: Spain are hoping the "exceptional" Fabian Ruiz can again be the difference-maker when they look to build on an impressive win against Croatia in their second Euro 2024 outing against Italy on Thursday.

The meeting between the reigning European champions and the three-time winners of the competition in Gelsenkirchen is the standout tie of the opening round at the tournament.

Top spot in Group B, and a theoretically easier last-16 draw, is at stake as the two sides aim to build on victories in their opening matches.

Italy came from behind to beat Albania, while Ruiz was outstanding as Spain thumped 2022 World Cup semi-finalists Croatia 3-0.



Paris Saint-Germain playmaker Ruiz, 28, set up the opener for Alvaro Morata and scored himself with a classy finish as he outshone all those around him, including Croatia captain Luka Modric.

That game confirmed the importance to Luis de la Fuente's Spain team of a player who was not taken to the last World Cup by former coach Luis Enrique.

"What can I tell you about Fabian Ruiz? He's an exceptional player, he's at the top level. If he wasn't called Fabian you would be talking a lot more about him," said De la Fuente.

"Based on what we've seen from him on a daily basis he's fantastic and has brilliant technique, we know what he brings to the team.

"We should recognise the quality that he has. He has real imagination."

De la Fuente's relationship with Ruiz goes back to when he was coach of Spain's Under-21 team — Ruiz was the star player when they won the Under-21 Euros in 2019.

It was around that time that the former Betis man broke into the full Spain squad, and he featured in Luis Enrique's team at the last Euros, when they went out to Italy in the semi-finals.

Yet he was not a starter, and Luis Enrique did not pick him again, meaning he was out in the cold by the time the 2022 World Cup came around. —Agency

Kane Williamson steps down as New Zealand captain after T20 World Cup debacle



Right-handed experienced batter Kane Williamson shook the cricket fraternity on Wednesday as he stepped down as New Zealand's white-ball captain following the team's poor run in the on-going ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024.

Besides relinquishing captaincy, Williamson also declined New Zealand's central contract in "an effort to prolong his international career".

The announcement came a day after the conclusion of New Zealand's T20 World Cup 2024 campaign, where they were eliminated in the group stages for the first time since 2014.

The 2021 finalists suffered gut-wrenching defeats against the West Indies and Afghanistan, the two teams that advanced to Super Eight from Group C.

Meanwhile, Kane Williamson reiterated his dedication to represent New Zealand at the international level and expressed his willingness to participate in eight World Test Championship (WTC) matches in the coming months and the ICC Champions Trophy in Pakistan next year.

Williamson, however, shared that he is open to exploring the possibility of accepting New Zealand central contract in future.

"Helping push the team forward across the formats is something I'm very passionate about and something I want to keep contributing towards," Kane said.

"However, pursuing an overseas opportunity during the New Zealand summer means I'm unable to accept a central contract offer.

"Playing for New Zealand is something I treasure, and my desire to give back to the team remains undiminished.

"My life outside cricket has changed however - spending more time with my family and enjoying experiences with them at home or abroad is something that's even more important to me." —Agency

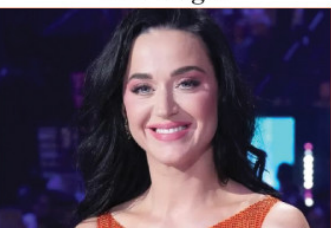

French Teens Raped 12-Year-Old, Made Anti-Semitic Remarks

President Emmanuel Macron on Wednesday denounced the "scourge of anti-Semitism" after authorities charged two 13-year-old boys with the gang rape of a 12-year-old Jewish girl in a Paris suburb.



The attack, suspected to have been motivated by anti-Semitism, has sent shockwaves through the Jewish community and added to tensions ahead of a snap election that could bring the far-right National Rally to power for the first time.

France, which is home to Europe's largest Muslim community, experienced a surge in anti-Semitic acts after Hamas's October 7 attack on southern Israel and the start of Israel's retaliatory campaign in Gaza. France's chief rabbi Haim Korsia wrote on X that he was "horrified" and that "no one should be excluded in the face of this unprecedented wave of anti-Semitism."

The three boys were arrested Monday. On Tuesday evening, two of them, both aged 13, were charged with gang rape, anti-Semitic insults and violence and issuing death threats, and remained in custody.

He "spoke solemnly and seriously about the scourge of anti-Semitism" in a cabinet meeting, the source said. The source added that the president called for "dialogue" about racism and hatred of Jews in schools to prevent "hateful speech with serious consequences" from "infiltrating" classrooms.

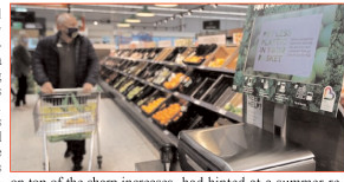

UK inflation slows to central bank's 2% target

LONDON: Britain's annual inflation rate slowed in May to the central bank's two-percent target, official data showed Wednesday, boosting Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's struggling election campaign.



The Consumer Prices Index slowed as expected from 2.3 percent in April, the Office for National Statistics said in a statement citing easing food prices. That follows almost three years Britain's above-target inflation, which last stood at two percent in July 2021 before surging higher in a cost-of-living crisis. The news sets the scene for next month's general election which Sunak's Conservatives are tipped to lose badly to Keir Starmer's opposition Labour Party, according to opinion polls.

had hinted at a summer reduction as UK inflation cools further. Economists expect it to maintain the status quo this week. "The BoE will be encouraged by the slowdown in headline inflation, and while concerns will remain over elevated underlying price pressures, further falls in services inflation are anticipated over the coming months," said KPMG UK chief economist Yael Seifin. Three Veterinary Hospitals To Be Upgraded With Indoor Facilities: CM Murad

KARACHI: Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah has directed the Livestock Department to upgrade three veterinary hospitals with indoor facilities for the treatment and surgery of injured animals and birds. These hospitals will cater to cattle as well as street animals and birds.

SHO Maripur Kamran Haider told Express News that the missing youth, identified as 21-year-old Shaheer, son of Aftab Rajput, was a



resident of Liaquatabad's Azam Square in the jurisdiction of Sharifabad police station. He had come to Hawksbay for a picnic with friends and went missing due to the high waves while swimming. The SHO stated that Maripur police had arrested nine individuals swimming in the sea, with six cases registered against them under Section 188. The Sindh government has enforced Section 144, prohibiting swimming in the sea. The high waves currently make the coast dangerous, posing a risk to citizens.—RT/Agency

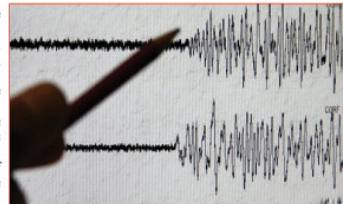

KARACHI: Residents of Karachi are distressed by piles of animal waste scattered across the city, leading to foul odors and health concerns. In response to complaints, PTI Sindh President and former Opposition Leader Haleem Adil Sheikh visited various areas to assess the situation.



Speaking to the media, Sheikh expressed dismay, stating, "Today is the third day of Eid, and animal waste is still strewn everywhere with no one to collect it." He questioned the effectiveness of the Solid Waste Management's Rs18 billion budget, highlighting the inefficiency despite being under the control of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP). "Karachi has turned into a garbage dump," he lamented. Sheikh noted that prior to Eid, it was claimed that 154,000 tons of animal waste would be disposed of, but Mayor Muratza Wahab reported only 68,000 tons collected. "The remaining 86,000 tons are still lying in the streets," he added. He criticized the inade-

quate number of collection points, with only 99 for a city of 25 million residents. "How can the city be cleaned with just 99 collection points?" he asked, noting the spread of diseases due to the stench from the waste. Sheikh further alleged that KMC, town, and Solid Waste staff are more focused on extracting fat from the waste rather than disposing of it. "Instead of discarding the remains, they are collecting fat," he claimed. He demanded accountability for the Solid Waste Management's Rs18 billion budget, arguing that neither the Sindh budget provided for Karachi nor did it ensure cleanliness. Before Wahab's tenure as mayor, Karachi was cleaner, Sheikh asserted, accusing the PPP of making Karachi the sixth dirtiest city in the world. He concluded by stating, "It's the third day, and there is no one to collect the waste. Citizens are forced to dispose of it themselves. The Sindh government must answer for its enmity towards Karachi."—RT/Agency

Government Imposes Section 144 In Karachi's Coastal Areas

KARACHI: Sindh government has imposed section 144 in the coastal areas of Karachi with a ban on swimming in the sea during the holidays of Eid-ul-adha, media reported on Tuesday. Reasonable precautions are being taken particularly to protect the lives of picnickers who visit beaches to celebrate the occasion, officials confirmed. The District South Po-

lice has confirmed that police officers are stationed at the beach to prevent citizens from entering the sea. The ban is a preventive measure taken by the authorities, and beachgoers are being requested to comply and refrain from going into the sea. Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPc) engages local organizations to

issue arrangements in broad daylight intrigue that may put a restriction on an action for a particular timeframe. Such a boycott is upheld by the police who enroll cases under area 188 of the Pakistan Penal Code for infringement of the boycott. Segment 188 conveys the greatest punishment of a half year in jail or a fine or both.—RT/Agency

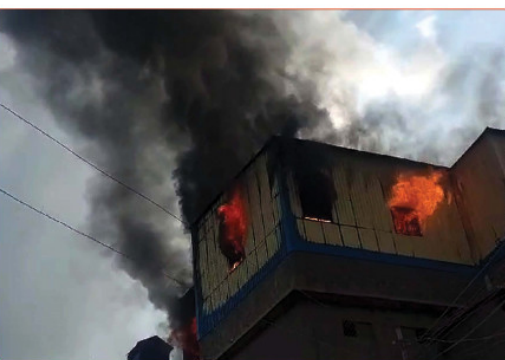
Laptop Battery Explosion Triggers Fire In Faisalabad Home, Leaving 2 Dead And 7 Injured

FAISALABAD: At least two people have died and seven others suffered burn injuries after a house in the Shareef Para neighbourhood of Faisalabad caught fire due to an explosion of a laptop battery on Wednesday, rescue officials told media.



According to the rescue officials, the house located at the Satyana road suffered the blaze as the exploded laptop battery was charging. The fire was put off later, they added.

At least nine people of the family, including five children and two women, residing in the house were shifted to the Allied Hospital following the ill-fated incident, said the rescue officials. Meanwhile, the hospital sources told media that two siblings, a brother and sister, have succumbed to the burns, while seven others are receiving treatment. All the injured, as per the doctors, are severely injured with around 50% to 60% of their bodies burnt. After the unfortunate incident, Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz expressed regret over the death of children, extending condolence and sympathy to the bereaved family. CM Maryam, according to the provincial government's statement, has ordered the provision of the best treatment and medical facilities for those injured in the fire. Regional Police Officer Dr Muhammad Abid Khan has ordered the senior superintendent of police to begin an investigation into the incident. Faisalabad deputy commissioner has also formed a committee to investigate the orders of CM Maryam, who vowed exemplary punishment for those found responsible.—RT/Agency

Youth Commits Suicide After Killing Father And Two Brothers

MARDAN: A youth committed suicide after shooting his father and two brothers dead in Khor Banda in Mardan, media reported on Wednesday. Nihar Ali, who is said to be mentally disturbed killed his father Nasrullah, and two brothers Faizullah and Abdullah at their home and later committed sui-

cide. The incident took place at Khor Banda in Shaikh Maltoon police jurisdiction. Accused Nihar Ali also injured his mother. "He was deranged and mentally disturbed," local police said. Police said that the dead bodies and injured have been shifted to MMC hospital.—RT/Agency

In another fire incident, at least 25 rescue workers put off blaze in a paper factory at the Sundar Industrial Estate in Lahore, Rescue 1122 sources told Geo News today. It took the rescue workers at least 14 hours to control the fire. Last week, a terrifying blaze at the Sahiwal Teaching Hospital claimed the lives of at least 11 infants. The deadly incident later prompted a high-level probe following the orders of CM Maryam, who vowed exemplary punishment for those found responsible.—RT/Agency

Pakistan calls for 'concerted campaign' to recover arms from terrorist groups like TTP

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has called on the United Nations for a "concerted campaign" to recover all weapons from terrorist groups, such as the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP).

Speaking at the UN's Fourth Review Conference of the Programme of Action (PoA) on Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW) on Tuesday, Ambassador Munir Akram expressed Pakistan's "grave concern over the acquisition and use of modern and sophisticated small arms by terrorist groups, such as [the] TTP".

According to a statement issued by the Pakistani mission to the UN, Akram highlighted the "need for a concerted campaign to recover all weapons from terrorist groups like the TTP" and also called for an investigation into how these groups acquired such sophisticated weapons.

The Pakistani envoy asserted that it was the UN member states' and the UN's responsibility to take measures to prevent the illicit trade, transfer, and diversion of these arms.

"Terrorists and criminals do not manufacture these arms. They acquire them from illicit arms markets or receive them



from entities that want to destabilise a particular region or country," Ambassador Akram emphasised.

The envoy highlighted how the "illicit proliferation, excessive accumulation and misuse of SALW" was exacerbating conflicts, fuelling terrorism, threatening peace and security, and undermining sustainable development globally.

Akram said the advent of new technologies, such as unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) and drones was "deepening challenges in combating the proliferation of increasingly lethal small arms".

Describing the UN PoA and the International Tracing Instrument (ITI) as a structured framework to address the challenges pertaining to the illicit

trade and trafficking of SALW, Akram reiterated Pakistan's commitment to both tools.

"We have strengthened our legislative frameworks, enhanced transfer controls and implemented robust measures to prevent the diversion of SALW to unauthorised users," the envoy asserted.

Pointing out the limitations of a supply-side approach to tackling the SALW challenges, Akram demanded more strenuous efforts and resources to "resolve and end conflicts in various regions and sub-regions, end terrorist activities, and eliminate organised crime".

Commenting on a revised draft outcome document (Draft-1) for addressing the illicit proliferation of SALW, the

ambassador highlighted various points, including building consensus on the scope of the PoA.

He stressed the need to maintain a balanced approach between the valid concerns over arms' illicit proliferation and legitimate security concerns of all states.

The Pakistan UN Ambassador termed the ongoing conference a critical step in reaffirming collective resolve to tackle SALW-related challenges and ensure global safety and security.

Islamabad has long held that the banned TTP uses safe havens in Afghanistan to launch deadly cross-border attacks.

In March, Pakistan had called on the UN Security Council (UNSC) to urge the Taliban rulers in Afghanistan to terminate their relationship with the TTP.

Last month, Pakistan's Special Representative on Afghanistan Asif Ali Durani had stated that TTP attacks in the country increased by 60 per cent in two years, showing a significant rise since the Afghan Taliban took over Kabul in 2021.

Days later, Pakistan and the United States had reaffirmed the continua-

tion of counter-terrorism cooperation to advance regional and global security and stability.

Pakistan has witnessed an uptick in terror activities in the past year, especially in KP and Balochistan after the banned militant TTP ended its ceasefire with the government in November 2022.

According to an annual security report issued by the Centre for Research and Security Studies, Pakistan witnessed 1,524 violence-related fatalities and 1,463 injuries from 789 terror attacks and counter-terror operations in 2023 — marking a record six-year high.

KP and Balochistan were the primary centres of violence, accounting for over 90 per cent of all fatalities and 84pc of attacks, including incidents of terrorism and security forces operations.

A report released last month said provincial counterterrorism departments (CTDs) lacked clarity on militant groups' dynamics, connections and operational strategies, apart from facing issues related to coordination, funding and intelligence gathering.

Budget strengthens prospects for IMF deal: Fitch

ISLAMABAD: The global ratings agency Fitch on Wednesday said that the federal budget for fiscal year (FY) 2025 "strengthens prospects for an IMF deal".

The government presented the budget for the next year on June 12, which contained an ambitious tax revenue target of Rs13 trillion rupees (\$47 billion) for the year starting July 1, a near-40 per cent jump from the current year, and a sharp drop in its fiscal deficit to 5.9pc of GDP from 7.4pc for the current year.

Fitch, in a comment, said it forecasted "the fiscal deficit will narrow" assuming partial implementation of the budget — whether fiscal targets will be met entirely remained uncertain.

"This should reduce external pressures, albeit at a cost to growth," it added.

The US-based agency re-estimated that the budget deficit of 5.9 per cent of the GDP — from the previous year's estimated 7.4pc — and 2pc primary surplus "on wide-ranging tax increases and also significant fiscal efforts at the provincial level".

Additionally, a separate report by rating agency Moody's said that the government has projected real GDP growth at 3.6pc and headline inflation at 12pc. It also sought to increase federal government revenue to an ambitious Rs17.8trillion



—46pc higher than previous year's.

Overall, the budget also seeks to boost development expenditure of the centre and provinces by over 58pc to nearly Rs3.8tr.

According to Fitch, "Our updated fiscal forecasts assume partial implementation and project a primary surplus of 0.8pc, on shortfalls in revenue generation and an over-run in current spending, partly offset by under-execution in development spending."

"We believe tight policy settings may depress growth more than the government expects, and have reduced our growth forecast to 3.0pc for FY25, from 3.5pc, despite some improvements in short-term indicators of economic activity."

Meanwhile the total current expenditure is estimated to surge by 21pc to Rs17.2tr, with power and other sub-

sidies jumping to Rs1.4tr and defence expenditure by 14pc to Rs2.1tr.

The agency added that its forecast reduction was due to the plans of the coalition government facing "stiff resistance" inside parliament from allies, opposition and among broader society after the Feb 8 elections and a "weaker-than-expected mandate" for the current government.

On a positive note, it did note that the previous year's primary deficit "was in line" with the target — with the authorities undertaking "unpopular subsidy reforms over the past year, supporting fiscal credibility."

"While Pakistan has a poor record of sustaining reform over time, the absence of viable alternatives has strengthened support for tough policy decisions, at least in the near term," it said.—RT/Agency

Loved ones search for missing as hajj death toll passes 900

MAKKAH: Friends and family searched for missing hajj pilgrims on Wednesday as the death toll at the annual rituals, which were carried out in scorching heat, surged past 900.

Relatives scoured hospitals and pleaded online for news, fearing the worst after temperatures hit 51.8 degrees Celsius (125 Fahrenheit) in the holy city of Makkah on Monday.

About 1.8 million people from all over the world, many old and infirm, took part in the days-long, mostly outdoor pilgrimage, held this year during the oven-like Saudi summer.

An Arab diplomat told AFP that deaths among Egyptians alone had jumped to "at least 600", from more than 300 a day earlier, mostly from the unforgiving heat.

That figure brought the total reported dead so far to 922, according to an AFP tally of figures released by various countries.

Mabrouka bint Salem Shushana of Tunisia, in her early 70s, has been missing since the climax of the pilgrimage on Saturday at Mount Arafat, her husband Mohammed told AFP on



Wednesday.

Because she was unregistered and did not have an official hajj permit, she was unable to access air-conditioned facilities that allow pilgrims to cool down, he said.

"She's an old lady. She was tired. She was feeling so hot, and she had no place to sleep," he said. "I looked for her in all the hospitals. Until now I don't have a clue."

Facebook and other social media networks have been flooded with pictures of the missing and requests for information.

Those searching for news include family and friends of Ghada Mahmoud Ahmed Dawood, an Egyptian pilgrim unaccounted for since Saturday.

"I received a call from her daughter in Egypt begging me to put any post on Facebook that can help track her or find her," said one family friend based in Saudi Arabia, who spoke on condition of anonymity because he did not want to anger Saudi authorities.

"The good news is that until now we did not find her on the list of the dead people, which gives us hope she is still alive."

The hajj is one of the five pillars of Islam and all Muslims with the means must complete it at least once.

Its timing is determined by the Islamic lunar calendar, shifting forward each year in the Gregorian calendar.—RT/Agency

Pakistan rejects Indian MEA's statement about Pak-China joint statement on J&K issue

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Wednesday said that India had no right to object to the references made to Jammu and Kashmir in Pakistan-China joint statement of June 8 and reiterated "it is an established fact that Jammu and Kashmir is an internationally-recognized disputed territory".

In response to media queries regarding the statement made by the Indian Ministry of External Affairs on June 3, the Foreign Office spokesperson in a press statement said that Kashmir dispute has been on the agenda of the UN Security Council for over seven decades.

"The relevant Security Council resolutions clearly stipulate that the final disposition of the State of Jammu and Kashmir will be made in



accordance with the will of the people expressed through the democratic method of a free and impartial plebiscite conducted under the auspices of the United Nations," it was reasserted.

In that backdrop, the spokesperson said the Indian claims over Jammu and Kashmir were totally unfounded and misplaced. "India should not mislead the international

community about the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), which is a flagship developmental endeavour, agreed upon by two sovereign nations.

Instead of making baseless claims about CPEC, India should implement, at the earliest, the relevant UN Security Council resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir," it was further added.—RT/Agency

PM strongly condemns killing of senior Landi Kot journalist



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday strongly condemned the murder of Khalid Jibrani, a senior journalist in Landi Kot city of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The prime minister, sympathising with the bereaved family members of the slain journalist, directed the KP chief minister and relevant authorities to arrest the perpetrators and take them to the task. He reiterated the government's resolve to protect the lives and freedom of the media community.

Israeli tanks storm deeper into Rafah, forcing people to relocate again

GAZA: Israeli tanks backed by warplanes and drones advanced deeper into the western part of the Gaza Strip city of Rafah on Wednesday, killing eight people, according to residents and Palestinian medics. Residents said the tanks moved into five neighborhoods after midnight. Heavy shelling and gunfire hit the tents of displaced families in the Al-Mawasi area, further to the west of the coastal enclave, they said. Some eight months into the war, there has been no sign of let up in the fighting as efforts by international mediators, backed by the United States, have so far failed to persuade Israel and Hamas to agree to a ceasefire. Israeli forces have laid waste to much of Gaza and



was looking into the report. Residents said Israeli army forces blew up several homes in western Rafah, which had sheltered over half of Gaza's 2.3 million people before last month, when Israel began its ground offensive and forced most of the population to head northwards.—RT/Agency

Boom Boom Afridi denies endorsing 'pro-Israel' event in UK

LONDON: Pakistani superstar cricketer Shahid Khan Afridi faced controversy after a pro-Israel account on Instagram claimed he supported a "Friends of Israel" event in the UK on Wednesday. Hours after the Instagram account posted Afridi's photo as an "endorsement" of the event in Manchester, Afridi responded on his X handle "Imagine strolling down a street in Man-



chester (UK) and so-called fans approach you for a selfie. You oblige, and moments later, they upload it as some form of Zionist endorsement," Afridi wrote. "Unbelievable! Please don't believe everything that is uploaded." He added that the photo does not signify his support for any situation where "human lives are at stake." "Seeing innocent lives in Palestine suffer is truly heartbreaking. Any photo or association shared in Manchester does not reflect my support for any situation where human lives are at stake," he wrote.—RT/Agency
