## PM Hails Landmark Decision As Five IPPs 'Voluntarily' End Contracts, Saving Consumers A Whopping Rs60 Billion Annually

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Thursday that five independent power producers (IPPs) have "voluntarily" agreed to cancel their power purchase agreements with the federal government, providing Rs60 billion in annual relief to inflation-hit consumers, following extended talks with the authorities.



"By voluntarily agreeing to terminate their contracts prematurely with the government, these five IPPs prioritised the nation's interests over their own," the premier said addressing the Cabinet. "The 'take or pay' contracts with the five independent power producers have been fully terminated, and they will only receive the outstanding amounts owed by the government, without any interest."

ther, saving the national exchequer Rs411 billion a year, creating more fiscal space for the cash-strapped country.

PM Shehbaz said: "The rate of inflation was more than 30% [in the same month during the previous year], it now stands at 6.9%." The prime minister commended the five IPPs, stating they were the first rindrops in the effort to bring relief to the public. An official, who was part of the task force on the power sector, told The News that the modalities were being settled, and once finalised, all five IPPs would sign the documents to terminate the contracts. The development came after PM Shehbaz's administration, last month warned the IPPs' owners of "consequences" for failure to voluntarily terminate the power purchase agreements (PPAs). "The entire cabinet, including me, is grateful to these IPP owners," he added, further men-

tioning that the task force established for the reform of the power sector and the members of the federal cabinet deserve praise for this effort. He also highlighted the record increase in remittances from overseas Pakistanis. "Record remittances of \$8.8 billion in the last quarter reflect the confidence of overseas Pakistanis in government policies." During the cabinet meeting, the details of the agreement between the task force and the owners of the IPPs — including Hubco, Lalpur, Saba Power, Roush Power, and Atlas Power — and the process of concluding the agreements with them were presented before the cabinet. Out of these IPPs, Roush Power was established under a build-own-operate-and-transfer agreement, which will be privatised by the Privatisation Commission after the transfer of its ownership to the government.

The PM said that in the first phase, five IPPs were ending deals with the government, however, revision of PPAs with other IPPs would gradually lower the tariff fur-

## Government Targets Massive Rs8-10 Per Unit Power Tariff Cut As Five IPPs Terminate Contracts

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Energy (Power Division) Awasi Leghari said on Thursday the government was aiming for an Rs8-10 per unit tariff reduction as five independent power producers (IPPs) cancelled their contracts, a move expected to save the national exchequer Rs411 billion.



"We will reduce the power tariff in mutual consultation with generation companies," Leghari said while addressing a press conference after the federal cabinet's meeting in Islamabad.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, earlier in the day, announced that five IPPs have "voluntarily" agreed to cancel their power purchase agreements with the federal government, providing Rs60 billion in annual relief to inflation-hit consumers.

The high cost of electricity has become a contentious political issue, with

opposition parties leveraging public dissatisfaction to criticise the incumbent government's handling of the energy sector and agreements with independent power producers (IPPs).

The burden of high electricity tariffs falls disproportionately on the middle and lower-income segments of society, fueling public outrage and eroding trust in the government's ability to manage the economy.

Analysts noted that a successful renegotiation with both local and interna-

"The decision would provide Rs60 billion annual relief to the electricity consumers and cumulatively save Rs411 billion to the national exchequer," Leghari said.

Hoping to achieve the target of reducing the power tariff by Rs 8-10 per unit in a few months, the minister said the government was undertaking various measures to ease the burden on the masses. He also thanked Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Asim Muneer for his assistance in re-negotiating the agreements. "We will now look forward to working with remaining IPPs," he added.

The energy minister also mentioned the establishment of an Independent System and Market Operator (ISMO), which he termed a "major win" for his ministry. "After its operationalisation, consumers

will be able to buy electricity like shares," he said. A day earlier, the Cabinet Committee on Energy (CCE) approved the establishment of ISMO, an independent multiparty market, for power generation and purchase to create a competitive environment and gradually end the government's role as a sole purchaser of electricity. "We are creating an independent environment for the sale and purchase of electricity," Leghari said, adding that the power purchasers will not be dependent only on the Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPPA-G). Furthermore, he said the government was considering introducing a programme, which he said would increase the usage of electricity in winter. "In this regard, a decision will be made after taking all stakeholders into confidence," he added.—RT/Agency

## PML-N And PPP Reach Groundbreaking Consensus On Crucial Constitutional Amendments

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Muslim League - Nawaz (PML-N) President Nawaz Sharif and Pakistan Peoples Party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari have held discussions during which the two leaders reached an agreement on constitutional amendments.



Bilawal called on Nawaz Sharif at the Punjab House, where the former Prime Minister warmly welcomed the PPP leader. The two leaders also exchanged views on the country's political situation.

The discussion primarily focused on judicial reforms and constitutional amendments.

They decided to present these amendments in Parliament following further consultation, with the timeline for this process to be determined in consultation with other political parties.

Maryam Aurangzeb, Rana Sanaullah, Perviz Rashid, Irfan Siddiqui, and Ahsan Iqbal attended of the meeting from the PML-N.

Meanwhile, the PPP delegation included Yousaf Raza Gillani, Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, Khurshid Shah, Murtaza Wahab, Murtaza Javed Abbasi, Naveed Qamar, and Palwasha Khan. Nawaz Sharif is scheduled to attend a dinner in honour of a Saudi delegation later tonight.—RT/Agency

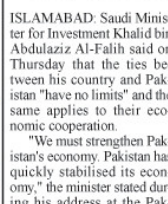
## Security Forces Take Down Four Terrorists In High-Stakes KP Intelligence-Based Operations



RAWALPINDI: Security forces have neutralised four terrorists in two separate intelligence-based operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) districts on October 9 and 10, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Thursday. Two terrorists were killed after an intense exchange of fire during an IBO in Janikhel area of Bannu District on October 9, the statement read. In another operation, security personnel effectively engaged terrorists' location in Hassan Khel area of North Waziristan district on October 10. After an intense gunfight, two more terrorists were killed in the operation. Weapons and ammunition were also recovered from killed terrorists, who remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against the security forces as well as abductions and target killing of innocent civilians, said the military's media wing. Sanitisation of the area is being carried out to eliminate any other terrorists found in the area as security forces are determined to

wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country, it concluded. Pakistan has experienced a spike in terrorism since the Taliban returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021. Most terror incidents are reported in provinces bordering the neighbouring country — Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan. Besides a spike in terrorist activities within the borders, Pakistan has also witnessed a significant surge in cross-border attacks from the neighbouring country targeting security forces in recent months. Islamabad accuses Kabul's new rulers of failing to root out militants sheltering on Afghan soil as they prepare to stage assaults on Pakistan. Against this backdrop, the federal cabinet in June this year approved Operation Azm-e-Istehkam, a reinvigorated national counter-terrorism campaign following the Central Apex Committee's recommendations under the National Action Plan to root out terrorism.—RT/Agency

## Pak-Saudi Economic Ties Have No Limits, Declares Saudi Investment Minister Al-Falih



ISLAMABAD: Saudi Minister for Investment Khalid bin Abdulrahman Al-Falih said on Thursday that the ties between his country and Pakistan "have no limits" and the same applies to their economic cooperation.

"We must strengthen Pakistan's economy. Pakistan has quickly stabilised its economy," the minister stated during his address at the Pakistan-Saudi Business Forum in Islamabad, where he is on a three-day visit.

The minister's comments were echoed by the World Bank, which has said that Pakistan saw a quick recovery while noting that its economy would grow by 2.8% in the current fiscal year.

A high-level 135-member Saudi delegation, led by the investment minister, landed in Islamabad a day earlier and is expected to sign agreements worth \$2 billion with Pakistan.

Speaking at the event, the Saudi dignitary underscored the rich history shared between the two countries and said: "We are family, not friends [...] Pakistan, Saudi Arabia [relations] do not need any [formal] agreement [to prove themselves]."

"Our economy and social values are linked together [...] As many as 2.5 million Pakistanis are working in Saudi Arabia, he added.



Referring to his interaction with President Asif Ali Zardari and Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Asim Muneer, Al-Falih recalled that the former has emphasised the development and expansion of Pak-Saudi friendship, whereas the latter assured of the establishment of a single window in the Kingdom for Saudi investments in the country. Noting the significance of facilitation by the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) for his country, the Saudi minister said that the army chief has insisted on turning the red-tape bureaucracy into a "red carpet" for the Kingdom. Providing details of his visit, the investment minister said that as many as 27 memoranda of understanding (MoUs) will be signed between Riyadh and Islamabad. Highlighting that the Kingdom has increased its cooperation and investment in Pakistan, he said while reaffirming his country's resolve to support

Islamabad. Furthermore, Al-Falih acknowledged the Ministry of Commerce's commitment to enhancing trade relations between the two countries, noting that bilateral trade has already surged by approximately 80%, rising from \$3 billion in 2019 to \$5.4 billion. He also expressed enthusiasm about the announcement from the Saudi Crown Prince regarding a \$5 billion investment in Pakistan, revealed during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's recent visit shortly after he took office. "I'm delighted to have the Public Investment Fund (PIF) represented among us," he remarked. "With the vision, determination, and dynamic private sectors of our leaders and peoples, along with investors from both sides, it is an honour to be part of this Saudi delegation and to engage with our Pakistani partners," added the dignitary.—RT/Agency

## Mustafa Nawaz Demands Full Transparency In Constitutional Amendments Process

ISLAMABAD: "We don't want to restrain the Parliament from its right to amend the constitution," former senator Mustafa Nawaz Khokhar said on Thursday.



In a statement, Mustafa Nawaz, a former PPP senator, said that we are only pleading to bring transparency in the issue of the proposed constitutional amendments. "The government should be directed to make the constitutional bill draft public and get feedback from people," Khokhar said.

"Thang God, Maulana Sahib (Fazlur Rehman), has impeded the constitutional amend, people lauding his stance," he said.

Mustafa Nawaz Khokhar has also filed a petition in the Islamabad High Court (IHC) recently, seeking an order to make the draft of the proposed constitutional amendment public and to allow

people to voice their opinions before it is passed.

In his petition, Khokhar named the federal government as respondent. The petition argues that the National Assembly's own rules require any proposed legislation to be published in the official gazette, and at least eight weeks should be given to the public to offer feedback on the amendment.—RT/Agency

## Ji Praises Bold Move To Cancel Contracts With Five IPPs, Applauding Government's Decision

LAHORE: Jamaat-Is-lami (JI) chief Hafiz Naeemur Rehman has welcomed the termination of contracts with the IPPs, calling it a positive step.



Speaking a press conference in Lahore, he said the saved capacity payments should be used to reduce electricity bills for the public.

He stressed that his party's protest movement will continue, maintaining pressure on the government. Hafiz Naeem also called for an end to taxes on electricity bills, reducing the fuel levy and tax-

ing large landowners.

He criticised the sugar mafia's influence and raised concerns about the looming food crisis due to reduced wheat cultivation.—RT/Agency

## FO Cautions Diplomats To Limit Movement During High-Stakes SCO Summit

ISLAMABAD: The Foreign Office has advised all the diplomats to consider limiting their movements during the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, which is scheduled to take place from October 15 to 16 in Islamabad.



Islamabad is all set to host the SCO Council of Heads of Government meeting next week with major foreign leaders, including Indian External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar visiting the country.

To ensure law and order situation in the federal capital during the forthcoming SCO summit, the federal government has deployed Pakistan Army's troops in Islamabad from October 5 to 17, under Article 245 of the Constitution.

In a letter, addressing all resident diplomatic missions, UN agencies, funds, and international organisations based in Islamabad, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said

the government had instituted heightened security measures to ensure safety of incoming dignitaries and delegates as well as success of the summit. The FO requested the diplomats to limit their movements during the international event, both within and outside the city. It further advised them to confine their activities "primarily" to the Diplomatic Enclave and Red Zone areas. It said the missions may follow the daily traffic updates by Islamabad Traffic Police, which are shared through police's various channels including social media handles. ## DC TMK Shahzeb Shaikh Addresses Rice Growers' Urgent Concerns In Major Meeting

Farmers raised issues including moisture deductions in rice, receiving 41 kilograms instead of the standard 40 kilograms per mound, ex-

cessive labor charges, and poor treatment from mill owners.

The Deputy Commissioner also listened to mill owners' concerns. The meeting concluded with several decisions: mill owners will accept 40 kilograms per mound instead of 41; no deductions will be made for moisture levels up to 21%, while 200 rupees will be charged for 15% moisture; and labor costs will be reduced from 20 to 16 rupees per mound. Standard ma-

chines will be replaced with better equipment for moisture checks, and fair prices will be ensured for farmers.

The Deputy Commissioner emphasized that respect is a fundamental right, urging mill owners to improve their conduct towards farmers. He noted that Tando Muhammad Khan has nearly 100 rice mills, some of which will be visited for surprise inspections to address legitimate concerns and ensure fairness for farmers.

## Mysterious Disappearance Of Youth In Tando Jam Ignites Furious Protests

TANDO JAM: In Tando Jam, a young man has mysteriously gone missing after going to a water channel, leading his family to accuse irrigation officials of abducting him. Relatives held a protest in front of the Irrigation SDO office, demanding the recovery of the missing youth.

During the protest, residents Muhammad Juman Samo, Muhammad Usman Samo, Hari Kolhi, Ramji Kolhi, and others spoke to the media, stating that the missing young man, Pancho Kolhi, was taken away by irrigation officials including Sub-Engineer Zohaib Jamal and Inspector Ghulam Sarwar Khoso, along with unknown individuals, while he was working on agricultural land. Despite three days passing since the incident, there has been no trace of him, and the Tando Jam police station remains oblivious to

the situation. They further expressed that they have been protesting for the past three days for the recovery of the missing youth but no action has been taken. The alleged abduction has left Pancho Kolhi's wife and mother in a state of distress and fainting spells due to the shock of his disappearance.

The family lamented that they have visited the irrigation office multiple times to inquire about the young man, but no one is willing to provide information.

## Thatta's Paddy Growers Struggle Against Market Monopoly, Facing Unfair Challenges

THATTA: The paddy market in Thatta district is currently besieged by a troubling monopoly involving hoarders, middlemen, and mortgagees, particularly those engaged in bulk paddy purchases. These entities have tightened their grip on the market, resorting to tactics that include slashing prices and manipulating the standard 40 kg bag by reducing its weight by 3 to 5 kg. This exploitation is causing significant financial distress for local farmers, cultivators, and landlords, who are already struggling to make ends meet.

The President of the Thatta Agricultural Council, Faqir Shah Nawaz Brohi, along with prominent figures such as Ghulam Mustafa Magsi and Abdullah Magsi, have

voiced their deep concerns regarding the drastic fall in paddy prices. Reports indicate that prices have plummeted from Rs. 70,000 per mound to just Rs. 48,000, making it increasingly challenging for farmers to sustain their livelihoods in the face of such overwhelming economic pressure.

Adding to this already dire situation is a dual crisis in the region: severe water shortages coupled with damage from recent rains. These factors have led to a substantial decrease in crop yields per acre, further exacerbating the challenges faced by local farmers.

Traders are compounding the issue by deducting an additional 4 to 5 kilograms from each mound of paddy, significantly reducing farmers' earnings and pushing many to the brink of financial

collapse. To make matters worse, a recent surge in forest fires has devastated additional crops, plunging farmers deeper into financial despair. With their livelihoods hanging by a thread, the agricultural community in Thatta is now calling for urgent intervention to address these issues and restore fair pricing in the paddy market.

The situation demands immediate attention from local authorities and agricultural departments to protect the interests of farmers and ensure a sustainable future for the agricultural sector in Thatta. Without timely support and action, many farmers may find themselves unable to recover from these compounded adversities, threatening both their livelihoods and the region's agricultural heritage.

## IHC Orders CDA To Reopen KP House In Bold Move

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Thursday ordered to de-seal the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa House in the federal capital, two days after the Capital Development Authority (CDA) sealed it.

The court's orders were issued by IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq during the hearing of a plea filed by the KP government.

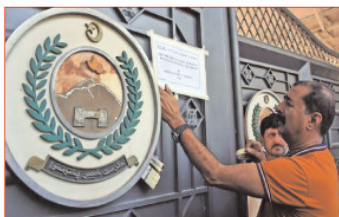
Justice Farooq told the CDA lawyer that the authority can issue notices to seal the property according to the law. "Don't make it seem like you are targeting someone."

Presenting arguments during the hearing, the authority's lawyer said that illegal construction has taken place on the property and some dues are also still pending with the first notice given to the KP administration in 2014.

The lawyer insisted that the lease of the property expired in 2014.

"When did CDA issue notices?" asked the IHC chief justice, insisting that a notice should have been issued even before sealing the house.

The judge further remarked: "It is a provincial house. [It] is shameful to seal it."



The KP government, a day earlier, filed a plea against the provincial house being sealed by the CDA.

In its petition, the provincial government maintained that the house - a property of the KP government - had been sealed "illegally".

The plea added that when the KP administration moved the Peshawar High Court (PHC) against the CDA's action, it was told to take the matter to the IHC which was termed as the proper forum for the case.

The court was requested to declare the sealing of the house and the act of taking the KP government's vehicles into custody "illegal", while seeking to reopen the property.

The matter came in the fore after the CDA, in an unprecedented move, on

Adnan, who claimed that Aleema and Uzma Khan had provided explosive materials.

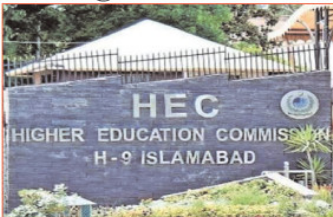

The tragic incident occurred as Safara was on her way to school in the morning when Aun shot her in the head, which resulting in the death of the female teacher.

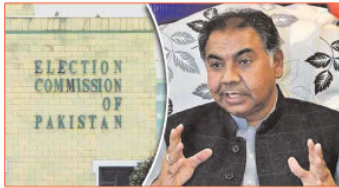
The CCTV footage of the incident also surfaced, showing the suspect fleeing the scene after the shooting and taking the victim's mobile phone with him.—RT/Agency

## The Muslim Ummah Prevails, But When Will Pakistan?

Pakistan's recent agreements with Saudi Arabia, worth \$2.2 billion, provide a much-needed lifeline at a time of economic instability. The support from Saudi Arabia, and the broader Muslim ummah, is a reminder of the strong bonds that unite us, helping Pakistan to weather difficult times. This show of solidarity is praiseworthy, and the goodwill demonstrated by Saudi Arabia is invaluable. However, this also raises a larger, more critical question: How long will Pakistan continue to rely on foreign aid and loans to stabilize its economy?

The relationship between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia has been a cornerstone of our foreign re-

lations, but our nation's continued dependence on external financial support, whether from Saudi Arabia or institutions like the Interna-



tional Monetary Fund (IMF), reflects deeper structural weaknesses. While such support can provide temporary relief, it cannot serve as a long-term solution to Pakistan's economic woes.

At what point will Pakistan be able to stand on its own two feet? For too long, we have been caught in a cycle of borrowing to keep the

economy afloat. This is not sustainable. Economic sovereignty requires more than just international goodwill; it demands sound policy, governance, and reform. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's acknowledgment that he hopes this IMF program will be the last one is welcome, but the reality is that the path to true economic independence requires consistent effort.

Pakistan's potential is immense, from its strategic location to its human capital, but until we address the fundamental issues hindering growth, the dream of a self-sufficient Pakistan will remain just that—a dream. We must seize this opportunity to reform, so we no longer have to rely on others to secure our future.

KHAIRPUR: A troubling scandal has emerged in Khairpur, where former district officials are accused of colluding with land mafias to unlawfully seize properties associated with significant cultural and religious sites, including the historic Gharib Shah shrine, Masjid Ali, Imambargah, and a local cemetery. The allegations center around former Deputy Commissioner Sharjeel Noor Channa, former Assistant Commissioner Safdar Mirani, and former Mukhtiar Abdul Hakeem Dharejo, who are said to have forged false reports to facilitate the illegal takeover of these properties.

According to sources familiar with the matter, these district officials played a crucial role in obstructing access

to the homes of long-time residents, prompting widespread protests from the community. ## Three Dead, Five Injured In Devastating Road Accident

NOORIBAD: A tragic road accident unfolded last night on the motorway under the jurisdiction of the Lonokot police station, resulting in the loss of three lives and leaving five others injured. The collision involved two cars and a Mazda, marking a devastating turn of events for those involved.

## England Shatters Records, Posts Jaw-Dropping Highest-Ever Innings Total Against Pakistan



MULTAN: England have now posted the highest ever innings total against Pakistan by any team, as the visitors accumulated more than 800 runs on the fourth day of the first Test match against Pakistan in Multan.

This is the second time in cricket history that any team has scored more than 700 runs in a Test match against Pakistan.

Earlier, West Indies scored 790-3 against the Men in Green in 1958.

This is the first time in the 21st century that a team has scored 800 runs, and only the fourth time in cricket Test history.

The last time Sri Lanka surpassed this landmark figure as they made 952-6 against India in 1997.

Whereas, England twice scored above 800 earlier. Once, England made 849 against the West Indies in 1930 and then 903 against Australia in 1938.

## England's Record Run Feat Will Mean Everything with a Test Win, Declares Root



MULTAN: Joe Root became England's all-time top run scorer after he surpassed batting great Alastair Cook during the first Test against Pakistan but the former captain put celebrations on the back-burner on Thursday as they wait to seal a famous victory.

Root's patient 262 in the first innings, combined with Harry Brook's blockbuster near-run-a-ball 317 propelled England to a mammoth total of 823-7 before they declared their highest test total since the second World War.

Root's knock has placed him fifth on the all-time list with 12,064 runs and Cook led the first Test in 2004 with 1,400 runs. Root and Cook were scored in the first innings on a flat track, now seems possible after Pakistan's top order collapse.

"They (records) are pretty cool things. It would mean a lot more if we can win this Test match. You look at the situation where they had 556 on the scoreboard and to be ahead in the game is the best thing," Root told the BBC.

"It doesn't mean a lot at the moment. I feel like I am



going to play a lot more cricket for England. It's obviously nice and I am sure when I finish my career, I will look back and feel good about it.

"It will be a nice thing to look back on at the right time. I want to contribute for a long while and make big scores like this one and hopefully win more test matches for England." The celebrations were muted and the 33-year-old said there was a lack of emotion partly due to the heat. "Just the amount of energy that is taken out of you playing in these conditions is huge. It's been quite pleasing to acclimatise and just drawing that mental resilience," Root added.—Agency

## Kendrick Perkins' Company Nilly Faces Massive Backlash Over Controversial NIL Deals with College Athletes



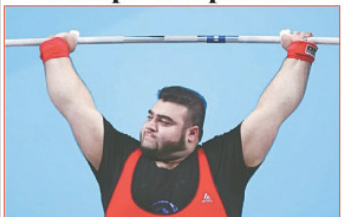
ESPN NBA analyst Kendrick Perkins' new company, Nilly, has sparked significant criticism and concern over its business model, which offers college athletes upfront cash in exchange for a portion of their future name, image, and likeness (NIL) earnings.

While the company promotes the idea of providing financial security to athletes, critics warn that the arrangement could exploit young athletes, comparing it to high-interest loans.

According to ESPN, Nilly, co-founded by Perkins and Wall Street veteran Chris Riccardi, offers athletes payments ranging from \$25,000 to hundreds of thousands of dollars. In exchange, the company claims exclusive rights to the athlete's NIL for up to seven years and takes between 10% and 50% of their NIL earnings. This model has raised red flags among consumer protection experts and financial advisers, who caution that such deals could prey on inexperienced athletes.

Public criticism has been swift, with many expressing concerns that the arrangement is predatory. One user on X, formerly Twitter, wrote, "You ought to be ashamed of yourself for financial security to athletes, critics warn that the arrangement could exploit young athletes, comparing it to high-interest loans."

## 'King of Clay' Nadal Set to Bow Out of Tennis After Struggling with Injury in Final Chapter



PARIS: Rafael Nadal will call time on his illustrious but injury-plagued career after next month's Davis Cup Finals, the 22-times Grand Slam champion announced on Thursday, as one of the greatest players in the sport prepares for an emotional farewell.

Nadal, who won a record 14 French Open titles, had said previously he expected to retire this year after a hip injury that required surgery limited his appearances in 2023.

The 38-year-old was a surprise selection for the November 19-24 Davis Cup Final 8 in Malaga, after last competing at the Paris Olympics in July and subsequently missing the US



Open and Laver Cup over fitness concerns.

"I am here to let you know I am retiring from professional tennis," Nadal said in a video posted on social media. "The reality is it has been some difficult years, these last two especially. I don't think I have been able to play without limitations. The former world number

one, Nadal, who has won two Australian Opens, two Wimbledon crowns and four US Opens plus Olympic gold and four Davis Cups on top of his multiple French Open titles, said finishing his career in Spanish colours at the team event felt right. He will link up again with four-times major champion Carlos Alcaraz after the duo played together at the Paris Games.

"I am very excited that my last tournament will be the final of the Davis Cup and representing my country," said Nadal. "I think I've come full circle since one of my first great joys as a professional tennis player was the Davis Cup final in Sevilla in 2004.—Agency

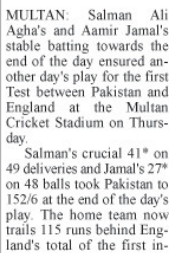
## Bangladesh's Shakib Al Hasan Issues Apology After Deafening Silence Amid National Unrest



DHAKA: Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan has tendered an apology for his silence during mass protests in the country which saw scores of people being killed in the student-led movement that succeeded in ousting the country's former prime minister Sheikh Hasina in August. Taking to social media, Shakib said, "Firstly, I would like to pay my respects to all the students who sacrificed their lives, led the anti-discrimination movement, and were martyred or injured during the people's uprising." The apology comes after the experienced cricketer - who was a parliament member of the Hasina-led Awami League party - was booked in a murder case involving the death of a garment factory worker. Shakib has not been home since protests erupted in July but the Bangladesh Cricket Board has assured him he will not be harassed on his return. "I extend my deepest respect and condolences to them and their families," read the cricketer's post on Facebook. "While no sacrifice can compensate for

the loss of a loved one, nothing can fill the void of losing a child or a brother, to those of you who were hurt by my silence during this critical period, I respect your feelings and sincerely apologise. If I were in your place, I too might have been upset," he added. The all-rounder is considered the greatest cricketer Bangladesh has produced but his political past places the former captain in a tricky position as an interim government supervises a power transition. He has played 71 tests, 247 One-Day Internationals and 129 Twenty20 Internationals, amassing 14,730 runs and claiming 712 wickets to establish himself as one of the leading all-rounders of his era. "I want to say goodbye with all of you around. At the moment of farewell, I want to shake hands with those whose applause compelled me to play better," the former skipper said while requesting the fans to be present for his final test match against South Africa in Dhaka starting from October 21.—Agency

## PAK vs ENG: Agha and Jamal Heroics Save Pakistan After Collapse at 152/6



MULTAN: Salman Ali Agha's and Aamir Jamal's stable batting towards the end of the day ensured another day's play for the first Test between Pakistan and England at the Multan Cricket Stadium on Thursday.

Salman's crucial 41\* on 49 deliveries and Jamal's 27\* on 48 balls took Pakistan to 152/6 at the end of the day's play. The home team now trails 115 runs behind England's total of the first innings.

Later on, wickets of Babar Azam, Saim Ayub and Mohammad Rizwan toppled in the next few overs, leaving Pakistan at 5/5.

were batting but it again went downhill for Pakistan when Shakeel fell in the 24.2 over. Earlier, England declared their first Test innings at a mammoth 823-7 before tea on the fourth day of the opening Test against Pakistan on Thursday for a lead of 267 runs.

Harry Brook notched up a superb 317 with a triple century and Joe Root hit 262 as

both batsmen made their highest Test scores on the flat wicket at the Multan Cricket Stadium.

Resuming their innings from 492-3 on the fourth day of the first Test, Root and Brook overhauled Pakistan's 556-run total by reaching 658-3 at lunch.

The visitors built a first innings lead of 102 runs with Root on 259 not out and Brook unbeaten on 218. The score marks the highest Test score for both batsmen.

Both players took their fourth-wicket partnership to 409 off 488 deliveries at the Multan Cricket Stadium.

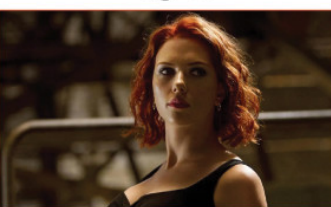
Meanwhile, the Shan Masood-led line-up faced a setback as the team's leg-spinner Abrar Ahmad didn't come out on the field due to fever.

As per the publication, Ellie's trip came after she partied with a whole host of stars in London last week at Chiltern Firehouse's 10th anniversary party.

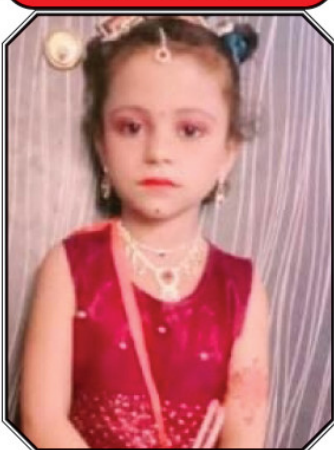
Furthermore, the singer wore a corset gown with a thigh-high slit and teamed the risqué mesh number with a pair of platform heels.

## Grand Jirga Empowers CM Gandapur To Lead Critical Peace Negotiations In KP

PESHAWAR: A Grand Jirga organised by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government and attended by top officials including Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi has empowered Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur to hold talks with dissenting parties to improve law and order situation in the province.



CM Gandapur hosted the high-level meeting at CM House on Thursday to discuss the current political and security situation in the province and reach a consensus plan of action after a three-day Pashtoon Qaumi Jirga was announced by the banned Pashtun Tahafuz Movement (PTM).

PTM members yesterday who set up tents near Regi Lalma on the Khyber district side, close to the boundary with Peshawar, media reported.

In today's high-level sitting, CM Gandapur requested the participants, including the interior minister, to refrain from taking any action until his permission.

Responding to Gandapur's request, Naqvi said that the federal government has no objection to holding talks hosted by the KP chief minister, the sources added.

Adviser to KP CM on Information Barister Mohamad Ali Saif said in a statement that the heads of the political parties came on the same page to establish peace in the province.

He added that CM Gandapur has been given full authority to find peaceful solutions to the prevailing issues and expressed confidence in his leadership.

Saif detailed that consultations were underway between Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barister Gohar Ali Khan,

CM Gandapur, Interior Minister Naqvi, Governor Kundli and the parties' heads to formulate future strategy.

A day ago, Interior Minister Naqvi had expressed deep concern over the upcoming three-day Pashtoon Qaumi Jirga organised by the recently-proscribed PTM and said that the state would not allow parallel judicial system [in the country] in any case.

He also warned that anyone found involved in facilitating the banned organisation would be dealt with iron fist. The coalition government, led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, on October 6 issued a notification under Section 11B of the Anti-Terrorism Act 1997, banning the PTM, citing the group's activities as a threat to peace and security. The provincial government conveyed its reservations to the Centre over the move and complained that the ban on PTM has triggered tensions in the province.

However, the KP government yesterday announced to strictly implement the ban on the outfit.—RT/Agency

## Finance Ministry Unveils Jaw-Dropping Rs3.4 Trillion In Sales Tax Evasion Across Multiple Sectors

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb said on Thursday that there was evasion of Rs3.4 trillion in sales tax evasion out of a total of Rs7 trillion in tax theft in different sectors of the economy.

Aurangzeb was addressing a press conference along with Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) Chairman Rashid Mahmood Langrial to discuss a study on sales tax evasion.

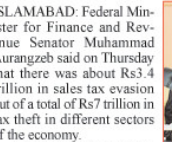
The study found that only 14% out of 300,000 manufacturers liable to register have done so, and many registered entities misreport turnover, claim excess input tax, and use fake invoices.

Sales tax in Pakistan is collected through VAT mode, relying on businesses to collect tax from buyers.

However, this trust has been breached on a massive scale, the minister said sharing findings from five sectors including iron and steel, cement, beverages, batteries, and textile.

He said malpractices were widespread, with most entities claiming excess input tax.

In the iron and steel sector, 33 large businesses, representing over 50% of total sales, evaded sales tax by



claiming Rs29 billion in excess input tax, mainly through scrap metal and coal purchases.

Likewise, in the battery sector, six active cases, representing 99% of total sales, claimed Rs11 billion in excess input tax, primarily through lead purchases while in the cement sector, 19 active cases claimed Rs18 billion in excess input tax in FY23-24, mainly through coal purchases.

In addition, the beverages sector with 16 active cases, representing 99% of aerated water sales, claimed Rs15 billion in excess input tax, mainly through sugar, plastics, and services purchases.

In the textile sector, with 228 active cases claimed Rs169 billion in excess input tax, mainly through services, chemicals, coal, and packaging purchases. Detailing steps to combat tax evasion, the fi-



nance czar said that the government has intensified enforcement measures, including arrests and criminal cases, resulting in a significant decrease in fake input tax claims in FY23-24.

However, massive evasion persists, and more measures are being planned to curb it. He said that the apex taxation body has identified evidence of tax fraud in various sectors, including 11 battery sector cases, 897 iron & steel sector cases, and 253 beneficiaries of fake input claims on coal purchases. Those involved face arrest and imprisonment of up to 10 years, heavy penalties, and fines. On the occasion, the FBR chairman emphasised that input tax adjustment fraud was a serious issue, warning CFOs to refrain from signing incorrect returns, especially before the October 15 deadline.

## Saudi Minister and COAS Strengthen Bilateral Cooperation In Strategic Talks

RAWALPINDI: Saudi Arabian Minister of Investment Khalid Bin Abdulaziz Al Falih and Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Syed Asim Munir discussed initiatives to strengthen "ever-growing brotherly" bilateral cooperation in a variety of sectors, the military's media wing said on Thursday.

Initially scheduled for October 1, the bidding date was moved to October 30. However, further issues have since arisen, leaving the privatisation initiative in jeopardy.

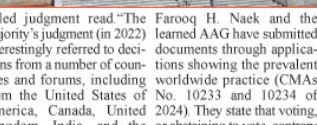

## SC Delivers Landmark Detailed Judgement In Controversial Article 63-A Interpretation Case

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan on Thursday issued its 23-page detailed judgment in the Article 63-A interpretation case, ruling the earlier verdict against the clear language and mandate of the constitution, media reported. A five-member SC bench headed by Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa and comprising Justice Aminud Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhel, Justice Mazhar Alam Miankhalil, and Justice Naeem Afghani through a short order issued on October 2 annulled its 2022 verdict that barred lawmakers from going against party directions when voting in parliament. In its detailed judgment, the SC ruled that its earlier verdict opened the way to transform the leader of a political party into a 'dictator'—"Nothing can be more undemocratic, the majority's judgment has opened the way to transform the leader of a political party into a dictator, simply because the party's leader can never be challenged," the de-



tailed judgment read "The majority's judgment (in 2022) interestingly referred to decisions from a number of countries and forums, including from the United States of America, Canada, United Kingdom, India, and the Privy Council. Foreign legal books and authors were also quoted. But, this appears to have been done, without first ascertaining the law in the respective countries regarding defections, and the consequences thereof." The detailed judgment read that the court sought the assistance of counsel for briefing on the international position on defections and its consequences. "Learned senior counsel Mr.

Farooq H. Naek and the learned AAG have submitted documents through applications showing the prevalent worldwide practice (CMAs No. 10233 and 10234 of 2024). They state that voting, or abstaining to vote, contrary to the party or its leader's direction does not result in automatic disqualification in any country of the world. The learned AAG pointed out that an automatic disqualification law was enacted in Papua New Guinea, but its Supreme Court (in Reference No. 11 of 2008) struck it down (copy of the judgment has been filed with CMA No 10234/2024)," the detailed judgment read.—RT/Agency
