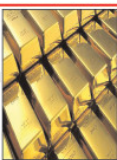

PM Shehbaz Holds Emergency Cabinet Meeting To Push Through Explosive Constitutional Amendment

ISLAMABAD: After day-long rigorous efforts to bring the treasury and the opposition parties on the same page, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led federal cabinet gave approval to the contentious 26th constitutional amendment draft on late Saturday night.



The approved draft is likely to be tabled in Senate session expected to begin shortly after it was adjourned till 12.30am today (Sunday). The Senate session, chaired by deputy chairman Syedal Khan Nasar, kicked off on late Saturday night but it was adjourned for half an hour till 12.30 am. The National Assembly session rescheduled for 9pm today also began shortly after the Senate session only to be adjourned till 11.30am today (Sunday). In a late night development, the federal cabinet met tonight with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in the chair to discuss the much-typed constitutional amendment. The meeting was initially scheduled to begin early morning. Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi, Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar, IPP's Awn Chaudhry and leaders of the allied parties were among the attendees of the key cabinet meeting, said the sources. After numerous political twists and turns, the government and opposition members "have reportedly agreed on a joint draft of the 26th Constitutional Amendment. The draft envisages reforming constitutional bench, parliamentary role in appointment of chief justice of the Supreme Court from list of three judges, restructuring of Judicial Council as well as Supreme Judicial Council, and fixing a three-year tenure of chief justice. If the cabinet approves the draft of the proposed amendments, it will be presented in Senate for approval. The federal cabinet meeting would be held in the PM's chamber in parliament, said sources.—RT/Agency

Imran Secretly Orders PTI To Keep Cozying Up To Fazl Over Controversial Judicial Package

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan on Saturday said that jailed former prime minister Imran Khan instructed the party leaders to continue consultations with Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam Fazl (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman on the proposed constitutional amendments. Speaking during a press conference flanked by other PTI leaders, Barrister Gohar said, "We held discussion over the amendments with the PTI founder and he has asked us to continue deliberations as it is very sensitive matter."



The PTI chief made these comments after holding an "inconclusive" meeting with party founder—who is currently incarcerated in Adiala jail—on the constitutional amendments. Gohar said that Khan also named four party members to accompany for consultations with the JUI-F chief as "we want that I should form my opinion on a broader consensus and give further direction". Leader of the Opposition in National Assembly Omar Ayub, Leader of the Opposition in Senate Shibli Faraz, Leader of the Opposition in Punjab Assembly Ahmed Bhachar and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur will join the PTI chairman for talks with JUI-F, the party chief said. The development comes a day after the special parliamentary committee—comprising government and opposition members "unanimously approved" the draft for 26th constitutional amendment. Muttabaha Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) leader Farooq Sattar claimed that PTI had principally agreed on the draft but the party had reservations on some points. However, Gohar had said that consultation on the fourth draft shared by the government was underway, adding that they would make final decision on the constitutional package after meeting Khan. "We have not agreed to anything at this point." Giving clarification after Gohar's presser, Adiala jail administration said the PTI founder is provided with all B Class facilities in the prison as per the law. "The PTI founder's diet, health, study including exercise are given special attention," said the jail admin, adding that there is uninterrupted power supply at Adiala jail. The administration mentioned that an inmate cook has been provided to the PTI founder to prepare his food. The admin added that the PTI founder is given curry, desi chicken, souhurat, chapati, mutton, soft drink salad, and green tea in lunch. It said that he is given porridge, coconut water and grapes in the evening. "Jail doctors examine PTI founder thrice a day. He does not have any disease and is completely healthy," it added.—RT/Agency

5 Dangerous Terrorists Captured In High-Stakes Intelligence Operation In Pishin: ISPR

RAWALPINDI: Security forces apprehended five terrorists—or "Khawarij"—in an intelligence-based operation (IBO) conducted in Balochistan's Pishin, said the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) on Saturday. During the operation, a large number of weapons, ammunition, and explosives, including three suicide vests, were seized from the militants involved in multiple terrorist attacks who were planning to target security forces as well as innocent civilians, added the military's media wing. The development comes amid security forces' ongoing efforts to curb the scourge of terrorism which has witnessed a notable spike in recent times. As per the third quarterly report (Q3) issued by the Centre for Research and Security Studies (CRSS), the total fatalities from three quarters of this year have surpassed the total fatalities recorded for the entire of 2023 with 1,534 deaths compared to last year's 1,523. A total of 722 people were killed, including civilians, security personnel, and outlaws, while 615 others



were wounded in as many as 328 incidents recorded during the third quarter. Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa have been on the forefront of the country's war against terror and have faced the brunt of terror attacks. Separately, the ISPR also said that the security forces carried out an IBO in Balochistan's Zhob district on Thursday wherein two khawarij were eliminated and weapons and ammunition were recovered during the sanitisation operation. Security forces of Pakistan remain steadfast in their commitment to eradicate terrorism from the country and protect innocent civilians from this menace, added the ISPR.—RT/Agency

Imran and Gandapur Cleared In Explosive 'Azadi March' Vandalism Case



ISLAMABAD: In yet another relief, a district and sessions court in Islamabad on Saturday acquitted incarcerated Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa firebrand Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur in a case pertinent to violence and vandalism during the former ruling party's May 25 "Azadi March". Following the PTI government's ouster through a vote of no-confidence in 2022, the former prime minister had given call for march towards the federal capital, demanding a fresh elections and the dissolution of assemblies. The law and order situation in the federal capital turned chaotic after Khan and his convoy entered the city and started marching towards the D-Chowk despite the Supreme Court's order to hold a jalsa at a ground between H9 and G9 areas of Islamabad. PTI protesters continued to engage in violent clashes with the police and other law enforcement agencies and continued moving towards the D-Chowk defying the court's prohibition. During the riots, the protesters also damaged public and private properties in the capital. Subsequently, an FIR was also registered against the PTI leadership at the Secretariat police station for inciting the protesters to damage public properties, interference in government affairs and other charges. After hearing arguments from both sides, the Islamabad bench reserved its verdict earlier today, Civil Judge Shahzad Khan announced the reserved verdict in the vandalism case.—RT/Agency

PPP and JUI-F Achieve '100% Consensus' On Game-Changing Constitutional Tweaks: Bilawal

ISLAMABAD: After holding back-to-back meetings with Maulana Fazlur Rehman, Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari on Saturday said that his party and the Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam Fazl (JUI-F) chief have reached a 100% consensus on the proposed constitutional amendment. The statement comes as the PPP chief is making last ditch effort to evolve a consensus on the judicial package among all political parties including the PTI. Addressing a public gathering in Hyderabad last night, the PPP chairman warned that he would be compelled to take a "controversial path" for the passage of the 26th constitutional amendment if the opposition parties refused to support his efforts to pass the judicial package with consensus. Moreover, the special parliamentary committee—comprising government and opposition members—had "unanimously approved" the draft for the 26th constitutional amendment, said PPP lawmaker Syed Khurshid Shah on Friday. Talking to journalist following his fresh meeting with JUI-F chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman, Bilawal said that he was in consistent contact with the latter on the matter related to constitutional amendment. "We have reached consensus over legislation on judicial reforms."



The PPP chairman said that he wished Maulana Fazl to table the 26th constitution amendment bill in parliament as "the draft is the same as Maulana Fazlur Rehman wanted". Responding to a question, the PPP leader expressed hope that the JUI-F could convince PTI to vote for the constitution amendment bill. "PTI can vote for the Maulana Fazlur Rehman's draft." Referring to PTI's past "political behaviour", Bilawal said: "PTI should prove that it is a political party." "Politics is the name of seeking consensus and reconciliation," the PPP chairman advised the PTI. He was of the view that PTI should have introduced judicial reforms during its tenure instead of him and added that the government should not table the constitutional amendment bill in parliament. To another query, the PPP chairman said: "Both the parties [PPP and JUI-F] have agreed on constitutional reforms. The joint draft was authored by the JUI-F chief." At the same time, Bilawal lauded the PM-N-led federal government for showing patience over the matter.—RT/Agency

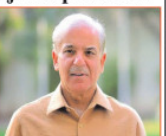
CJP Isa Demands Answers From SC Staff Over Confusing Clarification In Reserved Seats Case

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa has sought an explanation from Supreme Court staff following the release of a second clarification by eight judges in the reserved seats case without submitting the original case file. The CJP has directed Deputy Registrar Mujahid Mahmood, Assistant Registrar Shahid Habib, and Webmaster Asim Javed to explain how the clarification was published on the court's website without following standard procedure. "How was the clarification issued without submitting the original file?" Justice Isa questioned in a notice sent to the concerned staff members on Saturday. According to sources within the Supreme Court, the Deputy Registrar and Assistant Registrar have been officially notified and asked to provide details regarding the procedural lapse. The court has also requested a response from Webmaster Asim Javed regarding the incident. Yesterday, eight Supreme Court judges issued a second clarification concerning their decision on reserved seats, stating that the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) must implement the court's ruling, despite amendments to the Elections Act, 2017. The court had ruled in July that the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) was entitled to the seats reserved for women and minorities, a decision that was challenged after the government amended the election law. However, the bench reaffirmed that these changes cannot override the original ruling.—RT/Agency



PM Hails Security Forces For Crushing Victory Against Terrorists In Major Operation

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Saturday commended the officers and soldiers of security forces for successful operation against Fina al-Khawarij terrorists in districts Pishin and Zhob. In a statement, the prime minister congratulated the security forces for their commendable efforts, which resulted in the arrest of five Khawarij, and killing of two others. The operation also led to the seizure of a large amount of weapons and explosive materials. "The entire nation including myself, pays tribute to the brave Pak army soldiers and officers for purging the country from Fina al-Khawarij." He said the entire nation stood united with the Pakistan Armed Forces in their mission to thwart the ambitions of Pakistan's enemies, who aim to spread unrest and instability in the country.—RT/Agency



Hafiz Naeem Urges Deep-Dive Consultations On Controversial Constitutional Amendment

LAHORE: Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) Emir Hafiz Naeemur Rehman said on Saturday that the government should hold threadbare consultations on the matter of much-touted constitutional amendment. Holding a press conference in Lahore, the JI emir said that sale and purchase of votes had become a common practice in the parliament. "This practice resumes whenever a new amendment is forced to be passed by those who actually orchestrate these moves. The politicians are made figureheads. The Supreme Court must summon those who are behind this amendment," he mentioned. Taking potshots at political parties, he said people didn't have any trust in whatever political parties said, adding that mere 3 to 4 judges won't be able to address issues when a whole parliament was unable to redress the grievances of people. He said people didn't have access to justice in Pakistan as the judiciary lacked trust by the masses. The JI emir also condemned the martyrdom of Hamas leader Yahya Sinwar.—RT/Agency

Syed Zain Shah, Dr Safdar Abbasi condemn proposed construction of new canals on Sindh's waterways

THATTA: SUP President Syed Zain Shah has expressed concern over the federal government's decision to build six new canals from the Indus River, aimed at irrigating 4.8 million acres of land in Cholistan, Punjab. Speaking at a press conference at the Thatta Press Club, Shah criticized the move, stating that while efforts are being made to cultivate barren lands in Punjab, existing populated areas in Sindh are being neglected and risk becoming barren. He urged policymakers to reconsider their decisions, which he said are unacceptable to the people of Sindh. GDA General Secretary Dr. Safdar Abbasi added that the failure to release water downstream of the Kotri Barrage has already caused 4 million acres of land in Sindh's coastal belt to become submerged. He warned that the construction



of new canals could further harm the Kotri, Sukkur, and Guddu barrages, leading to widespread devastation in Sindh. Other leaders present at the event, including representatives from the National People's Party, Jamaat-e-Islami, Functional League, and Awami Jamhoori Party, echoed these concerns. Following the press conference, the Sindh Bachao Tehreek's awareness march continued its journey towards Sujawal and Badin.

SEPCO launches grand operation against electricity theft despite weekend holidays

LARKANA: SEPCO has decided to continue its grand operation against electricity thefts and defaulters over the weekend. Pakistan Reaffirms Unwavering Commitment To Deliver Urgent Relief For Gaza and Lebanon

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has renewed its commitment to ensuring timely and effective delivery of relief goods to the people of Gaza and Lebanon.

The resolve was expressed at a high-level meeting held at the headquarters of the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in Islamabad.

The meeting was jointly chaired by Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal and Chairman NDMA Lieutenant General Inam Haider Malik.

The meeting reviewed Pakistan's ongoing relief measures for the war-affected people in Gaza and Lebanon, and discussed plans to deal with any problems in this regard.

To date, Pakistan has dispatched a total of 12 consignments containing 1,251 tons of relief goods, with 10 sent to Gaza and 2 to Lebanon.



The supplies included essential items such as tents, tarpaulins, food packs, winter bedding, medicines, and hygiene kits.

Three Members Of Notorious Theft Gang Captured, Stolen Valuables Recovered

ISLAMABAD: Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) Police, Shahzad Town police station team arrested three wanted members of the thief gang involved in numerous theft activities and recovered cash and mobile phone from their possession.

A police spokesperson told APP, under the directives of Inspector General Police (IGP) Syed Ali Nasir Rizvi, the ICT Police has intensified crackdown against the criminal elements to eliminate crime from the city.

In this regard, the ICT Police Ramna, Tarnol, Sihala, Humak and Bhara Kahu police station teams took legal action against the accused involved in drug peddling and possessing illegal weapons and arrested six accused.

He said Police teams also recovered 1245-gram heroin, 530-gram hashish, 10 liquor bottles and two pistols along with ammunition from their possession. Moreover, four absconders were also arrested from various areas of the city during the last 24 hours.

Authorities Recover Jaw-Dropping Rs122 Billion In Nationwide Electricity Theft Crackdown

ISLAMABAD: More than 86,000 individuals have been arrested across Pakistan in an ongoing nationwide crackdown on electricity theft, Express News reported.

The campaign has also recovered Rs122.35 billion since it launched in September 2023.

Operations were carried out in several cities, including Lahore, Gujranwala, Faisalabad, Islamabad, Multan, Peshawar, Hyderabad, Sukkur, and Quetta, resulting in the recovery of over Rs1.35 billion from offenders in October alone.

Authorities have vowed to continue these efforts until electricity theft is completely eliminated, with 224 individuals apprehended during this month's operations. Previously, Ministry of Energy sources told The Express Tribune that the gross



addition to the circular debt had been estimated at Rs417 billion for fiscal year 2024-25 in spite of raising power tariffs from July.

The circular debt stood at Rs2.383 trillion by June this year, already higher than the commitment given to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and more than the threshold approved by the federal cabinet last year under the Circular Debt Man-

agement Plan 2023-24. After adding an estimated Rs417 billion, the debt will jump to Rs2.8 trillion by taking into account the power sector losses and inefficiencies. Sources said that under an understanding reached with the IMF, the government would provide Rs381 billion in subsidies from the budget. This will restrict the debt to Rs2.42 trillion by June next year.—RT/Agency

Naive and delusional!

Former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's recent remarks about the possibility of improved ties with India reflect a simplistic and overly optimistic approach that overlooks core issues. While normalization of relations is undoubtedly desirable, it cannot be achieved by ignoring the fundamental disagreements that continue to divide the two nations. Mr. Sharif's assertion that the Indo-Pak "ice is melting" based solely on India's participation in a multilateral summit seems more like wishful thinking than a realistic assessment.

During his meeting with Indian journalists, Mr. Sharif highlighted areas where both

countries could benefit from cooperation, such as trade, cricket, and climate change. However, he failed to address the more con-



tentious topics, such as the unresolved status of Jammu and Kashmir, cross-border tensions, and India's recent policy shifts that have strained relations even further. By glossing over these "elephants in the room," Mr. Sharif's statements risk appearing out of touch with the real complexities of Indo-Pak relations.

Peace cannot be achieved without acknowledging and addressing these critical issues. True normalization requires a dialogue that is rooted in dignity, equality, and a willingness from both sides to engage on the matters that have long been a source of conflict. Mr. Sharif's diplomatic optimism, while commendable, needs to be backed by a more strategic and realistic approach that respects Pakistan's stance and addresses the actions of the Indian government, which have, in recent years, only escalated hostilities. Without confronting these challenges head-on, hopes for lasting peace will remain just that—hopes.

Crumbling GGHS Arazi Puts Students and Staff in Grave Danger

SEHWAN SHARIF: The Government Girls High School in Arazi, Sehwan Taluka, is in a deteriorating and hazardous condition, posing a significant threat to the lives of students and teachers. Following the floods from the 2022 rains and Manchar Lake, the school walls have developed cracks, and the floors are completely damaged. The washrooms are unusable, and due to the risk of roof collapses, three classrooms and the science hall have been closed. The ongoing risk of roof damage has created an environment of fear among students and staff, negatively impacting girls' education, with many parents hesitant to send their daughters to school. Over 300 girls are enrolled, but the building has been



in disrepair for two years without any action taken for repairs. Affected students, including Tanzil Memon, are urging the education department and higher authorities to take immediate steps for the school's restoration to safeguard the lives and education of hundreds of students.

Grow Green Network calls on ADB to stop fossil fuel financing

SANGHAR: The Grow Green Network urged the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to cease funding fossil fuel projects in Pakistan during a public forum organized by the Sustainable Development Foundation and Indus Consortium. Participants criticized the environmental impact of the Jamshoro Power Company Limited (JPCL) and called for its early retirement, advocating for renewable energy investments. Key speakers emphasized the need for reforms in Pakistan's energy sector, highlighting issues like reliance on imported fuels and a significant energy shortfall. The forum also called for government investment in flood-resilient infrastructure and rejected further expansion of LNG and fossil fuels. It concluded with a demand for multilateral development banks to address funding gaps and support Pakistan's transition to renewable energy.



Children's Parliament Launched in Sindh to Champion Educational Rights

Elected children will choose their leaders and advocate for educational issues, gender equality, and religious har-



mony. Currently, the enrollment rate for girls in Sindh is only 39%, with significant barriers like limited access to schools and a shortage of qualified teachers. The Children's Parliament will educate around 200 youths on their rights, reserving 35% of seats for girls to ensure their voices are heard. This initiative seeks to foster dialogue among diverse groups and develop children's problem-solving and leadership skills. The selection process for representatives will begin soon, including children from various backgrounds.

Ten Hag Blasts 'Baseless Rumors,' Calls Them 'Fairy Tales'

LONDON: Erik ten Hag defiantly slammed "fairy tales and lies" about his Manchester United future as the under-fire boss insisted he is not in danger of the sack. Ten Hag is widely believed to be in a fight to save his job after presiding over United's worst start to a top-flight season since 1989-90. United are languishing in 14th place in the Premier League ahead of Saturday's visit from Brentford, whose manager Thomas Frank has been linked with replacing the Dutchman at Old Trafford.



Without a victory in their last five games in all competitions, Ten Hag's side have won just twice in seven league matches this term. Another flop against Brentford will pile further pressure on Ten Hag ahead of a tricky week featuring away games at Jose Mourinho's Fenerbahce in the Europa League and West Ham in the Premier League.

But the 54-year-old eventually signed a new contract in a move seen as a show of faith during the close season. Ten Hag won the League Cup in his first season to end United's six-year trophy drought, then lifted the FA Cup last term in a shock final triumph against Manchester City that is credited with saving his job. However, the embattled Ten Hag is once again engaged in a struggle to stave off the axe. United's inconsistent form during his reign shows no signs of improving and he acknowledged the climb back to respectability would not be easy. "We have to climb a mountain. That is top football and sometimes you have to face challenges. I am sure we will make a success, as we did the last two seasons," he said. "Underneath I see good things and good starts that confirm we are in a good direction. But of course the ranking is not lying. We are where we are and that is not good enough." —Agency

Sources within the PCB revealed that the board's domestic department is awaiting approval from chairman Mohsin Naqvi on several key matters, including the new dates for the tournament. The board is expected to announce the revised schedule soon. This is not the first disruption to PCB's domestic calendar. Earlier, the Under-19 domestic tournament was also suspended after just one day of play.

Sources say the domestic department has also instructed departmental teams to prepare for the Presidents Trophy, a backup tournament, should the Quaid-e-Azam Trophy experience further delays. "As a contingency, departments have been asked to be prepared," said a source.—Agency

Historical Migration Of Prophet's Descendants To Sindh Highlighted At TMK Event

TANDO MUHAMMAD KHAN: Following the tragedy of Karbala, the descendants of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) faced immense hardship in Arabia, prompting their migration to various regions, including Sindh. Historians document that the first caravan, led by Lady Ruqayyah bint Ali (A.S.), daughter of Hazrat Ali (A.S.), arrived in Sindh around 65-66 AH. Known locally as "Bibi Pak Daman," she settled in Sindh soon after Karbala. 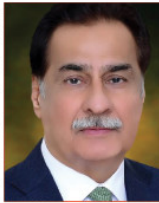

GDA protests against IRSA Act amendments

Breast Cancer Mortality Rate Soars To Alarming 48%, Sharmila Farooqui Demands Urgent Action

KARACHI: Pakistan Peoples Party MNA Dr. Sharmila Farooqui has raised alarm over the rising death rate among breast cancer patients in Pakistan, which has reached 48%. Speaking on the eve of the International Day Against Breast Cancer, she called for immediate nationwide efforts to combat this deadly disease through awareness and early detection.

Dr. Sharmila emphasized the importance of a door-to-door awareness campaign to destigmatize discussions



around breast cancer, noting that timely diagnosis is crucial. Globally, the early diagnosis rate is 98%, but in Pakistan, most cases are detected at late stages, where the risk of death is significantly higher.

Women aged 40 to 70 are particularly vulnerable, she said.

Dr. Sharmila urged health authorities to enhance access to screening and early detection services while prioritizing better treatment and patient care. She noted that technological advancements in imaging are opening new possibilities for improving breast cancer screening. She also called on the federal government to increase the health budget from the current 1% of GDP to at least 4%, with provinces following suit. With nearly 100,000 new breast cancer cases reported each year in Pakistan, Dr. Sharmila stressed the need for hospitals to hold free screening camps to improve early detection. She also encouraged women to practice regular self-examination to help reduce the mortality rate. "Awareness is key," she said, "and every woman should make self-checking a habit to ensure early diagnosis and timely treatment."—RT/Agency

SHC Delivers Temporary Blow To FBR's Affidavit Rule For Sales Tax Returns

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) has temporarily suspended the Federal Board of Revenue's (FBR) mandate requiring taxpayers to submit an affidavit alongside their sales tax returns, following a petition filed by the business community. The petitioners, including Asad Ashfaq Tola, argued that the requirement contradicts the Sales Tax Act of 1990, as it forces businesses to verify the actions of their suppliers.



In response, the court has asked the FBR and other involved parties to submit their replies by November 1, while also summoning relevant commissioners to the next hearing. In the interim, the SHC directed the FBR to allow the filing of September 2024 sales tax returns without the affidavit. Business leaders, including President of the Karachi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI) Muhammad Jawed Bilwani, have urged the FBR to defer the affidavit requirement, stating that taxpayers are being unfairly held responsible for potential errors by vendors. They argued that while businesses can verify suppliers' status on the FBR system, they have no access to the full supply chain and may face penalties for vendors' mistakes.

In a separate statement, Khuram Mukhtar, Patron-in-Chief of the Pakistan Textile Exporters Association (PTEA), called for the deferral of the affidavit requirement for Chief Financial Officers (CFOs), emphasizing that buyers should not be held accountable for the entire supply chain. Both leaders stressed the need for a business-friendly environment that supports compliance without placing undue burdens on taxpayers.—RT/Agency

Shocking Arrest: Man And Two Sons Nabbed In Brutal Murder Of Four Women In Lyari



KARACHI: Police have arrested a man and his two sons following the discovery of four women's bodies with their throats slit in a residential flat in Lyari's Lea Market area on Saturday. The victims, identified as a mother, her daughter, granddaughter, and daughter-in-law, were found in separate rooms of the seventh-floor apartment, all showing signs of severe torture.

Former First Lady Rallies For Nationwide Grassroots Movement To Battle Breast Cancer Crisis

KARACHI: Former First Lady Begum Samina Alvi has called for a nationwide grassroots campaign to raise breast cancer awareness, emphasizing self-examination for early detection. Speaking at a seminar on "Breast Cancer Prevention and Wellness," organized by the National Forum for Environment and Health (NFEH) on the International Day against Breast Cancer, Begum Alvi highlighted Pakistan's high breast cancer incidence rate—the highest in Asia.



She stressed that mammograms, while crucial for early detection, are often too expensive for women in low- and middle-income households, and public healthcare facilities offering mammography are limited. Self-examination, she argued, should be promoted as a key preventive measure and awareness efforts should continue year-round, not just in October, which is globally recognized as

Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Begum Alvi also urged society to remove the stigma surrounding breast cancer, recognizing it as a medical issue that requires early detection to protect women's health. She emphasized the importance of psychological support for cancer patients and urged men to be informed about the disease to help in early diagnosis for women in their families. With up to 100,000 new cases of breast cancer detected annually in Pakistan, Begum Alvi called for collective action and reaffirmed her commitment to improving healthcare and rehabilitation services for cancer patients and those with mental health challenges. Dr. Bushra Maham of Shaikat Khanum Cancer Hospital highlighted that 22% of patients treated there suffer from breast cancer. She urged women over 40 to undergo annual mammograms. Other experts stressed the importance of a healthy lifestyle and genetic testing for those with a family history of cancer.—RT

KU Students Declare Victory, End Protest After Successful Talks With Vice Chancellor

KARACHI: Students of Karachi University (KU) have called off their eight-day protest against fee hikes and inadequate campus facilities following successful negotiations with Vice Chancellor Dr. Khalid Mahmood Ibrahimi. The protests, organized by the Student Organisations' Alliance, focused on issues such as a 50% late fee surcharge, poor transportation services, and deteriorating campus infrastructure.



The protest was concluded on Friday after the VC approved several of the students' key demands. Among these were the reversal of the 50% late fee to 10%, adjustments to the re-admission fee, and improvements in campus security and bus services. Additionally, the examination fee structure will now be based on a per-course system, and the semester fee will see only a 10% increase. While the Student Alliance claims that 11 out of 14 demands were accepted, the university administration stated that only two major points were agreed upon. These include the reduced late fee and changes to

Karachi's Electronic Complaint Cell Triumphantly Tackles 1,850 Grievances In Its Inaugural Year

KARACHI: The annual report of the Electronic Complaint Cell (ECC), established by DIG East Gulshan Azfar Maheer, shows it received 1,850 complaints since its launch in October 2023, with over 1,500 addressed promptly. Ongoing issues include property disputes and land encroachments pending court resolution. DIG Maheer reported that investigations are underway for over 90 complaints, including tracing stolen vehicles. The ECC has taken significant actions, such as suspending four officers over bribery claims and addressing harassment complaints from women in various districts, leading to arrests. For the first time, an online FIR for vehicle theft was registered by a citizen in the US. The ECC also processes complaints from Pakistanis abroad and assists those unable to visit police stations. Women's desks have been established at police stations, and the public is advised to avoid unrelated complaints to the ECC.

ISLAMABAD: Omar Ayub Khan, the Leader of the Opposition in the National Assembly, has claimed that seven members of his party have been abducted.



Speaking to the media upon his arrival at the Parliament House on Saturday, Ayub stated, "I was in communication with Barrister Gohar on the phone when the connection was lost, and we have not been able to reconnect since. We are currently consulting with our colleagues on this matter."

When asked about casting a vote in favour of the constitutional amendment, Ayub responded, "I have just come straight from the village to parliament. I met Sher Afzal Marwat here and didn't recognise him at first because his health has significantly deteriorated."

He added, "We are in consultations with our colleagues. The decision is to engage with JUL-F. We are trying to trace our parliamentary party members to continue discussions with JUL-

As Ayub expressed concern over the government's actions, stating, "We are observing what the government will do here because seven of our members have been abducted, and cases have been filed against all of us."

Meanwhile, Sher Afzal Marwat, while speaking to the media, remarked, "This is a constitutional amendment of such historical significance that no one is aware of it, while half of the National Assembly members are

fake."

"The Supreme Court has paved the way for something that should not happen in any civilised society," he added.

Marwat noted that due to party directives, only a limited number of members will attend the meetings. "If they proceed with this constitutional amendment, they will push the country towards complete lawlessness. We must come out with all our strength to dismantle this system."—RT/Agency

Petroleum Minister Rallies For Collective Action To Combat Tobacco Epidemic

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Petroleum Musadik Masood Malik has underscored the need for collective action against tobacco use.



He expressed these words in his address at a seminar titled 'Sustainable Tobacco Control Policies: A Way to Healthier Pakistan' organized by the Society for the Protection of the Rights of the Child (SPARC) at a local hotel the other day.

The event aimed at bringing together government officials, public health advocates, civil society members, anti-tobacco activists, and youth leaders to address the growing tobacco epidemic in Pakistan and advocate for comprehensive policy reforms.

Musadik Malik stated, "Smoking is causing overall harm rather than any benefit. The fight against smoking will not be easy, but it is crucial. The real fight against smoking is a fight against the mafia."

Highlighting the severe health implications, he added, "Smoking has the deepest connection with cancer, and there is hardly any disease that isn't linked to it. Every year, 150,000 to

200,000 people die from smoking. Why can't we see the faces of our people in those numbers?"

Former caretaker minister of information and broadcasting Murtaza Solangi also spoke on the occasion.

He emphasized the need to take tobacco as a national issue.

"First of all, we have to see it as an issue, this is not even seen as an issue," he remarked.

He called for a unified approach, stating, "We have to create an ecosystem where media and everything around us reflects an anti-tobacco stance."

Dr. Khalid Ahmad, Program Manager at SPARC, while addressing a seminar,

emphasized the deadly toll of tobacco use in Pakistan, explaining, "Tobacco use is costing 166,000 lives each year, which equates to almost 450 deaths per day."

He urged the government to take critical steps to curb tobacco consumption, particularly among the youth.

Dr. Mati ur Rehman from the Health Services Academy, Muhammad Sabir, an economist from the Social Policy and Development Centre (SPDC), Khalida Ahmad, a board member of SPARC, Senator Sana Jammali, Nisar Ahmad Cheema, a parliamentarian, and prominent anti-tobacco activists, among others, were also in attendance and spoke on the occasion.—RT/Agency

'Our Senators Were Abducted,' Akhtar Mengal Declares, Rejecting Support For Constitutional Amendments



ISLAMABAD: Akhtar Mengal, leader of the Balochistan National Party (BNP), has alleged that two of his party's senators have been abducted along with their families, adding that he will not support constitutional amendments currently being discussed in Pakistan.

Speaking to the media outside Maulana Fazlur Rehman's residence in Islamabad, Mengal expressed outrage over the government's handling of the situation, questioning why the constitutional changes were being rushed without public transparency. Mengal further claimed that the family of a female senator had been held hostage to force her attendance at a luncheon with the Prime Minister.

"Is this what respect for the vote looks like?" he asked, adding that it is unacceptable for members of parliament and their families to be subjected to threats and intimidation.

The BNP leader vowed not to participate in any talks on the amendments until his missing senators are safely returned.

He criticised the secrecy surrounding the proposed changes, calling it an attack on democracy and questioning the role of external forces in the matter. Mengal has stated that his party will consult with the opposition alliance regarding the amendments, maintaining that no constitutional change should be forced under duress.—RT/Agency

Govt Aims For Sweeping Constitutional Amendment With Broad-Based Consensus

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Defence Khawaja Asif said on Saturday that the government desired to pass the 26th Constitutional Amendment with broad-based consensus.



Speaking to the media outside the Parliament, he said, "We have the required numbers for the passage of the 26th Constitutional Amendment, but we seek to develop a broader consensus in the National Assembly and the Senate."

The minister said that the primary objective of the amendment is to establish the supremacy of Parliament, which guarantees the Constitution of the country. "We want to put an end to the encroachment on Parliament and ensure that the supremacy of this forum, as promised by the Constitution of Pakistan, is upheld," he added.

Khawaja Asif further said that all political parties unanimously agreed that the su-

premacyp of Parliament must not be compromised.

He said that elected representatives have the authority to legislate for the welfare of the public, and the minority should not impose its decisions on the majority.

Addressing the issue of misinformation, the minister criticized the creation of a false narrative suggesting that members of the Senate and National Assembly had been kidnapped. "They should reveal the names of those allegedly kidnapped, imprisoned, or held hostage," he said.

He cited a fabricated incident in Lahore as an example of how such falsehoods are being circulated. Without naming any specific party, the minister remarked that a particular political party consistently developed fake narratives to advance its agenda. In response to a question, Khawaja Asif dismissed claims that some parties were blackmailing the government and said that constitutional amendments always require time to reach an agreement.—RT/Agency

Despite Majority, Efforts Underway To Forge Broader Consensus On Constitutional Package

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Information, Broadcasting, National Heritage and Culture Attaullah Tarar said on Saturday that despite having numbers, the coalition government was making all-out efforts for the creation of a broader consensus on the proposed constitutional package.



Talking to the media outside Parliament House along with the senior leader of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz Hanef Abbasi, he said the process of consultations for the constitutional package was ongoing and Pakistan People's Party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto held meetings with Jamiat Ulama-e-Pakistan Amir Fazlur Rahman and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

"We are democratic people, we try to create a consensus among all political stakeholders," he said adding that in democratic societies, efforts were made for consensus building through consultations.

He said that by changing the rules within Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), the powers of posting and transfer of police officers have been taken over by the Chief Minister from the IG. The minister said that the PTI aimed to obtain political objectives from the police.

He alleged that the KP Government wanted to con-

trol the people of the province politically.

Tarar said that the people from Punjab were also kept in KP and blame was shifted on the institutions for what they called their disappearance. The KP chief minister invaded the capital and used government resources against the Federation, he said.

The minister said the PTI has the habit of blaming others but they did not look into their behaviour.

Attaullah Tarar said that the PTI leadership threatened that the homes and businesses of those members would be set ablaze who would cheat the founder chairman of the PTI. He said the PTI had no problem with those working against the interest of the country, but they want to punish those who ditch Imran Khan.

Foremost was the interest of the country, political leaders and political parties come

second, he opined. He said if any legislator was attacked, the state would take action and culprits would be given exemplary punishment.

The minister remarked that the PTI was crying hoarse for political face-saving, otherwise, they knew the ruling alliance had secured the numbers needed for the amendment.

Replying to media person questions, he said there are other options within the constitution and law but the PML-N leadership and party thought that a consensus should be created on the amendments.

The information minister said the government had an open mind in moving ahead with constitutional amendments. He maintained that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf leaders were nervous about meeting their leader.—RT/Agency

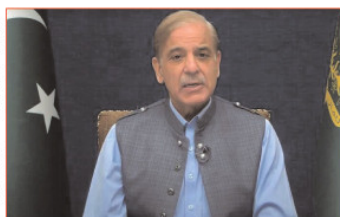
