Jaishankar Touches Down: India Gears Up For High-Stakes SCO Summit

ISLAMABAD: India's Minister of External Affairs S. Jaishankar arrived at the Noot Khan Airbase on Tuesday to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit being held here on Tuesday and Wednesday.



He was received at the airport by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs officers. Jaishankar reached Pakistan by a special plane from the capital New Delhi.

Jaishankar is the first Indian foreign minister who arrived in Pakistan after 2015 visit of former foreign minister Sushma Swaraj.

Meanwhile, the prime minister of Belarus also arrived in Pakistan to attend the SCO conference, where Federal Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar welcomed him.

The two-day Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit begins in the federal capital on Tuesday amid heightened security. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will preside over the main event.

The SCO member states will be represented by the prime ministers of China, Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan as well as the First Vice President of Iran and External Affairs Minister of India.

State Council of China premier Li Qiang represents his country. The prime minister of Mongolia as observer state, and deputy chairman of the Cabinet of Ministers and foreign minister of Turkmenistan as special guest will participate in the meeting.

The SCO Council of Heads of Government meeting will discuss ongoing cooperation in fields of economy, trade, environment and sociocultural linkages, and review the performance of the organisation.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will also hold important bilateral meetings with the visiting heads of delegations on the sidelines of the summit.

The SCO summit is anticipated to serve as a key platform for fostering regional cooperation, bolstering trade and investment besides enhancing socioeconomic and cultural linkages among its member states.—RT/Agency

Chinese PM Stands Strong: Vows Unwavering Support For Pakistan's Sovereignty

ISLAMABAD: Chinese Premier Li Qiang reaffirmed China's unwavering support for Pakistan's territorial integrity, sovereignty, and prosperity during a meeting with President Asif Ali Zardari at Aiwan-e-Sadr in Islamabad on Tuesday.



The meeting took place as part of Premier Li's visit to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, where he was honoured at a luncheon hosted by the president.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Senate Chairman Yousuf Raza Gillani and Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Asim Munir also attended the event, underscoring the importance of Pakistan-China ties.

Both leaders expressed their commitment to deepening strategic cooperation in key areas such as the economy, investment, and regional connectivity. They also stressed the need to ac-

celerate the implementation of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects.

Premier Li hailed the enduring friendship between China and Pakistan, stating, "Pakistan and China are not just neighbours but also brothers, partners, and friends."

He praised President Zardari's role in strengthening bilateral relations and highlighted the countries' mutual support despite global challenges.

future of the Pakistan-China relationship, saying it would grow even stronger in the coming years.

Additionally, Premier Li appreciated Pakistan's consistent stance on key Chinese issues such as Taiwan, Tibet, Hong Kong, Xinjiang, and the South China Sea. He reassured that China would maintain its support for Pakistan's sovereignty and prosperity.

He also conveyed his deep condolences for the two Chinese nationalities killed in a recent terrorist attack in Pakistan, assuring that the culprits would face exemplary punishment.

"Enemies of the Pakistan-China friendship are trying to harm CPEC and our bilateral ties, but they will not succeed," he said.—RT/Agency

Pakistan and Russia Join Forces: 'Druzhba-VII' Counter-Terror Drill Kicks Off

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan and Russian militaries have commenced bilateral exercise titled Joint Exercise Druzhba-VII — the seventh bilateral joint exercise in the counter-terrorism domain, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said in a statement on Tuesday.



According to the military's media wing, the two-week-long exercise commenced on October 13 at the National Counter Terrorism Centre, Pabbi with participation of Light Commando Troops ex Pakistan Army and Russian Military Contingent.

The commandant of the National Counter Terrorism Centre graced the opening ceremony of the exercise as chief guest, the statement added.

The exercise, the ISPR stated, is aimed at refining professional skills through joint training besides harnessing the historic military to military relations among the friendly countries.

"Participating troops are looking forward to benefit from mutual expertise experience," read the statement.

On October 13, Pakistan and United States navies also conducted a bilateral exercise in the Arabian Sea with the aim to enhance interoperability and demonstrate their resolve towards regional maritime peace.

The Pakistan Navy's (PN) media wing had stated that the US Navy Ship USS O'Kane visited Karachi and participated in a bilateral exercise at the Arabian Sea with Pakistan Navy Ship Babur.

"The visit and bilateral exercise reflect Pakistan Navy's commitment towards regional peace, stability and maritime order in collaboration with seasonal global partners," the media wing reported.

The collaborations have proved benefitting in countering menace of terrorism, piracy, narcotics, and human trafficking in the region and beyond, it added.—RT/Agency

COAS Takes Charge: Eyeing Stronger Military Ties with Belarus

"A conversation is necessary, whether today or tomorrow, both countries have their opinions on differences but why should we forget that Pakistan and India are the two most-stressed countries due to climate change. Gohar Confirms Imran In Good Spirits After Health Check-Up

ISLAMABAD: After a team of doctors from the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (Pims) visited Adiala Jail, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan on Tuesday shared an update on incarcerated party founder Imran Khan's health, saying, "Khan Saab is in good health and had exercised for an hour today."



Gohar's statement came after his party deferred its protest at Islamabad's D-Chowk on the SCO summit's inaugural day after the Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi assured the party that a team of doctors would examine the PTI founder's health at the Rawalpindi central jail.

The PTI chairman confirmed that two doctors — an ENT specialist and a medical specialist — visited Khan at Adiala Jail at 4pm today.

"We were informed a while ago that Alhamdulillah, Khan Saab is in good health and had exercised for an hour today," he said in a message on X, adding, "We shall get medical reports from them soon and I will share with you, InshaAllah."

He also expressed gratitude to the PTI workers and supporters who were concerned about the party founder's health.

A day ago, Gohar had announced his party's political committee's decision to put off its Islamabad protest scheduled for October 15 in view of the SCO summit kicked off in Islamabad earlier today.

Prior to accepting the government's proposal, the party sought permission for a meeting between Khan, his sisters and doctors at the jail, however, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's administration turned down the request. It was also learnt via sources that a team of Pims' doctors would visit Adiala Jail to examine the former prime minister. Additionally, Khan's private physician would also be permitted to meet him, the sources added.

However, Khan's personal physician Dr Asim Yusuf was not allowed to meet him despite he waited outside the jail for more than an hour and also submitted his credentials to the security staff.

Bilawal Hits Back: Opposition To Constitutional Courts Driven By Personal Vendettas



KARACHI: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari said on Tuesday that the opposition of certain parties to the establishment of the constitutional courts was based on their personal likes and dislikes.

In a statement shared on his X, the PPP chairman said, "The PPP has fought every election since 2007 with the manifesto pledge of implementing judicial reforms including but not limited to establishing federal constitutional courts. Please see attached relevant sections of 2006 Charter of Democracy, 2013 manifesto and 2024 election manifesto."

Expressing his party's position on the matter, he said, "while many of today's opponents have supported this reform in the past. Their opposition today is based on personal likes and dislikes or partisan positions on the politics of the moment.

Our permanent party position for almost 2 decades now has remained consistent. Our representatives elected in every election under my Chairmanship of this party have been given the mandate by the people of Pakistan to establish a Federal Constitutional Court with equal representation for all.—RT/Agency

Nationwide Protests Loom As Lawyers Rally Against Constitutional Reforms

ISLAMABAD: Lawyers across Pakistan have come together on a unified platform to oppose proposed constitutional amendments, warning of a nationwide movement if the government proceeds with the changes.



At a convention held by the Karachi Bar Association at City Court on Tuesday, prominent legal figures, including officials from the Pakistan Bar Council, Supreme Court Bar Association, and other regional associations, gathered to voice their concerns.

Attendees included Munir A. Malik, Hamid Khan, and Abid Zuberi, among others. However, no representatives from the Sindh High Court Bar Association attended the event.

The proposed amendments were denounced as unconstitutional and illegal, with lawyers threatening a countrywide protest in response.

Peshawar High Court Bar President Fida Gul expressed his determination to prevent any changes. "We will not allow these amendments to happen. The government's unconstitutional tactics will be met

with resistance," he stated, adding that the creation of a constitutional court would divide the judiciary. "We will fight to the end against such amendments."

Asad Manzoor Butt, President of the Lahore High Court Bar, criticised the government's plans to establish constitutional courts at both federal and provincial levels, and also condemned extending the age limit of the Chief Justice of Pakistan.

"The entire legal fraternity is ready for a nationwide movement," Butt warned. There was tension at the convention when members of the People's Lawyers Forum protested the event.

The convention organisers emphasised that the meeting was held for the benefit of lawyers, not to serve any political agenda. Former federal law minister Shahida Jamil advised caution, stating, "Everyone has their version of the amendments, but we must tread carefully. What happens if there's a clash between the constitutional court and the Supreme Court?"

Lawyers agreed that the government's secretive approach to these amendments would not be tolerated, with calls for transparency in the legislative process.—RT/Agency

- From Sanghar to Nawabshah: The fare is set at PKR 180
- From Sanghar to Mirpurkhas: The fare is also PKR 180

Civil Society Takes to The Streets Councilor Murtaza Buriro Accused of Humiliating Jogi Community

HANDIARI: In protest against the violence and humiliation inflicted upon Jogi community people by councilor Murtaza Buriro near the Lyari stop in Kotdiji, local social workers and journalists staged a protest demonstration.



Details reveal that on the previous day, councilor Murtaza Buriro publicly targeted the Jogis with violence. Led by social workers Muhammad Malook and Niaz Shar, a rally was organized, which marched through the streets before culminating in a protest at the National Press Club in Thari Mirwah. During the protest, Niaz Shar condemned the councilor's actions, describing him as a bully who humiliates poor women and girls. He stated that such behavior violates human dignity and morality. He warned that as long as this councilor remains influential, such incidents would continue, endangering the safety of many women. The protest concluded with demands to the DIG Sukkur and SSP Khairpur to register an FIR against the councilor. Failure to do so would result in further protests.

'Save Our Press' Funds Urgently Needed for Kumb's Press Club

KUMB: Naz Solangi, the President of the Awami Press Club, has made an urgent appeal to the Secretary Information and the Director Information of Sindh, emphasizing the pressing need for funds for the Press Club. Solangi pointed out that it has been ten years since the Press Club was officially registered, with its registration valid until 2027. However, despite this, no financial support has been provided by the Sindh government.



Highlighting the disparities in funding allocation, Solangi noted that while media centers and the residences of influential figures have received support based on political affiliations, the Awami Press Club has been overlooked. He emphasized that repeated requests have been made to the Chief Secretary of Sindh and senior officials within the Information Department, yet there has been no response or acknowledgment of their plight. For over 40 years, the members of the Awami Press Club have dedicated themselves to serving the nation, earning accolades such as the Best Writer Award from various private institutions. Despite their contributions, Solangi lamented the lack of recognition from the government. In his statement, Solangi urged the authorities to release the necessary funds to ensure justice and support for the Press Club, allowing them to continue their vital work in serving the community and the nation. He called on the government to acknowledge the contributions of local media and to prioritize equitable funding for local media organizations, regardless of political connections.—RT

Italian Aircraft Carrier Docks In Karachi: A Power Move to Bolster Defence Ties

A delegation led by Ambassador Armellini and Rear Admiral Stefano Barbieri held discussions with Pakistan Fleet Commander Rear Admiral Abdul Munib on enhancing interoperability and ensuring regional security, and our defence relations play a pivotal role in this partnership."

She further added, "Italy's presence in the Indo-Pacific region, including this visit, reflects our commitment to deepening cooperation with key partners like Pakistan, ensuring the security of international maritime routes. Our defence industries have been active participants in the IDEAS exhibitions, and I will be joining them again at this year's event in November."—RT

IGP Sindh Takes Action: New Committee Formed To Probe Shocking KPC Incident

KARACHI: Inspector General of Police (IGP) Sindh, Ghulam Nabi Memon, has set up a high-level committee to investigate the police's handling of journalists and protesters outside the Karachi Press Club (KPC), following reports of alleged brutality. The three-member committee, led by DIG Special Branch and including SSP Aviation and SP Investigation, has been tasked

with probing the incident involving alleged police mistreatment of journalists and protesting women. The committee has been directed to submit its findings within five days. A formal notification has been issued. This action follows directives from Sindh Home Minister Ziaul Hasan Lanjar, who instructed the IGP to ensure an impartial inquiry into the alleged police misconduct and to deliver the investigation report within three days. The minister also called for details on the officers suspended in connection with the incident. DIG South Asad Reza confirmed that disciplinary measures are underway against the police personnel involved in the violence, which has drawn widespread condemnation from the media community.—RT/Agency

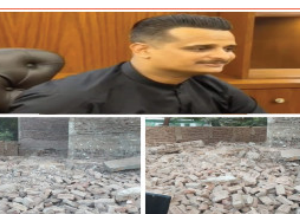
Furious Locals Demand Urgent Construction of GGHS Phulji Station

ASP Shehrbano Dismisses Shocking 'Rape' Allegations Against Lahore College Student

LAHORE: Punjab police have refuted the claims related to the alleged rape of a private college student, saying that "there is no victim" linked to allegations that sparked a violent protest in Lahore a day earlier.



A group of students gathered outside a private college on a protest call on Monday after reports of the alleged rape of a female student went viral on social media platforms.

At least 28 people suffered injuries as the protest turned violent and clashes erupted between the students and police.

Later, the protest was put off and it was decided to resume the demonstration today again.

It may be noted that the police had arrested a security guard of the college, who was being accused of raping the student and launched an investigation into the matter.

However, the suspect denied the allegations, while the police also couldn't find the evidence to prove them.

Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP) Defence Shehrbano Naqvi said while speaking to "Geo Pakistan" hosts on Tuesday that the girl who is being named was hospitalized 10 days prior to the day that is being claimed as the day of the incident.

"Her medical reports are available, the record of the hospitals she has been admitted to are also available, and information about the way she fell while getting away from registering an FIR"—RT/Agency

The ASP noted that two girls in the college had the same names, one of them was completely fine, while the other one was the girl admitted to the hospital.

Apart from them, if there is any other victim, the police have already announced that they have several platforms for reporting such cases, she said. "Any family, who thinks that there's a victim [should come forward]. Why would the police shy away from registering an FIR?"—RT/Agency

CM Maryam Assembles Emergency Committee To Investigate College Incident

LAHORE: Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz on Tuesday constituted a fact-finding committee to ascertain truth into the matter of a private college incident.

Sources said the committee would provide a detailed report to the chief minister within 48 hours.

According to the notification, the committee would be headed by the Punjab chief secretary and include the home secretary, Punjab advocate general, higher education secretary, special education secretary and specialised healthcare and medical health secretary as its members.

The committee would glean information and evidences in the case while recording statements of college students, teachers and administration. The committee would examine all aspects of the matter including quick response from the college administration and treatment of police. 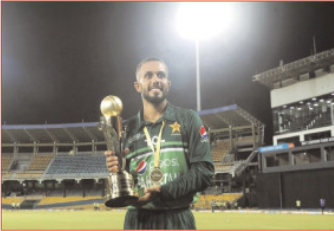

Mbappe Hits Back Slams Swedish Media's Rape Allegations as 'Fake News'

Real Madrid star Kylian Mbappe said he was the victim of "fake news" after a Swedish newspaper reported that an investigation had been opened for rape following a visit by the French footballer's entourage to Stockholm.



Mbappe, 25, claimed in a post on X that there was a link between the report in the Aftonbladet tabloid and his hearing before a French league committee on Tuesday in his bitter dispute over unpaid wages with his former club Paris Saint-Germain (PSG).

"FAKE NEWS!!!! It's becoming so predictable, on the eve of the hearing, as if by chance," wrote Mbappe. His entourage called the report a "slanderous rumour" and threatened to take legal action.

Mbappe claims he is owed \$60 million by the Qatari-owned French champions.

The 2018 World Cup winner was not selected for France's Nations League fixtures last week, and spent Thursday and Friday in the Swedish capital where he dined at a restaurant with a group of people.

According to Aftonbladet's report, the French footballer then went to a nightclub, according to Aftonbladet's report.

The newspaper said a rape was committed "in Stockholm city centre", citing a formal complaint made to police on Saturday that it had seen.

Aftonbladet said the complaint was made after the alleged victim had sought medical attention but did not say who was named in the accusation.

"A probe is under way into a crime that was reported on October 10 in the centre of Stockholm," a prosecutor investigating the accusation told AFP.

Swedish police refused to give any further details.

"In general, if we have received a complaint and decided to conduct interviews and we make it known (to the public), those involved in the case may take actions that delay and complicate the investigation," said police spokeswoman Carina Skagerlind.

The Swedish newspaper published photos on its website on Monday showing police officers in front of the hotel where Mbappe and the group with him had stayed.

Mbappe's entourage said in a statement sent to AFP: "Today, a new slanderous rumour is starting to spread across the web from the Swedish media Aftonbladet. These accusations are completely false and irresponsible, and their propagation is unacceptable."

"In order to put an end to this methodical destruction of (the) image (of Kylian Mbappe), all necessary legal actions will be taken to re-establish the truth and pursue any person or media involved in the moral harassment and defamatory treatment that Kylian Mbappe is suffering repeatedly," the statement added.—Agency

DHAKA: The Bangladesh Cricket Board said Tuesday it had suspended head coach Chandika Hathurusingha for misconduct including an alleged assault of a player.

Trinidadian former all-rounder Phil Simmons has been appointed stand-in coach and will take the team up until the ICC Champions Trophy, set for Pakistan in February 2025.

"You can't assault a national player physically," BCB president Faruque Ahmed said in announcing Hathurusingha's suspension, without giving details of the alleged incident.

There was no immediate response from Hathurusingha.

The 56-year-old former Sri Lanka batsman was hired in 2023 for a second time as head coach, after a largely successful tenure with the side between 2014 and 2017.

The suspension follows Bangladesh's tour of India, where they lost both Tests and all three T20s.

Bangladesh next play South Africa at home, with the first of two Tests starting on October 21.

They travel to the United Arab Emirates for three ODIs against Afghanistan starting November 6.—Agency

Babar Azam's Praise Party: Kamran Ghulam Stuns with Century on Test Debut

MULTAN: Pakistan's ace batter Babar Azam congratulated Kamran Ghulam on scoring a well-crafted century on Test debut.

Kamran Ghulam was included in Pakistan's Playing XI for the second Test in place of star batter Babar Azam and he made an immediate impact with a century on his debut.

He came into bat with Pakistan struggling at 19-2 inside ten overs and helped the team recover with an under pressure in his 149-run stand with Saim Ayub for the third wicket.

His defiant knock The star batter



posted a picture of Kamran, celebrating his maiden Test century and the caption on the picture read, "Well played, Kamran!"

With his maiden Test century, Kamran Ghulam became the 13th player from Pakistan to cross the three-figure on debut.

The last Pakistani player to achieve this feat was Abid Ali, who scored a century against Sri Lanka in December 2019.—Agency

Ronaldo's Secret Weapon? Roberto Martinez Spills on What Makes CR7 a Legend



Portuguese football legend Cristiano Ronaldo's national team head coach, Roberto Martinez, believes that his team's captain is an "example to his teammates."

The Portugal boss was impressed as he praised the Al Nassr striker's commitment to international football at the age of 39 as an example to his teammates.

Martinez's remarks came as hundreds of people descended on St Mirren Park, also known as the SMISA Stadium, in Paisley to get a glimpse of Ronaldo.

At the stadium, the Portugal football team was gearing up for their pre-match preparations, ahead of their Nations League clash against Scotland on Tuesday.

"When you arrive in a stadium, in a place like this, I think you get to know the iconic figure and the career of a player that is unique," said Martinez at his pre-match press conference.

"There is not another player with more than 200 caps at international level as an example, the number of goals that he's scored, the trophies that he's achieved."

"For me, it's very easy to manage a player that can help the team to win tomorrow. All the rest is something for all of us to enjoy because it's a unique case and I think we can all learn from being close to him."

The five-time Ballon d'Or award winner was often criticised after failing to score as Portugal crashed out of Euro 2024 in the quarter-finals to France. However, Martinez has continued to field for Ronaldo, who scored his 133rd international goal in Saturday's 3-1 Nations League win over Poland in Warsaw. The former Manchester United, Real Madrid, and Juventus star started that match and Martinez assured his fans he will be involved against Scotland.—Agency

Day 1 Thriller: Kamran Ghulam's Debut Ton Powers Pakistan to 259/5 Against England

MULTAN: Pakistan ended day 1 play at 259/5 with the aid of Kamran Ghulam's debut century, who came in as the replacement of star batter Babar Azam, and steadied the hosts' innings in the 2nd Test against England at Multan Cricket Stadium.

Pakistan scored 259/5 at the conclusion of Day 1 play with Mohammad Rizwan and Salman Ali Agha on the crease to drive the team's innings after they opted to bat first after winning the toss.

Kamran completed his century off 192 balls containing nine fours and one six.

He became the 13th Pakistani batter who smashed a ton on his debut followed by Javed Miandad, Saleem Malik, Muhammad Waseem, Ali Naqvi, Azhar Mahmood, Younis Khan, Taufeeq Umar, whereas, Yasir Hameed was the only batter who scored a



ton in both innings.

Additionally, Fawad Alam, Umar Akmal, and Abid Ali were among the batters who slammed a ton during their debut test matches.

Subsequently, he also became the 2nd Pakistani to score a century debut while batting at number 4. The only other Pakistani to score a debut century at 4 was Malik in 1982.

There are only 5 batsmen in Test history who made their debut at 4 and scored centuries. The last one to reach three figures on such an occasion was Aminul Islam of Bangladesh in 2000.

Also in attendance were Secretary Industries and Commerce Muhammad Yasir, Baloch Shar, PRGMEA Chairman Aamir Cothani, and other association representatives. The PRGMEA officials briefed the minister on the challenges faced by garment manufacturers and exporters. Dharejo acknowledged the critical role exporters play in enhancing Pakistan's image and emphasized the importance of industrialists in promoting local industries. He assured that the Sindh government is working in close collaboration with the private sector to bring positive societal changes. Security issues in industrial zones, he noted, have significantly improved. FIA Strikes At Karachi Airport: Two Women Caught Begging Under Umrah Pretense

The suspects, identified as Patti Khatun and Subhana, failed to present hotel reservations or sufficient funds for their trip during questioning. Initial investigations revealed that Subhana's son has been illegally residing in Saudi Arabia since traveling there on an Umrah visa in 2022, where he is also suspected of engaging in begging. An FIA spokesperson confirmed that further details are being gathered, and the women have been handed over to the Anti-Human Smuggling Circle in Karachi for legal proceedings.

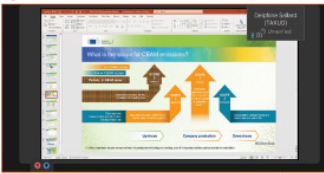

Golovchenko warmly congratulated Pakistan on the successful conduct of the SCO CHG meeting and its positive outcomes.

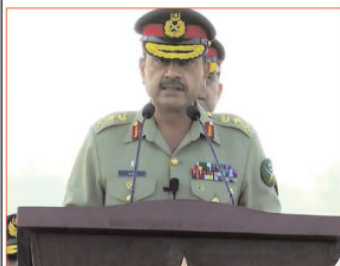
He thanked Pakistan for the warm welcome and hospitality extended to him and his delegation.

In addition to member countries, Iran's first vice president will be present, along with India's foreign minister.

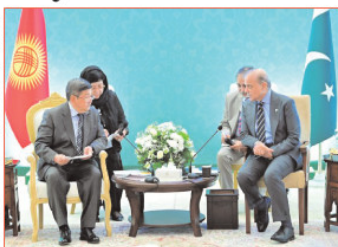

The court approved the case withdrawing the application by the NAB. The judge also directed to remand the reference to the NAB chairman.

Those acquitted include former PSO MD Shaikh Imranul Haq, former Secretary Petroleum Arshad Mirza, and former MD Yaqoob Sattar.

The Accountability Court in Karachi accepted NAB's request to withdraw the reference regarding illegal recruitment in PSO. The court ordered the case to be sent back to the NAB Chairman.

Those acquitted are former Prime Minister Shahid Khaqan Abbasi, ex-MD PSO Sheikh Imran-ul-Haq, ex-



Secretary Petroleum Arshad Mirza, and ex-MD PSO Yaqoob Sattar.

Speaking to the media outside the court, Abbasi reiterated that NAB should be abolished for the country to advance.

He stressed the need for judicial reforms, noting that politically motivated cases are prolonged unnecessarily.

"The judge acquitted four of us today, but another accused has been facing the same court for 12 years. This was not a corruption case but

merely an allegation of misuse of authority," Abbasi said. He also criticized NAB for dragging the case for over four years and presenting only one witness.

Abbasi, who faced a similar case in the NAB court for nine years, called it a "happy day" but stressed that the flawed judicial system needs urgent reforms.

He affirmed his support for any political party committed to upholding the Constitution. —RT/Agency

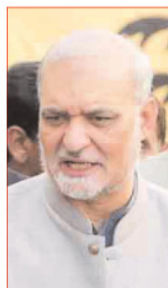
Hafiz Naeem Urges Bold Stance On Gaza at SCO Summit
