Petrol Hiked By Rs7.45 Per Litre

ISLAMABAD: ISLAM-ABAD. The federal government has jacked up the petrol price in the country by Rs7.45 per litre from Rs258.16 to Rs265.61 for the next fortnight in line with an "increasing trend in the international market".

The Finance Division officially notified the latest prices, which it said had been worked out by the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra), based on the price variations in the international market.

As per the notification, the price of high-speed diesel (HSD) has also been increased by Rs9.56 to Rs277.45 per litre. The new fuel prices will come into effect from July 1.

"The prices of Petroleum products have seen an increasing trend in the international market during the last fortnight," the official notification read.



The changes in fuel prices come for the first time since the announcement of federal budget for fiscal year 2024-25 earlier this month on June 12. The Finance Division stated that there will be no change in the applicable taxes and duties, which will remain at the existing level, as had been notified by the government in the Budget FY25.

The government had increased the petroleum development levy (PDL) by Rs10 per litre — from Rs60 to Rs70 — in the

budget, further burdening the inflation-hit masses. However, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb had clarified earlier today that the increased levy on petroleum products was not being imposed immediately, meaning that the PDL remains the same in the latest fuel price review. Earlier, the government had provided a cumulative relief of Rs35 per litre by decreasing the petrol price in the last four fortnightly reviews.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb said Sunday he was "very optimistic" about Pakistan securing a new International Monetary Fund (IMF) bailout after President Asif Ali Zardari approved the tax-heavy budget for the next fiscal year beginning on July 1.

"The IMF programme is our assurance in terms of macro stability. We are taking it forward; it is inevitable. I'm very optimistic that we'll be able to take it through the finish line for an Extended Fund Programme which is going to be larger and longer in nature," the minister told reporters in Islamabad.

The cash-strapped federal government adopted a Rs18.9 trillion budget laced with tax-raising measures as it had sought to secure a new bailout from the IMF after almost defaulting last year.

In the budget, the government has increased the taxes on the already burdened salaried class, bought exporters into the normal tax regime, increased the petro-



leum levy to Rs70, and imposed new taxes on the real estate sectors, among others, to increase the tax collection. Experts have said that while the financial blueprint is expected to help the struggling nation unlock a Fund deal, but also cautioned that it could lead to further inflation, which would draw public anger.

The finance minister, talking about the burden on the inflation-struck masses, said: "I completely understand the stress that people from different sectors feel about additional taxes; I completely empathise and sympathise, but we need to

work for it." The finance minister said he was clear-headed and would ensure that the government works to lessen the burden on the common people and businesses in the coming days by curbing leakages and improving the management system.

In the budget, the government has increased the petroleum development levy (PDL) by Rs10 per litre — from Rs60 to Rs70 — worrying the public as the petrol prices are already high.

But the finance minister stressed that this was not the case and that the levy was not being imposed immedi-

ately, meaning that when petrol prices are revised tonight, the levy would remain the same.

"There are talks about the PDL. I want to be very clear the Rs70 limit that we've set, we're not going to impose it [right now]," Aurangzeb, a former banker, assured the journalists.

"This is a ceiling. In my first budget speech, I had set it at Rs80, which was later revised to Rs70 and it will not be imposed; it'll be kept as a headroom," the finance minister added.

Rs70 levy has also been approved for diesel, Rs50 per litre levy would also be imposed on light diesel oil and kerosene oil, while Rs70 per litre levy would be applicable on high-octane.

In a nation of over 240 million people and where most jobs are in the informal sector, only 5.2 million filed income tax returns in 2022.

To boost tax collection, the government among other measures, blocked mobile phone SIM cards and will now also restrict non-filers

from travelling abroad. While the budget has been criticised for not bringing in new sectors into the tax net, the finance minister defended the financial blueprint and said that new sectors would be taxed.

"I'm repeating myself. When Miftah [Islam] sb proposed taxing retailers in 2022, it should have been implemented. We cannot have any segment that is not contributing to society and the exchequer."

He also thanked 42,000 new retailers for registering themselves as of yesterday and they will be taxed from July. "There should be no confusion that we aren't roping in new sectors. The same goes for the real estate sector, previously, the demand side was taxed [..] and now the supply side's income will also be taxed."

He added that non-filers should not exist. "In this particular budget, we have taken it to the punitive level so as to make the non-filers realise that they [have to file their taxes]."—RT/Agency

Fawad Rules Out Imran Khan's Release Under Current PTI Leadership

ISLAMABAD: Amid reports of internal rifts within the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), former federal minister Fawad Chaudhry has said there is "no chance" of the incarcerated party founder Imran Khan's release in the presence of the current PTI leadership.

"[Due to] lack of political strategy of current PTI leadership, all of us are suffering," said the former senior vice-president of the party, who parted with Khan following May 9 violent protests that saw attacks on public and military installations.

He also responded to the PTI leader's criticism that those who parted ways with Khan in the aftermath of the May 9 mayhem have now started speaking in his favour as the "tough time" for the embattled party has now come to an end.

"Tough time has not ended for the jailed former premier and other PTI leaders. Yasmin Rashid, Ejaz

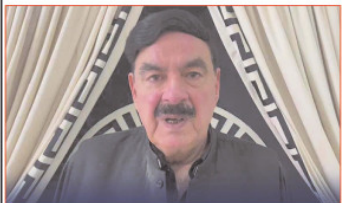


Chaudhry and others are still behind bars and going through a difficult time," he said.

The former federal minister said: "Some people start their journey from Peshawar and return after staging a rally in Lahore." Continuing with his criticism of the PTI leadership, the former federal minister said Barrister Gohar Ali Khan-led party's leaders only doing commentary on verdicts of different cases against jailed party leaders.

President Zardari Signs Tax-Heavy Finance Bill Into Law

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari on Sunday gave assent to the government's tax-heavy Finance Bill 2024 for the new fiscal year.

The government had presented the budget two weeks ago, drawing sharp criticism from opposition parties, especially the PTI, as well as coalition ally PPP.

Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb had moved the finance bill in parliament, which had been opened to seek amendments and debate by the ruling alliance led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and its opposition.

Opposition parties, mainly parliamentarians backed by currently incarcerated former premier Imran Khan, had rejected the budget, saying it would be highly inflationary.

Earlier this week, the PPP — which had initially boycotted the debate over the budget — decided that it would vote for the finance bill despite certain reservations.

On Friday, the National Assembly passed the budget with some amendments. The motion was preceded by fiery speeches from the opposition, who described the budget as unrealistic, anti-people, anti-industry, and anti-agriculture.



Today, President Zardari gave assent to the bill in accordance with Article 75 of the Constitution, the media wing of the President House said, adding that the bill would be applicable from July 1 (tomorrow).

Under Article 75 (1), the president has no power to reject or object to the finance bill, which is considered to be a money bill as per the Constitution.

The article reads "When a Bill is presented to the President for assent, the President shall, within [ten] days,—(a) assent to the Bill; or (b) in the case of a Bill other than a Money Bill, return the Bill to the Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) with a message requesting that the Bill or any specified provision thereof, be reconsidered and that, an amendment specified in the

message be considered". On Friday, the government had extended exemptions in specific sectors while announcing new tax measures in several areas to generate additional revenue in the coming fiscal year to meet the International Monetary Fund's criteria.

During the NA session, opposition lawmakers, particularly from the PTI, criticised the budget, asserting that it was now an open secret that the document was dictated by the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Leader of the Opposition Omar Ayub Khan had denounced the budget as "economic terrorism against the people" Pakistan is in talks with the IMF for a loan of \$6 billion to \$8bn.—RT/Agency

PTI Report Holds Marwat 'Responsible for Altercation' with Omar Ayub

ISLAMABAD: A recent report by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has blamed party leader Sher Afzal Marwat for the scuffle between Leader of the Opposition Omar Ayub and other workers, media reported Sunday.

The fight took place outside the judicial complex in Islamabad on Thursday when a district and sessions court turned down PTI founder Imran Khan and his spouse's pleas seeking suspension in their sentences in iddat case.

According to the sources, the report — which will be presented to the PTI founder on July 2 — has held Marwat responsible for the scuffle with Omar.

The report said that Marwat had desired to lead the party's protest rally in Khan's support, however, this led to an unpleasant situation, forcing Omar to leave the place in a hurry in utter disbelief.

Marwat has remained the centre of attention for the past few months due to his blunt remarks and differences with the party workers. Due to his outspoken comments, he was re-



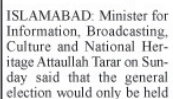
ported to have moved from the PTI core committee and political committee and a show-cause notice was issued to him a well.

The politician from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa responded to the show-cause notice and the political committee or the core committee has shown no indication of any further action against him.

Earlier this week, after Omar's resignation as PTI's secretary general, Marwat demanded Senator Shibli Faraz's resignation, saying the party will be freed from the qabza mafia.

Election Scheduled for 2029 Upon Completion Of Government's Tenure, Says Tarar



ISLAMABAD: Minister for Information, Broadcasting, Culture and National Heritage Attaulah Tarar on Sunday said that the general election would only be held in 2029 upon completion of the constitutional tenure of the incumbent government. While reacting to Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (F) chief Maulana Fazlur-Rahman's presser, he said the Parliament was an appropriate forum to do politics in the current circumstances. "Solution to all the problems in politics lies in negotiations and dialogue," the minister

added. Tarar termed Maulana a "seasoned" and "respected" politician, urging him to appreciate the government's economic policies that drove an increase in the foreign exchange reserves, and took the stock exchange to historic highest level. He lauded the government for strengthening the rupee and reducing trade deficit significantly.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: Former prime minister Shahid Khaqan Abbasi said that he couldn't accept the parliamentary system and democracy unfortunately. He was addressing a seminar on Sunday. "We do legislation in the parliament without any debate or discussion," said Abbasi while adding that bills are bulldozed through parliament. held responsible in case of any failure, he added.

"We need to resolve all these issues in order to run democracy efficiently," said the former prime minister. Abbasi added that the provinces get share in the government through parliamentary democracy. It merits mention here that Abbasi is

all set to launch a new political party named 'Awaam Pakistan' on July 6. Abbasi had been a confidant of PML-N President Nawaz Sharif and served as prime minister after he was disqualified by the Supreme Court over corruption charges from August 2017 to May 2018.—RT/Agency

16-Year-Old Boy Electrocuted By High Tension Electric Wire, Body Left Hanging For 20 Hours

TANDO ADAM: In a heart-wrenching incident within the jurisdiction of Tando Adam's City police station, a young boy, Sultan, son of Ali Gul Shaikh, lost his life after being electrocuted by high tension electric wires in the village of Colonel Hanif. The tragic event occurred when the 16-year-old became entangled in the 11,000-volt wires that run above a mango orchard, leading to his immediate death.

Sultan's body has been hanging from the mango tree for over 20 hours, causing immense distress and anguish for his family and the local community. Despite being promptly informed, neither the police nor the Hyderabad Electric Supply

Company (HESCO) officials have taken action to retrieve the boy's body.

Ali Gul Shaikh, the grieving father, spoke to the media amidst tears and profound sorrow. "My son went to offer Friday prayers and never came back. We informed the police and the respectable men of the village, but no one has helped us. For 20 hours, my son's body has been hanging in that tree, and no one has come to help us retrieve him," he lamented, his voice breaking with emotion.

The delay in response has sparked outrage among the villagers, who have gathered at the scene demanding immediate intervention. Community members have expressed their solidarity with the Shaikh family, condemning

the authorities for their apparent negligence and lack of urgency.

This incident has highlighted severe safety concerns regarding high tension wires running through residential and agricultural areas. Villagers are calling for an immediate review and action to prevent such tragic accidents in the future.

As of the latest reports, Sultan's body remains suspended in the tree, with the community anxiously awaiting the authorities to fulfill their responsibilities. The prolonged ordeal has deepened the family's grief, leaving a scar on the village of Colonel Hanif and raising serious questions about the efficiency and empathy of the local authorities.

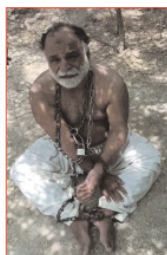

Kidnappers Send Video Of Abducted Khoso Community Notable To His Family

THUL: The distressing saga of a kidnapped Khoso community notable continues as the abductors have sent a video of the victim being tortured to his family, along with a list of ransom demands. Landlord Behram Khoso, who was abducted 20 days ago from the village of Pyaro Khoso, within the jurisdiction of RD-52 Police Station near Thul, has yet to be recovered.

The video, which has caused great anguish to Behram Khoso's family, shows him chained and subjected to torture by the kidnapers. In the footage, Khoso pleads with his family to meet the captors' demands to secure his release. The kidnapers are demanding a ransom of one crore rupees, two Rado watches, and an iPhone. When contacted, his son and brother, Ayub Khoso, confirmed the receipt of the video. "We have received a video showing Behram Khoso chained and being tor-

FIR Registered In Murder Of GDA Leader Haji Khuda Bakhsh And His Guard

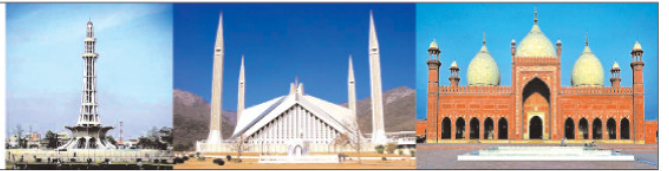

CTD Eliminates 124 Terrorists, Arrests 322 In KP During First Six Months

PESHAWAR: A total of 124 terrorists have been killed and 322 have been arrested in the first six months of the year 2024 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province, media reported on Sunday.

The Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) has released the details of operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province this year according to which a total of 1,433 operations were conducted and thwarted 55 terrorist attacks, 124 terrorists were killed while 322 were arrested.

The CTD report stated that Peshawar was saved



from a major attack by arresting two suicide bombers.

The commanders and associates of terrorists groups, identified as Mohsin Qadir, Betni Padakye, Tipu Gul, Zabar Group, Sunta, TTP Gandapur Group were killed during the operations.

Apart from this, 14 suspects involved in the smuggling of explosives were also arrested.

According to the CTD officials, the authorities also fixed bounty on the heads of 18 most wanted terrorists out of which eight of them were killed while 10 were arrested.—RT/Agency

Rawalakot said.

According to police, the deceased prisoner was arrested in a drug trafficking case. The district jail staff has been taken into custody, and an investigation is underway.

In a separate incident, several inmates escaped the prison in Balochistan's Chaman after overpowering guards when they were allowed out of cells for Friday prayers.

The incident unfolded as the inmates of barrack No. 4 were being led out for prayers. Seizing a moment of opportunity, the prisoners launched a sudden and coordinated attack on the prison guards, overpowering them and taking control of the situation.

Sources within the prison reported that many of the prisoners involved in serious criminal cases, including murder and other heinous crimes, had been housed in barrack No. 4.

The prison authorities revealed that one inmate was killed in the ensuing retaliatory gunfire by the police. Two others sustained injuries during the clash and are currently receiving medical treatment.—RT/Agency

"Hostile State Actors": UK Warns Of Russian Interference In General Election

London: Britain's deputy prime minister warned Sunday that the country's upcoming general election faces threats from hostile actors such as Russia seeking to influence the UK's democratic process. The country will go to the polls on Thursday, in an election expected to oust the governing right-wing Conservatives and put the opposition Labour party in

power. His comments came after the Australian Broadcasting Corporation reported that it had uncovered five Facebook pages spreading the same pro-Kremlin talking points. Some of them encouraged support for the hard-right Reform UK party led by Brexitite Nigel Farage -- a big challenger to the ruling Conservatives in Thursday's vote. "There is a threat in all elections, and indeed we see it in this election from hostile state actors seeking to influence the outcome of the election campaign," Oliver Dowden told Sky News. "Russia is a prime example of this, and this is a classic example from the Russian playbook," he added, noting however that the examples were "relatively typical, low-level stuff." —Agency

String of Nigeria suicide attacks kill at least 18

At least 18 people were killed and 19 seriously wounded in suicide attacks targeting a wedding, a hospital and a funeral in northeastern Nigeria on Saturday, authorities said.



The region has been scarred by more than a decade of violence by the militant group Boko Haram, which did not immediately claim responsibility for the string of attacks.

In one of three blasts on Saturday in the town of Gwoza, a woman with a baby strapped to her back detonated explosives in the middle of a wedding ceremony, according to a state police spokesman.

"At about 3:45pm (2:45pm GMT) a woman carrying a baby on her back detonated an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) she had on her at a crowded motor park," Borno State police spokesman Nahum Kenneth Daso said.

Women suicide bombers also targeted a hospital in the same town, which lies across

the border from Cameroon. Another attack was later carried out at the funeral for victims of the wedding blast, authorities said.

At least 18 people were killed and 42 others injured in the spate of attacks, according to the Borno State Emergency Management Agency (Sema).

"So far, 18 deaths comprising children, men, females and pregnant women" have been reported, agency head Barkindo Saidu said in a report seen by AFP. Nineteen "seriously injured" people were taken to the regional capital Maiduguri, while

23 others were awaiting evacuation, Saidu said in the report.

A member of a militia assisting the military in Gwoza said two colleagues and a soldier were also killed in a separate attack on a security post, though authorities did not immediately confirm this toll.

Although Boko Haram has lost ground in recent years, militants continue to attack rural communities in Nigeria on a regular basis. Over the course of the insurgency, Boko Haram has repeatedly deployed young women and girls to carry out suicide attacks. —Agency

Ronaldo's ex-teammate defends his controversial reaction to substitution



Cristiano Ronaldo's ex-Manchester United teammate Wes Brown came to his defence after he gave a controversial reaction to his substitution in the 66th minute of Portugal's Euro 2024 qualifier against Georgia. Earlier this week, Georgia beat Portugal 2-0 in a match where Ronaldo, 39, drew another blank at the tournament after being unable to score a goal so far, which added to his frustration which he did not hide during the game, the Mirror UK reported. The Al Nassr star expressed his frustration by kicking a water bottle as he approached his seat after receiving a yellow card and being substituted for Goncalo Ramos. This action was misinterpreted by viewers as Ronaldo's frustration aimed at teammates but Brown asserted that it was self-directed instead. On Reach's latest podcast episode of Euro Thrash, the English player told host Nubaid Haroon: "That's normal. He's come off, he wants to score. I've said this in previous ones. His attitude's so good. People might think he's snapping at other people but he's not. "He's just wounded he's not scored before he's come off. He probably knew he was coming off after a certain amount of time by the way, and he'll just be disappointed he's not contributed or got an assist or a goal." With just one assist in the first three matches, Ronaldo's performance at the tournament has been disappointing, according to the Mirror UK. Portugal still managed to top Group F due to a 2-1 win over Czechia and a 3-0 thrashing of Turkey. —Agency

Suryakumar's match-winning catch stirs controversy after T20 World Cup victory

BARBADOS: After India were crowned champions at the T20 World Cup 2024 with a seven-run victory over South Africa, the last-over catch by their player Suryakumar Yadav sparked a controversy. The 33-year-old cricketer helped his side seal the victory at the Kensington Oval, Barbados, on Saturday night as he took a stunning catch in the final over, dismissing David Miller, when the Proteas needed 16 runs to win. The batter hit a full toss for a six on a straight hit on Hardik Pandya's delivery but Suryakumar took a brilliant catch, which has also been regarded as the best grab of the entire tournament. The ball looked certain to cross the boundary ropes but Suryakumar grabbed it while running. He juggled the ball and went over the ropes to avoid his feet touching the ropes, jumped back again and held on to the ball, which ultimately won the match for India. The decision went to the third umpire, Richard Kettleborough, who had a quick view at it and declared the catch legal, which ended Miller's innings and eventually the Proteas' hopes of lifting their maiden title. Soon after India's victory a debate started on social media with some arguing that Suryakumar's shoes flicked the boundary ropes while grabbing the catch. "Not just that, the boundary ropes also looked out of position before the Indian



took the match-winning catch. As per the ICC's playing conditions, the cushion is considered the boundary and not the white line which can be seen in the pictures. Section 19.3 states: "If a solid object used to mark the boundary is disturbed for any reason, then the boundary shall be considered to be in its original position." It was further argued that the boundary rope should've been moved back into its original position. Section 19.3.2 states: "If a solid object used to mark the boundary is disturbed for any reason, the object shall be returned to its original position as soon as is practicable; if play is taking place, this shall be as soon as the ball is dead." —Agency

After Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, Ravindra Jadeja also quits T20I

BARBADOS: Indian all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja joined star batters Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma in stepping down from the T20 Internationals a day after Men in Blue defeated South Africa to win coveted title in the shortest format. "With a heart full of gratitude, I bid farewell to T20 internationals," Jadeja wrote on his official Instagram page a day after India's win over South Africa in a thrilling World Cup final in Bridgetown. "Like a steadfast horse galloping with pride, I've always given my best for my country and will continue to do so in other formats. Winning the T20 World Cup was a dream come true, a pinnacle of my T20 International career. Thank you for the memories, the cheers, and the unwavering support," he added. In less than 24 hours, three of India's most senior and important players announced their retirements which may make things a bit difficult for the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to find their replacement as all three were widely considered greats in their respective positions and roles. In 74 T20Is played, Jadeja scored 515 runs and bagged 54 wickets. After India's T20 World Cup win, Kohli announced his retirement immediately during a post-match ceremony saying that it is time for the next generation to take over. On the other hand, Rohit Sharma confirmed during a post-match press conference that he, too, is quitting the shorter format. Rohit and Kohli's retirement from the T20I format was not entirely unexpected. Neither



player had featured in any T20Is following India's semi-final defeat in the 2022 T20 World Cup, and they only resumed playing T20Is in January this year, with their focus on the 2024 T20 World Cup. Kohli ended his 125-match T20I career as India's second-highest run-scorer in the format - 4,188 at an average of 48.69 and strike rate of 137.04. Meanwhile, Rohit departed from the format as its highest scorer - 4,231 runs in 159 matches - and also holds the record for the most centuries (five) in T20 internationals. He won two T20 World Cup titles: the inaugural one as a player in 2007 and now as captain in 2024. —Agency

James Anderson included as England name 14-man squad for first Two tests against West Indies



England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) announced a 14-man squad for the first two Tests against West Indies starting on July 10 at Lord's Cricket Ground. The squad includes Nottinghamshire pacer Dillon Pennington and Surrey's wicketkeeper-batter Jamie Smith, who made his ODI debut in 2023. Pennington has taken 29 wickets for Nottinghamshire in the ongoing County Championship Division One averaging 23.03 for Smith, he has scored 507 runs averaging 50.70 for Surrey. The squad includes another Surrey player, Gus Atkinson, who toured with the English team earlier this year and returned uncapped. Atkinson has represented the English team in nine ODIs and three T20Is taking three and six wickets respectively. Jonny Bairstow has been excluded from the squad after the wicketkeeper-batter failed to perform against India in the five-match Test series earlier this year. His highest score in the series was 39 in England's second innings in the fifth Test. Along with Bairstow, Ben Foakes also failed to make it to the squad and the uncapped Smith will keep the wickets in their stead. Chris Woakes has also been called up for the first two Tests against the West Indies. The pacer last played for England in the Ashes 2023 and won the Player of the Series award as he took 19 wickets in six innings at an average of 18.15. The Ben Stokes led team will begin their quest against West Indies on July 10 at Lord's. —Agency

Pakistan name squad for ACC Women's T20 Asia Cup



KARACHI: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Sunday announced a 14-member squad under the leadership of Nida Dar for the ACC Women's T20 Asia Cup, which will be held in Dambulla, Sri Lanka, from 19 to 28 July. Ayesha Zafar, Natalia Parvaiz, Rameen Shamim, Sadaf Shamas, Umm-e-Hani and Waheeda Akhtar, who were part of the 17-member squad that toured England last month, have been left out. Instead, the selectors have recalled Iram Javed. Omaima Sohail, and Syeda Aroob Shah for the tournament. Iram Javed played the last of her 53 T20Is in October 2023 against Bangladesh at Chattogram, while Omaima Sohail last played against New Zealand in Queenstown in December 2023. Syeda Aroob Shah has played seven T20Is so far, with the last one coming against South Africa in September 2023. Tasmia Rubab, the 22-year-old left-arm fast bowler, is the only uncapped player in the side. She played for Pakistan A against West Indies A and Thailand in November 2023. Representing Multan in the recently held National Women's One-Day Tournament 2023-24, Tasmia scored 86 runs and took 12 wickets. She also took four wickets at an economy rate of 6.36 in the National Women T20 Tournament 2023-24. Meanwhile, a training camp of the Pakistan women's national cricket team for the ACC Women's T20 Asia Cup will commence in Karachi from 5 July and will continue until the side's departure on 16 July. Head coach Muhammad Wasim will supervise the camp and will be supported by Abdur Rehman (spin bowling coach), Junaid Khan (assistant coach - bowling) and Hanif Malik (assistant coach - fielding). Hina Munawar, Rabia Siddiqi and Waleed Ahmed have already been confirmed as the team manager, physio-therapist and analyst, respectively. Pakistan are placed in Group 'A' along with India, Nepal and UAE, while Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Thailand and Malaysia are in Group 'B'. —Agency

Mohammad Ali added to Pakistan Shaheens squad for Darwin tour

LAHORE: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Sunday added Test fast bowler Mohammad Ali to the Pakistan Shaheens' squad for the upcoming tour to Darwin under the supervision of red-ball coach Jason Gillespie. Mohammad Ali was added as the 15th player in the squad and will participate in Pakistan Shaheens' training camp in Karachi, scheduled from 8-13 July. In Darwin, Pakistan Shaheens will play two four-day matches against Bangladesh 'A', two 50-over matches against Northern Territory and Bangladesh, and also participate in the nine-team Top End T20 Series. Pakistan red-ball head coach Jason Gillespie will supervise the Pakistan Shaheens' training camp from 8-13 July and will also travel to Darwin as the team's head coach. He will return to Pakistan after the second four-day match against



Bangladesh 'A', which finishes on 29 July, to assume responsibilities as the national side's head coach and commence preparations for the two-Test series against Bangladesh. The pre-season fitness and fielding camp will be supervised by Mohammad Masroor, who will also travel to Darwin as Assistant Coach-cum-Manager. Abdul Rehman will be the white-ball head coach and will join the Pakistan Shaheens side on 28 July for the two 50-over and Top End T20 Series matches from 4-18 August. —Agency

Germany beats Denmark 2-0 to secure Euro 2024 quarterfinal spot



DORTMUND: The UEFA EURO 2024 Round of 16 match between Germany and Denmark resumed after a suspension due to heavy rain at Signal Iduna Park in Dortmund. The game paused for 24 minutes saw the players head to the dressing rooms in the 35th minute. Once the weather cleared, referee Michael Oliver brought the teams back onto the pitch to continue the match. Germany managed to secure a 2-0 victory over Denmark Kai Havertz converted a penalty in the second half. Jamal Musiala then sealed the win with a curling strike. Yesterday, Switzerland advanced to the quarterfinals after defeating Italy 2-0 at Berlin's Olympiastadion. Remo Freuler scored the first goal with a stunning left-footed shot in the 37th minute, assisted by Ruben Vargas. Vargas himself doubled Switzerland's lead with a curling effort early in the second half. Switzerland will now face the winner of the England vs. Slovakia match, which is set to take place on July 6. —Agency

Six Dead, 25 Injured As Heavy Rains Pummel Balochistan

QUETTA: The death toll due to heavy rains which have been battering Balochistan for the last five days has risen to six leaving 25 others wounded in various incidents across the province, Geo News reported on Sunday.

The N-70 highway which connects the province to Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has been closed off for traffic, said the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA).

The PDMA further revealed that a large number of vehicles are stranded at Dhana Sar due to landsliding due to heavy rains in eastern Balochistan's Koh-e-Suleman mountain range.

Traffic from Peshawar, Swat, Islamabad and Pindi have been instructed to stop at Dera Ismail Khan the PMD said, adding that the PZB-DI Khan Road has been blocked at Dhana Sar due to rains in Zhoab and Sherani.

Meanwhile, the administration at Zhoab and Qilla Saifullah administrations have been directed to stop the flow of traffic.

Furthermore, the PDMA has said that teams have been



dispatched for rescue and relief operations regarding the stranded travellers.

The downpour comes as several areas across the country namely Islamabad, Murree, Guliat, Gujranwala, Narowal, Sialkot, Balakot, Manshehra, Abbottabad and Swat are likely to witness rains today as per the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD).

Moreover, several areas of Azad Jammu and Kashmir, KP along with Balochistan's Khuzdar, Awaran and Lasbela are likely to witness downpour as well.

Earlier this week, the Met Office had said that most currents from the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal are penetrating southern and eastern parts of the country with thundershowers with gusty winds are making their way in parts of Sindh and other provinces.

This is not the first time in 2024 that Balochistan has reported heavy rains resulting in loss of life and landsliding as April earlier this year, a rain and flood emergency was declared by the provincial government due to continuous heavy rains which battered different districts of Balochistan, killing and injuring several people.

Prior to that, the province's port city Gwadar was battered by torrential rains in March prompting Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to announce a relief package during his visit to the inundated city where more than 40 people were killed in various incidents due to heavy rains.—RT/Agency

Japan to unveil new banknotes with advanced holographic features



ANKARA: Japan will start issuing new banknotes with the first-ever use of cutting-edge holographic technology.

Holographic portraits of historical figures appear to rotate in 3D on the bills, serving as an anti-counterfeit measure, Tokyo-based Kyodo News reported on Sunday.

In the first design change in 20 years, the 10,000-yen, 5,000-yen, and 1,000-yen bills will have larger face value numbers printed on them than the current versions for greater visibility.

Tactile marks for the visually impaired will also make them recognizable to touch. Eiichi Shibusawa

Hamas leader, Turkey's intelligence chief discuss Gaza truce talks

ISTANBUL: The head of the Turkish Intelligence Organization Ibrahim Kalin on Sunday met with Ismail Haniyeh, the head of the Hamas Political Bureau, the state-run TRT broadcaster reported.

They discussed the latest status of the ceasefire negotiations, the necessary measures to secure a lasting ceasefire, hostage exchange, and the delivery of humanitarian aid, the broadcaster reported.

Kalin expressed his condolences for the deaths of Haniyeh's sister, who was killed in a recent Israeli attack, and the Palestinian people killed in the ongoing of-



offensive, saying that Turkey will continue to stand by the Palestinian

people, according to the report.

The broadcaster did not identify the venue of the meeting.

Israel has been carrying out a massive offensive in the Gaza Strip in retaliation for a Hamas rampage on Oct. 7, 2023, during which about 1,200 people were killed and about 250 were taken hostage.

The Israeli assault caused a severe humanitarian crisis in the Palestinian enclave and killed more than 37,700 people, according to the health authorities in Gaza.—Agency

1 Dead, Baby Among 9 Injured In Ukraine Post Office Bombing

Kharkiv: One person was killed and nine others including a baby were injured Sunday in a strike on a post office in Ukraine's second city Kharkiv, local authorities said.

The head of Kharkiv's regional administration, Oleg Synegebov, said an eight-month-old baby was among those injured.

"A man, a post office employee, was killed," he said on Telegram.

The city of Kharkiv has been regularly targeted by Russian troops, who launched a major ground offensive in the region on May 10.

Russian President Vladimir Putin has said the



offensive in Ukraine's northeast was intended to create a "buffer zone" to protect Russia's border from Belgorod region from shelling.

On Saturday, seven people were also killed and nearly 40 injured in a Russian strike on Vilniansk, close to the regional hub of Zaporizhzhia.—Agency

5 Sri Lankan Fishermen Consume Contents Found In Bottle Floating In Sea, Die

Colombo: Five Sri Lankan fishermen who had consumed the contents in a bottle floating in the sea on Saturday had died by Sunday afternoon, Navy Spokesman Captain Gayan Wickramasuriya said.

The navy spokesman said the victims are a part of a six-man crew that sailed from the Tangalle Fisheries Harbour, reported Xinhua news agency.

They found the bottle around 320 nautical miles off the coast and had consumed its contents believed to be alcohol, he said. Wickramasuriya said one survivor is in critical condition and currently receiving emergency treatment.—Agency

Pakistan Seeks Qatar's Permission To Resell Excess LNG

ISLAMABAD: The government will approach Qatar seeking the Gulf state's permission to resell the liquefied natural gas (LNG) imported from Doha in the spot market in case there's low domestic demand, a senior official from the Ministry of Energy told media.

The revelation comes in light of the long-term LNG supply contract signed between Islamabad and Doha back in 2016. The price revision under the contract is due in February 2026.

Under the agreement, Pakistan State Oil (PSO) is obligated to take supplies regardless of domestic demand, causing pipeline issues for Sui Northern Gas Pipeline Limited (SNGPL) when the utility fails to consume the gas.

Officials have said that Pakistan is preparing to approach Qatar through diplomatic channels, seeking either to cancel shipments or sell them on the spot market



if domestic demand for LNG falls short.

The disclosure was made during a public hearing held on Friday by the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) regarding a petition by power distribution companies seeking permission to collect an additional Rs3.41 per unit from consumers due to fuel adjustments for May 2024.

During the hearing, power distribution companies noted that the actual

fuel rate was Rs9.12 per unit, compared to a reference price of Rs5.7 per unit, resulting in an increase of Rs3.41 per unit. They also reported a 5% drop in electricity consumption due to weather conditions, with total demand in May 2024 being only 17,000 megawatts. More electricity was produced using LNG rather than coal, with the cost of LNG-based electricity standing at Rs24.7 per unit.—RT/Agency

"Swarm" Of Ukrainian Drones Attack Russian Steel Mill In Overnight Raid



Moscow: A "swarm" of Ukrainian drones targeted Russian steelmaker Novolipetsk Steel's facility in a raid in the early hours of Sunday, but it sustained no serious damage, a company spokesperson said.

The attack achieved no results other than causing extra welding work, the spokesperson said. Igor Artamonov, the governor of the Lipetsk region in western Russia where the steel mill is located, said in a separate statement that nine drones had been downed over the steel mill.

Kyiv does not officially confirm or deny such attacks, but says the facilities being hit are supporting Russia's war in Ukraine and are thus legitimate military targets. NLMK denies cooperating with the defence ministry, saying that its Volynsk operations are not capable of producing military-grade heavy steels and it does not supply the military.

Russia's defence ministry said earlier that air defence systems had destroyed 36 drones launched by Ukraine overnight targeting several regions in Russia's southwest, including Lipetsk.

The ministry also said that Russian forces had taken over the villages of Spirine and Novooleksandrivka, which are in Ukraine's eastern Donetsk region, the Russian news agency RIA reported, the latest in a string of such incremental territorial claims.—Agency

Pakistan Railways Smashes Revenue Records In FY 2023-24

LAHORE: Pakistan Railways has reached a record high in revenue, with the organization reporting earnings of Rs 88 billion at the end of the financial year 2023-24, media reported on Sunday.

During the last year, the revenue of Pakistan Railways increased to more than Rs 88 billion, up from the previous Rs 63 billion, marking a 40 per cent increase in revenue compared to the last financial year.

Such revenue has never been recorded in the history of Pakistan Railways. Initially, the government set a revenue target of



Rs 73 billion for the department at the beginning of the financial year.

Baloch credited this achievement to the tireless work of the employees and expressed determination to increase the income to Rs 1 trillion next financial year.—RT/Agency

PPDA Exposes Truth Behind Hasan Shah And Associates



KARACHI: The Pakistan Petroleum Dealers Association (PPDA) has categorically dissociated itself from Hasan Shah and four other individuals, namely Khawaja Atif, Zaheer Paracha, Humayun Khan, and Nauman Butt. PPDA Chairman Abdul Sami Khan addressed concerns during a meeting, clarifying that Hasan Shah falsely claims affiliation as a focal person for the association, a role he does not hold. Several newspapers have erroneously published statements attrib-

uted to him in this capacity. Abdul Sami Khan emphasized that neither Hasan Shah nor his associates have any official connection with the PPDA, nor are they authorized representatives of members of the association. He stated unequivocally that their actions and statements do not reflect the PPDA's official stance. Present at the meeting were Malik Khuda Bakhs, Tariq Hasan, Anwar Kamal, and other members. Chairman Abdul Sami Khan reaffirmed that only individuals

authorized by him should be recognized as legitimate representatives of the PPDA. He cautioned the public against engaging with Hasan Shah and his associates in any dealings purportedly involving the PPDA, warning that such actions carry inherent risks and liabilities. The PPDA, under Abdul Sami Khan's leadership, remains committed to upholding its integrity and ensuring that only duly authorized individuals represent the association in any official capacity.—RT

PIA Slashes Fares For Umrah Pilgrims In Unprecedented Move



KARACHI: Pakistanis willing to perform Umrah in the coming month can now get the tickets at discounted prices till July 15 as the Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) slashed the fares for the lesser pilgrimage. A PIA spokesperson said Sunday that Umrah pilgrims going to Madina from Pakistan would benefit from discounted fares.

As per the slashed fares, the two-way ticket from Lahore, Islamabad to Madina would cost Rs86,000, while the two-way ticket from Karachi to Madina would be cost Rs76,000. The said rates are exclusive of taxes. Earlier, the Umrah ticket was available for Rs120,000. The spokesperson revealed that the discounted fares have been applied immediately, and will remain in effect till July 15, the spokesperson added. The Umrah pilgrimage is undertaken year-round in the Grand Mosque of Makkah. The new Umrah season started earlier this month, right after 1.8 million Muslims from all over the world undertook the annual Hajj pilgrimage. It may be noted that Saudi Arabia is reportedly seeking to increase the number of Muslims performing Umrah to reach 30 million a year. "Every year, there is an increase in numbers," Gulf News quoted Abdulrahman bin Fahd, an assistant undersecretary for Umrah Affairs. The Saudi official told a local TV channel Al Ekhbariya about the plan aiming to target more than 10 million Umrah pilgrims this year.—RT/Agency

Tragic Road Accident Claims Seven Lives, Leaves 30 Injured During Karachi Picnic

KARACHI: At least seven people, including women and children, were killed and 30 others injured when an "over-speeding" bus turned over near Mauripur area of Karachi on Sunday.



According to the rescue officials, the bus overturned after colliding with a trailer truck near Mauripur Truck Adda. They said the deceased included four children and three women, while six to seven other people of the injured were in critical condition.

Police said the accident happened as the vehicle's speed was over the limit, when victims of the accident were going to have a picnic. As per the rescue officials, the bodies and the injured were shifted to Civil Hospital Karachi for medico-legal formalities and treatment, respectively. The bodies were later shifted to the Sohrab Goth mortuary, the hospital administration said. The deceased have been identified as Sughra,

A relative of the victims, Mohammad Sakina, 6, Zeenat, 4, Bashir said from 40 to 45 people were traveling on the ill-fated vehicle for picnic. He requested Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah to provide treatment to the injured at a private hospital. "Some of them are critically injured, therefore, the Sindh chief minister should order for their transfer to a private hospital," he said. Bashir also demanded an inquiry into the incident to bring the culprit to justice.—RT/Agency

Sharjeel: Rs 675.4 Million Raised from 'Premium Number Plates' Auction To Aid Flood Victims

KARACHI: The Sindh Excise Department has generated Rs 675.4 million from the auction of 40 'Premium Number Plates' for first time in the history of the country.



In the auction ceremony held at a local hotel on Sunday, the Premium No. 1 Plate was auctioned in Rs100 million, Premium No Plate 5 in Rs50.3 million, No. 7 in Rs40.6 million, No. 8 in Rs40.10 million and No. 9 in Rs40 millions.

Investigation Launched Into Shocking Deaths Tied To Heatwave And Loadshedding



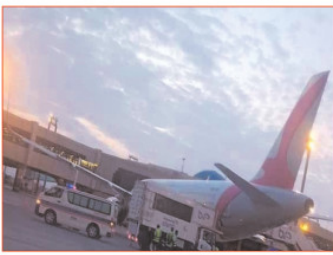
KARACHI: The authorities in Karachi have initiated the investigation into the mysterious deaths of the residents who died in recent days due to extreme 'heatwave' and 'load shedding', media reported on Sunday.

Following the news of mysterious deaths in Karachi, the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) on June 26 directed the CEO of K-Electric to submit a report within three days.

After the statement of Edhi Foundation regarding the deaths due to load shedding in an extreme heatwave in Karachi, a letter was issued under the signature of Director General Head of the Consumer Affairs Department Islamabad, Naveed Elahi Sheikh, directing the CEO of KE to submit a detailed report related to the incident.

NEPRA has initiated an investigation on the increase in death rate during the recent heat wave in Karachi, in which the aspect is being sought as to how many people have died due to extreme heat, hypothermia, or electricity load shedding in the past few days. This investigation is being conducted in light of the statement of the head of Edhi Foundation, in which he claimed that according to the heirs of those who died during the heat wave in Karachi, the deaths were due to power outage, heating, and humidity. In this investigation, the authorities are investigating the factor whether there is negligence on the part of KE in the recent deaths or not, NEPRA will also decide the future course of action in light of this investigation.—RT/Agency

PM Claims Budget Saved Public From Additional Taxes, Aligned With IMF Demands

LAHORE/ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that though it was tough to make a budget as per the direction of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and that the government saved the masses from many more taxes, media reported on Sunday.



"I had long discussions on each point and the matter was settled and no more taxes were imposed on agriculture and fertilisers," PM Shehbaz said revealing that the Fund wanted more taxes on agriculture, fertiliser and other domains including medical equipment — even those for charity hospitals.

It is to be noted that President Asif Ali Zardari on Sunday greenlighted the tax-heavy Finance Bill 2024, which will go into effect from July 1, which marks the beginning of the next fiscal year.

The federal government presented the tax-loaded Rs18.877 trillion budget for the fiscal year 2024-25 (FY25) two weeks ago and it was duly passed by the National Assembly on Thursday earlier this week.

The FY25 budget comes in the backdrop of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led coalition government's efforts to meet the prerequisites for the IMF programme — longer and larger — IMF programme by setting a high tax revenue target taking a shot at lowering the fiscal deficit from 7.4% to 5.9%.

Earlier, media reported that although the Washington-based lender has agreed on abolishing the goods and services tax (GST) on textbooks, restoring rebates for professors, and researchers,

withdrawing Federal Excise Duty (FED) on cement and some other technical changes; it has refused to allow the government to restore export proceeds into a fixed-income tax regime, as the exporters were lobbying hard against going into a normal tax regime.

Meanwhile, the Centre has also introduced reforms in the pension scheme to initiate a gradual reduction in superannuation liabilities. Speaking to media, the prime minister acknowledged that the government was under pressure from the Fund and that had the government accepted all direct

ions of the IMF, there would have been more burden on many sectors, which would have increased difficulties for the government. He revealed that the IMF wanted medical equipment to be taxed — including the one for charity hospitals. "I convinced them in this regard and such taxes were not imposed," he said. Highlighting that the government and the lender agreed on taxes after difficult "long discussions", the PM reiterated his commitment to strengthening the country's economy and highlighted the positive indicators for investment opportunities. "We will fulfil the dream of a strong economy; there are clear and positive messages of investment in Pakistan by the friendly countries," he noted. Furthermore, PM Shehbaz also expressed his optimism that it would be Pakistan's last agreement with the IMF and the budget under it, after which people would get more relief. Fazl Reiterates Call For Fresh Elections To Achieve Political Stability

ISLAMABAD: Jamiat Ulama-e-Islam Fazl (JUI-F) leader Maulana Fazlur Rehman has called for fresh elections in Pakistan, demanding assurances that the military establishment will not interfere in the electoral process.



He made these remarks during a press briefing in Islamabad following a meeting of the Central Majlis Shura on Sunday.

Rejecting the February 8 elections as "rigged and unacceptable," Rehman emphasised his party's ongoing opposition to what he perceives as interference by the establishment in electoral matters.

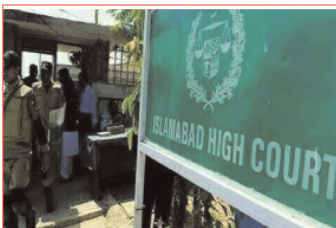
He underscored the importance of upholding the integrity of the electoral process and urged that the people's right to vote be safeguarded, urging the establishment and intelligence agencies to refrain from meddling in future elections.

Asserting the constitutional roles of all institutions, Rehman reiterated support for the military in matters of national defence, but criticised a recent resolution by the US House of Representatives, labelling it a diplomatic setback for Pakistan and advising the US to refrain from meddling in Pakistan's internal affairs regarding international issues, he condemned the global silence on Gaza and criticised current Muslim leadership, questioning their legacy for future generations.

He further reaffirmed JUI-F's support for Pakistan-China relations while acknowledging the need to rebuild Chinese confidence in investing in Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Audio Leaks Case: IHC Urges PM To Disclose Actors Behind 'Mass Surveillance'

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has declared that 'any form of surveillance' on citizens was illegal and unconstitutional, asking Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif to explain who is 'responsible for the mass surveillance, media reported on Sunday.



IHC Justice Babar Sattar issued a written order on the plea of Bushra Bibi, wife of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, and Najam Saqib, son of former chief justice Saqib Nisar, against the audio leaks.

In the written order, Justice Sattar said that the federal government was responsible for the surveillance of four million citizens and PM Shehbaz and cabinet members are "collectively and individually" responsible for the mass surveillance.

The IHC also ordered the Prime Minister to submit a report on the legal framework of the surveillance system within six weeks. The report must also clarify whether the surveillance is being carried out in accordance with the law and the constitution.

It also directed the Prime Minister to explain who is responsible for the installation of the surveillance sys-

tem and mass surveillance and "who is in charge of the system that is affecting the privacy of citizens".

Meanwhile, the IHC also issued contempt of court notice to Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) Chairman and its members, directing them to submit reports within six weeks. "The court is of the view that the PTA apparently misinterpreted the surveillance system in the report", it added.

Justice Babar, in its order, directed the telecommunication authority to submit its response on surveillance system in a sealed envelope. "PTA should explain where this surveillance system is installed and who has access to it", it added.

The written order further stated that the telecom companies will have to submit

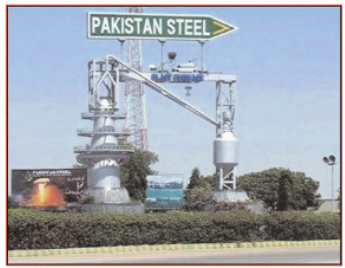
Afghan Taliban Participate In Third Round Of UN Talks In Doha



DOHA: Representatives of Afghanistan's Taliban government began meetings on Sunday with UN officials as they attended talks in Doha with special envoys to the Central Asian country for the first time, a UN spokesperson said. The two-day, UN-hosted meeting in Qatar is the third of its kind in the gas-rich emirate in just over a year but the first to include Taliban authorities who seized power in Afghanistan in 2021. Preparatory discussions have begun with the UN meeting separately with many of the special envoys in attendance and with the Taliban representatives," the UN spokesperson, who asked not to be named, told AFPUN officials and over 20 envoys, including the UN special representative to Afghanistan, were expected to meet with the Taliban government's delegation led by spokesperson Zabihullah Mujahid. The talks in Doha were due to discuss increasing engagement with

Pakistan Steel Mills Faces Closure As Government Halts Gas Supply

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Industries and Production has directed the authorities of Pakistan Steel Mills to discontinue the supply of gas to the steel plant, effectively rendering the revival efforts of Pakistan Steel Mills futile. According to a notification issued by the Ministry of Industries and Production, the chief executive officer of Pakistan Steel has been instructed to halt the supply of gas to the Pakistan Steel plant, reported media on Sunday.



They have been informed that following the decision taken in the Economic Coordination Committee's meeting on May 23, the responsibility for gas obligations of Pakistan Steel will not be with the federal government after June 30.

The circular stated that gas supply to important parts of Pakistan Steel's plants, including blast furnaces, was severely restricted since June 2015, with the aim of preventing significant components like blast furnaces from being completely closed.

Gas pressure was reduced for the first time in January 2015, although the factories of Pakistan Steel were operating at 50% production at

that time, on March 10, 2015, when the production rate was raised to 65% gas pressure.

It was further reduced on June 10, 2015, due to which billions of rupees in losses were incurred for Pakistan Steel.

Moreover, due to the reduction in gas pressure, it was kept at a venturi meter to maintain the life of machinery and equipment. After the issuance of the circular, it has been removed after nearly nine years.

Pakistan Steel had estimated losses of Rs 22.4 billion as of June 30, 2023, while gas obligations reached Rs 33.5 billion.

The assets of Pakistan Steel amount to Rs 83 bil-

lion, while during the fiscal year 2023-24, it faced a loss of Rs 6 million per hour due to the constant presence of accounts.

It is worth mentioning that the foundation of Pakistan Steel was laid by former Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto on December 30, 1973.

The design of the Pakistan Steel Mills, which has the capacity to produce 2.2 million tons of steel, was also given a 12% shareholding in 2009. Pakistan Steel Mills employees have said that its closure and the decision to build an export processing zone in its place have been made without their consultation or consent.—RT/Agency

Iranian Envoy Condemns US Resolution On Pakistan Polls As 'Form Of Extortion'

ISLAMABAD: Iran on Sunday condemned the resolution passed by the United States Congress, seeking an investigation of claims of "interference or irregularities" in February 8 elections.



"We condemn controversial US resolution on Pakistan elections," said Iran's Ambassador to Pakistan Dr Reza Amiri Moghadam.

The US House of Representatives, earlier this week, in an overwhelming majority, voted to demand a "full and independent investigation of claims of interference or irregularities" in the polls.

The resolution HR 901 was passed by a massive 308 against seven votes on Tuesday, which makes 85% of the total American lawmakers in the Legislature.

Through the resolution, the US lawmakers had emphasised the need for the Pakistani public's participation in the country's democratic process months after its general

polls were contested as "rigged" and its outcome termed "delayed" by political parties now seated on the opposition benches in the legislature.

Following this, the National Assembly on Friday passed a resolution to condemn the US Congress resolution and termed it "contrary to facts" and "interference" in its internal affairs.

The resolution was tabled by Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) lawmaker Shaista Pervaiz Malik, and passed by a majority in the National Assembly amid a noisy protest of the opposition benches. Expressing his discontent, Moghadam said that the US resolution is an "open interference in the domestic affairs of an independent member of the United Nations". The ambassador called it a form of extortion under the guise of supporting democracy. Speaking about the deadly situation in Gaza, the envoy also said that Washington stops a ceasefire resolution through its power to veto. "The US supports the genocide of the people of Gaza by providing lethal weapons to the Zionist regime," said the ambassador.—RT/Agency
