Six Passengers Killed, Nine Critically Injured In North Waziristan Helicopter Crash

ISLAMABAD: At least six people have been killed after a chartered helicopter carrying 15 passengers crashed in district North Waziristan of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.



The Mi-8 helicopter crash has left at least nine people injured. The chartered helicopter — that belonged to Mari Petroleum Limited, a public limited company — crashed due to technical reasons near an oil field, said the company's spokesperson, stressing that the accident had nothing to do with the security situation.

The deceased persons included three foreign pilots and three others while nine of the travellers got wounded, it added. Providing details of the incident, the spokesperson said that the ill-fated aircraft was providing personal transportation in the Shewa Waziristan block.

The injured persons were transferred to a nearby hospital and relief operations, by the Pakistan Army and others, the statement added. Media learnt from sources that the three foreign pilots are from Russia and that the wounded have been shifted to Combined Military Hospital (CMH) Thal.

The accident, the sources added, occurred after the copter suffered technical difficulty as soon as it took off and met the fatal accident after its tail rotor hit the ground during an emergency landing. Meanwhile, an investigation has been initiated by Mari Petroleum and relevant authorities into the unfortunate incident.

Helicopter crashes are not uncommon in Pakistan. In September last year, two Pakistan Navy officers and a soldier were martyred after their copter crashed in Balochistan's Gwadar. The Pakistan Navy spokesperson revealed that the mishap happened due to a technical issue during training.

"As a result of the crash, two officers and one sailor of the Pakistan Navy embraced martyrdom," the spokesperson said, adding that the Pakistan Navy had initiated an investigation into the incident.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Denounces Social Media Campaign Against Military Leadership

LONDON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that those involved in attacking Pakistan Army last year on May 9 cannot be forgiven as they have committed crimes against the nation and their crimes are unpardonable.



The prime minister was speaking to Pakistani media in London after participating in the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) session. He arrived in London on Saturday night and will be departing to Pakistan on Monday.

He said the vulgar and abusive campaign was a manifestation of digital terrorism and reflected on how the PTI was going out of all limits to harm Pakistan.

He thanked the Saudi, Kuwaiti, UAE and Chinese leadership for helping Pakistan in stabilising its economy. The PM mentioned that the Saudi king is playing a leadership role on the issue of Palestine.

He said "Filthy language is being used on social media against the Pakistan Armed Forces. We will not tolerate this."

He said the previous government left no stone unturned in destroying relations with China. He said: "I was accused of taking a 45% commission in a deal with China. After two years of investigation, the UK National Crime Agency gave me a clean chit."

He said "Without the help of brotherly countries — Saudi Arabia, the UAE and

China — the IMF programme wouldn't have been possible. Chief of Army Staff General Asim Munir made personal efforts for economic development and he played a big role in the revival of IMF plan. Khawaja Asif Reaffirms Pakistan's Commitment To Expanding Trade With Afghanistan

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif says Pakistan remains committed to expanding trade, commerce and investment in Afghanistan.



He addressed the third meeting of the Quadrilateral Group on Afghanistan in New York. Pakistan, China, Iran and Russia are the member of Quadrilateral Group on Afghanistan.

The Defence Minister said we must continue to support the provision of humanitarian assistance to the 23.7 million destitute people in Afghanistan. He expressed hope that the UN Secretary-General's appeal for over three billion dollars in humanitarian assistance will be fully funded, especially by the Western donor countries. Khawaja Asif said the early release of Afghanistan's frozen national resources, the revival of the banking system and connectivity projects is essential.

He said at the same time, we should continue to work jointly to promote peace and security within Afghanistan and to neutralize the threats to the regional countries emanating from Afghanistan.—RT/Agency

Hezbollah Confirms Hassan Nasrallah Martyred In Israeli Airstrike

BEIRUT: Lebanon's Hezbollah confirmed on Saturday that its leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah was killed and vowed to continue the battle against Israel.



Israel said earlier that it had killed the Hezbollah leader in an airstrike in Beirut's southern suburbs a day earlier, in what would be a devastating blow to the group as it reels from an escalating campaign of Israeli attacks.

Nasrallah's death marks a major blow not only to Hezbollah but also to its alleged backers in Iran. He was a leading figure in the Tehran-backed "Axis of Resistance", helping to project Iranian influence across the Middle East.

Iran, which arms and finances Hezbollah, said a senior member of its Revolutionary Guard Corps was killed in the same strike.

IRNA news agency reported General Abbas Nilforoushan, deputy commander of the Guards' operations, died in the strike that killed Nasrallah.

"Sayed Hassan Nasrallah, Secretary General of Hezbollah, has joined his great, immortal martyr comrades whom he led for about 30 years," Hezbollah said in a statement.

It said he was killed with other group members "following the treacherous Zionist strike on the southern suburbs" of Beirut.

AFP journalists heard a passer-by scream "Oh my God!", and women weeping in the streets after Hezbollah announced the news.

Hezbollah said it would continue its battle against Israel "in support of Gaza and Palestine, and in defence of Lebanon and its steadfast and honourable people".

It did not say how Nasrallah was killed. Hezbollah's Al-Manar TV began airing verses from the Holy Quran after his death was announced.

The Israeli military said in a statement that Nasrallah was eliminated in a "targeted strike" on the group's underground headquarters under a residential building in Dahiyyeh — a Hezbollah-controlled southern suburb of Beirut.

It said he was killed along with another top Hezbollah leader — Ali Karaki — and other commanders.

"The strike was conducted while Hezbollah's senior chain of command were operating from the headquarters and advancing terrorist activities against the citizens of the State of Israel," it claimed.

The Israeli military "eliminated [...] Hassan Nasrallah, leader of the Hezbollah terrorist organisation", Israeli army spokesperson Avichay Adraee wrote in a statement on X.

"Hassan Nasrallah will no longer be able to terrorise the world," the Israeli military said in a post on X on Saturday.

Late on Friday, a source close to Hezbollah told Reuters that Nasrallah was not reachable.

In Tehran, posters of Nasrallah were erected bearing the slogan "Hezbollah is alive".

Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Nasser Kanani posted on X that Nasrallah's "sacred goal will be realised in the liberation of Quds (Jerusalem), God willing".

Earlier, Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei condemned what he called Israel's "short-sighted and stupid policy", without referring to Nasrallah's fate.—RT/Agency

Government Likely To Maintain Petrol Prices For The Next Fortnight



ISLAMABAD: The government is likely to maintain the price of petrol from October 1, 2024, for the next fortnight as it has been worked out slightly upward by Rs0.11 per litre. The News reported on Saturday.

Meanwhile, the price of high-speed diesel (HSD) is estimated to decrease by Rs2.11 per litre starting from October 1, 2024.

The government, however, may make slight adjustments in the next fortnight, beginning from October 16, 2024. Previously, the prices of petrol were decreased by Rs10 per litre owing to a drop in fuel rates in the international market during the past fortnight.

The government also reduced the price of HSD from Rs262.75 to Rs249.69 after a reduction of Rs13.06 per litre. Petrol is mainly used in private transportation, small vehicles, rickshaws, and two-wheelers. Higher fuel prices significantly impact the budgets of those belonging to the middle and lower-middle classes, who primarily use petrol for commuting. On the other hand, a significant portion of the transport sector relies on high-speed diesel. Its price is considered inflationary since it is predominantly used in heavy goods transport vehicles, trucks, buses, trains, and agricultural machinery such as tractors, tube wells, and threshers.

The Oil and Gas regulatory Authority (Ogra) has worked out the consumer prices of petroleum products, based on the price variations in the international market," a statement released by the Finance Division read.

The consumption of high-speed diesel particularly contributes to the increased prices of vegetables and other food items.—RT/Agency

Barrister Gohar And Salman Akram Raja Arrested Amid PTI-Police Clashes In Rawalpindi

ISLAMABAD: Violent clashes broke out between Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) supporters and Punjab Police near Committee Chowk, escalating tensions in the Rawalpindi.



PTI workers forcefully removed police-placed containers on Saturday while chanting slogans and marching towards Liaquat Bagh.

In response, police deployed heavy tear gas shelling to disperse the crowd, leading to confrontations that spread along Murree Road. PTI supporters reportedly threw stones at officers, prompting authorities to call for additional reinforcements.

Amid the unrest, Punjab Police detained PTI Chairman Bairastr Gohar Ali Khan and leader Salman Akram Raja near the H-13 area while they were travelling to Rawalpindi, according to Express News.

Shortly after their detention, Bairastr Gohar was released, whereas Salman Akram Raja remains in custody.

Gohar stated that both he and Raja were stopped at H-13 and instructed to return after a disagreement, preventing them from proceeding to Rawalpindi.

The use of tear gas resulted in canisters falling into nearby homes, causing distress among residents, including women and children. Media personnel covering the protests were also affected by the shelling.

Despite police efforts, workers continued to congregate at Committee Chowk, Murree Chowk, and China Market, forcing some officers to retreat and leading to the arrest of several protesters.

The Rawalpindi administration had earlier sealed

off key locations, blocked entry points, and deployed thousands of police officers throughout the city.

Section 144 has been imposed from September 28 to 29, banning gatherings, political rallies, and the display of weapons.

In preparation for the planned protests at Liaquat Bagh, officials have placed containers to block major routes, conducted raids, and performed door-to-door searches to detain PTI leaders and active supporters.

Educational institutions, government offices, and hotels in affected areas have been closed, and ambulance access to Murree Road and nearby hospitals has been restricted to prevent disruptions.—RT/Agency

Tando Allahyar Police seize weapons

WASA's apathy and negligence result in spread of waterborne diseases in Hyderabad

HYDERABAD: WASA filter plant chlorine leakage issue occurred a few days ago which left 36 people unconscious but this was the result of the negligence of the concerned authorities. The WASA employees said that they had informed the officials but MD didn't heed on it and resultantly the leakage from the cylinder increased and 36 people became victims including 27 school children.
Zahid Khemtio, Managing Director WASA Hyderabad, neither reached the incident location nor visited the victims hospital to inquire the victims health. Chlorine is mixed in water for the purposes of disinfection as chlorine kills or inactivates harmful microorganisms which can cause typhoid, cholera, hepatitis and giardiasis. Unfortunately, chlorine has been providing to water filtration plants but their usage is questionable.
Natural water, such as rainwater, groundwater, and water from bodies such as lakes and rivers, is referred to as raw water. Until it is treated by a potable water treatment process, water is considered raw water. Although raw water is less expensive than treated water, it is dangerous for the health of consumers. Raw water has not been treated and doesn't have any of its minerals, ions particles, or parasites. The residents of Hyderabad has been providing raw water since years from 7 filter water plants.
Two filter plants have been covering population of Qasimabad Tehsil. 3rd Hala Naka Filter Plant covering neighboring population. 4th Hussainabad Filter Plant covering populations of Hussainabad. 5th filter plant Lati-fabad No. 4 covering Lati-fabad populations. 70 to 80. Pretabad filter plant covering populations of Pretabad. 7th filter plant is located in SITE area Hyderabad.
Residents of Hyderabad have been crying, protesting, holding sit-in and demanding for the provision of treated water but WASA authorities didn't care of it. It can be assumed that due to negligence of WASA authority and especially MD Zahid Khemtio, Hyderabad District witnessed several diseases. Due to this, hundreds of children, women and elders who have been victims to several waterborne disease. MD WASA turned the issue and responsibilities towards subordinates by suspending XEN and SDO and trying to keep away himself.
Dr. Kashif Memon, Medical Superintendent Civil Hospital Hyderabad, said that due to chlorine leakage, children were confronting the difficulties of shortness of breathing because the saturation level of affected victims dropped down till 70 to 80. All children were treated at Child Life Foundation, Civil Hospital Hyderabad. Whereas the adults were treated at Emergency Ward. They have been oxygen therapy for 9 hours to maintain saturation level.

Maryam Advocates For Establishment Of 'Punjab Tourism Authority'

LAHORE: Punjab CM Maryam Nawaz has sought proposals regarding the establishment, design and comprehensive plan for the 'Punjab Tourism Authority'.

She has directed the development of policy measures to promote tourism within the province and has established a special 25-member committee for this purpose.



Pakistan Muslim League (N) senior leader Senator Pervaz Rasheed will serve as a special member of the steering committee, while senior provincial minister Maryam Aurangzeb will act as the committee's convener.

Provincial ministers for information, minorities, transport and communication will also be part of the committee.

Members include National Assembly member Afzal Khokhar, senior an-

chorperson Iftikhar Ahmad along with various secretaries from different ministries.

The committee is tasked with preparing proposals within 15 days to present to the CM, with the aim of developing a comprehensive tourism plan for Punjab.

The initiative aims to promote 8 to 10 key tourist destinations in Punjab having religious, cultural, historical and business heritage significance.

The government plans to promote foreign tourism and religious tourism in the region.

A complete restructuring of the existing tourism framework in Punjab will be undertaken under the CM directive. This will include an upgrade of the system as well as a comprehensive overhauling of the archaeological, museums and transport sectors.

The development of a modern technology app and a tourism portal has also been initiated.—RT/Agency

Lahore DC Faces Contempt Charges For Blocking PTI Rally



LAHORE: The Lahore High Court has fixed a hearing against DC Lahore for September 30 to consider contempt proceedings for not allowing a PTI rally, despite court orders, media reported.

As per details, Justice Farooq Haider will hear the petition filed by Akmal Khan, seeking contempt proceedings against the Lahore DC for violating court orders.

The Lahore DC had refused to allow the PTI rally, despite the court's clear orders, leading to the petition for contempt proceedings.

Earlier, Lahore High Court directed the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Lahore to decide on the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) request to hold a rally at Minar-e-Pakistan by September 30.

The PTI is seeking permission to hold a rally at Minar-e-Pakistan on October 5, which is the birthdate of PTI founder Imran Khan.

The court's order comes after the PTI's Punjab Vice President requested the court to hear the case. The LHC has ordered the DC to make a decision on the request by September 30, the court's official lawyer has been directed to inform the DC about the court's order.—RT/Agency

Fake Currency Network Plans To Circulate Counterfeit Notes Nationwide

RANIPUR: The security agencies along with the police in joint operation confiscated a shipment of fake currency notes in Ranipur area of Khairpur, media reported on Saturday.

After confiscating the shipment sent through a courier of fake currency notes of Rs 200,000, the police managed to arrest the owner of medical store. The police spokesperson stated that the courier having fake currency notes of Rs 200,000 - was sent from Peshawar to a medical store in Khairpur.

The spokesperson further added that the packets of fake currency notes were also sent from Peshawar to Haripur and Islamabad on the same day by a group supplying fake currency across the country.

Apart from this, the police and security agencies have started an investigation to nab the gang supplying fake currency notes across the country.—RT/Agency

This is also leading to rising unemployment, putting pressure on the national economy. While we have a large workforce, unfortunately, the available jobs are unable to absorb this workforce. Furthermore, the education sector and healthcare system are facing challenges in meeting the growing population's needs. To resolve this critical issue faced by our country, population control must be implemented. In this regard, all stakeholders must play their full role with determination to improve the practical situation of family planning in Pakistan.

Uzma Bukhari: Punjab Police Know How To Handle Individuals Like Gandapur

LAHORE: Punjab Information Minister Uzma Bukhari has stated that the Punjab police know about the treatment for individuals like Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur.



Addressing a press conference with Khawaja Imran Nazir at the Directorate General Public Relations (DGPR) in Lahore, the Punjab minister said that police will ensure the K-P chief minister is taught a lesson, adding that any attempt to destabilise the province will not be tolerated.

Bukhari said that the concerns raised earlier had now materialised, as Gandapur was reportedly using government resources from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, including ambulances, jammers, and cranes, while entering Punjab.

She questioned whether such preparations were for a public gathering or an attack on the province.

According to Bukhari, Gandapur is bringing armed groups to Rawalpindi, which has been confirmed by the authorities.

Alongside armed police

forces, he is allegedly accompanied by his own private security.

Bukhari said that law and order prevail in Punjab, and the use of force or violence would not be tolerated under the guise of democracy.

She questioned calls from the judiciary to allow political rallies, asking whether rallies should be conducted in this manner.

Bukhari further accused Gandapur and his group of seeking violence and stated that previous political maneuvers involving casualties would not be repeated.

She reiterated that Punjab police are well-equipped to handle individuals like Gandapur and prevent any hostile actions in the province.

Additionally, Bukhari questioned why the youth of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa should be sacrificed while Imran Khan's children enjoy a luxurious life abroad.

She urged mothers in K-P to ensure their children pursue education instead of being used as fuel for violence and terrorism.

In a separate press conference earlier, Bukhari questioned the use of weapons by political parties during rallies.

She criticised the K-P Chief Minister, Ali Amin Gandapur, for carrying an AK-47, stating that a political leader should focus on resolving public issues rather than inciting violence.—RT/Agency

Three Policemen Injured In Bajaur Explosion



BAJAUR: At least three police officials got wounded in a blast on Saturday after their vehicle hit a bomb planted along the roadside in tehsil Khar of Bajaur district.

The deputy superintendent of police (DSP) said other officials, including the station house officer (SHO), escaped unhurt in the blast incident.

A hunt for the suspects had been launched in the Bhat Cheena area, the DSP added.

Police said the wounded were rushed to the hospital for medical treatment.

The attack comes two days after an explosion at a police station on Thursday night claimed the lives of two people, while several others remained injured in Swabi.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa District Police Officer (DPO) Swabi Haroon Rasheed had told reporters that the blast occurred in the police station's warehouse room on the first floor, where huge quantity of explosive material recovered from the terrorists from time to time was stored.

The nation has been reeling under rising violent attacks since the Taliban rulers returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan.

The two most vulnerable provinces saw a sharp rise in deadly attacks last couple of months, according to data from the Pak Institute for Peace Studies (PIPS).

The digital database of security incidents managed by the Islamabad-based think-tank suggested an alarming situation as the number of attacks jumped from 38 in July to 59 in August.

These incidents included 29 attacks in KP, 28 in Balochistan, and two in Punjab. Meanwhile, KP witnessed 25 casualties in the 29 terrorist attacks during August.

To tackle the menace of increasing terrorism in the country, the federal cabinet had approved Operation Azm-e-Istehkam in June this year. The operation is a reinvigorated national counter-terrorism campaign following the Central Apex Committee's recommendations under the National Action Plan to root out terrorism.—RT/Agency

The Tragedy of a Fake Encounter: A Call for Accountability

The recent revelation of a staged encounter by the Mirpurkhas police, which led to the extrajudicial killing of Dr. Shahnawaz Kumbhar, marks a dark chapter in Pakistan's justice system. This incident, fueled by baseless blasphemy accusations, reflects the deeply ingrained culture of impunity within our law enforcement agencies. The inquiry report that surfaced due to relentless public outcry has confirmed that the Mirpurkhas police, in a shocking breach of trust, fabricated an encounter to legitimize their unlawful actions.

Such incidents are not isolated; they point

to a systemic failure where police officers resort to fake encounters to cover up their inadequacies in building proper legal cases.



Rather than protecting the public, they inflict unimaginable pain on innocent lives. This mockery of justice cannot be tolerated in a society that aspires to uphold the rule of law.

The fact that high-ranking officers, including DIG Javed Jaskani and SSP Asad Chaudhry, are implicated in this crime is

alarming. These are the very individuals who are supposed to uphold justice, yet they have turned their back on it. Accountability is non-negotiable. Those responsible for the death of Dr. Shahnawaz must face the full force of the law.

Extrajudicial killings are a gross violation of human rights and serve to erode public trust in the police. It is imperative that the government takes decisive action to dismantle this culture of encounters and ensure that law enforcement officers operate within the boundaries of the law. Only then can we restore faith in our justice system and prevent such tragedies from occurring again.

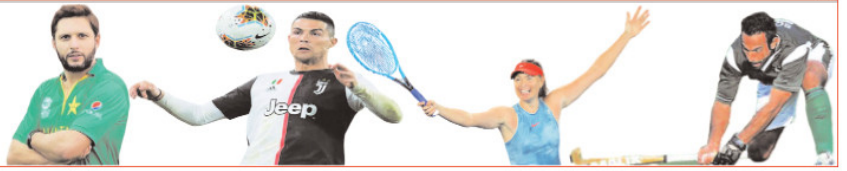

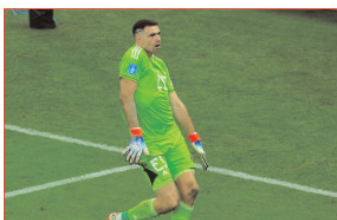
Sri Lanka sniff series victory as New Zealand trail by 315 after follow-on

GALLE: Sri Lanka launched a ruthless spin attack which powered them to move five wickets away from a resounding victory over New Zealand in the second Test. The touring side were 199/5 at the Stumps on Day 3, still trailing by 315 runs after the home side imposed a follow-on, having booked them on a meagre 88 in the first innings. Wicketkeeper batter Tom Blundell was unbeaten on 47 and Glenn Phillips on 32 when bad light forced an early close to an eventful day of action at the Galle International Stadium. The touring side had a shaky start to their second



innings as experienced opener Tom Latham bagged a six-ball duck in the first over. Devon Conway was joined by second-ranked Test batter Kane Williamson and together they raised a fighting 97-run partnership for the second wicket. Dhananjaya de Silva broke the threatening partnership by getting rid of Conway, who scored 61 off 62 balls. Williamson soon followed suit as he fell victim to Nishan Peiris after scoring 46 off 58 deliveries. The touring side slipped further to 121/5 with Daryl Mitchell (1) and Rachin Ravindra (1) perishing cheaply before Blundell and Phillips hung on. Earlier in the day, New Zealand resumed their first innings at 22/2 with skipper Williamson and nightwatchman Ajaz Patel. New Zealand's batting unit struggled against a ruthless Sri Lanka spin attack with their best partnership being 20 runs, added by the last pair of Mitchell Santner, who top-scored with a gritty 29 and William O'Rourke (2). Prabath Jayasuriya was the star with the ball for Sri Lanka, taking six wickets, followed by debutant Peiris, who bagged three. —Agency

Argentina goalkeeper Martinez banned for 'offensive behaviour'



ARGENTINA: Argentina's World Cup-winning goalkeeper Emiliano Martinez has been banned for two matches by FIFA for "offensive behaviour", the Argentine Football Association (AFA) announced on Saturday. The 32-year-old Aston Villa star was also found guilty of "violating principles of fair play" in two separate episodes. Martinez was found to have violated FIFA's code of conduct when holding a replica of the Copa America trophy to his groin after the World Cup qualifier win over Chile on September 5. It is not the first time Emiliano Martinez has performed such an action having also done it with the Golden Glove trophy for best goalkeeper after Argentina beat France on penalties in the 2022 World Cup final. FIFA also sanctioned him for hitting a TV cameraman's camera with his gloves after their 2-1 defeat by Colombia on September 10. The AFA expressed their dissatisfaction with the FIFA ruling. "It should be noted that the Argentine Football Association expresses its absolute disagreement with the decision taken by the FIFA disciplinary committee," they said in a statement. As a result of the decision Emiliano Martinez - also a key member of the Argentina side that won the Copa America in July, as well as the 2021 edition - will miss the World Cup qualifiers against Venezuela on October 10 and Bolivia on October 15. Argentina are top of the South American qualifying table with 18 points after eight matches. Colombia are just two points behind. —Agency

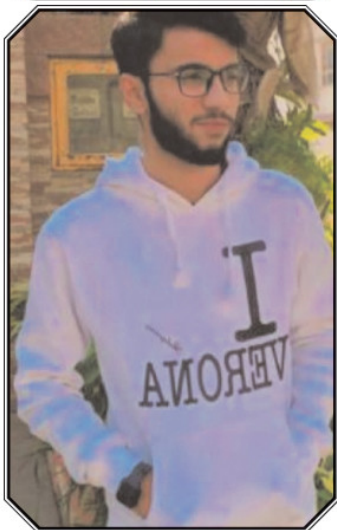

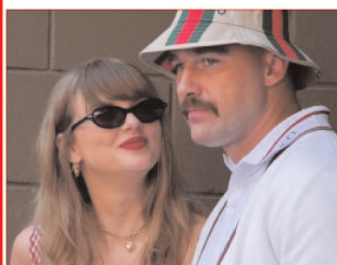

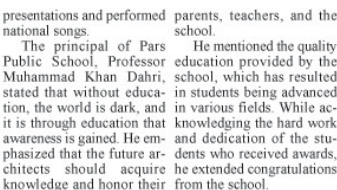

Sindh Govt To Revise Laws For Introducing Multiple Power Utilities

KARACHI: Sindh Energy Minister Nasir Hussain Shah announced that the provincial government is actively reviewing legislation to introduce multiple power utilities for the production and supply of electricity, alongside the local grid system. This move aims to foster competition, which could lead to improved services and lower costs for consumers.



Nasir Hussain Shah emphasized that coal is the cheapest source of electricity for the national grid. He assured that relief would be provided to consumers using up to 300 units, as promised in the party's manifesto.

Additionally, the provincial energy minister announced that the Sindh government is introducing hybrid solar parks and is revising laws to establish a competitor to K-Electric. The government is also developing its own transmission and distribution system, which is expected to enhance Karachi Electric's performance through increased competition.

Shah highlighted that Independent Power Producers (IPPs) have signed Memorandums of Under-

standing (MoUs) not only in Pakistan but also in Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. He noted that India improved its agreements after four to five years, while Pakistan's agreements remain based on outdated terms.

Sindh government spokesperson Saadia Javed also spoke, noting that Bilawal Bhutto is fulfilling his promise under the People's Economic Agreement by providing free solar home systems to 2.6 million households. Despite limited resources and the lack of federal support, the project is moving forward. This year alone, 500,000 off-grid households will receive free solar systems as part of this initiative.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz and President Biden Reaffirm Commitment To Enhance Cooperation In Key Areas

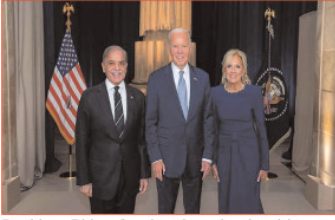
NEW YORK: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif attended a reception hosted by United States President Joe Biden in honour of the heads of government participating in the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) session.

President Biden and PM Shehbaz met during the reception. Both the leaders expressed good wishes for each other.

The heads of state of other countries also attended the dinner. Taking to X, the premier said: "My brief meeting with US President Joe Biden @POTUS and First Lady Jill Biden during the President's reception in New York was most warm and cordial."

"We reaffirmed our common desire to enhance cooperation in key areas including trade, investment, technology, & climate action," he added.

This is Premier Shehbaz's second meeting with President Biden as the previous one was also held at a reception hosted by



President Biden for the world leaders participating in the 77th session of the UNGA in 2022.

During the previous meeting, the premier lauded the flood relief efforts by the US and the continuous COVID-19 vaccine assistance and collaboration between the two countries.

Prior to attending the event, PM Shehbaz had addressed the plenary meeting for the UN General Debate at the 79th session of the United Nations Assembly (UNGA) in New York.

In his 21-minute address, he touched on multi-

ple regional and international issues including Palestine and Kashmir disputes, Ukraine war, climate change, rising poverty and debt burden particularly induced by climate change impacts.

Criticising India's policy of brutal coercion and oppression in India Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJ), he said such actions have ensured, that Burhan Wani's legacy continues to inspire the struggle and sacrifices of millions of Kashmiris.

For durable peace, the premier called on India to reverse the unilateral and illegal measures, it has

taken since 5 August 2019, and enter into a dialogue "for a peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, in accordance with the UN Security Council resolutions, and the wishes of the Kashmiri people".

PM Shehbaz also demanded an immediate end to the ongoing Israeli atrocities in Gaza, terming it "systematic slaughter" and "bloodshed".

The prime minister asked the United Nations to work for a durable peace, through the Two-State solution.

The premier said that Islamophobia was manifested, by frequent denigrations of the Holy Quran, attacks on mosques, negative stereotyping of Muslims and acts of discrimination and violence against them.

Pakistan and the OIC would work with the UN Secretary-General and his Special Envoy to implement a plan of action to combat this scourge, he assured.

PM Shehbaz also spoke to the tragic conflict in Ukraine, and its peaceful resolution, besides reaffirming Pakistan's resolve to continue to cooperate with Africa to counter terrorism and resolve regional conflicts, including through its role in UN peacekeeping and peacebuilding in the region.

During his US trip, PM Shehbaz held meetings with several world leaders, including UN Secretary-General António Guterres on the UNGA sidelines.

The premier had also engaged in talks with UK Premier Keir Starmer, European Commission President Ursula Von Der Leyen, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF) founder and co-chair Bill Gates, and others. He had also addressed a high-level open debate of the Security Council on "Leadership for Peace" on the sidelines of the 79th UNGA session.—RT/Agency

Gandapur Returns To Peshawar As PTI Calls Off Rawalpindi Protest Following Police Clashes

RAWALPINDI: Firebrand Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur has headed back to Peshawar as Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) protest at Rawalpindi "called off" after violent clashes with police near Liaquat Bagh.

The Gandapur-led convoy was stuck at the interchange hours due to closure of roads as the authorities have placed containers at Burhan Interchange in an attempt to thwart PTI's protest.

Addressing the participants, the KP chief executive directed them to return back to Peshawar and castigated the government for not granting PTI its "constitutional right".

He regretted that the police fired tear gas and rubber bullets at the protesters, vowing that they will come back with "all resources".

"They [police] have set a precedent of firing bullets [...] We also have guns," he warned.

The firebrand politician noted that the allocated deadline for holding protest in Rawalpindi has ended.

However, Gandapur's announcement drew strong opposition from the protesters as they refused to return back. The PTI workers chanted slogans against the KP chief minister and party leadership and surrounded their vehicles.



Earlier, clashes broke out between the PTI workers and police near Rawalpindi's Liaquat Bagh ahead of its planned protest as the garrison city was put on high alert.

The Punjab government has imposed Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) in Rawalpindi Division for two days, banning all political gatherings, sit-ins, rallies, protests and similar activities.

PTI had initially planned to hold a public rally at Liaquat Bagh, but shifted the event to a demonstration following directives from PTI founder Imran Khan.

It also withdrawn its application seeking a no-objective certificate (NOC) to hold a rally from the Lahore High Court Rawalpindi bench.

PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan and Salman Akram Raja were also detained in their way to Rawalpindi near Sector H-13 only to be released shortly.

In a statement issued earlier, the PTI said Gohar and Salman were travelling to Rawalpindi when the police stopped their vehicle near Sector H-13 and took them into custody.—RT/Agency

Pakistan-India Water Dispute: Third Meeting Held With Neutral Expert In Vienna

ISLAMABAD: The third meeting on proceedings related to the Rattle and Kishenganga hydroelectric plants discussed the competence of the neutral expert. The News reported on Saturday.

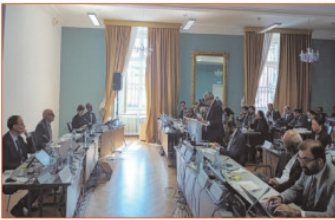
The meeting was part of the Vienna proceedings involving Pakistan and India — initiated by the latter.

As per the press release issued by the Permanent Court of Arbitration, Michel Lino, a neutral expert appointed under the Indus Waters Treaty 1960, held the third meeting after written submissions were made by teams of the neighbouring countries on the matter earlier in 2024.

"The third meeting concerned the competence of the neutral expert under paragraph 7 of annexure F to the Treaty," the press release said. Each party made opening and rebuttal submissions on this occasion.

It said the neutral expert would proceed accordingly to prepare his decision on competence under paragraph 7 of annexure F of Indus Waters Treaty.

Pakistan's submissions were made by its designated representative Ahmad Irfan Aslam, counsel Sir Daniel Bethlehem



KC, Professor Philippa Webb and Dr Cameron Miles. India's submissions were made by its designated representative and secretary, Department of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, Ms Debashree Mukherjee, and its counsel, Harish Salve KC.

Pakistan was also represented by Secretary Ministry of Water Resources Syed Ali Murtaza, Indus Waters Commissioner Syed Muhammad Mehar Ali Shah, Director General South Asia of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Ilyas Mehmood Nizami, legal advisor of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Assad Khan Burki, officials from the Embassy of Pakistan in Vienna Adeel Ahmed Khan and Hassan Abbas and Ms Laura Rees-Evans and counsel Abdullah Tariq.

The parties' submissions on the neutral expert's competence under paragraph 7 of annexure F to the Treaty are now completed.

India was also represented in the meeting by Kushvinder Vohra, ex-officio secretary and chairman, Central Water Commission (CWC); Ms Uma Shekhar, additional secretary, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA); JP Singh, joint secretary, MEA; Darpan Talwar, its Indus Waters Commissioner; Vivek Tripathi, chief engineer, CWC; Sharvan Kumar, chief engineer (Hydro-Power Planning & Investigation), Central Electricity Authority, Ministry of Power (MoP); Ms Chitrangna Singh, director, MEA; Naveen Kumar, senior joint commissioner for Indus Waters; Narendra Singh Shekharawat and Samarth Agarwal, director of the CWC; Dr Kumar

Abhijeet, legal officer, MEA; Vishal Kumar Saini, executive director and Shrish Dubey, general manager of NHPC Ltd., MoP; Ms Nidhi Dhiman, first secretary of the Embassy of India in Vienna; Ms Chetna Rai and Anandh Venkataramani, counsel, and Prof GR Basson and Dr Kim Wium Olesen, technical experts.

On October 13, 2022, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (World Bank), pursuant to Article IX and Annexure F of the Indus Waters Treaty 1960, and after consultation with each of the parties, appointed Lino as a neutral expert in proceedings commenced by India against the Pakistan concerning the KHEP and the RHEP.

The neutral expert convened a first meeting with the parties on February 27-28 in 2023 at the headquarters of the Permanent Court of Arbitration at the Peace Palace, in The Hague.

Following the first meeting, the neutral expert's terms of retainer were fixed on May 2, 2023. The terms of retainer also recorded the appointment of Luc Deroo as the neutral expert's technical assistant. On

June 1, 2023, the neutral expert issued supplemental rules of procedure, including a work programme, which was subsequently revised on Aug 21, Oct 11 and Nov 2, 2023, and most recently on May 29 and June 4, 2024.

On June 5, 2023, the PCA was appointed as registry and secretariat by the neutral expert. The proceedings are administered by the Vienna Office of the PCA, in cooperation with its Mauritius Office. On August 31, 2023, India submitted its memorial.

A second meeting with the parties was held on September 20-21 in 2023 at the Imperial Hofburg Palace in Vienna. Matters discussed at that meeting included the organisation of the first site visit, questions arising from India's memorial, and amendments to the work programme for the proceedings.

Following the second meeting, Pakistan submitted its statement under paragraph 7 of annexure F to the Treaty on Feb 1, 2024 and India submitted its paragraph 7 statement and response to Pakistan's paragraph 7 statement on June 14, 2024.—RT/Agency

Moreover, the COAS assured the traders of the city that their challenges and concerns would be addressed on priority.—RT/Agency



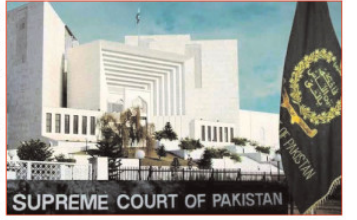
Supreme Court To Announce Election Tribunals Case Judgment On September 30

Pakistan Rejects India's Allegations At UN Forum As Baseless And Misleading

NEW YORK: Responding to India at the debate titled "Leadership for Peace" and held under the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the UN termed New Delhi's allegations against Pakistan baseless and misleading.

"India continues to paddle a false narrative on this forum, relying on tactics of denial, distortion and deflection," Pakistan Counsellor Gul Qaiser Sarwani stated.

India continued to sponsor terror activities not against just Pakistan but also in other countries, he said, adding that for decades, India had been the primary perpetrator, supporter and financier of terrorism.

Referring to Indian intelligence agency, Research and Analysis Wing (RAW), as a terrorist franchise, he said it had gone global with assassinations and attempted murders of political dissidents on North American soil.

Earlier this month, General Counsel of pro-



Khalistan group Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, through his attorneys, had filed a civil lawsuit in the US Federal District Court against the Government of India and senior RAW officials for their "unprecedented attempt to assassinate a US citizen on US soil".

Legal action has been initiated at United States District Court, New York, by Pannun and his lawyers against the Indian government and senior officials of Indian intelligence agency — namely, Ajit Doval, Samant Goel, Vikram Yadav and Nikhil Gupta.

The complaint alleged

that senior officials at India's spy agency RAW, which report directly to India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi, engaged weapons trafficker and RAW agent Nikhil Gupta to hire assassins in the US to murder Pannun in New York. This scheme was foiled when the hitmen Gupta hired turned out to be undercover federal agents.

The Pakistan counsellor said India's sponsorship of terrorist organisations, such as Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) had led to the loss of thousands of innocent Pakistani lives.

Sarwani said Pakistan had shared irrefutable evidence of India's involvement in terrorism with international community.

"The arrest and conviction of Kulbushan Yadav, a serving Indian naval officer and an operative of India's intelligence agency RAW, is irrefutable evidence of India's state sponsored terrorism against Pakistan including targeted assassinations," he said.

"India must end its state sponsored terrorism, cease its illegal occupation of Jammu and Kashmir and fulfil its obligations under international law," the counsellor demanded.

Sarwani said the UNSC through numerous resolutions had called for a free and impartial plebiscite to enable the people of Jammu and Kashmir to exercise their inalienable right to self-determination.

"Under Article 25 of the UN Charter, India is obligated to implement these resolutions. However, instead of honouring

its obligations, India has chosen the path of repression," he added.

The Pakistan counsellor apprised the forum that India had deployed nearly one million soldiers in Jammu and Kashmir to suppress the Kashmiri's legitimate right.

He said Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif shed light on those facts, which might be uncomfortable for India but it remained the truth which India could not deny.

"India has once again resorted to the tactic of deflecting global attention from its own terror activities by raising baseless accusation of terrorism. It is ironic that the country which uses terrorism as an instrument of state policy against its neighbours attempts to point fingers at others," he maintained.

However, these distortions could not alter the reality that Jammu and Kashmir was an internationally recognised but disputed territory, he said.—RT/Agency
