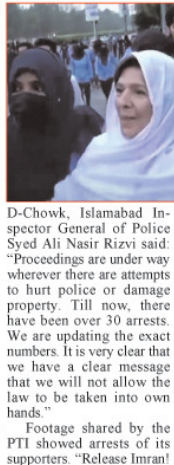

## Imran's Sisters Among 30 Arrested As PTI Uprising Paralyzes Islamabad

ISLAMABAD: At least 30 protesters have been arrested as mobile networks and internet services remain suspended in Islamabad and Rawalpindi amid a planned PTI rally at the capital's D-Chowk.

The PTI today shared updates of its caravans departing various cities, despite being warned by Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi a day ago not to hold any rally in Islamabad due to several high-profile visits by foreign dignitaries.



According to a media correspondent in Islamabad, mobile network and internet services have been suspended across the twin cities since the morning, causing problems for the public, especially those relying on them for their work.

Rawalpindi City Police Officer (CPO) Khalid Hamdani said in a statement that security was on high alert and pillion-riding was banned, adding that mobile network and metro bus services were suspended indefinitely.

Authorities had enforced Section 144 and the Peaceful Assembly Act across the federal capital, prohibiting gatherings and processions in restricted areas as part of tightened security measures.

Meanwhile, Naqvi said no one would be allowed to damage public property. "We have made arrangements for the security of our foreign guests. Apologies for the inconvenience to the citizens of Islamabad. Protesters should take stock of their senses. Visitors should feel that they are visiting a safe country," said a statement issued by state broadcaster PTV.

The notification from the interior ministry said the exact area of deployment along with the number of troops would be determined later.—RT/Agency

## Indian External Affairs Minister Jaishankar Set To Attend Pivotal SCO Summit In Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Minister of External Affairs of India S Jaishankar will travel to Pakistan to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's Council of Heads of Government (SCO-CHG) meeting, scheduled for October 15 and 16.

Islamabad extended invitations to all the government heads of the member states, including Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, for the upcoming SCO-CHG meeting in Islamabad, Foreign Office Spokesperson Mumtaz Zahra Baloch confirmed in a statement in July.

It was the first visit to India by a top Pakistani official since then-prime minister Nawaz Sharif attended Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's swearing-in in 2014.

## Murad Vows To Resolve Pakistan Business Council's Key Concerns

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah assured a delegation from the Pakistan Business Council (PBC), led by Shabir Diwan, that he is actively working to address their outstanding issues with both the provincial and federal governments on a priority basis.

The meeting included Minister of Industries Jam Ikram Dharejo, CM Secretary Raheem Shaikh, Secretary of Industries Yasir Shar, and Secretary of Finance Fayaz Jatoi, alongside PBC members Ms. Zeelaf Munir, Ehsan Malik, Arif Habib, Ziad Bashir, and Samir Amir.

The Chief Minister emphasized his commitment to fostering industrial growth, creating jobs, and strengthening the economy by enhancing existing trade and industry and attracting investment through essential support.

In a proposal, the PBC requested a reduction in the infrastructure cess from 1.8% to 1.2%. The Chief Minister agreed to review this request and instructed the Secretary of Finance to provide recommendations.

The delegation also expressed concerns about rising power tariffs affecting the industrial sector and suggested a package for industrial support. In response, Mr. Shah highlighted positive economic indicators and proposed that the federal government consider special power rates for industries operating night shifts to boost production and employment.

Both the Chief Minister and PBC representatives agreed to schedule another meeting to further discuss their concerns and formulate an action plan.—RT

## Sindh To Officially Take Over Karachi's Green Line Bus Service By December 2024

KARACHI: The Federal Government is set to hand over the operations of the Green Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system to the Sindh Government by December 2024. Sindh officials have confirmed that all preparations are in place for the provincial government to assume control of Karachi's first bus rapid transit project.

The Green Line BRT, operational since December 2021, currently runs 80 buses, transporting an average of 55,000 passengers daily along its 20.9-kilometre route. Despite its success, the project remains incomplete, with the final phase—stretching from Numaish to Municipal Park near Jama Cloth Market—left unfinished since the federal government cancelled the contract with the National Logistics Cell (NLC) in late 2020.

A high-level meeting chaired by Sindh Senior Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon took place today in Karachi to review the Green Line BRT's progress. Attendees included Transport Secretary Asad Zamin, Sindh Mass Transit Authority Managing Director Kamal Hakeem Dawo, Trans Karachi CEO Shumaila Mohsin, and other key officials. During the meeting, Minister Memon was briefed on the current status of the project, and plans were discussed to link the Green Line BRT with the Orange Line BRT.

Memon emphasized the importance of completing the Green Line's connection to the Orange Line before December 2024 and called for swift action to finish the project. Discussions also covered Sindh's public transport sector, ongoing utility services, and subsidies for the Green Line.

The federal government currently provides an annual subsidy of 2 billion rupees for Green Line operations. Memon noted that this financial arrangement will be re-evaluated once the Sindh government takes over, with plans to expand the service by introducing additional buses to improve transportation for Karachi's residents.—RT

## Closure Of Arif Alvi's Clinic Sparks Legal Battle In Sindh High Court

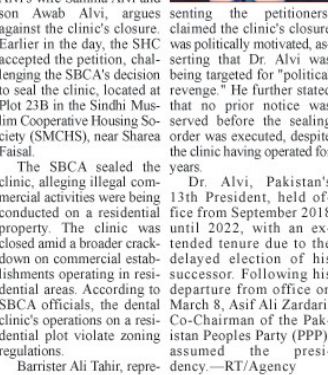
KARACHI: The decision by the Sindh Building Control Authority (SBCA) to seal the dental clinic of former President Dr. Arif Alvi in Karachi has been contested in the Sindh High Court (SHC). On Friday, a two-member bench of the court took up the case, issuing notices to the provincial government, SBCA, and the Sindh Healthcare Commission, seeking their responses by October 7.

The petition, filed by Dr. Alvi's wife Samina Alvi and son Awab Alvi, argues against the clinic's closure. Earlier in the day, the SHC accepted the petition, challenging the SBCA's decision to seal the clinic, located at Plot 23B in the Sindh Muslim Cooperative Housing Society (SMCHS), near Sharea Faisal.

The SBCA sealed the clinic, alleging illegal commercial activities were being conducted on a residential property. The clinic was closed amid a broader crackdown on commercial establishments operating in residential areas. According to SBCA officials, the dental clinic's operations on a residential plot violate zoning regulations.

Barrister Ali Tahir, representing the petitioners, claimed the clinic's closure was politically motivated, asserting that Dr. Alvi was being targeted for "political revenge." He further stated that no prior notice was served before the sealing order was executed, despite the clinic having operated for years.

Dr. Alvi, Pakistan's 13th President, held office from September 2018 until 2022, with an extended tenure due to the delayed election of his successor. Following his departure from office on March 8, Asif Ali Zardari, Co-Chairman of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), assumed the presidency.—RT/Agency



## NATIONAL BISP And WFP Extend Benazir Nashonuma Programme For Two More Years



ISLAMABAD: The Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) and the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) have renewed their partnership for an additional two years under the Benazir Nashonuma Programme.

The agreement was signed today at BISP Headquarters, with Senator Rubina Khalid, Chairperson of BISP, in attendance alongside Mr. Amer Ali Ahmad, BISP Secretary, and Ms. Ceco Ushiyama, WFP Country Director.

This collaboration addresses the urgent issue of malnutrition in Pakistan, where nearly 40% of children under five experience stunting due to inadequate nutrition. The Benazir

Nashonuma Programme aims to reduce stunting among pregnant and lactating women and children under two by providing additional cash support to BISP beneficiary families, with quarterly payments of PKR 2,500 for boys and PKR 3,000 for girls.

Chairperson Rubina Khalid highlighted the importance of the agreement in the fight against malnutrition, reaffirming the government's commitment to ensuring a healthy start for every child. The second phase will expand to cover 157 districts with 562 facilitation centers, concluding in June 2026, following the successful completion of the first phase in June 2024.—RT

This should have been a moment to showcase our ability to host high-level international gatherings, presenting a united and orderly front. Instead, we find ourselves in a repeat of chaotic confrontations that reflect poorly on our nation's governance and political maturity. How can we expect to gain respect on the global stage when we cannot maintain basic law and order during such critical events?

The deployment of the army for security purposes underscores just how precarious the situation has become. Relying on military

Larkana: Abida, a resident of Majeed Colony in Dadu, held a press conference at the Larkana Press Club with her husband, Muhammad Ibrahim Lakhtyio. She shared that she eloped with Ibrahim on September 27, choosing to marry him of her own freewill. Following their marriage, they filed a protection application in the Session Court in Larkana.



Abida stated that since their marriage, her family especially her father, Muhammad Pearl Khokhar, and brothers have turned against them, threatening to kill them under the pretext of honor. She expressed that her relatives have also threatened to file false kidnapping charges against her husband and his family, which she described as acts of injustice and oppression.

Abida appealed to the Chief Justice of the Sindh High Court, the IG of Sindh Police, and the DIG and SSP of Larkana to take notice of the situation and provide them with protection and justice.

## Corpse of Jatoi Community Man Discovered in Larkana, Sparking Outrage

The body of Gada Hussain Jatoi, a laborer who was reportedly abducted, was discovered with signs of violence. The police have sent the body for postmortem examination. Two suspects have been arrested as the investigation into the

incident unfolds. The DIG and SSP of Larkana have taken notice of the situation.

According to reports, Gada Hussain Jatoi was abducted late Friday night from the Walid Muhalla area of Larkana city. His body was found near the Arjia Phero bypass. Relatives, including Saifullah Jatoi, stated that members of the Magso community were involved in his abduction, and they have reported the incident to the police at the Walid station. Saifullah Jatoi demanded the arrest of those responsible for Gada Hussain's murder to ensure justice. The police at the Arjia Phero station mentioned that the reasons behind the incident are still unclear, but they have arrested two individuals and are investigating various aspects of the case.

In the meantime, the DIG and SSP of Larkana have ordered the arrest of the culprits. Following the postmortem, the victim's body was handed over to the family, leading to a scene of mourning as it arrived at their home. As of the latest reports, no formal case had been registered regarding the incident.

## JSQM Launches Protest Over Lack Of Facilities, Staff Misconduct At Taluka Hospital Tando Adam

TANDO ADAM: In Tando Adam, the Jeay Sindh Qaumi Mahaz (JSQM) organized a protest against the lack of facilities at the Taluka Hospital and the inappropriate behavior of staff towards patients. According to reports, the protest was led by JSQM District Sanghar Organizer Azad Kunbhar, Taluka President Shabeer Korojo, Irshad Brohi, Sanwal Sindh, and others. They started a rally from Muhammad Chowk and held a demonstration on MA Jinnah Road.



During the protest, the leaders stated that corruption is rampant in the only taluka hospital serving a population of over 300,000. They highlighted that poor patients do not have access to adequate treatment facilities, as doc-

tors prefer to work in private hospitals and their own clinics instead of fulfilling their duties at the public hospital. They claimed that medications are given only to favored individuals and that there is a severe lack of basic facilities.

Despite having ambulances, patients do not benefit from them and are forced to undergo tests outside. The protestors condemned the staff's disrespectful behavior towards patients. They demanded that basic facilities be provided in the hospital and that action be taken against the staff exhibiting inappropriate conduct. If their demands are not met, they threatened to file a petition in the Sindh Chief Justice's court.

## Bangladesh Women's Team Celebrates First T20 World Cup Win in 10 Years



SHARJAH: Bangladesh's women's cricket team finally ended their decade-long wait for a T20 World Cup victory, defeating Scotland by 16 runs in a thrilling opener in Sharjah.

"A win after 10 years is very emotional. We've been waiting for this for a long time," said Joty.

"No matter how well we play, if we don't win, it feels meaningless. This victory gives us momentum, and I feel it's a step towards something bigger," she added.

## Sirbaz Khan Etches His Name in History by Conquering All 14 Eight-Thousanders

KARACHI: Pakistani mountaineer Sirbaz Khan has made history by becoming the first Pakistani to summit all 14 of the world's 8,000-metre peaks, a feat accomplished by only a few elite climbers globally.

Khan's latest triumph came on Friday when he scaled Shishapangma, an 8,027-metre peak in Tibet without O2, marking the completion of his 14th "eight-thousander." This remarkable achievement places him in the ranks of the world's most accomplished high-altitude mountaineers.

Hailing from Hunza, Khan began his 14-year journey in 2017 when he successfully summited Nanga Parbat, a notoriously dangerous 8,126-metre peak. This marked the start of his journey to scale all of the world's highest mountains. Over the



years, he has conquered some of the most challenging peaks, including K2 in July 2018 and Lhotse in May 2019, where he became the first Pakistani to summit the world's most accomplished high-altitude mountaineers.

In July 2019, Khan added Broad Peak to his list of accomplishments, reaching its 8,051-metre summit without the use of supplementary oxygen, a feat that would become a hallmark of his climbs. Later that same year, in September, he scaled Manaslu in Nepal, becoming only

the second Pakistani to reach its 8,163-metre summit. Khan's determination was unwavering, and in April 2021, he became the first Pakistani to summit Annapurna, one of the deadliest mountains in the world. The following month, he successfully summited Mount Everest, the highest peak on the planet, standing at 8,849 metres. In July 2021, Khan led an all-Pakistani team to the summit of Gasherbrum II, standing at 8,035 metres, further cementing his reputation as a leader in high-altitude mountaineering. Just a few months later, in October 2021, he became the first Pakistani to summit Dhaulagiri, an 8,167-metre peak. Khan continued to break barriers in 2022, summiting Kangchenjunga in May and Makalu later that month, becoming the first Pakistani to conquer both of these formidable mountains. In August of the same year, he led another successful expedition to Gasherbrum I, marking his 12th summit of an 8,000-metre peak. In October 2023, Khan added Cho Oyu to his list of conquests, becoming the first Pakistani to summit the 8,188-metre peak. Finally, with his successful ascent of Shishapangma on Friday (October 4), Khan completed his mission, becoming the first Pakistani to conquer all 14 of the world's highest peaks.—Agency

## Ancelotti Admits Lille Defeat Was a Harsh Wake-Up Call for Real Madrid

Real Madrid manager Carlo Ancelotti is hoping the shock preparation time he has had with his players following the shock Champions League loss at Lille will be enough for his team to return to winning ways.



As they prepare to host Villarreal in LaLiga on Saturday, Ancelotti said Wednesday's match was a reality check after a penalty scored by Jonathan David earned the French side a 1-0 victory over the holders, ending the 15-times European Cup winners' 36-game unbeaten run in all competitions.

"(Villarreal) are doing really well, tomorrow is an opportunity for us to reconnect, to get back to playing good football," Ancelotti told a press conference on Friday.

"(The mood) is fine, as always. (Wednesday's) defeat is an opportunity, if we take it and react well. We are self-critical. There are times when you have to reconnect and you need to do it quickly.

"Sometimes a good run makes you think you're invincible, but a defeat brings you back to reality. We are

still not at our level, we have players who are not at their best. We are not far from where we want to be. There is a lack of defensive intensity and, offensively, a lack of ball circulation."

Coming off a remarkable 2023-24 season in which they won the LaLiga and Champions League double, Real are second in the Spanish league standings on 18 points, three behind leaders Barcelona and one ahead of Villarreal. Ancelotti expects to get Kylian Mbappe back into the starting team after the forward missed last weekend's 1-1 derby against Atletico and came off the bench at Lille due to a hamstring injury, which led to

France manager Didier Deschamps leaving his captain out of the squad for next week's internationals against Israel and Belgium.—Agency

## New Contenders Emerge for Pakistan's White-Ball Captaincy After Babar's Departure

LAHORE: After star batter Babar Azam's recent resignation as Pakistan's white-ball captain, speculation is rife over who will take up the mantle next.

Among the leading contenders for the role are Test vice-captain Saud Shakeel, dynamic opener Fakhar Zaman, and all-rounder Salman Ali Agha.

Reports indicate that wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and pace bowler Shaheen Afridi have slim chances of being considered for the role, despite their leadership experience in other formats.

Saud Shakeel, who recently replaced Rizwan as Test vice-captain during Pakistan's series against



Bangladesh, is seen as a potential candidate.

Meanwhile, Fakhar Zaman, who has captained Lahore Qalandars in the Pakistan Super League (PSL), brings his own leadership experience to the table.

However, Salman Ali Agha, the least experienced

among the three in terms of leadership, has yet to captain any side at the domestic level.

This leadership transition comes after Babar Azam's decision to step down from the captaincy across all formats last November, following Pakistan's disappointing World Cup campaign.

In the aftermath, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) handed the T20 captaincy to Shaheen Afridi and the Test leadership to Shan Masood.

Babar returned as captain of the white-ball team in March of this year, but his latest resignation leaves the position once again up for grabs. Previously, following Babar Azam's resignation, Mohammad Rizwan has emerged as the top contender to take over Pakistan's ODI captaincy.

Sources revealed that Rizwan's consistent performances and leadership experience make him a strong candidate for the position.—Agency

## Wasim Akram Claims Babar Will 'Soar Higher' After Stepping Down as Captain



KARACHI: Former Pakistan cricketer, Wasim Akram has expressed his support for Babar Azam's decision, stating that stepping down from captaincy will allow him to focus more on his batting and eliminate unnecessary stress.

Babar informed fans of his decision to step down as captain of the white-ball teams through a social media post in recent days.

His leadership has seen Pakistan's team underperform, which has led to appreciation for his decision.

In response to an inquiry from the Cricket Pakistan representative, Akram said that Babar must have made his decision thoughtfully.

He likened consulting with his seniors, mentors, and friends, including his father. "This would not have been an easy decision, but we should respect it. I stand with Babar. He should enjoy his cricket. With reduced pressure, he will be able to

focus more on his batting," he said.

"I believe that stepping down from captaincy will significantly improve Babar Azam's performance. He must have experienced unnecessary stress due to captaincy, and now he can fully concentrate on his game, win a few matches for Pakistan, and I am confident he will do just that," Akram said.

It's important to note that following Babar's resignation, Pakistan is now searching for a new captain for the white-ball format.

Names such as Mohammad Rizwan have come up in discussions.

The decision regarding leadership rests solely with the PCB Chairman, Mohsin Naqvi, who is currently busy with political matters and will take steps regarding this issue when time permits.

## Gillespie Shares Insights on His Game-Changing Role as Pakistan's Red-Ball Coach

LAHORE: Jason Gillespie, who was appointed Pakistan's red-ball head coach in April this year, revealed that the start of his new job has not been easy.

"It's been a tough initiation, and Pakistan haven't been playing well for a while now. Look, it's a challenge. There's no doubt about that, but it's an exciting one," he told The Telegraph.

With the harsh defeat against Bangladesh by 2-0, that too at home, Pakistan's Test captain, Shan Masood has faced criticism and his leadership qualities and capabilities have been questioned.

However, Gillespie seems to be impressed with Masood's ability to communicate with his team and how



he "has got a very clear plan on how the Test side should play and we are completely aligned on that."

"There are things people don't see and I've been really impressed by his communication with the players and how he's gone about doing his job," he added.

Gillespie also listed down key points through which

chance against good teams.

"We know England are going to go hard. But if we can just keep hanging in there, keep being disciplined, strike at the right moments, get on for the gap, so to speak, and go on top in games then we can mix it with really good teams," Gillespie said.

## Ombudsman Regional Director Tours Islamia Degree College Amid Scandalous Construction Delays

BADIN: The Regional Director of the Ombudsman in Badin, Manzoor Ali Soomro, visited the under-construction college in response to complaints from students of Islamia Degree College Badin. During the visit, Principal Professor Haroon Rasheed and Associate Professor Asghar Ali Memon briefed him that 3,000 students are currently enrolled at the college. The construction, which began in March 2021 at a cost of 12.9 million rupees, was expected to be completed in



30 months, but it remains unfinished. The work has been halted for the past year and a half, and substandard materials have been used. This delay has negatively impacted the education of the 3,000 students attending the city's only boys' college, with many lacking access to washroom facilities. Written complaints have been submitted to higher authorities, including the Deputy Commissioner of Badin, but no action has been taken. The Regional Director of the Ombudsman assured that the remaining construction work will be completed as soon as possible so that students can continue their studies without any issues.

They expressed frustration over the continuous lack of medicines at the government hospital, stating that poor residents are often denied medication by the hospital staff. Additionally, they highlighted that the hospital gate has been closed to restrict public access. Despite repeated complaints made to the DHO, no action has been taken, and the main gate remains shut, preventing patients from receiving necessary treatment. The leaders demanded that the Chief Minister of Sindh and the Minister of Health ensure the supply of medicines, open the hospital gate, and hand over the Khyber Rural Health Center to PPH.

## Nabi Bux Sathio Sounds Alarm Over Dubious Practices Of Rice Millers

TANDO MUHAMMAD KHAN: Sindh Abadgar Board leader Nabi Bux Sathio has stated that rice mill owners do not have the authority to check moisture levels using moisture machines or to unlawfully deduct 3.4 kg per mound for moisture content. This authority lies solely with the agriculture department and the market committee, which can coordinate with district administration for inspections. He urged the government to take strict action against officials and agents allowing substandard rice exports, which harm Pakistan's market. Sathio called for federal and provincial governments to take appropriate measures against rice mills and ensure that landrills receive a fair price of 3,500 per mound for their paddy crops.



## Azma Declares PTI A 'Terror Group,' Demands Immediate Crackdown

LAHORE: Following the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)'s insistence on holding a rally at Islamabad's D-Chowk today despite Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi's warning against it, Punjab Minister for Information Azma Bokhari on Friday said the party was not a political party and it should be treated as a terrorist entity.



"The [PTI] is not a political party," Bokhari said during an interview private TV channel. To a query, the information minister said she heard the interior minister last day and she believed he would not let the PTI supporters enter the federal capital. Naqvi on Thursday warned the PTI against holding the public gathering as visits of foreign dignitaries were planned in Islamabad, including the Malaysian prime minister. Amid its anti-govern-

ment campaign, the former ruling party - founded by Imran Khan - is holding protests for the "independence" of the judiciary and the release of the former prime minister from jail. The protest will coincide with the final day of the Malaysian prime minister's visit to Pakistan and the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit. The authorities have already enforced Section 144 and "the Peaceful Assembly and Public Order Act, 2024", regulating holding of public assemblies at certain places in Islamabad. "The PTI's top leadership should review its protest call [...] No one will be allowed for an onrush on Islamabad," the security czar said while addressing a presser along with officials of the federal police. Meanwhile, the provincial information minister the PTI had always worked against Pakistan's development. "The country is progressing and inflation is dropping, but they cannot sit with peace," she said.—RT/Agency

## U.S. Mobilizes Global Partners To Combat Drug-Resistant Typhoid Outbreak In Sindh

KARACHI: The United States convened a key meeting in Karachi from October 2-3 to coordinate efforts in combating the spread of extensively drug-resistant (XDR) typhoid in Sindh Province. The meeting brought together public health experts and stakeholders to devise a strategic response to this growing health crisis.

Participants analyzed the impact of XDR typhoid in Sindh, identifying the most critical and effective actions to curb the outbreak. Among the top priorities were enforcing antibiotic stewardship, restricting the sale of antibiotics without prescriptions, ensuring access to clean drinking water, and creating a provincial XDR typhoid response plan to guide future public health policies.

A multidisciplinary technical working group was also established during the meeting to lead the province's future efforts against typhoid. The group will reconvene in early 2025 to finalize strategies and implement the key



actions discussed. Attendees included Dr. Elizabeth Davlantes, Deputy Branch Chief for the Waterborne Disease Prevention Branch at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Dr. Muhammad Afzal from the CDC Pakistan Country Office, and representatives from the Sindh Government's Health Services, Aga Khan University, and the Pakistan Medical Association. Observers from the World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF, and other health organizations were also present.

Since 2016, Pakistan has been grappling with an outbreak of XDR typhoid, which is resistant to most available antibiotics. The strain has severely im-

## Russia Moves To Officially Delist Afghan Taliban As Terror Group In Groundbreaking Decision

MOSCOW: Russia's Foreign Ministry said on Friday that a decision to remove the Afghan Taliban from a list of terrorist organisations had been "taken at the highest level", the state TASS news agency reported.

The decision needs to be followed up with various legal procedures in order to make it a reality, President Vladimir Putin's special representative on Afghanistan, Zamil Kabulov, was quoted as saying.

Putin said in July that Russia considered Afghanistan's Taliban movement an ally in the fight against terrorism.

Russia has been slowly building ties with the Taliban since it seized power in Afghanistan in August 2021 as US-led forces withdrew after 20 years of war but the movement is still officially outlawed in Russia.

No country has formally



recognised the Taliban-led government as the country's legitimate leadership, although China and the UAE have accepted its ambassadors.

Russia added the Afghan Taliban to its list of terrorist organisations in 2003. Removing it would be an important step by Moscow towards normalising relations with Afghanistan.

The Taliban's acting foreign minister Amir Khan Muttaqi said in a speech in

mat dialogue" with the current Afghan government.

"It is obvious that it is impossible to solve problems or even discuss an Afghan settlement without Kabul," Lavrov said.

"Moscow will continue its course on developing political, trade and economic ties with Kabul," he added, speaking at a meeting in Moscow with Muttaqi and representatives of neighbouring countries.

While he did not mention the Taliban by name, he praised the current Afghan leadership for its efforts to curb drug production and fight Daesh which is outlawed in Russia.

Muttaqi said that countries in the region should cooperate against the Daesh, which he said had established training centres outside Afghanistan.

Lavrov said the United States should return confi-

ated assets to Afghanistan and the West should acknowledge responsibility for the post-conflict reconstruction of the country.

The Russian foreign minister also called for an increase in humanitarian aid to Afghanistan, and said Russia would keep sending it food and essential goods.

Russia has a troubled history in Afghanistan, where the Soviet army invaded in 1979 to support a pro-Moscow government but withdrew 10 years later after sustaining heavy casualties at the hands of mujahideen fighters.

Russia and its post-Soviet neighbours have suffered recurrent attacks from militant groups linked to Afghanistan — most recently in March, when 145 people were killed in an attack claimed by Daesh at a concert hall near Moscow.—RT/Agency

## Malaysian PM's Meeting With COAS Sparks Talks Of Strengthening Military Bonds

RAWALPINDI: In a meeting with Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Syed Asim Munir, Malaysian Prime Minister Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim stressed on the need for increasing bilateral ties particularly military relations between Pakistan and Malaysia.

Both the dignitaries discussed bilateral strategic interests, regional security and defence cooperation in the meeting, said the military's media wing on Friday.

PM Ibrahim, along with a high-level delegation, reached Islamabad on Wednesday on a three-day visit to the country. He held crucial meetings with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and President Asif Zardari, wherein they discussed a wide range of bilateral, regional and international issues of mutual interest.

Meanwhile, the Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR) said Prime Minister Ibrahim praised Pakistan Armed Forces' role in regional peace and stability, acknowledging their professionalism and sacrifices in combating terrorism.

While emphasising on enhancing military ties, the premier extended an invitation to the army chief to visit Malaysia "in the same con-



text". "The COAS thanked the prime minister for the invitation and appreciated the successful visit to Pakistan, which will help further improve the enduring and historic ties between the two countries and the militaries," said the ISPR.

COAS Munir also attended the investiture ceremony and state banquet held in the honour of the prime minister of Malaysia at the presidency.

During the special investiture ceremony, President Zardari conferred the award of Nishan-e-Pakistan upon PM Ibrahim in recognition of his support for Islamic causes and for being a great friend of Pakistan.

The top civilian award was conferred at a special investiture ceremony held at the Aiwan-e-Sadr and attended by PM Shehbaz Sharif, federal ministers, services chiefs, diplomats, and senior government officials.

During the ceremony, it was highlighted that the Malaysian prime minister was an avid reader of Allama Iqbal and acknowledged that his work had been a source of inspiration for him. PM Ibrahim has been a prominent advocate of humanitarian causes and Islamic values throughout his political career. His leadership is marked by a profound commitment to promoting social justice and addressing global issues affecting the Islamic world.

The president also hosted a state dinner in honour of the visiting Malaysian prime minister and his delegation.—RT/Agency

## ATC Grants 4-Day Remand For PTI Lawyer Accused Of Threatening CJ Isa

ISLAMABAD: An Islamabad anti-terrorism court has granted a four-day physical remand for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) lawyer Mustafin Kazmi, following accusations of misbehaving with Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa.

The ruling was delivered by Judge Tahir Abbas Supra during a court hearing on Friday.

Kazmi was presented before the court, represented by lawyers Eman Mazari and Rizwan, among others. During the hearing, prosecutor Raja Naveed read out the First Information Report (FIR) detailing the charges against Kazmi.

The defence argued that all individuals named in the FIR were lawyers, to which the prosecutor responded, "No one is above the law."

Judge Supra questioned who has the authority to determine who is above the law, following which the prosecutor requested a nine-day physical remand for Kazmi. However, the court approved a four-day remand and adjourned the case until October 8.

Kazmi's arrest came following allegations of inappropriate behaviour towards Chief Justice Isa, leading to the current legal proceedings.

Day before yesterday, lawyers belonging to the PTI gathered outside the Supreme Court to protest the formation of a bench hearing the review petition on the court's



interpretation of Article 63-A of the Constitution.

Inside the courtroom, PTI's counsel warned the bench of consequences if an unfavorable ruling was issued.

Despite the noisy protest outside, the hearing of the review petition continued. The case was heard by a five-judge larger bench, also including Justice Aminuddin Khan, Justice Jamal Mandoakhal, Justice Naem Akhtar Afghan and Justice Mazhar Alam Miankhal.

During the hearing, PTI's counsel, Tayyab Mustafin Kazmi, threatened the bench, stating that 500 lawyers were protesting outside and that he would see how the bench gave the decision against the PTI. Kazmi warned the bench of dire consequences if the verdict went against his party.

Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa condemned the threat, as-

## Army Assumes Control Of Islamabad's Security Under Article 245 As PTI Protests Escalate



RAWALPINDI/ ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Army units have taken over security duties in Islamabad under Article 245 of the Constitution, following orders from the Ministry of Interior. The move comes as part of efforts to maintain law and order amid escalating Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) protests in the capital.

According to official sources, the deployment has been completed, with army troops now stationed across Islamabad and surrounding areas. Their role includes patrolling key locations to safeguard citizens and protect public property, especially with the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in focus.

"These security measures are essential to protect lives and property, and to ensure peace during this critical period," a security official stated. The PTI protests have led to clashes with police, prompting authorities to take additional steps to control the situation.

The protests, which saw PTI workers gathering at D-Chowk, led to tear gas shelling by police to disperse the crowds. Several PTI workers were arrested at various points, including 26 Number Chungi.

"No one will be allowed to disrupt the peace or create unrest," the security source stressed, adding that the army's presence is crucial to neutralising any threats posed by the ongoing demonstrations.

Meanwhile, army units from Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) have been dispatched to support security operations in Islamabad and surrounding areas, as tensions rise in the capital amid ongoing Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) protests.

The move comes as part of heightened security measures to protect citizens and ensure the safety of the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit, according to security sources.

"No one will be allowed to disrupt peace or incite violence during this critical period," said a security official. "These deployments are aimed at safeguarding the public and ensuring that law and order prevail."

As the situation intensifies, authorities have tightened the noose around violent groups and armed protesters from both sides of the capital. "The army's presence is vital to neutralise any threats to public safety," the official added.—RT/Agency

## PTI Plotting Armed Attack On Islamabad During Protest Uprising

ISLAMABAD: While leadership and activists of the Imran Khan-founded party heading towards the federal capital despite roadblocks, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi has said everyone has the right to hold protest demonstration but the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) supporters are going to "attack Islamabad with weapons".

"This is not the right way and we will not allow this to happen," the security czar said while talking to journalists in Islamabad on Friday, with hoards of the PTI workers are travelling towards the federal capital amid visits of foreign dignitaries.

Naqvi said he had requested the PTI a day ago as well "not to hold rally for now". The minister added that he would not let anyone damage properties.

On Thursday, he also warned the PTI against holding the public gathering as visits of foreign dignitaries, including the Malaysian prime minister, were planned in Islamabad.

Amid its anti-government campaign, the former ruling party is holding protests for the "independence" of the ju-



diary and the release of the former prime minister from jail.

The protest coincides with the final day of the Malaysian PM Anwar Ibrahim's visit to Pakistan and ahead of the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit. The authorities have already enforced Section 144 and "the Peaceful Assembly and Public Order Act, 2024", regulating holding of public assemblies at certain places in Islamabad.

"The PTI's top leadership should review its protest call [..] No one will be allowed for an outreach on Islamabad," the security czar had said while addressing a presser along with officials of the federal police.

## NA Privatisation Committee Exposes 'Out-of-Turn' Appointments In PIA Under PPP Rule

ISLAMABAD: The General Manager (GM) of Pakistan International Airlines Friday said the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) during its three tenures did 'out-of-turn' appointments in the PIA, media reported.

This was stated by GM PIA Muhammad Shafique during a meeting of the National Assembly committee for privatization that met with PPP MNA Sehar Kamran in the chair.

Mr. Shafique said every MNA was given two seats for recruitment in the PIA during PPP's three tenures of government. "People were recruited in PIA even without meeting eligibility criteria."

He further stated that no permanent appointments have been made in the Pakistan International



Airlines from 2011 to incumbent government will complete the privatization of the national carrier along with three power distribution companies (Discos) before 2024 culminates.

The privatization of PIA, initially set to conclude by October 1, has been postponed to October 31 due to lower bidder interest, ongoing court cases, aging fleet issues, and civil aviation concerns.—RT/Agency

In a separate development on October 2, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb reaffirmed the government's commitment to privatising Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) and three power distribution companies (Discos) before the end of 2024.
