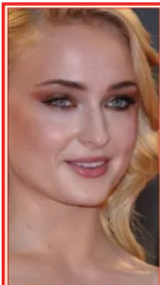

Gandapur Dismisses Apology Demands, Plans Rally In Mianwali On September 29

PESHAWAR: Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur stated that he will not apologise, questioning, "Who should I apologise to and why?" He stated that apologies should come from those who have laid hands on Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf founder Imran Khan.



In a video address on Sunday, Gandapur criticised the government for spreading false narratives regarding access to rallies, asserting that no expectations can be held for the "small-minded."

He also mentioned that the government being ousted. Looking to the future, he outlined a plan to secure freedom for upcoming generations. He called for peaceful protests nationwide on September 27 and announced a rally in Mianwali on September 29, along with events in Rawalpindi and other cities. He concluded that the movement will not stop and urged the public to remain supportive and ready for action.

Gandapur expressed concern that the current rulers are pushing the nation into darkness, noting that Imran Khan has been imprisoned for 414 days. He declared that the nation was not en-

slaved and would not tolerate subjugation. He also mentioned that the judiciary has reported pressure being applied to it, and that they do not recognise the unconstitutional amendments to Form 47. "Imran Khan's release will come only when the judiciary is independent," he asserted.

Discussing the economic situation during Khan's tenure, Gandapur stated that the economy, electricity, gas and employment were all better under his leadership. He claimed that Khan had intended to make independent foreign policy decisions before a conspiracy led to

the government being ousted. He noted that if cases are to be registered against them, they should proceed, as justices have been inflicted on their workers, and questioned who would apologise for that.—RT/Agency

PM: People Have Rejected 'Politics Of Anarchy' And Support Government's Robust Economic Policies

ISLAMABAD: Apparently referring to yesterday's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) power show in Lahore — which the government called a dud — Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday said "the people of Pakistan have rejected 'politics of anarchy' and prioritised improvements in economic policies."

A day earlier, the former ruling party held a public rally in Lahore, which came to an abrupt end after police stormed the stage, turning off the microphone and lights, forcing PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan and other party leaders to leave.

The police and district administration swung into action after the PTI rally exceeded the 6pm deadline specified in the no-objective certificate (NOC).

Even the first-tier leadership, including Omar Ayub, Assad Qaiser, and "firebrand" Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, failed to arrive at the venue before the 6pm deadline.

Federal Minister Attaullah Tarar claimed that Imran Khan-founded party failed to gather supporters despite receiving a "free



hand" from the government, while Punjab Minister Azma Bokhari stated that fewer than 3,000 people attended the rally from across the country.

In a statement on the country's political and economic situation issued today, PM Shehbaz said that "the public wants relief from inflation, solutions to their problems, and economic development."

The prime minister, stressing the urgency of addressing the public's economic concerns, called for a shift in political priorities, arguing that, instead of focusing

on rallies and gatherings, the immediate need is to improve the economic condition of the masses.

"We will hold rallies in 2028, but right now, it is time to work hard to fulfill the pledges made to the people."

He linked the success of the country's economic recovery directly to political stability, warning that political chaos would disrupt efforts to provide relief to the public. "Economic recovery is tied to political stability; political chaos means affecting the process of providing relief to the people," he said.

He praised the people for their role in supporting economic growth by promoting political stability and emphasised that national unity was crucial for sustaining this progress. "National unity for political stability will prove to be the guarantee of Pakistan's bright economic future and relief from inflation," he remarked.

To address the country's ongoing economic and security challenges, the prime minister called for collaboration between political parties, institutions, and provinces. "To tackle economic challenges and terrorism, the nation, political parties, institu-

tions, and provinces must work together," he urged. Recalling the past political instability, PM Shehbaz lamented that a lot of time had been wasted in political chaos rather than in the interest of the country and the nation.

On the economic front, the prime minister was optimistic about the country's progress, noting that inflation had returned to single digits and that Pakistan's overall economic situation was improving.

"Thank God, inflation has returned to single digits, and the economic situation is improving," he said, highlighting key indicators such as rising exports, the stability of the rupee, increasing remittances, and declining interest rates. Looking forward, the prime minister underscored that the current International Monetary Fund (IMF) program should be the last one for Pakistan, saying "if it is so, it will be a true success." He warned that abusive language, violence, and chaos would not lead to progress, urging every province and institution to play its role in solving the public's problems.—RT/Agency

CJP Isa Asks Registrar To Address Nine Questions Regarding Reserved Seats

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa has sought "explanation" from the registrar of the Supreme Court asking nine questions on the decision on reserved seats pronounced on July 12.

According to sources, the CJP wrote a letter to the registrar Jazela Aslam in which he put nine questions regarding apex court's September 14 majority decision on reserved seats.

The CJP questioned registrar Ms Jazela when did the Election Commission (ECP) and Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) file civil miscellaneous request for clarification?

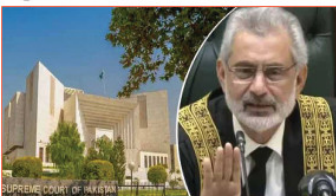
Why the applications were not sent to the Practice and Procedure Committee?

How were the miscellaneous petitions fixed for hearing without issuing a cause list?

Why has the cause list not been issued for hearing the applications?

Did the Registrar's Office issue a notice to the parties concerned and the Attorney General? In which courtroom or chamber were the applications heard?

The Chief Justice asked



why the order was not fixed in a courtroom for pronouncing.

How was the order uploaded (on website) without the original file and the order being deposited in the Supreme Court Registrar Office?

Who gave the order to upload the order on the Supreme Court websites?

It may be recalled that the Supreme Court had issued a written order on the ECP's plea for clearing ambiguity on the majority decision on reserved seats. The apex court, in its judgement, declared that the ECP had recognised that PTI was a registered political party. It is mala fide on part of the ECP not to acknowledge the cer-

tificates of the PTI members. For its act [of defiance] the ECP may face constitutional and legal consequences.

The apex court's decision categorically declared that all those who submitted certificates would be considered members of the PTI. The decision would be applicable to the national and provincial assemblies.

The Supreme Court strongly rejects ECP's attempt to create confusion, declared the decision. The written order mentioned that the ECP had recognised the PTI as a registered political party and Barrister Gohar as its chairman. Now the commission cannot change its position in the name of clarification.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: Amid the incumbent government's strenuous efforts to address the country's financial woes, the Federal Bureau of Revenue (FBR) is mulling strict measures including imposing a Rs1 million penalty on various categories of tax evaders, media reported on Sunday.

The tax authority has proposed six key measures against null, non-filers while identifying 10 major revenue spinner sectors for hiring independent experts which include textile, financial and insurance, chemical and fertiliser, petroleum, tobacco, iron and steel, beverages, tea, cement and real estate activities.

The development comes a day after the body announced that it would not be extending the September 30 deadline for the submission of tax returns.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led administration in its tax-heavy budget passed in June, set out an ambitious taxation plan to boost its prospects of securing a fresh bailout deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) — which it eventually did as the programme now awaits the approval of the Fund's executive board.

However, the FBR faces



a monumental tax shortfall in the first quarter (July-September) under the IMF programme of \$7 billion Extended Fund Facility (EFF) coupled with its failure to bring 3.2 million retailers into the tax net, the tax collection body has geared up for significant taxation measures against millions.

Sources say that an internal assessment of the FBR has shown a tax shortfall of over Rs220 billion for the first quarter (July-September) against the agreed target of Rs2,652 billion.

The authority faced a shortfall of Rs98 billion in August 2024. The FBR had collected Rs1,456 billion in the first two months (July and August) against the assigned target of Rs1,554 billion.

leaving the body with the challenging task of fetching Rs1,196 billion during the ongoing month to

materialise the first quarter agreed target with the IMF. The annual tax collection target of FBR envisaged Rs12,970 billion, which was approved by parliament (Rs12,913 billion).

Therefore, the Tax collecting body has chalked out half a dozen strict measures with the first one being the blocking of utilities for all three categories.

Out of the remaining five proposed actions, the freezing of bank accounts would be implemented. The FBR has also suggested the attachment of properties on non-registration from manufacturers and wholesale distributors — however, the attachment of property has not been proposed for retailers.

The sealing of premises for tax evasion and non-registration has been proposed for manufacturers, wholesalers and distributors while

retailers will remain exempted from this measure.

The fifth stern action has been proposed for the imposition of a new penalty of Rs1 million for the three categories.

Furthermore, the appointment of receivers only for manufacturers whose turnover exceeded Rs250 million on a per annum basis has also been proposed.

For enforcement measures for non-registration against manufacturers, wholesalers/ distributors and retailers, the FBR has suggested stern action against those manufacturers, wholesalers and distributors who possessed a turnover of Rs250 million and retailers whose turnover exceeded Rs100 million.

Furthermore, taking over the premises of factories having a turnover of over Rs250 million has also been proposed along with the appointment of a receiver if the revenue collector found non-registration in case of manufacturer and importer of Rs1 million penalty from manufacturer, wholesalers, distributors and retailers.

The tax authority has estimated a tax gap of Rs700 billion in the textile sector

in all three major taxes — sales tax, income tax and Customs duty. In the cement sector, the FBR estimates show that the tax gap stands at Rs100 billion.

For the appointment of independent experts for ten selected sectors, the FBR official said the tax authorities would find out former CFOs of the respective tax selected sectors to ascertain alleged wrongdoings and alleged desired tax revenues in accordance with their real/ actual potential.

A presentation given to the prime minister by the FBR has revealed that despite raising tax rates and abolishing tax exemptions and special regimes, tax collection remains stagnant showing there was massive tax evasion even in the case of those who are so-called registered sectors or individuals.

The FBR established a model taxpayer office in Karachi which alone collects 32% of total revenues collected by the revenue body. Currently, 68% of FBR's revenue is generated through these large taxpayer offices located in Karachi, Lahore, Islamabad and Multan. There is a gap of 1,550 auditors across the FBR which would be filled in three phases.—RT/Agency

At Least 51 Killed, 20 Injured In Iranian Coal Mine Explosion

KHORASAN: The casualties from the coal mine explosion in Iran's South Khorasan Province on Sunday soared to 51, state media reported revising the death toll, as some of the injured succumbed to their wounds.

Currently, there are 20 injured who are being treated at the medical facilities.

As per the reports, the accident was caused by a methane gas explosion in two blocks, B and C, of the mine run by the Madanjoo company.

"76% of the country's coal is provided from this region and around 8 to 10 big companies are working in the region including Madanjoo company," the governor of South Khorasan Province Ali Akbar Rahimi told state TV on Sunday.

The rescue operation in



block B has been completed. Of the 47 workers, who were in the block, 30 died and 17 were injured, Rahimi said earlier.

Rescue operations in block C have started. Methane density in the block is high and the operation will take around 3-4 hours, he added.

There were 69 workers in the blocks at the time of the explosion, state TV reported. "Seventeen injured peo-

ple were transported to the hospital and 24 people are still missing," it said earlier on Sunday citing the head of Iran's Red Crescent.

The explosion occurred at 9pm (1730 GMT) on Saturday, state media said. President Masoud Pezeshkian expressed condolences to the victims' families. "I spoke with ministers and we will do our best to follow up," Pezeshkian said in televised comments.—RT/Agency

Pakistan To Address Palestine, Kashmir, And Islamophobia Issues At UNGA

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will be attending the upcoming 79th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) wherein he will highlight Palestine, Islamophobia and other issues during his address slated for September 27, the Foreign Office said in a statement on Sunday.

The premier, set to attend the UNGA session from September 23 to 27, will underscore the importance of addressing long-standing issues on the agenda of the UN Security Council (UNSC) such as Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK) and Palestine.

The prime minister, a day earlier, reached London for a short tour from where he would depart for New York on Monday (tomorrow).

the Heads of Governments of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation Deputy PM and FM [Ishaq] Dar will not proceed to New York for the 79th session of the UNGA," an FO spokesman said.

Sources told media that the decision for the cancellation of the foreign minister's trip to New York was taken on Friday afternoon in a meeting at the FO.

Expanding on PM Shehbaz's trip, the FO said that the scheduled will not only reaffirm Pakistan's commitment to multilateralism and support for the UN's role in fostering global peace, security, and prosperity but will also accentuate the importance of addressing the inequities in international economic relations and

reforming the international financial architecture during his time in New York.

The premier will also highlight the country's priority to place people at the heart of the domestic and global development agenda. He will express Islamabad's commitment as an incoming member of the UNSC for the year 2025-26, to work with all UN member states to uphold the UN Charter, preventing conflict, fostering peace, and promoting global prosperity, the FO added. Furthermore, PM Shehbaz would urge the international community to take decisive measures in addressing climate change and countering the rising tide of Islamophobia.—RT/Agency

Mastermind Behind Transformer Theft Gang Arrested In Khairpur Operation

Khairpur: In a successful operation led by SHO B-Section Mushtaq Jatoi and Checkpoint In-charge Jabbar Phulphot, acting on the instructions of SSP Khairpur Dr. Samiullah Soomro, police apprehended the mastermind behind a gang involved in stealing electricity transformers across Khairpur city and the Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Basti Colony. Among those arrested were police personnel Khadim Suhag, Raza Qureshi, Muhammad Bachal Mari, and Haji Soomro. The police recovered five transformers, coils, and other valuable items from the suspects, registering a case against them. According to SHO Mushtaq Jatoi, investigations are ongoing. During interrogation, the suspects admitted to stealing 21 transformers from the Shaheed Benazir Basti, selling them at Raza Qureshi and Haji Soomro's workshop. They revealed that a transformer valued at Rs. 1.2 million was sold for a mere Rs. 100,000. Additionally, the suspects disclosed that police official Khadim Suhag was paid a bribe of Rs. 30,000 for each stolen transformer.

Dr. Mahesar emphasized that awareness seminars equip students with the knowledge and skills needed to tackle critical health challenges in their communities. Khairpur: Residents of Kumb, including Ghanur Khan Jafferi and AD Mirjat, staged a protest outside the Khairpur Press Club, accusing local authorities of negligence and corruption in the case of their brother, Kamber Jafferi, a livestock trader who was critically injured in a gun attack a month ago. According to the protesters, four armed men—identified as Gulzar Ali Jafferi, Allah Dino, Ali Muhammad Jafferi, and one unidentified individual—opened fire on Kamber Jafferi, leaving him with severe gunshot wounds before fleeing the scene.



A case was registered at Kumb Police Station, but the protesters alleged that SHO Kumb Aslam Laghari, ASI Nazaqat Shino, and other police officials accepted bribes worth millions from the accused to suppress the case. They claimed that despite medical reports confirming gunshot wounds, the police are downplaying the incident as a minor injury. The protesters further accused the suspects of having connections with criminals and the police, alleging that they are now being threatened with false death sentences for pursuing justice. They called for authorities to intervene, conduct a fair investigation, and ensure that the perpetrators are held accountable.

NAB Recovers Rs 168.5 Billion In BRT Peshawar Case

ISLAMABAD: The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) on Sunday announced the recovery of Rs 168.5 billion in the BRT Peshawar project, marking its largest recovery in the bureau's 25-year history, media reported.



The investigation into the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project began in 2018, amidst allegations of illegal contract awards and misappropriation of funds. The case saw NAB rejecting contractors' claims of Rs 31.5 billion in the International Court of Arbitration.

Investigations revealed six major contracts were wrongly awarded to specific companies, which later breached their terms. Over 400 bank accounts were inspected, revealing further evidence of misconduct. The contractors submitted fake guarantees and de-

layed project completion, leading to Rs 86 billion in damages sought by the Peshawar Development Authority (PDA). NAB's efforts resulted in a saving of Rs 108.5 billion, along with an additional Rs 9 billion in financial expenditure saved by completing the project within its original cost framework.

The investigation revealed that contractors failed to complete work within the stipulated time-

Three Policemen Martyred In Balochistan Attack In Zhob

ZHOB: Three officers of the Anti-Terrorism Force (ATF), including an Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI), were martyred when unidentified assailants opened fire on their vehicle in Zhob, media reported.

According to details, the Anti-Terrorism Force (ATF) vehicle was ambushed in Zhob, an area of Balochistan, by unknown attackers, resulting in severe injuries to two police officers who later succumbed to their wounds, raising the death toll to three. One officer remains hospitalized and is receiving treatment. Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi condemned the attack on the ATF vehicle and paid tribute to the martyred officers. He expressed deep sorrow over the loss and extended his condolences to the families of the fallen heroes. Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said that the nation salutes those who attained the highest rank of martyrdom while performing their duty. He encouraged citizens to report overcharging to the Assistant Commissioner's Office or via the Punjab Price App for swift action against non-compliant shopkeepers.

Remote-Controlled Bomb Targets Police Van In Swat, Resulting In Officer's Death

SWAT: At least one police officer was martyred, and four others were wounded in a "remote-controlled bomb explosion" targeting a police van guarding a convoy of foreign envoys heading to Malam Jabba from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Swat district on Sunday.



District Police Officer (DPO) Zahidullah Khan confirmed the explosion, stating the attack targeted a group of foreign diplomats, resulting in one officer losing his life and four others being injured.

DPO Khan detailed that the affected mobile van was leading the convoy of 11 foreign diplomats, adding that the martyred policeman was identified as Burhan while four wounded cops include a sub-inspector. Police officials informed the media that all envoys were safe after the explosion and had been shifted to Islamabad. They added that the diplomats were heading to Malam Jabba after attending an event at the Chamber

of Commerce in Mingora when the explosion occurred in the suburban area of Sherabad. The police confirmed that the convoy included ambassadors from Russia, Portugal, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Iran, and other countries. The wounded officers were transported to the District Headquarters Hospital (DHQ) in Saidu Sharif. Heavy contingents of law enforcement agencies were deployed in the area following the incident. They added that the diplomats were heading to Malam Jabba after attending an event at the Chamber

Police Release List Of 73 Most Wanted Terrorists

LAKKI MARWAT: Police have released a list of 73 most wanted terrorists, including their names, addresses, and details of their accomplices, media reported.

As per details, the list also includes individuals who have been involved in extremist activities, extortion, and bomb blasts. The police have directed their teams to intensify operations against these terrorists and their accomplices. Earlier, at least 37 terrorists were killed and 14 others wounded in the ongoing intelligence-based operations of Pakistan Army in the Tirah area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the military's media wing said.

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said in a statement that the security forces have been conducting extensive intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in the Tirah area of Khyber in the reported presence of terrorists since Aug. 20.—RT/Agency

Earlier, the district administration had issued orders to keep Wazir under custody from September 4 to 19. While under the fresh orders, he will remain imprisoned till October 4. Meanwhile, the PTM leader's lawyers have approached the Lahore High Court's Rawalpindi

Bench against the MPO orders. LHC Justice Chaudhry Abdul Aziz will hear the case pertaining to the orders on September 24. The ex-MNA from South Waziristan has spent years in jail as he was booked in several cases in different police stations, pertaining to delivering hate speeches against state institutions "one of them" at the hospital which led to the filing of a case against the politician under the Anti-Terrorism Act.—RT/Agency

Rare Eagle Valued At Rs 100 Million Recovered In Punjab

LAHORE: The wildlife department of Punjab government has recovered a rare species of eagle in the Taunsa area, valued at over Rs100 million in the international market, media reported on Sunday.



The wildlife department conducted an operation during the ongoing crackdown against the illegal trade and smuggling of rare wild animals and birds in the province.

According to the spokesman of the wildlife department, after receiving a tip, wildlife protection department and the police carried out a joint operation and recovered the rare species of eagle. The suspect involved in the illegal sale of rare animals and birds abroad

has also been arrested. The authorities confirmed that the rare eagle is physically healthy and is worth more than \$36,000 in global market. On the other hand, Senior Minister Maryam Aurangzeb lauded the department on behalf of Chief Minister Punjab and directed to release the eagle into the wild after mounting a tracker to monitor its movement, emphasizing the importance of birds in maintaining ecological balance. She also noted that several rare animals and birds have been recovered and transferred to zoos, with many receiving treatment that saved their lives.—RT/Agency

While visiting family in Altavista, Mr. Foxx popped into the A1 Mini Mart on Main Street to grab a quick pick-me-up. On a whim, he decided to purchase some scratch-off lottery tickets. Little did he know, one of those tickets would prove to be a \$1 million top prize winner in the 20X the Money game. However, he chose the cash option of \$625,000 rather than the option of taking the full \$1 million prize over 30 years.

"I thought I was reading it wrong. You don't know anyone who's hit the Lottery for that amount of money," he told lottery officials, reported WFXR.

As a result of Mr. Foxx's win, the A1 Mini Mart,

where he purchased the ticket, will receive a prize ranging from \$10 to \$10,000 bonus from the Virginia Lottery. When asked about his plans for the windfall, he chose to keep his intentions private.

According to WFXR-TV, a Fox News affiliate, his win marks the fourth top prize awarded in the 20X the Money game, indicating two remaining \$1 million prizes yet to be

claimed. The game features prizes ranging from \$10 to \$10,000. The game offers impressive odds, with a 1 in 1,958,400 chance of winning the top prize and a 1 in 3.65 chance of winning any prize. US Man Discovers He's Been Paying His Neighbour's Electric Bill For 15 Years

In a startling revelation, a resident of California discovered he had been footing the bill for his neighbour's electricity for over 15 years.



According to ABC News, Ken Wilson is a Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) customer who has lived alone in an apartment complex in Vacaville since 2006. His suspicions were raised when his bills seemed unusually high, despite his best efforts to reduce energy consumption. An inquiry by the local power company uncovered the shocking mistake, exposing the 15-year mix-up that had Mr. Wilson unknowingly shouldering the financial burden of his neighbour's electricity usage all along.

Before the discovery, Mr. Wilson has been taking proactive steps to reduce his soaring electricity bills by cutting back on usage and purchasing a device to track the wattage of his appliances. Despite these efforts, he noticed his meter bill continued to rise, even when his breaker was switched off.

"I've been trying to conserve electricity and lower my costs because it was getting really expensive. I kept going outside to check my meter... and I couldn't believe it. Even after I turned off my breakers, I kept going outside to check my meter to see if it was still running and it was still running," Mr. Wilson told local TV station KMAX/KOVR. Suspicious, he contacted Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) to investigate, presenting his findings and the measures he had taken to reduce usage. PG&E launched an inquiry and ultimately confirmed his suspicions. Turns out, he had been inadvertently paying his neighbour's electricity bill since 2009, three years after moving into his apartment. "Our preliminary investigation has found the meter number for the customer's apartment was being billed to another apartment since potentially 2009," a spokesperson for PG&E said. "We sincerely apologize for the oversight and regret any inconvenience caused by the duration of this issue," the spokesperson added.—Agency

Israeli troops raid, order closure of Al Jazeera's West Bank bureau

Israeli forces raided the bureau of media network Al Jazeera in the West Bank city of Ramallah early on Sunday morning, issuing it with a military order to shut down operations, the network and the Israeli military said on Sunday.



The Qatar-headquartered channel aired live footage of Israeli troops entering the office with their weapons drawn and handing a military court order to Ramallah bureau chief Walid al-Omari forcing the bureau to close for 45 days.

The Israeli military said, in response to a Reuters query, that the channel's offices had been sealed and its equipment confiscated. The military added that the order was signed after an intelligence assessment determined that the offices were being used "to incite terror" and "to support terrorist activities."

"The channel's broadcasts endanger the security and public order in both the area and the State of Israel as a whole," the statement said.

Al Jazeera called the raid "a criminal act" and held the government of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu responsible for the safety of its journalists, it said in a statement.

The network added that it would take legal action to protect its rights and promised to continue its coverage. "Al Jazeera rejects the draconian actions, and the unfounded allegations presented by Israeli authorities to justify these illegal raids," it said.—Agency

Two Motorcyclists Killed In Kashmir Trailer Collision

KASHMIRE: A tragic road accident near Dera Mor early Sunday morning resulted in the deaths of two motorcyclists and left another critically injured when their motorcycle was struck by a speeding trailer.

According to Rescue 1122, the collision involved a trailer and a motorcycle carrying three members of the Naich community. The impact was so severe that both riders, identified as Ali Nawaz Naich and Mohammad Nawaz Naich, died instantly. A third passenger, whose identity remains unknown, suffered serious injuries and was quickly transported to the hospital for emergency treatment.

The deceased were former employees of the Water and Power Development

Authority (WAPDA) and were well-regarded in their community for their years of service. Their sudden passing has left the local community in deep shock and mourning.

A team from Guddu Police Station arrived at the scene shortly after the accident, cordoning off the area and managing traffic flow. The bodies were taken to Civil Hospital Kashmir for postmortem examination, while the injured individual was admitted to the emergency ward for urgent care.

The driver of the trailer fled the scene after the incident. Police have filed a case against the unidentified driver and initiated a manhunt for their apprehension. The incident has raised concerns about the rising num-

ber of road accidents in the area, prompting calls for stricter enforcement of traffic laws and improved road safety measures.

Local residents expressed their sorrow over the tragedy and urged authorities to take immediate action to prevent similar incidents. "This road is notorious for accidents due to reckless driving and insufficient safety measures. We have voiced our concerns for years, but little has changed," lamented a witness to the aftermath of the crash. Kashmiri police are continuing their investigation into the accident, reviewing CCTV footage from nearby locations and interviewing witnesses to establish the exact cause of the collision.—RT

Pakistani-origin boxer Hamzah Sheeraz bags Middleweight European title



Pakistani-origin British boxer Hamzah Sheeraz has clinched the Middleweight European Boxing title by defeating British boxer Tyler Denny.

On September 21, at London's Wembley Stadium, Sheeraz completely dominated Denny. The undefeated middleweight sent his British opponent to the canvas twice before overcoming him via technical knockout.

The right cross and left hook combination early in the first round resulted in the first knockdown. Sheeraz downed outpaw Denny once more in the second round with a powerful left hook. Referee Mark Bates declared the bout over and waved it off, despite the fact that the latter was able to stand again.

The Pakistani-origin boxer, a resident of London now, has remained undefeated raising the tally of his victories to 21-0 with this one.

In addition to winning Denny's European title, the 25-year-old also won the Commonwealth and WBC 'Silver' titles.

33-year-old Denny, on the other hand, dropped to 19-3-3 and lost the strap. The defeat broke the English athlete's six-fight winning streak.—Agency

All-round Ashwin powers India to 280-run Test win over Bangladesh

CHENNAI: Ravichandran Ashwin claimed six wickets after a first-innings century with the bat to inspire India to a 280-run thrashing of Bangladesh in the first Test here on Sunday.

The Bangladesh team arrived in India in a confident mood following a historic victory in Pakistan but they were no match for the hosts for whom Rishabh Pant celebrated a triumphant return from a serious car crash.

The visitors were bowled out for 234 in the first session of an overcast day four while chasing a victory target of 515.

Skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto top-scored with 82 after he and overnight partner Shakib Al Hasan rested in a 48-run partnership.

The hosts took an emphatic 1-0 lead in the two-match series as they look to extend their advantage at the top of the World Test Championship rankings.

"It was a great result looking at what lies ahead," skipper Rohit Sharma said after India made an ominous start to a fresh Test season of 10 matches.

Hometown hero Ashwin struck first to end a stubborn overnight stand by getting Shakib caught at short-leg for 25.

Ravichandran Ashwin, who took three wickets on day three, then dismissed Mehdi Hasan Miraz for eight to bag his 37th five-



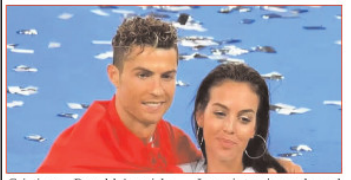
wicket haul, equalling the late Shane Warne. Muttiah Muralitharan remains well out in front with 67.

The feat added to Ashwin's heroics after his 113 guided the hosts to 376 in the first innings.

Meanwhile, left-arm spinner Ravindra Jadeja removed Litton Das for one after the wicketkeeper-batsman edged the ball to Rohit at first slip. Jadeja also ended Najmul's valiant stand and took three wickets for the innings.

For the unversed, Ravichandran Ashwin and Jadeja had played a key batting role in the first innings when their 199-run seventh-wicket stand lifted India from a precarious 144-6 to a challenging total on the first day.—Agency

Max Verstappen protests against FIA's 'ridiculous' punishment after Singapore GP qualifying

Max Verstappen criticized the FIA's decision to penalize him for swearing during a press conference in Singapore, calling it "ridiculous" after he was ordered to complete public interest work for using an expletive when discussing his Red Bull car's performance.

Verstappen, who qualified second for the Singapore Grand Prix, responded by giving brief answers in Saturday's official press conference and later explained his actions while speaking to journalists in the paddock. "I find it ridiculous what happened, so why should I then give full answers?" he told Sky Sports F1.

Verstappen clarified his frustration was with the FIA's rules, not the stewards. "They are very understanding but it's in the rules, and they have to apply something. For me, it's not the right way to go forward in our sport."

Lewis Hamilton, who qualified third, supported Verstappen, stating, "I think it's a bit of a joke, to be honest. I certainly wouldn't be doing it, and



"I hope Max doesn't do it." Lando Norris, a close friend of Verstappen, also expressed his disagreement, calling the penalty "pretty unfair."

Vinicius Jr came off the bench to score once and set up another goal to steer champions Real Madrid to a 4-1 fightback victory over Espanyol in LaLiga.

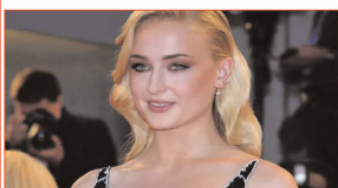

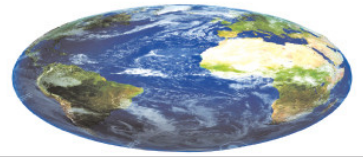

Floods, landslides hit central Japan months after major quake



WAJIMA: Floods and landslides left one dead and at least six missing in central Japan, with rescue and recovery teams at work on Sunday in a remote peninsula already devastated by a major earthquake earlier this year.

"Unprecedented" heavy rains that lashed the area from Saturday began to subside, leaving muddy scenes of destruction as the national weather agency urged residents to stay vigilant for loose ground and other dangers.

In the city of Wajima, piles of splintered branches and a huge uprooted tree amassed at a bridge over a river whose raging brown waters almost reached ground level.

People were seen wading into the mud to try to dig out half-buried cars, while elsewhere flood waters inundated emergency housing built for those who had lost their homes in the New Year's Day earthquake that

killed at least 318 people. Eight temporary housing complexes were affected in Wajima and Suzu, two of the cities on the Noto Peninsula hardest hit by the magnitude-7.5 quake, which toppled buildings, triggered tsunami waves and sparked a major fire.

More than 540 millimetres (21 inches) of rainfall in the past 72 hours to Sunday morning was recorded in Wajima — the heaviest continuous rain since comparative data became available in 1976.

Landslides blocked roads, complicating rescue efforts, and tens of thousands of people in the wider region have been urged to evacuate.

Muddy rivers ran high in Anamizu, south of Wajima, where more rain fell on Sunday morning onto quake-damaged houses and the shattered stone columns of a shrine still lying on the ground months after they were toppled. — Agency

North Korea Executes 2 Women Who Helped People Escape To South Korea



North Korea's recent actions have sparked international concern after two women, Ri and Kang, were executed on August 31 following a public trial in Chongjin, North Korea.

According to Jang Se-yul, head of the Seoul-based human rights organization Gyooreol Unification Solidarity, the women were charged with assisting other North Koreans in China to escape to South Korea. Radio Free Asia reported.

Ri, 39, and Kang, 43, were among approximately 500 North Koreans forcibly repatriated by China in October 2023. Nine other women received life sentences, highlighting the extreme measures taken by the North Korean government to deter defection.

According to Radio Free Asia, a resident of Chongjin reported that two women were subjected to a public trial in a marketplace, attended by hundreds of residents and merchants. The trial, which lasted only an hour, commenced at 11 am and concluded with the execution of the two women by officials from Hamgyong province on the same day.

Notably, these executions are part of a larger pattern of North Korea's treatment of its citizens who attempt to defect or assist others in defecting. The country has a history of severe punishment for those caught trying to escape or helping others to do so.

Women comprise the majority of North Korean escapees seeking refuge in China. Upon crossing the border, many fall prey to Chinese handlers who exploit their desperation, selling them into servitude. These women are frequently forced into prostitution or coerced into becoming the unofficial wives of Chinese men. — Agency

US School Shooter's Mother Charged With Taping His Grandmother To Chair

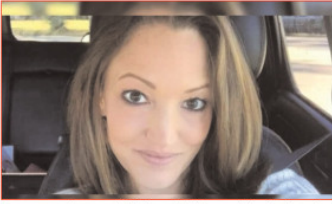


Georgia: The mother of Georgia school shooter Colt Gray, who allegedly killed four people at Apalachee High School last month, is now facing disturbing charges of her own. Marcee Gray, 43, has been accused of taping her elderly mother, Deborah Polhamus, to a chair for nearly 24 hours and damaging her home during an incident in November. The Atlanta-Journal Constitution reported.

Indicted this week in Ben Hill County, Marcee Gray is charged with exploitation and intimidation of an elderly person, false imprisonment and criminal damage to property. She faces several felony charges and could receive up to 20 years in prison for the top charge of elder exploitation.

Authorities revealed that the incident began when Gray, in a fit of anger, demanded her mother accompany her to confront her ex-husband, Colin Gray. When Ms Polhamus refused, Gray allegedly taped her to a chair, stole her phone and damaged several parts of the house, including a bathroom mirror and a door.

The situation escalated further when, according to the police report, Gray threatened her mother saying she had to go with her because



she was going to "kill her ex." When Ms Polhamus resisted, Gray pushed her against a wall, injuring her wrist.

Deborah Polhamus was discovered the following day by a family friend after her daughter, Annie Brown, who lives out of state, became concerned when her mother stopped answering her phone. "Deborah explained that she agreed that Marcee needed to be punished for what she [had] done, but she wanted Marcee to get help for her drug addiction," the police report stated.

This shocking incident coincides with the murder charges faced by Marcee Gray's teenage son, Colt Gray, who is accused of killing two students and two teachers at his school last month. Colt's father, Colin Gray, has also been charged with murder, accused of providing his son with the AR-15 rifle used in the shooting.

Neither father nor son has entered a plea as of their September court appearances.

Colt Gray had sent an apologetic text to his mother the morning of the shooting, and she had reportedly called the school 30 minutes before the gunfire, attempting to warn them about her son's intentions. After the tragedy, she released a public statement insisting that her son "is not a monster," despite the horrific nature of his actions.

Marcee Gray's legal troubles have been long-standing, with a criminal record that spans nearly two decades. A former neighbour claimed she would sometimes lock Colt and his sister out of the house at night. However, Marcee's father, Charles Polhamus, defended his daughter, disputing any claims of child abuse, stating that she only tried to help Colt. — Agency

Sri Lanka's Dissanayake wins presidential election

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka elected Marxist-leaning Anura Kumara Dissanayake as its new president on Sunday, putting faith in the 55-year-old's pledge to fight corruption and bolster a fragile economic recovery following its worst financial crisis in decades.



Dissanayake, who does not possess political lineage like some of his rivals in the presidential election, led from start to finish during the counting of ballots, knocking out incumbent President Ranil Wickremesinghe and opposition leader Sajith Premadasa to become Sri Lanka's 10th president.

Sri Lanka's president-elect on Sunday invited his compatriots to help him "rewrite" history in the cash-strapped island nation after winning a vote coloured by discontent over an unprecedented financial crisis.

Dissanayake, the once-fringe leader, whose party won less than 4% of the vote in parliamentary elections four years ago, saw a surge of support as the economic meltdown forced widespread hardships upon Sri Lankans.

"The dream we have nurtured for centuries is finally coming true," he said in a statement shortly after the announcement.

"This victory belongs to all of us," he added. "Millions of eyes filled with hope and expectation push us forward, and together, we stand ready to rewrite Sri Lanka's history."

Outgoing President Wickremesinghe — who took office at the peak of the 2022 economic collapse and imposed tough austerity policies per the terms of an IMF bailout — was a distant third in the contest with 17% of the vote.

"History will judge my efforts, but I can confidently say that I did my best to stabilise the country during one of its darkest periods," he said in a statement.

He congratulated Dissanayaka on the win and said he was "confident" the politician would "steer Sri Lanka on a path of continued growth and stability."

Dissanayaka will be sworn in on Monday morning at the colonial-era Presidential Secretariat in Colombo, election commission officials said.

Dissanayake polled 5.6 million or 42.3% of the votes. Premadasa was second at 32.8% after the first round of counting of ballots on Sunday.

It was the first time in Sri Lanka's history that the presidential race was decided by a second round of counting after the top two candidates failed to win the mandatory 50% of votes to be declared winner. — Agency



North Korea's recent actions have sparked international concern after two women, Ri and Kang, were executed on August 31 following a public trial in Chongjin, North Korea.

According to Jang Se-yul, head of the Seoul-based human rights organization Gyooreol Unification Solidarity, the women were charged with assisting other North Koreans in China to escape to South Korea. Radio Free Asia reported.

Ri, 39, and Kang, 43, were among approximately 500 North Koreans forcibly repatriated by China in October 2023. Nine other women received life sentences, highlighting the extreme measures taken by the North Korean government to deter defection.

According to Radio Free Asia, a resident of Chongjin reported that two women were subjected to a public trial in a marketplace, attended by hundreds of residents and merchants. The trial, which lasted only an hour, commenced at 11 am and concluded with the execution of the two women by officials from Hamgyong province on the same day.

Notably, these executions are part of a larger pattern of North Korea's treatment of its citizens who attempt to defect or assist others in defecting. The country has a history of severe punishment for those caught trying to escape or helping others to do so.

Women comprise the majority of North Korean escapees seeking refuge in China. Upon crossing the border, many fall prey to Chinese handlers who exploit their desperation, selling them into servitude. These women are frequently forced into prostitution or coerced into becoming the unofficial wives of Chinese men. — Agency

At least four die, 18 wounded in Alabama mass shooting

At least four people were killed and 18 others sustained injuries in a mass shooting in Birmingham, Alabama, CNN reported.



Speaking on the incident that occurred on Saturday evening (local time), Birmingham Police Officer Truman Fitzgerald said that multiple shooters fired several shots targeting a group of people in the Five Points South area.

Two men and a woman were found "unresponsive" by police officers at the incident site only to be later pronounced dead on the scene, Fitzgerald added.

Noting that no one has been arrested for the fatal incident so far, the police officer said that the victims, which also included a fourth person who died in a local hospital, were out in the open when they were targeted.

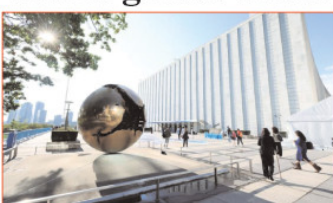
Meanwhile, more gunshot victims were identified in the area and were shifted to local hospitals.

"We have dozens of gunshot victims from this area [...] I'm told at least

four of those gunshot victims are [facing] life-threatening [injuries], the others have various injuries," Fitzgerald said.

University of Alabama at Birmingham Hospital spokesperson Hannah Echols told the outlet that the facility was treating at least 11 people wounded in the incident.

UN holds 'Summit of the Future' to tackle global crises



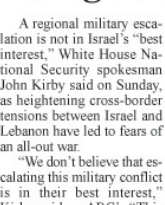
Global leaders are gathering in New York on Sunday for a "Summit of the Future" aimed at addressing 21st-century challenges ranging from conflict to climate, amid scepticism over whether the final pact will meet its lofty goals.

United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres first proposed the meeting in 2021, billing it as a "once-in-a-generation opportunity" to reshape human history by rekindling international cooperation.

As an opening act for the annual high-level week of the UN General Assembly, which begins Tuesday, dozens of heads of state and government are expected to adopt a "Pact for the Future" on Sunday.

But after intense last-minute negotiations, Guterres expressed some frustration, urging nations to show "vision" and "courage," and calling for "maximum ambition" to strengthen international institutions that struggle to respond effectively to today's threats. — Agency

US warns regional escalation not in Israel's interest amid rising tensions with Lebanon



A regional military escalation is not in Israel's "best interest," White House National Security spokesman John Kirby said on Sunday, as heightening cross-border tensions between Israel and Lebanon have led to fears of an all-out war.

"We don't believe that escalating this military conflict is in their best interest," Kirby said on ABC's "This Week," adding that the United States was "saying this directly to our Israeli counterparts."

Israel and the Iran-backed Lebanese group Hezbollah have engaged in rapidly escalating cross-border exchanges, including intense rocket fire overnight at northern Israel that sent hundreds of thousands of people to bomb shelters, according to the military there.

Netanyahu says Israel has "landed a series of blows on Hezbollah."

"The tensions are much higher now than they were even just a few days ago," Kirby said.

But he added that "we still believe that there can be time and space for a diplomatic solution here and that's what we're working on."



Hammas launched an unprecedented raid on Israel that precipitated its war in Gaza.

"We've been working since the beginning of this conflict, October 8th and on, to try to prevent an escalation, to prevent a broadening of this conflict there and in around Israel, but also in the region," Kirby said.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu earlier in the day vowed to return residents of northern Israel displaced by nearly a year of fighting near their homes.

An escalating war is "certainly not going to be in the best interest of all those people that Prime Minister Netanyahu says he wants to be able to send back home," Kirby said. — Agency

Hafiz Naeem Criticizes Country's Education System, Calls For Accessibility And Depoliticization

KARACHI: Hafiz Naeemur Rehman, leader of Jamaat-e-Islami (JI), condemned the government's policies, asserting that it has failed to provide citizens with essential services like health and education.

Speaking as a guest of honor at a two-day convention organized by the Pakistan Medical Association at the Expo Centre in Karachi on Sunday, Rehman emphasized the need to inspire hope and awareness among the younger generation. He cited the resilience of the Palestinian people, highlighting their steadfastness in pursuing rights while remaining content with God's will. He encouraged youth to remain hopeful and draw inspiration from such examples.

Rehman offered a sharp critique of the education system, stating that education in Pakistan has become a lucrative business, pushing higher



education out of reach for the middle class. He urged the government to make education more accessible and remove it from commercial interests.

He also expressed concerns about the underdevelopment of Balochistan and the insufficient healthcare facilities available. He pointed out that high tuition fees in medical colleges are preventing middle-class families from obtaining education.

"It is our collective responsibility to guide the younger generation away from drugs and social issues towards education and training," he asserted. He noted a troubling decline in the number of doctors in Pakistan, as many qualified professionals seek better opportunities abroad. The convention at the Expo Centre attracted significant participation from doctors nationwide, featuring five main sessions and 16 scientific discussions.—RT/Agency

Bangladesh Seeks Enhanced Trade Relations With Pakistan: "Two Countries, One Nation"

KARACHI: His Excellency Muhammad Rukh Alam Siddique, High Commissioner of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, addressed an event hosted by the Karachi Council of Foreign Relations (KCFR) at a local hotel, emphasizing the Bangladesh government's commitment to strengthening bilateral trade and fostering people-to-people relations with Pakistan.

Highlighting the historical ties between the two nations, Siddique noted that Bangladesh, as a former part of Pakistan, shares a profound connection with Pakistani culture. He pointed out that both countries face similar challenges that could be more effectively addressed through collaborative efforts.

To facilitate trade, Siddique expressed optimism about working toward a no visa, no tariff policy, which would encourage direct trade between the two countries in-

stead of routing through Dubai. He believes this initiative will also promote travel and cultural exchange between citizens.

Siddique underscored the importance of sports as a platform for engagement, recalling that the Bangladesh cricket team was the first to visit Pakistan during its time of international isolation. The High Commissioner mentioned that Pakistan is providing assistance to Bangladesh in the defense sector and identified youth, tourism, and sports as mutual areas of interest. He noted that two NGOs from Bangladesh are active in Pakistan's education sector and celebrated the contribu-

tions of Pakistani artists like Runa Laila, Shahnaz Begum, and Shabnum, who hail from what is now Bangladesh.

In his closing remarks, KCFR Patron-in-Chief Ikram Seghal stated that a no visa, no tariff policy would strengthen ties between the two nations, reiterating the sentiment that Pakistan and Bangladesh may be separate countries but are united as one nation. He referenced the historic words of Sher-e-Bengal and Muslim League leader A.K. Fazlul Haq, who urged against dividing Punjab and Bengal in 1946.

KCFR Chairperson Nadra Punjwani opened the event by encouraging both nations to move forward by putting past misunderstandings behind them, emphasizing that increased trade and stronger relationships are the best paths to mutual growth.—RT

Saeed Ghani Calls For Youth Skills Development Programs Across All 25 Towns In Karachi

KARACHI: Sindh Local Government Minister Saeed Ghani has urged all 25 town municipal corporations in Karachi to implement youth skills development programs focused on technical training for students. He made this call during his address at the entry test for the Peoples Youth Skill Development Programme, organized by the Town Municipal Corporation Korangi, where thousands of male and female students participated.

Ghani commended Korangi Town for its efforts in providing cutting-edge IT training to local students. He engaged with candidates at the Korangi Eidgah ground, learning about their



aspirations and encouraging them to pursue modern IT skills to contribute to the advancement of their city, province, and country.

Highlighting the importance of resourcefulness, he praised Korangi Town for leveraging its available resources to enhance the fu-

ture prospects of the younger generation. He was particularly impressed by the strong turnout of female students eager to gain knowledge in computer and IT fields.

The Local Government Minister announced that the Sindh Board of Technical

Education would award certificates to graduates of the program. He also noted that a governing board is being established by Korangi Town to oversee the training initiative and commended the creation of an IT lab dedicated to this purpose.

Korangi Town Chairman Naeem Sheikh shared that the skill development program aims to train around 3,000 students annually. Pakistan Railways Employees Caught Stealing Diesel From Depot

KARACHI: A video has emerged online showing employees of Pakistan Railways stealing diesel from the Karachi Railway depot.

The footage, obtained by media sources, features three individuals, including an engine driver, unlawfully taking diesel from the Karachi Cantt Railway Station depot. Reports indicate that these employees have been engaged in diesel theft for the past three months. They have since been arrested and the case has been filed at the Cantt police station.

In a related development, the railway department has announced plans to operate 10 passenger trains under a public-private partnership (PPP) model. According to Pakistan Railways officials, the first phase of this privatization initiative will begin soon, with 10 trains set to be handed over to private operators. Interested parties have been invited to submit their applications, with technical bids to be opened on the same day.—RT/Agency

JUI's Abdul Ghafoor Haideri Criticizes Government, Demands Immediate Elections



KARACHI: Maulana Abdul Ghafoor Haideri, Secretary General of Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI), asserted that the current government is unable to continue in power and called for immediate, transparent elections.

Speaking to the media in Karachi on Sunday, he emphasized that the government's authority is waning nationwide. Haideri highlighted alarming issues in rural Sindh, where banditry and kidnappings are rampant, and in Balochistan, where national highways are left unprotected.

He criticized the legitimacy of both the 2018 and 2024 elections, claiming they failed to establish stable governments and accused officials of placing power through these processes. Haideri pointed

out that even government representatives have recognized the current administration's ineffectiveness.

He argued that problems in Balochistan cannot be resolved through force and urged for serious attention to the demands in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan. Additionally, he stated that ordinances lack substantial constitutional value and should only be utilized temporarily.

Haideri also accused the government of being overly influenced by the International Monetary Fund (IMF), claiming that misleading statements are being made regarding inflation reduction. He stressed the importance of uniting all stakeholders to address and improve the country's economic situation.—RT/Agency

BMG Sweeps KCCI Elections 2024-26, All 30 Candidates Elected

Bars Criticize SC Practice And Procedure Amendment Ordinance As 'Bad Law'

ISLAMABAD: Days after the incumbent government passed the Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Amendment Ordinance 2024, several lawyer bodies across the country have termed it a "bad law" for being detrimental to the independence of the judiciary and protection of fundamental rights, media reported on Sunday.



Two senior lawyers bodies, namely the Pakistan Bar Council (PBC) and the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), have reacted strongly to the promulgation of the said ordinance which was signed into law by President Asif Ali Zardari following the federal cabinet's approval on Friday.

The ordinance in question provisions sub-clause 1 of the Act's Section 2 according to which the Practice and Procedure Act Committee will fix the cases for hearing. The body will comprise the chief justice, the most senior judge and the judge nominated by the chief justice.

Apart from amendment in Section 3 of the Act, the ordinance also provisions each case to be heard on its

procedure for the formation of a bench under Section 2 of the Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Act 2023.

"This is a bad law and detrimental to the independence of judiciary and protection of fundamental rights for which Article 184(3) of the Constitution is invoked by an aggrieved person," the senior lawyer said, adding that it was a longstanding demand of the PBC and the legal community that a committee of senior judges should be constituted to decide constitution of benches and fixation of cases.

"Now amendment to the said Act through the ordinance is a clear defiance of the long-standing struggle of lawyers," he remarked. Echoing Naek's point of view, SCBA President Muhammad Shahzad Shaukat, along with Secretary Syed Ali Imran also expressed concern over the timing and manner of the promulgation of the ordinance.

Fazl Urges All Institutions To Uphold The Constitution

KARACHI: The Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (F) chief stressed the need for fair elections to bring forward genuine public representatives in Pakistan, media reported on Sunday.



The chief of JUI-F, Maulana Fazlur Rehman, expressed concern over the current state of political representation in Pakistan, stating that people are increasingly aware that their so-called representatives do not truly represent them.

He emphasized the need for fair elections to bring forward genuine public representatives, especially in Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), where he claimed that no current representative can face the people.

Rehman criticized the prioritization of personal political interests over national needs, stating that the country's constitution and parliament needs instead of their own personal political interests. Rehman also highlighted the concerns of Pakistan's friendly countries over its deteriorating economic conditions.—RT/Agency

Embassy Assisting In Repatriating Body Of Pakistani Student From China, Says FO

ISLAMABAD: The Foreign Office (FO) on Sunday said that the Embassy of Pakistan in Beijing was facilitating the process of the repatriation of the dead body of a Pakistani student who passed away in China and was in contact with the university and her family members.



She said that legal procedures and regulations needed to be fulfilled in the repatriation of dead bodies from China.

Furthermore, she said that the transportation through commercial flights involved

special arrangements including embalming of the body and transportation of the remains in a specialised vehicle with cold storage.

The dead body can be sent after the completion of these arrangements.

She said that at the embassy's intervention, the insurance company had agreed to pay compensation to the family and the university had also offered to bear the cost of transportation of the dead body.

In June, before concluding his five-day visit to China, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif announced sending as many as 1,000 students to the brotherly country for advanced training in the agriculture sector.

Last month, South Punjab Additional Chief Secretary Fawad Hashim Rabbani met Chinese Consul General Zhao Shiren to discuss matters of mutual interest, including plans to cultivate red chilli in the region.

To address youth unemployment and poverty, Zhao Shiren proposed sending 200,000 Pakistani students to China for information technology training. He also announced that Huawei experts would provide artificial intelligence and IT training to South Punjab's youth.

President Zardari and Shehbaz Condemn Terrorist Attack On Police Van In Swat

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif strongly condemned the terrorist attack on a police mobile in the Malam Jabba area of Swat district.



In a statement, the prime minister prayed for a higher status in heaven for the police personnel martyred in the attack, and extended his condolences to the bereaved family.

The prime minister also prayed for the speedy recovery of the injured personnel and directed that they be provided with all possible medical assistance.

Shehbaz Sharif said the entire nation salutes the sacrifices of the police force in the fight against terrorism. He said such cowardly acts cannot shake our resolve to completely eradicate terrorism.

Ahsan Iqbal Claims Zionist Lobby Aims To Restore Imran Khan to Power



ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal has alleged that a Zionist lobby is attempting to re-establish Imran Khan as the prime minister of Pakistan.

During a press conference in Islamabad on Sunday, he criticised the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf founder, saying he supports Israel based on an article published in an Israeli newspaper recently.

Iqbal stated that the article suggested that Khan is seen as the only acceptable figure for the Israeli lobby in Pakistan. He maintained that the public has begun to understand who is behind Khan and the PTT's agenda.

He noted that Khan openly opposed a Pakistani-origin candidate in the London mayoral elections and has been perpetuating a politics of hate and division since 2013, which has resulted in significant societal rifts in Pakistan.—RT/Agency

HIOJK Elections: Mushaal Mullick Calls It A 'Shameful Drama'

ISLAMABAD: Senior Kashmiri leader and wife of Chairman Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front Yasin Malik, Mushaal Hussein Mullick on Sunday called the impending elections in the region, a "drama" and a "Shame."



In an interview with PTV News, she stated that these elections represent a facade of normalcy that is both misleading and harmful to the Kashmiri people.

She described the elections as a continuation of a long-standing strategy by India to undermine the legitimate aspirations of the Kashmiri populace. "This is not the first time we have seen such a charade," she noted.

Mullick criticized the Modi government for controversially granting domicile rights to approximately 5 million non-residents, whom she believes will masquerade as locals to partici-

She accused India of employing both old and new actors to maintain a narrative of normalcy in a region still under heavy military occupation. "The concept of normalcy is impossible here, it is all a deception," she declared.

"As the Zionist regime (Israel) and their Western backers, most notably the United States, have not succeeded in their sinister goals against the people of Gaza and Lebanon, they are now seeking to spread the crisis to Iran with a series of actions planned against our country's security," the statement said.
