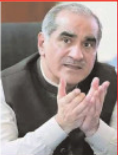

UN Urges For Imran's Immediate Release, Denounces His Detention As Arbitrary

WASHINGTON: Former prime minister and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan's detention is arbitrary and in violation of international law, a UN human rights working group said in an opinion issued on Monday, adding the jailed politician should be released immediately.



He is also fighting dozens of other cases which are continuing. Khan and his party say the charges were politically motivated to thwart his return to power.

The Geneva-based UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention said that the "appropriate remedy would be to release Mr Khan immediately and accord him an enforceable right to compensation and other reparations, in accordance with international law."

The UN working group said Khan's legal woes were part of a "much larger campaign of repression" against him and his PTI party. It said that in the lead up to the 2024 elections, members of Khan's party were arrested and tortured and their rallies were disrupted.

It also alleged "widespread fraud on election day, stealing dozens of parliamentary seats."

The Pakistani embassy in Washington had no immediate comment.

Pakistan's election commission denies that the elections were rigged. Khan has been in jail since last August and was convicted in some cases ahead of a national election in February.

In recent months, Pakistani courts have suspended Khan's jail sentences in two cases about the illegal acquisition and sale of state gifts, and also overturned his conviction on charges of leaking state secrets.

However, he has remained in prison due to a conviction in another case in which a trial court ruled that his 2018 marriage was unlawful. Khan also faces a trial under anti-terrorism charges in connection with violence in May last year.

Khan came to power in 2018 and was ousted in 2022 through a vote of no-confidence. He alleged the US and the military establishment

Traders Launch Nationwide Protests Against Tax Hikes and Electricity Price Increases

RAWALPINDI/ PE-SHAWAR/ ISLAMABAD:

Traders in all major centres of the country staged protests against the government's decision to increase taxes and electricity prices in the upcoming fiscal year.

In Islamabad, traders, responding to a call by the All Pakistan Anjuman-e-Tajir, staged a major protest at Aabpara Chowk, blocking the main road. Heavy police presence was deployed to disperse the demonstrators as trader caravans from across the city converged at Aabpara Chowk.

A large police presence was deployed as convoys of traders led by leaders from various markets across Islamabad arrived to protest against the government's tax increases and electricity price hikes.

Chanting slogans against the government, protesters held banners and electricity bills. "This is purely a traders' protest, no political party is allowed to claim it," declared Aabpara Market General Secretary Akhtar Abbasi.

The US, Britain and the European Union expressed concern about reported irregularities in the elections and urged a probe while United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres expressed concern about violence and the suspension of mobile communications services during the elections.—RT/Agency



raised our voices against the exorbitant increase in electricity prices. "Traders nationwide are protesting the significant hike in electricity prices," stated Ajmal Baloch, President of the All Pakistan Anjuman-e-Tajir. "Soon, the rulers will be held accountable by the people," he warned.

"The prime minister, who says our budget is made by the IMF, should resign immediately," Baloch asserted. "There are twelve-hour power outages in the country. The same companies you

make agreements with are responsible for generating electricity," he added.

Baloch highlighted the various taxes on electricity bills: "There is a 21% sales tax on a fourteen-thousand-rupee bill, followed by thirteen other types of taxes." He criticised political leaders for not fulfilling their election promises. "Nawaz Sharif and Bilawal promised free electricity for up to 300 units during elections," he said. "May God guide you, as you are failing to govern effectively," Baloch remarked. He further condemned the government for its mismanagement and corruption.

the widespread nature of the protests. "Traders are protesting in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Karachi, Balochistan, and Sindh. There is no district or tehsil in Pakistan without protests right now."

He issued a warning to the government. "If these electricity taxes are not withdrawn, we will initiate a shut-down strike. If the government does not roll back the electricity price hike, we will decide on further actions after consultation."

Baloch criticised the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) for labelling traders as thieves, emphasising that 17,000 industrialists and traders pay taxes. He accused parliamentarians of misappropriating funds allocated for infrastructure.

"These rulers are not just thieves; they are robbers," Baloch declared. "Prime Minister, listen carefully, your government is on shaky ground. Withdraw the taxes on electricity, or the next protest will be a siege of the Prime Minister's House," he warned. He noted that 1.5 million Pakistanis have left the country and criticised Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar for ruining the real estate

business with excessive taxation.

Baloch concluded with rallying cries for unity and action, urging people to awaken for the country's sake. Women also joined the protest against electricity price hikes, with the demonstration ending peacefully as traders dispersed.

In Rawalpindi, symbolic shut-down strikes failed to materialise across all markets due to factionalism within trader organisations. However, traders took to the streets, chanting slogans against taxes on electricity bills and burning gas bills.

The protest on Bank Road saw participation from traders of Kashmir Road, Haider Road, and other markets. One faction of traders held a symbolic strike by closing businesses at 4pm.

In Peshawar, traders held a protest rally against tax impositions, electricity price hikes, and inflation. Organised by the Tanzeem Tajir, the rally commenced from the Miled Chowk and concluded at Chowk Yadgar, with participants demanding the removal of newly imposed taxes and reduction in electricity prices.—RT/Agency

Establishment Prepared To Scale Back Its Roles As Pakistan Makes Progress: Rana Sanaulah

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister's Adviser on Political and Public Affairs Rana Sanaulah announced that the current establishment is prepared to limit their roles if economic and political progress is ensured.



During an appearance on a private TV programme on Monday, Sanaulah stated, "I say this with utmost belief and complete information that the current establishment has no personal agenda. These people have no personal agenda."

His comments came in response to questions about the establishment's involvement in politics.

Sanaulah acknowledged historical issues, noting that some previous establishment leaders had long-term personal agendas.

"Some people in the establishment had 10-11 year agendas. Some even had agendas for their whole life," he remarked. However, he assured that the current leadership's sole focus is on national stability.

Addressing the media ab-

sence of PML-N supremo Nawaz Sharif, Sanaulah clarified, "Nothing is holding him back." He emphasised the importance of timing in politics, suggesting that actions must be taken "at the right time."

He dismissed claims that political forces favour Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif over Nawaz, noting that it was Nawaz who nominated his brother for the premiership.

On the issue of who the lawmakers listen to, Sanaulah explained, "As

lawmakers, they listen to the PM, and as party leaders, they listen to the PML-N president."

He highlighted that the PML-N has always been open to dialogue, criticising the PTI for avoiding the negotiating table.

Sanaulah also addressed speculation around talks with Maulana Fazlur Rahman, clarifying that all meetings between the PML-N leadership and the JUI-F chief were transparent and focused on mutual concerns.—RT/Agency

Nine Terrorists Killed In Two KP Operations



RAWALPINDI: Security forces during two intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) gunned down nine terrorists, said Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) in a statement Monday.

On the reported presence of terrorists in the Tirah area of KP, the security forces conducted an IBO, killing seven including two wanted terrorists.

The killed wanted terrorists Najeem albin Abdur Rehman and Ashfaq aka Muavia have been killed, the statement read.

"The killed terrorists remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against security forces. Weapons, ammunition, and explosives were also recovered from killed terrorists," the ISPR added.

In a separate IBO in Lakkhi Marwat, two more terrorists were gunned down. "Sanitisation of the areas is being conducted to eliminate any other terrorist found in the area as the Security forces of Pakistan are determined to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country," the ISPR's statement added.

Earlier, the security forces during an IBO in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Khyber district killed five terrorists.

According to the ISPR, the killed terrorists were involved in attacks on security forces and the killing of innocent civilians across the country.

During the operation, the security forces also recovered weapons, bullets and explosives from the possession of the deceased terrorists.—RT/Agency

ATC Issues Warning to Declare Gandapur And Others As 'Absconders' For Failure To Appear

ISLAMABAD: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in the federal capital on Monday warned that it would declare Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur and other suspects as "absconder" over their failure to appear before the court.



The remarks were made by ATC Judge Tahir Abbas Supra during the hearing of two cases lodged against Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan and other party leaders regarding alleged vandalism and violation of Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) at Sangiani and I-9 police stations in the federal capital.

During the hearing today, PTI leaders Faisal Jawad Khan, Ali Nawaz Awan, Wasiq Qayyum, Aamer Kiani and other suspects appeared before the court whereas exemption pleas were filed by KP CM Gandapur and PTI leader Amir Mughal.

Reacting to the request for exemption from appearance, Judge Supra said that it was not a valid reason to argue that one can't appear before the court because he's

out of the city.

"Who's responsible for the failure to appear, the suspects or the court?" the judge questioned adding that no request for exemption of appearance from anyone will be entertained.

"We are issuing non-bailable warrants for all the absent suspects," Judge Supra remarked.

In response, the lawyers acknowledged that the onus for failure to appear before the court falls on the suspects and requested the court one more chance, reassuring that all the suspects would appear before the court in the next hearing.

At this, Judge Supra said that the suspects who fail to appear before the court on July 8 will be declared "abs-

conders", stressing that it is not necessary to wait for 30 days to declare a fugitive of the court an absconder.

The judge also stressed that the cases will only proceed if they have something in them and otherwise will be disposed of.

"I have to conclude these cases [and] it will only benefit you [if that happens]," he said.

Additionally, the court also sought a written reply from the Superintendent Adilajal regarding the appearance of the PTI founder via video link.

The court then adjourned both cases till July 8 and announced that the cases would be heard on a daily basis from the next hearing.—RT/Agency

SAU, FAO Sign MoU to Promote Climate-Resilient Agriculture

TANDO JAM: Sindh Agriculture University (SAU), Tando Jam and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) have signed an agreement aimed at promoting modern agricultural practices and assisting small farmers in coping with climate threats. The initiative focuses on improving water use, increasing production, and enhancing marketing through existing Farmer Field Schools (FFS). The MoU was signed by SAU Vice Chancellor Dr. Fateh Marri and FAO Senior Scientific Officer and Head of the Sindh Office, James Robert Okoth. This agreement is part of the broader project titled "Climate-Resilient Agriculture and Water Management for Transforming the Indus Basin." Under the agreement, SAU and FAO will work together to holistically improve climate-resilient agriculture and water management practices. These improvements will be integrated into agricultural extension courses at higher education institutions in Sindh and Punjab. During the signing ceremony in the University Senate Hall on Monday, Vice Chancellor Dr. Fateh Marri emphasized the importance of supporting small farmers in addressing climate change threats. He highlighted the need for intercropping, capacity building, and providing farmers with seeds, water, and marketing assistance to enhance prosperity. Dr. Marri noted that training programs for farmers through Farmer Field Schools would be further strengthened with the help of university experts and FAO. FAO's James Okoth stated that they are collaborating with educational and research institutions in Sindh and Punjab to transfer modern technology to small farmers and improve agricultural practices through short courses and Farmer Field Schools. He expressed hope for success in addressing food security, nutritional deficiencies, and the impacts of climate change jointly. Under a previously signed agreement, SAU and FAO established 22 demonstration sites during the Rabi and Kharif cropping seasons. These efforts aim to enhance farmer capacity by directly training 660 beneficiaries and an additional 1,100 farmers through field days. Furthermore, 44 field days were conducted to train 2,200 farmers on Climate-Resilient Agriculture (CRA) and water management practices. Simplified, field-validated training materials were developed in English, Sindhi, and Urdu, and efforts continue to raise awareness among male and female farmers about climate change risks and mitigation strategies collaboratively.

MQM-P Leader Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui Demands Full Equality For All Races In Pakistan

KARACHI: Muttahida Qaumi Movement Pakistan (MQM-P) leader Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui asserted that all races residing in Pakistan must be granted equal rights.

JI Announces July 12 Rally In Islamabad Against IMF Sponsored Tax-Heavy Budget



LAHORE: Jamaat-i-Islami (JI) emir Hafiz Naemur Rehman on Monday announced a protest in Islamabad for July 12 against "high taxes and exorbitant electricity tariff".

The JI announced its Haq Do Awam Ko (give rights to the masses) movement in a post on social media platform X, adding that Rehman would lead the rally.

President Asif Ali Zardari assented to the government's tax-heavy Finance Bill 2024 for the fiscal year on Sunday. The government had presented the budget two weeks ago, drawing sharp criticism from opposition parties, especially the PML-N.

Addressing a press conference in Lahore today, Rehman spoke at length about the economic challenges faced by the citizens, stating that the JI could not see the people suffer under such a "circus".

He said the government and the ruling classes were not ready to abandon their perks and privileges but had no problems pushing the nation into "a greater difficulty".

Termining the budget "cruel", he said it was insufficient to fulfill the government's "greed" and allowed that it wanted to levy further taxes on the populace.—RT/Agency

TikTok Informs PHC: PTA Tasked With Reporting Blasphemous Content

PESHAWAR: TikTok has shifted the onus of blasphemous content's removal to the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), saying that it takes down videos after receiving complaints from the regulator.

In a letter written to the Peshawar High Court (PHC), where a petition is filed against the app, TikTok said it has recently not received any escalations with respect to blasphemous content through the special portal.

A bench comprising Justice SM Atiq Shah and Justice Shakeel Ahmed is presiding over the critical hearing of the petition seeking to ban TikTok in Pakistan for its alleged blasphemous and immoral content.

The petition was filed by Advocate Imran Khan requesting the court to direct the respondents - PTA, Federal Investigation Agency



(FIA), and Ministry of Information - to ban TikTok in Pakistan permanently for persistent breach of guidelines and violation of the Constitution. In the previous hearing, the court directed the telecommunication regulator to ensure the removal of any blasphemous and objectionable material TikTok. The video-sharing app, in its letter, said that TikTok has a strict policy with respect to Pakistan of taking the issue of blasphemous content with utmost seriousness. "It is precisely because of this seriousness that TikTok has taken measures and provides special access to a dedicated portal to the PTA to report such content for expedited review by TikTok," said the letter. "It said that the app blocks access to any content which violates Pakistan's blasphemy laws as reported through the portal, adding that it hasn't received any escalations recently.—RT/Agency

Teenage Girl Killed By Aerial Firing At Wedding Event

LAHORE: In a tragic incident, a teenage girl lost her life after being hit by a bullet at a wedding event in Lahore, media reported.

According to the details, the incident took place within the limits of Manawan police station where

some people were aerial firing, resulting in the death of a 16-year-old girl.

Meanwhile, a case has been registered against unknown suspects on the complaint of the victim's father.

The police launched an investigation into the incident and took the father of the groom into custody.

Superintendent of Police (SP) Cantt said that raids are being conducted to arrest the suspects and efforts are underway to apprehend them soon.—RT/Agency

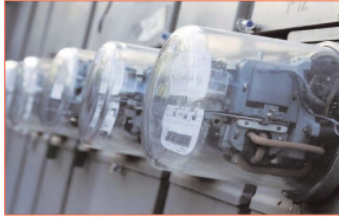
Karachi Residents Fume Over Astronomical Electricity Bills

KARACHI: Residents of Karachi are facing severe challenges due to a dramatic increase in electricity bills, with many struggling to pay their dues. The recent surge in electricity costs has left citizens in shock, particularly those using between 300 and 1,000 units per month.

From June 21 to July 1, the city has experienced a significant rise in heatstroke cases, adding to the citizens' woes. In the past 24 hours alone, hospitals have treated 144 people for heatstroke symptoms, with 34 requiring admission. Despite these hardships, Karachiites are now grappling with unprecedented electricity bills.

A Karachi resident, who previously paid around Rs8,000 to Rs10,000 for 300-plus units, received a bill of Rs28,901 for 305 units, despite not using an air conditioner. This family, living on the top floor and enduring extreme heat, is now struggling to cope with the high costs.

Another resident reported a bill of Rs13,000 for 289



units, highlighting a significant disparity compared to previous charges. Even a flat that has been vacant for a year received a bill of Rs4,300 for just five units, primarily due to the fuel adjustment charges imposed by K-Electric.

K-Electric's spokesperson explained that the charges are authorized by NEPRA, but residents are finding these taxes incomprehensible. Bills for those using over 200 units now range from Rs10,000 to Rs15,000, far beyond what many can afford.

The situation is particularly dire for the middle and lower-income classes

woodi Bohra Jamaat representatives were present at the meeting. Shah directed Commissioner Karachi and IG Police to engage with Bohra Community representatives to finalize security arrangements in consultation with them.—RT

Shah expressed gratitude to Afaq Ahmed for organizing the event, emphasizing the right to legal and peaceful protest while condemning damage to public and government property. He highlighted the establishment of a parliamentary

committee by the Sindh government to address public grievances regarding K-Electric, aiming to resolve issues of load shedding and overbilling. Shah disclosed recent visits to K-Electric's Central Load Dispatch Center, urging strategic load shedding only when essential and advocating for fair treatment of bill payment defaults. Furthermore, Shah outlined initiatives to support consumers, including disregarding dues for consumers using up to 200 units and ensuring uninterrupted electricity supply. He referenced Chairman Bilawal Bhutto's manifesto promise of free electricity up to 300 units, pledging provincial efforts to deliver free electricity up to 200 units in the absence of federal government support.—RT

Petroleum Dealers Announce Nationwide Strike Set To Rock Nation From July 5th

KARACHI: The Pakistan Petroleum Dealers Association has announced a countrywide strike on July 5, against the government's decision of 0.5% advance tax, media reported.

The chairman urged the government to withdraw the tax immediately as it will make impossible for the petrol dealers to run their businesses. Yesterday, the federal government increased the petrol price in the country by Rs 7.45 per litre for the next fortnight.—RT/Agency

Despite these irregularities, candidates aligned with Khan managed to secure the highest number of seats, indicating significant popular support for his leadership. However, the subsequent formation of a coalition government by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) has deepened the political divide.

It is evident that the current power structure in

Pakistan cannot sustain this trajectory without risking severe consequences. The widening gap between the government's actions and the public's mandate is a recipe for disaster, threatening to further destabilize the nation. The international community's concern, including statements from the US, Britain, and the European Union, underscores the need for a thorough investigation into the electoral irregularities and the immediate release of Imran Khan.

The Pakistani government must reevaluate its approach and heed the calls for justice and transparency. Addressing the legitimate grievances of the public and restoring faith in democratic processes is crucial. Failure to do so will not only exacerbate the political crisis but also undermine Pakistan's standing on the global stage. It is time for pragmatic and fair solutions to ensure a stable and democratic future for Pakistan.

Boom Boom lambasts Babar Azam's captaincy in T20 World Cup 2024

KARACHI: Former Pakistan captain and star all-rounder Shahid Afridi criticised national men's team's white-ball skipper Babar Azam for his leadership in the recently ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024, co-hosted by the United States of America and the West Indies.

Speaking at a press conference, Afridi highlighted the importance of the leader's mindset in shaping the team's demeanour, while citing the example of India captain Rohit Sharma, who led the nation to their second T20 World Cup title.

"Look, the role of a leader is always very important. The body language of the leader becomes the body language of the team. The leader has to set an example," said Afridi.

"Take Rohit Sharma as an example. Now, look at his game and his style of playing, the lower-order batsmen who come in are all confident because the captain likes to play aggressive and attacking cricket. So, I always believe that the role of the captain is very important," he added.

Shahid Afridi also shared that he is open to serve Pakistan Cricket but only at the grassroots level, which according to him, is the core reason behind the team's struggle at the international level.

"I am always available for Pakistan cricket, but at the grassroots level, there is no need for me with the Pakistan team. Whatever is needed is at the grassroots level," stated Afridi.

The legendary all-rounder also termed the national team's performance in the mega event "unsatisfactory" before going on to express his eagerness regarding the "major changes" expected to be made by the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman Mohsin Naqvi.

"Overall, if the performance had been good, you wouldn't be asking this question. Let's see what the chairman has said about making major changes to the team. I am also waiting to see what these changes will be, and you are too," stated Shahid Afridi.

"A positive decision needs to be made, and the changes shouldn't just be superficial. The real issue lies at the grassroots level of our cricket, which many cricketers often talk about.—Agency

T20 World Cup setback prompts PCB to bar Saim Ayub, Azam Khan from CPL



LAHORE: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has re-enforced its stance on the No Objection Certificate (NOC) policy following Pakistan's early exit from the T20 World Cup, co-hosted by the USA and West Indies.

This policy restricts centrally and domestically contracted players from participating in more than two overseas leagues annually, aiming to manage player workload and prioritise national commitments.

In light of this policy, PCB officials have withheld NOCs for Azam Khan and Saim Ayub, despite their retention by Caribbean Premier League (CPL) teams.

Both players were part of Pakistan's World Cup squad. An official source emphasised that all players, regardless of contract type, must adhere strictly to this regulation. The board also reserves the right to deny NOC requests based on factors such as player workload, fitness concerns, or domestic team obligations.

"The other players have also been given a clear message that the two NOCs rule applies to both centrally and domestically contracted players, and the board also reserves the right to turn down any NOC request from any player. The PCB retains the right to refuse an NOC if it believes a player's workload and fitness may be compromised or if the player is needed for domestic duties," a PCB official stated.

The enforcement of this policy was highlighted recently when leg-spinner Usama Mir was informed that he had exhausted his quota of two leagues for the year despite his eligibility due to a lack of international commitments and domestic events.—Agency

Samina Baig leads group of Pakistani, Italian mountaineers to summit K2



A team of Pakistani and foreigner mountaineers is on an expedition to summit the second highest peak of the world, 8,611 metres high K2.

The group includes four Pakistani and four Italian mountaineers and it is being accompanied by media team.

The mountaineers said that their arrival at the destination depend on the weather.—Agency

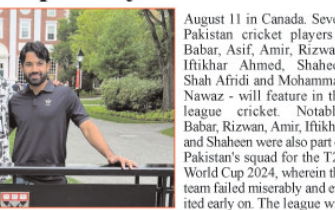
Babar Azam to now play under Mohammad Rizwan's captaincy

Carlos Alcaraz wins Wimbledon opener as Murray wants 'closure'

—Agency Carlos Alcaraz defeated 269th-ranked qualifier Mark Lajal at the start of his Wimbledon title defence on Monday as Andy Murray decided whether or not to call a halt to his All England Club singles career.

As action got underway, Australian Open champion Aryna Sabalenka was heading home after withdrawing from the tournament with a shoulder injury.

Alcaraz, still only 21, is chasing his fourth Grand Slam title and hopes to become just the sixth man after Rod Laver, Bjorn Borg, Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal and Novak Djokovic to win the French Open and Wimbledon back-to-back.

Opening the Centre Court programme, Carlos Alcaraz recovered from a breakdown in each of the first two sets to see off the deadlocked Lajal 7-6 (7/3), 7-5, 6-2.

"He played a really good match, he obviously surprised me a little bit because I didn't have the chance to see him play a lot," said Carlos Alcaraz.

This time last year, Lajal was losing a first-round match at a second-tier Challenger event in the United States and earning a paltry \$780 - on Monday he banked \$75,000.

Two-time Wimbledon semi-finalist Sabalenka, ranked third in the world, is one of eight players to have pulled out since the draw was made.

She had admitted she was not 100 per cent fit after suffering a shoulder injury at the Berlin Open and has been replaced by Russian lucky loser Erika Andreava.

"Heartbroken to have to tell you all that I won't be able to play The Championships this year," wrote 26-year-old Sabalenka on X.

Russian fifth seed Daniil Medvedev reached the second round and admitted he was happy not to be playing on the All England Club's famed Centre Court.

Medvedev, a semi-finalist last year, hit 16 aces in his 6-3, 6-4, 6-2 win over Aleksandr Kovacevic of the United States. "I've still never lost on Court One so hopefully I can play a lot more matches on this court," said Medvedev.—Agency

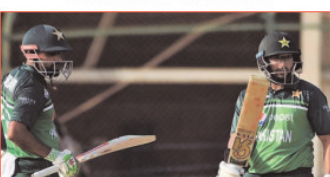

He urged human rights organisations to speak out against the brutal killing of women and children, emphasising that those involved in such acts of terrorism deserve no leniency. Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti expressed deep regret over the deaths in the explosion, stating, "The loss of precious human lives in this tragic incident is heart-wrenching. The hands stained with innocent blood will soon be caught by the law." Meanwhile, the Awami National Party (ANP) condemned the bomb attack and the deaths of women and children, stating that the terrorists aim to spread fear among the public. "Targeting innocent and defenceless citizens is unacceptable in any religion. Those involved in such acts are enemies of humanity," an ANP spokesman said. Sharjeel Demands Governor's Resignation Amid Explosive Controversy

KARACHI: The Sindh government on Monday called for the immediate resignation of Governor Kamran Tessori.

Sindh Senior Minister for Excise, Taxation, Narcotics Control, Transport, and Mass Transit Sharjeel Inam Memon and Energy Minister Nasir Hussain Shah made the demand during a press conference, criticising the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) for its divisive politics.

Memon accused the MQM-P of resorting to hatred and a blame game, stating that the party has become irrelevant at the local level. "MQM's politics of hatred and accusations are outdated. They are no longer visible at the Union Council level," he said.

He also criticised MQM-P Convener Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui for his remarks against the former prime minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto.



Memon claimed that the MQM-P had indulged in nepotism by hiring its workers in local government institutions and criticised the party for its stance on the quota system. "The MQM-P's demands to end the quota system are inappropriate," he added.

Shah echoed Memon's sentiments, stating that the MQM-P has not abandoned its old ways and continues to engage in hateful politics. "MQM-P should be ashamed of its illegal recruitments and the burning of living people for extortion in Balda factory incident," he said.

Both ministers demanded resignation from Governor Tessori to resign, accusing him of failing to address the issues caused by the MQM-P. "It is inappropriate to make baseless accusations against our martyred leaders. Governor Sindh should resign immediately," said Shah.

The ministers reiterated their commitment to maintaining decency in politics, despite MQM-P's provocations. "We do not want to respond to rudeness with rudeness or to escalate hateful politics," Memon stated.—RT

SC Judge: ECP Holds Authority Over Reserved Seats Formula, Can Declare Candidates Independent

ISLAMABAD: Supreme Court Justice Ayesha Malik Monday said that the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) is in control of the formula for the allocation of reserved seats, giving it the power to declare any candidate as independent.

"The ECP can declare anyone independent as per its will," Justice Malik said as a 13-member full-court SC bench heard the Sunni Itehad Council's (SIC) plea against the Peshawar High Court's (PHC) verdict upholding the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) decision denying them the reserved seats.

The bench, led by Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa, comprises Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Muneeb Akhtar, Justice Yahya Afridi, Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Athar Minallah, Justice Syed Hassan Azhar Rizvi, Justice Shahid Waheed, Justice Irfan Saadat Khan and Justice Naeem Akhtar Afghan.

During the hearing today, ECP's lawyer Sikander



Bashir apprised the court that the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) issued party affiliation certificates along with Form 66, which were signed by Barrister Gohar Khan.

However, the counsel contended that nomination papers filed by the party's candidates weren't valid since it had never held intra-party polls at that time nor had elected a party chairman.

Furthermore, Justice Ayesha inquired about the electoral body's counsel regarding the KP advocate general's argument wherein he

maintained that the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP) was allocated reserved seats despite failure to submit the list of candidates.

"You [ECP] didn't take any action against the BAP," the judge remarked, further asking the electoral body if it had held any meeting on the said issue regarding the aforesaid party.

Meanwhile, Justice Mansoor stressed that the court would every political party to be given its due rights.

"The court wants to ensure that no party is given more or less seats than what is due to it," he said.

The court then directed the ECP to submit the details of the reserved seats allocated in 2024 along with the documents regarding the re-

levant formula and adjourned the hearing till 11:30am Tuesday (tomorrow).

The whole reserved seats issue holds significance as the PTI-backed independent candidates, who make up the majority of the opposition benches, lost as many as 77 reserved seats in NA and provincial assemblies due to the PHC's verdict.

The issue first emerged after the PTI-backed independent candidates emerged victorious in the February 8 elections and subsequently joined the SIC in a bid to claim seats reserved for minorities and women.

However, the PTI suffered a setback after the ECP citing the party's failure to submit its list of candidates, denied allocating the reserved seats to the SIC.

The party then approached the PHC which upheld the electoral body's decision on the matter.

Subsequently, the SIC moved the SC seeking to set aside the PHC verdict and the allocation of 67 women and 11 minority seats in the assemblies.

They eventually ended up in the apex court where the

ECP has maintained that the reserved seats cannot be allotted to the SIC as the party did not submit the list of candidates before the January 24 deadline.

Whereas, the federal government, via Attorney General of Pakistan (AGP) Mansoor Usman Awan submitted its written response to the apex court urging it to reject the SIC's appeal seeking the allocation of reserved seats for women and minorities in the National and provincial assemblies.

The 30-page written submission argues that the reserved seats for minorities and women could be given to a political party which contested the polls and won at least one seat besides providing a list of candidates based on the total number of seats it won as per the law.

Additionally, the PTI has also moved the SC seeking to become a party in the said case contending that the PTI and the SIC were deprived of reserved seats despite being eligible. The SIC was ready to provide a list of candidates for the allocations but was denied permission to submit it.—RT/Agency

PTI Forms Five-Member Team For Talks with JUI-F Following Fazl's Criticism

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has formed a five-member negotiation team for talks with Jamaat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) and has communicated the names to the religious party, sources told media.

The negotiation team, as per the sources, comprises PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar, former National Assembly speaker Asad Qaiser, party's Central Information Secretary Raouf Hasan, Senator Shibli Faraz, and NA Opposition Leader Omar Ayub Khan.

The development comes as the leadership of both parties, who have been arch-rivals traditionally, have held multiple meetings since the February 8 polls due to their mutual concerns over the alleged interference and manipulation during the general elections. Last month, PTI's Qaiser called on JUI-F Emir Maulana Fazlur Rehman in Islamabad wherein both leaders agreed on fulfilling the role of opposition in the National Assembly as well as on the constitution of a political committee to address various issues between them and formulate a political strategy.

Both parties have also found common ground in their opposition to the recently announced anti-terror drive titled "Operation Azm-e-Istekham" announced by the Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led government.



During the said meeting, the PTI and the JUI-F leadership maintained that military operation was not the solution to the problems and stressed the role of political parties in achieving peace and stability in the province.

But speaking to the media in Islamabad a day earlier, Fazl said that the party's Majlis-e-Shura — the top decision-making body — has decided against becoming part of any alliance for now and has expressed "serious reservations" over the PTI in light of the reports that a verge of joining hands against the coalition government led by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N).

"Our stance and reservations against PTI are very serious," he said, adding that the decision-making body had reviewed JUI-F's meetings with other political parties and declared it nothing more than a "political process."

Speaking about the prospects of dialogue, the

politico said that his party welcomed PTI if they wanted to hold talks.

However, he said that the PTI still "lacked consistency," he added.

"Sunni Itehad Council (SIC) chief ruled out an alliance with JUI-F. These are two contradictory opinions which we are finding difficult to establish a stance on," Fazl said while referring to the possible dialogue with PTI and the reluctance of its allied party to enter talks.

The JUI-F chief further stated that different delegations hold consultations on behalf of the jailed PTI founder but the party hadn't yet decided on a team for holding the dialogue.

He said that his party did not have any hesitation in creating a "better political environment" and it stood by the positive approach towards its political rivals.

The politician called on the PTI and SIC to remove the confusion regarding their position on holding a dialogue.—RT/Agency

Headline Inflation Increases To 12.6% Year-on-Year In June

ISLAMABAD: Picking up the pace at the outset of the new fiscal year, headline inflation came in at 12.6% year-on-year (YoY) in June compared to 11.8% in May, according to data released by the country's federal statistics agency on Monday. This increase aligns with market and government expectations.

According to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) based inflation increased by 0.5% on a month-on-month basis in June. The CPI-based inflation in May rose 11.8% from a year earlier, the lowest reading in 30 months and below the finance ministry's projections.

The country has been beset by inflation above 20% since May 2022. Last year in May, inflation jumped as high as 38% as the country navigated reforms as part of an International Monetary Fund (IMF) bailout programme. However, inflation has since slowed down.

Brokerage firm Topline Securities noted that the reading matched their projections, so it did not surprise them.

This CPI reading brings the average inflation for fiscal year 2023-24 to 23.4%, compared to 29.2% in fiscal year 2022-23.

The Ministry of Finance, in its Monthly Economic Update and Outlook report, had forecast a marginally



higher inflation rate for June 2024 compared to the previous month but noted it was still lower than the same period last year.

The ministry attributed the hike to higher prices of perishable items driven by Eid ul Adha and added that the government is working to manage supply and demand to bring about price stability, reduce market volatility, and improve the inflation outlook.

JS Global Research, another brokerage firm, had projected CPI inflation to hover around 12.5% YoY, with the FY24 average at 23.8%, continuing the slow-down that started in May (11.8%). This compares to 17.3% in April and a significant drop from 29.4% in June 2023.

"June is expected to see a 37 basis points month-on-month decrease in food inflation, following an 8% month-on-month drop in April. This translates to a year-on-year food inflation rate of just 0.5% in June, a significant improvement

from 39% in Jun-2023," JS Global said in its report.

AKD Securities Limited, another brokerage house, estimated that inflation would register a 12.55% year-on-year increase, up from 11.76% in the previous month.

"On a monthly basis, it is likely to ascend by 0.45%, following a slight rebound in vegetable prices due to ongoing festivities during the current month," the AKD report said.

As per the AKD report, with both food and fuel indices slowing down in May, "we anticipate near-term CPI readings to remain highly susceptible to the upcoming inflationary hikes announced in the federal budget."

"Additionally, any further rebounds in essential commodity prices driven by a pullback in crude oil in the wake of global monetary easing, alongside moderate weakness in the domestic currency, if any, may keep disinflationary prospects in check," according to the AKD report.—RT/Agency

Pakistan And India Exchange Prisoner Lists Through Diplomatic Channels



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and India on Monday exchanged lists of prisoners in each other's custody through a diplomatic channel in Islamabad and New Delhi.

These lists are exchanged simultaneously, in pursuance of the Consular Agreement of 2008, every year on January 1 and July 1, a Foreign Office statement said.

As per the statement, Pakistan handed over a list of 254 Indian or believed-to-be Indian civilians and fishermen incarcerated in Pakistani jails, while India shared a list of 452 Pakistani or believed-to-be Pakistani civilian prisoners and fishermen in Indian jails.

Moreover, a list of 38 missing Pakistani defence personnel, believed to be in India's custody since the wars of 1965 and 1971, was also handed over by Pakistan.

Islamabad has called for immediate release and repa-

triation of all Pakistani prisoners who have completed their sentence in India.

A request for special consular access to various believed-to-be-Pakistani prisoners, including the physically — and mentally-challenged prisoners, and for expeditious confirmation of their national status has been made, the statement added.

The government also urged India to ensure safety, security, and well-being of all Pakistani or believed-to-be-Pakistani prisoners, awaiting their release and repatriation.

"The government is committed to addressing humanitarian matters as a priority. It will continue its endeavours to ensure early return of all Pakistani prisoners in Indian jails," the statement read.

As part of these efforts, repatriation of 62 Pakistani prisoners in 2023, and four others in 2024, has so far been secured.—RT/Agency

PTI States No Room For Those Who Left During Crisis

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Core Committee on Monday announced that those who distanced themselves from the party during challenging times would not be welcomed back.

Tarar Addresses Shahid Khaqan And Miftah's Criticism Regarding Tax-Heavy Budget

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attallah Tarar on Monday hit back at former PML-N leaders, Shahid Khaqan Abbasi and Miftah Ismail, following the latter's criticism of 'tax-laden' Budget 2024-25, media reported.

Addressing a joint press conference, Shahid Khaqan and Miftah Ismail — who recently launched a new political party — castigated the Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led government for burdening the inflation-hit citizens by imposing more taxes in the Budget 2024-25.

Abbasi asked the government to reduce its expenditures instead of imposing taxes on the public, demanding review of the federal budget — which took effect from today following an accord by President Asif Ali Zardari. He alleged that the government allocated Rs500 billion for legislators, stating that political favours were being prioritised over the welfare of the people. He



questioned whether the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) was aware of the massive tax evasion in the cigarette industry. The former PM highlighted that Pakistan's largest expenditure was debt servicing, and that no one was willing to tackle the issue of diesel smuggling. He also pointed out that factories in FATA (Federally Administered Tribal Areas) were not benefiting the local population, and that taxes should be levied on them as they were not contributing to the region's development. Meanwhile, Miftah Ismail suggested that taxing diesel and LPG smuggling could generate significant revenue, mak-

ing other taxes unnecessary. He also recalled that the IMF had recommended taxing agriculture and real estate, which the government had failed to implement. Responding to the criticism, Information Minister Attallah Ismail dispelled the impression that Rs500 billion rupees are being distributed among legislators in the name of development schemes Tarar said the total amount of Public Sector Development Programme is Rs1,500 billion and made it clear that the government has no intention to give Rs500 billion to members of the national and the provincial assemblies.—RT/Agency
