# Pakistan Pushes For Power And Peace At SCO Summit

ISLAMABAD: At the high-stakes Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, Pakistan has urged member states to prioritise collective efforts for regional security and stability amid a rapidly changing global landscape. "We are at a historic moment of transition where sweeping transformations are reshaping the global, social, political, economic, and security landscape," he said in his keynote address at the 23rd meeting of the SCO Council of the Heads of Government (CHG).

diplomatic reverberations of the SCO summit, former ambassador Maleeha Lodhi said that Islamabad had significantly bolstered its international standing. "By holding this summit, Pakistan's diplomatic position has strengthened globally. This is an important diplomatic moment for Pakistan as important leaders are attending the summit," said Lodhi while speaking to media. Presiding over the meeting, PM Shehbaz said: "From the esteemed platform of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, a beacon of multilateralism, I stand in the belief that we possess not only the potential but the will to forge a future that is more prosperous and secure for our people."

"A future, that is inclusive, and reflective of the shared aspirations of all member states," the premier said while addressing the meeting. The premier said that Afghanistan, by virtue of its contiguity with the region, presents an invaluable opportunity for trade and transit, benefiting all SCO member states. "A stable Afghanistan, is not only desirable, but essential, to fully realising these opportunities," he added. It may be noted that the neighbouring nation is part of the regional bloc. It holds the position of an observer state but has been inactive since 2021, when the Taliban took over. The premier called on the international community to step forward, with urgent humanitarian support for Afghanistan, while also urging its interim Taliban government to embrace political inclusivity to ensure that Afghan soil is not misused

for terrorism against its neighbours by any entity. PM Shehbaz highlighted the challenges of poverty in his address, saying that it was not just an economic issue but a moral imperative that demanded the collective attention of the regional states. "With millions living in poverty within the SCO region, closer cooperation on poverty alleviation is critical," he added. PM Shehbaz underscored that Pakistan, as the permanent chair of the SCO Special Working Group on Poverty, has facilitated, several seminars, and webinars aimed at sharing of knowledge, and best practices. He reaffirmed the coun-

try's commitment to providing the required impetus to the collective efforts to address the root causes of poverty and uplift the quality of life for our people. Speaking about another global issue, PM Shehbaz said that climate change is an existential crisis that transcends borders and its impacts are felt universally but more acutely by nations like Pakistan. He went on to say that the country is on the frontline of climate-induced disasters. "It is imperative that we prioritise environmental cooperation within the SCO to build resilience and secure a sustainable future for the generations to come," the premier added. Moreover, the prime minister maintained that Pakistan welcomes the recent SCO agreement on environmental protection and calls upon all member states to actively engage in both regional and global environmental efforts. He said that the government has developed a "one of its kind" proactive, technology-driven, disaster manage-

ment system. "We look forward to organising, simulation exercises with SCO partners, to bolster, disaster preparedness, across the region," PM Shehbaz added. Emphasising the importance of connectivity, the premier urged the establishment of a robust SCO connectivity framework to boost regional trade and advance the vision of a connected Eurasia. He also called for the expansion of flagship projects like the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), and the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC) to enhance integration and cooperation, across the region. "Let us not look at such projects, through the narrow, political prism and invest in our collective connectivity capacities, which are crucial to advancing the shared vision of an economically integrated region. Let us work together for a well-integrated and prosperous region that benefits all Member states," he added.

Moreover, the premier stressed that unilateral coercive measures and protectionist policies run contrary to the principles of international law as they "stifle economic growth, hinder technological advancements and exacerbate inequality". PM Shehbaz Sharif called on the SCO leaders to encourage private sectors to cultivate an environment that is conducive to business and investment within the region. He said that the growing consensus, among member states on the use of mutual currencies for settlements is a promising development. The premier added that Pakistan firmly believes that a stronger and more effective SCO is essential to achieving sustainable development in our region. "We wholeheartedly endorse, the ongoing reforms, aimed at modernising the organisation, enhancing the resources and capabilities of the SCO Secretariat and the Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure," he said. PM Shehbaz reminded

the SCO member states that the "true essence" of the multi-lateral forum extends, beyond political alliances and economic partnerships. "Pakistan remains deeply committed to fostering people-to-people ties and cultural exchanges that bridge divides, cultivate understanding, and deepen cooperation. In unity and with shared purpose, we can build, lasting legacies, and enrich, the future, of all our nations," PM Shehbaz said while concluding his keynote address. Before the meeting officially kicked off, the premier welcomed the leaders at the venue, which was followed by a group photo. Marking a successful end to the SCO summit, PM Shehbaz said he was honoured to chair the 23rd meeting today. "Pakistan's national statement, underscored the constructive role that SCO can play for sustainable development, enhance regional connectivity & economic integration, strengthen climate action, and poverty alleviation," the PM wrote on X.—RT/Agency



## India's Jaishankar Praises Pakistan's 'Warm Welcome' During SCO Talks

ISLAMABAD: Indian Foreign Minister Subrahmanya Jaishankar on Wednesday thanked Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Deputy Prime Minister and his Pakistani counterpart Ishaq Dar and the government for the "hospitality and courtesies" during the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit hosted by Islamabad. Jaishankar, who attended the SCO moot held in Islamabad, was the first foreign minister of the neighbouring nation to visit Pakistan in nearly a decade. Hours after the conclusion of the two-day regional huddle, Jaishankar wrote on his X handle: "Departing from Islamabad. Thank PM @CMShehbaz, DPM & FM @MishaqDar50 and the Government of Pakistan for the hospitality and courtesies."

Indian counterpart Jaishankar had a brief exchange during the lunch hosted for the leaders attending the SCO summit. The sources, however, said the details of the discussions between the top officials cannot be revealed at this time. Speaking about the Indian FM visit to Pakistan in nearly 10 years, Information Minister Attaullah Tarar termed it an "ice breaker". "Neither us nor them requested for a bilateral meeting... but I believe his arrival here is an ice breaker," AFP quoted the information minister as saying. "Yesterday, when all the leaders were being welcomed and there were handshakes, I think positive images were sent out globally."

Indian FM Jaishankar and PM Shehbaz greeted each other with a handshake and sombre expressions at the start of an official dinner for the visiting leaders of the SCO bloc on Tuesday. Relations between India and Pakistan have been particularly sour since 2019, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi revoked the limited autonomy of Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir. Jaishankar, in another X post, said that a productive meeting of the SCO Council of Heads of Government concluded in Islamabad today. "Signed eight outcome documents. India made a positive and constructive contribution to the deliberations."—RT/Agency

## JUI-F And PPP Leaders Hold High-Stakes Meeting With Sharif Brothers Over Controversial Constitutional Amendment

LAHORE: The bigwigs of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), Pakistan People's Party (PPP), and Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) are holding a detailed discussion on the proposed 26th constitutional amendment, media reported. The meeting is being held at the Jati Umra, the Sharif brothers' residence in Lahore, attended by President Asif Ali Zardari, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, PML-N President Nawaz Sharif, JUI-F chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman, Chief Minister Punjab Maryam Nawaz, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and others. During the meeting, three different drafts of the constitutional amendments—each presented by three parties—PPP's Khurshid Shah, who heads the parliament's special committee on the constitutional amendment, also

presented the recommendations. The federal government is intending to present the constitutional amendments in the National Assembly on Thursday for which the lower house session has already been called. PM Shehbaz will also hold a lunch-eve for coalition parties ahead of the National Assembly sitting. Earlier on Tuesday, the JUI-F and PPP reached an agreement on constitutional amendments following their meetings in Karachi. This was disclosed by JUI-F Maulana Fazlur Rehman and PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari while addressing a joint presser. Maulana Fazlur Rehman said that his party and PPP agreed on the draft of constitutional amendments, hailing Bilawal Bhutto Zardari for the consensus.—RT/Agency

## SCO Showdown: US Admits Nations Have The Right To Form Alliances

WASHINGTON: The United States (US) has said that it respects every nation's sovereign right to form alliances and associations of its own choosing. Responding to a question about the ongoing Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit in Islamabad, State Department's spokesperson Matthew Miller said that the US encourages every country to ensure that its participation in multilateral fora upholds and respects international law and reaffirms the sovereignty, territorial integrity and independence of all nations. Pakistan is hosting a two-day meeting of the Council of Heads of Government of the SCO in the federal capital that will conclude this evening. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will preside over the high-level meeting, for which the South Asian nation has made stringent arrangements to ensure the event proceeds smoothly. The prime ministers and high-ranking officials from the SCO member states, including Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, and

The move came after a recent Indian media report said that police had arrested three smugglers in the western Gopalganj district of Bihar with a rare Californium stone which is highly radioactive and fetches a high price in the international market. "The Security Council should be deeply concerned about the recurring incidents of theft and illicit sale of nuclear and other radioactive materials in our Eastern neighbour," permanent representative of Pakistan to the UN Ambassador Munir Akram told a committee established by the 15-member Council pursuant to its resolution 1540 that requires UN member states to take specific steps to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMD).—RT/Agency



## -Can you believe this nonsense? Government To Shell Out Rs 72bn To Five IPPs

ISLAMABAD: The federal government decided to pay a total of Rs 72 billion as a final settlement to five Independent Power Producers (IPPs) as it terminated the agreements with them, media reported citing sources. Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif announced to terminate the agreements with five IPPs in the first phase on October 10. According to sources, the government will pay Hubco Rs 36.5 billion and Rs 15.5 billion to the Roush Power. Similarly, the Lalpur Power will be paid Rs 12.8 billion, Atlas Power Rs 15.5 billion and, Sapphire Power will be paid Rs 6 billion by the federal government. According to the sources, the settlement does not include late payment charges. The agreements with the five IPPs will be deemed officially terminated with effect from October 1. Earlier chairing the fed-

eral cabinet meeting in Islamabad, PM Shehbaz said the termination was done after the mutual consent of the owners of the IPPs. The Prime Minister informed the Cabinet that only the outstanding amounts owed to these IPPs will be paid, without any interest. He said that termination of these contracts will save power consumers about sixty billion rupees and provide a benefit of around four hundred and eleven billion rupees to the national exchequer. PM Shehbaz Sharif said it was the outcome of the strenuous collective efforts

## Dar Hails SCO Summit As A Major Win For Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar has highlighted the significance of hosting the SCO summit, calling it a great honour for Pakistan. During a joint press conference with the secretary general of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in Islamabad, Dar expressed gratitude to all member countries that participated. He praised their positive contribution to the

summit and noted the approval of several proposals aimed at sustainable development, including discussions on trade, investment, and the creative economy. Despite regional and global challenges, Dar emphasized Pakistan's commitment to implementing the SCO Charter and underscored the improvement of trade, investment, and development of youth and women for regional prosperity.—RT/Agency

## FBR Boss Demands Slash In Income And Corporate Tax Rates

ISLAMABAD: Chairman FBR Rashid Mahmood Langrial on Wednesday said that the income tax and corporate tax rates required to be fixed and slashed, media reported. "It is wrong to collect tax for the whole year and paying it for debt servicing," FBR chief said. Rashid Langrial said that there are such government officers, traders and industrialists, who doesn't evade a single rupee of the payable tax. He said 95 people in the country are poor, but they are paying tax in the form of sales tax. FBR chief said there are five percent wealthy people thus the tax being imposed over them. "There are some people in this five percent who didn't pay their taxes," FBR chairman added. It is to be mentioned here that the government has extended the deadline for filing income tax returns for the tax

year 2024 again until October 31, providing an opportunity for those who did not file their returns before October 14. The previous deadline was October 14, but banks in Islamabad and Rawalpindi were closed for three days, causing issues for taxpayers who completed their returns. Federal Board of Revenue Chairman Rashid Mahmood Langrial confirmed to Dawn on Monday. The original deadline for submitting tax returns was September 30. The FBR received 4,537 million income tax returns until October 14, compared to 2,183 during the same period last year. For the tax year 2023, the FBR received a total of 6,464m returns. To reach last year's level, it needs an additional 1,927m returns.—RT/Agency

## Sassui Sounds Alarms Over Sindh's Water Crisis, Warns Of Grave Consequences

THATTA: Former Senator and Pakistan People's Party leader Sassui Palijo has issued a stark warning regarding the decisions made in the recent Central Development Working Party (CDWP) meeting, calling it a matter of "life and death" for the people of Sindh. Speaking at a press conference at the Thatta Press Club, Palijo voiced strong concerns about the controversial Kalabagh Dam and condemned the construction of the Cholistan Canal, labeling it as direct terrorism against Sindh. Palijo criticized policymakers, questioning whether they truly understood or respected the constitution, accusing them of repeatedly violating it. She vowed that the people of Sindh would never accept such unjust decisions. Highlighting the acute water crisis affecting districts like Thatta, the Sujawal, Badin, and Tando Muhammad Khan, she stressed that Sindh is disproportionately affected by climate change, with far fewer water resources compared to other provinces. She emphasized that access to clean drinking water and land is essential not only for the survival of the people but also for political relevance in the region. Palijo raised questions about the composition of the Council of Common Interests (CCI), which she argued was unfairly dominated by Punjab. She criticized the irrigation authority for overstepping its mandate and stressed that key decisions affecting water distribution should be made within the CCI. Palijo demanded that the Prime Minister ensure equal treatment of all provinces, questioning whether smaller provinces like Sindh are being left behind. With rising sea levels and a depleting Kotri downstream, Palijo warned that the lack of water has led to conflict, destruction of agriculture, and a fisheries crisis. She called on IRSA and the Punjab government to reconsider their actions.

## Nationalists Condemn Brutal Torture During Karachi Peace March

HINGORJA: In Hingorja, nationalist activists staged a protest demanding the arrest of the perpetrators behind the violence at the Karachi Peace March and the murder of Dr. Shah Nawaz Kumbhar. Led by Karam Samtio, Muji Bbhelar, Qalb Haidari Solangi, Zahoor Dayo, and Hakeem Mangi, the protest took place outside the press club. Activists spoke to the media, claiming that Dr. Kumbhar was killed by police in a fake encounter and called for a judicial inquiry into his death. They also demanded action against those responsible for the violence at the Karachi Peace March. In another incident, crime in Hingorja has escalated. Unknown thieves broke into two shops at the Hingorja Stop Market, stealing hundreds of thousands of rupees. The previous night, thieves targeted the shop of journalist and trader Aftab Memon, making off with four hundred thousand rupees and valuable goods. The same night, they also robbed the shop of grocer Nazir Memon. Police arrived to gather details from the affected shopkeepers. In response, Aftab Bhanbhro, Nazir Ahmed Memon, and other residents protested against the rising crime, accusing the police of failing to maintain order. They warned that unless criminals are apprehended and the stolen goods recovered, a complete shutdown strike would be organized in the city.

### Top Management Course Delegation Visits RPO Office In Gujranwala

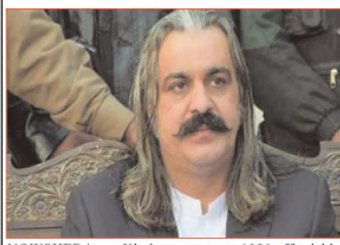

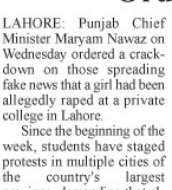
### President Pushes For Stronger Economic Ties With Turkmenistan Amid Trade Talks

### CM Maryam Targets 'Fake' Lahore College Rape Scandal, Orders Swift Action



LAHORE: Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz on Wednesday ordered a crackdown on those spreading fake news that a girl had been allegedly raped at a private college in Lahore. Since the beginning of the week, students have staged protests in multiple cities of the country's largest province, demanding that alleged culprits of the claimed crime be brought to justice. While the protests caused injuries to students and police alike, the authorities had firmly stated that no girl had been raped, while the girl's family had also ruled out the sexual assault. During a press conference, the provincial chief executive said that a crackdown should be launched "regardless of whether they belong to the PTI [Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf] or Chaudhry Pervez Elahi's Q-League". She also blamed the former ruling party for spreading fake news and spreading

siege, and anarchy. "I know very well who is behind this incident and will not leave anyone who was involved in this," she stressed. A high-level committee, formed by the Punjab government, has also stated in its report that the girl had not been raped and that she sustained injuries at her home. The police registered a first information report (FIR) at the Defence A Police Station against the spread of misinformation and unverified news on social media. She said that the authorities were still looking for the victim to date and added that the girl whose name was being taken as an alleged rape victim was undergoing treatment in the hospital since October 2 and the accused guard was on vacation. ### Massive Drug Haul: ANF Seizes 212 Kilos In Dramatic Nationwide Raids



RAWALPINDI: Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF) while conducting nine operations across the country managed to recover 212 kg drugs worth over Rs 25 million and arrested 11 suspects, said an ANF Headquarters spokesman here on Wednesday. 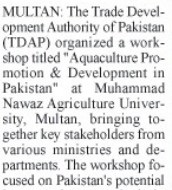

### TDAP Champions Aquaculture Growth With Workshop On Shrimp Farming In Punjab

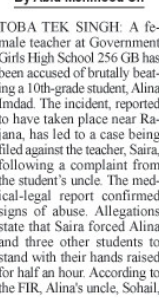


MULTAN: The Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) organized a workshop titled "Aquaculture Promotion & Development in Pakistan" at Muhammad Nawaz Agriculture University, Multan, bringing together key stakeholders from various ministries and departments. The workshop focused on Pakistan's potential in aquaculture, particularly shrimp farming, and recent advancements in freshwater fisheries exports. Prominent speakers at the event included Dr. Asif Raza (Dean, Veterinary & Animal Science Department), Dr. Anser Mahmood Chatta (Director General Wildlife & Fisheries South Punjab), Mr. Farhan Khan (Assistant Fisheries Development Commissioner, Ministry of Maritime Affairs), Dr. Mubarak Ahmed (Consultant Agro & Food Division, TDAP), and Mr. Junaid Watto (CEO, Fisheries Development Board). Dr. Asif Raza opened the event by discussing how Punjab is leveraging new regulations to boost freshwater fisheries and shrimp farming. Dr. Mubarak Ahmed shared a significant milestone, noting that Pakistan is preparing for its first-ever

freshwater fisheries exports, with the Central Asian market offering immediate opportunities. He highlighted that TDAP is targeting \$1 billion in fisheries exports, building on the \$406 million achieved by June 2024. Dr. Anser Mahmood Chatta emphasized the vast potential for shrimp farming in Punjab, explaining how saline groundwater in the region can be used for shrimp cultivation. He spotlighted the 130-acre shrimp farming project in Muzaffargarh, initiated by CM Punjab Maryam Nawaz, which has already seen an \$8 million investment in shrimp seed ready for harvest. 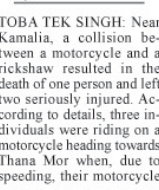

### Police Clamp Down On Spread Of Shocking Unverified Reports In Lahore Rape Case

LAHORE: Soon after a high-level committee, formed by the Punjab government, published its preliminary findings concerning the alleged rape of a first-year female student at a private college in the city, the police registered a first information report (FIR) at the Defence A Police Station citing the spread of misinformation and unverified news on social media. The case has been registered by the police under section 20 of the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act, 2016, which deals with "offences against dignity of a natural person", while other charges include section 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty), 500 (punishment for defamation), 501 (printing or engraving matter

known to be defamatory); and 505 (statements conducive to public mischief). The development comes after social media was flooded with public outcry over the alleged rape incident, with the matter going viral across various platforms with photographs of some female students also being widely shared. The matter surfaced on the internet after students of a private college took to streets on Monday to protest against the alleged rape. The demonstration turned violent after dozens of the protesters were injured in violent clashes with protesters and law enforcers. The protests also continued on Tuesday and Wednesday in difference of the province. According to the FIR, the

## The weaponization of social media

The recent uproar over the alleged rape incident at a private college in Lahore has brought to light the enormous influence of social media—both its power to inform and its potential to mislead. In today's digital age, information travels at lightning speed, often without verification, leading to a dangerous mix of truth, misinformation, and speculation.

Last week, social media was ablaze with reports of an alleged rape on a Lahore campus. The news went viral, sparking protests and demands for justice. However, Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz has now debunked these allegations, calling the incident

Sajid Khan's Rampage: England Crumbles To Pakistan's Spin Wizard

MULTAN: Pakistan bounced back in the game as four English wickets fell in a span of a few overs including robust opener Ben Duckett leading England to finish the second day's play of the second Test against Pakistan at 239/6 at the Multan Cricket Stadium on Wednesday.



Pakistan's Sajid Khan got his team back in the game as he grabbed the all-important wickets of century Dockett, Harry Brook and Joe Root. Earlier, he had dismissed Ollie Pope. The visiting side were pretty much leading the game from the top with Duckett's smashing hundred to lead England's robust reply to Pakistan's first-innings 366. Duckett reached his fourth Test hundred on 129 balls - his slowest-ever

hundred comparing to his ton on 88 balls vs India, 105 balls vs Pakistan and 106 balls vs Ireland. Root was with Duckett, cheering him on but failed to replicate his partner's score and was dismissed by Sajid Khan after scoring 34 off 54 balls, leaving England at 211/3. Within the next couple of overs, Pakistan's bowlers found their rhythm and dismissed Duckett at 114 runs, dangerman Harry Brook and skipper Ben Stokes. Earlier, the touring side were 88 for one at tea with Duckett unbeaten on 53 and Pope on five. Duckett combined in a breezy 73-run opening stand with Zak Crawley, who led a charmed life before he fell for 27. Crawley survived a run-out after a mix-up with Duckett only because

bowler Sajid Khan had broken the stumps before he could collect the ball. Sajid appeared to have redeemed himself in the next over when his lbw appeal against Crawley was upheld. Pakistan's joy was short-lived, however, as Crawley, convinced by Duckett, reviewed the decision, which was reversed after replays confirmed the ball would have narrowly missed the stumps. Crawley could not make the most of the reprieves, though, and fell to Noman Ali. After the caught-behind against Crawley had been turned down, left-arm spinner Noman cajoled his captain Shan Masood to review the decision and replays confirmed an edge.—Agency

Messi Matches Ronaldo: Argentina Thrashes Bolivia 6-0



Argentine football legend Lionel Messi equalled Portuguese football star Cristiano Ronaldo's record for most international hat-tricks as he scored his 10th such hat-trick. Messi, 36, achieved the latest feat as his national team thrashed Bolivia 6-0 in South American qualifiers for the 2026 World Cup in front of a home crowd at the Monumental stadium and helped score two more goals. In only his second international appearance since recovering from an injury sustained at the Copa America in July, the Inter Miami star capped a tally to 112 goals for his country.—Agency

Cricket Showdown: ECB Warns India Pullout Could Shatter Champions Trophy



ENGLAND: As the Board of Cricket Control in India (BCCI) is yet to decide on sending a team to Pakistan for the upcoming ICC Champions Trophy 2025, the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) Chair Richard Thompson said: "It would not be in cricket's interests for India not to be playing [in the event]". Pakistan is scheduled to host the prestigious ICC tournament in February next year, however, India's participation remains uncertain as the BCCI seeks the New Delhi's approval to visit the country. India has not travelled to Pakistan since 2008 and both the historical rivals have not had any bilateral series since 2012-13. Urging both South Asian nations to reach a decision amicably, Thompson said that BCCI Chairman Jay Shah is going to have a big role to play in this situation. "There's geopolitics, and then there's cricketing geopolitics. I think they'll find a way. They have to find a way."

England Shake-Up: Ex-Chelsea Boss Tuchel To Lead National Football Team

Former Chelsea manager Thomas Tuchel has agreed to take on the role of England manager. He will become the third non-British permanent coach to lead the England men's team. The German coach will officially succeed Gareth Southgate, who resigned after England's defeat to Spain in the Euro 2024 final.



According to BBC, Thomas Tuchel will take charge after Lee Carsley's interim spell, which concludes with England's last two Nations League matches in November 2022, winning the Champions League, FIFA Club World Cup, and UEFA Super Cup. His most recent managerial post was at Bayern Munich, which he left after the club failed to secure the Bundesliga title last season. England's main objective under Thomas will be to secure qualification for the 2026 World Cup, hosted by the United States, Canada, and Mexico. The Football Association (FA) had also approached Pep Guardiola in the summer, but the Manchester City manager declined. Thomas's appointment adds to his impressive resume, which includes stints at Paris Saint-Germain and Borussia Dortmund, where he won multiple domestic titles.—Agency

Explosive Video: Haris Rauf's Heated Clash With Kamran Ghulam Resurfaces



LAHORE: Pakistan's batter Kamran Ghulam made an outstanding debut, scoring a brilliant century against England on the first day of the second Test in Multan. The 29-year-old hit 118 off 224 balls, which included 11 fours and one six, guiding Pakistan to a solid 259-5 by stumps. Ghulam's impressive performance came after Pakistan faced early trouble, losing two wickets for just 19 runs. Ghulam, who replaced the out-of-form Babar Azam in the line-up, formed a crucial 149-run partnership with Saim Ayub (77) for the third wicket. He also built a 65-run stand with Mohammad Rizwan (37\*), helping Pakistan recover and finish the day in a strong position. Ghulam reached his century after 280 minutes at the crease, hitting a boundary off Joe Root, becoming the 12th Pakistani batter to score a century on Test debut. This achievement comes after Ghulam's long wait for a place in the national team, following his record-breaking performance in the 2020 domestic season, where he amassed 1,249 runs. However, as Ghulam's name trended on social media, an old controversial video from the Pakistan Super League (PSL) resurfaced. In 2022, fast bowler Haris Rauf slapped Ghulam on the field after the latter dropped a catch during a Lahore Qalandars match. Though the incident drew attention, the two players quickly made peace, with Rauf hugging Ghulam later in the match. Despite this past controversy, Ghulam's Test debut has now overshadowed the 280 minutes at the crease, making headlines and offering Pakistan.—Agency

Men's Ashes 2025-26 Unveiled: Epic Opening Clash Set For Perth

PERTH: Cricket Australia has officially unveiled the dates for the highly anticipated 2025-26 Men's Ashes series, set to kick off at Perth Stadium from November 21-25, 2025. The announcement was made on Wednesday at an event held at Scarborough Beach, Perth, with support from the Western Australian Government.



The iconic five-match series will begin with the "West Test" in Perth, followed by a day-night Test at the Gabba in Brisbane (December 4-8) and the traditional Christmas Test at Adelaide Oval (December 17-21). The famous Boxing Day Test at Melbourne's MCG (December 26-30) and the New Year's Test at Sydney's SCG (January 4-8) will maintain their usual timeslots, providing a classic Ashes summer experience for cricket fans.

This announcement aligns with Australian Cricket's seven-year scheduling plan, designed to offer more certainty for fans and enhance partnerships with governments and tourism departments. By releasing the Ashes dates early, Cricket Australia aims to help international and interstate fans plan their trips in advance. Joel Morrison, CA Executive General Manager for Events and Operations, expressed excitement about the series. "There is already enormous excitement surrounding the 2025-26 Ashes series and we are pleased to announce the dates for the five Men's Tests to enable fans across the world to lock in their travel plans for this summer. Beginning with the West Test at Perth Stadium, the 2025-26 Ashes dates align with our recently released seven-year international schedule and we are grateful for the support state and territory governments are providing to enhance and grow our major events. Morrison highlighted the support from state and territory governments, emphasizing the significance of the Ashes in the global sporting calendar. "The history and excitement of the Ashes make it one of the world's most iconic sporting events and we are delighted to see the rivalry will extend over two summers in 2025 - commencing with the Women's Ashes this summer, which includes the historic MCG day-night Test, and culminates in the Men's Ashes next summer.—Agency

## Bloody Ambush: Four Policemen Injured In Deadly IED Blast In Buner

BUNER: Four policemen including the in-charge of the police post, were injured on Wednesday when an improvised explosive device (IED) went off near a police van in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Buner district, a police official said. Speaking to media, the spokesperson to the Buner district police officer, Israr Ahmad, said, "A police vehicle was on its routine patrol in the Nawagai area, and when it reached the Kankai Chowk, an IED exploded." The police official said that the in-charge of the police post at Ambela, Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASP), Shahid Zada, Constable Noor Mohammad, who was the driver, Constable

Ifrikhar Ali, and Constable Altaf Ahmad were injured in the attack. "The injured policemen have been shifted to a hospital in the area and their condition is stable," he said. Ahmad added that following the attack, police began a search operation in the area and the District Police Officer (DPO), Shah Hassan, himself was leading the operation to find the perpetrator who attempted to kill the police personnel. The incident is the latest in a string of attacks on police officials and checkpoints, particularly in KP and Balochistan. In another incident in Buner in September, unidentified suspects torched a government primary school and detonated an IED as a police team returned from the burnt school in Meragai. No casualties were reported in that incident. Meanwhile, an attack took place on Monday where five militants wearing burqas and suicide vests were killed as four police officials embraced martyrdom in an attempt to foil a gun and bomb attack on Iqbal Shaheed Police Lines in Bannu. Pakistan has lately seen a rise in terrorism incidents, particularly in KP and Balochistan. Attacks have escalated after the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) broke a fragile ceasefire agreement with the government in 2022 and vowed to target security forces.—RT/Agency

## Heartbreaking Tragedy: Four Family Members Killed As Vehicle Overturns In Vehari

VEHARI: At least four members of a family lost their lives after a vehicle overturned in Vehari, media reported on Wednesday. As per details, the incident occurred near Ladan area of Vehari where vehicle overturned when the driver slept while driving. The rescue officials stated that the incident reportedly claimed life of four family members who were on their way back from Lahore. In January this year, two individuals died, 10 others injured after a bus full of passengers overturned on National Highway due to dense fog. The rescue officials reported that a bus carrying passengers was overturned on the national highway due to heavy fog and low visibility near Kot Khalfia, leaving two dead and multiple passengers injured.—RT/Agency

## Non-Bailable Arrest Warrants Issued For Key Figures In Explosive May 9 Incident

PESHAWAR: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Peshawar has issued non-bailable arrest warrants for three individuals accused of involvement in the May 9 protest case, media reported. As per details, the accused are Abdul Rehman, Abdul Jabbar Baghi, and Latif Ali, who failed to appear in court, will now be arrested and presented before the court. The May 9 protests in Peshawar were marked by violence and destruction of private and public property, resulting in the loss of one life. The case has been adjourned until October 19, and Provincial Minister Meena Khan Afridi is also named in the case. Earlier, the Anti-Terrorism Court acquitted all 18 accused, including PTI workers, in the May 9 riots case due to lack of evidence. The defendants were accused of protesting in Landi Kotal on May 9, blocking the Torkham Road, damaging property, and damaging an Anti-Narcotics Force vehicle. However, the court found no evidence against them and acquitted all 18 defendants. The verdict was announced by Judge Muhammad Iqbal of the Special Anti-Terrorism Court.—RT/Agency

## Sindh Revolutionizes Education With New Matric And Intermediate Grading System

KARACHI: In a bid to modernize the education system, the Sindh government has announced a new grading policy for matriculation and intermediate exams, marking the first province in Pakistan to make this shift. According to a notification by Muhammad Abbas Baloch, Secretary of Boards and Universities, students will now receive grades rather than traditional marks or positions, effective from 2025.

The move, formulated by the Inter-Board Coordination Committee (IBCC), is aimed at standardizing assessments across the board. The grading scale includes B+ (80-84%) for "Very Good," B (75-79%) for "Good," B- (70-74%) for "Fair," and C (60-69%) for "Above Average." While Sindh leads the way, other provinces like Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and Balochistan have yet to adopt similar systems. Educationist Syed Abidi from Lahore praised the initiative, stating that it provides a more comprehensive evaluation of student performance and prepares them for future academic challenges.

Under the new system, the top three positions will be eliminated, and grades will be awarded based on percentage scores. For example, an A++ grade will be given to students scoring 95% or above, while those between 90% and 94% will receive an A+.

Abidi also highlighted that the new system aligns

## KCCI President Calls For FBR To Delay Affidavit Rule For Sales Tax Returns

KARACHI: Muhammad Jawed Bilwani, President of the Karachi Chamber of Commerce & Industry (KCCI), has recommended that the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) defer the requirement for taxpayers to submit an affidavit with their Sales Tax Returns. He argued that while taxpayers must affirm the accuracy of their information, they could still face penalties for vendors' wrongdoings.

In a statement, Bilwani noted the confusion surrounding the current purchasing process, urging the FBR to clarify which vendors are trustworthy or establish standard operating procedures (SOPs) for purchases. He recalled that FBR officials previously advised businesses to check vendor compliance on their website, a practice now complicated by the affidavit requirement, which could be used against businesses in cases of vendor tax evasion.

Bilwani also expressed concerns over the FBR's increased audits, which he believes contradicts the Finance Minister's promise of an IT and AI-driven, streamlined audit process. He cautioned that more

auditors could lead to corruption and inefficiencies. While he acknowledged some positive aspects of the FBR's transformation plan, he stressed the need for collaboration with the business community to address ongoing issues.

Following a recent meeting with the Chairman of FBR at Customs House in Karachi, Bilwani expressed hope that the FBR would consider the challenges and suggestions presented to create a more taxpayer-friendly environment essential for business and economic growth.—RT

## FPCCI And FBR Joining Forces For Groundbreaking Taxation Reforms: Atif Ikram Sheikh

KARACHI: Atif Ikram Sheikh, President of the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI), announced a significant partnership between FPCCI and the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) to develop comprehensive taxation reforms. He emphasized that effective revenue generation is crucial for Pakistan's fiscal health and must involve a consultative and inclusive approach.

The announcement followed a visit by FBR Chairman Rashid Mahmood Langrial to FPCCI's headquarters in Karachi, where he engaged with senior trade, industry, and media representatives. Sheikh reiterated that taxation reforms should focus on broadening the tax base, simplifying the tax system, and rationalizing tax rates to foster a supportive taxation culture.

FPCCI Senior Vice President Saquib Fayyaz Magoon raised concerns over FBR's ambitious revenue target of PKR 12.97 trillion, highlighting the disparity with the economy's 2% growth rate. He warned that this could lead to new taxes and financial burdens on the already taxed business community.

Magoon criticized recent government policies, including the abrupt withdrawal of the 1% full liability for exporters and the implementation of the Tajir Dost Scheme without proper consultation, resulting in a 99% revenue shortfall. He called for a revision of problematic SRO 350 (I)/2024 and urged the revival of the Alternate Dispute Resolution Committee (ADRC) for smoother tax processes.

He also proposed simplifying the Export Finance Scheme (EFS), which currently takes 3-4 months due

to its complexity, and warned against including Export Processing Zones (EPZs) in the regular tax scheme, as it would deter investors.

Khurram Ejaz, a member of the PM's committee, questioned why Pakistani ports do not operate 24/7 like their international counterparts and urged the implementation of FBR's LIVE project to improve customs procedures. Chairman Langrial acknowledged the need to reduce tax rates to alleviate burdens but stated it was not feasible under current conditions. He expressed optimism about potential interest rate cuts and emphasized that promoting a tax culture is essential for the economy's recovery. Langrial also noted that tax evasion remains a significant issue, urging efforts to target evaders rather than compliant taxpayers.—RT

## Sindh Small Industries Corporation To Revive Training Centers: Jam Ikram



KARACHI: Provincial Minister for Industries and Commerce, Jam Ikramullah Dharejo, announced that the training centers managed by the Sindh Small Industries Corporation (SSIC) will be revitalized to provide vocational and technical training to youth, enabling them to become productive members of society.

During the briefing, it was revealed that SSIC oversees 22 industrial estates and seven artisan colonies across Sindh. Dharejo highlighted the need for activating these training centers and improving the recovery of arrears from industrial plots to stabilize the corporation's financial situation.

The meeting was attended by Secretary Industries and Commerce Muhammad Yasin Shar Baloch, MD SITE Ghazwanfar Ali Qadri, and MD Small Industries Sarwat Faheem.—RT

## Sindh Government Unveils Ambitious Plan To Restore 350,000 Hectares Of Mangroves

KARACHI: Chief Secretary of Sindh, Asif Hyder Shah, met with a 40-member delegation from the Senior Management Course today, including official such as Additional Chief Secretary Home Muhammad Iqbal Memon and IG Sindh Ghulam Nabi Memon.

During the meeting, Shah outlined the Sindh government's development initiatives, highlighting a significant allocation of 959 billion rupees for the current year. He announced that the Malir Expressway is set for completion by 2025 and that the reconstruction of schools damaged by the 2022 floods, with a target completion date of 2028.

The Chief Secretary reported that 200,000 houses have been rehabilitated fol-

lowing the 2022 floods, with over 430,000 additional homes constructed to the plinth level. He emphasized that Sindh's Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) have gained international acclaim, citing completed projects such as the Karachi-Thatta Dual Carriageway and ongoing initiatives like the Malir Expressway and Dhabaji Industrial Zone.

Highlighting environmental efforts, Shah announced a plan under the Carbon Project to restore mangroves across 350,000 hectares, with the Sindh government having received \$14.7 million in carbon credits so far. He projected annual earnings of \$15 to \$20 million from carbon credits.

The Chief Secretary also outlined a \$200 million budget for road construction and a \$320 million allocation for canal rehabilitation under the Sindh Flood Emergency Rehabilitation Project, which totals \$530 million for infrastructure restoration.

Additionally, the Sindh Police reported a significant decrease in crime rates this year, with street crime incidents dropping from 93,467 last year to 56,877 this year. The meeting concluded with updates on police efforts in the Katcha area, including the arrest of 54 suspects, and the martyrdom of 31 police personnel during operations. A budget of Rs 4.8 billion has been set for enhancing police station autonomy, alongside ongoing recruitment for 25,000 additional constables.—RT/Agency

## SCO Leaders Double Down On Peace And Prosperity Pledges

ISLAMABAD: The heads of delegation from Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) member states on Wednesday reaffirmed their commitment to peacefully resolving disputes through dialogue and consultations besides emphasizing the importance of strengthening cooperation across various sectors, including politics, security, trade, finance, and cultural ties, to build a prosperous, peaceful, safe, and ecologically sustainable planet.

In a joint declaration issued at the conclusion of the two-day SCO Council of Heads of Government (CHG) meeting held here, the heads of delegations called for sustainable and inclusive economic growth of member states by optimizing the region's potential in areas such as green development, digital economy, trade, e-commerce, finance and banking, investment, high technology, startups and innovation, poverty alleviation, health care, including traditional and folk medicine, agriculture, industry, transport, logistics connectivity, energy, including renewable energy, communications, science and technology, environment and climate change.

The heads of delegations, reaffirming their desire to ensure stable economic and social development in the SCO region, noted the importance of implementing the SCO Economic Development Strategy for the period up to 2030 and the Program of Multilateral Trade and Economic Cooperation of the SCO member states.

They stressed the need for coordinated efforts through the mechanisms of relevant cooperation in order to implement the respective action plans.

The event was chaired by Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif and was attended by the leaders from the SCO member states including China's Premier of the State Council Li Qiang, Prime Minister of Belarus Roman Golovchenko, Prime Minister of Kazakhstan Olzhas Bektenov, Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin, Tajik Prime Minister Kohir Rasulzoda, Uzbek Prime Minister Abdulla Aripov, Kyrgyzstan's Chairman of Ministers' Cabinet Zhaparov Akybek, Trade Minister of Iran Seyyed Mo-

hammad Atabek, and Indian External Affairs Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar.

Besides, Mongolia is participating in the summit as an Observer State being represented by Prime Minister Oyuun-Erdene Luvsannamsrai and Turkmenistan as a Special Guest represented by Deputy Chairman of the Cabinet of Ministers Rashid Meredov.

Among other dignitaries attending the moot include SCO Secretary-General Zhang Ming, Director of Executive Committee SCO Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (RATS) Ruslan Mirzayev, Chairman of the Board of SCO Business Council Atif Ikram Shaikh and Chairman of the Council

of SCO Interbank Union Marat Yelbayev.

The heads of delegation noted significant shifts in the global economy due to advancements in technology and e-commerce, expressing concern over reduced investment and disrupted supply chains caused by protectionist measures and trade barriers.

Opposing unilateral sanctions and trade restrictions, the delegations emphasized the need for a multilateral trading system to support global sustainable development.

Belarus, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan reiterated their support for China's One Belt,

One Road initiative, highlighting ongoing collaborative efforts to integrate this project with the Eurasian Economic Union.

The heads of delegation underscored the importance of leveraging regional potential and international cooperation to facilitate equitable interactions within the SCO. They called for sustainable and inclusive economic growth, advocating for optimization in green development, digital economy, health care, agriculture, energy, and environmental initiatives.

Heads of delegation also praised Kazakhstan's chairmanship of the SCO for 2023-2024 and emphasized the importance of implementing decisions from the July 4, 2024, CHS meeting, while expressing support for China's chairmanship for 2024-2025.

They noted that the member states advocate respect for the right of peoples to independently and democratically choose their political, social and economic development, emphasizing that the principles of mutual respect for the sovereignty, independence, and territorial integrity of states, equality, mu-

tual benefit, non-interference in internal affairs, non-use of force or threat of use of force are the basis for the sustainable development of international relations.

They reaffirm the commitment to the peaceful settlement of differences and disputes between countries through dialogue and consultations.

They emphasized the importance of leveraging regional potential and international cooperation to foster broad, equitable interactions in the SCO region based on international law and mutual respect.

They highlighted the need to enhance trade and economic ties through the "New Economic Dialogue" concept among SCO member states. They also stressed the importance of leveraging the digital economy and technological innovations to boost regional competitiveness and ensure that technology benefits all.

The Heads of delegations stressed the importance of deepening cooperation in the field of information security, the relevance of the "digital divide" issue and advocated for exploring the creation of

a mechanism for cross-border data exchange.

They noted the role of standardization tools in trade facilitation and called for the promotion of mutually beneficial and equal interaction between the SCO member states, as well as the exchange of experience in these areas.

They acknowledged the significance of the SCO Industry Ministers' Meeting and proposed its next session in 2025, emphasizing that support for creative industries will enhance competitiveness, reduce unemployment, and foster sustainable growth in the region.

They supported establishing an exchange of experiences on national industrial policies and IT standardization. They emphasized the importance of developing micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises to drive economic growth and job creation, advocating continued cooperation under the 2018 Memorandum of Understanding.

Heads of delegation emphasized the importance of a unified energy vision, calling for continued cooperation in energy infrastructure, secu-

energy, and investment in renewable energy.

They reaffirmed the importance of implementing the road map for increasing the use of national currencies in mutual settlements and supported proposals for an independent settlement mechanism and converging payment systems.

They also recognized the SCO Business Council's role in fostering business cooperation and noted the Interbank Association's efforts in ESG financing and financial inclusions, along with Iran's intention to join the IBA.

Heads of delegation emphasized enhancing railway transport cooperation and welcomed the upcoming meeting of Railway Administrations in Moscow. They advocated for innovative technologies in multi-modal transport and called for developing infrastructure, logistics, and safety measures, aligning with the SCO's Concept of Cooperation on ports and logistics centers.

They also advocated for enhanced cooperation in environmental protection, biodiversity conservation, and waste management.—RT/Agency

## PM Shehbaz To Wine And Dine Coalition Partners On Constitution Amendment Plans

Earlier on Tuesday, the Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) and Pakistan People's Party (PPP) successfully reached an agreement on constitutional amendments following their meeting in Karachi.

This was disclosed by JUI-F Maulana Fazlur Rehman and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman

Maulana Fazlur Rehman said that his party and PPP Maulana Fazlur Rehman agreed on the draft of constitutional amendments, hailing Bilawal Bhutto Zardari for the consensus.

The JUI-F chief however rejected the government's initial proposed constitutional amendments, terming them unacceptable. He stressed the need for non-controversial constitutional amendments, saying that the nation, constitution, and parliament require a united voice.

Speaking on the occasion, Bilawal Bhutto Zardari said that JUI-F Chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman will be meeting with Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz President Nawaz Sharif on Wednesday.

He said that the PML-N will also be invited to support the draft finalised by the JUI-F and PPP.

"We will try to include PML-N in this consensus," Bhutto Zardari said, emphasizing that the agreement between PPP and JUI-F will serve as the foundation for future negotiations.

Bilawal Bhutto Zardari said that the goal is to resolve public issues, rather than focusing on individual interests or timing.—RT/Agency

## Pakistan Defiant: 'Kashmir Is Not India's, Never Was, Never Will Be'

UNITED NATIONS: Pakistan has rejected India's claim that Jammu and Kashmir was its "integral part" of India, and sought a UN-led plebiscite to determine the will of the Kashmiri people, as demanded by UN Security Council resolutions.

"Jammu and Kashmir is not, never has been, and will never be an 'integral' part of India," Pakistani delegate Ansar Shah told the General Assembly's Special Political and Decolonization (Fourth) Committee. "This disputed status of Kashmir is acknowledged by the UN and the international community," Shah, a first secretary at the Pakistani Mission to the UN, said in a response to an accusation by an Indian delegate that Pakistan was misinterpreting the principle of self-determination which, he said, does not justify undermining a member state's territorial integrity. The Indian delegate, Eldos Mathew Punnoose, a counsellor at India's Mission to the UN, was reacting to a sharp statement by Pakistan UN Ambassador Munir Akram who described the Indian occupation of Jammu



and Kashmir as the "worst manifestation of modern-day colonialism." Akram called on the UN to push for a peaceful settlement of the Kashmir dispute in accordance with the UNSC resolutions and Kashmiri people's wishes. "India is under a legally binding obligation under Article 25 of the UN Charter to implement the resolutions of the Security Council and enable the people of Jammu and Kashmir to exercise their right to self-determination," the Pakistani delegate said. He pointed out that Kashmir was being held by brute force, with all pro-freedom Hurriyat Leaders remaining incarcerated and many having died in custody under suspicious circumstances.

Far from seeking a peaceful solution to the dispute, Ansar Shah pointed out that India has resorted to belligerence against Pakistan — threatening to "take over" liberated Azad Jammu and Kashmir, reminding New Delhi that Islamabad will respond decisively to any Indian aggression. The Pakistan delegate went on to call India the "mother" of terrorism in South Asia, having resorted to terrorism against all its neighbours as a tool of its hegemonic policies. "India's campaign of targeted terrorist assassinations in third countries is now common knowledge," he said, adding, its agents have been responsible for at least 22 targeted assassinations in Pakistan.—RT/Agency
