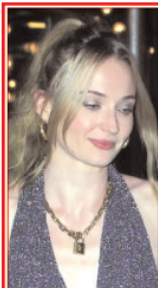

Nawaz Vows To Play Active Role In Strengthening Political System

LAHORE: After getting back Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz's (PML-N) presidency last month, former prime minister Nawaz Sharif has decided to play "an active role in national politics", sources told media on Monday.

The development came after the PML-N president held a meeting with senior party leaders — including Rana Sanaulah and Khawaja Saad Rafique — which lasted for nearly two hours, the sources said, adding that Nawaz decided to become more active in the political affairs of the country.

The politico would hold more meetings with the party's leaders and workers besides playing an active role in strengthening the prevailing political system, they added.

Nawaz had lost the prime minister's office in 2017 and the presidency of his party in 2018, as a result of the Supreme Court's ruling in the assets beyond means case.



After the ouster of Imran Khan-led Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government in April 2022, the Nawaz-led party came to power.

The parties under the flag of the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) got a chance to transfer the power to the then-largest opposition party — PML-N — and elected Shehbaz Sharif as the new premier for the remaining 1.5 years of the rule.

The Nawaz-led party was re-elected to power after forming a coalition with the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) and the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) in the Centre after the general elections this year. The PML-N chief refused to become the prime minister as he did not want to head the coalition in the Centre as no party was able to secure enough seats to form the majority government following the February 8 polls. Strengthening its image on political canvas, Nawaz was elected unopposed as the party president in May 2024 after a six-year hiatus as no other party leader submitted their nomination papers against the party and the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) in the Centre after the general elections this year.

CJP Isa: PTI's Merger With SIC Is 'Political Suicide'

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa wondered on Monday why Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) "committed suicide" when it decided to merge with the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) following the February 8 elections.

The CJP's remarks came during a hearing of the petition filed by the SIC, which is an ally of the PTI, against the Peshawar High Court's (PHC) verdict denying reserved seats for women and minorities in the national and provincial assemblies.

A full court 13-member bench, headed by CJP Isa, also comprises Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Muneeb Akhtar, Justice Yahya Afridi, Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Ayesha A Malik, Justice Athar Minallah, Justice Syed Hassan Azhar Rizvi, Justice Shahid Waheed, Justice Irfan



Saadat Khan and Justice Naem Akhtar Afghan. "Why did the independent candidates leave PTI when it is a political party? Why did you commit suicide by joining another party which goes against your arguments?" asked the chief justice.

The CJP said that had the independent candidates stayed with the PTI, there would have been no problem today. Following the today's proceeding, the Supreme Court said PTI leader Kan-

pendent candidates who emerged victorious in the February 8 elections had joined the SIC in a bid to claim seats reserved for minority and women.

However, this did not help the party as the election commission did not allocate reserved seats to the SIC, citing its failure to submit its list of candidates. The party had then approached the PHC on the said issue wherein the court upheld the electoral body's decision.

In April, SIC chief Sahibzada Hamid Raza, along with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly speaker, moved the SC seeking setting aside of the PHC verdict and the allocation of 67 women and 11 minority seats in the assemblies.

On May 6, a three-member SC bench headed by Justice Mansoor Ali Shah, including Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar and Justice Athar

Minallah, suspended the PHC verdict. It then referred the matter to the judges' committee for the formation of a larger bench since the matter required constitutional interpretation. Meanwhile, the ECP had last week submitted its response to the apex court, saying the SIC does not qualify for reserved seats as the political party doesn't allow non-Muslims to be a part of it.

The ECP informed the top court that the reserved seats cannot be allotted to the SIC as the party did not submit the list of candidates before the January 24 deadline. On the other hand, SIC also submitted the additional documents to the apex court, including the ECP's notification of success for two National Assembly lawmakers-elect, with a plea to bring the said documents on judicial records.—RT/Agency

IHC Suspends ECP's Decision On Transfer Of Election Petitions To New Tribunals

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) Monday suspended the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) order, wherein it had transferred multiple poll rigging petitions to a new tribunal.

The case was heard by IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq who also issued a contempt of court notice to Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) lawmaker Anjum Aqeel Khan, directing him to ensure his appearance before the court in every hearing.

The electoral body's 13-member bench, headed by Chief Justice Sajid Umar, including Justice Sikandar Sultan Raja, on June 10 approved the petitions from PML-N lawmakers seeking transfer of the cases, wherein their win in the February 8 polls was challenged by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) backed independent candidates.

The petitions were filed by PML-N's Tariq Fazal Chaudhry, Aqeel Khan and Raja Khuram Nawaz whose rival candidates in the general election were PTI-backed Muhammad Ali Bokhari, Shoaib Shaheen and



Aamir Mughal.

In response, the PTI-backed independent candidates then moved the IHC against the ECP's decision, with the court initially barring the new tribunals from hearing the cases.

During the hearing today, IHC CJ Farooq directed PML-N lawmaker Anjum to read his affidavit submitted in the ECP.

"What is the meaning of the word nepotism? Explain it to me," the chief justice said.

"My English is very weak [...] These are legal terminology, I apologise unconditionally to the court," the politician said in response.

"This is not at all a legal terminology," CJ Farooq replied.

When asked by the chief justice whether he had signed the affidavit without reading it, the PML-N lawmaker answered in the affirmative.

Referring to the legislator's petition in the ECP for the transfer of the case to a new tribunal, the CJ questioned how the tribunal judge was biased.

"Did you want to change him [judge] because he was not giving you undue favours?" the CJ questioned.

"I didn't ask for any favours," Anjum replied. "[Then] why did you accuse the judge [of bias]? Why did you ask the lawyer to submit an application [to ECP]?" the chief justice inquired.—RT/Agency

Law Ministry Notifies Elevation Of Three Judges To The Supreme Court

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Law and Justice on Monday notified the appointments of three high court judges to the Supreme Court following the approval of President Asif Ali Zardari.

The judges who have been elevated to the top court include Lahore High Court (LHC) Justice Shahid Bilal Hassan, LHC Chief Justice Malik Shahzad Ahmad Khan and Sindh High Court (SHC) Chief Justice Aqeel Ahmed Abbasi. The new appointments were approved by the president under Article 177.

After Lahore High Court's Chief Justice Shahzad's elevation, Justice Shujaat Ali Khan was appointed as acting LHC CJ by President Zardari under Article 196, according to a notification issued by the law ministry. Justice Shujaat will perform duties as acting LHC CJ until the appointment to the top post, if further stated.

The Judicial Commission of Pakistan (JCP) had recommended the elevation of chief justices of the LHC and the SHC to the apex court, be-



sides recommending the elevation of the LHC judge to the apex court earlier this month. The decision was taken by Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Justice Qazi Faez Isa, chairman of the commission, in the SC chaired a meeting of the JCP, a constitutional forum for the judges' appointment in the superior courts. It was learnt by The News that after detailed deliberations, the commission by a 5-4 majority approved the elevation of Justice Shahzad. The JCP also approved elevation of Justice Shahid. Of nine members of the commission, four JCP members, Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Muneeb Akhtar, Justice

Zardari Advocates Rehabilitation For Surrendered Dacoits

KARACHI: President Asif Ali Zardari has stated that criminals from the Kacha Area in Sindh, except for hardened criminals, who are willing to surrender to the state, should be gradually brought into the mainstream and rehabilitated to become responsible and productive citizens.

The president expressed these views while chairing a meeting on the law and order situation in Sindh, held in Sukkur on Monday. He also called for stern action against hardcore criminals involved in heinous crimes.

The president emphasised the need to improve the road, health, and education infrastructure of the Kacha Areas on a priority basis to enhance the socio-economic conditions of the people.

He advised that a qaumi jirga, comprising tribal chiefs, should be convened to engage and negotiate with the local population to bring normalcy, prevent crimes, de-weaponise, and improve the security situation in the area.

Zardari was briefed about the security situation in Sindh and the implementation status of the directions given during the previous meeting on May 1. He was informed that 133 joint operations had been conducted by the Sindh Police and the Rangers, leading to the arrest of hundreds of dacoits and criminals. He stated that additional check posts had also been established in various parts of Kacha Areas to control crime.

The meeting was further informed that, on the direction of the president, the campaign against drug peddlers had intensified, resulting in the arrest of 308 suppliers while smart cameras were also installed to monitor the entry points of the province.

The president emphasised that the Sindh government should focus on raising a modern police force to effectively meet the security challenges and requirements of the province. He underlined the need to strengthen the capacity of the Sindh Police by providing them with modern equipment, weapons, adequate human resources, and logistics.

Imran Urges SC For Expedited Hearing On Disqualification Appeal



ISLAMABAD: Incarcerated PTI founder Imran Khan has filed a petition in the Supreme Court on Monday to expedite the hearing of an appeal regarding his disqualification by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) in the Toshakhana case.

Barrister Ali Zafar, the lawyer representing the PTI founder, has submitted a request for an early hearing of the appeal against the former premier's disqualification.

The application argues that the petitioner, a former prime minister and leader of the largest political party (PTI), faces ongoing challenges to his role as party chief following a disqualification by the electoral watchdog. The petition added that cases challenging the ECP's decisions are currently pend-

ing in Islamabad and Lahore High Courts, with proceedings stalled due to a related case in the Supreme Court.

The petitioner contended that these legal challenges prevent him from assuming the role of PTI chairman, member of the assembly, and also hinder his participation in by-elections due to the pending appeal.

In December last year, Imran challenged in the Lahore High Court (LHC) the ECP's ruling of disqualifying him for five years for not declaring Toshakhana gifts in his statement of assets and liabilities. Khan contended that recent amendments to the Elections Act 2017 limit the ECP's jurisdiction in deciding the qualification or disqualification of a member based on a court conviction.—RT/Agency

Fazl Warns Azm-e-Istehkam Operation Could Further 'Destabilize' Pakistan



ISLAMABAD: After Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and Awami National Party (ANP) opposition against Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rahman has also condemned the operation, declaring it a "destabilising initiative" that will further weaken Pakistan.

During a press conference, JUI-F chief after meeting with Dr Malik Baloch, Asghar Achakzai, Khushal Khan Kakar, and Abdul Khaliq Hazara said, "This is not Operation Azm-e-Istehkam but rather operation 'Adm-e-Istehkam', which, he say will make Pakistan even more vulnerable.

"The establishment must end its dominance in all aspects," the JUI-F chief added.

Fazl stressed the equality of all citizens under the same national identity, asserting, "We are all equal citizens of this country. One class should not consider itself rulers while the rest remain subjects. Our history is about fighting against slavery, and we will not be treated like animals."

Criticising the state's declining control, Fazl highlighted the ineffectiveness of police in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) and



questioned the military's involvement in civilian governance. "What is the Apex Committee? At the tehsil level, a major, at the district level, a colonel, at the provincial level, a corps commander, and at the federal level, the army chief. When a uniformed officer is present, who will make the decisions?" he asked.

On June 22, the Apex Committee of National Action Plan, chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, approved "Operation Azm-e-Istehkam" to eliminate terrorism and extremism across the country.

The meeting, held in Islamabad, included key federal cabinet members such as the Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister, Defence Minister, Interior Min-

ister, Finance Minister, Law Minister, and Information Minister. Chief ministers from all provinces and Gilgit-Baltistan, services chiefs, provincial chief secretaries, and other senior civilian, military, and law enforcement officials also attended.

The meeting stressed the need for a new, dynamic counter-terrorism strategy based on national consensus and broad systemic coordination. Prime Minister Shehbaz approved the reactivation of the national anti-terrorism campaign through the launch of Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, symbolising national resolve with consensus from all stakeholders, including the provinces, Gilgit-Baltistan, and Azad Jammu and Kashmir.—RT/Agency

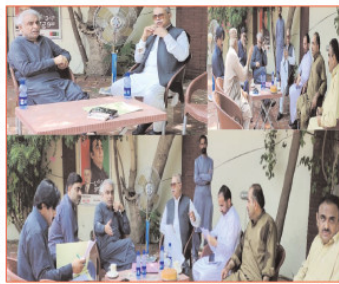

TEA, SEF join hands to provide education and vocational training to out-of-school children

MITHI: Thar Education Alliance has signed an agreement with the Sindh Education Foundation to provide education and vocational training to out-of-school children. Admissions at these centers will begin on July 1st, and children aged 9 to 17 years will be enrolled. Two Fraudulent BISP Device Operators Arrested

Tando Adam's growers decry acute water shortage

TANDO ADAM: A sit-in protest has been organized at the Qaiser Goth stop in Tando Adam by the residents against the scarcity of water persisting in the area for the past several years. Participating in the protest are councilors Imran Brohi, Ibrahim Hakro, Muslim League Functional Muhammad Qasim Hingoro, Nazeer Pathan, Saeed Brohi, and others. The protesters have demanded immediate action from the concerned authorities. Ad-

ditionally, a boycott has been initiated by the residents, affecting local businesses and workers' incomes. Some of the protesters expressed their frustration, particularly targeting the landlords and influential figures who, despite being in power for the last 15 years, have failed to address the water scarcity issue. They called upon the authorities, including the Sindh government and local officials, to address their grievances promptly and provide them with access to water.

Seven Bodies Found In Karachi Under Mysterious Circumstances

KARACHI: The tally of unexplained deaths in Karachi surged to 17 within a span of one day as rescue services recovered seven additional bodies from various parts of the city on Monday, according to media reports.

Rescue officials indicated that most of the deceased individuals, aged between 35 to 60 years, were suspected drug addicts who succumbed to the extreme heatwave prevailing in the city.

Six bodies were discovered in locations including Jama Cloth Market, Goli-mar, Super Highway, Gulistan-e-Johar, Federal B Area, and Landhi. Addition-

tionally, a body showing signs of torture was found near Surjani Town's Fatimi Society. The bodies have been transferred to respective police stations and subsequently to the morgue for further investigation. Identification procedures are currently underway. Notably, on Sunday, 10 bodies were found under similar mysterious circumstances in various areas of Karachi, including KMC ground Lyari, Jahangir Road, Godam Chowrangi, and others. Police have initiated urgent investigations to ascertain the causes of death and potential connections between these incidents.—RT/Agency

Afghan Gang Arrested In Karachi

KARACHI: Sindh Rangers and police conducted a joint operation resulting in the arrest of an Afghan dacoit gang in Karachi, as reported by the media on Monday.

According to details, the Afghan gang was involved in street crimes and other serious offenses in the city. Acting on a tip-off, Rangers and police raided Karachi's Sohrah Goth area and apprehended two dacoits, including their leader.

The arrested individuals were identified as Jan Agha, known as Umed Gul or Lughmani, and Abdul Rehman. It was revealed that they had been ordering weapons from Dara Adami via Facebook. A spokesperson for Sindh Rangers stated that the dacoits were wanted in connection with more than 300 dacoity cases. Initial investigations indicated that mobile phones snatched in Karachi were being sold in Afghanistan.

The Afghan dacoit group has been handed over to the police for further investigation.

Earlier on March 16, the Kalri police had arrested the leader of another Afghan dacoit gang involved in various criminal activities in Karachi.

During the investigation, the arrested leader, identified as Abidullah alias Karzai, disclosed that his gang members were responsible for the killing of police constable Wahid Parvaiz on February 13, as well as a Rangers officer named Asif during a robbery.—RT/Agency

PTI Leaders Arrested During Karachi Rally Granted Bail

KARACHI: PTI leaders and workers arrested during a rally in Karachi's Korangi area were granted bail by the City Court, Civil Judge, and Judicial Magistrate, Karachi East. Among those arrested were PTI Sindh Additional General Secretary Rizwan Niazi, Karachi General Secretary Arslan Khalid, Wali Mugheri, Sultan Rehmat, Abdul Qadeer, and nine other workers. They faced charges including involvement in a police encounter. Prominent PTI figures including PTI Sindh President Hafeem Adil Sheikh, Karachi President Raja Azhar, former MNA Faheem Khan, and others

attended the court proceedings. The case was represented by PTI Sindh leaders and IFL lawyers, resulting in bail set at ten thousand rupees each due to insufficient evidence presented by the police. In a media briefing, PTI Sindh President Hafeem Adil Sheikh condemned the arrests as politically motivated, criticizing the government's alleged manipulation of the electoral process and law enforcement priorities in Karachi. He asserted the PTI's commitment to peaceful protest until the release of Chairman Imran Khan and a change in governance in Sindh.—RT/Agency

Punjab CM approved an extension in the Maryam ki Dastak project in a session today presided over by her.

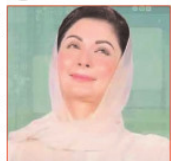
The Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB) chairman gave the briefing about the Maryam ki Dastak project extension.

The heat is on!

The blistering heatwave gripping Karachi and Sindh demands immediate and decisive action from both the federal and Sindh governments. With temperatures soaring to an unprecedented 43.7 degrees Celsius in Gulistan-e-Johar, Karachi experienced its hottest day of the year so far, making daily life almost unbearable. The situation is exacerbated by chronic power outages, leaving many without the means to cool their homes, thus turning living conditions into a veritable hell. Those fortunate enough to receive electricity are often unable to afford the exorbitant bills, creating a scenario ripe for unrest.

Only through decisive and sustained action can we hope to prevent further tragedies and ensure a livable environment for all.

Generators should be kept ready at all pumping stations in case of power outage. The staff involved in this operation should be kept on duty, and measures should be taken for mosquito spray campaign. The Livestock Department officials were directed to take effective measures for vaccination against diseases in animals that occur after rainfall. The officials of the WAPDA department were instructed to reduce the duration of power load shedding during rainfall and to promptly repair any transformers that may malfunction anywhere in the district.

The left-handed opening Test batter said Pakistani team had great talent, but it lacked stability and it was always challenging to perform in such a situation. "When I look from the outside, everything is changing in the Pakistan cricket team. Selection committee members, staff and players keep changing," he said while speaking at an event in Melbourne. Pakistan were eliminated at the group stage of T20 World Cup 2024 which has led to a lot of criticism in the country and abroad. It was particularly senior players, including skipper Babar Azam, who received the

flak the most. To a query about Babar Azam's captaincy, Khawaja said it was for the star batter to decide. "It's Babar Azam's decision to captain, if he can, he should," he said. Pakistan were defeated by debutants US by five runs in a Super Over tie and by six runs against India. They managed to win against Canada on June 11 by seven wickets. Then, their hopes were tied to Ireland's beating the US, however, rain washed out the match with Pakistan's hopes for advancing into the Super 8 stage in the tournament, this handed both the teams one point. India beat powerhouse Australia to book T20 World Cup 2024 semi-final spot

GROS ISLET: Rohit Sharma's swashbuckling 92, followed by a combined bowling effort led India to beat Australia and qualify for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 semi-finals here at Darren Sammy National Cricket Stadium on Monday. Chasing a daunting 206-run total, Australia could accumulate 181/7 in their quota of 20 overs despite Travis Head's half-century.



Australia had a shaky start to the pursuit as they lost David Warner (6) in the first over with just six runs on the board. Following the early hiccup, Mitchell Marsh joined forces with Travis Head and the duo launched a counter-attack. They raised 81 runs in just 41 deliveries before Marsh fell victim to Kuldeep Yadav as Axar Patel took a blinder just inside the square leg boundary.

Marsh made important contribution for Australia with a 28-ball 37 which included three fours and two sixes. Travis Head and Glenn Maxwell then put together a quick partnership for the third wicket, adding 41 runs to the total until Kuldeep castled the latter on the first delivery of the 14th over. Maxwell made 20 in 12 balls, laced up with two fours and a six. Australia then lost another wicket, exactly an over later, when Marcus Stoinis (2) fell prey to Axar Patel while attempting to play a reverse sweep. The 2021 champions suffered a massive setback to their run-chase when their mainstay Head was out-classed by Jasprit Bumrah's slower delivery in the 17th over with 56 still required. Head remained the top-scorer for Australia with 76 off 43 deliveries, hitting nine fours and four sixes. His dismissal halted the flow of runs for Australia and they lost two more wickets in the next over, allowing India to seize control. Australia eventually succumbed to a 24-run deficit which dented their semi-final hopes.—Agency

Kylian Mbappe can't wait to play against Poland despite nose injury



PARIS: Kylian Mbappe's club and country teammate recently confirmed that the former Paris Saint-Germain star is determined to take the field for France's final Euro 2024 group stage match against Poland on Tuesday. According to Euro Sport, the 24-year-old French football star and Real Madrid midfielder, Aurélien Tchouameni, told media that his 25-year-old teammate is "really eager" to play against Poland despite the nose injury he suffered during France's opener against Austria. "I think everyone knows he [Mbappe] is really eager to play in the next match," Tchouameni told media. "As for the mask, I think he is starting to get used to it. Of course he would rather not wear it but I think if you ask the doctor he would say there is no choice. "But that won't change anything for him. We know that when he is on the field he will bring a lot to the team." Following the injury, Mbappe didn't feature in the draw against the Netherlands but he participated in a practice match against Paderborn's under-21 side on Saturday. He wore his much talked-about mask and scored twice, Euro Sport reported. Tchouameni replaced Mbappe in Didier Deschamps' starting line-up for the Netherlands clash having missed the Austria game with injury. Ahead of the final round of Group D matches, which will see a three-way battle for qualification with Poland already eliminated, Tchouameni said: "Some people want to win and do so by playing well, and others just want to win.—Agency

'It was historic': USA's Corey Anderson on Cinderella T20 World Cup run



NEW YORK: USA's exit from the T20 World Cup 2024 was quite unlike the start they took in the tournament by winning two back-to-back games against Canada and then surprising everyone by defeating Pakistan in a super over. They lost their next game against India and their game against Ireland was washed out due to rain. Still, the new side managed to progress in the Super 8 round of the T20 World Cup 2024 but failed to win even a single game against England, West Indies and South Africa though they almost won against the Proteas but lost by 19 runs. Despite not winning a single game in the second round of the T20 World Cup, USA's Corey Anderson, who used to represent New Zealand, believes the entire T20WC was historic for the side. "Making it through to the Super Eights was obviously a historic occasion for the USA. I think the boys can hold their heads high and be proud of what they've done. Because again, I think we've probably turned the world's attention to the US for them to say we're here to play. I'm extremely proud of what this team has done this World Cup. The future of USA Cricket looks good. The sky's the limit really," stated Anderson while facing the media after their defeat against England. Anderson also revealed how the T20 World Cup 2024 was a good chance for the USA cricket team to play against bigger teams as they usually do not get to play against them. "We are still an Associate nation, growing, trying to get a bigger player pool. Any time that we can play against these guys is hugely valuable. We've got extremely good talent in showing that. We don't get to play against these big teams often or at all. The more we've played as well, the more footage they have on us," he concluded.—Agency

Amy Yang wins Women's PGA Championship

ANGELES: South Korea's Amy Yang captured her long-awaited first major title on Sunday, hanging on late for a three-stroke victory at the Women's PGA Championship in her 75th major start. Yang fired a level-par 72 to stand on seven-under 281 after 72 holes at Sahalee Country Club in Sammamish, Washington. And despite some late struggles, that was enough to claim the \$1.56 million top prize with compatriot Ko Jin-young, Japan's Miyu Yamashita and American Lilia Vu sharing second on 284. "I'm at a loss for words right now," Yang said. "All four rounds it was tough out there, but I did my best." World number 25 Yang, who had 21 career top-10



major finishes without a victory, won her first major in her 17th LPGA Tour season at age 34. "I always wanted to win a major and I came close several times and I started doubting myself if I'm ever going to win a major before I retire because I've been on tour for quite a while," Yang said. "I'm so grateful and very happy to win a major." The two-time US Open runner-up won her fifth and most recent prior LPGA title at last November's Tour Championship, her first triumph on US soil. Despite a large lead late, Yang faced some tense moments down the stretch. Yang made her second three-putt bogey of the week at 16, trimming her lead to five strokes. After her group was given

a time warning, Yang plunked her tee shot into the water at the par-3 17th and made double bogey, slicing her lead to three over Ko and Vu. At the par-5 18th, Yang found the fairway but sent her second shot into left rough short of the green. She pitched her third shot onto the green and two-putted for par from just inside 12 feet for the triumph. World number 22 Yamashita, a 22-year-old with 11 wins on the LPGA Japan Tour and closed with a birdie to shoot 73 and grab a share of second. Vu and Ko shot 71. Americans Ally Ewing and Lauren Hartlage shared fifth on 285. Hartlage, ranked 272nd, managed her first top-five LPGA finish.—Agency

Five issues England must resolve to deliver on expectations at Euro 2024

GERMANY: Booned by their own fans and heavily criticised by the media back home, England's Euro 2024 campaign is off to a stuttering start despite picking up four points from their opening two games. An underwhelming 1-0 win over Serbia was followed by a disappointed display in a 1-1 draw with Denmark. Gareth Southgate's men are still almost certain to make the knockout stages and can win Group C with victory over Slovenia in Cologne on Tuesday. However, Southgate has several fires to fight if the Three Lions are to deliver on the expectation to become European champions for the



very first time. In response to questioning over why England have sat back after going in front early in both their opening games, Southgate has conceded his players are not at the physical level needed to press for 90 minutes. "We are not pressing well

a similar workload also weighing on the legs of their squads. Indeed, Southgate has hinted the opposite is the case as many of his squad had not played a competitive 90 minutes for nearly a month before facing Serbia and finds himself left hoping they will regain match sharpness as the tournament progresses. Southgate's gamble on bringing Luke Shaw as his only natural left-back in a 26-man squad already looks misjudged. Shaw has not played a minute for club or country since February and has still not been fit enough to join in team training in Germany.—Agency

"Performance, fitness, and merit will be the key criteria for advancing players," Naqvi said. 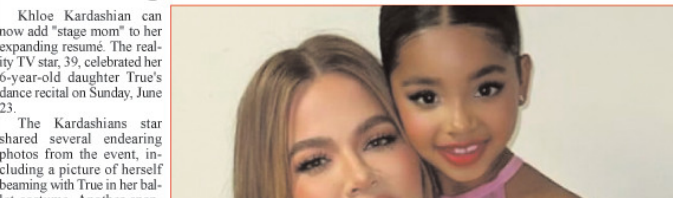

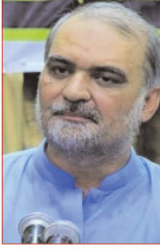

Karachi In Grip Of Partial Heatwave

KARACHI: Chief Meteorologist Sardar Sarfaraz has indicated that Karachi is currently experiencing a partial heatwave, which is expected to persist for the next two days, as reported by media on Monday. The prevailing hot weather in the city is attributed to a change in wind direction, according to Sarfaraz. He forecasted a likely decrease in temperatures after the two-day period. The Meteorological Department also anticipates the onset of the monsoon season in the first week of July, Karachi and other districts of Sindh are predicted to receive above-normal rainfall during

this monsoon season. Today, the temperature in Karachi could rise to 43 degrees Celsius, with continued hot and humid conditions expected for the next three days. Tomorrow, daytime temperatures are projected to range between 38 to 40 degrees Celsius. In other parts of Sindh, including Hyderabad, Mirpur Khas, Umartkot, and Badin, temperatures may reach between 44 to 46 degrees Celsius. Tharparkar and Umartkot could experience light rainfall accompanied by wind and thunderstorms later today or tonight, according to the weather report. Recent weather patterns have already brought pre-monsoon light rain and strong winds to various areas of the city. Similarly, Rohri, Pannu Aqil, Kandhra, and Salehpur witnessed rainfall that damaged mud houses and inundated roads. The Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) of Punjab has issued a monsoon rain alert, predicting an increase of 35 percent in rainfall this season starting from July 1st. Heavy rains are expected in upper, central, and southern Punjab, potentially leading to urban flooding and flooding in hill torrents in southern Punjab during July's rain spell.—RT/Agency

Activist Sarim Burney Hospitalized Amid Child Trafficking Charges

KARACHI: Sarim Burney, renowned human rights activist and philanthropist, has been hospitalized after being arrested on charges of child trafficking and document forgery, as reported by Express News. The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has filed an interim charge sheet in the case.



Burney, accused of smuggling over 20 newborns under the guise of adoption in the past year, was transferred to a hospital from court lockup due to health concerns. The bail hearing took place in the court of the Additional District and Sessions Judge East, overseen by a substitute judge in the absence of the assigned judge.

hearing has been adjourned to June 26 upon the defense's request.

Defense lawyers successfully requested Burney's transfer from Landhi Jail to Central Jail, which was granted by the court. However, the bail application

Amir Nawaz Warrach, defense lawyer, informed that Burney's health deteriorated necessitating his transfer to the hospital while in court lockup. The FIA's interim charge sheet alleges that Burney attempted to smuggle children to the USA by falsely declaring them as orphans.—RT/Agency

KATI Warns That Fixed Tax Regime On Exports Will Devastate Industry

KARACHI: Johar Qandhari, President of the Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (KATI), has condemned the proposed fixed tax regime on exports, warning it will severely harm exports and deter investment. Qandhari stated that this policy would exacerbate economic challenges for industrialists.



"The government's proposal to implement a fixed tax regime on exports will only add to the difficulties of industrialists, rather than facilitating them to boost exports," Qandhari said. He highlighted that the current tax burden, including income tax, sales tax, withholding tax, and regulatory duties, can account for up to 50% of their income, making profitable operations nearly impossible.

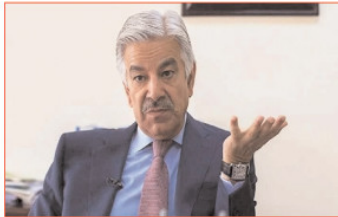

Bajwa and Faiz Hamid Settled Matters With TTP, Gave Us Brief Overview: Khawaja Asif

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif Monday revealed that former army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa and ex-Inter Services Intelligence director General Faiz Hamid settled matters with Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and only gave a brief overview to them on the matter.



"They [former generals] painted a picture as if all was good in Swat," Asif said while speaking to media.

The defence minister said that the politicians, most notably Ali Wazir and Mohsin Dawar, had raised questions in the relevant briefing but were not allowed to speak much.

The minister's remarks come after Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led federal government, in light of increased terrorist incidents in recent months, announced launching a fresh anti-terror operation across the country titled "Azm-e-Istehkam".

The decision was made during a meeting of the National Apex Committee on National Action Plan (NAP) which was attended by chief

ministers of all provinces and GB, services chiefs, and chief secretaries of the provinces along with other senior civilian, military, and law enforcement agencies officers.

The operation will provision streamlining of multiple lines of effort to combat the menaces of extremism and terrorism in a comprehensive and decisive manner, read the statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

However, the Centre's move hasn't bode well with the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), which constitutes the majority of the opposition benches in the National Assembly and has opposed the

military operation, calling for the issue to be discussed before the parliament.

"The federal government should discuss this issue in the parliament before approving it. No Apex Committee is above this house," PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar said while speaking in the lower house on Sunday.

Reflecting on PTI's government, Asif claimed that around 5,000-6,000 TTP fighters were brought back and were given shelter and amnesty during the former ruling party's tenure.

"The army conducts an operation against terrorists, but the civilian government of this area does not fulfil its

responsibility," the minister said.

Commenting on his meetings with Afghan ministers and leaders, the defence minister said that he didn't feel any animosity or hostility against Pakistan during his interaction with the officials from the neighbouring country.

His remarks come as Islamabad has time again called on Kabul's Taliban-led administration to prevent its soil from being used by various terrorist organisations against Pakistan — an allegation Kabul has denied.

Lamenting the country's history of being engaged in wars, Asif said: "General Zia ul Haq and General Pervez Musharraf fought wars to extend their rule. Gen Zia destroyed religion, social structure and society, took the money and became a part of the Afghan war [against Russia]."

"We should take account of ourselves as to why we became a part of two wars. Will our soldiers continue to pay the price of our wrong policies?" the minister noted.

Addressing the issue of mob lynching, he noted that people used blasphemy even in their personal enmity and stressed the need to stand up for the rights of minorities in the country.

"We tabled a resolution in the assembly against the incidents of minorities which was opposed by PTI," he said while referring to a resolution passed by the NA which called on the Centre and the provinces to ensure the complete safety of members of minority communities.

The resolution was tabled after a man was lynched to death in Swat over allegations of desecration of the Holy Quran.

Last month, a Christian man in his seventies was attacked by a mob on charges of desecrating the Holy Quran and later died of his injuries in Sargodha, Punjab.

Meanwhile, over 90 Christian homes and 21 churches were vandalised when hundreds of people rioted through a Christian neighbourhood in Faisalabad's Jaranwala tehsil last year.—RT/Agency

Gandapur Seeks Meeting With Army And ISI Chiefs As PTI Signals Readiness For Talks

PESHAWAR: After Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) signalled to hold dialogues on multiple occasions to end political stability, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur expressed wishes to hold a meeting with the incumbent Chief of Army Staff (COAS) and the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) chief.



CM Gandapur, speaking to journalists in Rawalpindi after meeting incarcerated PTI founder Inran Khan in Adiala Jail on Monday, said that the former prime minister has always offered dialogues.

He expressed sorrow that nobody responded to Khan's call for talks, adding that dialogues were not held with the institutions or the federal government so far.

Reiterating the PTI's conditions for political talks, the KP chief executive said that terms and conditions would be unchanged for the dialogues. He detailed that the former ruling party sought restoration of its stolen mandate and the formation of a probe commission on the May 9 riots.

"I want to meet the army chief and the DG ISI," CM Gandapur said, adding that he met the top military personalities at different events, clarifying that there was no one-on-one meeting held between them.

Criticising the federal government on the newly launched anti-terrorism operation — Azm-e-Istehkam, he claimed that there was no

mention of any kind of [military] operation in the last apex committee meeting.

He admitted that law and order situation and "distribution of prizes" came under discussion and was labelled as "Azm-e-Istehkam" in the top huddle.

CM Gandapur said that he would talk about Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) policies on another occasion whether the operation would be held or not.

He, however, gave credit to the PTI government for improving law and order situation as the former administration strengthened all law enforcement agencies, including the Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD).

Recalling the past developments during the PTI government, he said that former PM Khan visited Afghanistan and held talks with then-president Ashraf Ghani. He added that then-ISI chief Lieutenant General Faiz Hamid remained in contact with the Afghan administration during the three-year tenure of the PTI government. However, then-army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa removed ISI chief Hamid.

He argued that it was necessary to take all provinces and stakeholders in confidence on major decisions.

Commenting on the rise in terrorism incidents, he was of the view that the menace of terrorism was increasing for finding a solution via dialogues. He offered the PTI's support to the federal government "if it is willing to hold talks with Afghanistan".

To a question regarding the KP government's stance on electricity-related issues, CM Gandapur said that his province should not be blamed for the massive line losses. He also blamed the Centre for not disbursing dues worth Rs1,510 billion.

He defended his decisions to take a tough stance against the federal government over loadshedding issues in KP. The chief minister warned the federal authorities again, that they would give a strong "reaction" if their demands were not met.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz and Bill Gates Renew Commitment To Eradicate Polio From Pakistan

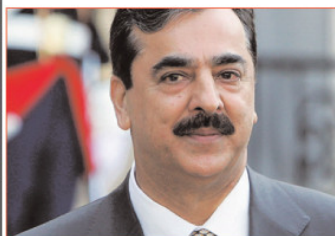
ISLAMABAD: As Pakistan remains in the grip of poliovirus despite the government's rigorous efforts towards eradication of the paralytic disease, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Co-Chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), Bill Gates renewed the pledge to wipe it out of the country. Polio is a highly infectious disease caused by poliovirus mainly affecting children under the age of five years, who are malnourished and have weak immunity because of being under-vaccinated or not vaccinated for polio and other childhood diseases. The illness invades the nervous system and causes paralysis or even death. While there is no cure for polio, vaccination is the most effective way to protect children from this crippling disease. Pakistan is one of two remaining polio-endemic countries in the world, along with Afghanistan and the number of cases on a yearly basis have significantly dropped in the country. The latest diagnosis was reported in Shikarpur on June 1, bringing the toll of polio cases in the Pakistan this year to four. In a meeting with PM Shehbaz Sharif in Islamabad on Monday, Gates expressed his confidence that with a sustained vaccination campaign and firm commitment



of the Pakistani government, polio eradication drive would get back on track to end the crippling disease following the recent surge in environmental detections. He also underscored how Pakistan's deployment of data science tools and digital technology are important resources to continue to improve the lives of the citizens across the country. The visiting dignitary also thanked the premier, who received him at the Prime Minister's House, for his continued dedication and personal interest in eradicating wild polio from the country. Welcoming Gates, PM Shehbaz updated him about the government's efforts to achieve economic stability and key advances in digital financial services, increased health coverage, climate change adaptation and efforts to eradicate poliovirus. He deeply appreciated the Gates Foundation's valuable support for government's initiatives to digitise the economy. Military Operation As Necessary Now As In The Past: Gilani



JHELUM: Senate Chairman Yusuf Raza Gilani on Monday backed the newly announced counterterrorism operation 'Azm-e-Istehkam', saying that military operation to combat terrorism is as necessary as it was in the past, media reported.

Speaking to journalists here, the PPP leader expressed support for the military's actions in Swat and Malakand, saying there was no other option.

Gilani also praised the military's efforts in eliminating terrorism, saying that

nearly two million people affected by military operations are currently living in camps.

The remarks came as opposition parties, including Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), have opposed the Opposition Azm-e-Istehkam, announced by the government to combat terrorism.

The launching of the operation was announced in a meeting of the Central Apex Committee of National Action Plan, which was chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.—RT/Agency

Senate Proposes 128 Recommendations To National Assembly On Finance Bill 2024

ISLAMABAD: The Senate on Monday proposed a total of 128 recommendations including nine about the Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) for the year 2024-25 to the National Assembly for inclusion in the Finance Bill 2024.

The recommendations on the Finance Bill 2024 would be forwarded to the National Assembly which would decide whether or not these recommendations are to be incorporated into the Money Bill.

Out of a total 128, some 69 were related to general recommendations on budget 2024-25, eight to Custom Act, 1969, 23 to Sales Tax Act, 1990, 15 to Income Tax Ordinance, 2001, three to the Federal Excise Act, 2005, and one in Abandoned Properties.

Chairman of the Senate Standing Committee on Finance Saleem Mandviwalla presented the Senate's budget recommendations which were adopted by the House.

Earlier, speaking on the floor of the House, Mandviwalla said that they were given six days instead of 14



to go through the budget document and prepare recommendations for the lower house of the Parliament.

He said that some 32 associations, chambers of commerce from all provinces and members of the civil society including education, medical, retail, automotive and others met the finance committee and gave their feedback.

He went on to say that out of the total Rs18.9 trillion budget, some Rs9.75 trillion were to be paid in interest and debt repayments while Rs2.63 trillion was to be borrowed to make up the budget deficit.

The Senate body's chairman said that 2.9 million non-filers were left at large by the authorities who should

be brought into the tax net to increase revenue instead of burdening the poor masses.

Mandviwalla added the committee unanimously rejected an increased tax on the low-tiered salaried class and also the one imposed on baby milk.

He said for the first time persons with disabilities who served in public departments came to the forum and presented their grievances.

The disabled persons claimed that they were ignored in the budgets passed in the past decade, he said. He said the committee proposed the government to allocate special allowances, negotiate with them and listen to their problems.—RT/Agency

Kundi Urges For Cabinet Meetings On Operation Azm-i-Istehkam To Be Held In Terrorism Hot Zones In KP

ISLAMABAD: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Faisal Karim Kundi on Monday suggested that the federal government hold meetings on counterterrorism with the KP assembly in terrorism hotzones across the province instead of Islamabad.



The federal government on Saturday approved a reinvigorated and re-energised national counter-terrorism campaign, Operation Azm-i-Istehkam, that symbolised the national resolve to eradicate extremism and terrorism from the country.

The campaign was launched with the consensus of all stakeholders, including the provinces, Gilgit-Baltistan and Azad Jammu and Kashmir, during a meeting of the Central Apex Committee on the National Action Plan (NAP), chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

"Azm-i-Istehkam will integrate and synergise multiple lines of effort to combat the menaces of extremism and terrorism in a comprehensive and decisive manner," the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said in a press release.

However, in a parliament session marked by ruckus on Sunday, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif criticised the opposition for not supporting the newly announced counterterrorism operation as the latter demanded that Parliament be taken into confidence before any offensive against militancy was launched. Speaking to the media outside Parliament House in Islamabad the same day, PTI MNA Gohar Khan had said, "It is our demand [..] that if there is any operation — whether intelligence-based or full-fledged or in certain districts or villages or tehsils — it is necessary to take this Parliament into confidence." He had made the remarks while the

National Assembly was in session, saying that the opposition wanted to speak on a point of order that the "military leadership, as has been done in the past, give an in-camera briefing and detail the situation". However, he alleged, that lawmakers from his party were denied the chance to speak and therefore staged a walkout in protest.

Talking to reporters today, KP Governor Kundi said Operation Azm-i-Istehkam was launched following meetings between the federal government and all stakeholders, including the provinces, Azad Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan. "They have all committed and we stand with them and the federal government," Kundi said.—RT/Agency

GB Government Unveils Rs1.4 Trillion Budget For 2024-25 Including Wheat Subsidy



GILGIT: The Gilgit-Baltistan government on Monday unveiled a budget worth Rs1,402 trillion for the upcoming fiscal year 2024-25.

Presenting the budget in the provincial assembly, GB Finance Minister Engineer Ismail said that an amount of Rs86.6 billion was allocated for non-development expenditures and Rs34.5 billion for development projects.

"The development budget includes Rs20 billion for the annual development programme and Rs13.5 billion for the federal government projects," he said.

The minister said in order to provide relief to the GB people, a significant amount of Rs19.07 billion was earmarked for wheat subsidy.

In the financial plan for FY25, the education sector got an allocation of Rs1.37 billion, Rs1.52 billion for health sector, Rs597.9 million for agriculture depart-

ment, Rs998 million for food department and Rs110 million for mineral resources department.

The finance minister said that Rs1,728 billion has been earmarked for irrigation department, Rs1,524 billion for forestry and environment department, Rs1.19 billion for rural development department and Rs1,316 billion for information technology department.

Moreover technical education department Rs 7.763 billion, social welfare department Rs 3.632 billion, power department Rs 2.88 billion, communication department Rs 5.63 billion, and information department Rs 41.4 million.

Additionally, Rs536.8 million was specified for the prison department, Rs192.6 million for law department and Rs57.4 million for excise and taxation department.—RT/Agency

PML-N Leader Warns Mohammad Zubair Of Consequences Following Claims Of Nawaz's Meeting With Bajwa

LAHORE: On levelling allegations of former prime minister Nawaz Sharif's meeting with former chief of army staff General (retired) Qamar Javed Bajwa ahead of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government's ouster, Punjab Assembly Speaker Malik Ahmad on Monday warned legal action could be taken against ex-Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leader Mohammad Zubair.



Addressing media in Lahore, Ahmad said he did not expect Zubair to issue such a statement. He alleged that the former Sindh governor had said an unfounded thing upon which he could face legal consequences.

Talking with a TV channel, Zubair, who recently quit the PML-N, mentioned about the PTI government's ouster from power in 2022. The politico claimed Nawaz met

Bajwa in London, before the vote of no confidence was moved against the then prime minister Inran Khan.

Dismissing the former PML-N leader's claim, he said Zubair had stated a lie about the PML-N president's meeting with Bajwa in London. He could put himself into trouble for speaking such a thing, Ahmad said.

"Zubair should reveal details about Nawaz-Bajwa meeting. When did it take place and where," he asked,

adding no engagement or meeting of a leader of Nawaz's stature could remain secret. "What to talk of Nawaz's meeting with Bajwa, they even did not speak on phone," he said.

PTI's demand for constitution of a commission to probe the former Sindh governor's statement, the Punjab Assembly speaker said before going towards a judicial commission. Zubair should apprise when the meeting took place.—RT/Agency
