Shehbaz Assures Bilawal Of Addressing PPP's Concerns On 'Unilateralism'

ISLAMABAD: After political tensions rose among ruling coalition partners over the matter of federal budget 2024-25, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday assured Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari of taking steps to address the key ally's reservations on multiple issues, media reported citing sources.



The top leaders of the ruling coalition partners — Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and the PPP — held a key meeting in the federal capital after the latter lodged a token protest during the recent National Assembly session last week in which Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb unveiled budget 2024-25.

Confidence in decision-making, including the Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) and budget proposals.

It also emerged that both sides discussed the PPP's inclusion in the federal cabinet and power-sharing in Punjab during the meeting which was also attended by senior leaders.

Bilawal also complained that the ruling party failed to implement the agreement reached with his party, wherein the former supported the latter in the formation of a coalition government, the sources added.

Moreover, the PPP chief also accused Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz-led administration of creating hurdles for his party in Punjab, the sources said adding that Premier Shehbaz agreed on most of the concerns raised by Bilawal and formed separate committees to address those complaints.

"Economic Hitman": PTI Slams Federal Budget As Detrimental To National Interests

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has termed the budget 2024-25 presented by the federal government in the National Assembly last week against the interests of the country and nation.



"This budget was made by an economic hitman," said Opposition Leader Omar Ayub Khan while addressing on floor of the National Assembly on Thursday.

The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N)-led coalition government has set a challenging tax revenue target of 13 trillion rupees (\$46.66 billion) for the year starting July 1, a near 40% jump from the current year, in the budget that looked to strengthen the case for a new

18.87 trillion rupees (\$68 billion).

Speaking about the ambitious targets set in the federal budget, Ayub said the investors do not inject their capital in countries where the rule of law is not supreme.

The opposition leader said the International Monetary

Fund (IMF) had asked the government to negotiate with all stakeholders to evolve consensus over the federal budget.

"The wings of this finance minister [Muhammad Aurangzeb] have been clipped," the PTI secretary-general claimed, alleging that the government's economic figures are based on lies. "The economic survey [2023-2024] is also based on lies." He further said that the unemployment and inflation increased substantially and per capita income also declined in the country.

On Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's announcement that he would eliminate corruption from the country, Ayub laughed off his statement, saying: "The pot calling the kettle black."

He said PM Shehbaz, despite being implicated in National Accountability Bureau (NAB) cases, pledged to rid the country of corruption.

Ayub said those involved in the "corruption cases cannot eliminate corruption from the country." "Charity begins at home. Start [accountability] charity from Hududbiya Paper Mills, London Flats and Sugar Mills," he said referring to the references filed against the Sharif family in the past. "This government is of and for the corrupt people. This government is based on corruption," the opposition leader said, reiterating allegations that his party's mandate was stolen in the February 8 elections.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: Senator Faisal Vawda opposed the imposition of new taxes in the fiscal year budget 2024-25, saying that the common man would not be able to buy a home, media reported.

Senator Saleem Mandviwala chaired a meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance that also opposed a proposal to impose tax on hybrid and electric vehicles in the next fiscal year's budget.

Speaking on the occasion, the independent Senator said that due to the imposition of taxes in the new budget on the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) "demand," the property market in Pakistan has come to a halt.

Senator Faisal Vawda also opposed the imposition of additional taxes on hybrids and electric vehicles. He said that additional taxes on vehicles are not acceptable, demanding that the concerned minister should be summoned and asked for an explanation. "The new taxes should not be proposed or else I will speak out openly," he added.

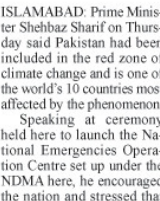

Pakistan Among Top 10 Countries Most Affected By Climate Change: Shehbaz



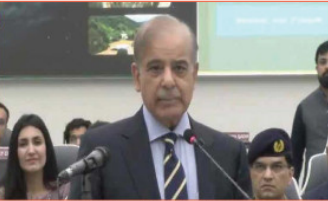
ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday said Pakistan had been included in the red zone of climate change and is one of the world's 10 countries most affected by the phenomenon.

Speaking at ceremony held here to launch the National Emergencies Operation Centre set up under the NDMA here, he encouraged the nation and stressed that "we must not lose heart and work hard."

He was all praise for the NDMA (National Disaster Management Authority) for its "important role in the rehabilitation of flood victims" in 2022.

He recalled that the country suffered \$30 billion loss in 2022 floods. The deluge wreaked havoc in Sindh and the NDMA played an important role in rescue and rehabilitation of flood victims, he added.

The prime minister commended the NDMA chairman who took steps to tackle the challenges of climate change. The NDMA devised a strategy and implemented it successfully in unison with other departments.



He mentioned the NDMA's weather information system and said it is a role model for other departments as well.

The joint efforts of the provinces and the federal government ensured the rehabilitation of the flood victims, he continued.

He said Pakistan faced many floods in the past and the government had earmarked Rs100 billion for the rehabilitation of flood victims in the next budget.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif raised voice of the flood victims at a donors' conference in Geneva and stressed on measures for their rehabilitation.

He promised that the government would provide all

possible resources to the NDMA. He urged the NDMA to follow merit, pay no heed to any recommendations, pick the best manpower and pay special attention to their training, the premier stated.

He stressed the NDMA to be in close contact with the provinces and have an integrated and comprehensive communication system.

The premier said that the government has earmarked Rs80 billion for information technology. A Chinese company would impart IT skills to 300,000 children every year. The government has planned to train millions of our boys and girls in IT so that they could earn decent living.—RT/Agency

He said privatization and outsourcing of the power distribution companies was the top priority of the govern-

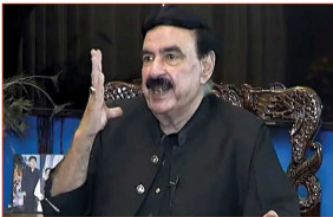
ment. "In this regard the government desires to take benefit from the Georgian experience."

building flexible smart classrooms.

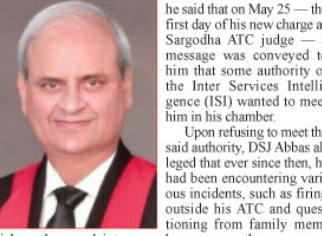

Court Sends Six Suspects on Physical Remand for Cutting Camel's Limb

SANGHAR: A court in Sanghar on Thursday sent six suspects, allegedly involved in the case pertaining to chopping off a camel's leg, on physical remand for two days.



The court pronounced the judgement after hearing the case as police produced the suspects before it following the completion of their previous remand. The investigation officer apprised the court that two of the suspects had admitted to the crime. Additionally, two axes were recovered from the suspects, according to the IO.

A Shahdadpur magistrate on June 16 remanded the suspects into police custody for four days, hours after their arrest. The victim camel was shifted to Karachi on June 15 and has since been treated and cared for by a non-governmental organisation for the rehabilitation.

The heartbreaking incident took place on June 14 in the Mundh Jamrao area. The animal had entered agricultural land, angering its owner, who then resorted to physical violence against the camel. The landlord, along with his employees, first physically tortured the camel as punishment for entering the land for fodder. Later, they cut the animal's leg with a sharp tool. The camel's video went viral on social media, with thousands of people condemning the brutal action. Despite the uproar, the police initially registered a first information report (FIR) against unknown individuals, Geo News reported, and not the landlord who was involved in the incident.

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Ijaz later confirmed that law enforcers had arrested five people in connection with the animal abuse, of whom two had confessed to the crime. Meanwhile, Sindh Governor Kamran Tessori announced that he would give two camels to the person whose animal was hurt.—RT

Water shortage intensifies in Pithoro

PITHORO: Due to the negligence of the Irrigation Department, a severe crisis of drinking and agricultural water has emerged in the Pithoro Tehsil. The shortage of water has affected various canals, including Khiproo Canal, Mithrao Canal, Khai Shakk, Pithoro Mines, Saedi Branch, Sarhari Branch, Jumma Branch and others at the tail-ends. Due to this artificial shortage, thousands of acres of crops have dried up and been destroyed, and drinking water has become scarce in the areas. The intense heat and lack of water have led to people, animals, and livestock dying of thirst, forcing the residents to drink brackish underground water. The town administration has stopped the water supply due to unavailability. Citizens are closing their businesses and wandering in the intense heat and sunlight in search of water. The farmer and peasant communities have started to migrate. Residents of Pithoro state that for the past month, no water has reached the tail end of the Khai Mines, causing the city's ponds to dry up and creating a drinking water crisis. They are forced to drink brackish underground water, leading to various diseases. The town administration has stopped the water supply due to unavailability. Citizens are closing their businesses and wandering in the intense heat and sunlight in search of water, forced to buy water at Rs 300 to Rs 500 per drum. The elected representatives of the area have remained silent.

18th Basic Training Course for Junior Prison Officers underway at Sindh Prisons Staff Training Institute Hyderabad

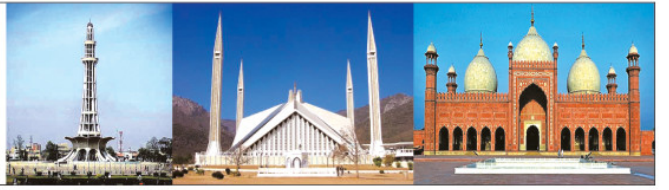

Punjab Government Accused Of Deceiving Farmers With 'Kisan Card'

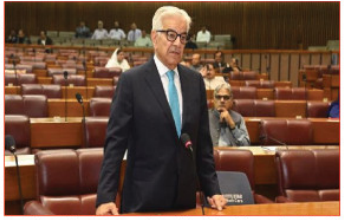

Elderly Lahore Siblings Die Due To Food Poisoning



LAHORE: Tragedy struck as two elderly siblings, aged 70 and 75, succumbed to food poisoning inside their residence in Lahore, according to media reports citing police sources.

The initial post-mortem report indicated that the siblings, discovered deceased in their home in Ghalib Market Canal Park, Gulberg Market, had passed away due to food poisoning, police stated. Authorities have dispatched the deceased siblings' bodily organs for forensic examination to aid ongoing investigations.

The victims, identified as 70-year-old Hamid and his 75-year-old sister Saima, were found dead in separate locations within their residence. Hamid was discovered in a courtyard, while Saima's body was re-

covered from a room. A case has been registered against unidentified persons based on a statement from the siblings' brother, Babar. Police are actively conducting further inquiries into the incident.

In a separate tragic incident, four minor girls and their 34-year-old mother died after consuming poisonous food in Tandianwala, Punjab. The victims were identified as three-year-old Farzana, four-year-old Aqsa, five-year-old Rukhsana, eight-year-old Muskan, and their mother. The incident occurred in Tandianwala, situated approximately 40 kilometers from Faisalabad and 45 kilometers from Okara. The bodies were transferred to District Headquarters Hospital, with police confirming the fatalities.—RT/Agency

Senator Awan Voices Concerns Over Inadequate Funding For Karachi's K-IV Water Project

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) leader and former Minister of State, Senator Shahadat Awan, expressed deep concern on Thursday regarding the insufficient allocation of funds for Karachi's vital K-IV water project, crucial for supplying clean drinking water to the city's residents.



Speaking to the media outside the Parliament House, Senator Awan emphasized the urgent need to redirect resources towards the development of Karachi and Sindh. He highlighted significant financial disparities evident in the current budget, particularly noting the discrepancies surrounding the K-IV project. Initially budgeted at Rs 120 billion, with Rs 56 billion already expended, the project was expected to receive Rs 70 billion this fiscal year. However, only Rs 25 billion has been allocated for the year 2024-25.

Senator Awan also underscored several other projects under the Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP). He referenced the Supreme Court's directive to clear encroachments on Karachi's railway land, with the federal government pledging resources for resettling affected residents, yet minimal progress has been made. Regarding the federal budget discussions, Senator Awan criticized the 14-day period allotted as insufficient for a thorough review of its various aspects. He advocated for an extended period to ensure comprehensive evaluation. Responding to questions, Senator Awan affirmed that the public is willing to pay taxes if assured of their welfare-oriented utilization. He criticized the adequacy of salary increases for government employees, given the current 16% inflation rate and expanded tax brackets, calling for adjustments to align with inflation levels.—RT/Agency

PESCO Takes Legal Action Against PTI MNA For Power Supply Incident

NOWSHERA: The Peshawar Electric Supply Company (PESCO) has initiated legal action against Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) MNA Zulfiqar Khan for forcibly restoring power supply to 17 feeders in Nowshera.

Accompanied by party workers, the PTI-affiliated MNA stormed Pabbi and Taru Jaba grid stations, prompting PESCO to send a letter for lodging a case against him for his actions.

Similar incidents of forcibly restoring power supply have occurred in Mardan, Charsadda, Tank, Bannu, Dera Ismail Khan (DI Khan), and Peshawar.

Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur intervened by fixing loadshedding durations to a maximum of 12 hours. He emphasized that assembly members should ensure compliance with the schedule by



visiting grid stations in their respective areas.

The trend of entering power grid stations in KP started after PTI-backed Member Provincial Assembly (MPA) Fazal Elahi forced his way into the Rehman Baba grid station in Peshawar, responding to protests over loadshedding.

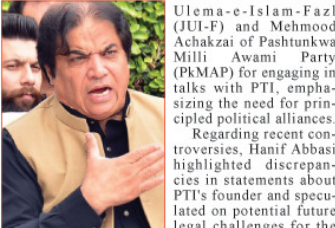
In a separate development, PESCO provided details on provinciewide electricity feed-

ers, with varying durations of loadshedding based on losses incurred in different areas. Urban areas are experiencing 4 to 6 hours of loadshedding, while suburban areas face up to 16 hours due to high losses attributed to electricity theft and non-payment of dues. Meanwhile, PTI workers protested against loadshedding in Mardan, staging a sit-in outside the Wapda office and negotiating with officials.—RT/Agency

Rising Ethnic Violence Threatens National Unity

The recent abduction of ten residents from Punjab at Shuban picnic point in Quetta, Balochistan, is a deeply disturbing incident that underscores a dangerous and escalating trend of ethnic targeting. Armed men, identifying victims by their Computerized National Identity Cards (CNICs), singled out Punjabis for abduction while releasing others. This alarming event follows a pattern of ethnic violence, including last year's horrific murder of six laborers from Punjab in Kech, Turbat.

This surge in ethnically motivated attacks is not just a Balochistan issue but a significant threat to the integrity of our federation. The targeting of individuals based solely on their ethnicity reveals a deep-seated hatred that risks spiraling into broader,

uncontrollable conflict. It is a stark reminder of the fragility of our national unity and the dire need for immediate and decisive action.



The government's response to these incidents has been alarmingly inadequate. The kidnapping of a Customs Officer among the abductees highlights that no one is immune from this terror. There must be a concerted effort to ensure justice for the victims and to dismantle the networks that perpetuate these heinous crimes.

Ignoring these issues will only lead to further destabilization, not just in Balochistan but across the country. It is imperative for the government to recognize the gravity of this situation and to take immediate, concrete steps to restore security and foster national cohesion. The future of our federation depends on it.

Later, on his X account, Rauf addressed the incident, clarifying his side of the story.

He wrote: "I decided not to bring this up on social media. But now that the video is out, I feel it is necessary to address the situation. As public figures, we are open to receiving all kinds of feedback from the public. They

are entitled to support or criticize us. Nevertheless, when it comes to my parents and my family, I will not hesitate to respond accordingly. It is important to show respect towards people and their families, irrespective of their professions."

Following the incident, the Pakistani pacer received the support of his teammates who stated that criticism was the right of every fan, however they should do it with respect.

He has been criticised for conceding 15 runs in the final over that brought the US back in the match at Dallas, leading to a Super Over which ultimately went in favour of the host side.—Agency

Former Indian cricketer accuses selector Wahab Riaz of 'favoritism'

Legendary Indian opener Virender Sehwag heavily criticised Pakistan men's team selector Wahab Riaz and accused him of favouritism.

Sehwag's accusation of Wahab came in the wake of Mohammad Amir's return to international cricket which eventually saw him representing the national team yet another T20 World Cup.

However, Amir's comeback did not bring fortune to the Green Shirts as they suffered a group-stage exit for the first time.

Meanwhile, Virender Sehwag was irked by the fact that both Wahab Riaz and Mohammad Amir, who previously criticised the team on national television, are now part of the setup.



"Wahab Riaz and Mohammad Amir, these are two names who criticised the Pakistan team on the same TV channel, giving their comments. Today, one of them is a selector [Riaz] and one is in the playing eleven [Amir]," Sehwag said. "So the same persons who were criticising, if today they have power, became the selector, what have they done first up? Mohammad Amir was with me, let's select him. It's like if Ajit Agarkar is chairman (of BCCI selection committee) today, he will say 'come Viru, come Zak (Zaheer Khan), I will facilitate your comeback,' Sehwag added.

Virender Sehwag then advised Pakistan selectors to focus on the team's future and also to avoid favouritism.

"You have become a selector, you have to look at the future. You have a job, make the right use of it, don't do favours. That hard selector will have to take," he concluded.

It is worth mentioning here that Pakistan, the former champions, were knocked out of the group stage of the ongoing ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 as a result of gut-wrenching defeats against the co-host (United States of America) (USA) and arch-rivals India.—Agency

Kylian Mbappe returns to train for France after bloody nose injury



Kylian Mbappe, the French football star, returned to the field to train for France on Wednesday, after he suffered a broken nose during their 1-0 win over Austria in their opening Euro 2024 game in Germany's Dusseldorf.

According to the BBC, the 25-year-old former Paris Saint-Germain star was pictured wearing a protective bandage during the session and initially trained alone.

The new Real Madrid signing was badly hurt in a collision with Austrian defender Kevin Danso and had to be replaced by Olivier Giroud.

Danso, 25, said on X after the game that he wished Mbappe a "good recovery" and was sorry he was injured.

Despite Mbappe's return to the training session, the team fears that they may have to face the Netherlands in Leipzig without their captain on Friday.

However, France coach Didier Deschamps might

have to put his faith in the rest of his team to seal their last-16 place, meaning Mbappe might sit out the last Group D game against Poland without it being a problem.

"Of course he is an important player, the captain, a leader. So that will have an impact, but we have an exceptional squad," French midfielder Adrien Rabiot said on Wednesday.

"I am not going to complain given the lads we have on the bench. We have more than enough options to replace Kylian. I have total confidence in the guys on the bench and the quality we have."

The French Football Federation said that Mbappe would not need an operation but he would need to be fitted with a mask before he could return to action, AFP reported.

Mbappe is France's third-top scorer of all time with 47 goals from 80 caps.—Agency

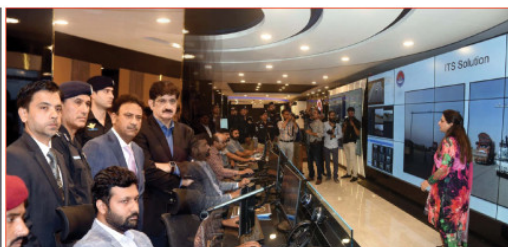

According to a report submitted by Deputy Commissioners to Commissioner Karachi, the breakdown of arrests is as follows: South District (26), East District (44), West District (7), Malir (14), Korangi (57), Central (40), and Keamari (5).

Commissioner Karachi Syed Hassn Naqvi has emphasized that the crackdown was enforced to maintain cleanliness and public hygiene in the city.—RT/Agency

Noted Trade Unionist Karamat Ali Passes Away In Karachi

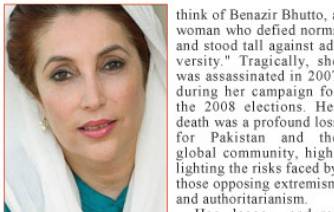

Senators Grill FBR Chief Over Tax Hike On Hybrid And Electric Cars

ISLAMABAD: Senators Thursday grilled Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) Chairman Asim Ahmad over the hike in taxes imposed on hybrid and electric cars, among other items.

The Senate Standing Committee on Finance, in a meeting chaired by Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Senator Salim Mandviwala, in Islamabad raised an objection on the increased tax rate on electric and hybrid vehicles.

During the meeting, independent Senator Faisal Vawda said that the use of electric vehicles is being encouraged all over the world. "A sales tax of 25% has been levied on vehicles priced above Rs15 million," said Vawda.

The senator maintained that problems increase when a policy is made and revised. "No one sets up industry in this country because of changes in taxes and policies."

Responding to Vawda's objections, the FBR officials said that imported, not locally manufactured, vehicles have been taxed. In reaction to this, the politician said he knows who is taxing vehicles.

The committee, however, adjourned the matter in the meeting.



The politician, who is a member of the Senate in an independent capacity, objected to the tax proposals made in the budget, announced last week by the federal government.

The government has, as per analysts, devised the budget in line with the recommendations of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), as Islamabad hopes to sign a new and bigger programme with the global lending institution.

The federal government had to increase taxes and reduce the fiscal deficit as part of negotiations with the IMF, with which it is discussing a loan of \$6 billion to \$8 billion, as it seeks to avert a debt default for an economy growing at the slowest pace in the region.

On the other hand, Vawda also lamented the imposition of taxes on property in the re-

cently proposed budget, insisting that the market across the country has become stagnant.

"Now, a common man will not be able to buy a house," said the senator, sharing his viewpoint during the meeting.

Responding to Vawda in the meeting, the FBR chairman said tax rates in the property sector are "fair". "In the property sector, tax is 15% for filers and 45% for non-filers," said the FBR chairman. He also highlighted that the salaried class is taxed up to 35% and non-salaried up to 45%.

"How will the common man build a house with an increased tax on property," said Vawda in response to the official's comment.

The FBR chairman maintained that a Re1 per kilograms increase in Federal Excise Duty (FED) on ce-

ment has been proposed by FBR, as the board has not benefited from the increased rates of the commodity.

"Re1 is being raised so that FBR gets revenue," said the chairman.

During the meeting, the FBR chairman was also questioned about the FED imposed on plots.

"How excise duty is imposed on plots?" asked PPP Senator Farooq H Naek.

"We wanted to impose sales tax," said the FBR chairman, who was then told by Naek that plots, in fact, neither come under the category of commodities nor services.

"Under which law did you tax the purchase of a plot? You have stretched the law and included them," the senator said, contesting that this law will be challenged and he doesn't favour it.

The standing committee, during the meeting, took up the matter of the FED increase on cigarettes.

"Has increasing FED on cigarettes reduced cigarette consumption?" asked Senator Naek.

Responding to the senator, the FBR chair said, "Formal sector output has declined by 40%. But people did not stop smoking, despite increasing taxes."

He added that the board, this year, seized 400 million "non-tax paid cigarette sticks".

"If smuggled cigarettes are found in a shop, such shop will be sealed," he maintained.

PPP Senator Sherry Rehman said: "If you can close all the shops big and small then it is allowed."

Senator Naek pointed out that the price of the items sold in any shop is not enforced. He said there is no enforcement of the relevant law, terming it a violation.

"Ensure all items are priced prominently," said Naek, addressing FBR officials, after which the proposal was approved by the Standing Committee on Finance.

During the meeting, the committee also brought amendments to the Public Finance Management Act, 2019 under consideration.

"Under the amendments, the definition of technical supplementary grant is being expanded," said a representative of the finance ministry.

Naek asked why there was a need for the amendment, while Senator Rehman said that the Ministry of Finance is seeking the authority to use the money that cannot be used.—RT/Agency

CJP Isa Criticizes Ordinances An An 'Insult' To Parliament

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa on Thursday called the presidential ordinance an insult to the parliament as the Supreme Court rejected the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) plea to issue a stay order in the election tribunals case.

"[Presidential] ordinance is an insult to the parliament when it has already made a law [on an issue]," the top judge said while hearing ECP's plea against the constitution of election tribunals by the Lahore High Court (LHC).

The case, heard by a two-member bench comprising the CJP and Justice Nasim Akhtar Afghan, has been sent to the three-member ECP committee for the constitution of a larger bench.

The ECP had moved the apex court under Article 185(3) of the Constitution against the LHC's May 29 verdict wherein it had constituted eight election tribunals.

The order of the court's single-member bench comprising LHC CJ Malik Shahzad Ahmad provisioned that Justice Shahid Karim, Justice Ch Muhammad Iqbal, Justice Anwar Hussain, and Justice Sultan Tanvir Ahmad would hear the election petitions at the LHC principal seat in Lahore.



Whereas Justice Asim Hafeez will hear the election petitions at the LHC Bahawalpur bench, Justice Sar-

dar Muhammad Sarfraz Dogar and Justice Raheel Kamran will hear the LHC election petitions at the LHC Multan bench, and Justice Mirza Viqas Rauf will hear the election petitions at the LHC Rawalpindi bench.

The order, which came in response to petitions filed by Rao Hashim Omar Khan and others, had also ordered the ECP to appoint six more judges, nominated by the LHC chief justice, as election tribunals.

It is pertinent to mention here that two out of the eight election tribunals were already working in Punjab. In response, the electoral body, in its appeal filed in the SC, sought leave to appeal against the impugned judgement of the LHC contending that under Article 219 reading with Article 222(b) of the Constitution, the power to appoint the election tribunals was vested in the electoral body.

consult the relevant high court's chief justice for appointing election tribunals or for allocating territorial jurisdiction to such election tribunals.

Section 140(3) of the Elections Act 2017 only required consultation with the chief justice of the high court concerned on the appointment of sitting high court judges as election tribunals, but this consultation did not cover the allocation of territorial jurisdiction to the election tribunals which was the sole power and prerogative of the Election Commission, as was evident from Section 140(1) read with Section 151 of the Elections Act 2017, the petition stated.

CP Isa questioned how the ECP was issuing presidential ordinance and wondered why the electoral body didn't meet the LHC CJ. "Nowhere is it written in the Constitution that one cannot meet a judge [...], why is the ECP controversial?" the top judge remarked.—RT/Agency

President Emphasizes Enhanced Capacity Of LEAs To Counter Terrorism In Balochistan

GWADAR: President Asif Ali Zardari on Thursday called for enhancing the capacity of the Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs), posting competent officers in Balochistan, and improving the prosecution mechanism to effectively counter terrorist elements in Balochistan.

The president expressed these views while chairing a meeting on the security/law and order situation in Balochistan, in Gwadar, on Thursday.

Minister for Interior, Mohsin Raza Naqvi, Chief Minister Balochistan, Mir Sarfarz Ahmed Bugti, MNA Malik Shah Gorgaji, Home Minister, Mir Ziaullah Langgou, MPA Maulana Hidayatullah Rehman, senior civil and military officials attended the meeting.

The president was briefed about the overall security situation of the province as well as the role of LEAs in successfully countering terrorist attacks in various districts of Balochistan.

It was informed that the provincial government had adopted a targeted approach to improve the security and law-and-order situation in Balochistan.

It was further apprised that the initiatives taken by the LEAs had resulted in improving the security situation in the province. The president was informed that the provincial government was taking steps to provide fool-proof security to Chinese and foreign nationals.

He appreciated the efforts of the provincial government as well as the sacrifices of the LEAs in combatting terrorism.



The president emphasized that the prosecution system needed to be improved so that the terrorist elements could not escape justice.

He said that compensation for the families of martyrs of LEAs in Balochistan should be enhanced bringing it at par with the rest of the provinces. The president said that competent and brave police officials needed to be posted in Balochistan that would help improve the law-and-order situation of the province. He also called for taking effective measures to ensure the safety and security of Zaireen.

Underlining the need to improve the socio-economic condition of Balochistan, the President called for focusing on the skill development of its people and producing more skilled professionals.

He said that the capacity of training institutions should be enhanced to produce more trained human resources and equip them with foreign language skills that would also help them find jobs in foreign countries.

The president also called for promoting the fishing industry of Balochistan by providing financing and equipment to local fishermen.

apart from promoting sustainable fishing practices and checking the production of illegal fishing nets.

During the meeting, the president said that political dialogue was the way forward to bring prosperity, development and peace to Balochistan.

Chief Minister Balochistan thanked the president for visiting Gwadar, saying that it would give the people of Balochistan a sense of ownership as well as strengthen the resolve of the LEAs to eliminate terrorism.

He informed that the provincial government was according top-priority to the capacity building of police and levies. He underlined the importance of equipping people residing in border areas of Balochistan with marketable skills to help them find employment in the country and abroad.

He highlighted that all stakeholders needed to make collective efforts to stamp out terrorism, besides evolving a national consensus for the development of Balochistan.

Ministry Reports Death Of 35 Pakistani Pilgrims During Hajj



ISLAMABAD: At least 35 Pakistanis have lost their lives while performing Hajj this year due to extreme weather conditions, the Ministry of Religious Affairs confirmed on Thursday.

The death toll from this year's Hajj has exceeded 1,000, an AFP tally said on Thursday, more than half of them unregistered worshippers who performed the pilgrimage in extreme heat.

Fatalities have been reported by Egypt, Pakistan, India, Jordan, Indonesia, Iran, Senegal, Tunisia, and Iraq.

Director General of Pakistan's Hajj Mission Abdul Wahab Soomro said as of 4pm on June 18, a total of 35 Pakistani deaths had been reported — 20 in Makkah, three in Madinah, four in Mina, three in Arafat, and two in Muzdalifah. "Due to a temperature of 50°C, this was a tough Hajj," the official said.

Soomro also dismissed social media claims of leaving the pilgrims "helpless". "We trust the Saudi govern-

ment's information and we confirm it ourselves as well, whenever there's a death. We are informed."

Meanwhile, the ministry added that under the Saudi government's rules, they seek permission from the heirs of the family for burial.

"After bathing [the body], funeral prayers are offered here and burial takes place in Saudi Arabia." In case the family wants the body back, it said, arrangements are made to send it to Pakistan.

Media reports suggest that friends and family of missing Hajj pilgrims are searching hospitals and pleading online for news, fearing the worst. The Hajj is one of the five pillars of Islam and all Muslims with the means must complete it at least once.

Its timing is determined by the Islamic lunar calendar, shifting forward each year in the Gregorian calendar. For the past several years the mainly outdoor rituals have fallen during the sweltering Saudi summer.—RT/Agency

Atta Tarar Issues Warning To Gandapur

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Information and Broadcasting Atta Tarar took a jibe at Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister (CM) Ali Amin Gandapur for "storming" grid station in Dera Ismail Khan, media reported.

Addressing a presser in Islamabad, the minister said that if the chief minister could take 100 people to the grid station, he could take 1000 there.

Att Tarar said that the issues of electricity and line losses should be resolved by the centre and the provinces together, with mutual understanding and cooperation.

"Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is also a part of our country. We all have to come on one page to facilitate the people. The country can develop by solving the issues of power theft and line losses," he added.

Attallah Tarar said that some people go to the entertainment places on the eve of Eid and some go to the grid station. "We are not the ones who



burnt the bills," the minister added.

Atta Tarar's statement came amid escalating tension between the centre and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as Ali Amin Gandapur visited a grid station in Dera Ismail Khan, flipping the switch.

"No area would suffer power outages for more than 12 hours now," the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government's official X account posted.

In a presser, the minister said the visit of the Chinese delegation to Pakistan is a proof of trust between the two countries.

He said that a high-level delegation of China is visiting Pakistan from

Thursday to participate in the third meeting of the Pakistan-China Joint Consultative Mechanism (JCM).

He also urged all political parties to welcome the delegation in a manner that can express the exemplary bond between the two countries.

Talking about Prime Minister's recent visit to China, the Minister said Pak-China friendship and progress of CPEC projects were discussed during the tour.

Termining Pak-China friendship beyond politics, he said China's commitment during the Prime Minister's visit to upgrade CPEC is a welcoming step.—RT/Agency

PML-N And PPP Navigating Contentious Relationship: Mohsin Shahnawaz Ranjha

LAHORE: Pakistan Muslim League (N) central leader Mohsin Shahnawaz Ranjha issued a strong warning in response to the PPP's threat to leave the government.

In his statement, Ranjha accused the PPP of blackmailing and said that if power is lost, both parties will be in Adiala Jail. He blamed the PPP for making insincere statements to secure their future in politics.

Ranjha likened the relationship between the Muslim League-N and the PPP to that of a contentious relationship.

Earlier, in a press conference in Lahore, PPP leader Hasan Murtaza



claimed that the Muslim League (N) owes its power to the PPP.

Murtaza highlighted that the PPP's 45 members are crucial to the survival of the Muslim League (N), sug-

gesting that without the PPP, the entire Muslim League (N) would be in jail.

Murtaza insisted PML-N leader Hanif Abbasi stop inciting division and chaos in politics.—RT/Agency

10 Punjab Based Individuals, Including Customs Officer Abducted At Picnic Point In Quetta



QUETTA: Unidentified armed men kidnapped 10 people hailing from Punjab from Shuban picnic point in Zarghon Ghar, Quetta, media reported on Thursday, citing DG Levies.

According to details, armed men took 16 people hostage who were enjoying at Shuban picnic point in

Zarghon Ghar. The DG Levies said the armed men released six hostages after checking their Computerized National Identity Cards (CNICs).

The ten people who have been abducted include a Customs Officer and others, who are residents of Punjab province.—RT/Agency

Lawyers' Killing a Test Case For Government, Says Law Minister Tarar

ATTOCK: Federal Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar on Thursday spoke at the condolence reference of the murdered lawyers in Attock, where he assured the community of taking the killers to justice by declaring it a test case for the government.

"It is really sad that we will not be able to meet our friends again but I assure you that justice will prevail and we will do everything for the consolation of the bereaved families of Israr and Zulfiqar," the minister said.

He said this was a textbook case of terrorism. "Every case has its merits and job of a lawyer is to present the case before the court and verdict is then announced on merit. No one will be allowed to go scot-free as lawyers are an important pillar of society," he said.

"Good human beings and friends stay alive in our hearts forever. We should scratch our heads to find a way to stamp



out events like these. Psychological screening should be made necessary for on-duty security personnel in order to stave off Attock-like incidents," he said.

The minister said there should be zero tolerance in cases of bringing arms to court premises.

The minister also highlighted the significance of lawyers' freedom to speak against injustice as muzzling lawyers' voice could lead to unintended consequences as happened in the past. He reminded that lawyers stood like a shield whenever democ-

racy underwent difficult phases.

An ASI of Elite Force gunned down two senior lawyers - Malik Israr Ahmed, a former president of the Punjab Bar Council, and Zulfiqar Mirza - with his official weapon in their chamber on the district court premises.

Security personnel arrested ASI Intizar Shah who targeted Malik Israr Ahmed over a pillar of society," he said. Israr represented the ex-wife of the police official in a local family court in which the court annulled his marriage.—RT/Agency
