## Muharram Moon Not Sighted in Pakistan; Ashura To Be Observed On July 17

QUETTA: The crescent moon for Muharram has not been sighted in Pakistan and the first day of the month will fall on Monday (July 8), Central Ruet-e-Hilal Committee Chairman Maulana Abdul Khair Azad announced on Saturday.

Accordingly, Ashura — the 10th day of Muharram will fall on July 17.

The announcement was made after the Central Ruet-e-Hilal Committee met in Quetta to sight the crescent of Muharram Haram 1446 Hijri.

Chairman of the moon-sighting body Maulana Abdul Khair presided over the meeting to sight the moon of the first month of the Islamic calendar.

The meetings of zonal and district bodies of the Ruet-e-Hilal Committee will also simultaneously be held at their respective headquarters.

The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) had predicted unlikely sighting of Muharram moon sighting today due to partly cloudy or cloudy weather in most parts of the country as the moon-sighting body gets



busy. The Met Office had said that the new moon would be born on the crossing conjunction point at 03:57 PST on July 6. Muharram is regarded as one of the four sacred Islamic months. Ashura falls on its 10th day when grandson of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), Hazrat Imam Husain (RA) along with his family members were martyred in the battle of Karbala. Faithful hold processions and majalis across the country in Muharram, while religious scholars address huge gatherings amid tight security, with thousands of law enforcers deployed to ensure security. To curb the spread of hate material on the internet, the provincial

governments have sought the suspension of six social media applications for about a week during Muharram so that security is not compromised. Moreover, Sindh government has banned 143 ulama and zakireen for 60 days as part of security measures during the month of Muharram, while Punjab government has requisitioned the services of the Pakistan Army and Pakistan Rangers while announcing a ban on pillion riding across the province.

However, the federal government has not yet taken any decision to suspend internet services during Muharram, a spokesperson for the Ministry of Interior Friday said.—RT/Agency

## Oil and Gas Exploration Firms Commit To \$5 Billion Investment In Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: A group of local and international oil and gas exploration and production (E&P) companies is ready to pump \$5 billion in Pakistan's petroleum sector, showing trust in the government's investor-friendly policies and assurances for the security of their capital, according to state-run APP.

An announcement to this effect came to light in a meeting held between a delegation of the local and international E&P firms with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Saturday as the pressure continues to mount on Islamabad to shore up the country's wobbly energy infrastructure.

If it materialises, it will not only help provide more reliable energy supplies to the country's growing population but also cut reliance on expensive oil imports.

"Exploring the oil and gas reserves at the local level in Pakistan is our top priority," PM Shehbaz said during the meeting with the delegation at Prime Minister House, inviting the oil and gas explorers to also tap Pakistan's offshore reserves.

Pakistan spends billions of dollars every year on importing oil and gas, the PM lamented. "Production from local reserves will save Pak-



istan's valuable foreign exchange, and fuel and gas will become affordable for the common man."

Facing a severe balance of payments crisis, record inflation, and sharp currency devaluation, Pakistan lacks sufficient resources to operate its oil and gas plants, leading to the import of most of its energy needs.

Consequently, planned power cuts, known as loadshedding, occur every summer due to fuel shortages and high demand. The duration of these power cuts varies across different areas of the country, which has a population of 241 million.

The delegates informed the Prime Minister that over the next three years, around 240 exploratory wells would be drilled for \$5 billion to explore petroleum and gas in Pakistan.

State Bank of Pakistan (SB) Governor Jamil Ahmed told the meeting that, on the prime minister's special instructions, all the remittances (profit of the business) had been sent to the respective countries of the oil and gas production companies.

The delegation thanked the prime minister for making the petroleum and gas exploration and production sector part of the consultation process, listening to their problems, and finding serious solutions to them.

The meeting was attended by Deputy PM Ishaq Dar, federal ministers Ahmad Khan Cheema, Muhammad Aurangzeb, Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi, Engineer Amir Muqam, Ahsan Iqbal, Sardar Awas Khan Leghari, Deputy Chairman Planning Commission Jehanzeb Khan, Coordinator to PM Rana Ehsan Afzal, Chairman Federal Board of Revenue Amjad Zubair Tiwana, representatives of domestic and international companies, and relevant high officials.

According to the Pakistan Economic Survey 2023-24, Pakistan's petroleum import bill decreased in the first nine months (July-March) of the fiscal year 2023-24 not because of higher local produc-

tion but due to lower consumption.

The Economic Survey states that the drop in consumption was caused by reduced economic activity and higher product prices. Total petroleum product imports fell to 11,047 thousand metric tons, valued at \$8.36 billion.

The main imported products are motor spirit (MS), high-speed diesel (HSD), and crude oil. Compared to the same period last fiscal year (2022-23), the import bill for MS dropped from \$3.704 billion to \$3.156 billion, for HSD from \$1.646 billion to \$1.050 billion, and for crude oil from \$4.287 billion to \$4.051 billion.

Oil and gas exploration companies showed mixed results during this period. Gas exploration declined by 2%, while crude oil production increased by 1.5%. Gas production decreased from 1,190 million cubic feet in the first nine months of the previous fiscal year to 1,166 million cubic feet in the same period this year. However, crude oil production rose by 1.5%, from 25.5 million barrels to 25.7 million barrels.—RT/Agency

## Court Reserves Verdict On Imran's Interim Bail In Three May 9 Cases

LAHORE: An anti-terrorism court has reserved its decision on Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan's interim bail requests related to the May 9 incidents, including the Jinnah House case and two other cases.

During the hearing on Saturday, Imran counsel, Barrister Salman Safdar, argued that the PTI founder was being targeted for political reasons.

"In my entire career, I have never seen so many cases against a single individual. Those who were actually inciting against institutions at the scene were not arrested," Safdar alleged.

How could a case be filed against him when he was in custody at the time of the crime?" PTI chief's counsel questioned.

The government lawyer countered, stating that according to a special branch report, the former premier had instructed his followers to attack civil and military installations if he were arrested.

"The directive to attack military installations across Pakistan resulted in the events that transpired," the



prosecutor claimed.

After hearing arguments from both sides, the court reserved its judgement on Khan's interim bail requests. Earlier this week, on July 3, a district and sessions court in Islamabad acquitted the founder of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Imran Khan, along with all other defendants in a case registered at Islamabad's Aahpara police station.

Judicial Magistrate Yasir Mahmood announced the reserved verdict, clearing Imran Khan, Shah Mahmood Qureshi, Sheikh Rasheed, Shehryar Afridi, Faisal Javed, Raja Khuram Nawaz, Ali Nawaz Awan, Asad

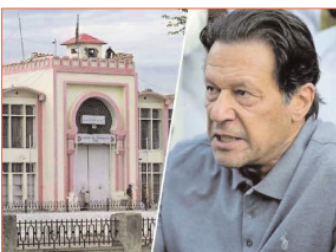
Qaiser, and others of all charges. The acquittal came after the defence, represented by Advocate Sardar Masroof and Ansar Kiani, presented their arguments on behalf of accused Imran Khan, Sheikh Rasheed, and others. On July 1, at least 140 workers of PTI were acquitted in a case related to holding a rally before the general elections. The court found that the accused were neither arrested at the scene nor was any incriminating material recovered from them. Furthermore, there were no complaints from local residents regarding road blockades.—RT/Agency

## Imran Appeals for Improved Jail Conditions In Letter To President Zardari And Shehbaz

LAHORE: Imran Khan the incarcerated founding leader of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has urged President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to ensure proper jail facilities through a letter penned by his counsel, Azhar Siddique.

On Saturday, Siddiqui, who is the head of the Judicial Activism Panel said through the letter that the PTI chief was not being provided with the facilities mandated by law and was being denied visits from people.

"Why is there an obstruction in Imran Khan's meetings?" the letter questions, emphasising the need for Khan to be given basic amenities in prison.

## Operation Azm-e-Istehkam: Nawaz Urges Full Support For Armed Forces

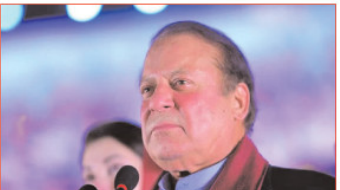
ISLAMABAD: After the announcement of a new anti-terrorism drive — Operation Azm-e-Istehkam (Resolve for Stability), Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) President Nawaz Sharif on Saturday called for extending "unwavering support to armed forces and security institutions to root out terrorism from the country."

"[The] issues which were countered seven years ago have now become a serious crisis, again," Nawaz said in a meeting with PML-N Parliamentary Leader in the Senate Irfan Siddiqui in Murree today.

Slamming the opposition's criticism against Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, the former prime minister said that some elements behind "instability" and "defamation" of the country abroad were not interested in [fortifying] democracy.

He demanded all stakeholders to show firm support to the security institutions to eliminate the menace of terrorism.

The PML-N's top leader made the statement after Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif decided to organise an all-parties conference (APC)



take all stakeholders into confidence on the newly launched anti-terrorism operation — a reinvigorated and re-energised national counter-terrorism drive following a spike in terrorist attacks.

The federal cabinet last week approved the launching of the counter-terrorism operation following the National Action Plan's Central Action Committee's recommendations to turn up the heat on militants targeting Pakistan — which would be focused on intelligence-based operations instead of large-scale military action.

Regarding the scope of the new operation, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif also revealed in a recent interview with the Voice of America (VoA) that Pakistan could

target terrorist hideouts across the border in Afghanistan to target outlawed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and other militant outfits for carrying out attacks in the Pakistani territory.

However, opposition parties including the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Jamiat-e-Ulema Islam Fazl (JUI-F), Awami National Party (ANP), and others have voiced concerns over the military operation, demanding that parliament must be taken into confidence before taking any such decision.

Incarcerated PTI founder Imran Khan announced a day ago that his party would participate in the PML-N government-sponsored APC and "hear what the government has to say".—RT/Agency

## Pensions Place Significant Burden On Government: Aurangzeb

KARACHI: Federal Minister for Finance, Muhammad Aurangzeb, on Saturday termed the pension for retired employees as a burden on the government, media reported.

Addressing industrialists and businessmen at the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI), Aurangzeb highlighted several critical economic issues and measures.

He stressed that the federal cabinet's decision not to take salaries had not substantially alleviated the treasury's burden.

He highlighted that the substantial expenditure reduction would be achieved through the closure of inefficient departments.

The Finance Minister also mentioned plans to reduce the policy rate this year, noting that while making emo-



to avoid entertaining any Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) personally.

Additionally, Aurangzeb noted that the caretaker government has consistently supported various initiatives, despite the industry's struggles due to difficult economic decisions. He promised to consider the recommendations from businessmen regarding the budget.

Addressing the Independent Power Producers (IPPs) issue, Aurangzeb criticized the previous PTI government's insufficient efforts and expressed a desire to resolve the matter. He also pointed out that 60% of the total tax revenue is allocated to the provinces, with taxes on farmhouses and large houses being imposed in consultation with provincial governments.—RT/Agency

## Sindh Being Subjected to Injustice in Power Supply: CM Murad

JAMSHORO: Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah has voiced concerns over the perceived injustice in the province's power supply, despite Sindh contributing significantly to the national grid. Speaking to the media, Shah highlighted that Sindh provides 3,000 megawatts of cheaper electricity generated in Thar, yet its residents suffer from severe power shortages, especially in the scorching heat.



"Sindh's people are suffering most in this hot weather, and we are making every effort to provide relief," the Chief Minister stated. He also mentioned that Bilawal Bhutto has raised this critical issue in the National Assembly, seeking redress. ## Political and social organizations protest against prolonged load shedding in Kandiaro

KANDIARO: Leaders and activists from various political and social organizations staged a protest demonstration in Kandiaro against prolonged, unannounced load shedding and the non-replacement of faulty transformers. 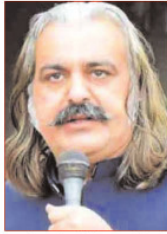


## Nation To Join Imran Khan In Hunger Strike: Gandapur

## Sindh Government To Launch Pakistan's First EV And Pink EV Taxis: Sharjeel

**KARACHI:** The Sindh government on Saturday announced that it would soon launch Pakistan's first EV taxis in the province.

"Pakistan's first EV taxis and Pink EV taxis will be started soon by Transport Department Government of Sindh," Sindh Minister for Information, Excise, Narcotics and Transport Sharjeel Inam Memon said in a post on X, formerly Twitter.

The announcement comes as province's largest city, Karachi, suffers from high air pollution levels due to an overwhelmingly large number of gasoline-engine vehicles in light of an arguably insufficient mass-transit system to meet its needs.

However, the minister did not disclose any timeline for EV vehicles' launch in Sindh.

The introduction of EV



taxis is likely to not only address the air pollution issue but might also provide an alternate and hopefully cheaper commute option to the masses owing to the soaring fuel prices which not only have resulted in high fares being charged by various online ride-hailing apps but also costs owners to private vehicles heavily as well.

Furthermore, the introduction of electric vehicles also falls in line with the global trend and shift towards environment-friendly vehicles as several countries around the world strive to shift away from fossil fuels.

Earlier this year, Karachi received 30 hybrid and 50 electric buses as part of the Peoples Bus Service fleet being run in the city - pushing the total number to 300 vehicles.—RT

## NEPRA Announces Relief Of PKR 1.67 Per Unit under April FCA Notification

**KARACHI:** The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has issued its decision regarding the Fuel Charges Adjustment (FCA) requested by KE for April 2024, indicating a benefit of PKR 1.67 per kWh to be passed on to customers in their July 2024 bills.

Earlier, NEPRA had notified a decision that specified the FCA rate of PKR 1.7111 per kWh and PKR 1.3946 per kWh, pertaining to July 2023 and September 2023 respectively, to be applied to customers' July 2024 bills.

Fuel Charge Adjustments are incurred by utilities due to global variations in fuel prices used to generate electricity and changes in generation mix. These costs are passed through to the consumers following NEPRA's scrutiny and approval.

Earlier to this, the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Anti-Corruption Circle Lahore initiated an inquiry against Lahore Electric Supply Company (LESCO).

The FIA spokesperson stated that the power distri-



butions company - LESCO - allegedly overbilled millions of protected customers by sending the consumers more than 200 units of power bills. Due to the alleged over-billing, the category of the protected consumers changed, resulting in an additional burden of millions.—RT/Agency

## Tessori Announces Rs1 Million Grant for PILER

**KARACHI:** Sindh Governor Kamran Khan Tessori has pledged a Rs1 million grant for the Pakistan Institute of Labor Education and Research (PILER) and announced the launch of free IT courses at the Governor House for 200 children of workers.

The incident - which occurred after the employee was returning from a bank in Muhammad Ali Society - was captured on CCTV footage.

The footage of the incident revealed that the bakery employee stopped the car outside the bakery while another employee can be seen approaching the vehicle to help with the cash in the meantime the security guard was helping the employee to park the car. During this period, the robbers - allegedly following the victim from the bank - snatched the bag full of cash from the hands of the other employee and attempted to flee from the scene. The security guard tried to stop the robbery but was met with gunfire. Fortunately, the bullets did not hit the guard, while his weapon also fell during the scuffle. The robbers seized the guard's weapon and made their escape towards Jail Road.—RT/Agency

## Man Arrested For Harassing Women With Obscene Pictures

## Old wine in a new bottle!

The launch of Awaam Pakistan by former Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leaders Shahid Khaqan Abbasi and Miftah Ismail heralds yet another attempt to rejuvenate the political landscape of Pakistan. However, the history of similar ventures suggests that this initiative is likely to be another exercise in futility. While the party's slogan, "Awaam Pakistan: Badlein ge nizam" (People of Pakistan: We will change the system), offers a tantalizing promise, it risks being perceived as nothing more than old wine in a new bottle.

The assertion that Awaam Pakistan will eschew hereditary politics is commendable, yet the skepticism surrounding its efficacy is hard to dispel. citizenry.

If Awaam Pakistan aspires to be more than a transient phenomenon, it must transcend the conventional model of political parties and establish a genuine connection with the people it aims to represent. This requires more than rhetoric; it demands a commitment to transparency, accountability, and grassroots engagement. The people's will, not the machinations of political elites, should be the driving force behind any meaningful transformation.

Ultimately, the success of any political movement hinges on its ability to honor the aspirations of the populace. The repeated failures of similar initiatives underscore the need for a paradigm shift in how political change is envisioned and enacted in Pakistan. It is only by respecting and amplifying the genuine will of the people that Awaam Pakistan can hope to achieve its ambitious goals.

A spokesperson for the paramilitary force detailed the operation, revealing that the deceased suspects were identified as Imdad alias Imdo Bhayo and his brother, Nazeer alias Mawali alias Miandad Imdad Bhayo was named as the mastermind behind the abduction of the traders and was implicated in numerous criminal activities, including kidnappings, encounters, attacks on police pickets, robberies, and murders, with an estimated 25 to 50 cases against him and his brother.



The spokesperson added that Imdad's body was transported to Civil Hospital Kandhkot for legal formalities. Meanwhile, search operations are ongoing to apprehend the fleeing suspects who sustained injuries during the encounter. The Bhayo gang, which operates in Kashmir, has long been infamous for its involvement in abductions. Earlier this year, in March, a man named Agha Sohail Ali Khan was kidnapped for a ransom of Rs20 million after leaving his home in Sukkur. His body was tragically discovered in

Kashmir's riverine area in May. Police sources reported that the kidnappers had initially demanded Rs20 million for his release but later reduced the amount to Rs10 million.

The rescue of the three Hindu traders marks a significant victory for law enforcement agencies in their ongoing battle against the entrenched criminal networks operating in Sindh. The successful operation underscores the commitment of the Pakistan Rangers and Sindh police to restoring safety and security in the region.—RT

Cristiano Ronaldo was seen offering a shoulder to his teammate Pepe to cry on after their team was kicked out of the Euro 2024 on Friday following a 3-3 defeat from France in their quarter-final clash.

This was potentially the last international tournament for the 41-year-old Portuguese defender who has been seen crying uncontrollably on the field after France sealed a dramatic shootout win against Portugal in Hamburg.

With the latest defeat, the future of Ronaldo, who marked his record sixth European Championship this year, hangs in balance as he is yet to decide whether he will continue playing for his national side, Goal reported.

Portugal's 39-year-old captain previously said that Euro 2024 would be his last European competition with the national side but it is still uncertain whether he had played his last match with Portugal or not.

After the defeat, Portugal's head coach Roberto

"I have decided to make the very tough decision to withdraw from the mixed doubles," she said.

"I'm disappointed as I was



really looking forward to playing with Andy but I've got to take care."

Murray, a two-time singles champion, was competing at Wimbledon for the final time before retiring later this year.

The Scot made his last SW19 appearance on Thursday, when he suf-

fered as 7-6(6), 6-4 defeat in the 2024 Wimbledon men's doubles alongside brother Jamie to John Peers and Rinky Hijikata.

After his defeat in men's doubles, the 37-year-old legend was honoured by Wimbledon where a montage consisting of his legendary career

was shown on the big screen. Names like Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal, Novak Djokovic and others appeared in the video capturing the 37-year-old's memorable time on the court.

"It wasn't something that I'd asked for," said Murray. "When I was making the decision around the singles, the club spoke to me and said they would like to do something after one of my matches here. I think if I'd played singles, then would do it after I potentially lost in the singles. If the singles doesn't happen, we'd like to have it after the first doubles match, regardless of the result.—Agency

"You got to look at 'Djoker'. He may be the third favourite, but he has won the tournament seven times," Wimbledon said Connors.

"If he's healthy and feeling good, then why wouldn't he be right up there as the favourite? Sure, he's had a tough season so far, but champions like Djokovic thrive under pressure. Wimbledon could be his stage to turn it all around.

"Djokovic has this incredible knack for wearing down his opponents. His movement on the court is like no other, and his stamina is second to none."

Connors also declared Alcaraz the biggest threat to the Serb and also added that Sinner will have some additional pressure as he is the world No. 1.

"Alcaraz has that fearless spirit and, having already won a Major, he knows what it takes to perform on the big stage," Connors continued.

"Sinner has had tough outings against Djokovic in the past. Facing Djokovic at Wimbledon, where his game shines brightest, is a different challenge altogether.—Agency

## Muharram Security Measures: Sindh Bans 143 Ulema And Zakireen For 60 Days

KARACHI: The Sindh government on Saturday banned 143 ulema and zakireen for 60 days as part of security measures during the month of Muharram, expected to begin on July 8.

As per a notification issued by the Sindh Home Department, they will not be allowed to travel or deliver a speech for the next 60 days. The order is applicable with immediate effect.

"On recommendation of the inspector general of police, the speeches and travel of 143 scholars and zakirs hailing from 13 districts have been banned," the department said.

It said the ban had been imposed on them while viewing the law and order situation during the Islamic month.

Muharram marks the beginning of the Islamic calendar, and it is regarded as one of the four sacred Islamic months. During this month, Hazrat Imam Hussain (RA), the grandson of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (SAWW), along with his family members were martyred.

Faithful hold processions and majalis across



the country in Muharram, Committee of the Cabinet on Law and Order was convened to review security and administrative arrangements for Muharram.

In this meeting, it was decided to suspend social media platforms, including Facebook, Twitter, WhatsApp, YouTube, TikTok and Instagram from Muharram 6 to 11 to prevent the dissemination of hate material and misinformation, aiming to avert sectarian violence.

However, the federal government has not yet taken any decision to suspend internet services during Muharram, a spokesperson for the Ministry of Interior Friday said.—RT/Agency

## Mustafa Kamal Disputes Sindh CM's Claims On Development

KARACHI: Muttahida Qaumi Movement Pakistan (MQM-P) leader Mustafa Kamal has rejected Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah's claims of development in the province.

Addressing a press conference in Karachi, he denounced the claims of Sindh CM about the development in Sindh on the public reaction.

He gave a response to the briefing of Sindh CM Murad Ali Shah about the 15 years of performance of his government and development projects across the province, stating that Sindh CM projected the false image of Sindh.

He suggested the Sindh government resolve the public crisis, claiming, the Sindh government had not done anything for the province.

He asserted, "you don't need advertisement if you have done some work for development." He claimed 50 new Sindh provinces could be built in the 18 thousand billion funds spent in 15 years.

Mustafa Kamal highlighted, MQM-P MPA's strived for Sindh province rights in the assembly.

He asserted that during his mayorship, Karachi was included among the top 12 developing cities in the world.

Mustafa Kamal highlighted his achievements during his tenure, claiming his government provided water in Karachi areas including Orangi, Lyari, Baldia, and Baba Bhatt spending 300 billion.—RT/Agency

## Karachi Domestic Worker Allegedly Drugged And Pushed From Third Floor



KARACHI: A female domestic worker on Saturday fell from the third floor of an apartment in Clifton which led to her legs and arms fractured, media reported on Saturday.

The incident has raised serious concerns and prompted an investigation by local authorities.

The injured housemaid, in a statement, claimed she was drugged and pushed from the apartment. "I did not jump myself, someone pushed me. I am a domestic worker," she stated.

According to the police officials, the woman suffered multiple fractures, including broken bones in both her legs and hands. Meanwhile, the local authorities are currently investigating the circumstances surrounding the incident to determine the veracity of the housemaid's claims and to identify those responsible.—RT/Agency

## Karachi's CBC Declares Rain Emergency

KARACHI: In view of upcoming monsoon spell, the Cantonment Board Clifton (CBC) of Karachi on Saturday imposed rain emergency in areas falling under its jurisdiction by appointing special teams for timely drainage of rainwater.

A CBC spokesperson said in a statement 1,288 staffers have been appointed on special duties under its rain emergency plan, including 638 in seven sectors for rain emergency while 650 other staffers will work for the drainage of rainwater.

The board also spotted low-lying areas which could be affected after downpours. Special teams have been assigned for performing specific tasks in DHA Phase-I to Phase VIII, Clifton Block 8, 9 and the market area.

It added that heavy machinery would be deployed in the affected areas, whereas, additional teams would be deputed at commercial avenues of Khayaban-e-Shujaat, Khayaban-e-Shehbaz, Khayaban-e-Badar and Khayaban-e-Tariq. The CBC teams will be equipped with 1,000-3,000-gallon water bowzers and powerful pumps for drainage purposes, the spokesperson concluded. Strong monsoon currents from the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating the upper and central parts of the country. A fresh westerly wave is affecting most upper and central parts of the country, according to the Pakistan Meteorological Department's (PMD) weather report issued today.

Residents of the provincial capital have longed for a break from the sweltering temperatures that have recently gripped the city. But, so far, Karachi has only received drizzle in some areas which improved the weather but was still not enough to break the heat spell.

The PMD said earlier today that despite the prediction of hot weather in the



port city, there is a chance of drizzling at night. According to the Met Office, the weather in Karachi, however, will continue to remain hot and humid in the next 24 hours.—RT/Agency

## TAAP Opposes Latest Tax Hike On Air Tickets

KARACHI: The Travel Agents Association of Pakistan (TAAP) has declared the recent increase in taxes on air tickets as illegal, stating that the sharp rise has plunged the industry into a severe crisis.

During a press conference held at their office, former chairman and member of the executive committee Nadeem Sharif emphasized that the industry could face destruction due to these measures.

APJC Chairman Muhammad Hanif Ranch criticized the government's actions over the past five days, asserting that they have violated existing laws. He labeled the tax increases as arbitrary and detrimental to the travel and tourism sector.

TAAP officials expressed deep concerns over the impact of the tax hike on air tickets, noting that bookings for economy class tickets abroad have surged by 150%, while first-class ticket prices have increased by 40%.

The association warned that these measures could lead to the default of numerous travel agencies across the country.



Travel agents nationwide are currently protesting against the government's decision, highlighting the dire financial strain placed on the industry. The association has called for immediate intervention to prevent further damage and to safeguard the livelihoods of those dependent on the travel and tourism sector.—RT

## CTD Officer Charged With Kidnapping And Extortion

KARACHI: A Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) officer has been booked for alleged kidnapping and extortion, media reported citing sources.

According to sources, a case was registered against CTD Sub-Inspector Razaqat Shah at the Tipu Sultan police station for kidnapping youth from a hotel and demanding a ransom of Rs 4 lac.

Sources within CTD said that the victim, Jasim, was released after the ransom was paid. Razaqat Shah was suspended on April 24 but a

high-rank officer issued an order for his reinstatement on May 1, sources added.

CTD sources revealed that the AIG has requested IG to cancel the order, and a petition has been filed in the Soldier Bazaar police station to cancel the order.

In a separate incident, Rangers personnel conducted a raid at the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) office and rescued an abducted citizen from their possession.

The DIG CTD Asif Aijaz Shaikh in a statement stated that the CTD

officials had failed to report the detained individual - who recently arrived in Karachi from Iraq - to higher authorities and had not officially recorded his detention. He further disclosed that the CTD initially demanded a ransom of Rs 500,000 from the victim's family, which was later negotiated down to Rs 100,000.

As a result, the DIG CTD announced the suspension of four CTD officials, including the Station House Officer (SHO), Sub-Inspector, Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI), and a Constable.—RT/Agency

## Khaqan, Miftah Launch Their New Party

ISLAMABAD: Ending months of speculation about the formation of a new political party, former Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leaders, Shahid Khaqan Abbasi and Miftah Ismail launched 'Awam Pakistan,' with a pledge to change the governance system of the country and deny political space to the "tainted" politicians.



"Politicians with tainted reputations won't be a part of Awam Pakistan," said Khaqan, who served as prime minister during the PML-N's 2013-18 stint in power, at the press conference in Islamabad flanked by Miftah and ex-PML-N leader Mehtab Abbasi.

The party's launch came months after Khaqan and Ismail parted ways from the ruling party following their differences with the leadership.

Giving rise to speculations about a new political platform, Khaqan in April approached the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) for the registration of

a new party. In a hard-hitting press conference today, the former prime minister bashed the incumbent government, saying that those won elections on the basis of "Form-47" — reference to the alleged manipulation in the election results — can't build the country.

"We are just concerned about power, not about the country. Parties keep forming in Pakistan for specific purposes," he said, adding that they had not invited anyone to join the newly-launched Awam Pakistan party.

Electables are part of the

adding that the "system of the hunter and the hunted cannot continue".

Lambasting the federal government for its budget for the fiscal year 2024-25, the ex-finance czar said that those earning merely Rs50,000 per month are asked to pay tax, but no tax is demanded from the one owning thousands of acres of land.

"The tax on the salaried class has been doubled in the budget [...] the middle class is being crushed," Miftah said, stressing that the budget in essence is a reflection of the ruling elite's priorities.

The ex-minister's comments refer to the tax-heavy Finance Bill 2024, which was assented by President Asif Ali Zardari last week, wherein the government has set out a challenging tax revenue target of Rs13 trillion for the year starting July 1, up about 40% from the current year to strengthen the case for a new rescue deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

The rise in the tax target

is made up of a 48% increase in direct taxes and a 35% hike in indirect taxes over revised estimates of the current year. Non-tax revenue, including petroleum levies, is seen increasing by a whopping 64%.

Referring to the recently announced anti-terrorism drive "Operation Azm-e-Ishtehak," the politician said: "Today we are going to conduct another operation [...] why these operations are needed again and again because you cannot end poverty."

His remarks came as the federal cabinet last week approved the launch of the counter-terrorism operation following the National Action Plan's Central Apex Committee's recommendations to root out militance from the country.

With opposition parties voicing concerns over the anti-terror operation, the government has decided to convene an all-parties conference (APC) "to gain political parties' confidence" over its decision. —RT/Agency

## New Era of Pak-China Cooperation To Boost Economic Prosperity And Regional Connectivity: PM

In response, IHC's Babar Sattar on June 26 directed the party and the city's administration to amicably sort out the issue after which the deputy commissioner allowed the PTI to hold its rally.

However, Islamabad Chief Commissioner Muhammad Ali Randhawa later suspended the NOC citing the beginning of the month of Muharram and security concerns along with complaints lodged by the local people.

The chief commissioner, in a letter dated July 5, said that the police on Wednesday confirmed recovering a heavy cache of weapons and ammunition.

Stressing that an intelligence-based operation (IBO) was still underway in Tarnol, the official highlighted insufficient manpower to secure a



local Imam Bargah and the rally at the same time, particularly in Muharram.

The intelligence agencies, he added, had shared information about the presence of security threats in the area during this month.

Apart from the security threat, he said residents of Tarnol also conveyed their concerns over permission for the public gathering in the area.

Hence, Randhawa said he deemed it "expedient in the public interest to suspend the NOC till Chehlum."

In its petition filed in the IHC, the party said the Islamabad DC apprised the court on July 4 that the NOC had been issued.

Nevertheless, the plea added, the PTI leaders got to know about the NOC's suspension through the Islamabad Police's post via its official handle on social media platform X.

## Omar Ayub's Resignation Rejected On Imran's Directives



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, following directives from founding chairman Imran Khan, has announced that Omar Ayub Khan's resignation as central secretary general has not been accepted.

Omar Ayub Khan has been directed to continue his duties as central secretary general. The PTI parliamentary party and core committee had also expressed full confidence in Ayub.

The parliamentary party and core committee unanimously passed resolutions recommending that founding chairman Imran Khan and chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan not accept Ayub's resignation.

Imran Khan also lauded Ayub's services and sacrifices for PTI. The parliamentary party PTI showed last

month disagreement over party's founding chairman Imran Khan's decision to accept the resignation of PTI's secretary general Omar Ayub, urging him to take a U-turn and reappoint Ayub on the post.

The party's parliamentary faction's demand came within 24 hours after the incorporated PTI founder endorsed the decision of Ayub, who is also the leader of the opposition in the National Assembly, to step down from his party position.

Confusion prevailed within PTI ranks over Ayub's resignation amid reports of rifts in PTI. On the one hand, the party announced that it would take out rallies for the release of the party supremo. On the other hand, the secretary general left the key party position so that he could focus on parliamentary affairs. —RT/Agency

The prime minister directed the power division to suspend such officials of power distribution companies, besides ordering the Federal Investigation Agency to launch investigation into these matters.

The prime minister chaired a meeting regarding reforms in power sector and solarisation process, PM Office Media Wing said in a press release. The meeting was attended by Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar, federal ministers, Jam Kamal Khan, Sardar Awais Khan Leghari, Ahsan Iqbal, Ahmad Khan Cheema, Attaullah Tatar, Minister of State Ali Pervaiz Malik and relevant senior officials. The prime minister said that



exemplary punishment should be given to those officials who had included extra units in the monthly bills of consumers with their anti-public attitude, besides unmasking them who had sent extra units to the protected consumers category, using less than 200 units per month. ## Revocation Of PTI's Rally Permission Purely An Administrative Matter: Rana Sanaullah

ISLAMABAD: Advisor to Prime Minister on Political Affairs and Inter-Provincial Coordination (IPC) Rana Sanaullah said on Saturday that the cancellation of permission for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) rally is purely an administrative matter.

Holding rallies and mobilizing people are the essence of democracy. However, PTI should consider the sensitivity of the time (Muharram) before calling for a rally, he said while talking to a private news channel.

The local administration would have a proper justification as to why they revoked the permission, he added.

During Muharram, when the administration was fully occupied with ensuring security for the processions, it was unwise



to gather people for other events, he further added. In response to a query about the All Party Conference (APC), he mentioned that the government has invited all stakeholders to participate in it. —RT/Agency

## Tatar Questions Credibility of Awam Pakistan Party's Founders

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaullah Tatar on Saturday questioned the credibility of founders of the newly launched political party named as Awam Pakistan.

The minister, reacting to the minister's press held at the launching ceremony, said it was nothing but a gathering of investors who had billions of rupees in their possession. The presser was a repeat telecast of the old narrative
