PTI's Attempts To Disrupt SCO Summit Will Be Countered By Government: Naqvi

ISLAMABAD: Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi has accused the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) of attempting to sabotage the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, further stating that the government would not allow such plans to succeed.

During a visit to Poly-clinic Hospital in Islamabad where the Interior Minister met with police officers injured by rioters, Naqvi slammed Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, accusing him of crossing all limits.

"The responsibility lies with the Chief Minister of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. We tried to make him understand, but he is unwilling to listen and is crossing all boundaries," Mohsin added.

Mohsin Naqvi claimed that Ali Amin Gandapur's convoy fired at police, resulting in injuries to 80-85 police personnel.

The interior minister praised the courage of the injured officers, acknowledging their restraint despite the violent situation, and commended their dedication to upholding the law.

"You are the brave sons of Islamabad Police, and we are proud of you," Mohsin Naqvi said. Speaking to the media, Mohsin Naqvi

Meanwhile, Federal Information Minister, Attaullah Tarar, has warned that no troublemakers will be allowed near Islamabad's D-Chowk, particularly during the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit. He stressed that any attempt to disrupt the conference



would be dealt with strictly. Speaking at a press conference in the capital, Tarar highlighted the importance of the SCO summit, noting that several heads of state will be visiting Pakistan.

He praised the prime minister's strong stance on global issues, including Palestine and Kashmir, at the United Nations General Assembly.

Tarar criticised the opposition, particularly Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), for organising disruptive protests. He accused the PTI of attempting to derail Pakistan's progress, noting that the economy was showing signs of improvement, with inflation rates dropping and exports rising.

He expressed frustration over the opposition's protests coinciding with international events.

He pointed out that the opposition's actions echo their 2013 protests, which delayed crucial investments, including Chinese President Xi Jinping's visit and the launch of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Tarar also slammed the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government, accusing it of failing to lower transport fares despite falling fuel prices and neglecting development projects in healthcare and education.

He further criticised the PTI for misusing public resources to fund their protests. He assured that the government is working hard to showcase a positive image of Pakistan to foreign investors and dignitaries, emphasising the need for security and order during the upcoming SCO summit.

He said that millions of taxpayers' rupees have been spent on these protests. Government vehicles are being used, and even the fuel for private vehicles at their rallies is being provided by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government, while not a single development project has been initiated there. Inflation is decreasing across the country, but not in KP because there is no focus on it. They are spending all their time on protests and pleasing their leader.—RT/Agency

Clashes Break Out Between PTI Protesters And Police At D-Chowk Amid Heavy Rainfall in Islamabad

ISLAMABAD: The federal capital witnessed ongoing clashes between the police and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) activists at D-Chowk on Saturday. Following heavy rainfall, which diminished the effects of tear gas, a large number of protesters surged towards D-Chowk, prompting police to detain several activists from Jinnah Avenue.

According to media, PTI protesters organised in convoys to reach the protest site, leading to intermittent skirmishes with police. Many activists advanced towards D-Chowk, pushing back law enforcement agencies, but were met with intense tear gas shelling that forced them to retreat.

The confrontations, which began in the morning, involved protesters throwing stones and retaliating against police actions. Earlier, demonstrators successfully removed obstacles to advance towards D-Chowk.

A convoy of 800 PTI activists from Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) entered Rawalpindi, where enraged individuals set a crane and a motorcycle on fire at Chungi Number 26.

The back-and-forth between police and PTI workers continued for an extended period on Jinnah Avenue, with police deploying tear gas and rubber bul-



lets. Due to a shortage of tear gas, PTI activists took the opportunity to advance, resulting in clashes where protesters pelted stones and used slingshots against the police.

Meanwhile, a significant police and Rangers contingent arrived at K-P House to detain Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, bringing along a prisoner transport vehicle. Reports surfaced of Gandapur's arrest, though he has reportedly not yet been

apprehended while his mobile phone was said to be turned off.

PTI leader Shaukat Yousofzai confirmed that the CM was still at the K-P House where he presented demands to the administration, including the immediate release of the party's founder and addressing grievances related to ongoing injustices.

Meanwhile, PTI activists advanced past China Chowk and near D-Chowk, prompting police to order the removal of media vehicles from the area.

Renewed clashes erupted at China Chowk as police began shelling again, leading to chaotic scenes at D-Chowk where protesters set fire to trees. Police retaliated with tear gas, forcing them back toward China Chowk.

Rangers were deployed to manage the situation and regain control of D-Chowk, dispersing the PTI demonstrators. However, heavy rain in Islamabad brought relief to the protesters, alleviating the effects of tear gas. During the confrontation, a journalist from a private TV channel was injured due to police shelling and rubber bullets. Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar condemned PTI's protests, stating that the timing of their actions was unfortunate and aimed at damaging Pakistan's international standing. He stressed the need for unity and responsibility at a time when the country is hosting the SCO summit. Dar argued that the protests were intended to create chaos and undermine Pakistan's diplomatic efforts, highlighting the importance of focusing on national stability over narrow political interests.—RT/Agency

Six Soldiers, Including Lt. Col., Martyred In Gun Battle With Terrorists In N Waziristan

RAWALPINDI: A lieutenant colonel was among six soldiers who embraced martyrdom during a gun battle with terrorists in North Waziristan's Spinwama area, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Saturday.

In a statement, the military's media wing said that the exchange of fire between the two sides took place on the night between October 4-5, during which "six Khwari" were also killed.

"Lt Col Muhammad Ali Shaukat was leading the operation against the khwari when he and five soldiers were martyred as a result of



intense exchange of fire," the ISPR stated.

The martyred soldiers were identified as Lance Naik Muhammad Ullah, Lance Naik Yusuf Ali, Lance Naik Shahid Ullah, Lance Naik Akhtar Zaman and Sepoy Jameel Ahmed. "Security forces are determined to eradicate the menace of terrorism. Sacrifices of our brave soldiers further strengthen our determination," the military's media wing added.—RT/Agency

Indian Foreign Minister Jaishankar Dismisses Possibility Of Bilateral Talks At SCO Summit In Pakistan

DELHI: India's Minister for External Affairs Subrahmanya Jaishankar on Saturday said he would not discuss bilateral relations when he visits Pakistan this month, the first such visit in nearly a decade, for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit.

"I expect there would be a lot of media interest because of the very nature of the relationship," Jaishankar said in response to a query at an event in New Delhi.

"But I do want to say it will be for a multilateral event. I am not going there to discuss India-Pakistan relations," he added.

"I am going there to be a good member of the SCO but since I am a courteous and



civil person, I will behave myself accordingly," he said.

The Indian foreign ministry confirmed a day ago that Jaishankar will visit Pakistan to participate in the summit on Oct 15-16 but did not say if he would meet any Pakistani leaders on the sidelines.

Relations between the two countries have gone through periods of thaw from time to time but have been largely frozen since they downgraded diplomatic ties in tit-for-tat moves in 2019.

Earlier, the Foreign Office (FO) had confirmed that Prime Minister Modi was invited to the SCO Council of Heads of Government meet-

ing, which Pakistan is hosting on Oct 15-16, under its rotating chairmanship.

FO spokesperson Muntaz Zahra Baloch had said, "An invitation has also been sent to the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi," adding that some countries had already confirmed their participation in the meeting.

Meanwhile, a comprehensive security plan for the upcoming SCO summit was approved on Wednesday at a meeting chaired by Federal Minister for Interior Mohsin Naqvi.

The interior minister said additional personnel from Pakistan Army, Rangers, FC and Punjab police will be deployed to ensure foolproof security for the guests.

In May last year, then-foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari had visited India to attend the two-day meeting of the SCO Council of Foreign Ministers.

He was the first Pakistani foreign minister to visit India in almost 12 years.

At a Senate panel later that month, Bhutto-Zardari called it a "productive and positive decision" to participate in the event.

"As far as the Kashmir issue, bilateral issues between Pakistan and India, and the responsibilities of multilateralism are concerned, my conclusion after the trip is that it is a productive and positive decision to participate in the event," he had said.—RT/Agency

Conflicting Reports Surround Gandapur's Arrest In Islamabad As PTI Protests Continue

ISLAMABAD: In a dramatic turn of events, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur was 'arrested' in Islamabad moments after he entered the federal capital along with party workers for holding protest despite imposition of Section 144 on Saturday.

The chief minister was arrested by a team of the Islamabad police in KP House for "damaging public properties and attack on the state". He has also been accused of misusing state resources for his party.

The KP chief minister had earlier resolved to reach D-Chowk in the federal capital for the PTI protest on Imran Khan's call despite a ban on public gatherings and rallies. Clashes also took place between police and PTI workers at several points in the federal capital.

However, official sources have denied arrest of the KP



chief minister while declaring the reports about his detention "false".

Earlier in the day, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said nobody would be allowed to sabotage the SCO summit to be held this month.

Speaking to media, the interior minister said he was in constant touch with the prime minister. He stated that the army and FC had been deployed in the capital and that maximum deployment of security personnel would be ensured.

Naqvi regretted that the protesters opened fire on police personnel besides using teargas shells. "We have every idea of the motives behind it," he said.

Meanwhile, KP Information Adviser Barrister Saif said security officials had sealed the KP House and taken Gandapur into custody. He said the mobile phone of the chief minister was switched off as "we have no contact with him at this time."—RT/Agency

Government Lacks Five Senators And Seven MNAs For Constitutional Amendments To Reach Required Majority

ISLAMABAD: The government benches are short of five senators and seven members of the National Assembly to carry out constitutional amendments, claim sources.

"We are more deficient in numbers than before but the effort is on to achieve the magic number (two-thirds majority in both the houses)," a government source said, adding that next week is important.

Media talked to three influential government members of Parliament but found none of them sure about achieving the goal of constitutional amendments regarding superior judiciary. They appear to be dependent on the work of some other



forces than relying on their own muscles.

One of these sources said that during the last effort in this respect, the government had more numbers than now as some of the MNAs, who had assured their support to the government for these constitutional amendments in the past, have run away. It is said that in the Senate the government is short of five votes whereas the deficiency in the NA is of seven members.

Maulana Fazlur Rehman has become a difficult challenge for the ruling coalition parties. Neither Pakistan

Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) nor even the interior minister Mohsin Naqvi has succeeded in convincing Maulana to side with the government.

Even if the government achieves the required number, there is an urge to have the JUI-F chief on its side instead of leaving him to join the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI).

According to a ruling party senator, the chances of getting through the constitutional amendments is becoming dim. However, another key MP from the treasury benches said when the 'state' takes a decision it makes the things happen.

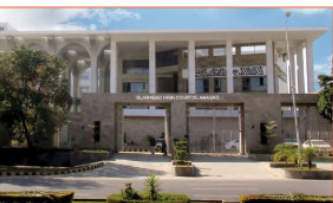
The government is also working on Akhtar Mengal of the Balochistan National Party but Maulana still remains the prime target to achieve. Before the last embarrassing anticlimax of the ruling parties' effort with regard to the judiciary related constitutional amendments, the government sources were more confident than now.

Many even in the PML-N set their eyes on Bilawal Bhutto, who is making the case for setting up a Federal Constitution Court. Bilawal, however, has also not yet succeeded in wooing Maulana Fazlur who remains relevant even after the latest Supreme Court decision in Article 63A case.—RT/Agency

IHC Directs Authorities To Designate Area For PTI's Lawful Protest

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has directed the local authorities to allocate a designated place to the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for organising its demonstration and to stop any unlawful protest in the federal capital that create situation of lockdown or disrupt peace during the period of SCO summit.

The directives were issued by IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq through a three-page order on Saturday after hearing the petition filed by Traders Welfare Association President Raja



Hassan Akhtar, who sought the court's order to stop the protest at D-Chowk amid the imposition of Section 144 (which bars political activities and gatherings) in the

twin cities to ensure security, ahead of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's meeting.

Clashes also broke out between the law enforcers and party workers, with both sides claiming that the other had attacked them.

Police fired tear gas at the protesters on Saturday in the capital as well as at the convoys trying to enter Islamabad, while the workers used slingshots to hit the law enforcers.

The PTI's protests entered the second day in Islamabad while it also started in Lahore, badly affecting the routine life due to blockades of roads, police-protesters' clashes, and suspension of metro services.

The high court's top judge noted that the freedom of assembly and movement are fundamental rights provided to the citizens under Articles 16 and 17 of the Constitution.

Justice Farooq stated that the Ministry of Interior and the Islamabad administration were responsible for the maintenance of peace and law and order in the federal capital.—RT/Agency

Sindh Police to conduct operations in katcha areas on decisive level

LARKANA: In the Katcha area, bandits are being targeted under the cover of darkness.

Significant progress has been made in the ongoing operation. Following the federal government's No Objection Certificate (NOC), the Sindh Police have procured military-grade weapons and technical equipment for the police forces in the districts of Kandhkot-Kashmore and Shikarpur. Rangers, police, and law enforcement agencies have developed a strategy to advance into the Katcha region, with a decision made to establish complete state authority in the area.

According to police sources, after receiving the NOC from the federal government, the Sindh Police have purchased military-grade weapons and technical equipment for the ongoing Katcha operation in the districts of Shikarpur and Kandhkot-Kashmore. The advanced weaponry includes drones capable of carrying warhead payloads that can



strike from 400 meters in the sky to distances of up to five kilometers, thermal imaging-equipped night vision drones, and launch pads. Additionally, anti-aircraft guns, LMGs, hand grenades, and modified hand-impact shell-firing mortar guns have also been acquired. These munitions are designed to explode upon impact with any surface, causing damage. The procurement of weapons by the Sindh Police is nearing completion, and drones have already been provided to the police in Kandhkot-Kashmore and Shikarpur. Other shipments

of weapons and technical equipment are expected soon. The police's APC (Armored Personnel Carrier) vehicles have also been upgraded to withstand fire from bandits' anti-aircraft guns.

Sources indicate that with the arrival of modern weaponry, the Rangers, police, and law enforcement agencies will jointly advance into the Katcha regions. They plan to encircle the area and conduct intelligence-based operations under the cover of night. This will involve shelling bandits' hideouts from 400 meters above, aiming to eradicate their presence and re-establish state authority by setting up police pickets in the relevant areas. The strategy has been finalized by DIG Larkana Nasir Aftab Pathan, the Wing Commander of Rangers, and the relevant SSPs, along with other law enforcement agencies. Meanwhile, efforts are also underway to rescue police officer Muhammad Ismail Shar, who was abducted by bandit Nisar Banglani from the police picket in the Naipur Kot area.

KSO launches campaign to end illegal land grabbing and other civic issues

THATTA: The Kohistan Sujag Organization in District Thatta has launched a vigorous campaign addressing critical issues in Kohistan, including illegal land occupations and the lack of job opportunities in wind energy projects. Utilizing Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds, the organization aims to restore blocked accounts for local residents while advocating for enhanced infrastructure, healthcare, and education in the area.



During a protest at the Thatta Press Club, leaders such as Muhammad Anwar Jakhro, Umar Burfat, and Abdul Jabbar Palari joined affected community members in condemning the land mafia. They accused these entities of displacing local residents and jeopardizing their livelihoods. Protesters highlighted that, despite rehabilitation efforts, essential services like hospitals remain absent. Demonstrators underscored the dire conditions in

Key demands included an end to illegal land occupations, the reopening of blocked accounts, and the restoration of closed schools. Protesters called for the repair and reconstruction of dilapidated school buildings and the establishment of hospitals for medical care. They urged authorities to provide housing for families affected by rain, compensate those impacted, and conduct a comprehensive survey of homes needing rehabilitation.

Eid Milad-e-Nabi (SAWW) celebrated at Govt Marvi Girls Degree College Badin

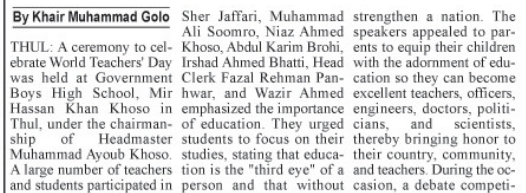

PTI Rally: Punjab Government Calls In Military For Lahore Security

LAHORE: The Punjab government has requested the deployment of the military in Lahore to secure sensitive buildings and key locations, including airports and other significant infrastructure, officials said.

The move follows a similar deployment of the armed forces in Islamabad, media reported.

According to documents released by the Punjab government, a formal request was sent to the federal government for military assistance in maintaining order across six districts of the province.

Earlier, authorities in Lahore sealed off all roads leading to Minar-e-Pakistan, placing containers at key access points, cutting off routes around the area.

The protest, announced by PTI for 2 pm, prompted the deployment of heavy security across the city.

Law enforcement officials were stationed at all major entry points, and central roads were blocked to prevent any disturbance or unrest.



Security forces also closed off roads from Kasur, Thokar Niaz Baig, Kahna Nau, and Canal Road, further limiting access to the protest site.

Lahore's residents, anticipating delays and disruptions, adjusted their daily activities as the situation unfolded. However, PTI has selected six alternative locations across the city for the demonstrations, including Data Darbar, Ravi Bridge, and the railway station, with three additional sites yet to be finalized.—RT/Agency

The statement said that the CTD recovered weapons, 5429 grams of explosives, 18 detonators, a 53-foot safety fuse wire, one IED bomb, pistols with bullets, 48 pamphlets of banned organizations and efforts to put terrorists and anti-state elements behind bars.—RT/Agency

A Nation on the Brink: Restraint is Crucial

Pakistan's political situation is teetering dangerously close to a full-scale crisis. The escalating tensions between the government and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) supporters threaten to push the country into a scenario where chaos could become uncontrollable. The arrests of PTI workers and the subsequent protests have only fanned the flames, with both sides digging in deeper, creating an atmosphere of volatility that cannot be sustained.

Pakistan cannot afford such upheaval at a time when the country's armed forces are already overstretched. A clash between the military and citizens would be disastrous. Both sides must step back and show restraint. Dialogue, not confrontation, is the only way forward. Let us not allow political rivalry to tear this nation apart. The cost would be far too great.

However, it seems that the Ronaldo-effect is not limited to the football pitch as the owner of YouTube's most subscribed channel Jimmy Donaldson, popularly known as "MrBeast", is seemingly concerned by the Portuguese footballer's rise on the video-sharing platform.

Seemingly worried about losing his crown, MrBeast has said that he will not lose the number one spot without a fight while hinting at joining hands with Argentine footballer Lionel Messi - widely compared with Ronaldo as arguably the greatest player of all time (GOAT).

"I'm not going down without a fight. I mean Messi, let's go! If Messi's the only thing standing between Ronaldo passing me [...] I mean, if I got to do a Messi collaboration," said the Logan Paul's "IM-

PAULSIVE" podcast.

"I broke the world record for most subs in a month, and two months later, Ronaldo comes on [...] If there were someone who would pass me, it would be Ronaldo," he remarked.

MrBeast's remarks come as the Al-Nassr striker launched his YouTube channel back in August and has since gained 63.9 million subscribers against MrBeast's 319 million.

The footballer has also expressed willingness to surpass the American YouTube star. "MrBeast on YouTube? In two years, let's try to beat him," Ronaldo said casually while speaking to reporters during a media talk ahead of Portugal's Nations League fixture against Croatia, last month.

Its worth noting that the Portuguese footballer's YouTube channel "UR Cristiano" had garnered 1.69 million subscribers within hours and the 39-year-old soon received the gold Play Button only a day after launching the channel. —Agency

Saud Shakeel Confident of Pakistan's Powerhouse Performance Ahead of Test Showdown with England

England's Joe Root, on the contrary, sounded confident for the series and revealed his plans to break new records by giving extraordinary performance.

She remained the top-scorer for Sri Lanka with a

40-ball 29.

Megan Schutt was the standout bowler for Australia, courtesy of her economical bowling figures of 3/12 in her four overs, followed by Molineux with two wickets, while Ashleigh Gardner and Georgia Wareham shared two wickets between them.

In response, Australia had an alike start as they lost three wickets, including their captain Alyssa Healy (4) and experienced all-rounder Ellyse Perry (3), inside the batting powerplay with just 35 runs on the board.

But the defending champions recovered, courtesy of an anchoring partnership between Mooney and Gardner.

The duo added 43 runs for the fourth wicket until Gardner perished with Australia in touching distance to a triumphant start to their Women's T20 World Cup title defence.

Gardner made 17 off 15 balls with the help of three fours.

Growers and different parties' leaders protest against rice millers

BADIN: In a show of solidarity, hundreds of growers and political activists from various parties took to the streets of Badin, rallying from DC Chowk to the Deputy Commissioner's office. The protest, which drew a large crowd, was organized in response to the drastic reduction in rice prices by local millers.

Key leaders, including Amir Azad Panhwar of Awami Tehreek, Jakhro Noohani of Sindh Taraqi Pasand Party (STP), Shah Nawaz Siyal Mirza of STP, Dilbar Sindh, Abdullah Chandio, convener of the

Urban Union, and Khalifa Tariq Aziz Memon, spoke at the rally, condemning the actions of what they termed the "rice millers' mafia."

The leaders alleged that the rice millers had, as part of a larger conspiracy, slashed prices from 3,500 rupees per maund to a shocking 2,500-2,600 rupees within just two days. This sudden price drop, they argued, severely undermines the livelihood of farmers who invest significant sums in cultivating their crops. "Farmers pour millions into their land, only to face such blatant exploitation," said one protester.

Adding to the frustration, the Deputy Commissioner of

Badin left his office without addressing the concerns raised by the protesting growers. In response, the demonstrators have called on the Sindh Commissioner in Hyderabad to intervene and set a minimum price of 4,000 rupees per maund for rice, comparable to the current rate for wheat.

The protest leaders also warned that their movement would escalate if their demands were not met. Plans are already underway for province-wide protests, with the possibility of a massive sit-in at the Chief Minister's House in Karachi, to demand fair pricing and justice for farmers.

Murad Highlights Rs218 Billion Allocation For Karachi Development Amid Limited Resources

Sharjeel Slams PTI For Promoting Political Instability Amid International Visits

KARACHI: In a recent press conference, Sindh Senior Minister for Information, Transport, Excise, and Narcotics Control, Sharjeel Inam Memon, expressed concern over the disruption caused by a political party's protests in Islamabad. He accused certain individuals of conspiring to undermine Pakistan's development and security, coinciding with the visit of Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim and the Shanghai Cooperation Conference. Memon highlighted that the Chief Minister of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa had orchestrated an attack on the capital, using militants equipped with cranes and machinery, exploiting government resources for this effort.



He criticized the narrative of "No Pakistan without the captain," pointing to international connections, including Zach Goldsmith's controversial support for Israel, and alleged links to Imran Khan. Memon warned that foreign conspiracies are at play, aiming to destabilize Pakistan's institutions and defense, strengthened by leaders like Zulfikar Ali Bhutto and Benazir Bhutto.

Memon also touched on the New World Order narrative, citing figures like Dr. Israr Ahmed, and denounced unconstitutional actions by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister. He reiterated the People's Party's opposition to Governor's rule but hinted at constitutional options if necessary. Addressing the Sindh government's initiatives, Memon affirmed their commitment to building 1 million houses for the homeless, with the province's economy showing steady improvement. He lauded Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari's efforts to maintain judicial independence, ensuring that the mistakes of the past would not be repeated. He also condemned the privileges afforded to

Imran Khan during his imprisonment, contrasting them with the sacrifices of People's Party leaders, including the arrest of Ms. Fryal Talpur and the restrictions placed on Asifa Bhutto Zardari.

FIA Arrests Two Passengers at Karachi Airport For Fraudulent Travel Documents



KARACHI: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Immigration unit arrested two passengers, including a woman, in separate operations at Karachi Airport, media reported on Saturday. In the first operation, a woman attempting to travel to Saudi Arabia for alleged begging activities was detained after failing to provide valid documents and hotel bookings. In the second operation, a man was arrested while trying to board a flight to Malawi, East Africa, using a fake South African visa attached to his passport. Both individuals have been taken into custody for further investigation.—RT/Agency

Four Drown at Manora Beach, Rescue Efforts Continue

KARACHI: In a tragic incident at Manora beach, four individuals, including two women, drowned, according to media reports on Saturday. A police spokesperson confirmed that the incident occurred near huts 65 and 67. 11 KP Police Officers And Afghan Nationals Arrested Among PTI Protesters

ISLAMABAD: Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi claimed that a total of 11 officers from the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) police and 120 Afghan nationals were arrested among Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) protesters in Islamabad, media reported on Saturday.

Speaking alongside IG Punjab Dr. Usman Anwar, Naqvi described how the protest, led by KP Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur, escalated into violence, including firing at police resulting in injuring several policemen.

According to Naqvi, a total of 564 individuals were arrested during the crackdown, including 11 KP police officers who were reportedly involved in the protest. The minister stressed that while there were wishes



from some quarters for casualties, but no lives were lost. However, due to the firing of 75 Punjab police officers and 31 Islamabad officers were injured, with one in serious condition.

Naqvi claimed that the protesters' goal was to stay until October 17 and disrupt the peace of Islamabad, while he commended the police for maintaining restraint which turned into violence.

He further noted that legal action would be taken against those responsible for calling the protest — including the armed protesters — which turned into violence.—RT/Agency

Ji Emir Urges Chief Minister Gandapur To Prioritize Governance Over Protests

LAHORE: Jamaat-e-Islami Emir Hafiz Naeem Rehman has advised the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur to focus on governance in his province rather than leading the protest.

He was addressing a press conference in Mansoorah on Saturday.

The Ji Emir also urged the government to give the right to protest to political parties in order to diffuse the political instability. He criticised the deployment of army in the federal capital under the pretext of providing security for the upcoming SCO conference, days before the event. "The government must refrain from pitting the army against its own people," he said, adding that any



military deployment should be reserved for the duration of the conference itself. ISPR: Terrorist Linked To Attack On Convoy Of Foreign Dignitaries Neutralized

RAWALPINDI: Law enforcement agencies (LEAs) have gunned down a terrorist involved in a recent attack on a convoy escorting foreign dignitaries in Swat, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Saturday.

A statement released by the ISPR said that the terrorist was killed during a joint intelligence-based operation (IBO) in the Chahragh area of District Swat on the night between October 4-5.

The attack on a convoy of foreign diplomats took place on September 22. Terrorists had used a roadside bomb, which resulted in the martyrdom of a police officer, who was part of the security detail, while four others suffered injuries.

The diplomats, who remained safe, were visiting the Swat Valley area at the invitation of the local chamber of commerce to showcase it as a potential tourist destination.

The bomb had exploded as the convoy was en route to the Malam Jabba hill station.

In its statement today, the military's media wing said that two terrorists — including "Kharij ring leader Atta Ullah [aka] Mehran — were killed after an intense exchange of fire, while another terrorist was apprehended.

Atta Ullah, the ISPR revealed, remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities in the area, including the attack on the convoy of foreign dignitaries. The military's media wing said that sanitisation of the area is being carried out to eliminate any other "Kharij" found in the area. "[...] security forces in coordination with law enforcement agencies are determined to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country," the statement added.—RT/Agency



Khawaja Asif: PTI Determined To Incite Chaos In Capital With Support From Armed Groups

SIALKOT: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz senior leader and Defence Minister Khawaja Asif labelled the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf as an 'armed group' who is hell-bent on creating chaos in the capital just ahead of SCO summit.

Addressing the media in Sialkot, the minister said it was for this reason the government could not hold dialogue with the PTI.

He said the PTI under the leadership of Imran Khan was repeated the same old script of 2014 when it organized sit-in on the arrival of the Chinese President Xi Jinping.

Now, it was making efforts to stall the arrangements of the upcoming session of SCO. He alleged the armed groups of Fina al Khawarij was also coming with the

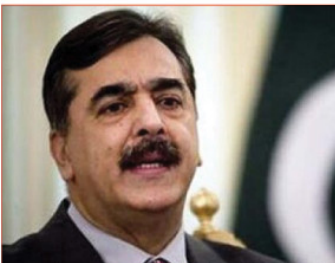
Gilani Condoles Martyrdom Of Soldiers In North Waziristan Operation
