Petrol Prices Decreased

KARACHI: The government has announced a slight reduction in the prices of petroleum products, effective from September 1, 2024, media reported on Saturday.



The price of petrol has been reduced by Rs 1.86 per litre, bringing the new price to Rs 259.10, while the High-speed diesel will see a reduction of Rs 3.32 per litre, now costing Rs 262.75.

Following the recent change, the Kerosene oil will be priced at Rs 169.62 per litre after a decrease of Rs 2.15, while light diesel oil will drop by Rs 2.97 per litre, with the new price set at Rs 154.05.

It is worth mentioning here that the federal government was consid-

ering a reduction in petrol price, which will be a third consecutive decrease in petroleum products rates since July 31.

According to sources, the proposal suggests a decrease in the price of petrol by Rs 2.97 per liter, high-speed diesel by Rs 2.31 per liter, kerosene oil by Rs 1.39 per liter, and light-speed diesel by Rs 1.96 per liter.

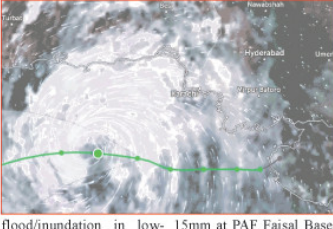
Sources said that the drop in international oil prices has resulted in the proposed reduction, with American crude oil falling by 3.60% to \$74.69 per barrel over the past two weeks and London Brent oil decreased by 2.34% to \$74.69 per barrel.—RT/Agency

Cyclone Asna Shifts From Karachi, But Winds, Heavy Rains Forecast Remains For Coastal Areas

KARACHI: As Cyclone Asna on Saturday steered away from Pakistan's coastline—lying about 300 kilometres away from Karachi—residents still braced for expected heavy rains brought by the weather system.

A deep depression (a very strong low-pressure area), which the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) warned on Thursday would bring widespread rainfall, intensified into Cyclone Asna on Friday.

According to a PMD alert issued at 5:30pm today, the cyclone over the northeast Arabian Sea off the Sindh coast has kept moving further west-south-westward during the past six hours and now lies at around about 300km southwest of Karachi, 230km south of Ormara and 300km southeast of Gwadar.



The system is likely to track further west-south-westward," the Met Office added.

It said torrential rains may generate pluvial flood/inundation in low-lying areas of south Sindh, south Balochistan and possible flash flooding in local nullahs/streams of Karachi, Hyderabad, Dadu, Kalat, Khuzdar, Jaffarabad, Sibbi, Naserabad, Barkhan, Lorlai, Awaran, Panjgur, Washuk, Mastung and Lasbella from Saturday-Sunday.

According to rainfall figures as of 3pm, it rained 39 millimetres in Karachi's Quidabad, 24mm in Surjani, 18.4mm in Korangi, 17mm in North Nazimabad, 16.5mm in North Karachi, 6mm each at University Road and Jinnah Terminal, 15mm at PAF Faisal Base, 13mm at PAF Masroor Base, 12.4mm in Old Area Airport, 11.8mm each in Keamari and Gulshan-i-Maymar, 5mm in Gulshan-i-Hadeed, 4.2mm in Gadap and 1mm in Saddar.

According to an update on Zoom Earth at 8am—provided via the Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC)—Cyclone Asna was expected to minimally intensify to 85km/h in around 12 hours and in 24 hours, a weakening trend will start.

"Weakening to tropical depression strength is expected to occur in around

two days," the JTWC was quoted as saying.

Met officials have described the formation of a cyclone in the monsoon season as a "rare phenomenon".

"It would be a rare event as cyclones are uncommon in the monsoon season," Chief Meteorologist Dr Sarfar Sarfarz said earlier.

He said the cyclone would be the first in the Arabian Sea in August since 1976 and would get the name 'Asna' suggested by Pakistan. He added that regional cyclones were assigned names according to a list prepared by a 13-country panel, including Pakistan.

Due to the forecast of heavy showers and urban flooding warnings, schools in Karachi and Hyderabad were shut on Friday.

An aban on "fishermen venturing into the sea, as well as on swimming, bathing, diving, and wading in the sea/beaches and coastal areas" of Karachi Division had been imposed from Aug 29 till Aug 31 (Saturday).

About two dozen people were killed on Friday across the country as heavy monsoon rains caused widespread devastation.

In Sindh, at least nine people lost their lives in rain-related incidents in Jamshoro, Dadu and Mirpurkhas districts on Friday. More than 30 people were injured as the deluge ruptured sewers, breached dykes and swept away countless mud houses.

In Balochistan, two persons were missing after 13 people were swept away in flash floods in Lorlai, Qila Saifullah, Duki, Har-nai and Jhal Magis areas.

In the north, 13 of a family died when the roof of their home collapsed due to a landslide induced by incessant rainfall in Dir Div.

Meanwhile, in India, where at least 31 people have died this week from rain-related incidents, authorities evacuated more than 8,700 people from ten districts in the Gujarat state yesterday, officials said.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Army Reports Success In Ongoing Tirah IBOs; 37 Terrorists Including Ringleader Killed

KHYBER-PAKHTUNKHWA: The Pakistan Army has announced that 37 terrorists have been killed and 14 others wounded in ongoing intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in the Tirah area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.



The operations, which began on 20th August, have dealt a significant blow to the Fitna Al Khawarij militants, with the death of their key leader, Abu Dhar alhas Saddam.

The operations in Tirah Valley have been described as highly successful by military officials. Brigadier Commander Frontier Corps Amir Nawaz Khan stated that the security forces have effectively countered the incursion of Khawarij militants from Afghanistan and are continuing their efforts against militant hideouts in the region.

Brigadier Faisal of the Special Service

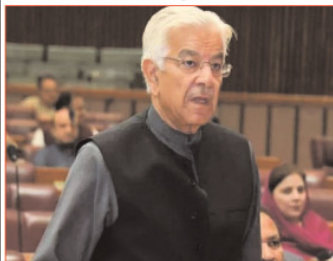
Group (SSG) highlighted that a coordinated strategy was implemented to minimise casualties among the local population and Pakistan Army personnel while maximising damage to the enemy.

"By the grace of Allah Almighty and the bravery of our soldiers, we have inflicted heavy losses on the Khawarij and dismantled their top leadership," he said. Major Mohsin, who led the mission to destroy Khawarij hide-

outs in the valley, praised the valiant efforts of the SSG and Light Commandos, despite challenging conditions. Lieutenant Hafiz Muzamil also confirmed that the operations had successfully inflicted heavy losses on the enemy.

The Pakistan Army has reiterated its commitment to protecting the lives and property of the local population against the threat posed by Khawarij militants.—RT/Agency

Not In Favour Of Talks With PTI: Khawaja Asif



ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has expressed his opposition to engaging in negotiations with Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI).

During a key advisory meeting of the Pakistan Muslim League (Nawaz) held under the chairmanship of Nawaz Sharif at the party secretariat in Model Town, Lahore, Asif made his position clear.

Responding to media queries after the meeting, Asif stated, "I am not in favour of talks with PTI."

He further clarified that he is not part of any team involved in negotiations with PTI through Mahmood Achakzai.

Recent media reports suggest that the Pakistan Muslim

League (N) has been in contact with Mahmood Khan Achakzai to explore indirect negotiations with PTI, with the party leadership assigning Rana Sanaulah, the Prime Minister's advisor on political affairs, to engage with Achakzai for this purpose.

Achakzai, representing PKMAP, was elected in April as head of an alliance—the Tehreek-e-Tahaffuz-e-Aim—also comprising the PTI, the SIC, the MWM, and the BNP-M. The PTI had later announced expanding the alliance to include all opposition parties.

However, Asif distanced himself from these efforts, reiterating his opposition to such negotiations.—RT/Agency

Moody's Upgrades Ratings Of 5 Pakistani Banks

KARACHI: International rating agency Moody's on Saturday upgraded the ratings of five major Pakistani banks, citing improved economic conditions in the country.

The long-term deposit ratings of the five banks have been upgraded from Caa3 to Caa2.

The banks include Habib Bank Limited, National Bank of Pakistan, United Bank Limited, Allied Bank Limited, and MCB Bank Limited.



Moody's also changed the outlook for all five banks from stable to positive. The decision comes after Moody's upgraded Pakistan's credit rating from Caa3 to Caa2 and changed the country's outlook from stable to positive.

The international ranking agency noted that Pakistan's improved economic conditions, including a reduction in default risk, were key factors in the upgrade. The agency also cited the country's \$7 billion deal with the

International Monetary Fund (IMF) as a positive development.

"CCC+", Moody's said that this upgrade reflects Pakistan's improved macroeconomic conditions and moderately better government external positions from very weak levels.

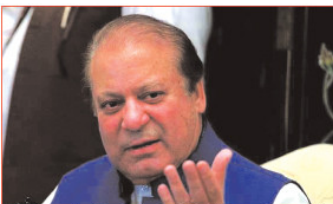
"We have also upgraded the rating for the senior unsecured MTN programme to (P)Caa2 from (P)Caa3. Currently, the outlook for Government of Pakistan is changed to positive from stable," read the statement.

Accordingly, Pakistan's default risk has been reduced to a level consistent with a Caa2 rating.—RT/Agency

Nawaz Pledges More Relief For Electricity Consumers

LAHORE: Former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif has pledged to provide more relief to Pakistan's electricity consumers, media reported.

Speaking in Lahore, Nawaz Sharif said that Pakistan Muslim League (N) is the only party that has consistently provided relief to the people in difficult times.

He emphasized that stabilizing the economy is his top priority and that he will take all necessary steps to reduce electricity bills and strengthen the economy.

Drainage canal suffers breaches in Nawab Wali Muhammad

Kaiser Bengali Resigns From Three Government Committees

KARACHI: Prominent economist Dr. Kaiser Bengali has resigned from three key government committees, citing concerns over the federal government's austerity measures, media reported on Saturday.
In his resignation letter addressed to Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb and Cabinet Secretary Kamran Afzal, Dr. Bengali expressed his dissatisfaction with the government's cost-cutting strategies. While acknowledging the government's efforts to reduce expenses, he criticized their approach as flawed.
Dr. Bengali had previously proposed significant measures for cost reduction, including the closure of 17 divisions and 50 government departments. His recommendations focused on addressing inefficiencies by reducing the number of smaller government employees rather than targeting senior officers.
However, he criticized the current policy of terminating lower-grade employees (Grades 1 to 16) while retaining higher-ranking officers (Grades 17 to 22). Dr. Bengali argued that removing senior officers could save up to Rs 30 billion annually, but this approach is not being pursued.
The committees from which Dr. Kaiser Bengali resigned are the Austerity Committee, the Right-Sizing Committee, and the Government Expenditure Reduction Committee.
Dr. Bengali also warned that the economy is on the brink of collapse, exacerbated by the lack of support from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and other financial institutions. He expressed concern over the severe impact on household budgets, leading to increased financial distress and even instances of 'self-harm' among the population.—RT

FIA Arrests 240 Human Traffickers and Advertisers in August 2024

GUJRANWALA: FIA Gujranwala zone has released the performance report for the month of August, 2024. According to the details, 85 cases were registered against human traffickers, advertisers and suspects involved in white-collar crime and a total of 240 suspects were arrested. The challan was submitted to the court. According to the spokesperson of FIA, the FIA issued a report on the arrests of human traffickers, advertisers and suspects involved in white-collar crime on the instructions of FIA Director Abdul Qadir Qamar. Among the arrested suspects, there are also suspects involved in the kidnapping of citizens abroad in Iran and Bulgaria. Most wanted among the arrested suspects 6 advertising suspects including human traffickers are also involved. The accused stole about 12 crore rupees by pretending to send innocent citizens abroad. Apart from Pakistani passports, fake documents of Spain, UK, Italy and Greece were recovered from the accused. For the recovery of money from human traffickers actions are being taken. FIA registered 21 cases during the campaign against electricity theft, arrested 190 accused and filed challans of 160 cases against GAPCO officials involved in over billing. More than 80 million rupees have been recovered from the possession of the accused involved in the illegal money exchange. The investigation of 833 inquiries was finalized on merit, and all resources were used to deliver justice.

The match began at 12:08 a.m., setting the record for the latest start of a men's or women's match in the history of the tournament.

The match finished at 1:48 a.m. It is tied for the second-latest finish for a women's singles match at the US Open.

The 29th seed Alexandrova was defeated in the early hours of Saturday morning by last year's runner-up with a 2-6 6-1 6-2.

Following 2-6 in the first set, the Australian Open champion made a strong comeback, winning the next two sets 6-1, 6-2 which allowed her to make a spot in the Round 16.

"I don't know what I did, I was just trying to stay low, put as many balls as I can back on that side. She played incredible tennis in the first set. It was really tough to change it," Sabalenka said.

The 26-year-old quickly found her groove and broke for a 3-1 lead in the next set and never looked back thereafter, leveling the contest with a breathtaking display of power to overwhelm her spirited Russian opponent.

"I'm really happy I was able to turn around this match and get this really difficult win."

In the final set, Sabalenka was on the verge of winning 5-0 until Alexandrova broke her opponent's serve, making it 5-1.—Agency

Wrestler Ali Asad receives four-year ban for doping



Pakistani wrestler Ali Asad, a bronze medalist at the Commonwealth Games, has been handed a four-year ban for using prohibited performance-enhancing substances.

The International Testing Agency (ITA) offered him the opportunity to appeal and request a B sample test. However, due to his lack of response, a direct four-year ban was imposed.

Ali Asad denied using performance-enhancing drugs after his positive doping test.

Earlier on May 29, the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) handed four-year bans to four Pakistani weightlifters for violating anti-doping rules.

Abdur Rehman, Sharjeel Butt, Ghulam Mustafa, and Farhan Amjad were suspended in 2022 after refusing to provide samples to the International Testing Agency (ITA) team on November 10, 2021.

According to sources, these four weightlifters took their case to the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) to defend themselves, but they were unable to avoid the lengthy ban.—Agency

PSB rejects PHF's allegations of withholding fund for participation in Asian Champions Trophy



KARACHI: The Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) has dismissed claims by the Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) alleging that PSB is withholding funds for the national hockey team's participation in the Asian Champions Trophy in China.

In a strongly worded statement, the PSB criticized the PHF for its "baseless allegations" and clarified that the delays in releasing funds were due to the federation's failure to provide necessary documentation on time.

The PSB pointed out that the PHF had submitted a request for a budget exceeding Rs 55 million, in addition to US \$60,000 in foreign exchange, and sought funding for 27 players and six officials.

The Pakistan Sports Board called this demand "excessive" and "beyond international standards," adding that it had agreed to finance air tickets for 19 players and four officials in line with global norms.

"Despite this, the PHF claimed it had already booked tickets, to which PSB agreed to reimburse upon receipt of original tickets," the

PSB stated, mentioning any delay in the process was due to the PHF's failure to meet procedural requirements.

The sports board accused the PHF of failing to provide the required documentation on time, including lists of players and officials, computer clearance forms, and undertakings, and surety bonds.—Agency

Meanwhile, Ronaldo is on break from the Saudi Pro League for the upcoming international break. He will next be seen in action against Croatia on September 5.—Agency

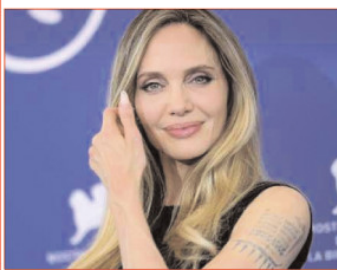

Cyclone Asna stays clear of Pakistani coastline, brings heavy rains to Sindh

THATTA: The anticipated cyclone Asna, named by the Pakistan Meteorological Department, originated as a low-pressure area over the Bay of Bengal on August 16. Despite initial concerns, the cyclone remained at a safe distance from Pakistan's coastline. Asna intensified into a depression over the Saurashtra and Kutch regions of Gujarat, India, but did not make landfall in Pakistan. It maintained a distance of 200 to 220 km from Karachi, according to meteorological reports. While Asna stayed offshore, its presence brought heavy rainfall and gusty winds to the southeastern coast of Sindh, affecting areas such as Badin, Sujawal, Thatta, and Karachi. According to TV channel reports that the India Meteorological Department (IMD) had indicated that the depression was likely to move west-southwest into the northeast Arabian Sea, potentially strengthening into a cyclonic storm by Friday. Fortunately, the deep depression and Asna did not pose a direct threat to the Pakistani coast as it continued moving away from land towards the Arabian Sea. Although initial concerns had suggested a possible impact on Sindh's coastline, but by the blessings of God the cyclone did not make landfall. However, the coastal regions experienced significant rainfall and strong winds, leading to inundation in some cities, including Karachi. A new system of torrential rains and stormy winds is expected to enter the Arabian Sea, potentially bringing more rainfall and thunderstorms to the region in the next Three days meteorological department has also updated.

the No Objection Certificate (NOC).

The public gathering was scheduled to be held in Tarnol on August 22 but the PTI had to cancel as the administration revoked the NOC.

The decision to revoke the NOC was made in a

meeting of the Intelligence

Committee chaired by the Chief Commissioner Islamabad. The district administration maintained that religious parties have also called for protests, adding that permission for the public gathering cannot be granted in such circum-

Addressing a flag-hoisting ceremony at the DC Office Buner, PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan said that the party will be holding public gatherings in three major cities including Islamabad, Lahore, and Karachi.

Barrister Gohar said that the PTI will continue to struggle for the release of its founder Imran Khan on all fronts. "We will strive for Imran Khan's release in courts as well as public gatherings," the PTI Chairman added.—RT/Agency

Information Minister Rejects Attempts To Damage Pakistan-China Relations

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Information, Broadcasting, National Heritage and Culture Attaullah Tarar on Saturday said that "The Diplomat" magazine in its article had tried unsuccessfully to spoil Pakistan's relations with long-time friend China.

In his reaction to the article published in the journal through his account on X, Tarar maintained: "This is yet another failed attempt to damage Pakistan's relations with its time-tested friend China. These attacks on our foreign policy will never succeed."

He said that the impression given in the article was based on false opinions which did not reflect the sentiments of the people of Pakistan.

On the other hand, the



istry of Information and Broadcasting (MoIB) on Saturday declared the article published in "The Diplomat" magazine regarding the visit of a high-level Chinese delegation to Pakistan as misleading and baseless.

"An attempt has been made in the article to create a misleading link between the visit and the in-

cidents of terrorism". The Fact Checker said the article was based on false pretext and untrue context.

It said that visits of foreign dignitaries continue throughout the year.

The article was misleading and baseless, the Ministry of Information Fact Checker maintained.—RT/Agency

Nab Requests Court To Seize Zulfi Bukhari's Assets

ISLAMABAD: The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) filed a plea in an accountability court, requesting it to freeze the assets of Zulfi Bukhari, a close aide of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, media reported.

Zulfi Bukhari has been declared a proclaimed offender by the accountability court in a corruption case after his continuous absence during the hearings.

In the fresh plea, the NAB requested the court to order the seizure of Bukhari's assets to ensure his appearance in the court.

According to the NAB, Zulfi Bukhari possesses 30 plots in Sector 16, Islamabad, four pots in Sector 15, and, 1300 kanals of land in Attock Reason for Request. The court will re-



view NAB's request and make a decision on freezing Bukhari's assets in the coming days. Earlier, the Ministry of Interior on Wednesday gave its approval for the issuance of a red warrant against PTI leader Zulfi Bukhari.

The approval for the red warrant is an international notice sent to the International Criminal Police Organisation (Interpol) during the appearance of the PTI Chairman before the court in the Toshkhana case.—RT/Agency

No Talks With PTI Until Imran Khan Apologizes For May 9 Fiasco: Ahsan



LAHORE: Federal Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal said on Saturday there would be no talks with the PTI until its founder Imran Khan apologized for the events of May 9.

The minister rebuked the PTI, claiming they had caused more damage than terrorists had done and questioned how any dialogue could take place with such people.

He also condemned the former ruling party's approach, particularly its insistence on demanding 'receipts' from opponents.

The minister also highlighted that the country is currently facing an unde-

clared war, with enemies attempting to destabilise the nation through terrorism and internal conflicts.

Also, according to Ahsan Iqbal, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif met JUI-F chief Fazlur Rehman. "The prime minister also plans to engage with other political leaders as well," he said.

Discussing the PML-N meeting, Iqbal revealed that rising electricity prices was a key topic of discussion. The party leadership stressed the importance of resolving the energy crisis to provide relief to the public, he added.

He also noted that the local government system was part of the party's manifesto.—RT/Agency

Police Arrest Former Senator Mushtaq Ahmed In Islamabad

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad Police on Saturday arrested former senator Mushtaq Ahmed of Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) during a march organized by the party to express solidarity with the people of Gaza, media reported.

The authorities has imposed section 144 in Islamabad according to which gatherings without prior permission from the district administration is prohibited.

The administration warned that violators would face legal action, reiterating that any procession or protest with-

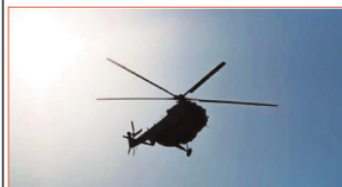


out approval is unlawful.

The march, which took place near D-Chowk, led to the arrest of more than 20 participants, including two women, for violating Section 144.

Helicopter With 22 Aboard Goes Missing In Russia's Kamchatka



MOSCOW: A helicopter with 22 people aboard, most of them tourists, has gone missing in Russia's Kamchatka peninsula in the far east, regional authorities said Saturday.

"Today at about 1615 (0415 GMT) communication was lost with a Mi-8 helicopter... which had 22 people on board, 19 passengers and three crew members," Kamchatka Governor Vladimir Solodov said in a video posted on Telegram.

Rescue teams in helicopters have been searching the night for the missing aircraft, focusing on a river valley that the helicopter was due to fly along, Russian authorities said.

The Mi-8 is a Soviet-designed military helicopter that is widely used for transport in Russia. The missing helicopter had picked up passengers near the Vachkazhets ancient volcano in a scenic area of the peninsula

known for its wild landscapes and active volcanoes.

A source in the emergency services told TASS news agency that the helicopter disappeared from radar almost immediately after taking off and the crew did not report any problems.

The local weather service said that there was poor visibility in the area of the airport.

Accidents involving planes and helicopters are very frequent in Russia's far eastern region, which is sparsely populated and where there is often harsh weather.

In August 2021, a Mi-8 helicopter with 16 people on board including 13 tourists crashed into a lake in Kamchatka due to poor visibility, killing eight. In July the same year, a plane crashed as it came in to land on the peninsula, with 22 passengers and 6 crew aboard, all of whom were killed.—RT/Agency

PTI Has No Idea About Formation Of Government Committee For Negotiations: Barrister Gohar

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan said on Saturday that his party had no idea about the formation of the government for negotiation.

Expressing his thoughts, Khan said, "Nobody has told us about the formation of the government committee. It is a good thing that the committee has been formed for the negotiations."

Khan said: "From our side, it is up to Mahmood Khan Achakzai to hold talks with the government. We have no objections to Mahmood Khan's talks with the government. We will look forward to proposals brought forward by Mahmood Achakzai after holding talks with the government."

"The PTI founder had also given the permission to Mahmood Khan Achakzai to



hold talks with the government weeks ago," he said.

Few days back, the PTI announced on Sunday that it is postponing its Lahore rally originally scheduled to take place on August 27.

According to PTI Punjab Information Secretary Shaukat Basra, the party's current focus is solely on the Islamabad rally, which was also recently resched-

uled. The new date for the Lahore rally will be announced following the Islamabad event. The Islamabad rally, initially set for August 22, has been postponed to September 8 on the direction of the PTI founder and at the request of the Islamabad administration. The administration has issued a new No Objection Certificate (NOC) for the revised date.—RT/Agency

'PPP Is Playing An Active Role In Punjab', Says Kaira

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) senior leader Qamar Zaman Kaira said on Saturday that his party was playing an "active role" in Punjab and at the national level.

According to details, Kaira called on Punjab Governor Saleem Haider in Lahore. On this occasion, the Punjab governor stated: "The doors of the Governor House are open for all the political parties."

Moreover, both the leaders had also discussed the matters in line with their mutual interests. —Insufficient relief for KP people—

According to details, PML-N President Nawaz Sharif and Maryam Nawaz were opposed to negotiating with the PTI. Meanwhile, the PML-N supremo had given the party the greenlight to negotiate with the like-minded other parties within the opposition.

Sources revealed that the PML-N huddle agreed to hold the local government elections.

Meanwhile, PML-N stalwart Ayaz Sadiq suggested: "The negotiations can take place with the PTI leaders with good timing."

Separately, Federal Minister for Planning Ahsan Iqbal disclosed on Saturday that former prime minister Nawaz Sharif has directed the



federal and Punjab governments to reduce expenses and provide relief to the public.

The instructions were issued during a consultative meeting of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), which was chaired by Nawaz.

During the meeting, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Federal Energy Minister Awaiz Leghari provided a detailed briefing on ongoing reforms in the energy sector.

The focus of these reforms, they said, is to ensure the supply of afford-

able and uninterrupted electricity to the people.

The PML-N supremo emphasised the need for stringent oversight of government expenditure, instructing both the federal and provincial administrations to identify areas where savings can be made and redirect those funds towards public welfare initiatives. "Just as we resolved the energy crisis in 2013, we must tackle this challenge with the same resolve and prevent the public from suffering," Nawaz Sharif said.—RT/Agency
