## Government Authorizes Joint Ventures To Facilitate Relocation Of Chinese Industries To Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday permitted joint ventures (JVs) between the two nations to relocate Chinese industries to Pakistan, as part of its efforts to fire up the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) activities following his recent engagements with top officials from Beijing, state media reported.



Presiding over a meeting centred on the matters of the Board of Investment (BoI), the premier underscored the government's commitment to fostering both local and foreign investment, which he said were among the government's priorities.

Minister Shehbaz in Beijing on June 7 had said that their two countries should focus on "promoting the joint construction of the CPEC," and Chinese and Pakistani firms 31 MoUs covering technology, agriculture, trade, energy, coal and gasification, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

The meeting was attended by Federal Minister for Privatisation and Investment Abdul Aleem Khan, Federal Minister for Commerce Jam Kamal, Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue Muhammad Aurangzeb, Federal Minister for Petroleum Dr Musadik Malik, Prime Minister's Coordinator Rana Ehsan Afzal, and other senior government officials.

During the meeting, he spotlighted the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led administration's contributions towards creating a truly business-friendly environment for traders and investors.

The premier also called for a review of the draft legislation for the Special Economic Zones (SEZs) One-Stop Shop, keeping in view the latest economic and business-related developments from his successful China trip.

Moreover, the draft "Easy Business Act" is being forwarded to the Cabinet Committee for Legislative Cases. The meeting was attended by Federal Minister for Privatisation and Investment Abdul Aleem Khan, Federal Minister for Commerce Jam Kamal, Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue Muhammad Aurangzeb, Federal Minister for Petroleum Dr Musadik Malik, Prime Minister's Coordinator Rana Ehsan Afzal, and other senior government officials.

The prime minister, according to state-run APP, tasked the authorities to submit a detailed report on the follow-up actions related to the memoranda of understanding (MoUs) inked between Pakistani and Chinese companies during his recent visit to Shenzhen, China.

Highlighting the potential for relocating industries, the PM identified significant potential for China's textile, leather, footwear, and other sectors to move to Pakistan, as per the state media.

## Pakistan Calls US Resolution On Alleged Poll Irregularities Misinformed

ISLAMABAD: In response to a resolution passed by the United States House of Representatives on alleged poll irregularities in Pakistan's nationwide general election 2024, the Foreign Office (FO) has said that it "stems from an incomplete understanding of the political situation and electoral process in Pakistan".

## Sindh Government Implements Comprehensive HIV Prevention and Treatment Measures

KARACHI: The Government of Sindh is actively addressing the HIV epidemic with extensive measures aimed at prevention and treatment across the province. These efforts include widespread HIV screening, inaugurating new treatment centers, and digitalizing existing facilities for enhanced efficiency, all verified by the Global Fund.

In addition, the Sindh Healthcare Commission has been directed to crack down on quackery and ensure safe disposal of needles, while awareness campaigns educate communities on preventive measures. Early HIV detection through screening is crucial for prompt treatment and reducing transmission.

Efforts also extend to tracking and treating patients regardless of their location, complemented by educational programs in schools and communities. Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) is being promoted to reduce infection risks among high-risk populations, with mobile health units deployed to underserved areas for testing, treatment, and education.

The government seeks media support to raise awareness responsibly, emphasizing that cases are not clustered but tracked effectively. Collaborations with local and international organizations strengthen resources and expertise in combating HIV.

Psychosocial support services are provided to patients and families, acknowledging the importance of capacity building for healthcare providers in updated HIV treatment protocols. From January to June 2024, Sindh reported 1,453 new HIV cases, including 169 children. Addressing recent concerns in Mirpur Khas, where 24 cases were reported, the government assures that all cases are registered and managed, with ongoing efforts to locate and treat affected individuals.

With 3,072 screenings conducted in Mirpur Khas yielding 5 new positive cases, efforts continue to mitigate HIV spread. Stigma reduction remains crucial to encouraging testing and treatment uptake. Through these measures, the Government of Sindh aims to build a comprehensive strategy to combat HIV, enhancing health outcomes for its residents.—RT/Agency

## Sharjeel Warns That No One Is Above The Law

KARACHI: Sharjeel Memon, a leader of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) and provincial minister, emphasized the principle of accountability for those who believe they are exempt from the law.

Speaking in the Sindh Assembly, Memon underscored that the public exercises accountability through their votes, as demonstrated in the February 8 elections where PPP holds a significant majority. He emphasized that the people are the ultimate judges who determine outcomes.

Memon highlighted initiatives undertaken by the excise department to recover Rs203 billion and announced the implementation of random drug testing in schools starting July 1 to combat substance abuse.

He further noted the deployment of AI software to swiftly address public concerns and highlighted legislative measures for journalist protection passed by the assembly.

Regarding governance achievements, Memon

tailed the introduction of a biometric system for vehicle registration and crackdowns on counterfeit number plates. He also outlined ongoing infrastructure projects, including the launch of a shuttle service between the Orange Line BRT and Green Line within the initial 100 days. He mentioned progress on the Yellow Line BRT, a \$438 million project, and plans for a double-story bus stand aimed at resolving land issues in Karachi.

In conclusion, Memon affirmed the Sindh government's commitment to uphold the rule of law and ensure accountability across all sectors.—RT

## 72 Bandits Killed, 394 Arrested in Sindh Operation: Home Minister

KARACHI: The Provincial Home Minister of Sindh emphasized today that there will be no compromise on maintaining law and order in the province, as reported by the media.

Speaking in the Sindh Assembly, Home Minister Zia Lanjar disclosed that police and Rangers have been conducting a joint operation in the katcha areas. Over the past four months, 72 bandits have been killed, 116 injured, and 394 dacoits have been arrested. Tragically, eighteen policemen lost their lives during these operations.

He further stated that security forces have recovered 4,979 weapons from the bandits. The operations were supported by drone surveillance, focusing particularly on Sukkur, Ghotki, Kashmore, and Shikarpur districts.

Regarding criminal reform, the government plans to e-tag 4,000 hardened criminals. The Home Minister highlighted the need for an additional 42,000 personnel for the Sindh Police force.

In a development regarding a three-year-old abduction case, Minister Lanjar informed the assembly that Priya Kumari, the abducted girl, has been located alive in the Bahawalpur area. A committee headed by the DIG Mirpur Khas has been tasked with her recovery.—RT/Agency

## Yasmin Rashid Criticizes Government for Placing Burden on the Poor

LAHORE: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leader Yasmin Rashid has strongly condemned the current government's policies, accusing them of exacerbating poverty among the poor.

Speaking to the media after appearing in the anti-terrorism court (ATC), Rashid highlighted concerns over Pakistan's rising debt, citing data from the State Bank of Pakistan indicating a significant increase over the past two years. She criticized the allocation of budget revenues towards interest payments on loans, emphasizing the detrimental impact on the country's economy.

Rashid also criticized the government's reliance on loans from international lenders, warning of further economic hardship for Pakistan. She expressed distress over what she described as oppression against PTI leaders, noting new legal cases filed against them.

Referring to recent incidents, Rashid condemned the judicial remand of PTI women leaders Aliya Hamza and Sanam Javed, describing it as unprecedented mistreatment of doctors in Pakistan's history, particularly highlighting the crackdown on young doctors. She sharply criticized the government's taxation policies, attributing them to increased inflation, unemployment, and the deterioration of farmers' livelihoods, all contributing to heightened poverty among the populace.—RT/Agency

## Maryam Assesses Punjab's Preparedness for Above-Normal Monsoon Rainfall

LAHORE: Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz has directed comprehensive cleaning of rivers and canals across the province in anticipation of a projected 35 percent increase in monsoon rainfall this year.

Chairing a meeting at the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) head office on Wednesday, the chief minister reviewed measures to ensure Punjab's readiness for the upcoming monsoon season. She emphasized timely flood information dissemination, continuous monitoring of flood dams, and urgent implementation of preventive measures.

Maryam stressed immediate drainage arrangements in flood-prone cities and towns, expressing concern over the country's inadequate early flood warning system. She called for proactive measures and highlighted the removal of encroachments from river channels like Rod Kohi. The CM underscored the need for evacuation plans for both human lives and livestock in case of floods. She received detailed briefings from the irrigation secretary, chief meteorologist, and PDMA director general on Punjab's preparedness.

A comprehensive report was presented on the status of barrage link canals, main canals, drainage systems, and dams, highlighting forecasts predicting above-normal rainfall across Pakistan in the next three months. Maryam instructed thorough cleaning of Punjab's drainage systems and requested daily updates from all districts to monitor potential flooding risks. She emphasized informing residents in at-risk areas about evacuation plans and ensuring availability of accommodations and food supplies.

Additionally, the chief minister visited the PDMA central control room to review the weather portal, flood forecasting division, and flood simulation model, evaluating their readiness for the monsoon season.—RT/Agency

## LHC Petition Challenges Young Doctors' Strike At Government Hospitals

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court (LHC) has received a petition challenging the ongoing strike by young doctors across government hospitals in Punjab.

Citizen Mazhar Abbas filed a miscellaneous petition through Advocate Safdar Shaheen, contesting the strike led by the Young Doctors Association (YDA) since June 15. The strike was prompted by the detention of doctors following a fire incident at a teaching hospital in Sahiwal.

The petitioner argued that the strike was causing severe hardships to patients, emphasizing that doctors, paid from public funds, were duty-bound to provide timely treatment instead of exacerbating patient suffering. The petitioner urged the court to direct the YDA to immediately end the strike, citing the detrimental impact on healthcare services. Currently, only emergency services are operational in Punjab's government hospitals, affecting over 900,000 patients who rely on outpatient departments (OPDs) for care. Numerous surgeries and procedures have also been postponed due to the strike. While negotiations between the health department and doctors are ongoing, the YDA remains firm in its demand for an apology from the Punjab chief minister and the resignation of the health secretary before calling off the strike.—RT/Agency

## AJK Government to Establish CTD and Anti-Riots Police Units

MUZAFFARABAD: The Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) government has announced plans to establish specialized units including a Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) and an Anti-Riots Police Unit to bolster law enforcement capabilities in the region.

Inspector General Police (IGP) Rana Abdul Jabbar disclosed this decision during a meeting with senior journalists at his office. He highlighted the necessity for these units following recent riots in May, underscoring the need for professional handling of such incidents.

The Anti-Riots Police Unit, comprising 500 personnel, is undergoing training by Punjab's anti-riots police trainers, previously trained by Turkish experts. Selected

from various police ranges, these young and physically fit officers aged between 20 to 30 years will be dedicated solely to riot control duties. These units will be stationed at three divisional headquarters under the oversight of Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Police, with SPs receiving specialized training on deploying and utilizing these units during public protests. Prime Minister Anwar Ul Haq has allocated funds for essential equipment for these units. Anti-Riots Police Unit and approved the recruitment of 1,000 additional police personnel to meet increasing policing demands. In addition to forming the CTD for specific security purposes, the AJK government plans to re-

## US lawmakers take notice of Form 47 irregularities

The recent resolution by the US House of Representatives, which called for an independent investigation into the alleged irregularities in Pakistan's February 8 polls, sends a clear message that the legitimacy of the current government is under scrutiny. With an overwhelming 368 members voting in favor, this resolution cannot be dismissed lightly. The US, as a global superpower, has significant influence, and its lawmakers' concerns about the election's validity must prompt serious introspection and action within Pakistan.

The February polls have been marred by accusations of interference and manipulation, raising doubts about their fairness. Political parties, particularly the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), have contested the results, citing numerous obstacles faced by their candi-

dates. The controversial Form 47 and other alleged irregularities have cast a long shadow over the electoral process, fueling public distrust.



For the current coalition government, led by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), to gain credibility, it must heed the US resolution's call for a thorough and transparent inquiry. Ignoring these concerns would only perpetuate the stigma of being an illegitimate government. Such an inquiry would not only address the international community's concerns but also restore

faith among the Pakistani populace in the democratic process.

Michael Kugelman, a respected South Asia expert, highlighted the significance of the resolution, noting its potential impact on future US legislation regarding Pakistan. While the resolution may not directly alter US policy, it underscores the need for transparency and adherence to democratic principles in Pakistan.

The current government has a critical opportunity to demonstrate its commitment to democracy and human rights. By initiating a full and impartial investigation into the February polls, it can dispel doubts, reinforce its legitimacy, and uphold the democratic values that both the Pakistani people and the international community expect and deserve.

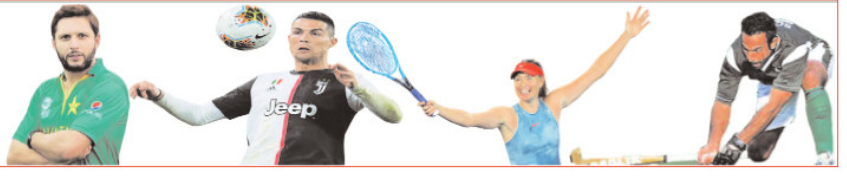

The Australian opener jumped four places to claim the top spot in the ICC Men's T20I Batting Rankings, with Suryakumar, Phil Salt, Babar Azam, and Mohammad Rizwan all dropping down a place to make up the remainder of the top five.

On the other hand, Australia's Marcus Stoinis has been knocked off the top spot in the All-rounders rankings after his short stay as No. 1. Stoinis slipped to fourth, with India's Hardik Pandya up to third, Mohammad Nabi of Afghanistan in second, and Sri Lanka's Wanindu Hasaranga back to top spot.

"If it was Pakistani bowlers [reverse swinging the ball] this would have been a big issue. We know reverse swing very well and if Arshdeep can come in the 15th over and start re-

versing the ball, it means some serious work had been done before," he added.

Inzamam-ul-Haq gave leverage to Jasprit Bumrah, considering his unorthodox bowling action, but reiterated that the ball had to be in "perfect condition" for the other bowlers.

## TDAP Sukkur Organizes Consultative Session on Bananas and Dates in Khairpur

**KHAIRPUR:** The Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) Sukkur organized a consultative session on the banana and dates products of Khairpur to assess their potential and the challenges faced by stakeholders. The event was held in collaboration with the Khairpur Chamber of Commerce & Industry, Sindh Chamber of Agriculture Khairpur, Sindh Abadgar Foundation Khairpur, Date Palm Research Institute Khairpur, and Banana Research Institute Khairpur.

The organizers explained that the objective of such sessions is to connect and unite the concerned stakeholders to identify structural flaws in their products. The audience, comprising growers, traders, processors, exporters, and technical experts highlighted various issues affecting these products at almost all stages.

Key issues discussed included:

- Lack of good agricultural practices
- Limited and traditional varieties
- Unskilled labor and less educated growers
- Inadequate pre- and post-harvesting techniques
- Improper tools and non-feasible infrastructure
- Inadequate transport and shortage of cold storages
- Lack of mechanization and value addition
- Natural calamities, such as prolonged monsoon rains, also force growers to harvest their crops prematurely, adding to the challenges.

During the session, an expert from SGS Pakistan gave a detailed presentation on ISO standards and other certification requirements of different importers. An ex-Director of the Date Palm Research Institute (DPRI) Khairpur suggested a SWOT analysis of the highlighted problems to convert weaknesses and threats into strengths and opportunities. He emphasized that unity, sincerity, and a will to work can resolve these issues and suggested that stakeholders form a delegation of growers to approach higher authorities in both Federal and Provincial governments for support, including the supply of imported elite varieties of date palm seedlings. **LAHORE:** The Higher Education Commission of Pakistan (HEC) has reinstated a ban on the affiliation of colleges with government universities.

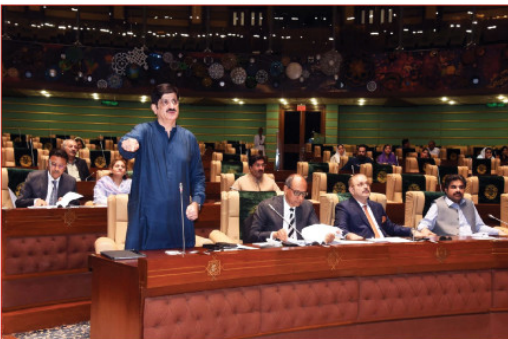

## Sindh Home Minister Seeks Report On Umerkot Clash

## Karachi to See Rs 134 Billion Investment in 1137 Development Schemes: Saeed Ghani

KARACHI: Sindh's Local Government Minister, Saeed Ghani, announced that Karachi will receive Rs 134 billion in the upcoming financial year 2024-25 to complete 1137 development schemes. Ghani revealed this during the ongoing discussion in the Sindh Assembly on the newly presented provincial budget. He specified that Rs 74 billion will be allocated through the Sindh Local Government Department, with an additional Rs 60 billion funded by foreign donor agencies for Karachi's development.



He also highlighted a total allocation of Rs 448 billion under four phases of the Karachi Water and Sewerage Services Improvement Project. Addressing concerns from opposition legislators about Karachi's development funding, Ghani urged them to review the budget details provided. He noted that 347 illegally constructed buildings were demolished in Karachi recently as part of ongoing operations against unauthorized constructions. Ghani welcomed the Sindh Home Minister's decision to pursue legal action against K-Electric for deaths linked to prolonged power outages, emphasizing that no

institution should jeopardize lives due to financial losses. He clarified that although the new provincial budget prioritizes ongoing projects over new schemes, Rs 12 billion has been earmarked specifically for the Hub Canal expansion project to benefit Karachi residents.

Ghani criticized opposition claims that Karachi was neglected in the budget, asserting that the Pakistan Peoples Party has been actively addressing civic issues in the city. He detailed that currently, 551 development schemes from the Local Government Department and 985 projects from other provincial departments are underway in Karachi. For the upcoming year, Rs 76.8 billion will be allocated to complete these projects.

Regarding past investments, Ghani highlighted that from 2016 to 2023-24, Rs 42 billion was spent on major development schemes in Karachi, including the construction of the Bakhtari Youth Centre. He concluded by announcing ongoing road construction in Korangi and other districts, along with plans to open the Korangi Causeway Bridge to traffic within eight months. Ghani emphasized the Sindh government's commitment to Karachi's development, particularly in upgrading water supply and sewerage services, despite a significant shortfall in water demand and supply. He noted ongoing efforts to demolish illegal water hydrants while maintaining essential legal hydrants that supply 18 million gallons daily to areas without pipelined water.—RT

## Sindh CM Assures Precautions Ahead Of Monsoon Season

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah assured on Wednesday that the provincial government has initiated preventive measures to avert potential flooding in anticipation of heavy rainfall during the upcoming monsoon season.



Addressing the Sindh Assembly session, Chief Minister Shah updated lawmakers on the timely repair of the collapsed gate at Sukkur Barrage, highlighting that the repairs were completed within a record 72 hours. He underscored the critical importance of ensuring infrastructure resilience ahead of expected monsoon rains. Shah further informed the House about the resumption of water supply to various canals, including the vital Rahri Canal, aiming to enhance irrigation capabilities. Sukkur to oversee further operational enhancements and mitigate water-related challenges. The chief minister emphasized the government's proactive stance in preparing for the monsoon season, ensuring comprehensive measures are in place to safeguard communities and infrastructure across Sindh. He reassured the assembly of ongoing efforts to manage potential risks and enhance disaster preparedness across the province.—RT

## KE Demands Sindh Government To Settle Rs 10.50 Billion In 'Outstanding Dues'



KARACHI: K-Electric (KE) has called upon the Sindh government to immediately settle its outstanding dues of Rs 10.50 billion, as reported by the media. In a statement on X (formerly known as Twitter), KE spokesperson Imran Rana highlighted that the power utility is grappling with severe challenges in maintaining uninterrupted power supply due to the Sindh government's non-payment of dues.

The spokesperson urgently appealed to the Sindh government to clear the outstanding amount of Rs 10.50 billion without delay. Notably, despite the ongoing intense heatwave in Karachi, Pakistan's largest city, K-Electric continues to implement power shedding for up to 16 hours daily. Earlier, KE issued a stern warning regarding the potential disconnection of electricity to various Sindh government departments owing to outstanding dues amounting to billions of rupees.

Sources familiar with the matter disclosed that neither the Government of Sindh nor the Karachi Water and Sewerage Board (KWSB) has made any payments to K-Electric since January. The accumulation of unpaid dues has precipitated a financial crisis for K-Electric, severely impacting its ability to maintain and upgrade its network infrastructure. In response to these financial challenges, KE has dispatched letters to key officials, including the Sindh Secretary of Finance and the Mayor of Karachi, urging immediate settlement of outstanding electricity bills.—RT/Agency

## Karachi Commissioner Clarifies About Heatwave's Impact Amidst Concerns

KARACHI: Karachi Commissioner Hassan Naqvi has refuted reports of widespread fatalities in the city due to the recent heatwave, asserting that the circulating figures are inaccurate.



Addressing the media at the Commissioner House in Karachi on Wednesday, Naqvi clarified that the heatwave has affected 1,700 people and resulted in 10 deaths. He acknowledged a slight increase of 4% to 5% in the city's death rate during this period, pending further investigation. Responding to concerns about mysterious deaths, Naqvi stated that hospital data indicates fatalities from heart attacks and other medical conditions are not directly attributable to the heatwave.

Highlighting specific incidents, Naqvi noted that on June 25, 147 individuals were hospitalized due to heat-related illnesses. Most patients recovered and were discharged; however, two individuals admitted to Qatar Hospital on the same day succumbed to their conditions. Naqvi urged welfare organizations to collaborate closely with the administration to avoid unnecessary public alarm. He assured that the situation in Karachi, prompted by the heatwave, is currently under control. The commissioner underscored the importance of verifying mortality data before dissemination, cautioning against releasing unconfirmed figures independently. He emphasized ongoing emergency measures being taken by the Karachi administration to manage the heatwave's impact. In addressing citizens' grievances, Naqvi acknowledged severe electricity disruptions, with load-shedding lasting 12 to 14 hours. He announced plans to meet with K-Electric officials to address these issues, aiming to minimize nighttime load-shedding and align electricity provision with Meteorological Department heatwave warnings. Additionally, Naqvi expressed concerns over water supply inconsistencies in Karachi, questioning sudden disruptions in areas previously unaffected. He announced plans for the Water Corporation to provide detailed reports on water distribution, identifying areas experiencing shortages. The commissioner reas-

## Karachi to Charge for Underground Water Usage Starting August 1

KARACHI: The Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC) has issued a notification announcing that residents of Karachi will no longer have access to free underground water, as reported by the media. According to the notification, digital water meters will be installed to measure underground water usage across Karachi, including its industries. The new regulation, effective from August 1, will apply to corporations, commercial entities, water bottling and packaging units, educational institutions, hotels, restaurants, manufacturing plants, and processing units within Karachi Division. It will also encompass societies, residential complexes, apartments, and flats, though individual residential houses are exempt from the metering system. Mayor Karachi Barrister Murtaa Wahab anticipates an annual revenue of Rs 1 billion from this initiative.—RT/Agency

## Karachi Heatwave Claims 100 Lives in Three Days

KARACHI: Amidst a scorching heatwave, a social organization has reported that 100 bodies were brought to their morgue over the past three days, highlighting a surge in fatalities due to the extreme weather conditions. A spokesperson from the Chhpa Foundation disclosed that the morgue received 37 bodies on June 23, 44 bodies on June 24, and 19 bodies on June 25.



"Thirty-six of the deceased brought to the morgue remain unidentified," the spokesperson added. Karachi is currently enduring a severe heatwave, prompting the government to establish 77 heatwave centers across seven districts of the city. In response to the crisis, authorities have announced the setup of 11 heatstroke camps in Karachi South, 18 in Karachi East, 6 in West, 12 in Karachi Central, 15 in Malir, 8 in Korangi district, and 7 in Keamam. Paramilitary Rangers have also set up heatstroke camps equipped with cold water and Sharbat stalls throughout the city. A spokesperson further noted that heatstroke centers are strategically placed along major roads and thoroughfares, staffed with doctors and paramedics.—RT/Agency

## Attorney General: PTI-SIC Cannot Use Backdoor Entry To Assemblies, Tells Top Court

ISLAMABAD: The Attorney General of Pakistan (AGP) on Wednesday submitted its written response to the Supreme Court in the reserved seats case, stating that the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) "cannot be permitted to make its way into assemblies via backdoor".

The SIC's appeal, the AGP stated in its 30-page written submissions to the 13-member full court, for reserved seats should be dismissed and the Peshawar High Court's (PHC) verdict on the matter should be upheld.

The attorney general, while elaborating on the allocation mechanism, said that reserved seats for minorities and women could be given to a political party who contested the



polls and won at least one seat besides providing a list of candidates based on the total number of seats it won as per the law.

Furthermore, independent candidates could not automatically become relevant for reserved seats under a parties' list system unless they join a political party.

"Independently elected candidates are counted towards reserved seats for women and non-Muslims only when they join political parties within 3 days of publication of names of the returned candidates in the official Gazette" under Articles 51(6)(d) and (e), as well as 106(3)(c), the AGP's re-

sponse read. The SIC neither contested the general elections as a political party nor filed any list of candidates for reserved seats for women and non-Muslims, under Section 104 of the Election Act, 2017, it further stated.

Subsequently, the aforesaid party did not present its manifesto before the February 8 nationwide polls and its candidates to the voters for their scrutiny.

"The SIC cannot be permitted to use the backdoor to make its way into the assemblies. Allowing so will set a very dangerous precedent," the AGP said.

"It will permit elements who would otherwise be rejected by the

voters to make their way into the assemblies by encouraging independents' getting elected or luring them to join such parties and benefitting from the allocation of reserved seats."

The attorney general said that the approval of the SIC's appeal would be an "antithesis of the democracy" and "will weaken the political parties who participate in the electoral process". It further elaborated that the reserved seats for women and non-Muslims would only be allocated to political parties, whereas, independently elected candidates or those parties who have not contested the polls would not be considered for the seats.—RT/Agency

## Pakistan Criticizes UNSC For Ignoring Hindutva Terrorism

UNITED NATION: Pakistan has called on the UN Security Council to shift some of its focus on combating Al-Qaeda and ISIS to Hindutva groups in India terrorising Muslims as well as on state terrorism brutalising people under occupation, like those in Palestine and Kashmir.

"The Security Council's work on Counter-Terrorism needs urgent reform," ambassador Munir Akram, Pakistan's permanent representative to the UN, told the UN General Assembly, which discussed the annual report of the 15-member Council on its actions to maintain international peace and security.

The Council, he said, had focused on combating Al-Qaeda and ISIS and its associates, while terrorism proliferated across the world.

"The (current) listing and sanctions processes are cumbersome and politicised," the Pakistani envoy said.

"The Council has also ignored terrorism by extremist and fascist organisations, including the Hindutva groups terrorising Muslims. It has also ignored state terrorism which is used for oppressing and brutalising people under occupation, as in the case of Palestine and Kashmir.



In this regard, ambassador Akram said the Council also failed to distinguish between terrorism and the legitimate struggles of peoples under colonial and alien domination for self-determination.

While awaiting agreement on the reform of the Security Council, the Pakistani envoy said several steps could be taken to improve transparency and accountability in its work, including open discussions allowing inputs by the concerned states and parties following the adoption of Council decisions.

He said the selection and appointment of expert panels and special representatives of the secretary-general should be made transparently with balanced representation from the North and South and various regions.

The Council, the Pakistan envoy added, should set up a body to monitor and facilitate the implementation of its resolutions, including those in abeyance for considerable time, such as those on Palestine and Kashmir.

Expanding the number of non-permanent members was vital to enhancing its representativeness and reducing the dominance of its permanent members, ambassador Akram said.

"Adding new permanent members will erode the principles of sovereign equality and equity and further paralyse the Council," he insisted.

Opening the debate, the president of the General Assembly, Dennis Francis said what emerges from the Security Council report is "a vivid picture of a world fraught with tension and conflict".—RT/Agency

## PTI Welcomes US Resolution As Ruling Parties Slam 'Foreign Intervention'

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) on Wednesday welcomed the passage of a resolution in the US House of Representatives, seeking an impartial probe into the claims of irregularities during the February 8 general elections in the country, something that the Imran Khan-founded party has been campaigning ever since the nationwide polls.

Expressing their support for democracy and human rights in Pakistan, the US lawmakers, many of whom have been speaking in PTI's favour, have emphasised the need for the Pakistani public's participation in the country's democratic process.

The former ruling party is among those opposing the results of the polls after its candidates faced immense hurdles in their run-up to their participation in the vote, leading them to participate as independent candidates and being deprived of their iconic bat symbol following a legal battle with the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP).

The country's two major parties — Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) — along with other political parties, formed a coalition government in the Centre.

Terminating the development a move in the "right direction", former president Arif Alvi lauded the massive majority in the resolution's approval.

"What a resounding condemnation by (568-7) of the



unhinging of the democratic process in Pakistan by the US Congress. A positive push in the right direction, along the lines of our own constitution, for democracy, rule of law, civilian control over our armed forces (not vice versa), personal freedoms, etc.," he wrote on social site, X (formerly Twitter).

The PTI leader drew similarities between the Resolution 901 and the Constitution of Pakistan about upholding democracy and citizens' right to have a free and fair election.

The ex-president also mentioned the key proposals and demands in the US resolution in his post.

Meanwhile, former aide to Khan during his tenure as the prime minister, Zulfikar Bukhari also appreciated the passage of the resolution saying that the move was about to bring a "change".

"Things are about to change. The International silence is about to break," he

wrote on X. However, Raza Haroon from rival PPP voiced criticism, asking if PTI now deemed the "US intervention" right.

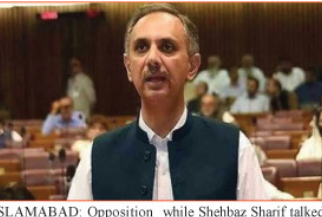
Replying to Alvi's post, the politician stated three questions. Seeking and supporting US intervention in our internal matters?

Where does our Constitution or Law of the Land allow for it?

How do you explain the issue of jurisdiction?

Haroon also responded to Bukhari's post, raising concern over the "foreign intervention in Pakistan's internal matters". "Wasn't your leader against FUSA intervention during the 2013 election? Was it of no confidence? Was I [Imran Khan] bluffing of US conspiracy on stage while he was the PM and even after?" he asked.—RT/Agency

## Omar Ayub: Release Of Imran Khan And Other Detainees Precondition For Dialogue



ISLAMABAD: Opposition leader in National Assembly Omar Ayub said on Wednesday dialogue with the government was possible only if PTI founder Imran Khan and other detainees were set at liberty.

Ayub said so in response to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's offer of talks, stating that "discussions will take place only when the PTI founder and other detainees are released."

Speaking in the National Assembly, Ayub addressed the prime minister, whom he referred to as "Form 47 PM".

The speaker intervened, saying the environment was improving, to which Ayub responded that he had the right to reply.

He said the House could only function with mutual respect.

Ayub mentioned that

while Shehbaz Sharif talked about his mother's funeral, he attended Kulsom Nawaz's funeral but could not attend his own father's funeral.

The opposition leader also stated that reconciliation would only be possible if the government make amends for mistreatment of Dr Yamin Rashid, Mahmood Rashid, Hassaan Niazi and others.

At this point, the speaker asked Ayub to sit down, stating that he had made his point and had been allowed to speak.

Despite this, the opposing leader continued to speak and said his leader was detained in a death cell while others were provided with air-conditioners. He contended that the country's instability was due to a lack of rule of law.—RT/Agency

## Fazl Criticizes Military Operations Since 2010 For Resulting In Instability

ISLAMABAD: Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rahman has once again criticised the Azm-e-Istehkam Operation stating that military operations being conducted since 2010 have only led to instability.

Speaking in the National Assembly (NA) on Wednesday, Fazl yet again condemned Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, stating, "We have been suffering under the guise of operations since 2010. This is not stability, we are doing this for China."

"People were forced to vacate their areas for these operations. Tribal women were sent to deserts, and many places in tribal areas were cleared, forcing people to beg. Their dignity and traditions were harmed," he protested.

Fazl highlighted the insufficient compensation provided to the displaced, saying, "Victims are given Rs400,000 to rebuild their homes. This amount is not enough to build even a bathroom. It's a joke." The JUI-F chief maintained that instead of cash, the victims are given tokens.

Fazl lashed out at the current government set-up. "The state has abandoned us. Do we not have any rights as citizens?" Fazl further criticised the government's policies, "The government is making people jobless. They are closing departments older



than Pakistan itself."

Commenting on the recent hike imposed on the salaried class in the recent budget, he stated, "Taxes are imposed on salaries and businesses, yet we demand taxes without providing rights. People will not pay taxes because they don't trust you. They demand peace and prosperity."

He pointed out the contradictions in government actions, "25,000 to 30,000 Afghans returned to their country, but 40,000 to 50,000 came back to Pakistan. General Bajwa told me that a fence was erected to prevent terrorists from entering. Now, it's being said that the fence has been removed."

He emphasised the dire situation in many regions maintaining that people have reached the point of starvation in many areas of the country "People in Chaman have been protesting for nine months. Is this how a country treats its border populations? These people have no alternative employment. Mothers and sisters sold their jewellery, but even that money is gone.—RT/Agency

## Vawda Offers 'Unconditional Apology' To SC, Requests Withdrawal Of Contempt Charges

ISLAMABAD: Senator Faisal Vawda on Wednesday tendered an unconditional apology to the Supreme Court, asking it to withdraw the contempt charges against him.

On May 17, a three-judge Supreme Court bench headed by Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faez Isa issued contempt charges against Vawda for his outburst against the judiciary during a press conference at the National Press Club in Islamabad.

The notices were issued for several "malicious" allegations against the judiciary and the judges.

The court had also issued show cause notices to 34 television channels, asking them to explain why court contempt proceedings should not be initiated against them for airing the remarks of Vawda as well as MQM-P's MNA Mustafa Kamal criticising the judiciary.

Kamal had already submitted an unconditional and unqualified apology for his utterances.

Earlier this month, Senator Vawda had requested SC to withdraw the contempt of court charges, stating he never intended to bring the judiciary into disrepute.

In his apology today, a copy of which is available



with media, Vawda said that he had every respect and regard for the judiciary, adding that he could not "imagine to do any act which lowers the estimation of the judiciary in any manner."

He said that the matter was not about anyone's ego and one should "act more cautiously to work towards the establishment of a better image of the judiciary."

"It will be adverse to the interests of the people of Pakistan if two Constitutional bodies are seen to be standing against each other," Vawda said in his letter.

He said he realised that the maintenance of a good public image and estimation of the judiciary was vital for the judiciary to be able to perform.

Despite his best intentions, he said, his press conference may have come across as objectionable.

He said to ensure the

prestige concerning the image of the judiciary, the respondent submitted himself before the honourable court and deeply regretted any harm that may have been caused by his press conference.

"That further, in order to show his utmost respect as per the teaching of Islam for the Honourable Court the respondent sincerely apologizes unconditionally," he said.

He said he would be willing to take any further steps that the court deemed "necessary and appropriate" for their satisfaction, adding that he never intended to impugn the dignity or independence of the judiciary.

"In light of what has been stated above, it is very humbly prayed that this Court may be pleased to withdraw the said show cause notice," the apology states.—RT/Agency

## Sheikh Rashid: Imran Khan Will Remain Detained For The Foreseeable Future

RAWALPINDI: Awami Muslim League chief Sheikh Rashid Ahmad said on Wednesday the nation had rejected the budget presented by the government.

"People will not wait for anyone to take to the street after being fed up with inflation and a lack of relief in the budget," he said.

Speaking to media outside the Adiala Jail, the former federal minister lashed out at the government for not taking care of the poor while preparing the budget.

"This is the fight of the destitute as they are hardly making ends meet under extreme poverty and hunger. This government lacks understanding of the challenges being faced by the people," he said.

## State Department: US Supports Pakistan's Efforts In Operation Azm-e-Istehkam

WASHINGTON: A State Department spokesperson on Wednesday said the United States supports Pakistan's efforts to combat terrorism after the country announced the launching of an anti-militancy campaign — Operation Azm-e-Istehkam.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has assured that the civilian population would not be disturbed and under this initiative, intelligence-based operations would be intensified, instead of launching a new organised armed operation.

State Department Spokesperson Matthew Miller, when asked about the new operation and the US reaction to its announcement, said, "We support Pakistan's efforts to combat terrorism and ensure the safety and security of its citizens in a manner that promotes the rule of law and protection of human rights."

He, during a press briefing, continued that Washington's partnership with Islamabad on security issues includes its high-level counterterrorism



dialogue, including funding robust counterterrorism capacity-building programmes and supporting a series of US-Pakistan military-to-military engagements.

"Pakistanis people have suffered tremendously from terrorist attacks. No country should have to suffer such acts of terror," he said, adding that the US and Pakistan have a shared interest in combating threats to regional security.

Last week, the government decided to launch the operation amid an increase in terror incidents as "a collective multidimensional operation and national vision of the entire

state system". According to the PM Office (PMO), the new counter-terrorism push was approved with the consensus of all stakeholders including the four provinces as well as Gilgit Baltistan (GB) and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK).

However, opposition parties including the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Jamiat-e-Ulema Islam Fazl (JUI-F), Awami National Party (ANP), and others have voiced concerns over the military operation, demanding that parliament must be taken into confidence before taking any such decision.—RT/Agency
