## Jamshoro Police arrest 191 criminals in one month

JAMSHORO: Under the leadership of SSP Jamshoro Zafar Siddique Chhangha, the Jamshoro Police is actively engaged in crime prevention.

The following are the statistics regarding the successes achieved against crime and the resolution of public complaints in the last month. In the past month, 175 cases of various crimes were registered across the district's police stations.

191 accused individuals were arrested in these cases.

There were 7 police encounters with criminals, resulting in the capture of 7 criminals in injured condition.

7 gangs involved in robbery, theft of vehicles, and burglaries in homes and shops were apprehended.

During the month, the list of 153 absconding and wanted criminals decreased, with 22 absconders and 131 wanted individuals arrested.

19 cases were registered against individuals possessing illegal weapons, leading to the recovery of 19 pistols, 102 rounds of ammunition,



In operations against vehicle lifters, 30 stolen vehicles were recovered.

Recoveries of stolen property included 17 motorcycles, 9 four-wheeled vehicles, 36 mobile phones.

In actions against drug dealers, 84 cases were registered, and 102 drug dealers were arrested, with recoveries of

34 kg 150 g of cannabis, 29 kg of bhang, 358 g of ice, 319 liters of alcohol, 3718.875 kg of harmful gutka material was recovered from gutka sellers. 9 cases were registered against gamblers and bookies, leading to the arrest of 9 individuals, with recoveries including cash amounting to 7000, playing cards, and betting books.

In response to an incident of rape in Sehwan, immediate action resulted in the arrest of 3 suspects.

During the month, a total of 345 complaints were received at the District Complaint Cell through various channels.

Out of these, 301 have been resolved, while 44 applications are still under investigation.

The special investiture ceremony, held at Awan-e-Sadr, was attended by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, federal ministers, military chiefs, diplomats, and senior government officials. During the event, it was noted that Anwar Ibrahim, an admirer of Allama Iqbal, has found inspiration in the philosopher-poet's works. Anwar's career has been distinguished by his advocacy for humanitarian causes and Islamic values, with a focus on social justice and addressing issues facing the Muslim world. The Malaysian prime minister has been a strong supporter of self-determination movements, speaking out against global oppression. He continues to fight against Islamophobia and promotes interfaith harmony by encouraging understanding and respect among different cultures and religions. President Zardari later hosted a state dinner in honour of Prime Minister Anwar and his delegation.—RT/Agency

## PTI's Alvi Accuses Chief Justice Isa Of Encouraging Floor-Crossing To Extend Tenure

LAHORE: Former president and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leader Dr Arif Alvi has accused Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faez Isa of creating an atmosphere conducive to floor-crossing, driven by a "lust" to extend his tenure.

Alvi likened Isa's actions to those of the current government, which he alleged is "ruining the Constitution for its survival."

"I have never seen a chief justice like Faez Isa in my life," Alvi said while speaking to reporters at the Anti-Terrorism Court, where he met with PTI lawmakers arrested in connection with the May 9 riots following the arrest of PTI founder Imran Khan.

Alvi went on to criticise the chief justice, stating, "He has damaged the country more than Justice Munir," referring to the controversial former judge who was criticised for judicial overreach in the 1950s.

The former president expressed concern over what he described as a "hazak of cruelty," claiming that the CJP



had opened "a market for buying and selling people, like how slaves were once sold in America."

Alvi also questioned the timing of the invocation of Article 63-A, which deals with defection, claiming it was unnecessary and only served to prolong Faez Isa's tenure. He stressed the need for judicial reforms in the lower courts to provide justice to the public, instead of what he saw as efforts to extend each other's tenures.

Regarding PTI's rallies, Alvi said that the police were solely responsible for the violence and chaos at the rallies. "PTI's rallies are peaceful, it's the police who create anarchy," he stated.

When asked about the ongoing situation in Gaza and Palestine, Alvi thanked Iran for its response to Israel and urged Muslim countries not to forget the plight of Muslims in Gaza, Palestine, and Kashmir. "Israel is acting like a hooligan, and Muslims must stand united. Quid-e-Azam's vision was for a single state with a Palestinian majority," he said.—RT/Agency

## Egyptian, Ethiopian Envoys Meet National Assembly Speaker To Discuss Bilateral And Regional Issues

ISLAMABAD: National Assembly (NA) Speaker, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq on Thursday said Pakistan valued high its cordial ties with Egypt and intended to further expand the existing relations through enhanced parliamentary and economic cooperation. He expressed these views in a meeting with Ambassador of Egypt Dr. Ihab AbdelHamid Hassan who called on him at the Parliament House. Ayaz Sadiq said the relation between the two brotherly countries was based on common religion, culture, history, mutual respect and brotherhood. He expressed grave concern over the current situation in the Middle East and condemned Israeli aggression in Palestine and Lebanon. He urged upon the international community to



play its role in ending Israeli occupation and aggression so that durable peace can prevail in the region. Highlighting the importance of parliamentary diplomacy, the speaker said parliamentary diplomacy could play a vital role in strengthening the bilateral relations. He further said the exchange of parliamentary delegations would enable parliamentarians of both countries to learn from each other's experiences. He also said enhanced contacts between Parliamentary Friendship Groups (PFGs) of both countries would result in strengthening of bilateral relations as well. Ayaz also extended invitation to his Egyptian counterpart to visit Pakistan along with parliamentary delegation. Egyptian Ambassador Dr. Ihab AbdelHamid Hassan appreciated the remarks of the speaker for further expanding relations between both brotherly countries and parliaments.—RT/Agency

## ANF Arrests 11 In Nationwide Operations

RAWALPINDI: Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF) while conducting raids in different areas managed to recover 58 kg drugs worth Rs 6.5 kg and arrested 11 accused, said an ANF Headquarters spokesman here on Thursday.

He informed that 82 in-toxicated tablets, 70 grams ice and 168 grams hashish were recovered from an accused arrested near a college in Lahore. 105 grams opium and 90 grams hashish were recovered from an accused rounded up near a university in Lahore. 198 ecstasy tablets and 130 grams hashish were recovered from a drug dealer netted near a major university in Lahore.

The arrested accused confessed to selling drugs to the students of educational institutions. Establishing drug-free educational institutions is first priority of ANF, the spokesman added.

In an operation at Peshawar International Airport, 55 grams hashish was recovered from the luggage of a passenger leaving for Dubai. 2.9 kg ice was recovered from the possession of a passenger going to Bahrain at Peshawar Airport. 9.6 kg hashish and 1.2 kg opium were recovered from a vehicle arrested near Chenab Toll Plaza Gujarat and 3 accused were arrested. 1.2 kg opium, 1 kg heroin and 500 grams were recovered from two accused going on a motorcycle in Sialkot. 30 kg hashish hidden in extra tyre in the trailer was recovered in Gadap Town Karachi and an accused was arrested during the operation.

Cases under the Anti-Narcotics Act have been registered against the arrested accused and further investigations are under process.—RT/Agency

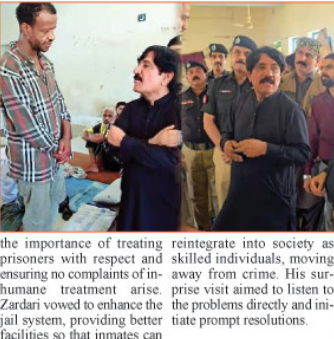

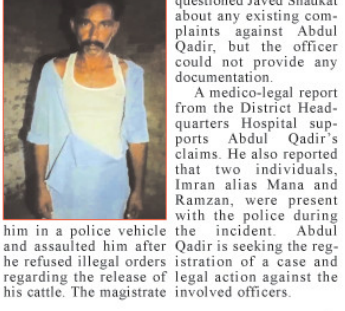

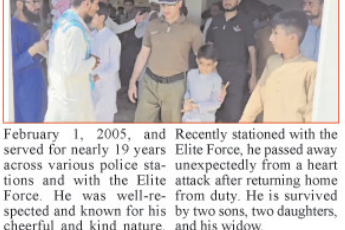

### The Path to Peace Must Prevail

The escalation of violence between Iran and Israel has brought the Middle East to the edge of a catastrophic regional conflict. Missiles flying across borders, lives lost, and the intensifying rhetoric from both sides have only heightened the danger of a wider war. It is imperative to recognize that this dangerous cycle of aggression and retaliation cannot be the solution to the deep-rooted issues plaguing the region. Violence only breeds more violence, leading to further devastation and suffering for countless civilians.

Dialogue, no matter how difficult, remains

the only viable path to lasting peace. The international community must step forward, not to fan the flames of conflict by support-



ing one side against the other, but to bring the parties to the negotiating table. Israel's actions, including assassinations of key figures and bombings, may be seen as strategic moves, but they ultimately undermine any possibility of reconciliation. Similarly, Iran's missile strikes, justified or not, only exacerbate tensions, risking a full-scale war

that could engulf the entire region.

Both sides must show restraint and take meaningful steps towards de-escalation. Global powers, especially the United States and the United Kingdom, have a responsibility to temper their support and instead encourage genuine diplomatic efforts. The cost of war is too high, and without peaceful dialogue, this conflict threatens to spiral beyond control. Now is the time for calm heads and constructive conversations, not more violence and inflammatory rhetoric. Only through diplomacy can peace be achieved and stability restored in the region.

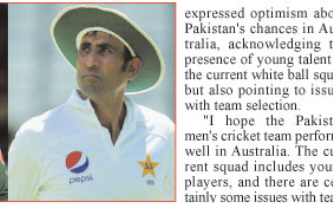
## Stepping away from captaincy will be beneficial for Babar Azam, says Younis Khan

LAHORE: Former Pakistan skipper Younis Khan has endorsed ex-captain Babar Azam's decision to resign from captaincy, stating that it will be "beneficial" for him.

The veteran cricketer has also proposed the names of wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and left-hand batter Fakhar Zaman as new contenders for the post.

"In our culture, we often make the biggest player the captain, which I believe is a mistake," said Younis, adding that Rizwan or Zaman should be considered for the role.

Babar, on Tuesday, announced that he was stepping down from white-ball captaincy, saying that it was time for him to focus on his playing role and personal growth.



The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) had reappointed him as the national team's captain for T20I and one-day internationals (ODIs) on March 31. He had earlier ended his years-long stint as skipper in November 2023 after he stepped down as captain of the national side.

The former batter's remarks came during his visit to the Adelaide Oval earlier today where he was honored with the official South Australia Redbacks cap by Mark Cosgrove, former Australian cricketer and current High-Performance Coach of the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA).

The legendary batter, who arrived in Australia this morning, represented the Redbacks during the 2008-2009 season.

During a media briefing at the iconic venue, Younis expressed optimism about Pakistan's chances in Australia, acknowledging the presence of young talent in the current white ball squad but also pointing to issues with team selection.

"I hope the Pakistan men's cricket team performs well in Australia. The current squad includes young players, and there are certainly some issues with team selection that need to be addressed," the veteran cricketer stated.

"I have played cricket with Jason Gillespie, he is working hard to improve the Pakistan team. However, there needs to be better decision-making when it comes to selection," he added. Younis is also set to take part in the upcoming Australian Summer Cricket Festival, scheduled for October 5 in Melbourne.—Agency

## Pakistan to host South Asian Cross Country Athletics Championship next month



KARACHI: Pakistan will host the South Asian Cross Country Athletics Championship for the first time, with the event scheduled to take place on November 24 in Islamabad, officials confirmed.

The championship, a major milestone for athletics in Pakistan, will feature athletes from seven South Asian nations, including India, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and the Maldives.

The Athletics Federation of Pakistan (AFP) confirmed that the government has granted clearance to all participating teams, including India's, ensuring a smooth process for international participation.

"This is a significant event for Pakistan's sporting landscape," an AFP official said, adding that the Pakistan Sports Board has also issued the necessary no objection certificate (NOC) for the event. Cross country running is a long-distance sport where individuals and teams compete over natural terrain. The courses typically range from 3 to 12 kilometers and often feature varied surfaces, including grass, dirt, and gravel, along with natural obstacles like hills and woodlands. Athletes are evaluated both on their individual performance and through a team-based points system.—Agency

## Stuart Broad backs England's 'Bazball' style for triumph against Pakistan



MULTAN: England's former bowler Stuart Broad said that his national team's aggressive approach, famously known as the 'Bazball' style, will help when they face spin-friendly conditions in Pakistan during their Test series this month.

England returned to Pakistan for a red-ball series after defeating the hosts 3-0 in Tests in 2022 when Harry Brook scored three centuries and spinners thrived.

The three-Test series against Pakistan, as part of the ICC World Test Championship 2023-25, will begin in Multan on October 7.

The 38-year-old former cricketer said England have got the players to deal with spin in Pakistan but will have to play with their ultra-aggressive style to get positive results, Reuters reported.

"I think the style will work in Pakistan, for sure," Broad said, during an interview, ahead of the launch of Inside Lord's, Marylebone Cricket Club's (MCC) new digital platform.

"I think they're really positive and aggressive, they can find the boundary and don't get tied down by spin. England will have to play fast-paced cricket to force results over there because you generally do need five days to make something happen."

England's fast-bowling unit, led by Chris Woakes and including Matthew Potts, Olly Stone, Gus Atkinson and Brydon Carse, will be without experienced Mark Wood, who has an elbow injury, and skipper Ben Stokes, who is not yet fit to bowl.

Broad said Pakistan, who were defeated 2-0 at home by Bangladesh last month, would be looking to take advantage of England's inexperienced fast bowling lineup, but the visitors must capitalise on the hosts' underwhelming form.

"Pakistan have not been playing the best cricket. They've been struggling, so England should see that as a positive and go there trying to apply pressure to that team as soon as they possibly can," Broad said.—Agency

## Bowlers give Bangladesh triumphant start to Women's T20 World Cup 2024

Set to chase 120, Scotland's batting unit struggled against a disciplined Bangladesh bowling attack and could accumulate 103/7 in the allotted 20 overs despite Sarah Bryce's unbeaten 49-run knock.

Bryce lamented subtle support from the other end as none of her teammates could put up a fight against Bangladesh's bowling with only Kathryn Bryce and Ailsa Lister, 11 each, managing to amass double figures.

The wicketkeeper batter remained stranded on an unbeaten 49 off 52 deliveries with the help of a boundary.

Ritu Moni led the bowling charge for Sri Lanka with two wickets, while Rabeya Khan, Fahima Khatun, Nahida Akter and Marufa Akter shared four wickets between them.

Bangladesh opted to bat first but failed to get the desired start as Murshida Khatun departed after scoring 12 runs in the fifth over.

Shathi Rani and Sobhana Mostary then stitched a 42-run partnership for the second wicket to push the team's total to 68. Katherine Fraser provided the breakthrough when she dismissed Rani, who scored 29 off 32.

Meanwhile, Mostary fell prey to Olivia Bell, after top-scoring for Bangladesh with a scratchy 36-run knock from 38 balls.

Horley further dented Bangladesh's progress with a double-wicket over, dismissing Shorna Akter (5) and Ritu Moni (5).

Skipper Nigar Sultana (18) and Fahima Khatun helped push the total to 118 before the former also fell to Horley off the penultimate ball of the innings. Fahima Khatun remained unbeaten on 10 as Bangladesh managed 119-7 in their allocated 20 overs.—Agency

The 31-year-old cricketer shared the news via a heartfelt post on X (formerly known as Twitter), expressing gratitude for the opportunity to represent Pakistan.

Qadir, the son of legendary leg-spinner Abdul Qadir, reflected on his journey, thanking his coaches, teammates, and the fans who supported him throughout his career.

"It has been an immense honour to represent my country," Qadir wrote. "I'm thankful for the support of my coaches and teammates who have been with me every step of the way."

Despite his accomplishments, Qadir also faced challenges, including frustrations over his exclusion from the national team.

In May 2024, he voiced concerns about former PCB technical director Mohammad Hafeez, alleging that Hafeez influenced his absence from the squad.

Qadir has vowed to continue his father's legacy as he steps away from Pakistan cricket. "As I step into this new chapter, I will be continuing my dad's legacy, embracing both my love for cricket and the lessons he instilled in me," Qadir stated.

Usman Qadir concluded his international career with 29 wickets and an economy rate of 7.95 in T20Is. He last represented Pakistan in 2022 and had since been playing for the Dolphins in the Champions One-Day Cup.—Agency

DUBAI: The International Cricket Council (ICC) has launched a new AI tool as part of the social media moderation programme for the Women's T20 World Cup to help protect the players from harmful content.

The move will help the women cricketers avoid hate speech, harassment and misogyny during the mega event.

The cricketing body released a statement on the opening day of the T20 World Cup 2024 saying that the software will "promote a more positive and inclusive online experience for teams and players."

As per the statement issued by ICC, 60 of the cricketers participating in the event have already opted for the programme.

ICC has collaborated with GoBubble to provide a combination of AI and human resources to monitor comments on ICC's social media handles and the 60 players who have signed up for the initiative.

"The cutting-edge technology is designed to identify and hide from public view toxic content such as hate speech, harassment, and misogyny, helping to create a safer and more welcoming space for fans to engage with the World Cup," the ICC release said.

"We are dedicated to fostering a positive and inclusive environment for all participants and fans of the ICC Women's T20 World Cup, it's been great to see so many of the players and teams embrace our new initiative," ICC head of digital, Finn Bradshaw said.

The women cricketers are overjoyed with this initiative with South African wicketkeeper-batter Sinalo Jaftha saying that this kind of protection is "very big."

"For me with social media protection I think it takes a lot of weight off players, especially at World Cup campaigns as that is the worst of it," the Proteas keeper was quoted saying in the ICC release.

"There is nothing worse than opening up your phone after a loss - or after a victory - and regardless of what side you find yourself there is always some degrading content about your personality," she added.—Agency

The suspect has confessed to the crime, and further investigations are ongoing. He will be presented in court for further proceedings following judicial orders.

During a media briefing on Thursday, Sheikh Umar Rehman, Chairman of the Pakistan Vanaspathi Manufacturers Association, announced that a delegation will soon meet with Federal Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb to discuss export opportunities.



needed to meet domestic demand. He called on the Ministry of Industry to implement regulations for establishing new ghee factories, similar to those in place for the sugar industry.

Currently, Pakistan exports ghee to Afghanistan via road, with sea exports restricted. Rehman highlighted the need to lift these restrictions, stressing that the local ghee industry could significantly boost foreign ex-

change earnings if given the opportunity. A major challenge facing the ghee industry is the sales tax under section 8-B, with over 100 billion rupees stuck with the government, according to Rehman. He noted that Pakistan has 148 ghee manufacturing companies, but only 100 mills are

operating. Rehman also shared that Pakistan's annual demand for ghee is 4.5 million tons, while the country imported 3.2 million tons of palm oil last year to meet this demand. Although ghee prices rose by ten rupees per kilo after the budget, further increases are unlikely due to the turnover tax implementation. Ghee companies contribute over 700 billion rupees in taxes to the national treasury.—RT

## Sindh Food Authority Intensifies Inspections Of Water Plants Following Sindh High Court Directive

KARACHI: Following directives from the Sindh High Court, the Sindh Food Authority (SFA) re-examined licenses of water plants across the province, ensuring compliance with water testing standards set by the World Health Organization (WHO). The SFA launched a comprehensive campaign, physically inspecting 463 food business units and Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants involved in producing and supplying bottled and filtered water to the public.

The inspection campaign began by visiting 13 units, revealing that 233 of the listed units had either closed or relocated. In addition, 58 newly established plants were inspected to ensure broader coverage. During the inspections, SFA teams found 43 plants compliant with WHO standards, while 19 met WHO guidelines. However, 13 units were discovered operating in unsafe and unhygienic conditions, and their production was suspended immediately to protect public health.

Improvement notices were issued to 238 units, giving them 14 days to address safety and quality concerns identified by the SFA teams. So far, sample results from 82 plants were deemed satisfactory and safe for human consumption, while 62 were found unfit, leading to the suspension of their production and legal action. Additionally, 52 unlisted RO plants were visited, and those failing to meet standards were temporarily sealed.

The Director General of the SFA, Muzamil Hussain Halepot, presented the findings to the Sindh High Court, which praised the SFA's efforts and urged the authority to expedite its work to ensure the public receives safe drinking water.—RT

## Bandit Facilitators Kidnap Nine From Karachi To Katcha Area

KARACHI: Bandit facilitators have abducted nine individuals from Karachi and taken them to the Katcha area, according to SSP Ansel Hyder of the Anti-Kidnaping for Ransom Cell. "The facilitators, posing as factory workers, lured victims with promises of good jobs and a better future before sending them to the

Katcha area," SSP Hyder revealed. Four hostages have been recovered, and efforts are underway to rescue the remaining five. The kidnaping have been demanding over Rs 10 million in ransom, as well as expensive mobile phones. Several victims were also trapped through false marriage proposals.—RT/Agency
