

he Pakistan cricket team, once a symbol of national pride and a formidable force in the cricketing world, now finds itself in a state of disarray. What was once a team that evoked fear and admiration on the pitch has become a laughing stock, unable to string together consistent performances. Their recent series of defeats, including a whitewash by Bangladesh and a humiliating innings loss to England despite scoring over 500 runs in the first innings, has left fans and experts questioning the state of the game in the country.

The problem isn't just about losing matches; it's about a systemic decline. Pakistan cricket has long been known for pro-
