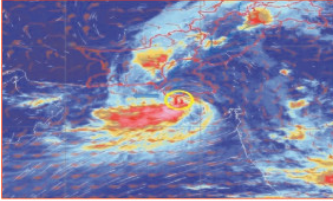

Cyclone Threat: Deep Depression Forms 170km From Karachi

KARACHI: The Pakistan Meteorology Department (PMD) on Friday said that the deep depression, which is slowly progressing towards the Arabian Sea from India's Rann of Kutch, is now 170 kilometres south-east of the port city.



According to the PMD, this deep depression — a very strong low-pressure area — is expected to keep moving west-southwestward along Sindh's coastal belt.

It further stated that it lies around Latitude 23.5 N & Longitude 67.9 E at about 170km south/southeast of Karachi and 88km south of Kati Bander.

The low pressure area may further intensify into a cyclonic storm upon entering the Arabian Sea by today afternoon or evening, if environmental conditions remain favourable, the PMD said in its latest cyclone alert.

PMD Director General Mehr Sahibzada Khan said in a press conference that the cyclone named Asna brewed off the Karachi-Gwadar coast which may result in heavy rainfalls after hitting western coastal areas.

"Cyclones usually advance from sea to land but Asna's advancement is vice versa [...] It will intensify into a hurricane whose impacts will be seen in the next week," he added.

"Our country is receiving

more than usual downpours due to this cyclone. Upper areas of the country will experience more rain from September 2 to 4."

Mehar predicted that the weather conditions would improve in southern areas after two days.

Additionally, the Met Office said that there is a possibility of heavy rain in Karachi in the next 24 hours, accompanied by strong winds and thundershowers.

The meteorology department's forecast on Friday recorded the minimum temperature in the metropolis at 26°C while the maximum temperature in the city is likely to be 28°C to 30°C. Meanwhile, winds in the metropolis are blowing from the northeast at a speed of 22km/hour.

According to the Met Office, heavy rainfalls are likely in Sindh areas under the influence of the potential cyclonic storm.

These areas include

Karachi division, Tharparkar, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Hyderabad, Tandu Muhammad Khan, Tandu Allah Yar, Matiari, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Jamshoro, Dadu and Shaheed Benazirabad districts till August 31.

Additionally, heavy downpour is also likely in Hub, Lasbella, Awaran, Keach and Gwadar districts between August 30 to September 1 with occasional gaps.

Heavy rains may cause water logging or rain inundation in low lying areas of the Sindh-Makran coast while sea conditions are likely to remain rough with squally winds of 60-70kph gusting 80kph. The PMD has advised fishermen in Sindh to avoid venturing into the sea till August 31 and those of Balochistan till September 1 while residents are advised to avoid unnecessary movement.—RT/Agency

Naqvi: Balochistan Attacks Targeting SCO Summit Preparations

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Interior Mohsin Naqvi on Friday said that the horrific attacks in Balochistan, wherein dozens including security personnel lost their lives, was a "plot to subvert" upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit to be hosted by Pakistan next month.



Balochistan, on August 26, faced a series of horrific attacks that resulted in over 50 deaths, including 14 security personnel, as militants affiliated with the banned Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) targeted civilians, police, and security forces.

In one of the deadliest attacks, at least 23 passengers were killed after being offloaded from passenger buses and trucks in the Karasham area of Balochistan's Musakhel.

Separately, at least 10 people, including police and Levies personnel, were martyred in a gun attack in Kalat.

Furthermore, at least 14 brave sons of soil, including 10 security forces soldiers and four personnel of law enforcement agencies (LEAs), were martyred in clearance operations, wherein at least 21 militants were neutralised.

Amid the latest terrorist incidents, Pakistan is set to host SCO Council of Heads of Government (CHG) meeting from October 15-16.

In this regard, Islamabad extended invitations to all heads of government of the member states, including Indian Prime Minister Narendra

Modi despite strained ties.

Speaking on the floor of the Senate today, the interior minister said that the "completely-planned" Balochistan attacks were carried out by "two to three terrorist organisations".

"A lot of people are in anguish as they don't want Pakistan to host the [SCO] meeting," he said, adding that the August 26 incident was a "conspiracy to sabotage the summit".

Naqvi further said that no operation was being launched in Balochistan while "stringent action would be taken against those who did not accept the state and took up arms".

He also said that the apex committee reviewed the decisions related to the National Action Plan (NAP) and coordinated with the federal and provincial institutions, adding "Parliament is supreme and will remain supreme".

Giving details of the Thursday's meeting chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in Quetta, the minister said that dialogue could only be held with those who respect the Constitution of Pakistan and salute the national flag.

He said the meeting decided to provide Rs5 billion to the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) to enhance capacity against terrorism while Rs8 billion including Rs1 billion would be given to each division of the province for the development which would be spent

with their local parliamentarians' recommendations.

The security czar said that to overcome the shortage of federal government employees as many as 30 to 40 officials would be deputed in the province within two days.

Pakistan has witnessed a surge in militant attacks since the Taliban government returned to power in neighbouring Afghanistan in 2021, mostly in the northwestern border province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, but also in southwestern Balochistan, which abuts Afghanistan and Iran. There were at least 170 militant attacks killing 151 civilians and 114 security personnel in Balochistan last year, according to the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies Islamabad accuses Kabul's new rulers of failing to root out militants sheltering on Afghan soil as they prepare to stage assaults on Pakistan.—RT/Agency

No Room For Deserters In PTI: Imran



ISLAMABAD: Incarcerated former prime minister Imran Khan has announced a policy for the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) deserters, stating that there is no room for those who left the party during difficult times.

"I want to clearly state that there is no space for those who abandoned the party during difficult times," the PTI founder said while speaking to the journalists in Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail.

Refusing to name anyone, the embattled party founder said that he knows who abandoned the party during difficult times.

"Those who were active during good times but left during hardships have no place in the party," he added that some deserters desired to join the party's ranks once more, but the PTI leadership categorically denied taking anyone back.

Most prominently, former federal minister Fawad Chaudhry — who is also a strong critic of current PTI leadership — expressed desire to rejoin party's fold, which was denied by the party's core committee.

"The PTI core committee 'strongly condemns' those politicians who parted ways during the difficult time, a resolution read, adding that such politicians have no moral rights or powers to comment on the party affairs.

The May 9 incidents refer to the violent protests that broke out in many parts of the country following the arrest of Khan in corruption

case.

The violent protests saw attacks on state properties including military installations, with the civil and military authorities vowing to try the rioters under the Army Act.

A few months later and ahead of the February 8 elections, reports had emerged that some deserters desired to join the party's ranks once more, but the PTI leadership categorically denied taking anyone back.

Most prominently, former federal minister Fawad Chaudhry — who is also a strong critic of current PTI leadership — expressed desire to rejoin party's fold, which was denied by the party's core committee.

"The PTI core committee 'strongly condemns' those politicians who parted ways during the difficult time, a resolution read, adding that such politicians have no moral rights or powers to comment on the party affairs.

The ex-Imran's aide, on May 24 last year announced "taking a break from politics" and parting ways with PTI over the May 9 mayhem when party workers and supporters allegedly attacked public and military installations almost across the country immediately after the arrest of the PTI founder.

A group of disgruntled PTI leaders also formed a separate political party — Ishtekam-e-Pakistan Party (IPP) led by Jahangir Tareen.

The 71-year-old cricketer-turned-politician has been in prison for more than a year after he was booked in plethora of cases, including the Toshakhana case, cipher case, and the un-Islamic marriage case.

Despite securing relief in several cases, the PTI founder remains behind bars after he was booked in new Toshakhana case and other cases related to May 9 mayhem.—RT/Agency

Security Forces Neutralize Five Terrorists In Balochistan IBOs

RAWALPINDI: At least five terrorists have been killed and three others injured by security forces in separate intelligence based operations (IBOs) in Balochistan's District Keach, Panjgur and Zhob.



In a statement issued by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) on Friday, the security forces are conducting extensive IBOs to hunt down the perpetrators of the Balochistan incident.

According to the military's media wing, the operations are being conducted in the backdrop of cowardly terrorist activities that targeted innocent civilians across Balochistan on August 26.

"On night August 29-30, in three separate IBOs in District Keach, Panjgur and Zhob, five terrorists were sent to hell by the security forces, while three terrorists got injured during the intense fire exchange," said the statement.

Moreover, sanitisation operations will continue until all perpetrators, facilitators and abettors of these atrocious acts are brought to justice, it added.

The statement further mentioned that the forces, in step with the nation, remain determined to thwart attempts at sabotaging peace, stability and progress of Balochistan.

The development comes after at least 23 passengers on Monday were killed after being offloaded from passenger buses and trucks in the Karasham area of Balochistan's Musakhel.

Separately, at least 10 people, including police and Balochistan Levies personnel, were martyred in a gun attack in Kalat.

US Defense Department Condemns Balochistan Terrorist Attack

WASHINGTON: The United States Department of Defense has "strongly condemned" the recent attack on Balochistan days after the province was marred by terrorist leaving dozens of civilians and security forces martyred.



Responding to a question regarding the Washington's support to Islamabad in dealing with such terrorist groups, Deputy Pentagon Press Secretary Sabrina Singh said she was not aware of any US involvement or assistance to Pakistan at this time.

"But if that changes, I can certainly let you know," she maintained.

"We strongly condemn any terrorist attack like that and of course our thoughts are with those who lost their lives during that attack, but I don't have anything beyond that," said Singh, addressing a press briefing at the Pentagon on Thursday.

Singh's statement comes in the wake of the recent bloodshed in Balochistan where over 50 people were martyred in different terrorist attacks.

In response to the series of horrific attacks, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif visited the provincial capital on Thursday and vowed to completely eradicate terrorism from the province at all costs, saying the "blood of martyrs will not go in vain".

The press secretary,

when responding to another question on whether the US can help Pakistan in rooting out terrorism from that region, said that Washington is always willing to work with any nation that wants to root out a terrorist organisation.

"We have good cooperation with the Pakistani government. But in terms of these attacks, I just — I don't have anything for you other than that we, of course, condemn them," said Singh.—RT/Agency

Aleema Khan: Imran Khan Facing Increased Restrictions



ISLAMABAD: Aleema Khan, the sister of PTI founder Imran Khan, has claimed that authorities have intensified pressure on her brother, aiming for a swift conviction in the £190 million case.

Speaking to the media outside Adiala Jail, she expressed concerns over the increasing restrictions on Imran Khan, including limitations on family visits.

Aleema Khan stated that no more than three people are being allowed to meet the former prime minister at a time, attributing this to the upcoming 8th September rally, which she believes has caused apprehension among the authorities.

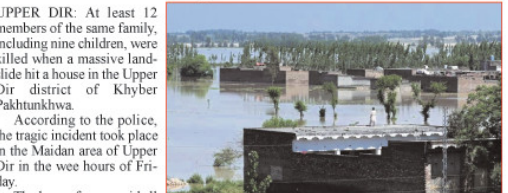
She noted that only Omar Ayub and Shibli Faraz were permitted to visit him yesterday, while many others were left waiting outside.

During her address, Aleema mentioned that when they filed a bail application in the Toshakhana case, the prosecution claimed they were unprepared, leading the judge to adjourn the hearing until Monday.

She expressed concern that efforts are being made to secure a quick conviction for Imran Khan in the £190 million case, citing remarks allegedly conveyed by Justice Qazi Faez Isa.

Aleema further warned that a conviction in the £190 million case could lead to additional legal challenges for Imran Khan in the High Court.—RT/Agency

Landslide In KP's Upper Dir Claims Lives Of 12 Family Members



UPPER DIR: At least 12 members of the same family, including nine children, were killed when a massive landslide hit a house in the Upper Dir district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

According to the police, the tragic incident took place in the Maidan area of Upper Dir in the wee hours of Friday.

The law enforcers said all 12 bodies have been retrieved from the debris and sent to the hospital for medico-legal formalities.

"Two women, one man and nine children were killed in the incident," said the officials.

President Asif Ali Zardari expressed his condolences to the family members of the deceased.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Information Adviser Barrister Muhammad Ali Saif expressed regret over the incident, saying he is deeply saddened by the deaths of 12

family members due to landslide.

"We are standing with the bereaved families in this difficult time of sorrow," said Barrister Saif while directing all authorities concerned including Rescue 1122 to remain on alert.

The KP information adviser said an advisory has been issued regarding landslides and flooding in mountainous areas, adding that advance measures have been taken to reduce losses in natural calamities.

"People are requested to

avoid going near rivers and streams," he said.

Meanwhile, a road in Upper Dir's Kumrat was washed away due to rains and landsliding. Moreover, many tourists are stuck as the water is flowing through the road near the river bank.

The development comes as Pakistan is hit by heavy monsoon rains with the Pakistan Meteorological Department forecasting more widespread rain with windstorm all across the country during the next 24 hours.—RT/Agency

Record flow of water passing through LBOD Spinal Drain

Court Denies Physical Remand For Orya Maqbool Jan In Cybercrime Case

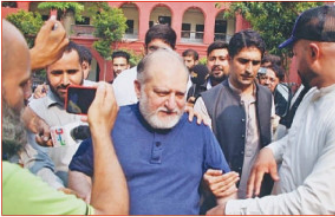
LAHORE: A district court on Friday rejected a request for a physical remand of columnist Orya Maqbool Jan.

Duty Magistrate Sarwat Batool denied the plea for a six-day physical remand and instead ordered Jan to be sent to jail on a 14-day judicial remand.

Orya Maqbool Jan is facing charges related to cyber-crime and hate speech.

Previously, the court had granted a four-day physical remand, placing Jan in the custody of the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA). He was arrested a few days ago.

On August 27, a judicial magistrate in Lahore ex-



tended the physical remand of anchorperson Orya Maqbool for an additional four days in a cybercrime case related to alleged hate speech against the country's top judge.

The extension followed the expiry of the anchor-

son's initial four-day remand. The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) presented Orya Maqbool, known for his controversial remarks, before the magistrate and requested further custody to complete the investigation.—RT/Agency

Security Forces Eliminate 12 Militants In Tirah Valley IBO

RAWALPINDI: Security forces killed 12 militants in the Tirah Valley of Khyber District during an intelligence-based operation, said ISPR.

According to a statement released by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the security forces have been conducting an operation in the Tirah Valley of Khyber District since August 20, following intelligence about the presence of militants.

ISPR reported that on August 28 and 29, security forces effectively targeted

the militants' hideouts, killing 12 militants after an intense exchange of fire.

The statement mentioned that these operations have dealt a significant blow to the militants and their affiliated organisations, with 37 terrorists killed and 14 others severely injured so far.

"Intelligence-based operations will continue until peace is restored in the area and the militants are eradicated. Pakistan's armed forces are committed to eliminating the scourge of terrorism from the country," said ISPR.—RT/Agency

PM Praises Security Forces For Anti-Terror Operations In Balochistan



ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Friday lauded the security forces for carrying out operations against the terrorists involved in attacks killing innocent people in Balochistan.

FIA Files 85 Cases And Arrests 240 Suspects In August

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Gujranwala Zone during the month of August filed a total of 85 cases and arrested 240 suspects involved in human trafficking, white-collar crime, and electricity theft, media reported on Friday.

The FIA Gujranwala zone released its performance report for the month of August 2024, highlighting significant achievements in the fight against human trafficking, white-collar crime, and electricity theft.

During the month, the FIA submitted challans (formal charges) for 209 accused to the court, after registering 85 cases, resulting in the arrest of 240 suspects. Notably, 63 cases were

registered specifically against human traffickers, leading to the arrest of 39 individuals involved in these crimes.

Among the arrested were the most wanted human traffickers, including six who were previously tagged as fugitives.

The operations uncovered that these traffickers had defrauded innocent citizens of approximately Rs 120 million by promising them overseas jobs. In addition to Pakistani passports, the FIA recovered fake documents of Spain, the UK, Italy, and Greece during various raids. The FIA Gujranwala Zone also conducted significant operations against electricity theft.—RT/Agency

Speaking during a meeting with Zubair Tufail, former FPCCI President and current President of the United Business Group (UBG), Khan highlighted the government's commitment to improving trade performance and easing business operations under the Prime Minister's vision.

Khan emphasized that past free trade agreements (FTAs) with Sri Lanka, Malaysia, and China had not served Pakistan's national interest, resulting in trade imbalances. He assured that current efforts are focused on rectifying these issues and promoting eco-



nomically. Tufail criticized previous FTAs, suggesting that they favored other countries over Pakistan. He called for future agreements to include business community input to enhance export potential. Specifically, he urged the government to negotiate increased meat exports to China and address trade challenges with Turkey due to a 25% duty. Tufail also advocated for a re-balanced FTA with Thai-

land. Additionally, Tufail raised concerns about the current contract for bulk chemicals import through Port Qasim, which is held by Engro and incurs high costs. He recommended not renewing Engro's contract and exploring alternatives to benefit local industries. Tufail further suggested leveraging Balochistan's mineral reserves and Gwadar Port to reduce reliance on the IMF.—RT

Murad Allocates Rs500 Million For IT Certification Program

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah has approved Rs500 million to launch IT certification programs aimed at enhancing the IT skills of students and professionals across the province. The initiative, part of a poverty reduction strategy, will offer industry-recognized certifications in nine trades.

The program, designed to benefit 10,000 youth initially, will be implemented in two phases. NED University will provide IT courses in Karachi Division and Tharparkar District, Mehran University in Hyderabad and Mirpurkhas Divisions, and IBA University in Larkana Division.

The certifications will cover a range of skills, including JAVA Development, Python Development, Database Administration, Graphic



Design, E-Commerce, Digital Marketing, Web Development, Mobile Application Development, and Data Science. Each certification course will last two months, with classes held five days a week, from Monday to Friday, accommodating 30 to 35 participants per batch.

The Chief Minister emphasized that the program would equip participants with practical skills to excel in the job market. An MOU was signed with NED University, IBA

Iranian Delegation Urges Elimination Of Unofficial Trade With Pakistan To Boost Official Channels

KARACHI: Reza Babak Afghahi, Chief Executive of Iran's Ta'min Petroleum & Petrochemical Investment Company (TAPPICO), emphasized the need to eliminate unofficial trade between Iran and Pakistan during a visit to the Karachi Chamber of Commerce & Industry. He stressed that many Iranian products currently enter Pakistan through unofficial channels, and called for a shift to official trade to enhance economic benefits for both countries.

Afghahi highlighted that Pakistan imported LPG, methanol, motor oil, and other products worth \$5 billion last year, which could be produced locally through joint ventures with Iranian companies. He reassured that despite international sanctions, Iran has successfully exported goods worth \$200 million to the U.S., and sim-



ilar strategies could be used to facilitate trade between Iran and Pakistan.

The meeting, attended by Commercial Attaché of the Iranian Consulate Karachi Morad Nemat, KCCI President Ifthikhar Ahmed Sheikh, and other KCCI officials, also addressed the need to improve bilateral trade, streamline customs procedures, and establish a formal banking channel. Present Sheikh noted that the current trade volume falls short of its potential

and urged for the reduction of trade barriers and support for SMEs.

Sheikh suggested that enhancing connectivity, investing in infrastructure, and establishing border markets could strengthen economic cooperation and reduce illegal trade. He also invited Iranian investors to explore opportunities within the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), particularly in special economic zones offering significant incentives.—RT

Solar Power Conclave Emphasizes Need To Maximize Solar Potential For Energy Security



LAHORE: At the Solar Power Conclave & Technology Excellence Awards 2024, energy sector leaders underscored the urgent need to harness Pakistan's solar power potential to transition from fossil fuels and alleviate high electricity tariffs.

The event, organized by The Energy Update in collaboration with the Ministry of Energy (Power Division), Private Power Infrastructure Board (PPIB), and Pakistan Solar Association, featured discussions on expanding solar energy use and improving regulatory frameworks.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Faisal Karim Kundli, the chief guest, expressed concern over the rising electricity bills and called for immediate government action to address the energy crisis. He advocated for utilizing natural resources like solar and wind

energy to provide affordable electricity, particularly to lower-income households.

Faizan Ali from the Prime Minister's Solarization Committee revealed plans to add 10 gigawatts of solar power over the next decade, with a proposal soon to be submitted for approval. Swiatek calls for more tools to help players combat online abuse



Five-times Grand Slam champion Iga Swiatek called for the sport's governing bodies to provide players with more tools to combat online abuse after Caroline Garcia spoke about the hate she received on the internet.

On Wednesday, Frenchwoman Garcia said she received online abuse after her first-round loss at the US Open and blamed "unhealthy betting" as one of the main reasons players are targeted on social media.

The ITF, WTA, AELTC and USTA in December launched a monitoring service named Threat Matrix, which uses a combination of artificial intelligence and open-source data, to help protect their athletes.

The French Open has also made AI-powered software available for players, which is designed to block online harassment and hate speech.

"It would be nice if we can do more as (Garcia) did and try to educate people to provide players with more tools to combat online abuse after Caroline Garcia spoke about the hate she received on the internet.

"I feel like we can't be on the internet and feel safe anymore. You have to really be careful on what you're reading, you you're following. I know that there are some tools that, for example, Roland Garros offered for us.

This app that we can have on the phone, and it's going to block the hateful messages. It's also going to learn with you when you're going to tag some messages as hateful or comments, you know... It would be nice if we had more opportunities to use these kind of tools. —Agency

Despite manager Carlo Ancelotti making four changes to the team that narrowly defeated Valladolid, Real Madrid started the game sluggishly. Las Palmas capitalised on this, with Moleiro scoring from a quick counterattack in the fifth minute. The hosts missed several opportunities to extend their lead as Real Madrid's defence struggled to find stability. Goalkeeper Thibaut Courtois made three crucial saves to keep the visitors in the match. After the break, substitute Rodrigo added much-needed energy and creativity to Real's attack. Las Palmas goalkeeper Jasper Cillessen made important stops to deny Antonio Rudiger, Federico Valverde, Aurelien Tchouameni, and Vinicius Jr. However, forward Sandro squandered a clear chance to double Las Palmas' lead, sending his shot well over the bar in the 54th minute. Real Madrid salvaged a point when Vinicius converted a penalty after Las Palmas defender Alex Suarez was penalised for handball. The result sees Real Madrid continue their unbeaten run, while Las Palmas remain in 16th place. Real Madrid will face Real Betis at home on Sunday, while Las Palmas travel to the Basque Country to play Alaves.—Agency

Cristiano Ronaldo 'honoured' to receive major UEFA Champions League award

Portuguese football legend Cristiano Ronaldo was "honoured" to have been crowned the "all-time leading goalscorer" in the UEFA Champions League.

Ronaldo's remarkable feats in Europe's elite club competition, spanning over 18 years, were recognised during the inaugural 2024/25 UEFA Champions League at Monaco's Grimaldi Forum.

After receiving the award, the 39-year-old Al Nassr star said: "The first win with Manchester United was very special. Winning four times with Real Madrid was also incredible.

"In 2018, in Lisbon, I felt the pressure of being the most expensive player in the world and needing to win the Champions League. But I think goals and trophies are



like ketchup; once they start coming, they keep coming."

Taking to his Instagram after the event, the five-time Ballon d'Or award winner shared a snap from the event in a post.

In the caption, he wrote: "Honored to receive this award from @championsleague for being the all-time top scorer of the competition. Grateful for all the

support along the way! Thank you!" Ronaldo has made history in Europe several times, scoring 140 goals in 183 matches while playing for Manchester United, Real Madrid and Juventus and also lifted the elusive title five times, which is the second most by any player.

He has won the competition four times with Real Madrid (2014, 2016, 2017, and 2018) and once with Man Utd (2008). He is also the only player to score in three different finals (2008 against Chelsea, 2014 against Atletico Madrid and 2017 against Juventus). Additionally, Ronaldo finished as the Champions League top-scorer in seven different seasons and holds the record for most goals in a single season, as he netted 17 goals during Madrid's historic Champions League win in the 2013/14 season.

He also holds the record for longest Champions League scoring streak having struck in 11 successive matches from June 2017 to April 2018. Ronaldo has also scored an astounding eight Champions League hat-tricks.—Agency

Afghan Khudadadi wins first paralympic medal as a refugee

PARIS: Afghan Zakiya Khudadadi completed a remarkable journey to become the first athlete from the refugee team to win a medal at the Paralympics when she clinched a taekwondo bronze.

Khudadadi, who made her Paralympics debut in Tokyo days after being exfiltrated from Taliban-controlled Kabul, secured her place on the podium when her opponent withdrew before her bronze medal bout in the K44-47kg category.

The 25-year-old, who was granted asylum by France, was cheered on like a local throughout the day by the Grand Palais crowd and by her coach, Haby Niare, who took a taekwondo silver medal at the Rio Olympics in 2016.

"This medal is fantastic for me but also for all the women in Afghanistan and all the refugees," she said in impeccable French.

"We're not giving up for equality and freedom in my country." Khudadadi, who was already looking ahead to the next Games in Los Angeles where she said she intended to win gold, delivered a message of freedom. "I want to give this



medal to the whole world. I hope that one day there will be freedom in my country, for all the world, for all the girls, for all the women, for all the refugees in the world." Khudadadi, who was born with an atrophied arm, said.

"And that all of us work towards that, for liberty and equality." As the Paralympic Games begin, a new high-tech headset allows visually impaired fans to enjoy the action like never before. The Taliban's restrictions on women and freedom of expression have drawn sharp criticism from rights groups and many foreign governments since the former insurgents resumed control of Afghanistan in 2021.—Agency

Misbah-ul-Haq to mentor Wolves in Champions Cup



LAHORE: Former Pakistan captain and all-format head coach Misbah-ul-Haq has been confirmed as mentor of the Wolves side for next month's Champions One-Day Cup, which will be played in Faisalabad from 12-29 September.

Prior to Misbah, Shoaib Malik was named as the mentor of the Stallions side on Thursday, while announcements of team names for the other three mentors - Saqlain Mushtaq, Sarfaraz Ahmed and Waqar Younis - will be made in the coming days.

While Shoaib Malik's Stallions has been allocated Sialkot Cricket Academy for training and practice during the 2024-25 domestic cricket season, Misbah's side has been allocated Faisalabad Cricket Academy to prepare for the events during the upcoming season.

The Champions One-Day Cup will feature the country's 150 best of the best cricketers. This will be a 50-over tournament that will be played in a single-league format.

All but the 16 September match between Lions and Panthers, which will start at 9.30 am, will commence at 3 pm. There will be three play-offs in four days with the final on Sunday, 29 September.

Misbah-ul-Haq's Wolves will take on Panthers on the opening day on 12 September, followed by matches against Stallions (15 September), Dolphins (17 September) and Lions (20 September).

Misbah ul Haq is Pakistan's most successful Test captain, who led his side to victories in 26 out of 56 Tests, including the country to No.1 in the ICC Test Team Rankings in August 2016.

Before that, he equalled the then-world record of the fastest Test century by hitting a 56-ball 100 against Australia in Abu Dhabi in 2014.

Misbah-ul-Haq has featured in two 50-over World Cups, three T20 World Cups and three ICC Champions Trophy events for Pakistan.

He was a member of the side that played in the final of the ICC T20 World Cup 2007 and won the tournament two years later at Lord's.—Agency

Joe Root dedicates record-equalling century to Late Graham Thorpe

LONDON: England batter Joe Root paid an emotional tribute to the late Graham Thorpe after scoring a milestone 33rd Test hundred against Sri Lanka at Lord's on Thursday, saying much of his success was down to the impact of his former coach.

His innings meant Root equalled Alastair Cook's record for the most Test hundreds by an England batter after he came in with the side faltering at 42-2 on the first day of the second Test.

Root immediately pointed to the sky after reaching three figures in a gesture in memory of former England batter and assistant coach Thorpe, who died aged 55 earlier this month after taking his own life.

A deeply moved Joe



Root, whose composed 143 helped England reach 358-7 at stumps, told reporters: "I've been very lucky to work with a lot of people, whether it be senior players, coaches, mentors, and Thorpe was one of those people who offered me so much.

"It was nice to be able to think of him [Graham Thorpe] in that moment. He's someone I'm sorely going to miss, and who I owe a lot to. He put a lot into my game and my career, and without his help, I definitely wouldn't be where I am now."

Graham Thorpe, who won exactly 100 Test caps, was widely regarded as the best England batsman of his

generation. The stylish left-hander was also one of the first to recognise Root's talent.

"Before I'd even made a hundred at first-class level he picked me for an England Lions (A team) game against Sri Lanka at Scarborough," said Root.

"He saw something with me... He pushed very hard for me to be involved in that India tour where I made my debut (in 2012) and from that point onwards we worked together."

Root added: "It evolved into more than that, we became good friends and I really enjoyed spending a lot of time with him. It was nice to pay a small tribute. He means a lot to me and that was a small thank you.—Agency

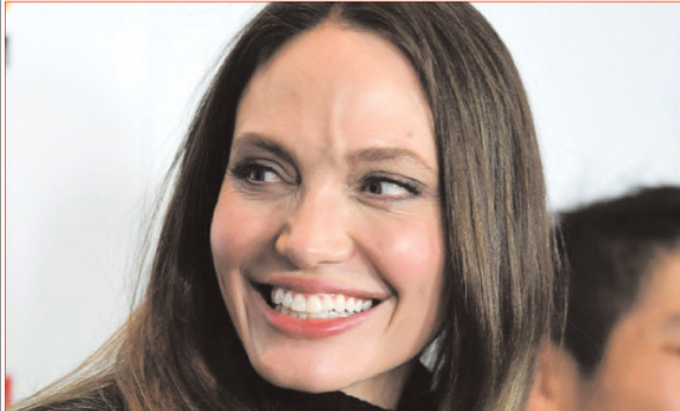

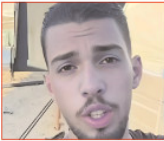
Blogger documenting life in Gaza killed in alleged Israeli airstrike

A Gaza-based blogger who gained a substantial following on Instagram and TikTok by portraying daily life in Gaza has been killed in an Israeli strike.

Mohammad 'Medo' Halimy, 20, was struck by shrapnel from an Israeli missile blast in Khan Younis on Monday, according to two youth organisations he had previously collaborated with.

The Tamer Institute for Community Education informed the BBC that Halimy was in a sheltering area near the beach when he was fatally injured by debris from the explosion.

The Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) told the BBC they could not confirm a strike in Khan Younis on Monday but stated they continue to "counter threats while striving to minimize harm to civilians" in Gaza.



Halimy had built a following of over 250,000 on Instagram and TikTok after his family was forced to flee their home due to Israeli military operations following the October 7 attacks.

His videos featured everything from simple cooking recipes made with limited supplies to tutorials on creating his content.

In an interview last year, he mentioned that each video cost him about \$3, a significant amount in Gaza.

He posted his final video on Monday, hours before his death, showcasing his talent

and detailing his day's activities.

Both Palestinian organisations that confirmed his death to the BBC reported that the fatal strike occurred on a nearby street, with Halimy being injured by flying debris.

He succumbed to his injuries the following day. Spark, a Gaza-based charity with which Halimy had worked in the summer of 2023, confirmed his death to the BBC, praising his "ability to add beauty and splendour to a place wherever it is."

"His sister, Rahaf, announced his passing on Instagram. Writing, 'Muhammad, your kindness will remain with us, and we believe you deserve a better world. May God accept you as a martyr.' — Agency

Germany departs first Afghan nationals since Taliban govt took control



FRANKFURT: Germany said it carried out Friday the first deportation of Afghans back to their home country since Taliban authorities took power in August 2021, as Berlin faces pressure to crack down on migration.

"These were Afghan nationals, all of whom were convicted offenders who had no right to stay in Germany and against whom deportation orders had been issued," government spokesman Stefan Hebestreit said in a statement.

A chartered Qatar Airways flight bound for Kabul took off from Leipzig airport just before 0500 GMT with 28 Afghans on board, Der Spiegel magazine said, citing security sources.

The operation was the result of two months of "secret negotiations" in which Qatar acted as the go-between between Berlin and the Taliban authorities, Spiegel reported.

Hebestreit said Germany had "asked key regional partners for support in order to facilitate the deportations" without giving more details.

Germany completely stopped deportations to Afghanistan and closed its embassy in Kabul following the Taliban administration taking power in 2021.

Friday's deportation comes as the German government faces growing calls to curb illegal migration and take tougher action against dangerous and convicted asylum seekers, following a series of high-profile crimes by migrant suspects.

Germany is still reeling from last week's knife attack at a street festival in the western city of Solingen that left three people dead, allegedly committed by a 26-year-old Syrian man — Agency

Five Iranian policemen arrested after suspect dies in custody amid torture allegations

Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian has ordered an investigation into the death in custody of a defendant in the northern city of Lahijan, state media reported.

"Following the tragic incident in Lahijan, the president ordered the interior minister to form a committee to investigate all aspects of this incident and report its results to the cabinet as soon as possible," the head of government public relations Elias Hazrati said.

Five policemen were arrested by the judiciary in relation to the case, according to the judiciary's Mizan news agency, which did not reveal the deceased's name, the charges he was facing, or the date on which he died.

"Following the violation of a citizen's rights, necessary follow-ups were carried out and defendants related to the case were imprisoned based on a temporary arrest warrant," Lahijan's prosecutor, Ebrahim Ansari, said according to Mizan.

Ansari added that forensic pathologists carried out fol-



low-ups to determine the cause of death of the accused, without providing additional information.

Iranian activist rights group Hengaw reported that the deceased, who it identified as 36-year-old Mohammad Mirmousavi, was arrested on Aug. 24 following an altercation and tortured to death on the same day.

A blurred video was circulated on social media showing the lacerated back of a topless man. Reuters could not verify the authenticity of the video.

The respect of citizens' rights, including women and minorities, was one of the electoral promises of the relatively moderate Pezeshkian, who won the presidency in July.

In 2022, the death in custody of young Kurdish-Iranian woman Mahsa Amini, who was arrested for flouting Iran's strict hijab laws, sparked months of nationwide protests in what became a major challenge to the Islamic Republic, said this was the seventh case of a death in custody since the start of the year — Agency

Doha talks yield no progress on Gaza cease-fire as Israeli delegation leaves

The Israeli delegation that arrived in the Qatari capital Doha on Wednesday for high-stakes negotiations on the Gaza cease-fire has left without reaching any agreements, Israeli media claimed on Friday.

According to Haaretz daily, an Israeli negotiating team made up of representatives from the intelligence agency Mossad, the security agency Shin Bet, and the military returned to Israel from Qatar.

The daily added that "there have been no breakthroughs in the talks thus far regarding the red lines set forth by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, including the issues of inspections at the Netzarim route," the presence of the Israeli army on the Philadelphia route, and the manning of the Rafah crossing — Agency

Musk's X braces for Brazil shutdown as authorities call for accountability

SAO PAULO: An ongoing feud between a Brazil Supreme Court justice and Elon Musk left social media platform X on the brink of being blocked in the country, as President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva demanded that the billionaire comply with local laws.

X was still working normally in Brazil on Friday morning, but the platform said late on Thursday that it expected Supreme Court Justice Alexandre de Moraes to order a shutdown "soon," after a court-imposed deadline expired for the company to identify a legal representative in Brazil.

"Each and every citizen from any part of the world that has an investment in Brazil is subject to the Brazilian constitution and



Brazilian laws," Lula told a local radio station on Friday.

"Just because a guy has a lot of money doesn't mean he can disrespect (the law)," the leftist leader added. Musk on Thursday had criticized Lula as Moraes' "lapdog" in a post on X in which the billionaire also called Moraes a "dictator".

The judge, in a separate event on Friday, reiterated his view that social media needs regulation to contain "hate speech." He did not provide any details about when he might issue an order blocking X. "Those who violate democracy, who violate fundamental human rights, whether in person or through social media, must be held accountable," Moraes said. Under Brazilian laws governing the internet, social media platforms are required to have a locally based representative. — RT/Agency

Kamala Harris defends immigration shift



SAVANNAH: Kamala Harris defended some personal shifts in policy toward the center on Thursday and said she might name a Republican to her cabinet if elected, in her first interview with a mainstream news organization since Democrats nominated her for president.

"I think the most important and most significant aspect of my policy perspective and decisions is, my values have not changed," she told CNN anchor Dana Bash in an early excerpt from the interview to be broadcast at 9 pm ET (0100 GMT on Friday).

Harris has moved more toward the center on some issues from the time she ran for president in 2020 until she took over from President Joe Biden as the Democrats' choice to face Republican former President Donald Trump in the Nov. 5 election.

She has toughened her position on migration along the southern US border with Mexico. She also no longer wants a ban on fracking, an energy production method that employs many people in Pennsylvania, one of a handful of swing states that could decide the election.

"My value around what we need to do to secure our border — that value has not changed. I spent two terms as the attorney general of California prosecuting transnational criminal organizations, violations of American laws, regarding the illegal passage of guns, drugs and human beings across our border. My values have not changed," she said — Agency

NADRA Reaffirms Commitment To Financial Inclusion and Digitalization At Stakeholders' Conference



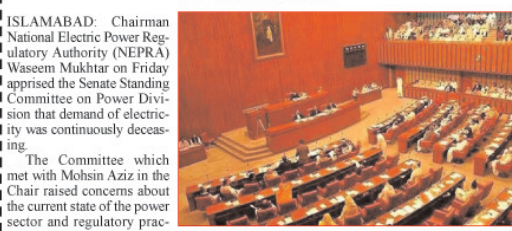

Senate Body Reports Decrease In Electricity Demand



ISLAMABAD: Chairman National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) Wassim Mukhtar on Friday apprised the Senate Standing Committee on Power Division that demand of electricity was continuously decreasing.

The Committee which met with Mohsin Aziz in the Chair raised concerns about the current state of the power sector and regulatory practices in the country.

The Chairman told that the authority did not intend to add more capacity to the grid.

The Committee members challenged NEPRA's independence and tariff decisions. Senator Shibli Faraz questioned NEPRA's recent tariff adjustments. He inquired whether NEPRA increased electricity costs by three rupees instead of the anticipated five.

Faraz demanded transparency regarding the increase in electricity prices over the past two years and urged the provision of detailed reports on power projects nationwide.

Minister for Power Division, Sardar Awais Ahmad Leghari highlighted ongoing efforts to review and revise Independent Power Producers (IPPs) agreements, including those related to the Diamir Bhasha Dam.

He warned that the cost of hydroelectricity from the Diamir Bhasha Dam would be high, stressing, "Diamir Bhasha Dam will increase electricity prices."

Furthermore, the Committee also commented on the Task Force to scrutinize IPPs, a task force has been established to closely examine IPPs, following recommendations from the Mahammad Ali Report.

This report suggests a detailed study, including district audits, though the focus has shifted towards arbitration rather than direct audits. Additionally, the committee debated load shedding and project costs. The minister also discussed the implications of load shedding and questioned the need for 1875 MW capacity if load shedding persists.

Mohsin Aziz raised concerns about the high cost of wind projects in Pakistan compared to international standards, urging a reassessment of why local projects are significantly more expensive.

Overall, the committee's meeting underscored critical issues facing Pakistan's energy sector, from regulatory challenges to escalating costs and project evaluations. — RT/Agency

President Xi says China committed to good ties with US

BEIJING: Chinese President Xi Jinping told top White House aide Jake Sullivan on Thursday that Beijing remained committed to good ties with the United States, despite "great changes".

Sullivan, the first US national security adviser to visit China since 2016, met Xi as he wrapped up three days of talks in the Chinese capital which also saw him meet Foreign Minister Wang Yi and other high-ranking officials.

Sullivan's visit comes as China is embroiled in security rows with US allies Japan and the Philippines.

But state broadcaster CCTV said Xi told Sullivan that in spite of "great changes", China and the US



could still enjoy good ties. "China's commitment to the goal of stable, healthy, and sustainable development of China-US relations hasn't changed," Xi said. "We hope that the US will work with China to meet each other halfway," he added, according to CCTV.

Sullivan said US President Joe Biden is looking forward to talks with Xi Jinping in the "coming weeks".

Sullivan told Xi that Biden "looks forward to engaging with you again in the coming weeks". "President Biden is committed to regularly managing this consequential relationship to ensure that competition does not veer into conflict or confrontation, and to work together where our interests align," he said — Agency

PMD Issues Warning For Fishermen As Deep Depression Nears Sindh

KARACHI: The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has issued a warning for fishermen and sailors, advising them to avoid venturing into the sea until Sunday. This precaution follows the movement of a deep depression towards Sindh in the Arabian Sea.



The PMD noted that the depression has the potential to intensify into a cyclonic storm, which could lead to flooding in urban areas and flash floods in hilly regions in the coming days. Heavy rains and strong winds have already impacted several districts across the country.

According to the PMD alert, fishermen in Sindh are advised not to go to sea until August 31, while those in Balochistan should refrain from fishing until September 1 due to the threat of rough sea conditions. Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, and other Sindh districts are expected to experience intermittent heavy rainfall until August 31. Similarly, Hub, Lasbela, Awaran, Kech, and Gwadar districts in Balochistan may witness torrential showers until Sunday.

The PMD's third alert for the tropical cyclone indicates that the deep depression is currently situated near India's Rann of Kutch and its adjacent areas. The system has been slowly moving west and southwest over the past 12 hours and is now located approximately 200 kilometers east and southeast of Karachi.

The PMD warns that the system is likely to continue moving west and south-west, possibly entering the Arabian Sea and the adjoining Indus coastline by this evening. The department cautions that severe sea flooding is expected, with winds already blowing at 50 to 60 km/h, and gusts reaching up to 70 km/h.—RT/Agency

Murad Proposes Electricity Tariff Reforms In Meeting With Federal Power Minister

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah proposed significant changes to electricity tariffs during a video conference with Federal Minister for Power Awaiz Leghari. Shah suggested that, given the current electricity production exceeds demand, peak-hour tariffs and various pricing slabs should be abolished to provide relief to the public, particularly low-income customers.



Syed Nasir Shah, Chief Secretary Asif Hyder Shah, PSCM Agha Wasif, and Secretary Energy Munsif Khan on the Sindh side, and Federal Secretary for Power Dr. Fakhre Alam on the federal side, focused on the need to adjust tariffs for low-income households.

Shah recommended a flat rate for all domestic consumers, with specific relief for those using 300 to 500 units per month, potentially through the BISP program.

Federal Power Minister Awaiz Leghari agreed that a detailed plan to support low-income consumers is necessary and mentioned that the Prime Minister and President Asif Ali Zardari have directed him to explore solutions. Leghari acknowledged the need to lower production costs through the use of local fuels to enable tariff reductions but noted that the proposal to abolish different tariff slabs is still open for debate.

Shah also proposed offering subsidized electricity rates to factories that operate night shifts, suggesting that this could optimize power usage and create job opportunities. Leghari indicated that a follow-up meeting would be arranged to further discuss and finalize these proposals.

Airport Authorities Issue Alert Amid Thunderstorm Forecast In Karachi

KARACHI: In light of the forecasted torrential rains, the Pakistan Airport Authority (PAA) has implemented emergency and safety measures to ensure secure flight operations at Karachi's Jinnah International Airport. Authorities have emphasized the urgent need to drain accumulated water from tarmac areas to prevent aircraft accidents.

As a precaution, light-weight fixed-wing and rotary-wing aircraft have been relocated to safer locations, and additional weight has been added to smaller aircraft to prevent damage.

The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has issued a warning for heavy rains across coastal regions of Sindh in the next 24 hours. Fishermen are advised to avoid venturing into the open sea for the next 48 hours due to severe weather conditions.

Rain is expected in several areas, including Tharparkar, Badin, Thatta, Sajawal, Hyderabad, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Ullah Yar, Matiari, Umakot, Mirpur Khas, Sanghar, Jamshoro, Dadu, and Shaheed Benazirabad. Karachi Division is anticipated to experience intermittent stormy rains until August 31, with concerns about potential flooding in urban areas and canals in Balochistan.

The NDMA advises residents to stay vigilant and prepare for possible emergencies.—RT/Agency

PTI Sindh President Urges Immediate Action From CM On Rain Damage Across Sindh

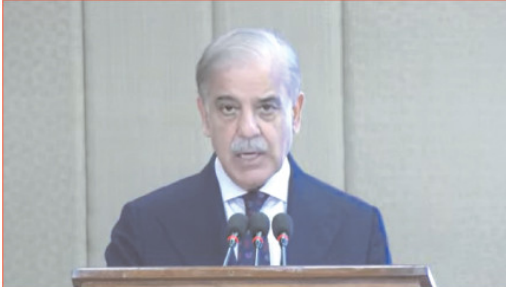
PM: Terrorists To Be Made Examples Of In Progress Journey

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Friday vowed that the government as well as the armed forces would collectively make the terrorists an example to accomplish the journey of the country's progress and prosperity.

"This is for sure, the armed forces and the law enforcement agencies will collectively make them (terrorists) an example. Without this, the country's journey of progress and prosperity cannot be accomplished. We have unity of thought and action on this," he remarked addressing the meeting of the federal cabinet chaired by him here.

The prime minister, referring to his Thursday visit to Quetta, said that the provincial government and the political leaders unanimously viewed that any talks with the anti-state elements were out of the question.

He said the family members of the martyrs he interacted with during his visit,



were in high morale despite losing their dear ones in the terrorist incident.

Prime Minister Shehbaz said the federal government would implement the proposals put forward by the provincial political leaders during his visit.

He told the cabinet members that during the visit, the Quetta Corps Commander gave a presentation on challenges faced by Balochistan

and how the terrorists, funded by foreign forces, were sowing hatred against Pakistan among the people. He said the civilian government was also taking effective measures for the youth's uplift.

Besides, the officers and the personnel of the armed forces were chasing the terrorists with the federal government's support, he said, and assured the federal government would spend Rs55 billion to solarise agricultural tube wells in Balochistan.

The prime minister said that Moody's has recently upgraded Pakistan's rating to indicate the country's improving economic condition.

"This is a long journey. This yet needs more concerted efforts to improve the economy. The whole nation, including the provincial governments, are united on this," he said.

Federal Government, ECP, And Others Issued Notices In Election Act Amendment Case

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court (LHC) has issued notice to the federal government, Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and other parties in a case pertaining to the amendment in the Election Act.

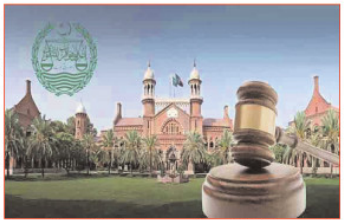
LHC's Justice Muhammad Raza Qureshi heard the application filed by Advocate Muneer Ahmed against the Election Act amendment.

The application has made the Senate chairman, National Assembly speaker, PM, opposition leader and political parties respondents in the case.

The assistant attorney general informed the court that an additional attorney general couldn't appear before the court due to its busy schedule and requested adjournment of the case hearing.

Applicant's lawyer Azhar Siddique informed that the court has issued a notice of 27 A to Attorney General of Pakistan and additional attorney general appearance wasn't necessary.

Lawyer added that the Supreme Court had directed for immediate verdict issued on the application. Azhar Siddique said that



the court was due to issue judgment on the application under the Article 187 Section 2 of the constitution.

The Election Act was enforced from the past by making amendments in it and now law could not be enacted from the past, the lawyer stated in the court.

Consequently, LHC has issued notices to the federal government and others in the case by adjourning the case hearing until September 9.

In the last hearing of this case on August 24, LHC's Justice Shakeel Ahmad heard the case and issued the two-page written verdict.

Petitioner in his petition contended that four amendments were made in the Election Act to revoke the Supreme Court reserved

seats verdict. The amendment act was passed without approval of the relevant committee and consultation. The petitioner contended that Parliament couldn't nullify the member bench decision by amendment in the act and requested to declare the amendment null and void.

Citizen Mashkoor Hussain had also filed the petition through Nadeem Sarwar against the Election Act amendment.

It is pertinent to note that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has also challenged the Election Act amendment in the Supreme Court on August 7, labelled it violation of constitution and law and aimed to thwart PTI.—RT/Agency

Adiala Jail Administration Denies PTI's Claims About Imran's Facilities

RAWALPINDI: The Adiala jail administration on Friday denied reports about withdrawing facilities for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, while the party is insisting he is facing hardships citing a lack of due facilities.

The superintendent of Central Jail Rawalpindi, famously referred to as the Adiala jail, said all the facilities were available to Khan, with special attention on his security and health.

"The PTI founder is supplied one English newspaper daily. He has an exercise machine and place for walk [to keep him fit]," he said.

The jail official added that the former prime minister and his incarcerated spouse, Bushra Bibi, had been allocated a separate kitchen, while prison staff was present 24/7 for his security.

The Adiala jail superintendent said books were also available for him to read.

The official repudiated the report about an open sewer in Khan's cell and rats in Bushra Bibi's cell, saying, "There is no veracity in the news of an open sewer in



Khan's cell or rats in Bushra's."

The official said the PTI founder was allowed to meet family, lawyers as well as hold political meetings twice a week. Also on the occasion of case hearings the PTI founder met those who attended the hearings in the jail, the official maintained.

The jail official said Khan also had the facility of television in his prison cell.

The jail's stance comes in the wake of claims made by PTI Senator Muhammad Ail Khan Saif who relayed media about a spectrum of "facilities" his leader is being deprived of. The senator said he called on Khan at the prison and found he was encountering adversities there.

The PTI founder was not given the facilities that President Asif Ali Zardari and former prime minister Nawaz Sharif enjoyed during their respective jail terms, he maintained.

"The PTI founder is suffering from ear pain. He's not being provided an electric toothbrush and a dumbbell for exercise," he said.

Saif said the ex-premier was not being allowed to talk to his sons as well over the phone.

He conveyed the workers' sentiments to the PTI supreme, saying that they were dejected after the August 22 public rally was postponed abruptly.

The PTI founder directed him to make the party leaders sit down and resolve grievances, he said.—RT/Agency

Federal Cabinet Approves Talks On ML-1 Financial Agreement



ISLAMABAD: The Federal cabinet on Friday approved starting negotiations on the Financial Commitment Agreement between China and Pakistan Railways for the up gradation of the ML-1 project, a crucial component of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

The cabinet meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, instructed that the final agreement (on ML-1) be brought back to the cabinet for approval.

The prime minister briefed the cabinet on his recent visit to Quetta, highlighting ongoing efforts to strengthen the capacity of law enforcement agencies, such as the police and levies, in Balochistan.

The prime minister stated

that the entire nation was committed to eliminate terrorism and setting an example by dealing firmly with terrorists.

He also praised the Balochistan provincial government for its commendable efforts to integrate Baloch youth into the national mainstream, aiming for their development and prosperity.

The prime minister stated that the federal government will fully support the Balochistan government in offering world-class education and equal development opportunities to Baloch youth.

The Cabinet also approved the decisions made by the Economic Coordination Committee on August 29, 2024.—RT/Agency

US Welcomes Pakistan's Envoy Rizwan Saeed At Credential Presentation Ceremony

WASHINGTON: Rizwan Saeed Sheikh, Pakistan's new ambassador to the United States, received a warm welcome by top diplomats of America as he was presented with a copy of credentials for his new role, a statement issued by the Pakistan Embassy in Washington said on Friday.

According to the statement, Rizwan attended the traditional ceremony at the US Department of State, almost a week after he formally assumed his new diplomatic responsibilities in Washington.

The ceremony was attended by top US diplomats, including Assistant Secretary of State for the Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs Donald Lu and Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary Elizabeth Horst.

Speaking to the attendees at the ceremony, the new Pakistan envoy to the US vowed to contributing to cementing Pak-US bilateral ties



to the best of his abilities. He particularly emphasised the significance of enhancing the frequency of "high level interaction, economic linkages and people-to-people contacts between the two countries".

Last week, as he assumed his new responsibilities, Rizwan held introductory meetings with officers from the embassy and discussed priorities in the context of Pakistan's economic situation.

Rizwan, who previously served as the deputy chief of

Mission at the Pakistan Embassy for a long time, has held diplomatic responsibilities with former ambassadors Jali Abbas Jilani, Aizaz Ahmad Chaudhry, Asad Majeed Khan, and Ali Jahangir Siddiqui.

On his first day in office, last week, he had also highlighted the importance of the Pakistani diaspora in the US, describing them as a valuable asset of the country while also noting their role in serving as a strong bond in the Pak-US relationship.—RT/Agency

Pakistan And Bangladesh Emphasize Need For Closer Cooperation

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Bangladesh's Chief Adviser, Professor Muhammad Yunus, have agreed on the "need for closer collaboration" to advance the progress and prosperity of both Pakistan and Bangladesh during a telephone conversation on Friday.

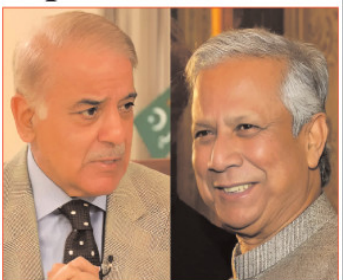
The chief executives of the two South Asian countries also stressed that "greater regional cooperation could play a vital role in uplifting the lives of the people of South Asia," according to a statement from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

Premier Shehbaz congratulated Professor Yunus on his appointment as Chief Adviser and acknowledged his significant contributions to Bangladesh's socio-economic development.

He also expressed his sympathies over the recent flood devastation in Bangladesh.

Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus was sworn in as Bangladesh's interim leader on August 8, vowing to "uphold, support and protect the constitution".

He flew into the capital, Dhaka, just days



after Sheikh Hasina - the woman who ruled Bangladesh with an iron fist for 15 years - fled across the border to India.

During today's call, Shehbaz also highlighted the importance of "revitalizing bilateral relations" between the two nations through enhanced cooperation across various domains.

He emphasised the shared historical, religious, and cultural bonds and expressed a "keen desire to boost commercial relations, cultural exchanges, and people-to-people contacts."

Professor Yunus expressed gratitude for the prime minister's call, reaffirming the commitment to strengthen ties

between the two countries. Ms Hasina resigned as prime minister after weeks of student-led protests - which left hundreds dead - escalated and culminated in calls for her to stand down. The decision to name Prof Yunus as chief adviser of the interim government followed a meeting between President Mohammed Shahabuddin, military leaders and student leaders.

The students had been clear they would not accept a military-led government but wanted Prof Yunus to lead. Among his new cabinet are Nahid Islam and Asif Mahmud, students who led the anti-government protests.—RT/Agency

Ahsan Iqbal: Imran Khan Will Not Receive An NRO



ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives Ahsan Iqbal said on Friday Imran Khan would not be granted National Reconciliation Ordinance (NRO) and he had to prove his innocence in courts.

As for provision of facilities to Imran Khan in Adiala Jail, Iqbal said the best possible facilities equivalent to those of a five-star hotel had been provided to the PTI founder in the jail.

The minister said almost all PML-N senior party leaders, including Rama Sanaulah, Khawaja Asif and himself (Ahsan Iqbal), faced the ordeal of imprisonment with courage and proved their innocence in courts in-

stead of begging seniors of US Congress for relief.

He stressed that the PTI had to face the music due to its acts.

Iqbal recalled that the PTI leaders during their rule kept asking for receipts from the PML-N leaders but now they were not providing their receipts to courts in corruption cases such as 190 million pounds reference.

"PTI leaders should follow those principles which they set for the then opposition members (PML-N) during their tenure," he said. The PML-N leader said the PTI leaders were now seeking NRO but it would not be given to them, rather they had to prove their innocence in courts.—RT/Agency

Omar Ayub: Government Came To Power Through Fake Mandate

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf leader Omar Ayub said on Friday the incumbent government came to power through a fake mandate.

Speaking to media outside parliament, he said the situation in Balochistan was highly volatile and the interior minister had failed to answer the questions in this regard.

Continuing his onslaught of the current government, he said PML-N supreme Nawaz Sharif was allowed to meet people in prison. "Institutions changed the medical tests of Nawaz Sharif to facilitate

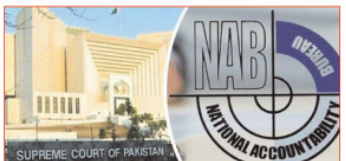


him," he alleged. He added that the political opponents in Sindh had been facing oppression. "The PPP is involved in blackmailing the GDA members," he said.

PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar also said the cases against Imran Khan would have ended if there was an impartial judicial process.—RT/Agency

NAB Recovers Rs 7 Billion From Corrupt Elements In 2024

ISLAMABAD: The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) recovered a significant amount of money from corruption cases in the first seven months of 2024 and deposited the same in the national exchequer, media reported. According to NAB spokesperson, the corruption watchdog recovered over Rs 7.08 billion from January to July 2024 and deposited the same into the national exchequer. Additionally, the spokesperson said that the NAB returned over Rs 4 billion to 21,760 victims of fraud and cheating during the period. According to the



NAB, over Rs 2 billion has been deposited to the federal government; over 136 million to the Punjab government; over Rs 13 deposited into the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government's account; and over Rs 259 million to the Sindh government. The NAB's spokesperson said that Rs 500,000 of plea bargain have been deposited with the Balochistan government while over Rs 43 million has been deposited into various government departments and financial institutions.—RT/Agency
