Bilawal Claims Budget Drafted By Bureaucrats Without Any Political Input

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari on Tuesday reiterated the taking political input in the budget 2024-25 proposals for it to achieve targets.

"If there is no political input, your budget will not work. The relief you want to give to the people won't be possible. The ground realities that you [politicians across the board] know, none of the 'babu' in Islamabad know about them," he said while speaking during the National Assembly session.

"Without political input, the budget will be the babus, for the babus and of the babus. And we want to end this tradition," said the PPP chairman.

The PPP, which is the main ally of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), continued to raise objections for not taking it into confidence regarding the federal budget for the upcoming fiscal year starting July 1.

Both the parties held several rounds of talks during which the PPP shared its grievances with the Shehbaz



Sharif-led party. A day earlier, sources said the PML-N accepted all demands of its major ally.

Bilawal, during the NA session, said that a politician would never suggest taxing milk or stationary in a country with 40% stunting rate and where 26 million children are out of school, but this would be a "babu's" suggestion.

The politician said he hopes that Prime Minister Shehbaz and his team will be able to get Pakistan out of trouble. "The government has managed to slightly decrease the inflation," he said. The PPP chairman said that they have so far failed in

Operation Azm-e-Istehkam To Energize IBOs Without Displacing Locals: Shehbaz

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday ruling out any large-scale military operation said that Azm-e-Istehkam was a multi-domain, multi-agency and whole of system national vision aimed at decisively rooting out the nebulous and shadowy presence of remnants of terrorists, and violent extremism.

The prime minister, chairing a meeting of the federal cabinet, took the members into confidence about the prevailing misunderstanding and speculations about the Azm-e-Istehkam, saying that instead of any large-scale operation, the already ongoing intelligence based kinetic operations would be energized.

In his remarks, he told the members that no additional duty would be imposed on the solar panels to ensure the accessibility of low-cost solar energy to every citizen.

He said the government was planning to put the national economy on a positive trajectory and expressed sat-

isfaction over the country heading towards economic stability. The prime minister reiterated the resolve to boost the country's exports by promoting Small and Medium Enterprises and withdrawing privileges from the elite class and those exploiting the national resources. The economic protection of the common man and providing them equal opportunities were among the government's priorities, he added.

Gandapur and Shibli Advise PTI Leaders To Await Details Of Military Operation

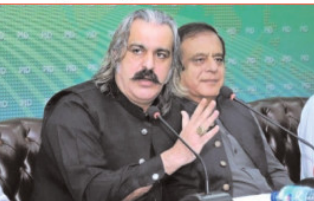
ISLAMABAD: In a high-level Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) meeting, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, PTI leaders Shibli Faraz and Barrister Saif advised party leaders to wait for particulars of the newly-announced military operation to come out before taking any decision.

Sources told media that the meeting at the KP House, Islamabad, was given a briefing on the National Action Plan's Apex Committee meeting and also on meeting with the incarcerated PTI founder, Imran Khan.

Gandapur, who attended the Apex Committee meeting as his province's representative, apprised that the forum only discussed about security issues and stability in Pakistan.

He briefed the meeting for 35 minutes, wherein he presented his arguments supporting his stance of waiting for details of the operation Azm-e-Istehkam, but majority of the party members did not agree to him, the sources maintained.

During a meeting of the Apex Committee, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif last Saturday gave the go-ahead to operation Azm-e-Istehkam, a reintegrated and

re-energised national counter-terrorism drive, to turn up the heat on militants targeting the state of Pakistan.

The Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said the new counter-terrorism push has been approved with the consensus of all stakeholders including provinces, Gilgit Baltistan (GB) and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK).

"The approval of the operation symbolises the national resolve to eradicate all forms of extremism and terrorism from the country," the PMO said. The opposition parties including the PTI, Jamiat-e-Ulema Islam Fazi (JUI-F), Awami National Party (ANP) and others have voiced concerns over the launch of the new military operation, demanding that parliament must be taken into confi-

IHC Dismisses Case Against Sheikh Rashid Over Alleged Use Of 'Immoral' Language



ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday dismissed a case filed against Awami Muslim League (AML) chief Sheikh Rashid pertaining to his using "immoral" language against Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.

A case was registered in February last year against Rashid for using offensive words against the foreign minister. The FIR was registered by Karachi's Mochko police station on a complaint from a local PML leader.

The former federal minister, according to the first information report, made "immoral" and "nasty" comments which infuriated the public and created a law and order situation in the city.

IHC Justice Tariq Mehmoood Jahangiri announced the verdict approving Awami Muslim League (AML) chief Sheikh Rashid's plea seeking the dismissal of the case lodged at Mochko Police Station against him. Rashid in person was present in the courtroom to hear the judgement.—RT/Agency

Dar Highlights Benefits Of Peaceful, Stable Afghanistan For Both Countries

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar has said that a peaceful, stable Afghanistan would benefit both countries and promote prosperity in Central Asia and beyond.

Speaking at the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad on Tuesday, he highlighted the importance of dialogue, the avoidance of bloc politics, and adherence to the UN Charter.

He emphasised Pakistan's commitment to maintaining peaceful, cooperative, and good neighborly relations with all countries, despite facing challenges and setbacks in certain instances. IHC stressed Pakistan's focus on economic development and regional peace, particularly with Afghanistan and India, advocating for stability in South Asia.

He highlighted Pakistan's cooperation with Afghanistan since the Taliban takeover in August 2021 to avert a humanitarian crisis and support the Afghan people. He further maintained that Afghan soil must not be used for terrorism against any state and urged Afghan authorities to address its concerns.

The foreign minister expressed Pakistan's desire for good relations with India based on mutual respect, sovereignty equality, and a peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, rejecting unilateral approaches or attempts at hegemony.

"We will maintain strategic stability in South Asia and respond decisively to any ill-considered military actions by the Hinduva-driven government in New Delhi," he added. Regarding the new term of the BJP-led NDA government in India, Dar called for reflection on India-Pakistan relations and regional issues. He criticised India's unilateral actions on August 5, 2019, in Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, stating they harmed bilateral relations.

Deputy PM urged India to create an environment conducive to meaningful dialogue, end its smear campaign, cease state-sponsored terrorism in Pakistan, and take concrete steps for positive relations. He noted that South Asian nations must address poverty and low human development rankings and lamented the stalled progress of the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation due to one member state's obstinacy.—RT/Agency

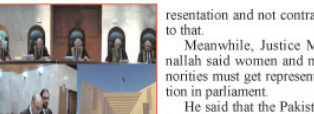
Allocation Of Reserved Seats Must Follow Principle Of Proportional Representation: SC Justice Ayesha Malik

ISLAMABAD: Supreme Court of Pakistan's Justice Ayesha A Malik on Tuesday said that the reserved seats cannot be allocated contrary to the principle of proportional representation.

Justice Malik made these comments during the hearing on the petition filed by the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC), the ally of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), against the denial of reserved seats for women and minorities.

A 13-member full court, headed by Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa, heard the matter.

The bench comprises Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Muneeb Akhtar, Justice Yahya Afridi, Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail,

Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Malik, Justice Athar Minallah, Justice Syed Hassan Azhar Rizvi, Justice Shahid Waheed, Justice Irfan Saadat Khan and Justice Naeem Akhtar Afghan.

"Whether SIC wins or loses this case, what will other parties benefit from it?" questioned Justice Ayesha during the hearing today, noting that the reserved seats can only be allotted on the principle of proportional rep-

resentation and not contrary to that.

Meanwhile, Justice Minallah said women and minorities must get representation in parliament.

He said that the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) were affected earlier but the SC did not come forward to help.

"The same is happening as it did in 2018. One party is the victim," said Justice Minallah, adding that the court did not learn from its history. The judge added that there would surely come a time in the future when the Supreme Court will regret its decision again. The hearing of the case has been adjourned till 11:30am on Thursday.—RT/Agency

PM Assures Tangible Results Soon From Government's Cost-Cutting Measures

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif addressed the National Assembly on Tuesday, outlining his government's efforts to curb expenditures and combat corruption.

During the session, he announced the abolishment of the Pakistan Public Works Department, citing pervasive corruption within its development budget.

He disclosed the formation of a rightsizing committee, led by Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb, tasked with streamlining government operations and delivering substantial outcomes by the specified timeline.

Emphasising his administration's commitment to regional development, the premier underscored initiatives aimed at uplifting southern Punjab. He noted that the PML-N-led government has consistently allocated budgets

and employment opportunities exceeding the region's population ratio. PM Shehbaz stated that specific measures included a 10% increase in allocation for southern Punjab under national schemes such as the laptop distribution and PM Rozgar schemes.

He added that the Zewar Taleem Programme saw a significant rise in stipends for female students, from Rs200 to Rs1000. Furthermore, the PM highlighted federal investments in major infrastructure

projects across southern Punjab, including the Lodhran-Khanewal Motorway and the Dera Ghazi Khan-Muzaffargarh Motorway.

Responding to opposition concerns, he highlighted the imminent results of these initiatives, expected to manifest within approximately six weeks.

The PM's address comes amid heightened scrutiny over government spending and efforts to enhance transparency and efficiency in public administration.—RT/Agency

Nawabshah's Deputy Commissioner Chairs Meeting To Prepare For Upcoming Monsoon Rains

NAWABSHAH: Deputy Commissioner Gul Memon presided over a crucial meeting at his office to assess the readiness of drains and canals ahead of the upcoming monsoon rains, aiming to ensure efficient water drainage during the rainy season. The meeting focused on proactive measures to safeguard residents and farmers from potential flood risks exacerbated by climate change. Deputy Commissioner Memon directed officials from the LBOD (Left Bank Outfall Drain) to develop comprehensive plans for water drainage, taking into account forecasts of above-average rainfall. Emphasis was placed on maintaining cleanliness at drainage points and ensuring uninterrupted electricity supply at pumping stations. Immediate actions were mandated to swiftly drain rainwater from Nawabshah city, surrounding areas, and the airport. Furthermore, a request will be submitted to the PDMA (Provincial Disaster Management Authority) for urgent deployment of machinery to channel rain-

water into the Indus River from Qazi Ahmed, Daur, and nearby regions. Sinjhor's Junejo community demands justice in land dispute

Despite reporting the incident to the police, no action was taken against the

influential individuals involved. The Solangi family accused the Sanghar police of being influenced and claimed they received threats from the authorities. They further alleged that certain political figures were orchestrating the situation and pressuring the police to arrest them. The aggrieved party is demanding justice for the assault on their women and the perceived incompetence of the Sanghar police. They warned that if justice is not served, they would escalate their protests by blocking roads and staging further demonstrations.

4 Hindu families leave Pakistan due to growing lawlessness and inflation

JACOBABAD: Amid worsening law and order conditions, rising inflation, and increasing unemployment in Pakistan, four Hindu families from Jacobabad have made the difficult decision to migrate to India. The families of Hindu businessmen Kishore Singh, Anop Singh, Kirpal Singh, and Sunny Kumar departed for India via the Jaffar Express, intending to cross the Wagah border from Lahore. Over the past two weeks, a total of 24 families from

Jacobabad have relocated to India, citing similar reasons of deteriorating living conditions. At the railway station, Anop Singh, one of the migrants, spoke to journalists about the hardships they faced in leaving behind their homeland, homes, and businesses. He explained that despite their deep roots in Sindh, the current circumstances, including violence, inflation, and unemployment, had become unbearable. Singh expressed sorrow over the decision to leave, emphasizing that they had endured significant hardships before finally opting to seek refuge in India. The families had been part of the fabric of Sindh for over a century, but the escalating challenges forced them to depart, seeking better prospects and security across the border. The departure of these Hindu families underscores the impact of socio-economic challenges on minority communities in Pakistan, prompting calls for improved conditions and security measures to safeguard all citizens.

Karachi, Pakistan's largest city, is no stranger to crises. However, the recent spate of deaths is a glaring testament to the deep-seated neglect and chaos that plague our governance.

Pakistan is already burdened with countless problems, and it is only a matter of time before this continual disregard for human life leads to an explosive situation. The government must act decisively and urgently to address these issues, not only to prevent further loss of life but to restore a semblance of trust and responsibility in its governance.

After England and South Africa, India became the third team to qualify for the T20 World Cup semi-final on Monday. The Men in Blue beat Australia by 24 runs in their recent match.

On the other side, Afghanistan beat Bangladesh by 8 runs (DLS method) in the final Super 8 match of the tournament on Tuesday to qualify for the final four.

For the first time in history, the Rashid Khan-led unit have qualified for the semi-finals of a World Cup.

Bangladesh were bowled out for 105 in 17.5 overs while chasing a target of 116 runs, which was later reduced to 114 in 19 overs due to rain.

Wasim Akram explains why Indian team should visit Pakistan for Champions Trophy 2025

KARACHI: Former Pakistan cricket captain Wasim Akram has expressed hope that the Indian team will visit Pakistan for the 2025 ICC Champions Trophy.

"I believe the Indian team will tour Pakistan next year for the Champions Trophy and witness the excellent arrangements," Akram said during an interview with an international media outlet.

He praised PCB Chairman Mohsin Naqvi's efforts to upgrade stadiums for the mega event, calling it a positive step.

Akram emphasised that Pakistan needs this tournament to boost its cricketing profile. "I hope all countries will participate because cricket and politics are entirely different. The whole nation is ready to host eight major teams," he added.



The 2025 Champions Trophy is scheduled to take place between February and mid-March, featuring 15 matches. The Indian team is expected to play all its matches in Lahore.

This tournament marks the return of the Champions Trophy after an eight-year hiatus. Pakistan won the last edition in 2017 under Sarfraz Ahmed's leadership, defeating India in the final.

The ICC has confirmed the participation of eight teams: Pakistan (host), India, South Africa, Australia, New Zealand, Afghanistan, England, and Bangladesh.

Pakistan and India have not played a bilateral series since 2013. The Indian team last toured Pakistan for the 2008 Asia Cup.—Agency

Rashid Khan becomes fastest bowler to take 150 T20I wickets



NEW YORK: Afghanistan spin wizard Rashid Khan Tuesday added another feather in his cap by becoming the first bowler to grab 150 wickets in less than 100 T20 international matches.

The Afghanistan skipper became the fastest bowler to take 150 T20I wickets in 89 matches, achieving a historic feat.

The only other bowler to reach this milestone is New Zealand's Tim Southee who bagged 150 wickets in 118 matches. Which means there are just two such bowlers in T20I yet.

Bangladesh's Shakib Al Hasan is one wicket short of joining the club though. He has played 129 T20I matches.

David Warner quietly concludes illustrious international cricket career

SYDNEY: Australian opener David Warner bid farewell to his 15-year international cricket career after Afghanistan bagged a victory over Bangladesh in the ongoing T20 World Cup 2024 on Tuesday, eliminating the Kangaroos from the tournament.

The decision comes as Afghanistan's latest victory marked Australia's exit from the tournament in the Super 8 stage, confirming a subdued farewell for Warner.

With appearances in 110 T20I matches, the 37-year-old opening batsman scored 3,277 runs, including a century and 28 half-centuries, at a formidable strike-rate of 142.47.

He had already announced that the T20 World Cup 2024 would be his last tournament and had played his final ODI in November's World Cup final win over India while his



last Test was against Pakistan in January.

Before Afghanistan's match against Bangladesh, pacer Josh Hazlewood had stated that the timing of Warner's send-off from his teammates would rely on the result of the same match.

"Nothing's been said yet," Hazlewood said. "It might be said after this [press conference] before the [evening] game, but I think we'll wait until after the game and then we'll [acknowledge] the career that's been. It's been unbelievable. We'll definitely miss him around the group, out in the field and off-field — an amazing all-format cricketer."

"I'm very proud of my players and the country. It's the second time we've played this competition and I've said before and I'm very happy with the country, the federation and the fans," Sylvinho told reporters.

"People would have thought Italy and Croatia would have scored four and five against us but my players believed in the work we were doing."

"We managed to compete against three great national teams, teams that play in quarter-finals and semi-finals." Albania have never played in a World Cup but Sylvinho said that the country is ready for a serious qualification bid for the next tournament which is being held in the USA, Canada and Mexico in 2026.

"The objective of the Albania FA is to do just that, keep playing in important tournaments, to keep improving. We have the right tools for that," added Sylvinho.

"They left everything out on the pitch and they will remember this for the rest of their lives. The next time they come out to play this will be very valuable experience. This is gold for my players, for everybody."—Agency

Government Launches Probe Into Mysterious Deaths



KARACHI: Media reports on Tuesday confirmed that Sindh's Interior Minister has directed an immediate investigation into the series of 'mysterious deaths' occurring in Karachi.

Expressing profound sorrow and concern over these incidents, Interior Minister Zia-ul-Hassan Lanjar has mandated a thorough inquiry to uncover the causes behind these deaths. "K-Electric will be held accountable if prolonged load shedding is found to be a significant factor," stated the minister, emphasizing potential consequences for KE administrators and responsible individuals implicated in the inquiry.

Earlier today, the discovery of additional bodies in

various parts of Karachi marked the third consecutive day of such incidents. Rescue officials located bodies on footpaths in Manghopir, Orangi Town, and Gulshan-e-Maymar areas. Among them, the body of 50-year-old Munawar was recovered from Orangi No. 12 and transferred to a hospital, while details regarding the identities and causes of death of the other victims remain undisclosed.

Efforts are actively underway to identify the deceased individuals and ascertain the circumstances surrounding their untimely deaths. Rescue operations and investigations continue to be closely monitored as the situation unfolds.—RT/Agency

PTI Leader Blames Heatwave And Load Shedding For 427 Deaths In Karachi

KARACHI: Rizwan Niazi, Additional General Secretary of PTI Sindh, expressed grave concern on Tuesday over the reported death toll of 427 people in Karachi over the past four days. He attributed these fatalities to the severe heatwave and what he described as the city's worst-ever load shedding.

In a statement from Media Cell Haleem Adil Sheikh, Niazi highlighted the unbearable conditions faced by

KARACHI: Haleem Adil Sheikh, President of PTI Sindh, has raised serious concerns in a letter to the Chief Secretary Sindh regarding recent damages to gates 47 and 44 of the Sukkur Barrage. According to a statement issued by PTI Sindh today, national media and official notifications have highlighted the damages, which have necessitated the closure of several linked canals including Nara, Rohri, Khanpur East, Khanpur West, Daud, Rice, and Kirthar canal. This has severely impacted agricultural

lands spanning 8 million acres in Sindh, causing widespread water scarcity across all districts, particularly affecting farmers who recently sowed paddy crop seeds. Sheikh pointed out that the crisis poses a significant threat to upcoming crops such as paddy, cotton, and sugarcane, with billions of rupees worth of seeds at risk of drying up due to the delays in repairs and inadequate communication from concerned authorities. He alleged negligence on the part of the Irrigation Department, suggesting that the damages

may have been intentional for personal gain, jeopardizing both farmers' livelihoods and the provincial economy. Despite numerous meetings, Sheikh criticized the lack of concrete actions taken so far and stressed the urgent need for accountability. He demanded an immediate inquiry into the incident, calling for the suspension of all involved officers and the resignation of the Minister of Irrigation. Additionally, he proposed the establishment of a judicial commission to prevent similar incidents in the future.—RT/Agency

Budget FY25 Targets Fiscal Deficit Reduction: Aurangzeb

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb has said that the budget for the next fiscal year was aimed at narrowing the fiscal deficit by expanding the government's revenues and cutting unnecessary expenditures.

Concluding the discussion on the budget 2024-25 in the National Assembly on Tuesday, he said that, following the prime minister's directives, the emphasis on simplicity and austerity would continue into the next fiscal year.

The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led coalition government is striving to meet the prerequisites for an additional—longer and larger—International Monetary Fund (IMF) programme, by setting a high tax revenue target taking a shot at lowering the fiscal deficit from 7.4% to 5.9%.

It is believed that streamlining the tax collection processes and broadening the tax base would help achieve these fiscal targets.

Pakistan has set a challenging tax revenue target of Rs13 trillion for the year starting July 1, a near 40% jump from the current year to strengthen the case for a new bailout deal with the



lender of the last resort. The ambitious revenue targets are in line with analyst expectations.

The finance czar mentioned that a committee headed by him, had been formed to present recommendations, including the closure or merger of ministries and their devolution to the provinces.

He announced that future pension expenditures would be reduced through pension reforms.

Senator Aurangzeb highlighted that the home-grown reforms programme formed the basis of next year's budget to navigate the country through its challenging economic situation.

He said the reforms included increasing the tax-to-GDP ratio to 13%, state-owned enterprises (SOE)

and education sectors, including skills development.

He appreciated the recommendations submitted by the Senate for inclusion in next year's budget. He said the government had decided to incorporate these recommendations, considering the public interest.

These proposals included providing an opportunity for non-filers to have a personal hearing before measures such as SIM blockage and a ban on foreign travel were implemented.

In the Finance Bill 2024, the government has proposed to ban non-filers from traveling overseas and block their SIM cards, aiming to encourage citizens to use formal channels—a move that has sparked a debate over its practicality.

He announced that stationary items would remain exempt from tax and that the current reduced rates for hybrid-electric vehicles would remain unchanged.

Under the Export Facilitation Scheme 2021 policy, he said, zero-rating for local suppliers was not being abolished.

The finance minister emphasised that the agriculture, education, and health sectors had been prioritised, while proposals such as exempting

charity hospitals from sales tax would be given serious consideration.

The former banker noted that the government was fast-tracking reforms in the FBR, with seven billion rupees allocated in the budget for this purpose.

He said action would be taken from July 1st against retailers who failed to register with the FBR Tajir Dost Scheme.

Regarding the defence budget, the finance minister acknowledged the immense sacrifices made by the armed forces in defending the country and their readiness to meet internal and external threats.

He emphasised that national security was the foremost priority and assured that the armed forces would be provided with the necessary resources.

The finance minister announced honoraria equivalent to three months' basic pay for various departments, including the staff of the National Assembly, Senate, Press Information Department (PID), Radio Pakistan, Pakistan Television (PTV), and Associated Press of Pakistan (APP), who performed duties in the Parliament House during the budget session.—RT/Agency

Cabinet Decides Against Imposing Additional Duty On Solar Panels

ISLAMABAD: After speculated changes in net metering and new taxes on solar products raised many eyebrows, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has clarified that the federal government will not impose additional duties on solar panels to ensure the accessibility of low-cost energy to every citizen.

The clarification came after the federal government signalled to replace solar net metering with "gross metering" while some reports suggested that new taxes would be introduced on solar products which would extensively reduce the financial benefits of in-house power generation.

PM Shehbaz said the "government is planning to put the national economy on a positive trajectory" and expressed satisfaction over the country heading towards economic stability.

He made these remarks while chairing the federal cabinet meeting in Islamabad on Tuesday in a set of key decisions.

The premier reiterated the resolve to boost the country's exports by promoting Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) and withdrawing privileges from the elite class and those exploiting the national resources.

The economic protection of the common man and providing them equal opportunities were among the government's priorities, he added.



Discussing the annual budget 2024-25, the premier instructed the members to ensure their presence in the ongoing budget debate in the parliament.

During the briefing, the cabinet members were informed that the privatisation of the PIA was moving ahead swiftly as companies showing interest in the pre-bidding process were visiting different airlines' sites. The bidding of the national flag carrier will be held in the first week of August, it was told.

He instructed to accelerate the PIA privatisation while ensuring transparency in the process.

During the briefing on the Economic Coordination Committee's decision, the cabinet meeting was told that the country had sufficient stock of sugar available and the Sugar Advisory Board and relevant departments had approved exporting the leftover stock of sugar after taking into account the expected consumption before the next crushing season and assessing the surplus stock.

The body gave the go-ahead to the signing of a MoU between the Ministry of Religious Affairs of Pakistan and Saudi Arabia. It also extended till March 2025 the timeframe of an implementation committee on the immovable property of the late Ameer of Bahawalpur in light of the Supreme Court's ruling and recommendation of the States and Frontier Regions Division.—RT/Agency

Asif Vows To Remove PTI's Reservations Regarding Anti-Militancy Operation

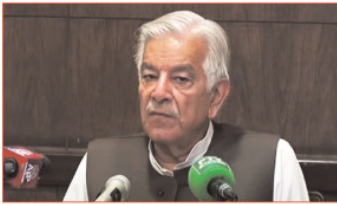
ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif said Tuesday that the federal government would ensure to provide satisfactory answers to the concerns of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) over a newly announced anti-militancy operation, Azm-e-Istehkam.

The minister, while addressing journalists during a presser in Lahore, said that the proposal for launching the operation would be presented before the federal cabinet today, following which, it will be laid before the parliament.

"We will create a consensus among the [parties]. The opposition parties and allies. We will give them ample time to discuss this issue. Whatever their questions or concerns, it will be responded to in a satisfying manner."

The government had, last week, announced a fresh counter-terrorism operation, pledging to utilise the full strength of the country's resources, including military, diplomatic, and legislative, to turn the heat up on militants.

In response, PTI, Jamiat-e-Ulema Islam Fazi (JUI-F), Awami National Party (ANP), and others voiced concerns over the new military operation, demanding that parliament must be taken



into confidence before taking any such decision and that they opposed the operation.

Following much criticism, the federal government issued a policy statement, saying that "no large-scale military operation is being launched" in the country.

"The recently announced vision for enduring stability named Azm-e-Istehkam is being erroneously misunderstood and compared with earlier launched kinetic operations like Zarb-e-Azab, Rah-e-Najata etc.," a statement from the Prime Minister's Office said.

During the presser, the minister said several operations have been conducted against terrorism in the past and a new operation will be launched now.

On the opposition's resistance to the idea, he said that the four chief ministers were present in the apex committee meeting, and none of

them opposed the operation. Khawaja added that the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur did not disagree. He, in fact, said "We will support this action," in hushed words.

"This operation has no political ambitions," said the minister, emphasising that the government wants to fight the rising tide of terrorism. All must support operation Azm-e-Istehkam, he added.

He insisted that since the National Action Plan was formulated after the Army Public School (APS) incident, the situation is very different today compared to what it was like back then.

"Terrorists had occupied the areas of FATA. The areas of FATA had become no-go areas, this is not the case today," he said, adding: "The [government's] write is established in these areas today."—RT/Agency

Zubair Acknowledges Lack Of Authentic Information On Nawaz-Bajwa Meeting



ISLAMABAD: Former Punjab governor and ex-Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leader Muhammad Zubair has backed track from his earlier claim and has said that he has no authentic information about the alleged meeting between Nawaz Sharif and former army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa. Speaking to media, the former spokesperson said, the former spokesperson for the ex-PM and his daughter Maryam Nawaz clarified that his comments regarding the said meeting were in fact speculative and were not facts that he could say under oath. He explained that he was responding to a speculative query by sharing the rumours circulating at the time. Zubair emphasised that he also mentioned during the talk show that he could not confirm the speculated Nawaz-Bajwa meeting.

All Reservations Of PPP Addressed, Will Join Cabinet After Consultations: Gilani

JHELUM: Senate Chairman and senior Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) leader Yusuf Raza Gilani has said that the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) has addressed all of their reservations on various issues, media reported on Tuesday.

Speaking to journalists in Jhelum, Gilani said that the PPP would decide on joining the federal cabinet after consultations with the party as currently, they are working to strengthen the government to control the economic situation.

The former prime minister's remarks come in administrative posts in Punjab, the sources said.

The PPP has demanded the appointment of an additional secretary in the chief minister secretariat whose job would be to resolve the issues faced by the party only, they said.

The Punjab government would appoint district deputy commissioners, district police officers and revenue officers in consultation with the PPP in the areas where the political party has significant support, the sources said.

Sources said 12 such districts were pointed out including Multan, Muzaffargarh, Rahim Yar Khan, Rawalpindi and Rajanpur. The PPP would be consulted in the appointment of a district officer in these areas, the sources added. On the other hand, the PPP offered to appoint district officers of PML-N's choice in Sindh areas despite the ruling party not having a representation there. Furthermore, commenting on the political polarisation on various issues, Gilani said that all political parties including the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) were united on the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project. He also backed the government's newly announced anti-terror drive "Operation Azm-e-Istehkam" stressing that combating terrorism was as necessary today as it was in the past.—RT/Agency



PTI Continues Opposition To 'Azm-e-Istehkam' Operation, Citing Affordability Concerns

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) lawmakers while maintaining their stance against Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, argued that the country cannot sustain more military operations for stabilisation.

Speaking outside the Election Commission Pakistan (ECP) on Tuesday, PTI leaders reiterated their opposition against the newly approved military operation.

They argued that military operations would disproportionately impact Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) and Balochistan.

"Investment isn't coming because there's no rule of law," they claimed, challenging the necessity of military action.

PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan called for immediate justice and the release of former premier Imran Khan and other party members.

He condemned their re-arrests as human rights violations.



"When justice is delayed, it is also injustice," he stated, demanding the PTI chief's immediate release.

Gohar said that the party protested from Parliament all the way to the ECP during today's budget session. "This isn't just a walk of 180 parliamentarians, but of 30 million voters," Gohar maintained. "Our protest will continue until all our members are freed," he affirmed. "Any decision must be brought to the house. This country cannot afford any operation for stability. Stability requires

rightful representation in the assembly," he said, declaring the party's firm stance against the operation. The lawmakers highlighted that PTI conducted three intra-party elections in the last 18 months, contrasting with other parties. "We will not accept double standards in this country," they said. On June 23, PTI and Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) declared their refusal to support any military operation, demanding that military leadership take Parliament into confidence first.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz Government Extends Olive Branch To Modi Government

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Tuesday said it does not believe in "perpetual hostility" with India, urging the BJP-led government to do a "sober reflection" on the future of ties between the two nuclear-armed neighbours.

In a policy statement delivered at the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI), Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar said Pakistan always sought "good neighbourly relations" with India.

"To our east, the relationship with India has historically remained troubled. Pakistan does not believe in perpetual hostility. We seek good-neighbourly relations with India on the basis of mutual respect, sovereignty, equality, and a just and peaceful resolution of the long-standing Jammu and Kashmir dispute," Dar said.

He said while Pakistan had always been receptive to constructive engagement through dialogue that in-



cludes all outstanding issues, Pakistan would never agree to unilateral approaches or attempts to impose India's will or hegemony. "We will also take every step needed to maintain strategic stability in South Asia and would respond effectively and decisively to any ill-considered military misadventure by the 'Hindutva' driven dispensation in New Delhi," he added.

In our view, as the BJP-led NDA government starts a new term, it is time for a sober reflection on the future of India-Pakistan relations and the cross-cutting issues affecting the entire region," the foreign minister further said.—RT/Agency

Court Reserves Verdict On Suspension Of Sentence In Bushra Bibi's Iddat Case

ISLAMABAD: A district and sessions court Tuesday reserved its verdict on pleas filed by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi seeking suspension of their sentence in the iddat case.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC), earlier this month, had directed the district court to decide the pleas seeking the suspension of the sentence of former prime minister Khan and his wife Bushra within 10 days.

The court had also given one month's time for the decision on the petition filed by the couple against their conviction.

The IHC's orders came after the couple had filed multiple petitions with the ex-premier seeking the announcement of the district and sessions court's reserved verdict and had further requested the high court to hear the appeals in the said case.

Meanwhile, Bushra had sought a decision on her plea filed in the sessions court seeking sentence suspension.



February and imposed a fine of Rs500,000 each on the duo.

Khan and Bushra had then filed various appeals including the ones against their conviction and those seeking suspension of their sentences.

Judge Shahrukh Arjumand had reserved the verdict on their appeals challenging their conviction on May 23.

However, in light of Maneka's repeated expression of no-confidence, the IHC, on Judge Arjumand's request, then transferred the case to the court of Additional District and Sessions Judge Muhammad Afzal Jukka.—RT/Agency
