Ahsan Iqbal Vows To Tackle MQM-P's Uproar Over Controversial Constitutional Amendments

KARACHI: Pakistan Muslim League - Nawaz (PML-N) leader and Federal Minister for Planning, Development and Reform, Prof Ahsan Iqbal, has said that he arrived in Karachi on the Prime Minister's directives, where Muttahida Quami Movement-P (MQM-P) was taken into confidence regarding the proposed constitutional amendments.

He assured that any concerns would be addressed.

Speaking at a joint press conference with MQM-P, Ahsan Iqbal remarked that no democratic party can oppose these amendments.

He stressed that parliamentary affairs should not be dictated by judicial rulings, as political decisions by courts can lead to instability in the country.

Ahsan Iqbal criticized the judiciary for its involvement in political matters, stating that the removal of governments through Article 58-2(b) ended with its repeal, but the courts began intervening again. He emphasized that the judiciary should remain separate from political affairs.

He further remarked that Pakistan's development journey was halted when the PML-N government was ousted. He accused the judiciary of overreaching its authority, referencing the dis-



qualification of Nawaz Sharif and the dismissal of Hamza Shehbaz's government by a few judges.

The Federal minister also criticized the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government, claiming it pushed the country to the brink of bankruptcy. He appreciated MQM-P's support over the past 26 months, acknowledging their role in backing the government.

MQM-P leader Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui stressed the importance of working together in the future. He highlighted that their discussions covered constitutional amendments, Article 140-A, missing persons, and independent power producers (IPPs).

Government Urges PTI To Ditch October 15 Protest 'For The Sake Of National Unity'

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar on Sunday urged the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) to withdraw its October 15 protest call in the "larger national interest".

The deputy PM remarks came as the country is all set to host Council of Heads of Government (CHG) of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meeting slated to be held on October 15 and 16 in Islamabad wherein significant issues would be discussed under the SCO framework.

Talking to journalists after his visit to review arrangements for the upcoming CHG-SCO meeting, Dar said that for the sake of politics, it was not good for the political party that had been repeating the same scenario of 2014. Due to their protest,



Chinese president's visit had been postponed.

It had already crossed all the red lines in the past and attacked the state institutions, Dar observed and stressed upon its leadership to rectify its wrong decision.

The deputy PM said that certain countries had requested for bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the CHG-SCO which were finalized.

Afghanistan had neither been invited to nor participated in SCO meetings.

Therefore, he said, Pakistan could not take decision alone in this regard as the decisions were taken on the SCO forum by the member states.

Dar, to another question, said Pakistan is a host to CHG-SCO and would fully meet the responsibility.

About the North-South and South-South connectivity with the relevant countries were in progress and continuing on the bilateral and multilateral levels.

But within the SCO framework and protocol, certain matters would be discussed under specific scope of discussions and within its contours, he further clarified. He said that the entire region required integration

and peace and it was the core objective of the PML-N leadership including former prime minister Muhammad Nawaz Sharif, besides it was also included in the PML-N manifesto.

He enumerated the incumbent government's efforts to bring down inflation ahead of the target set for the next year.

Dar advised those quarters who had been claiming that Pakistan was in diplomatic isolation to reassess their projections as Pakistan had become a hub of regional trade and investment and referred to the recent visits of Malaysian premier and the Saudi delegation.

With the SCO member states, matters related to the trade and commerce had also been discussed continuously, he added. —RT/Agency

Economists Warn: PTI Protest During SCO Summit Could Jeopardize Pakistan's Economic Future

ISLAMABAD: Businessmen and economic analysts on Sunday expressed grave concerns over Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) call ahead of the highly anticipated Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, urging the party leadership to reconsider and postpone their decision.

As the foreign dignitaries are set to arrive in Islamabad to attend the SCO moot, the former ruling party had announced holding another protest at the federal capital's D-Chowk on October 15.

PTI spokesperson also announced that all district-level protests were suspended given the forthcoming demonstration in the federal capital next week.

The Imran Khan-founded party had launched a series of protests for the "independence of the judiciary" — as the government aims to introduce constitutional amendments — and for the release of its founder, jailed at Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail for more than one year.

Talking to state news



channel PTV, economists slammed PTI's protest call during the SCO summit as "self-destructive," citing concerns over economic instability and damage to Pakistan's global image.

The business community in Islamabad stressed that the SCO conference was an important platform to promote regional economic cooperation and hoped that PTI would reconsider the decision to protest for the country's national interest.

Renowned economist Dr Noor Fatima said: "This move will undermine Pakistan's credibility in the international community. We need to focus on economic diplomacy, not political posturing."

"The SCO conference is an opportunity to strengthen our ties with regional countries," she emphasized. Another analyst, Mirza Ikhtyar Baig warned that PTI's call may jeopardize the country's chances of benefiting from this platform. "The SCO conference is critical for Pakistan's economic revival. The protest call will only create uncertainty and deter foreign investors," he said, adding that Pakistan needs to showcase its "economic potential, not its political divisions." —RT/Agency

Crackdown Begins: Over 35 PTI Activists Detained In Lahore Ahead Of Planned Protests

LAHORE: In the much-anticipated protest of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) scheduled for October 15 — Lahore Police have intensified their efforts and arrested more than 35 party activists from various locations across the city, media reported on Sunday.

As per the details, the Punjab police conducted raids in several areas, including Defence, Kot Lakhpat, and Johar Town, targeting individuals believed to be involved in organizing the protest.

The police operation is part of a broader strategy to maintain order and prevent any disruptions as Pakistan is set to host the 26th Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Summit on October 15-16.

PTI leadership has announced the protest to voice concerns regarding political grievances, which has heightened tensions between the party and law enforcement agencies.

In light of these developments, police officials have emphasized their commitment to ensuring public safety while also respecting citizens' rights to protest. —RT/Agency



PTI Torn Apart By Internal Rift Over Bold Protest Plans Amid Critical SCO Summit

ISLAMABAD: PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur are among the minority in the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) political committee who are against holding a protest at D-Chowk on October 15.

Saner elements in PTI are trying to get the protest call withdrawn. They believe it is not in the interest of Pakistan to hold such a protest on the occasion when many foreign dignitaries will be attending the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) summit in the capital city.

Asad Qaiser, Hamid Khan and Raouf Hasan are also among the minority that believe it is not in the interest of Pakistan to hold such a protest. Ali Muhammad Khan though not a part of the PTI's political committee, is also upset with the protest call for October 15.

PTI sources have said that Shehbaz Gill, Hamid Azhar, Khalid Khurshid and Hafiz Farhat are leading the hawkish elements, who prevailed in pursuing the political committee to give a call for protest at the D-Chowk Islamabad for October 15 — the first day of the two-day SCO summit.

It sounds unbelievable but

a source said a person like Salman Akram Raja also supported the hawkish elements and endorsed the idea of protest in the Red Zone at a time when the SCO leadership would be meeting within a few kilometres from the protest site. The lawyer could not be reached for comments.

As against him, CM Gandapur, who in public appears aggressive, voted against the PTI protest on the occasion of the SCO summit.

Murad Saeed is not a member of PTI's political committee, but he is reportedly the first one to post on "X" about the protest call. The sources noted that the likes of Gill and Azhar use the party's social media to target those in the party who resist decisions like holding a protest at the D-Chowk on October 15 and boycotting the All-Parties Conference.

Those who are trying to

get the protest call withdrawn fear any untoward incident or any clash between the PTI supporters and law-enforcing agencies will not be in the interest of Pakistan. It may hurt the SCO summit and upset the high-profile foreign guests, including heads of government.

Three PTI leaders contacted by media, on condition of not being named, said they are trying their level best to call off the October 15 protest in the interest of Pakistan and to pay respect to visiting dignitaries. One of these leaders said the ordinary voters of PTI are not happy with the protest call on the occasion of the SCO summit. The source said many people may not join the protest. He, however, admitted even if it is successful, the protest will be in conflict with the interests of Pakistan. —RT/Agency



Gilani Pushes For Robust Economic Ties With Regional Powerhouses

Asad Qaiser Pledges PTI's Support For SCO Summit, Despite Internal Protest Chaos

ISLAMABAD: Former speaker and PTI leader Asad Qaiser said that his party was not intending any harm to the SCO Conference in Islamabad. "We have concerns over the health of the PTI's founder, no doctor being sent to attend him, we want the party leaders' contact with the chairman," Asad Qaiser said. It is to be mentioned here that the PTI has announced protest on October 15 during the SCO summit in the federal capital. PTI leader alleged that the kidnapping for vote being practiced for passing proposed constitutional amendments' bill. "The government's behaviour has been condemnable," he said.

"We are not against the legislation but won't accept any legislation by force," he added. Pakistan hosting the 23rd meeting of the Council of the Heads of Government of the member states of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) on 15 to 16 October 2024 in Islamabad.

SCO member States will be represented by the prime ministers of China, Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan as well as the First Vice President of Iran and External Affairs Minister of India. —RT/Agency



FAFEN Calls For Urgent Political Consensus On Essential Constitutional Overhauls

ISLAMABAD: The Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) has urged political parties to engage in transparent and comprehensive negotiations on proposed constitutional reforms in Pakistan, media reported on Sunday.

Addressing critical weaknesses in the current constitution, Fafen emphasized the need for wide-ranging amendments to strengthen the legislative, electoral, and local government systems.

Fafen highlighted that the ongoing political instability in Pakistan stems from constitutional deficiencies and urged immediate reforms to empower Parliament as the ultimate protector of public interests.

The organization called for amendments focused on enhancing parliamentary authority, ensuring that Parliament plays a central role in safeguarding citizens' fundamental rights.

Fafen's proposal also stresses the need for public scrutiny in the appointment of constitutional officeholders and recommends empowering the Election Commission to oversee elections for all such offices.

Additionally, they proposed that future reforms address key issues of representation in the electoral system, calling for the Election Commission to have the authority to manage elections in the Senate to prevent conflicts like the one in 2021.

Fafen also called on political parties to put aside personal and communal differences and prioritize the larger national interest, emphasizing that a strong, independent Parliament is essential for safeguarding democracy and citizens' rights.

The organization reiterated the importance of consensus-building on these reforms to ensure political stability and good governance in Pakistan. —RT/Agency

Nisar Khuhro Champions Constitutional Courts and Democratic Values at PPP Workers' Convention in Badin

BADIN: Nisar Ahmed Khuhro, President of the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) Sindh, stressed the urgent necessity of establishing constitutional courts, asserting that the PPP is both the creator and protector of the constitution. Speaking at a workers' convention in Badin, held to prepare for the commemorative event for the martyrs of the October 18 tragedy in Hyderabad, he emphasized Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari's commitment to ensuring that any constitutional amendments are made through consultation with all political parties.



Khuhro articulated the PPP's ongoing struggle to uphold the constitution and parliament, enhance democracy, and ensure the rule of law. Following the convention, he addressed journalists at the residence of provincial assembly member Haji Taj Muhammad Mallah, accompanied by other provincial leaders and assembly members. He reaffirmed the PPP's historical fight for democracy and the protection of the rights of Sindh and its people. Khuhro insisted that constitutional amendments are vital for the continuity of democracy, adding that the establishment of constitutional courts is essential. He noted that Bilawal Bhutto Zardari is keen to consult all political factions before any constitutional changes are approved. Clarifying the amendment process, he stated that a

unanimous resolution is not required, but the constitutional procedure and member count must be adhered to. Khuhro highlighted the PPP's consistent opposition to anti-Sindh and anti-people initiatives, particularly the amendments in the IRSA Act and the illegal construction of canals from the Indus River. He remarked that the PPP was the first to raise these concerns in the Sindh Assembly. Moreover, he referenced the party's collaborative efforts with other democratic and political groups to halt the construction of the Kalabagh Dam, which was successfully stopped through a resolution approved in the Sindh Assembly.

SU conducts pre entry test for its Bachelor degree programs at Jamshoro campus

JAMSHORO: The phase-wise entry test for admission to various bachelor's degree programs for the academic year 2025 began at the University of Sindh, Jamshoro, on Sunday.



A total of 9,787 candidates, including 1,938 female students, took the test in the first phase out of as many as 21,809 candidates seeking admission against almost 11,000 seats in 70 disciplines of bachelor's degree programmes offered by the university. SU Vice Chancellor Professor (Meritorious) Dr Muhammad Siddique Kalhoro reviewed the test process and personally supervised it. He expressed his satisfaction over the arrangements made by various committees for the exam. Prof Dr Abdul Sattar Shah, registrar Dr Mushtaq Ali Jariko, director admissions Prof Dr Ayaz Keero, Dr Irfana Malal, Dr Misbah Bibi Qureshi, Dr Hamadullah Kakepoto, Dr Khalil ur Rehman Khambhati, Dr Agha Asad Noor, Dr Nek Muhammad Sheikh, Dr Anila Naz Soomro, Dr Rabia Asma Memon, Dr Tania Mushtaq, PD Gulam Shabbir Abbasi, Dr Muhammad Younis Laghari, Dr Kiran Sami Memon, Dr Muhammad Aqeel Bhutto, Dr Ali Nawaz Siyal, Munawar Rajar, Ghulam Saqib Burrito, Engr Sajjad Shah, Engr Murad Shah and others accompanied the VC during his visit. Separate blocks were set up for the 1,938 female candidates at

the Institute of Biochemistry, Institute of English Language & Literature and Institute of Art & Design. The 9,787 male candidates were accommodated in the Faculty of Arts, Department of Media & Communication Studies, Department of Zoology, MA Kazi Institute of Chemistry and Faculty of Engineering & Technology. During the first phase of the entry test, the candidates appeared represented various districts across Sindh, which included Dadu 1,809 candidates including 458 females, Ghotki 598 candidates including 30 females, Jacobabad 292 candidates including 39 females, Karachi division 50 candidates including 21 females, Kashmorelandkot 278 candidates including 20 females, Khairpur Mirs 790 candidates including 93 females, Larkana 710 candidates including 131 females, Matiari 773 candidates including 205 females, Naushero Feroze 1,184 candidates including 248 females, Qambar-Shahdadkot 661 candidates including 123 females, Sanghar 1,411 candidates including 380 females, Shaheed Benazirabad 526 candidates including 95 females, Shikarpur 333 candidates including 54 females, Sukkur 232 candidates including 19 females and 140 candidates including 22 females from Punjab, Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Gilgit-Baltistan. It may be noted that the University received a total of 24,687 online applications this year. Of these, 21,809 were for undergraduate admissions, including 16,209 male and 5,603 female applicants. Moreover, 2,878 candidates exempted from the test have applied for the BS (3rd Year) program, including 1,690 males and 1,188 females.

JSM protests against arrest of Chairman Riaz Chandio

TANDO ADAM: In protest against the arrest of Jeay Sindh Mahaz Chairman Riaz Chandio and the police raid on his house, a demonstration was held on MA Jinnah Road in Tando Adam, led by Taluka President Saddam Khaskheli, Manthar Choliani, and Dr. Zahid Keero. Jeay Sindh Mahaz workers raised

strong slogans against the arrest of their chairman. Speaking on the occasion, the leaders condemned the police raid and arrest of Riaz Chandio in the strongest terms. They stated that holding protests and rallies is a constitutional and legal right of every citizen. They described Riaz Chandio as a peace-loving and tolerant leader

and alleged that his arrest was an attempt to harass the party's workers. The leaders reaffirmed their commitment to continuing their peaceful struggle and demanded the immediate release of Riaz Chandio and all other detained national activists. They warned that if their demands are not met, the scope of their protests will be expanded.

HANDS accused of jeopardizing future of educated youths in Larkana

LARKANA: In Larkana District, nine schools built by USAID and handed over to HANDS under the EMO Project RFP#5 are experiencing significant issues due to HANDS's poor performance. These schools include GHS Purnoabad, GHS Karani, GHS Jakhra, GHS Mehrab Sandilo, GHS Haji Abdul Karim Unar, GHS Saudero, GHS Pir Jo Goth, GHS Zakario Mahesar, and GHS Phulpota. Teachers at these institutions are receiving salaries of Rs 14,000, Rs 17,000, and Rs 22,000, which are not competitive enough to attract qualified professionals. Alarming, even peons and sweepers earn the same Rs 14,000, underscoring HANDS's lack of educational expertise. This wage structure negatively impacts the quality of education provided to students. School Coordinators, assigned by HANDS, have expressed dissatisfaction over low salaries and the absence of annual increments for the past three years, violating their contractual agreements. The shortage of qualified teachers persists, as many leave for better opportunities, dismissing the low salary offered. HANDS justifies the low salaries by claiming they signed contracts at minimal costs, reflecting a lack of efficiency in negotiating reasonable pay rates with the government. Staff at these schools face hardships, including illegal salary deductions and delayed payments. Allegations suggest that HANDS operates with a mafia-like mentality, while anyone can join, those wishing to leave often lose their last one or two salaries due to poor management oversight. Currently, the EMO Project RFP#5 continues in Larkana without a Project Manager and with some schools lacking School Coordinators. Over the last four years, five Project Managers have resigned due to unprofessional conduct from higher authorities. The government seems to benefit from organizations like HANDS, leaving their actual performance unassessed. Although USAID-constructed schools may appear successful in photographs, there is little real improvement in student education or teacher effectiveness.—RT

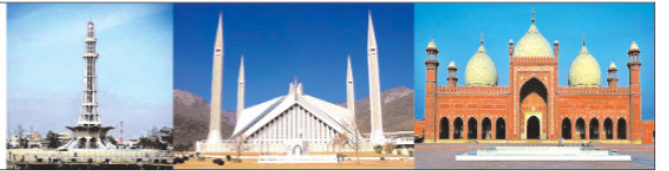

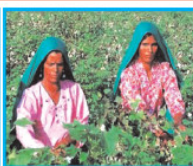
The memories of the 2014 protests, which

Cristiano Ronaldo Shatters Records As He Extends Goal Tally In Portugal's Domination Over Poland

Portugal captain Cristiano Ronaldo shined once again on the field after scoring yet another goal for his national team as they beat Poland 3-1 for their third straight Nations League win. Bernardo Silva volleyed Portugal ahead in the 26th minute in Warsaw as Bruno Fernandes cleverly nodded a cross from Ruben Neves back towards the Manchester City midfielder. Ronaldo then found himself in the right place at the right time to turn in the rebound for Portugal's second after Rafael Leao's shot came back off the post following a brilliant surging run by the AC Milan winger. With his latest goal, the 39-year-old Al Nassr striker has now struck in all three

games of this Nations League campaign for Portugal, taking his record men's international goals tally to 133. Jan Bednarek's own goal sealed victory for Portugal, the lone remaining team in League A with a 100% record, and they could secure a place in the quarter-finals next week, AFP reported. "We worked very hard the last few days, preparing various solutions for this game, and we were able to show it on the pitch. I am really satisfied because we controlled this game," said Portugal coach Roberto Martinez. "We played great as a team." Meanwhile, the five-time Ballon d'Or award winner celebrated his national team's victory with a social media post, featuring a series of snaps from the match. In the Instagram post, the former Manchester United, Real Madrid and Juventus star wrote: "Important win in the Nations League. Thanks for everyone's support, let's go all out!" Additionally, in an Instagram Story update, Ronaldo shared a screenshot of his message on the Meta-owned channel on the Meta-owned photo and video-sharing app, which read: "We felt your support on the pitch. Maia Bouchier scored an unbeaten 62 runs from 34 balls, which featured 12 boundaries, while Danni Wyatt-Hodge struck 51 off 26 with seven boundaries. Scotland opted to bat first after winning the toss and got off to a cautious start as they managed 38 runs in eight overs before Nat Sciver-Brunt broke the opening stand. Saskia Horley went back to the pavilion after scoring a mere 13 runs from 23 balls. Meanwhile, Sarah Bryce scored 27 off 31 before falling prey to Sophie Ecclestone. Kathryn Bryce held on to one end for Scotland, but could not find enough support from the other end. She top-scored with 33 runs from 28 balls with the help of four boundaries.—Agency

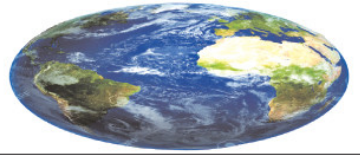

Iran fired 200 missiles at Israel on October 1 in what it said was retaliation for the killing of Tehran-aligned operator leaders in the region and a general in Iran's Revolutionary Guards.

Iran's defense minister, Ali al-Moussawi, political advisor to the Iraqi prime minister, told AFP Araghchi's visit was part of a diplomatic effort "to silence weapons and violence... to establish security and stability in the region."

After Baghdad, Araghchi will head to Oman, the Iranian ISNA news agency reported. On Thursday, Araghchi was in Qatar where he met Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani over the wars in Gaza and Lebanon.—Agency

US To Send High-Altitude Anti-Missile System THAAD To Israel Amid West Asia Conflict



Washington: The Pentagon said Sunday it will deploy a high-altitude anti-missile system and its US military crew to Israel to help the ally protect itself from potential Iranian missile attacks.

At the direction of US President Joe Biden, Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin "authorized the deployment of a Terminal High-Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) battery and associated crew of US military personnel to Israel to help bolster Israel's air defenses following Iran's unprecedented attacks against Israel on April 13 and again on October 1," Pentagon press secretary Pat Ryder said in a statement.—Agency

Lebanon Conflict Forces Expectant Mothers To Flee, Risking Premature Births



Beirut: Tahani Yassine was in her third trimester of pregnancy when she chose to return to her hometown of Beirut to deliver her baby.

Living in Equatorial Guinea with her husband and three young children, she had more faith in the Lebanese healthcare system.

But just a few days after her arrival in Beirut, Yassine began to regret her decision. Israel intensified its military campaign in Lebanon, targeting Hezbollah strongholds in the south, the Bekaa Valley in the east and the southern suburbs of Beirut, closer to her home.

Although her area wasn't directly hit, the strikes were unnervingly close, and the boom of Israeli warplanes breaking the sound barrier overhead filled her with fear.

Anxious for the safety of her unborn child, the 36-year-old moved to an apartment closer to hospital where she was due to deliver.

"My doctors told me that I was too far along in my pregnancy to travel. I had no choice but to stay and deliver here," she told Reuters just hours after giving birth at Trad Hospital in central Beirut on Oct. 10.

Sharjeel Accuses Imran Khan And Israel Of Plotting To Undermine SCO Conference

KARACHI: Provincial Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon has accused Imran Khan, founder of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), of attempting to sabotage the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) conference through alleged connections with Israel.

In a press conference, Memon claimed that Khan's political actions were not in Pakistan's interest but rather aimed at protecting Zionist agendas. He suggested that Khan's ties to Tel Aviv were part of a larger conspiracy by adversarial forces to destabilize the SCO.

Memon characterized the PTI-Israel alliance as a significant compromise of Pakistan's national interest, recalling instances where Khan allegedly conspired to jeopardize relations with China during a visit by the Chinese president.

He asserted that PTI's leadership was following anti-Pakistan agendas backed by foreign entities,



placing their interests above the nation's security and sovereignty. Memon alleged that PTI's think tank was operating from Tel Aviv and actively plotting against Pakistan.

Highlighting that key policy advisors of PTI were based in Israel, Memon claimed the party received directives and support from Tel Aviv, with Israeli handlers engaged in international lobbying for PTI. He further noted that foreign support aimed to incite political instability within Pakistan and hinder its economic and diplomatic progress.

Mustafa Kamal Raises Concerns Over PTI's Planned October 15 Protest

KARACHI: Mustafa Kamal, a senior leader of Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P), has voiced his concerns about the potential consequences of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's (PTI) planned protest on October 15 at D-Chowk, Islamabad.

Speaking at a press conference in Karachi, Kamal emphasized that the survival of politics and democracy in the country depends on the existence of a stable state. He noted that while political dissent is natural, it must not come at the cost of national integrity and unity.

"The economic challenges Pakistan faces are well-known," Kamal said. "The government and state institutions are working hard to stabilize the situation. PTI's protest plan is not in the country's best interest at this critical time."

Kamal also expressed MQM-P's support for constitutional amendments to address PTI's grievances but advised the party to adopt a more constructive approach.



He cautioned that PTI's actions could further alienate them and tarnish their image, particularly when they are accused of being anti-state.

"PTI is a popular political party, but they need to act responsibly," he remarked. "I urge them to reconsider their protest and work within the political framework. We have no hostility towards PTI and are always open to dialogue." Drawing comparisons with the unrest in countries like Iraq, Libya, and Syria, Kamal warned of the dangers of destabilizing state institutions, particularly the military. He

Sindh Police To Receive Discounted Housing Plots And Interest-Free Motorcycles

KARACHI: In a welfare initiative for Sindh police personnel, the Sindh Police, in partnership with the National Police Foundation (NPF), has announced plans to provide discounted housing plots and interest-free electric motorcycles for officers up to the rank of inspector.

During a gathering at the Police Headquarters in Garden South, Sindh Inspector General (IG) Ghulam Nabi Memon, along with senior police officials and NPF Managing Director Irfan Zaman, outlined the initiative. Zaman revealed that the NPF will cover Rs50,000 for each



of the first 2,000 plots in the Police Housing Society.

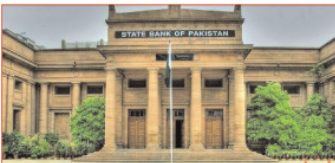
The program also includes interest-free electric motorcycles, offered in installments, a plan proposed by IG Sindh to further support the welfare of officers.

Business Leaders Call For Major Interest Rate Cut To Boost Economy

KARACHI: Business leaders and traders have urged the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) to lower interest rates to single digits to stimulate economic growth and end the ongoing economic stagnation.

Majid Aziz, former president of the Karachi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI), praised recent rate cuts but stressed the need for further reductions to drive private sector investment. He noted that lower rates would encourage businesses to invest in machinery, expand operations, and improve production.

Muhammad Saleem Memon, President of the Hyderabad Chamber of Small



Traders, echoed the call for rate cuts, highlighting the negative impact of high borrowing costs on small businesses. He urged the SBP to align its policies with global trends to spur industrial output and job creation.

KCCI President Muhammad Jawed Bilwani and PRAC Chairman Mohammad Yunus Dagha also

pressed for a 300-basis-point rate reduction, citing a decline in inflation and stabilizing commodity prices. They argued that this move is crucial for reviving large-scale manufacturing and alleviating pressure on businesses, particularly as the sector continues to struggle with high interest rates and limited access to credit.—RT/Agency

Murad Issues Guidelines For 2025-26 ADP Preparation

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah has released guidelines for the formulation of the Annual Development Program (ADP) for 2025-26, urging all government departments to align with current economic conditions and federal policies.

The directives, issued through the Planning & Development (P&D) department, emphasize a focus on sectoral priorities and socio-economic impacts. Mr. Shah instructed departments to ensure that proposed projects contribute to measurable outcomes in line with the government's development strategy.

Departments must adhere to the federal Public Sector Development Program



Mr. Shah mandated that 80% of the development budget be allocated to ongoing schemes, stating that projects expected to be completed by June 2025 should adhere to their original plans. He also directed departments to allocate remaining funds to projects that have utilized over 70% of their budget to ensure completion in FY 2025-26.

Pakistan, US Navies Conduct Bilateral Exercise To Boost Maritime Cooperation



KARACHI: The navies of Pakistan and the United States have successfully conducted a bilateral exercise in the Arabian Sea, aimed at strengthening interoperability and reinforcing their shared commitment to regional maritime peace.

According to a statement from the Pakistan Navy's (PN) media wing, the US Navy Ship USS O'Kane visited Karachi and took part in the exercise alongside Pakistan Navy Ship Babur.

The media wing highlighted that this collaboration reflects Pakistan Navy's dedication to fostering regional stability and maritime security in partnership with global allies. The exercise also contributed to joint efforts in combating terrorism, piracy, drug trafficking, and human smuggling in the region.

Pakistani Airlines Set To Resume Flights To UK, EU And US



KARACHI: Pakistan's aviation sector is on the verge of a major transformation, with reports indicating that direct flights to the UK and EU may soon resume.

The UK Department for Transport (DfT) is expected to send a safety assessment team to Pakistan, followed by a security evaluation of key airports. This could pave the way for Pakistani airlines, such as Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) and Airblue, to restart flights to the UK.

Upon successful completion of these assessments, airlines like Serene Air may also receive clearance for direct flights to Europe. This development is crucial for the EU's decision to lift its ban on Pakistani airlines.

Restoring EU clearance will not only reinstate flights but could also prompt the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to reconsider Pakistan's aviation category. Currently, Pakistan

is classified as Category 2 following the EU ban. A positive reassessment from the EU could lead to an upgrade to Category 1, enabling Pakistani airlines to expand international operations, including potential routes to the U.S.

To facilitate this progress, the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) of Pakistan must strictly adhere to the safety and security standards set by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the UK. Ensuring comprehensive compliance across the aviation industry is essential for lifting existing restrictions and fostering future growth in international flight operations.

Over 100 Arrested As Karachi Protests Escalate, Defy Section 144

KARACHI: Violent clashes broke out between protesters and police across Karachi, resulting in the arrest of over 100 people, including women, for violating Section 144, which was imposed just a day earlier.

Protests erupted in various areas such as the Karachi Press Club and Teen Talwar in Clifton. TV footage captured scenes of police using batons to disperse demonstrators, leading to multiple arrests.

The Sindh Rawadari March participants confronted police outside the press club after breaching Section 144, which prohibits gatherings of more than five people. Law enforcement reported that protesters from different groups were arrested from key locations, including outside the press club, Metropole Hotel, and Jinnah Hospital.

Earlier in July, the Pakistan and US armies conducted the first-ever Infantry Rifle Company Exercise 2024, focusing on counterterrorism operations. The two-week-long exercise concluded at the National Counter Terrorism Centre in Pabbi, Nowshera, with a closing ceremony attended by senior military officials from both countries.

The exercise aimed at refining counterterrorism tactics, urban warfare procedures, and marksmanship skills, strengthening the professional expertise of the participating troops.—RT



During the clashes, four police officers sustained injuries and were rushed to the hospital. South Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Syed Asad Raza stated that at least 20 individuals, including women, had been detained. More police personnel were deployed to block roads leading to the press club.

Another confrontation unfolded near the Governor House, where police resorted to tear gas to disperse protesters from a religious group holding a counter-demonstration. Protesters responded by throwing stones, injuring two

officers, and reportedly setting a police van ablaze. Additionally, 27 protesters were arrested near Teen Talwar in Clifton, including several women.

Sindh Home Minister Zia Lamiar confirmed the arrests for violating Section 144 and warned that strict action would be taken against anyone flouting the law. He also ordered an investigation into the reported mistreatment of journalists at the Karachi Press Club, assuring accountability for those involved.—RT/Agency

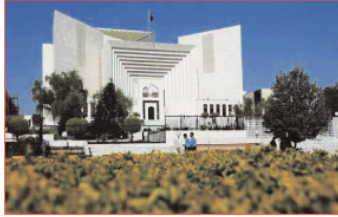

Government Sparks Debate By Proposing Chief Justice Selection From Supreme Court's Top Three

ISLAMABAD: The successor of Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa will be picked from the three most senior judges of the Supreme Court, the government has proposed in its draft for the intended constitutional amendments, media reported on Sunday.



The selection for the coveted post will reportedly be made by an eight-member parliamentary committee. The coalition government has stepped up its efforts to evolve consensus on its controversial 'Constitutional Package' with all political parties regularly holding meetings of the special parliamentary committee... be provincial constitutional courts. According to the proposed amendment, the prime minister will send the matter to the president after consultation on the name of a qualified judge.

Meanwhile, according to the JUI-F's draft, special benches of the Supreme Court will be formed to hear constitutional cases. The constitutional bench will consist of Chief Justice of Pakistan and four senior judges.

Apart from this, there will be provincial constitutional courts. According to the proposed amendment, the prime minister will send the matter to the president after consultation on the name of a qualified judge. The age of a judge will be 40 years, three years of court experience and 10 years of legal experience will be mandatory. An FCC will be established for the dismissal of a judge and the president will give the final approval for dismissal of any judge.

According to the government draft, the FCC will consist of seven members, including the chief justice. The first chief justice of the FCC will be appointed by the president on the advice of

the prime minister. The first chief justice and three senior judges of the constitutional court will be appointed on the recommendation of the committee that would include four members of the parliament, federal law minister and a representative of the Pakistan Bar Council. It has been proposed that a commission will be formed for the appointment of FCC judges, the head of which will be the FCC chief justice, and its five most senior judges will be members of the commission.

Fazl's party proposed to implement the 18th Amendment to the extent of appointing judges while the constitutional bench of the Supreme Court will be authorised to hear appeals against the decisions of the constitutional bench of the high courts. Meanwhile, the cases related to interpretation of the Constitution will be heard by the constitution bench only. The government had attempted to present the bill to amend the Constitution last month, but its allies as well as members from the opposition benches vehemently opposed the proposal...

Atta Tarar Hypes SCO Summit as Game-Changer For Pakistan's Economic And Regional Future

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attallah Tarar claimed that the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit would be a game changer for Pakistan, boosting economic and regional ties.



Briefing the international media in Islamabad today about preparations for the upcoming SCO summit, he stated that Pakistan was all set to host a major event and it was a great honour for Pakistan to be acknowledged for its true potential by the global community. 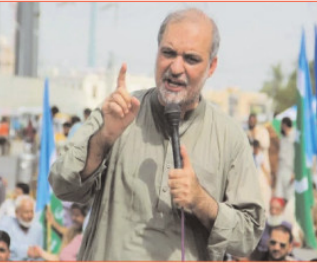

Islamabad Turns Into A Fortress: Heightened Security Ahead Of SCO Summit Amidst Protest Fears

ISLAMABAD: The federal authorities were preparing on Sunday to shut down the capital ahead of a Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, an event of international importance.



In a statement, Islamabad Inspector-General of Police (IGP) Nasir Ali Rizvi said that a 'comprehensive' security plan had been chalked out ahead of the all-important summit in the federal capital.

"Security personnel will be deployed at funnel areas, hotels and places where foreign delegations are staying," he said, adding that they ensured the security of foreign leaders, delegations and guests. Furthermore, Rizvi said search and information-based operations were underway, with personnel of the Pakistan Army, intelligence agencies, Frontier Corps (FC) and Rangers performing their duties.

Restored hundreds of security forces of key opposition party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), who attempted to march in Islamabad earlier this month, to register protest for 'independence of the judiciary' and release of its jailed founder Imran Khan. A deadly attack on a convoy of Chinese engineers in the mega port city of Karachi last week also deepened security fears. Local administration has banned protests, sit-ins, rallies and public gatherings in Karachi under Section 144 for a period of five days citing security concerns.—RT/Agency

Sherry Slams PTI's 'Mob Mentality' For Daring Protest During Key SCO Summit

ISLAMABAD: PPP Vice-President Senator Sherry Rehman on Sunday said that PTI's 'worst legacy' was that it had 'incessantly shrunk the space for democratic politics by resorting to extremes no one has gone to before' as the opposition prepared for a protest at D-Chowk on October 15.



Her statement came as the PTI announced the suspension of its protests in Punjab and issued a nationwide call urging party leaders and workers to converge in Islamabad on Oct 15 when the two-day Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit will begin.

The PTI has also demanded immediate access for party leaders and family members to its founder, Imran Khan, who is incarcerated in Adiala Jail. The government earlier banned visits to prisoners at the prison until Oct 18 due to security concerns related to the high-profile SCO summit. "If the PTI goes forward worse conditions but no one has done this." The former federal minister went on to say that much of the PTI's concerns could be addressed after the summit, however, the party's "worst legacy" was that it had "incessantly shrunk the space for democratic politics by resorting to extremes no one has gone to before."
