Khawaja Asif Criticizes PTI For Seeking NRO From Establishment

ISLAMABAD: Slamming the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for not seeking negotiations with political parties, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif on Monday said that Imran Khan-founded party was begging for a "NRO-like deal" from the establishment. [PTI spokesperson] Raouf Hasan is begging for an NRO from those who they believe wield real powers," the defence czar said while speaking on the National Assembly floor.

His remarks came in response to Hasan's interview to Voice of America (VOA), wherein the PTI leader "hoped and prayed" that the deadlock between the military and his party does not continue any longer.

"In the interest of the state, it is imperative that PTI and the establishment engage in dialogue," he said, adding that the party had not left any stone unturned to "end this stalemate".

The former ruling party has long maintained stance that it will only hold talks with the powers that be instead of the political parties.

Today, Asif said that Imran Khan "only wanted" to negotiate with the establishment and seeking the NRO, clarifying that the government has no objection



with whom they want to be engaged. Reminding the PTI that their past benefactor are no more in power, the defence minister said: "This is a new system with a new leadership."

The defence minister said the embattled party is looking towards establishment for relief and reiterating negotiations with the Imran Khan-founded party cannot take place until they apologised for the May 9 murders and terrorism.

However, the minister asked Pashtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PKMAP) Chairman Mehmood Khan Achakzai — who had been tasked by PTI founder in this regard — will he hold negotiations with the establishment?

"They [PTI] say Achakzai heads the opposition alliance [Tehreek-e-Tahafuz-e-Ain-e-Pakistan] and he will negotiate," he said, asking them to decide

Senate Bill Proposes Increasing Supreme Court Judges To 20, Excluding Chief Justice

ISLAMABAD: Seeking an amendment to the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1997, a bill was tabled in the Senate on Monday to increase the number of judges in the Supreme Court to 20 — other than the chief justice — to address the rising number of pending cases.

The bill titled "Supreme Court (Number of Judges) (Amendment) Act", 2024, was presented by an independent senator from Balochistan, Mohammad Abdul Qadir.

He sought the increase in the number of top court judges from 17 to 21 as



"more than 53,000 cases" pending in the apex court. According to the bill, a copy of which is available with Geo News, the number of judges of the top court other than the chief justice shall be 20.

It further stated: "The Supreme Court has four jurisdictions original, appellate, advisory, and review being diverse and demanding, contributing to the continuous

accumulation of cases." "With economic growth and social changes, the complexity and variety of cases have increased," it pointed out. It stressed: "This backlog, combined with the complexities of integrating the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (Fata) into Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, necessitates more judicial resources."

Speaking on the floor of the upper house, Senator Abdul Qadir called for appointing "at least 16 judges" to the top court, saying that several constitutional matters were being referred to the top court.

"Larger benches are formed and these judges look into the constitutional matters," he added.

Not only constitutional cases, but several cases related to financial matters worth billions were also pending in the top court as it does not have time to hear these cases, the senator claimed.

"Our judicial system is lowest on the [global] ranking," he added.

Federal Minister for Law and Justice Azam Nazeer Tarar also backed the legislation and suggested forwarding the new bill to the relevant committee.—RT/Agency

Imran Open To Talks With Key Decision-Makers, Highlights May 9 As Pivotal For Government

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder, Imran Khan, has expressed his willingness to engage in dialogue, stating that discussions will take place only with those who make the decisions.

During a conversation with journalists at Adiala Jail, Imran Khan remarked that May 9 is their "insurance policy."

He further claimed that if May 9 is disregarded, the government and its politics will come to an end.

He suggested forming a judicial commission to investigate the events of May 9.

"Whenever the topic of negotiations arises, they start making noise about May 9. We are always ready for talks. We will speak with those who make the decisions," he added.

Imran Khan also mentioned that his potential appointment as Chancellor of Oxford University would be a matter of pride for Pakistan.

However, he stated that even if he doesn't become Chancellor, it wouldn't be an issue.

He highlighted his achievements in cricket and philanthropy, noting



that he is Pakistan's biggest philanthropist, having established two hospitals and two universities, with a third university currently under construction.

Khan also claimed there were two upcoming entries in the Guinness Book of World Records.

The first, he claimed, would be for the "U-turn" where the slogan "Respect the Vote" was replaced with "Respect the Boot."

Imran Khan, when in power himself was described a "master of U-turn" which he had claimed was a "hallmark of great leadership."

He criticized Nawaz Sharif for his previous stance against the mili-

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday expressed satisfaction over the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics report, which announced that inflation had fallen to single digits in August 2024.

"With the grace of Allah, the hard work of the government's economic team is bearing fruit," the prime minister said in a statement issued by Prime Minister's Office.

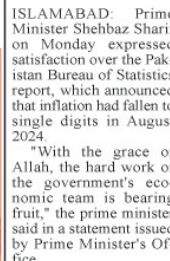
According to data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) earlier in the day, the country's consumer price index (CPI) rose by 9.6 per cent year-on-year (YoY) in August, marking a 34-month low.

The inflation rate dropping to 9.6% in August is a reflection of the government's efforts to improve the economy, the prime minister said.

"This is the lowest inflation rate in the past three years, and credit goes to the tireless work of our economic team," he added.

He noted that the reduction in inflation aligns with the Ministry of Finance's economic outlook report, which had forecast inflation to be between 9.5% and 10.5%

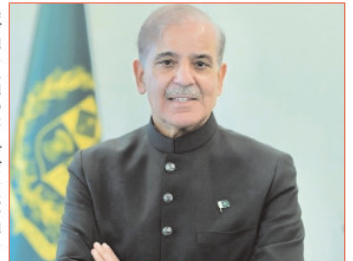

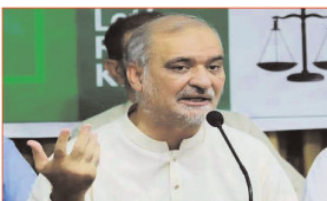

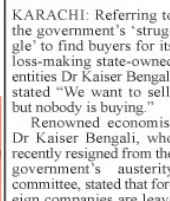

KARACHI: Referring to the government's 'struggle' to find buyers for its loss-making state-owned entities Dr Kaiser Bengali stated "We want to sell, but nobody is buying."

Renowned economist Dr Kaiser Bengali, who recently resigned from the government's austerity committee, stated that foreign companies are leaving the country, and despite efforts to sell institutions, there are no buyers.

During a press conference in Karachi, Dr Kaiser Bengali declared that the country is bankrupt, with no loans being offered and foreign companies exiting.

He emphasised the need for urgent measures, noting that while they are trying to sell institutions, there are no buyers. The economy is deteriorating and Islamabad is not concerned about it.

Dr Kaiser Bengali mentioned that he has been advocating for reduced expenses and imports for the past 10 years. He stated that closing institutions will not solve

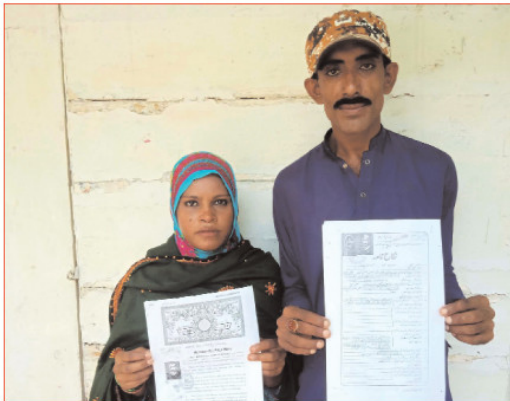


the problems and that he is presenting facts, not supporting anyone. He expressed support for providing employees and advised the prime minister to close institutions without laying off employees immediately.

The economist highlighted that small industries are shutting down, while large industries can afford generators, small ones cannot. To promote industries, taxes need to be reduced, and interest rates must be lowered to save the industry.

Dr Kaiser Bengali criticised the government for laying off lower-level employees instead of officers to reduce expenses. He confirmed his resignation,

Ph.D seminar highlights training needs of apple value chain in Balochistan

TANDO JAM: Syed Taimoor Shah, a scholar from the Department of Agricultural Education, Extension & Short Courses at Sindh Agriculture University Tando Jam, presented his final Ph.D seminar on the training needs analysis of intermediaries in the apple value chain in Balochistan. The seminar was presided over by Vice Chancellor Dr. Fateh Marri, and the speakers highlighted the significance of the apple value chain. In his presentation, Ph.D. scholar Syed Taimoor Shah noted that 11 districts in Balochistan are major apple producers, and his research focused on 6 of these districts. His findings revealed that the best commercial apple varieties are grown in these areas, and if farmers receive training in supply chain management, value chain shelf life, and export of high-

quality varieties, both the farmers and the province of Balochistan could see significant development. Vice Chancellor Dr. Fateh Marri praised the scholar's research, stating that it identifies a critical gap in agricultural activities, specifically the training needs of individuals involved in the apple value chain. This work not only has the potential to improve apple production and marketing in Balochistan but also offers guidance on the possible opportunities for apple cultivation in Sindh. Dean of the Faculty of Agricultural Social Sciences, Dr. Aijaz Ali Khuharo, emphasized that the research identifies key training gaps and proposes strategies to improve the apple value chain in Balochistan, which could support economic growth and strengthen the local economy. PTA To Deactivate SIMs For Users With Expired CNICs

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) Monday said it will begin suspending mobile SIMs of users who have not renewed their Computerised National Identity Card (CNIC).

The authority's announcement comes as it begins the second phase of its operation to stop the illegal use of SIMs across Pakistan.

"Those whose ID cards have expired before 2017 and have not been renewed, their SIMs will be suspended," said PTA in a statement issued today.

The authority has urged users to get their identity cards renewed to avoid getting their SIMs blocked.

It should be noted that PTA blocked fake SIMs and cancelled CNICs of citizens in the first phase after initiating the operation.

"Since August 16, more than 69,000 illegal SIMs have been blocked," the statement read, adding that the illegal SIMs are being



blocked on the basis of data obtained from National Database and Registration Authority (Nadra).

Meanwhile, the authority will terminate SIMs registered in the names of deceased persons during the third phase.

Before the blocking of mobile SIMs, awareness messages were sent to users, asking them to update relevant data.

The statement by the PTA maintained that fake SIMs are being used in various illegal activities including terrorism, financial fraud and other activities.

Two Officers Injured In Terrorist Assault On Mianwali Checkpoint

MIANWALI: At least two policemen sustained injuries after more than a dozen terrorists attacked Qabool Khel police check post in Punjab's Mianwali on Monday.

According to a police spokesperson, about 12 to 14 khawarij attacked the check post with rockets and hand grenades.

However, the Punjab Police thwarted attack by the terrorists after which they escaped, said the spokesperson, adding that two cops were injured in the attack.

Following the incident, district police officer of Mianwali, Deputy Superintendent of Police Isa Khel reached the check post along with heavy personnel.

Last month, at least 12 policemen were martyred and six sustained injuries after bandits attacked their vans with rockets in a ravine area of Punjab's Rahim Yar Khan.

The horrific attack occurred in the Machka area located in one of Rahim Yar Khan's riverine areas.

Police officials told the media that two police vans



with more than 20 cops were trapped in rainwater in the locality when bandits launched rockets at them.

As a result of the fierce attack, a dozen cops were martyred while seven others were wounded and five went missing, the police added.

Pakistan has witnessed a surge in militant attacks since the Taliban government returned to power in neighbouring Afghanistan in 2021, mostly in the north-western border province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, but also in southwestern Balochistan, which abuts Afghanistan and Iran.

Continuous increase in LBOD's water level posing a threat to Badin

BADIN: After the continuous increase in water level and pressure on weak embankments in the country's largest drainage sluice LBOD the local growers and stakeholders protested against the excavation and non-repair of the weak embankments. Following the recent heavy rains across Sindh, the country's largest

drainage basins (LBOD) including Left Bank Outfall Drain, Amir Shah Goni Outfall Drain, Karo Ghaghara Drain, Mir Wah Talhar Outfall Drain, Luarn Sharif Drain, Shaikh Manzoor Drain, Sirami Drain and other Link Sewer Drains are increasing the water level due to the drainage of rainwater and the water pressure on the weak embankments is also increasing, due to which the sewers often collapse. Inflation Rate Drop: A Mirage for the Common Man

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's recent announcement of Pakistan's inflation rate dropping to 9.6% in August 2024 may seem like a cause for celebration. However, for the average Pakistani struggling to make ends meet, this drop in inflation is far from a victory. The prime minister's satisfaction over these figures highlights a growing disconnect between the government and the reality faced by millions of citizens.

Inflation statistics, while technically accurate, often fail to reflect the lived experiences of the common man. A single-digit inflation rate does not erase the months or years of soaring prices that have already eroded the purchasing power

of ordinary Pakistanis. Food, fuel, and essential commodities have become increasingly unaffordable, and the slight dip in inflation does little



to alleviate the financial burden that has accumulated over time. The reduction in inflation might ease the government's economic report cards, but it doesn't fill the empty plates on dinner tables across the nation.

Moreover, the government's focus on the inflation rate as a metric of success ignores the broader context of economic hardship. Unem-

ployment remains high, wages stagnant, and the cost of living continues to rise. For those living paycheck to paycheck, a decrease in inflation offers little solace when their incomes have not kept pace with the cost of survival.

The reality is that a statistical drop in inflation does not translate into real relief for the common man. It is essential that the government not only acknowledges these figures but also addresses the systemic issues that keep the majority of Pakistanis trapped in a cycle of poverty and economic insecurity. Celebrating a modest drop in inflation without tackling these deeper problems is like offering a band-aid for a wound that requires stitches.

Bangladesh pacers wreaked havoc in the first session of the recently concluded Day 4 of the second Test, taking four key wickets to leave Pakistan reeling at 117-6 at Lunch. Wicketkeeper batter Mohammad Rizwan and all-rounder Salman Ali Agha offered some resilience with their gutsy 43 and 47 knocks before the home side was booked on a modest total of 172, setting Bangladesh a 185-run target to claim their first-ever clean sweep victory over Pakistan in Tests. Pak vs Ban: Bangladesh in control of 2nd Test as rain ends play on day four

RAWALPINDI: The rain ended play on day four after Bangladesh scored 42/0 while chasing 185 against Pakistan in the second Test at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium on Monday.



Zakir Hasan has been the aggressor in the run chase, scoring 23-ball 31 while Shadman Islam has scored 9*. Bangladesh need 143 runs more to win the second Test as well as the series. Earlier, Bangladesh bowled out Pakistan for 172 after pacers Hasan Mahmud and Nahid Rana wreaked havoc, picking five and four wickets, respectively. The hosts started the day on 9/2 and had a decent start courtesy of Saim Ayub and skipper Shan Masood, adding 38 runs. Ayub was the first man to depart as Taskin Ahmed took his wicket. He made 20 runs off 35 balls. Masood managed 28 runs off 34 balls and was removed by Rana soon after. Kana managed to dismiss Babar Azam (11) and Saud Shakeel (2) in quick succession, leaving Pakistan in

more trouble. Babar's poor run continued in the Tests as he now batted 16 innings without a Test fifty. Meanwhile, Mohammad Rizwan and Salman Ali Agha made valuable contributions at the back end. The pair added 55 runs for the seventh wicket. Mahmud dismissed Mir Hamza (4) to wrap up Pakistan's innings on 172. Salman added vital runs for Pakistan and remained unbeaten on 47. Mahmud registered his first fiver in Test cricket, becoming first Bangladesh pacer to take this many wickets in an innings in Pakistan.—Agency

Champions Trophy 2025: Mohsin Naqvi orders for timely upgradation of iconic Gaddafi Stadium



LAHORE: Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Chairman Mohsin Naqvi conducted a detailed visit to Lahore's Gaddafi Stadium and reviewed the progress of the upgradation project for the 2025 Champions Trophy. As per the details, the construction of the water tank in the basement and steel fixing work has begun. Naqvi instructed FWO and NESPAK to complete the Gaddafi Stadium Upgradation Project within the stipulated time frame. "The steel fixing work should be completed quickly," said Mohsin Naqvi. "The construction work should be completed within the timeline," he added. A meeting was also held under Naqvi at the FWO's camp office. NESPAK was instructed to complete the drawings promptly and hand them over to FWO. Meanwhile, the FWO's Project Director briefed about the progress on the Gaddafi Stadium Upgradation Project. The PCB's Director of Infrastructure, Senior General Manager of Infrastructure, and relevant officials from NESPAK and FWO were also present on the occasion. Three venues—Karachi, Rawalpindi and Lahore—will host the matches of eight teams and according to PCB's proposed schedule to ICC, all of India's matches will take place in Lahore. The PCB also allocated Rs12.80 billion for upgradation of three stadiums. Lahore's Gaddafi Stadium, Karachi's National Bank Cricket Arena and Rawalpindi International Cricket Stadium will be elevated ahead of the marquee event.—Agency

Two England players eye comeback for Pakistan series

LONDON: Opening batter Zak Crawley and right-arm spinner Jack Leach are likely to make a comeback for England for their upcoming Test series against Pakistan. England will tour Pakistan for a three-match Test series, scheduled to run from October 7 to 24 with matches scheduled in Multan, Karachi and Rawalpindi respectively.



Meanwhile, experienced Somerset spinner Jack Leach, who has been out of the England Test side since 2018 is hopeful to make his long-awaited comeback, banking on his magnificent performance in the County Championship. Leach was one of the most pivotal parts of the Ben Stokes-led England Test team but a series of injuries put him out of the international circuit. Jack Leach acknowledged

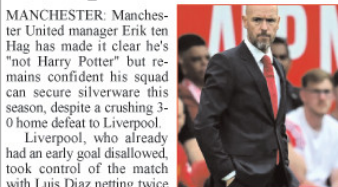
the competition from youngster Shoaib Bashir, who made notable inroads early into his Test career, picking up three five-wicket hauls in eight matches but the former remained optimistic that England may pick both the spinners for the Pakistan tour. "I totally understand the reason why Bash has been selected," Leach said. "I rate him really highly and think he is already a very good bowler with a lot of promise for the future. We have worked together a lot and I am very proud of him and want to see him flourish. But there is a tour to Pakistan coming up and if England need me, I am more than happy to go." "I would imagine they will take more than one spinner and I feel I am getting back to my best after almost a year with niggles that have taken some overcoming. You don't always realise how hard it is to come back from injuries," he said. "Long spells like I have had against Durham certainly help in that respect. It would be nice if both Shoaib and myself could make the Pakistan tour and there is no reason why that can't happen. I don't want to get my hopes up, but I am as determined as I ever have been to play for England," he added. On the other hand, opening batter Zak Crawley has been out of the action since the last Test of the three-match series against West Indies. He fractured his finger while attempting a catch. Crawley is now in a race against time as the typical recovery period for a broken finger is approximately six to eight weeks, and the upcoming series against Pakistan was nine weeks away at the time of his injury.—Agency

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan's Test head coach Jason Gillespie shared that the national men's team will give their "best shot" to secure a victory over Bangladesh on the final day of the ongoing second Test here at Pindi Cricket Stadium. Bangladesh are 42/0 in pursuit of a modest 185-run target. The touring side will have an entire day and all 10 wickets to score 143 more runs and secure their first-ever Test series victory over Pakistan. However, Jason Gillespie, who addressed the media after an eventful fourth day of the second Test, acknowledged that Pakistan are lacking in a few areas but expressed his confidence in the players' ability before stating that they will give their best shot to snatch victory from Bangladesh. "We are lacking in a few areas but hopefully, we will address those issues soon. I think there's a lot of quality in that dressing room of Pakistan, and the boys are working really well. I know they can develop into match-winners for Pakistan," Gillespie stated.

Ten Hag refuses to 'play Harry Potter' as Liverpool hand Manchester United a 3-0 defeat



MANCHESTER: Manchester United manager Erik ten Hag has made it clear he's "not Harry Potter" but remains confident his squad can secure silverware this season, despite a crushing 3-0 home defeat to Liverpool. Liverpool, who already had an early goal disallowed, took control of the match with Luis Diaz netting twice within seven first-half minutes. Mohamed Salah added a third shortly after the break, leaving United fans grateful it wasn't a repeat of their 5-0 drubbing by the same opponents back in 2021. The loss was particularly stinging for Ten Hag, considering six of his own signings

were in the starting lineup. Among them was the newly signed £50.5m Uruguayan midfielder Manuel Ugarte, who was introduced to the crowd before the match but wasn't eligible to play. United currently languish in 14th place on the Premier League table with just three points from three games. However, Ten Hag refused to let the defeat dampen his spirits, emphasizing that no one should expect him to work miracles overnight. "It's not like I'm Harry Potter," Ten Hag remarked. "We have to be realistic. For three of the players, it was their first start of the season. Manuel Ugarte needs time to build his fitness and integrate into the team. I'm confident he'll contribute, but it may take weeks, even a month. The same goes for other players." Ten Hag also referenced striker Joshua Zirkzee, who had a mixed performance, missing two key chances, one of which was brilliantly saved by Liverpool's Alisson Becker. Meanwhile, Matthijs de Ligt struggled defensively alongside Lisandro Martinez, and England midfielder Kobbie Mainoo was often outmaneuvered by Liverpool's Ryan Gravenberch.—Agency

Roelant Oltmans to not continue as head coach of Pakistan hockey team



KARACHI: The Pakistan hockey team currently in China is encountering significant challenges and after losing several senior players, the national side has also been deprived of the services of their foreign coach, Roelant Oltmans, Geo News reported on Monday. In a major blow to the team ahead of the Asian Hockey Champions Trophy, Dutch coach Oltmans has declined to continue coaching the Pakistan side. As per sources, Oltmans was keen on securing a long-term contract with the Pakistan team, but the Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) preferred to offer him a contract on an event-by-event basis. Consequently, discussions between PHF and Oltmans failed to reach an agreement, and he will not be available to coach the team in the upcoming tournament. Furthermore, the team's vice-captain, Abu Bakar, has yet to receive his visa for China. Currently playing league hockey in Australia, he was expected to join the Pakistan team directly from there. Additionally, players Murtaza Yaqoob, Ehtisham Islam, and Abdul Rehman are engaged in league hockey in Europe, while Arbaz Ahmed has opted not to travel to China due to personal commitments. Six senior players from the squad that participated in the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup and the Nations Cup will be unavailable. Pakistan's first match in the Asian Hockey Champions Trophy is scheduled against Malaysia on September 8.—Agency

Different diseases spreading in rain affected areas of MPK

MIRPURKHAS: After the rains in Sindh, various areas, including Sindhri, Hingorno, Phulhadiyon, Garhor Sharif and Atan Mouri, have been hit by a gastroenteritis, diarrhea, and malaria epidemic. Both children and adults have fallen victim to these diseases. Due to the gastroenteritis epidemic, 2 people have died. The Sindh government has not established any emergency centers in these areas after the rains. Government hospitals and basic health centers in Hingorno, Dilbar Mahar Rural Health, Khan Sahib, and Garhor Sharif Rural Health are ineffective for the public. None of these government hospitals or centers have provided emergency services due to the rains. There is no doctor or ambulance service available; these centers only provide normal treatment from 8 AM to 2 PM. Sometimes, the staff is absent, forcing patients to seek out unqualified doctors, leading to the spread of gastroenteritis and diarrhea from one patient to another. Treatment in government hospitals is very limited, and although emergency measures were announced, they have not been implemented effectively. The stagnant rainwater has become contaminated, and the presence of mosquitoes in these areas is increasing.

LG Minister Announces Repair Work On Karachi's Major Roads Post-Monsoon

KARACHI: Sindh Local Government Minister, Saeed Ghani, announced that the repair work on the main roads in Karachi, damaged due to accumulated rainwater, will commence immediately after the monsoon season concludes. The minister made this statement on Monday while addressing the Sindh Assembly during a session in response to call attention notices submitted by Opposition legislators.



Ghani highlighted that the monsoon rains in Karachi have been unusually prolonged this year. He assured the assembly that once the highways are repaired, efforts will swiftly shift to restoring smaller roads, alleys, and streets across the city that were also damaged by the rains. He informed the assembly that under the Competitive and Livable City of Karachi Project, the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC) had undertaken the construction or restoration of 400 roads in the city. However, the recent rains have damaged approximately 14 to 15 of these roads. Ghani assured concerned lawmakers that the Sindh government would investigate the extent of these damages. Addressing the Opposition MPAs, Ghani explained that repair work could not be initiated during the ongoing monsoon rains. He mentioned that the Sindh Local Government Department has instructed the KMC and town administrations to conduct surveys of the damaged roads and streets, so that restoration efforts can begin immediately after the rains subside. He noted that some areas of Karachi received up to 200 to 250 mm of rainfall during different spells. Ghani also acknowledged that Karachi and other parts of Sindh have experienced heavy rains in past monsoon seasons as well. He assured the assembly that those responsible for any damages to recently constructed or repaired roads will be held accountable, and relevant consultants involved in these development projects have been asked to submit review reports on the situation. —RT

Karachi Customs Seize Drugs Valued At Rs 2.25 Million



KARACHI: Customs authorities successfully thwarted an attempt to smuggle drugs into Pakistan through the International Mail Office (IMO) at Jinnah International Airport Karachi, according to media reports on Monday. Acting on credible intelligence, a Customs team led by Collector Adeem Khan, along with Additional Collector Muhammad Fayal Khan and Assistant Collector Sharjeel Abbas Wasan, intercepted a suspicious EMS parcel labeled as 'Fresh Galangal (Thai Ginger)' originating from Bangkok, Thailand. Upon examination and subsequent laboratory testing, the parcel was found to contain 500 grams of marijuana (cannabis) valued at approximately Rs 2.25 million. The package was addressed to Muhammad Usama Mahmood, a resident of Gulistan-e-Johar, Karachi. An FIR has been registered against the recipient, and efforts are ongoing to apprehend all the individuals involved in the smuggling operation. The Customs department has reiterated its commitment to intensifying the crackdown on drug smuggling to prevent such illegal activities and safeguard the country's borders. —RT/Agency

Sindh Government To Build Expressway Linking Karachi Port Terminal To Jam Sadiq Bridge

KARACHI: The Sindh government has announced plans to construct an expressway connecting the Karachi Port Terminal (KPT) to Jam Sadiq Bridge, according to media reports on Monday.

The decision was made during a session of the Public Private Partnership (PPP) Board, chaired by Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah. The expressway will include a 12.5-kilometer section above ground, with the remaining portion below the surface. The expressway will connect the KPT terminal directly with the Malir Expressway at Jam Sadiq Bridge. Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah directed the Sindh Local Government Department to finalize the project in collaboration with the PPP unit, stating that the government will undertake the construction using its own resources under the PPP mode. In addition to the expressway, Chief Minister Shah mentioned the development of the NDD Technology Park, also under a public-private partnership. The Sindh government has allocated Rs 1.7 billion for this project, with an agreement expected to be signed within the month. The PPP policy board also approved a reforestation project covering over 100,000 hectares of land in Sindh, with plans to seek assistance from the Asian Development Bank for reforestation on 88,022 hectares. According to a 2017 WWF report, only 6% of Pakistan's land is covered by forests, while the minimum recommended forest cover is 25%. The reforestation project will begin in the katcha areas of Malir and Jamshoro districts, with the first phase targeting 34,995 hectares. Chief Minister Shah also expressed frustration over delays in the Marble City project and called for its prompt implementation. —RT/Agency

The police have now added Section 100 of the Motor Vehicle Act to the case, which pertains to driving under the influence of intoxicants. This addition follows last week's medical reports confirming that Natasha Danish was under the influence of methamphetamine (commonly known as crystal meth) at the time of the accident. Natasha Danish is currently in judicial custody following orders from a Karachi East court. The accident also resulted in injuries to five other individuals on Karsaz Road. —RT/Agency

Another Suspect Apprehended In Karachi Over 12-Year-Old Girl's Rape And Murder

KARACHI: Karachi police on Monday said they arrested a second suspect in connection with the gang rape and murder of a 12-year-old girl during an "encounter".

The body of a minor girl was found in a bag near a garbage dump in the city's Lucky Star area on August 25. The autopsy had revealed that she was raped and strangled. Last week, the police had claimed to have arrested what it described as the prime suspect in the crime. "A highly wanted suspect was arrested in injured condition during a police encounter on Abdul Sattar Edhi Avenue in Defence Phase 8," Deputy Inspector General (DIG)-South Syed Asad Raza said today. He did not specify whether the suspect was already wounded or injured during the pursuit. Noting that the suspect, Asim Ali, was wanted in the case of "rape and murder of a 12-year-old girl," DIG Raza said he had "thrown her body near Lucky Star" after committing the crime. "An accomplice of the suspect is already in custody," the DIG said, referring to the arrest made last week. The case had been registered at the Saddar police station, Raza said. DIG Raza had previously described the man arrested last week as the prime suspect, who he said was a watchman at the Bara Market near Cantonment Railway Station. However, his two accomplices, who worked at the Shalimar bus terminal, were still at large, the official had stated. DIG Raza also said that investigators had identified the victim as belonging to the Hindu community and living under the name of the Lilly Bridge with her mother. —RT/Agency

Authorities Intercept Currency Smuggling Operation At Jinnah International

KARACHI: Customs authorities successfully thwarted an attempt to smuggle foreign currency at Karachi Airport, recovering millions in currency, according to media reports on Monday.



The passenger, identified as Moster Uddin, was intercepted while attempting to board international flight FZ-336. Upon inspection at the common counter, customs officials discovered the currency hidden in a secret compartment at the bottom of his bag, which contained 30 bundles of 500 Indian Rupee notes. Further inspection revealed a total of 71.4 million in Indian Rupees and 16,000 Bangladeshi Taka in the passenger's possession. Customs officials suspect the Indian currency may be counterfeit. An FIR has been lodged against the passenger, and an investigation is currently underway. —RT/Agency

Court Extends Judicial Remand For Imran And Bushra Bibi In New Toshakhana Case

RAWALPINDI: An accountability court in Rawalpindi on Monday extended the judicial remand of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan and his wife, Bushra Bibi, in a new Toshakhana reference.

The accountability court's judge Javed Rana conducted the hearing of the new Toshakhana reference pertaining to a jewellery set gifted by the Saudi crown prince.

The hearing was attended by the couple's lawyers and the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) prosecutor.

The new reference pertains to a case related to a jewellery set gifted to former first lady Bushra by the Saudi crown prince when Imran



was the prime minister of the country from 2018 to 2022.

At the outset of the hearing, defence lawyer Salman Saifdar argued that the new reference was similar to the previous one, therefore, two separate references could not be filed in the same accusation.

Later, the judge extended the judicial remand of the

former premier and his wife till September 16.

The hearing was adjourned till September 6.

It is noteworthy to mention here that the couple had filed separate post-arrest bail pleas in the new Toshakhana case last week.

Mentioning the state and chairman National Accountability Bureau (NAB) as parties to the case, both the applications filed through Barrister Salman Saifdar under Section 9(b) of NA Ordinance 1999 and Section 497 of Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) request the accountability court to grant post-arrest bail to the couple to "interest of justice and fair play".—RT/Agency

Law Minister Dismisses Rumors Of CJP Isa's Tenure Extension

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Law Azam Nazeer Tarar on Monday rebuffed speculations centred on the imminent retirement of Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa, saying that the top judge does not want extension in his tenure.

The top judge is set to retire in October this year, but as his retirement draws near, rumours of an "extension" in his tenure through judiciary-centric legislation in parliament have been rife.

However, the Centre has time and again denied these reports, saying that nothing as such was on the cards as CJP Isa has "no interest" in getting an extension.

The legal experts say there is no constitutional mechanism for such an extension without amendments to the Constitution. Even if the government wants such an amendment, it would require a two-thirds majority in



both houses of parliament, which is a challenge in the light of recent Supreme Court verdict on reserved seats favouring Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI).

"The two-thirds majority should be discussed when an extension has to be granted," Tarar said while addressing an event in Islamabad.

He said that the chief justice "clearly told me and the attorney general that he doesn't want an extension." The minister said that CJP

come the country's top judge.

The speculations about CJP Isa's extension gained attraction after the PTI sought an early issuance of notification regarding the next chief justice of Pakistan (CJP), last month.

While speaking to the media today, PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan said that the party has decided to oppose any amendment bill regarding the judiciary and all their members of parliament have been officially notified about it.

"None of our MNA or senator will vote in the favour of the proposed amendments. Every MNA has been individually instructed in this regard in the light of Article 63 of the Constitution," Gohar said.

It may be noted that the controversial apex court judgment of July 2022 on former Punjab chief minister Pervaiz Elahi's petition pre-

vents lawmakers from defying party lines in constitutional votes, effectively limiting the government's ability to secure additional votes through defections.

Moreover, speaking about the matter of parleys between the opposition and the government, the PTI chairman said that a dialogue should be held. The PTI chief said his party has also clarified with whom the talks should be held.

"PTI founder has given the mandate to hold the talks with political parties to Mahmood Achakzai and it is his prerogative to decide the point which should be talked on," he added.

Gohar further stated that if the party will consider any suggestions presented by the Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PKMAP) chairman.—RT/Agency

No Government Officials Willing To Support Afia Siddiqui's Lawyer, IHC Reports

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court has expressed frustration over a lack of support from government officials in the Afia Siddiqui case.

Justice Sardar Ejaz Ishaq Khan remarked that no government official had expressed support for Afia Siddiqui's lawyer.

The IHC addressed the request for release and repatriation of Dr Afia Siddiqui. The court session included the presence of Fozia Siddiqui's lawyer, Imran Shafiq, and judicial assistant Zainab Janjua.

Foreign Secretary Syrus Sajid Qazi, Additional Attorney General Manzoor Iqbal Dogal, and Senator Mushtaq Ahmed were also present. Afia Siddiqui's lawyer, Clive Smith, participated via video link.

The additional attorney general began by stating that further information from the American lawyer was needed regarding the judicial assistant's arguments. The Foreign Ministry requested additional time to



submit a report. The court questioned Clive Smith about his role in fighting the case in the US. The court further highlighted that while an American lawyer was handling Clive Smith's case, the Pakistani government seemed disengaged and repeatedly requested extensions. The court questioned whether the ISI had allegedly handed over Afia to the US.

Judicial assistant Zainab Janjua expressed hope that the federal government would find a proper solution, to which the judge responded by pointing out that the petition had been under review for three years with

no progress. Justice Ishaq criticised the federal government and Foreign Ministry for avoiding a stand in court alongside Smith, to which the additional attorney general responded that the government supported Afia and Fozia but must follow procedural protocols. The American lawyer inquired about the time required to submit responses once they receive a copy, with the court stating it would not grant more than a week's extension. Subsequently, the additional attorney general requested a five-week extension, which was denied by the court.—RT/Agency

CJP Qazi Faez Isa Has Declined Extension, Says Rana Sanauallah

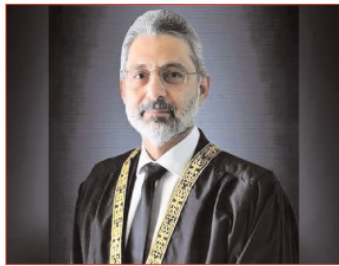
ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa has refused an extension in his service tenure, according to a statement by Advisor to the Prime Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination, Rana Sanauallah.

While speaking on a private media channel on Monday, Rana said that Justice Isa discussed the matter with the Law Minister and Attorney General, indicating that while he would accept a general age limit extension for all, he would not accept an extension in his individual case.

Rana noted that the government lacks the parliamentary majority required for either granting the extension or passing a constitutional amendment to facilitate it.

"If we had the numbers, it should have been done because a constitutional amendment is the prerogative of Parliament," he stated.

On the political front, Rana clarified that his cooperation with Maulana Fa-



zur Rehman does not signify full alignment.

He also addressed allegations against Lt. General (retired) Faiz Hameed, who is accused of influencing military appointments through the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and suggested that the involvement of PTI's founder could not be ruled out.

The PM's adviser further dismissed rumours regarding former COAS Qamar Javed Bajwa seeking an extension

and denied any meetings between Nawaz Sharif and Bajwa's father-in-law in London. Opposition leader in National Assembly and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Secretary General, Omar Ayub Khan, had earlier last week called on the government to immediately announce the name of the new chief justice, replacing CJP Qazi Faez Isa, amid speculations of a possible tenure extension.—RT/Agency

CM Bugti Updates Bilawal On Recent Surge In Balochistan Terror Attacks



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari met Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti.

ISLAMABAD: Political advisor to the prime minister, Rana Sanauallah said that there might be WhatsApp messages between former ISI chief General (ret'd) Faiz Hameed and the founder of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) regarding the events of May 9.

In an exclusive interview with private tv, Rana Sanauallah addressed questions about Faiz Hameed, stating that speculation about him is unnecessary as the institution has already provided a brief and concise statement.

The political advisor mentioned that Faiz Hameed has been accused of influencing the appointment of Lt Gen Faiz Hameed (Ret'd), under provisions of the Pakistan Army Act, the Pakistan Army's media wing said. In addition, multiple instances of violation of the Pakistan Army Act post-retirement have also been established.

The process of Field General Court Martial has been initiated and Lt Gen Faiz Hameed (Ret'd) has been taken into military custody last month and court-martial proceedings were initiated, according to the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR). "Complying with the orders of the Supreme



Court of Pakistan, a detailed court of inquiry was undertaken by the Pakistan Army, to ascertain the correctness of complaints in the Top City Case made against Lt Gen Faiz Hameed (Ret'd). Consequently, appropriate disciplinary action has been initiated against Lt Gen Faiz Hameed (Ret'd), under provisions of the Pakistan Army Act," the Pakistan Army's media wing said. In addition, multiple instances of violation of the Pakistan Army Act post-retirement have also been established.

When asked about Nawaz Sharif's alleged meeting with Bajwa's father-in-law, Ejaz Amjad, in London, Rana Sanauallah denied any such meeting took place. He mentioned that some friends suggested greeting Ejaz Amjad to help with the ongoing case against Nawaz Sharif.

The political advisor also commented on the influence of individuals like Sabir Mithoo, stating that many people benefited from their connections with General Ejaz and Sabir Mithoo, and prominent figures often sought their help.—RT/Agency

He gave these remarks during a hearing of a case regarding the distribution of property. The CJP noted that litigations was done on a deathly dispute after the property of 75-year-old owner.

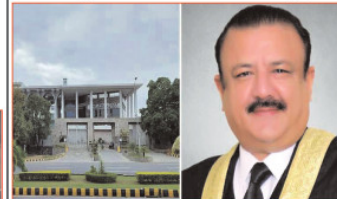
He questioned that why a 75-year-old man would gift his land to people other than his two sons. Unfortunately, such baseless and fabricated cases are wasting courts'
