Shehbaz Orders For Karachi Port's Upgrade

KARACHI: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has directed to take comprehensive measures for the upgradation of the Karachi Port and ease of access to the harbour via rail and road connectivity.

During his one-day visit to Karachi on Sunday, the premier issued the directives while chairing a session in which he was briefed on the Karachi Port Trust (KPT), Port Qasim and Pakistan National Shipping Corporation (PNSC).

The high-level session was attended by federal ministers Muhammad Aurangzeb, Jam Kamal Khan, Ahmad Khan Cheema, Attaullah Tarar, Sindh Governor Kamran Tessori, Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah, Qaiser Ahmed Sheikh, Federal Board of



Revenue (FBR) chairman and others.

PM Shehbaz said that steps should be taken to reduce Customs clearance time by installation of modern machinery. He also emphasised on connectivity of the KPT via road and rail network for the ease of access for goods.

He also directed that the Lyari Expressway should be opened 24/7 to ensure an unhindered

supply of goods to the KPT, as well as linking the port to the Malir Expressway to improve the delivery of goods.

He ordered to enhance the goods' supply by linking the port to a rail network.

PM Shehbaz ordered the Port Qasim Authority to reduce charges for LNG cargo vessels and bring them in line with the international rates.

He sought a comprehensive strategy for the regulation of shipping lines besides ordering the PNSC to cut its expenditures.

He said that Pakistan provides a convenient route for the Central Asian states to gain access to maritime trade while the countries also expressed interest in using Pakistani ports for trade.

Top Hamas Official Open To Hostage Deal Talks Without Permanent Ceasefire

Gaza: A Hamas official said Sunday the Palestinian group was ready to discuss a hostage release deal with Israel even without a "complete" ceasefire.

The apparent easing of Hamas's position comes as long-stalled diplomatic efforts to secure a ceasefire and hostage release have gathered pace with a new proposal and meetings hosted by Qatari and Egyptian mediators.

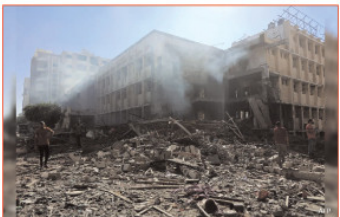
"Hamas had previously required that Israel agree to a complete and permanent ceasefire," the top official told AFP as the war entered its 10th month.

But mediators have offered assurances "that as long as the... negotiations continued, the ceasefire would continue," said the official, speaking on condition of anonymity.

Israel, which vowed to destroy Hamas in response to the group's October 7 attack that sparked the war, has repeatedly rejected demands for a permanent ceasefire.

US President Joe Biden announced a plan in late May that included an initial six-week truce and the exchange of hostages held by Hamas for Palestinian prisoners held in Israel.

Talks quickly stalled but a US official said Thursday that a new text from Hamas



"moves the process forward and may provide the basis for closing the deal."

Egypt's state-linked Al-Qahera News said late Saturday that Cairo was "hosting Israeli and American delegations" and mediators were in contact with Hamas amid "intensive Egyptian meetings this week with all parties" in Israel, anti-government protesters demanding a hostage release deal blocked roads in the commercial hub of Tel Aviv on a nationwide "disruption day" from 6:29 am, the time Hamas launched their attack on October 7. Data scientist Yoni Peleg, 34, said protesters were crying "out for help."

Hamas's unprecedented October 7 attack on southern Israel resulted in the deaths of 1,195 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli figures. Israel has carried out a military offensive that has killed at least 38,153 people in Gaza, also mostly civilians, according to data from the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory. Israel has said it would send a delegation to continue talks with Qatari mediators, though a government spokesman said Friday there were still "gaps" with Hamas. An official with knowledge of the mediation said US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) director William Burns would also go to Qatar this week. If negotiations start, Hamas expects them to take between two to three weeks, according to the official from the Islamist movement.—RT/Agency

Sargodha ATC Issues Arrest Warrants For PTI's Omar Ayub



ISLAMABAD: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Sargodha has issued arrest warrants for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Secretary General Omar Ayub, as his party leaders remain embroiled in legal battles.

Opposition Leader in the National Assembly Ayub, in a statement on X, also confirmed that the warrants have been issued, and slammed the "desperate" authorities for trying to nab him.

"Bailable arrest warrants issued for me by ATC Sargodha, but Mianwali Police and Islamabad Police teams went to my Islamabad home to arrest me a few minutes ago," he said. The top PTI leader, whose party has recently rejected his resignation from the top office added: "The form 47 Federal Government, Punjab Government, and agencies must be very desperate to arrest the Leader of the Opposition in the National Assembly." 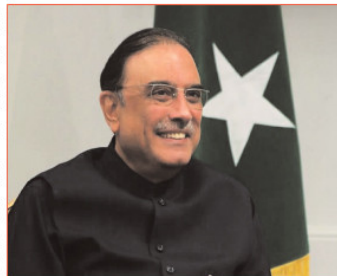
President Zardari Urges Unity And Reflection As New Islamic Year Begins

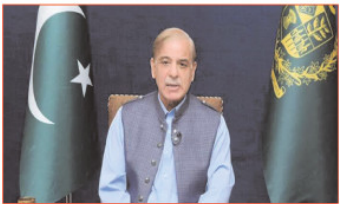
PM Extends New Islamic Year Greetings, Prays For End To Oppression In IIOJK And Palestine

PM Announces Development Of Country's Ports For Regional Corridor

KARACHI: Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday that the government was taking steps for the provision of shortest corridor to the regional countries, especially to the Central Asian States.

He said with a spur in sea trade by the Central Asian States, China and other countries of the region via Pakistani ports, the country could earn worth billions of dollars as foreign revenue every year.

Development Budget Of Kunri Town Committee Set At 14 Crore Rupees

KUNRI: The Town Committee of Kunri has allocated 14 crore rupees for various development projects in its budget for the fiscal year 2024-25. The budget meeting, chaired by Town Committee Chairman Haji Shaheel Bajwa, saw the presentation of a comprehensive budget plan aimed at enhancing infrastructure and addressing community needs.



Present at the meeting were Vice Chairman Sivanand Sindi, Councilor Syed Manzoor Ali, Gulam Hussain Dars, Imran Mughal, Usman Baloch, Sajid Bhatti, Imran FM Zeib Amjad, Haji Jahanzeb Arayan, Pappu Raza, Rizwan Sunny, and other committee members. Chairman Haji Shaheel Ahmed Bajwa outlined the budget details, revealing that the Town Committee anticipates an income exceeding 48 crore 22 lakh rupees from various sources, including taxes, capital funds, and other revenues. The budget allocates 3 crore 54 lakh rupees for retired employees' pensions, 3 crore 44 lakh rupees for district employees' salaries, and 1 crore 20 lakh rupees for town employees' wages.

Highlighting the focus on development, Bajwa emphasized the allocation of 14 crore rupees specifically for city development schemes. He expressed determination to beautify Kunri and address citizens' essential needs despite resource limitations. Bajwa also acknowledged the support of PPP MPA Nawab Taimur Talpar in securing funds for upcoming projects. Among the planned initiatives, construction and repairs are set to commence on Sampur Block Road and the CCC at a significant cost. These efforts aim to improve local infrastructure and enhance the quality of life for residents, ensuring better service delivery and community welfare. The budget session concluded with a commitment to promptly initiate the outlined projects, underscoring the Town Committee's dedication to advancing Kunri's development agenda in collaboration with governmental support.

Sindh Government Proposes Major Expansion Of Keenjhar Lake To Address Karachi's Water Needs

THATTA: In response to the escalating water demand in Karachi, the Sindh government is moving forward with plans to significantly expand the storage capacity of Keenjhar Lake, located in Thatta district. This initiative is critical for the Greater Karachi Bulk Water Supply Scheme (K-IV project), which aims to increase Karachi's water supply by 650 million gallons per day (MGD). The Sindh irrigation department has developed a comprehensive proposal to enhance Keenjhar Lake's storage capabilities, which has been submitted to Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah for approval and funding. The project, estimated to cost approximately \$300 million, has attracted interest from the World Bank for financial backing. Currently, Keenjhar Lake is a vital water source for both Thatta district and Karachi. Upon the completion of the K-IV project's

Phase-1, it can supply an additional 260 MGD of water. However, the lake's current capacity is insufficient for the planned second and third phases of the K-IV project, necessitating an expansion to support the increased storage requirements. Syed Salahuddin Ahmed, CEO of Karachi Water and Sewerage Corporation, emphasized the urgent need for this expansion. He noted that Karachi's current daily water supply is 650 MGD, significantly below the city's actual requirement of over 1,200 MGD. In a strategic meeting at CM House, Chief Minister Shah and World Bank Country Director Najy Benig-hassine discussed the necessity of this expansion. Shah highlighted Keenjhar Lake's pivotal role in supplying drinking water to Karachi and surrounding regions. The proposed expansion plan includes enhancements to the KB Feeder Lower Canal Sys-

Motorcyclist Killed In A Hit-and-Run Incident Near Kunri

KUNRI: In a tragic hit-and-run incident near Kunri, a motorcyclist from the Bheel community lost his life after being struck by a speeding van. Tragic Drowning Incidents Near Kunri: One Child Dead, Two Hospitalized



KUNRI: In two separate incidents near Kunri, three young girls tragically drowned in a canal, resulting in the death of one and the hospitalization of two others. The first incident occurred near Karunjhar Colony, where 6-year-old Kajal, daughter of Bilawal Linju, drowned while washing clothes with her mother in the Rahmur canal. Despite immediate rescue efforts, Kajal could not be revived. She was rushed to a local hospital in Kunri, where doctors sadly confirmed her death. In a second, unrelated in-

cident in Harijan Colony, two young girls, Priya Kohli, 5, and Anjali Kohli, 4, fell into the canal while playing. Both girls were quickly rescued and taken to the hospital for emergency treatment. Their current condition remains under medical supervision. The local community is deeply shaken by these tragic events. Authorities have urged parents and guardians to exercise increased vigilance and ensure the safety of children near water bodies. These incidents underscore the need for enhanced safety measures and public awareness to prevent such heartbreaking occurrences in the future.

Notorious Dacoit Imdu Bhayo Killed In Kandhkot Shootout

Major Drug Bust Reported By CIA Police In Thatta

Maryam Aurangzeb Meets Global Expert Sir Michael Barber To Discuss Punjab's Reform Agenda

LAHORE: PML-N leader Maryam Aurangzeb met with renowned international expert Sir Michael Barber to discuss reforms in various sectors including education, in a high-level meeting. JI Plans Sit-In Protest Against Soaring Electricity Bills On July 12



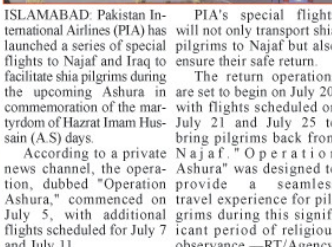
MULTAN: In what appears to be a strong censure of the incumbent government over the skyrocketing price of electricity bills and fuel, Jamaat-e-Islami Emir Hafiz Naemur Rehman said on Sunday the party would hold a historical sit-in on July 12 in Islamabad.

Pakistan Army Rescues Samina Baig From K2 Base Camp Emergency

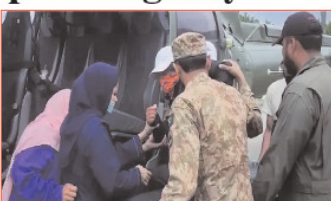

Samina became the first Pakistani woman to summit the world's highest peak, Mount Everest, in 2013 at the age of 21 and has since set off on a number of expeditions around the world.

She has also claimed Nanga Parbat, and the Seven Summits in seven continents. Currently, Samina Baig was part of an eight-member Pakistan-Italy joint women's K2 expedition team. She was forced to abandon her climb on July 5, 2024, due to severe health issues.

She was shifted from the K2 base camp to Shigar's Askole area earlier in the day after undertaking a lengthy journey on horseback while in critical medical condition. Due to inclement weather, the Pakistan Army's rescue flight was unable to reach the base camp, and Baig was instead transported to Skardu by road early this morning.

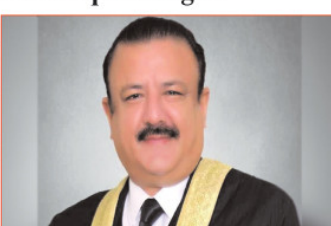

2 suspects arrested for sexually abusing disabled minor boy in Mandi Bahauddin

"Malakwal police station obtained a three-day physical remand of the arrested suspects from the magistrate's court," DPO Mohiuddin said, adding that during interroga-



tion, both suspects confessed to the crime. A mobile phone was recovered from the suspects, which they allegedly used to make videos, he added. SHO Hashmi, while speaking to media added that the victim, who is mute, identified both suspects through hand gestures. He further said that the suspects lured the victim to a large house in the village where the alleged assault took place. According to the first information report (FIR) of the incident, a copy of which is available with media, the victim was "almost 18 years old". It added that the police registered a case against the suspects upon the complaint of the victim's grandfather under sections 376 (3) (punishment for rape of a minor or a person with a mental or physical disability), 292 (c) (takes part in [...] the sale, etc., of obscene books, etc.), 114 (abetter present when offence is committed) and 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention)—RT/Agency

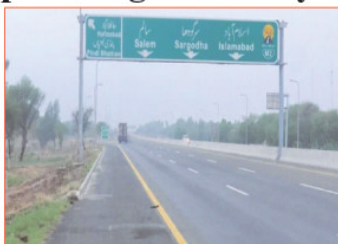
Nine Friends Reported Missing After Trip To Kaghan Valley

Muharram Security: Over 16,000 Personnel To Be Deployed In Islamabad

All gatherings and processions will be video recorded by drone cameras. Locals and non-locals will be allowed to enter the procession after thorough search. Entry of vehicles and motorcycles will be completely prohibited in the procession. People joining the processions and majalis will be checked by metal detectors while walk-through gates will also be installed at entrances and exits. Ending the cycle of poverty and violence against children in Pakistan

In recent news that shocks the conscience, two incidents from Naushehro Feroze and Lahore vividly underscore the harrowing reality faced by children across Pakistan. In Naushehro Feroze, a father resorted to burying his 15-day-old daughter alive, driven by desperation due to financial constraints that prevented him from affording her medical treatment. This act of unimaginable cruelty reflects not only an individual's despair but also a broader societal failure to protect the most vulnerable. Similarly distressing is the case from Lahore, where a 13-year-old domestic worker named Tehreem was subjected to brutal torture by her employers, allegedly over suspicions of theft. The incident, where the child was stripped naked and suffered broken bones, paints a chilling picture of

abuse and exploitation.

These incidents are not isolated; they are symptomatic of a deeper crisis of poverty and disconnect



between the ruling elites and the masses in Pakistan. The gap between those in power, who often exhibit apathy towards the struggles of ordinary citizens, and the populace struggling to survive, has widened to a breaking point. For children like Tayyab's daughter and Tehreem, this disconnect translates into a dire lack of protection and support. To end this cycle of poverty and violence against

children, immediate and concerted action is imperative. It starts with addressing the root causes: poverty alleviation measures that provide economic security to families, robust social welfare programs that ensure access to healthcare and education, and stringent enforcement of child protection laws. Moreover, it demands a shift in societal attitudes towards empathy and responsibility, where every child is seen as deserving of dignity and protection.

The tragedies in Naushehro Feroze and Lahore should serve as a wake-up call. They remind us that the safety and well-being of our children must be a top priority, not an afterthought. It is time for Pakistan's leadership to bridge the gap, to listen to the cries of its people, and to act decisively to ensure that no child suffers such atrocities again.

Sleepy Joe Biden returns to campaign trail amid calls to end White House re-election bid

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden heads back out on the campaign trail on Sunday, desperate to salvage his re-election bid as senior Democrats meet to discuss growing calls that he quit the White House race.

The 81-year-old Democrat kicks off a gruelling week with two campaign rallies in the battleground state of Pennsylvania, before hosting the NATO leaders' summit in Washington.

He will do so under an increasingly unforgiving spotlight, as pressure mounts for him to drop out after his disastrous debate against Donald Trump last month ignited panic over his age and fitness to serve another four years. Biden has remained defiant, unequivocally declaring - at a rally, to reporters and on social media - that he is fit to serve, the only one who can defeat Trump, and stay in the race.

"I beat Trump in 2020. I'm going to beat him again in 2024," his campaign social media account posted on Saturday. But a televised interview with ABC News on Friday has failed to quell concerns. His next major test in the public eye will be a press conference scheduled for Thursday, during the NATO summit.

So far, five Democratic lawmakers have called on Biden to drop out, with the drumbeat of dissent slowly rising.

The House minority leader, Hakeem Jeffries, has scheduled a virtual meeting of senior Democrat representatives for Sunday to discuss the best way forward, and Democrat Senator Mark Warner is reportedly working to con-

vene a similar forum in the upper chamber. Meanwhile, for Biden and his campaign team, the strategy seems to be to ride it out. The campaign has unveiled an intense battle plan for July, including an avalanche of TV spots and trips to all the key states. That includes a visit to the southwest of the country during the Republican convention from July 15-18, at which Trump is set to be anointed the party's official presidential nominee.

In what had been billed as a make-or-break interview with ABC News on Friday, Biden flatly dismissed the falling poll numbers and concerns over his mental and physical fitness triggered by his dismal June 27 performance against Trump. He blamed the Russian strongman Vladimir Putin, and insisted he could bring about a quick end to the fighting in Ukraine, where the Russian invasion is now in its third year. For now, Democrat heavyweights are largely keeping a lid on any simmering discontent with their leader - at least in public. But with election day just four months away, any move to replace Biden as the nominee would need to be made sooner rather than later, and the party will be scrutinized for any signs of more open rebel-

lion. Meanwhile, the local authorities are committed to ensuring that the case is thoroughly investigated, with stringent measures taken against those responsible for such heart-breaking incidents. —RT

Sharjeel made a 30-ball 72 powered by seven fours and five sixes. While

Kamran continued the aggressive approach, scoring a 40-ball 77 before being bowled by Pawan Negi in the 14th over.

Sohaib Maqsood chipped in with a powerful 26-ball 51. He hit five sixes and two fours. Afridi went for a golden duck while Shoaib Malik remained not out on 18-ball 25.

India replied strongly at the start of the chase with Robin Uthappa scoring 12-ball 22. Sohaih Khan removed him to bring the first wicket for Pakistan.

Ambati Rayudu and Suresh Raina paired up to trouble the Men in Green but Shoaib Malik had the better of Rayudu (39) to put India under pressure.—Agency

Rohit Sharma to lead India in Champions Trophy, WTC: BCCI



Triumphant captain Rohit Sharma who recently won his country the T20 World Cup 2024, will be leading team India in the Champions Trophy 2025 and the 2023-25 World Test Championship (WTC).

"I am confident that under the captaincy of Rohit, we will win the WTC Final and the Champions Trophy," said the Board of Control for Cricket in India's (BCCI) Secretary Jay Shah.

Shah's remarks come after India ended their 11-year-long ICC trophy drought after beating South Africa in the final of the T20 World Cup 2024 under the leadership of Rohit.

The star batter was appointed India's captain in 2021 after Virat Kohli stepped down and since then, the Blues made it to the WTC 2021-23 final and the ODI World Cup 2023 final where they lost to Australia on both occasions.

In a video message shared by the BCCI, Shah dedicated India's World Cup win to previous head coach Rahul Dravid, whose last match in charge was the final and said the Board of Control for Cricket in India's (BCCI) Secretary Jay Shah.

"Many congratulations to Team India for this historic victory [.] This was our third final in the last year. In June 2023, we lost in the final of the World Test Championship. After ten wins in November 2023, we won hearts but couldn't win the cup," the BCCI official said.—Agency

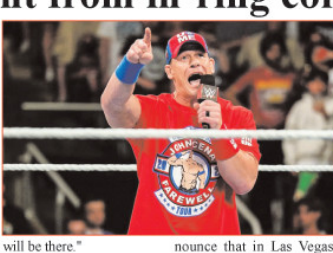

Seifert's 82 trumps Hasaranga's fifty as Galle Marvels beat Kandy Falcons

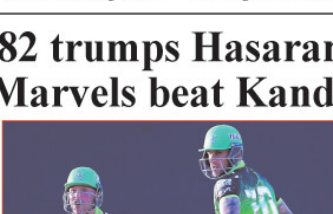

The accused has been shifted to the Anti-Human Trafficking Circle Karachi for further legal action and further investigation is underway. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Railways To Operate Trains Through Public-Private Partnership

LAHORE: Pakistan Railways has decided to run its all trains under the public-private partnership mode, sources said.



Citing railway officials' sources said that the decision has been taken to provide better facilities to railway passengers and bringing stability in the department's income.

Several trains including Karakoram Express, Karachi Express, Awam Express, Green Line, Mahar, Chenab, Suman Sarkar and Mohenjo Daro passenger train will be run under the public-private partnership mode, officials said.

Moreover, Pak Business, Bolan Mail, Thall, Sukkur Express, Marvi, Chaman and Hazara Express would also be operated by the private sector, officials said.

Railways officials said that Shalimar Express, Bahaudin Zakaria, Kohat, Mehran Express, Attock, Jund and Rawalpindi passenger train also been run under this mechanism.

Chief Executive Officer Amir Baloch has stated that the railways intend to provide the best travel experience to its passengers.

Sources apprehended that the railway fares would skyrocket under the public-private partnership mode. —RT/Agency

Couple Accused Of Brutally Torturing Domestic Worker In Lahore

LAHORE: Another distressing incident was reported from Lahore's Defense B area in which a husband and wife allegedly stripped and tortured a 13-year-old domestic worker, media reported on Sunday.



Following the torture incident, the police filed an FIR over the complaint of the mother of the domestic worker - Tahreem - and arrested the accused - Hassam - allegedly involved in the incident.

Meanwhile, the police officials claimed that raids were being conducted to

arrest Hassam's wife. As per the FIR, the accused continued to torture the minor domestic worker Tahreem by stripping her naked over the suspicion of theft, the mother of the victim also claimed in the FIR that the bones of the girl's hand and nose were broken. The victim girl was handed over to her mother after her medical examination, while the SP Cantt stated that the perpetrators involved in the incident would be brought to justice. —RT/Agency

US Election 2024: NATO allies concerned over Sleepy Joe Biden's ability to beat Trump



As the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation's (NATO) summit is just around the corner, diplomats and world leaders are expressing concerns about US President Joe Biden's age and health.

To defeat Donald Trump in the November 5 election, Biden is required to prove that he's ready and strong at the summit, which will be held in Washington next week.

According to Politico, allies want Biden to compete for his second term against Trump, but they are concerned about his ability to defeat the former president in the forthcoming elections.

Following the 81-year-old's poor performance in the first presidential debate against the Republican, some European officials have voiced doubts about Biden's stamina and leadership capabilities.

"It doesn't take a genius to see that the president is old. We're not sure that, even if he wins, he can survive four years more," one of the officials of the European NATO stated.

Another EU official remarked: "We all want Biden to have a second term to avoid dealing with Trump again, but this isn't really reassuring."

Moreover, NATO allies are concerned about how long Biden can keep US support for European defence, since Trump is sceptical about extending support for other countries.

"We're having more conversations about our own defences since it looks like Trump is coming back," an official from one NATO country said after the debate. —Agency

Deadly Gaza Battles, Hezbollah Rockets As War Enters 10th Month

Gaza: Israel carried out deadly air strikes in the Gaza Strip on Sunday as the war entered its 10th month, with fighting raging across the Palestinian territory and fresh diplomatic efforts underway to halt the violence.

Lebanon's Hezbollah movement fired another 20 rockets at northern Israel, leaving one person injured there, the latest cross-border attacks launched in solidarity with Gaza's Palestinian group Hamas.

Efforts towards a truce continued with US, Qatari and Egyptian mediators hoping to halt the worst-ever Gaza war, which has caused mass civilian casualties and devastated the coastal territory since Hamas's October 7 attack on Israel. Egypt's Al-Qahera News reported that Cairo was "hosting Israeli and American delegations to discuss the outstanding points" for a ceasefire and

hostage release deal, citing an unnamed high-level official source. Mediators were in contact with Hamas amid "intensive Egyptian meetings this week with all parties to push efforts" for a truce, said the news reporter late Saturday, without giving further details or dates. Israel has also said it would send a delegation in the coming days to continue talks with Qatari mediators, even though Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's spokesman said Friday that "gaps" remained with Hamas. US President Joe Biden announced a plan in late May that included an initial six-week truce and the exchange of hostages for Palestinian prisoners.

Talks subsequently stalled, but a US official said Thursday that a new proposal from Hamas "moves the process forward and may provide the basis for closing the deal". —Agency

"Need Plan To Control Immigration": Ex UK PM Tony Blair's Advice To Keir Starmer



London: Former Labour prime minister Tony Blair made an early intervention in British politics on Sunday after Keir Starmer's landslide election victory, urging him to have a "plan to control immigration".

Blair warned Starmer, who is beginning his second full day as prime minister with a visit to Scotland, that the anti-immigration Reform UK Party also posed a challenge to Labour, not just the Conservative Party.

The Reform UK party, led by Brexit firebrand Nigel Farage, maximised the damage to the Conservatives at the election by splitting the right-wing vote.

It won five seats in the Westminster parliament and 14 percent of the vote, prompting Farage to warn that it will target Labour voters next.

In a piece headlined "My advice to Keir Starmer",



Blair wrote in the Sunday Times that "all over the western world, traditional political parties are suffering disruption".

"Where the system allows new entrants to emerge, they are running riot everywhere. Look at France or Italy. We need a plan to control immigration. If we don't have rules, we get prejudices," he added.

Blair, the only Labour leader to lead his party to three consecutive election

victories starting with his own landslide win in 1997, couched his "advice" in an article about harnessing the power of artificial intelligence (AI).

He said he believed digital ID technology offered the best solution to controlling irregular immigration, a key issue on the doorstep during the election campaign.

"We should move as the world is moving to digital ID. If not, new border controls will have to be highly effective," he wrote.

Other suggestions included "a tough new approach to law and order" due to the fact that "at present criminal elements are modernising faster than law enforcement".

And he said the government should "avoid any vulnerability on 'wokeism'", warning against policies that many regard as overly politically correct. —Agency

Overnight Ukraine Drone Hit Sets Russian Munitions Depot Ablaze



Moscow: An overnight Ukrainian drone attack set a Russian munitions depot ablaze the Voronezh region, near the two countries' shared border, Russian and Ukrainian officials said Sunday.

"Several drones were detected and destroyed overnight by air defence systems above the Voronezh region," regional governor Alexander Gusev wrote on Telegram.

"Their falling debris set off a fire in a depot" in the Podgorenskiy district, about 80 kilometres (50 miles) from the Ukrainian border.

"Explosives began to detonate", Gusev said, adding that there were no indications anybody had been hurt.

Rescue teams were at the scene and Gusev said local



people living near the depot were being evacuated.

A Ukrainian defence source told AFP that its drones hit the munitions factory in an overnight attack.

"The enemy stored surface-to-surface and surface-to-air missiles, shells for tanks and artillery and boxes of ammunition" at the site, which was hit by drones resulting in a "powerful" explosion, the source said. Russia and Ukraine have used drones, including large explosive devices with a range of hundreds of kilometres (miles), extensively since Russia launched its military offensive in February 2022. Ukraine has stepped up its attacks on Russian territory this year, targeting both energy sites it says supply the Russian army and towns and villages just across the border. —Agency

Israeli Strike On School Sheltering Displaced Gazans Kills 4, Second Attack In 2 Days



Gaza: The civil defence agency in Hamas-run Gaza said a strike Sunday on a school sheltering displaced Palestinians killed at least four people, the second such Israeli attack in two days.

The Israeli military, which has long accused Palestinian operatives of using schools and other civilian infrastructure, confirmed the strike "in the area of the school" in Gaza City. It said in a statement the school complex was used as a hideout and housed "a Hamas weapons manufacturing facility".

The civil defence agency said that al-Ghussein, the Hamas government's deputy labour minister, was among those killed in the

strike on the Holy Family school. The strike came a day after a UN-run school in the central Nuseirat refugee camp was hit, in an attack that the Gaza health ministry said killed 16 people and drew condemnation from the United Nations. Israel said militants were hiding there. —Agency

Rupee Depreciation Expected By End of 2024 Despite IMF Bailout Prospects

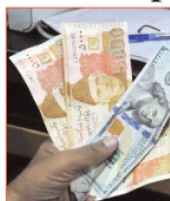


KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee, which is currently being exchanged at Rs278 against the dollar, is expected to depreciate to Rs 295 by the end of December 2024 despite the government's hope of securing a new bailout package from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), media reported on Sunday.

"As Pakistan navigates these turbulent waters, we expect economic challenges to persist in the near term with elevated inflation and demand contraction," said Tresmark in a client note issued a day earlier.

The prediction comes after Minister of State for Finance Ali Pervaiz Malik's remarks claiming that the government was looking forward to an IMF bailout in excess of \$6 billion after addressing all of the lender's requirements in its tax-heavy budget.

In the budget, the government increased the taxes on the already burdened salaried class, brought exporters into the normal tax regime, increased the petroleum levy and imposed new taxes on the real estate sectors, among others, to increase revenue generation aimed at stabilising the country's economic indicators.



"We hope to culminate this [IMF] process in the next three to four weeks," Malik told Reuters.

This week, the rupee traded within narrow ranges due to balanced supply and demand dynamics for dollars in the market and saw slight fluctuations throughout the week before recovering losses to close at Rs278.37 on Friday.

Elaborating on the performance of the local currency, Tresmark's note said that the rupee is projected to trade at Rs295 against the dollar by this year's end and at Rs325 by June 2025.

Positive indicators such as a narrowing trade deficit and a resilient stock market suggest a gradual economic recovery and an expected IMF agreement, anticipated to bring in between \$6 billion to \$8 billion, is seen as crucial for stabilising the economy, Tresmark noted.

However, potential implications from the Finance Bill's tax measures and escalating fuel prices may further strain purchasing power and demand, the report cautioned.

On the policy rate issue, it said that it is anticipated to remain between 17 to 19 percent by December 2024 to counter growth-related inflationary pressures.

Meanwhile, Sakib Sherani, an economist who heads the private firm Macro Economic Insights, is of the view that a quick deal with the IMF was needed to avoid pressure on the country's foreign exchange reserves and the currency due to maturing debt repayments and the effects of unwinding of capital and import controls that were applied earlier. —RT/Agency

Woman and Daughter Killed In Multan Roof Collapse Tragedy



MULTAN: A woman and her daughter have died while the father and son suffered injuries after the roof of their house collapsed in Multan.

Rescue sources said the tragic incident occurred in Chowk Shaheen Nala Wali Muhammad due to extensive rainfall.

The roof of the house collapsed because it was rotten, burying the family members under the debris.

As a result, the mother and daughter lost their lives, and the son was seriously injured.

The deceased were identified as Saima Bibi and four-year-old Sania, while the injured included 50-year-old Riaz and Miraj.

The bodies and the injured were shifted to Nasir Hospital, the rescue sources said. —RT/Agency

Couple Killed As Vehicle Plunges Into Ravine Near Babusar Top

MANSEHRA: A tragic accident occurred near Babusar Top when a car carrying a family of five plunged into a ravine, leaving a couple dead, media reported.

As per details, the incident took place when the family was returning from a trip.

According to the Kaghan Development Authority, the car was carrying a family of five from Lahore, including three children, who were left injured in the incident.

The authorities have launched a rescue operation to retrieve the bodies and provide medical assistance to the injured children.

Earlier today, at least two tourists died, while three others injured in Chitral car accident.

The incident which claimed the lives of two tourists occurred in Ashrit due to damaged road. —RT/Agency

This festival and exhibition were organized with the collaboration of the Pakistan Maritime Museum, TCN Executive Forum, and various institutions and farms. The festival was inaugurated by Provincial Agriculture Minister Sardar Muhammad Bux Mahar, along with Vice Chancellor Dr. Fateh Marri, Vice Chancellor of Begum Nurat Bhutto Women University Sukkur Dr. Tahmina Mangan, DG Maritime Farooq Azam, and DG Research Noor Muhammad Baloch.

The exhibition featured stalls showcasing mangoes and their by-products from various institutions, including the Institute of Food Sciences and Horticulture Department of Sindh Agriculture University Tando Jam, Agriculture Research Sindh, Sub Campus Umerkot, Horticulture Institute Mirpurkhas, MH Panhwar Farms, Pahl Farms Tando Allahyar, among others. There were also mango grafting demonstrations, Sindh cultural stalls, and food stalls.

In his inaugural address, Agriculture Minister Sardar Muhammad Bux Khan Mahar, stated that climate change is impacting mango orchards in Sindh. Efforts are being made to establish modern research centers for mango production in Sindh. Additionally, they plan to in-

PSQCA Releases New List Of Mandatory Items, Introduces Strict Quality Checks

KARACHI: The Pakistan Standards and Quality Control Authority (PSQCA) has unveiled an updated list of mandatory items, featuring several new products, and has launched special inspection teams nationwide to enforce quality standards rigorously.

Director General Tawfiq Ali Abbasi emphasized that the newly formed teams are empowered to scrutinize the quality of goods across the country. Stringent measures will be enforced against unlicensed items, including confiscation of stock and the closure of non-compliant factories.

The revised list encompasses a wide range of food and non-food items, including medical devices, shaving cream, car and bicycle tires,



coffee, and electric sockets. Units failing to apply for a license within 14 days will face legal consequences.

DSP CTD Ali Raza Fatally Shot In Karachi Attack

KARACHI: Unidentified assailants gunned down Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) Investigations Deputy Superintendent Police (DSP) Ali Raza in Karachi's Karimabad area on Sunday.

The senior police officer, who was a close friend of another martyred officer senior superintendent police (SSP) Chaudhry Aslam, was targeted by two gunmen near a residential building in the area.

Ali received a bullet in the head following the heavy firing by the culprits and was immediately taken to the Abbasi Shaheed Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries during treatment.

A security guard of the residential building also lost his life in the fierce gun attack.

Police officers confirmed that one of the armed men donned an ajrak — a traditional block-printed shawl in Sindh — while the second gunman hid his face with a helmet. The attacker used a 9mm pistol with a silencer to



target the senior cop, they added. They said that Ali frequently used to visit the area to meet his childhood friends which increased suspicions that the assassins carried out the attack after full revenge.

The police personnel also found 11 spent bullet casings of a 9mm pistol from the crime scene. The attackers opened fire at DSP Ali after he came out of his "bullet-proof vehicle".

CTD Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Asif Aijaz Shaikh while speaking to journalists following Ali's killing today said that the culprits behind the attack would not be spared at any cost. He confirmed that the slain police officer "uses a bullet-proof vehicle". To a question regarding any threat to DSP Ali, Shaikh replied that "all CTD officers face threats". He added that two persons were involved in the attack who fired 11 times at Ali. DIG Shaikh further said that it would be too early to comment on the motives behind the attack which would be ascertained after a thorough probe. Following the attack, senior CTD officers including Raja Umar Khattab, Mazhar Mashwani and Khurram Ashraf also visited the crime scene.—RT/Agency

Karachi school headmaster rapes a 10-year-old



KARACHI: In a harrowing incident, a school's headmaster allegedly raped a 10-year-old female student in the city's Moach Goth area.

A case has been registered at the Mochko Police Station on the complaint by the victim's father, said the police officials.

The mother, in the first information report (FIR), said that three of her daughters take tuitions from the headmaster. "The headmaster called and asked to send our daughters on June 21, saying he wants to give them eid. However, when I refused, the headmaster insisted after which I sent my daughters," said the FIR.

Following the incident, the girl also underwent medical examination. The police said they are waiting for the report.

The victim's parents and local residents of the area protested at the Hub River Road against the suspect not being arrested. Due to the protest, the traffic was affected.

In a similar incident last month, a principal of a private school was arrested for torturing and harassing a female student. He was accused of attempting to rape a Class 10 student at the school near Orangi Town.

The principal had been sending obscene messages and harassing the victim for several days.

During the incident, he allegedly turned the CCTV camera towards the ceiling and coerced the student to commit adultery, threatening to fail her in her matriculation exams and ruin her future if she did not comply.—RT/Agency

However, police claimed that the said SHO was not engaged in the cross-firing as he was present at the police station at the time of the encounter. They said that the police party was chasing the criminals when the woman was caught in the line of fire.

The bereaved family had been seeking the registration of a first information report (FIR) against the Steel Town



Police Station's station house officer (SHO) for leading the encounter that left the woman dead.

Meanwhile, the victim's brother stressed that SHO should be booked as the police party couldn't engage in an encounter with criminals without the former's consent. However, the family ended the protest following talks led by East Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Ghulam Azfar Mahesar, saying that they "left the matter to Allah".—RT/Agency

New Poll Shows Biden Leading Trump In Key Battleground States Ahead Of 2024 Election

WASHINGTON: President Joe Biden is ahead of former president Donald Trump in two key battlegrounds — Michigan and Wisconsin — however, he faces challenges in swing states and trails behind his nemesis in Pennsylvania, a new poll showed, mostly due to his debate debacle.



On the night of June 27, Biden and Trump locked horns in the first presidential debate of the 2024 election cycle, which left America shell-shocked.

Political analysts attributed the surprise not to the latter's falsehoods and personal attacks but to the former's complete failure to grasp the situation.

Biden's doddering performance against the main Republican candidate in the debate could potentially end his campaign just four months before the election.

Desperately, the incumbent US president is now urging voters to consider

his 3½-year record of achievements in office rather than dwelling on his 90-minute debate debacle.

In Michigan, Biden has 48% of the vote compared to Trump's 43%, while in Wisconsin, the 81-year-old is leading with 47% of the vote compared to Trump's 44%.

Nevertheless, the Democrat is behind Trump in Pennsylvania, a state where Biden grew up and expected a lot of support. The Republican is leading with

51% of the vote there, while Biden has 44%.

Additionally, he's trailing in other swing states as well, like Arizona, Georgia, Nevada, and North Carolina, but the difference is small and within the poll's margin of error.

As per the poll conducted by Bloomberg News between July 1 and July 5, there are 4,902 voters in the seven swing states, with a one percentage point margin of error.

This poll comes follow-

ing Biden's poor performance in the presidential debate, which raised concerns about his age and his capability of serving as president for another term.

Around half of the people surveyed said Trump won the debate, with only 13% believing Biden had.

Some Democrats are reportedly considering urging Biden to withdraw from the race. The president, however, has stated publicly that he remains committed to running for re-election.

Speaking to ABC on Friday, Biden called his debate performance a "bad episode" and further added that there were no serious concerns about his health. He also mentioned that "most of the Democratic Party still supports him."

To the dismay of the entire America, the commander-in-chief wobbled on the debate stage, murmuring, muttering, and frequently fading out as if in a

trance — during the first presidential debate.

Between speaking, he stood quietly hunched over, with his mouth occasionally wide open and his eyes switching between confusion and clarity.

Even after 90 minutes, he seemed to have the same demeanour as when he entered, as his wife gently escorted him offstage, holding his hand.

However, in households across the country, this worst showing on the part of President Biden, triggered off some serious existential questions.

The octogenarian inadvertently became the poster child for many families' ageing and sometimes infirm relatives — showing how inherently fragile the human life is.

For many Americans, it was a heartbreaking portrayal of a man deep in the twilight of his otherwise eventful life.—RT/Agency

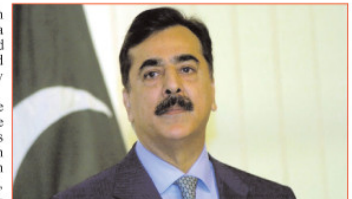

UNHCR Chief Begins Pakistan Visit, Meets Afghan Refugees In Peshawar

PESHAWAR: UN refugee agency chief Filippo Grandi on Sunday met Afghan refugees and asylum seekers in Peshawar as he began a three-day visit that will focus on the problems of Afghan refugees, a UNHCR spokesperson said.

Spokesperson Qaisar Afridi told media that Grandi, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), met delegations of Afghan refugees who apprised him about their problems in Pakistan.

"The UNHCR chief assured Afghan refugees that he would discuss with Pakistani officials about all issues of the refugees," the spokesperson said.

According to Afridi, the Afghan delegation comprised registered refugees and those who arrived in Pakistan after the Taliban takeover in August 2021.

The UNHCR chief also met Minister for States and Frontier Regions (SAFRON) Amir Muqam in Peshawar, the minister's of-



ice in Islamabad said. SAFRON ministry also deals with Afghan refugees. "Pakistan has been hosting Afghan refugees for 40 years despite serious economic difficulties," an official statement quoted the SAFRON minister as telling Grandi. This is the first visit of the UNHCR chief to Pakistan after the country announced a repatriation plan for "illegal foreigners" in October last year. Taliban rulers in Afghanistan had angrily reacted to Pakistan's decision to expel what Pakistan call illegal Afghans and called for a halt to the operation.

According to an estimate

nearly 500,000 Afghans, who did not have legal documents, have been repatriated to Afghanistan since November 1, 2023. Officials had earlier stated that about 1.7 million illegal Afghans are living in Pakistan. "The refugee issue is becoming complicated across the world. Conflicts are leading to refugee issues and attention must be paid to resolve conflicts," Minister Muqam told the UNHCR chief. Grandi-led UNHCR delegation praised Pakistan for taking care of Afghan refugees for a long time, the statement further said.—RT/Agency

UN Reports Lack Of Safe Havens For Palestinian Families In Gaza City

UNITED NATION: The UN agency for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA) said families in the Gaza Strip are facing dire circumstances with nowhere safe to seek refuge.

"Palestinian families in the Gaza Strip have nowhere safe to go," said UNRWA on X.

The agency also quoted its spokeswoman in Gaza, Louise Wateridge, in an interview with The New York Times, saying: "It's an endless cycle of death and displacement."

"People express here that they are losing hope, they are losing the willpower, faced with another forced displacement and absolutely no certainty of safety," Wateridge said.

"In terms of people's ability to move, it's been eight months of war, people are extremely fatigued, they're exhausted, they're malnourished."

She said "people are a lot



weaker, there are more injuries, there's been less medicine available, less fresh fruit, less water."

Israeli army spokesman Avichay Adraee on Monday called for the evacuation of Palestinians from areas east of Khan Younis, forcing them to flee towards al-Mawasi area in Rafah.

Israel has continued brutal offensive on Gaza since an Oct. 7, 2023 attack by the Palestinian group Hamas.

More than 38,000 Palestinians in Gaza have since

been killed, mostly women and children, and vast tracts of the territory lie in ruins amid a crippling blockade of food, clean water and medicine.

Israel also stands accused of genocide at the International Court of Justice, whose latest ruling ordered it to immediately halt its military operation in the southern city of Rafah, where over a million Palestinians had sought refuge from the war before it was invaded on May 6.—RT/Agency

Mohsin Naqvi Addresses Over-Billing Issue In Electricity Bills



ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Interior Mohsin Naqvi on Sunday took strict notice of the increasing complaints of overbilling of protected consumers and ordered legal action against the officers and staff involved in it.

The Minister issued directions to all Directors of FIA to immediately redress the injustice being faced by consumers using up to 200 units.

He has strictly prohibited the inclusion of protected consumers in the non-protected category, terming it a criminal act that will not be tolerated.

Mohsin Naqvi ordered

FIA to review the entire situation and take action against those responsible without any discrimination, in light of the facts.

He reiterated that adding protected consumers in the list of non-protected consumers is unacceptable under any circumstances. He further said that the overbilling has put an additional burden of millions of rupees on consumers, and protected consumers who are already facing difficulties have been further affected. He emphasized that the overbilling complaints and injustices faced by protected consumers must be addressed immediately.—RT/Agency

Multiple Victims, Including Women, Injured in Acid Attack

PESHAWAR: Two unidentified men threw acid on a woman travelling along with five others in rickshaw in Peshawar, media reported on Sunday.

The incident — a CCTV footage of which is available with media — took place on Peshawar's Abdara Road, where a woman along with five others was travelling in rickshaw.

Despite having CCTV footage, the police have failed to arrest the culprits. A first information report (FIR) has been registered against the attackers, according to which four people, including a 28-year-old woman and a 15-year-old girl, were



injured in the acid attack. The victim woman alleged that her former husband had been threatening to kill her and was behind the acid attack. The police are investigating the incident and searching for the culprits.—RT/Agency
