Tragic Kohistan Bus Crash: 2 Dead, 36 Injured, Rescue Operations Ongoing

KOHISTAN: Two people were killed and 36 others were injured when a Rawalpindi-bound passenger bus fell into a ravine in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Upper Kohistan area on Sunday evening, according to a rescue official.

Rescue 1122 spokesperson Abdur Rehman told media that a private company's passenger bus carrying 38 passengers bound for Rawalpindi from Skardu fell into a ravine near the Shetial area in Upper Kohistan's Harban tehsil.

"The bus driver and a passenger died in the accident and 36 others were injured and had been shifted to district headquarters hospital Chilas in Diamer," he said.

The spokesperson identified the deceased passenger as Mohammad Nadeem, a resident of Vehari in Punjab and bus driver Sadaqat Hussain, a resident of Gilgit's

Rehman told media that most of the injured hailed from Skardu, four from the Bisham Dandai area of Shangla, and two from parts of Punjab province.

Some patients in critical condition are undergoing surgeries while the rest are stable. Women and children were among the injured passengers, the spokesperson added.

Accidents are frequent in KP and northern areas due to rugged terrain, poor

roads, overloaded vehicles, and minimal traffic regulation. Narrow, winding routes, harsh weather, and driver fatigue further increase the risk, making these areas particularly accident-prone. In September, three people, including two army personnel, died and one was injured after a landslide struck a bus on the Karakoram Highway (KKH) in the Dasu area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Upper Kohistan district, officials said.—RT/Agency

Bilawal And Shehbaz Hail Landmark 26th Amendment Passage

ISLAMABAD: PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has described the passage of the 26th Constitutional Amendment as historic during a meeting with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

Bilawal Bhutto Zardari was accompanied by former Prime Minister Raja Pervaiz Ashraf and Punjab Governor Sardar Saleem Haider while Prime Minister's advisor Rana Sanaullah and National Assembly Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq were also reported to have attended the meeting.

During the meeting, Bilawal emphasised the need to work together for the strengthening of democracy and parliament, stating that the 26th Constitutional Amendment will be effective in curbing undemocratic forces.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif credited the approval of the 26th Amendment to all coalition parties, reaffirming their commitment to public service. He noted that



positive economic indicators are leading to a noticeable decrease in inflation.

It is important to note that just a few days ago, the government secured the passage of the 26th Constitutional Amendment in both the National Assembly and Senate, although opposition parties, including Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI), expressed reservations regarding the amendment.

Earlier this week, President Asif Ali Zardari, has officially approved the 26th

of the official gazette, cementing its place within Pakistan's legal and constitutional framework.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had earlier sent advice on Monday to President Asif Ali Zardari about ratifying the 26th Constitutional Amendment Bill into law.

The prime minister had signed the advice on the said constitutional amendment bill after its passage by both the house of the parliament

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has praised the unanimous passage of the 26th constitutional amendment, calling it a "shining example of national consensus".

Addressing the joint session of the Senate and National Assembly approved the amendment by a two-thirds majority, Shehbaz said it marks a "great day" in the country's history.

He noted that the amendment fulfils the incomplete

vision of the Charter of Democracy, which was initiated by former leaders Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif.

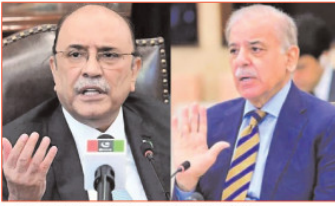
The prime minister expressed that the era of dismissing elected prime ministers is now over, and Parliament has demonstrated its strength and unity.

Shehbaz Sharif commended Bilawal Bhutto Zardari for his sincere efforts in making the amendment a reality and thanked Maulana Fazlur Rehman for his contributions to advancing Pakistan's best interests.

He added that the approval of the amendment sends a strong message that all political parties prioritised the nation's future over personal interests. The prime minister concluded by stating that these constitutional amendments will pave the way for easier access to justice and secure Pakistan's future.—RT/Agency

President Zardari And Shehbaz Reaffirm Unwavering Support For Kashmiris On Black Day

ISLAMABAD: As Kashmir marks the 'Black Day' in condemnation of India's illegal occupation of the region, President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in separate messages, expressed solidarity with the Kashmiris, pledging unwavering support until the achievement of their inalienable right to self-determination.



President Zardari said that Pakistan would stand shoulder-to-shoulder with its Kashmiri brothers and sisters until the final resolution of the Kashmir dispute and freedom of Kashmir.

The president urged the international community to pressurise India to halt its human rights abuses in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK), alleviate the suffering of Kashmiris and implement UN Security Council (UNSC) resolutions.

He also condemned India's ongoing atrocities in the illegally occupied territory and reaffirmed Pakistan's unwavering moral, diplomatic and political support for the Kashmiri people's just cause.

In his message on the occasion, PM Shehbaz Sharif, said that the people of IIOJK have suffered countless hardships during the last 77 years of occupation.

He said India had been taking successive steps to tighten its grip over IIOJK since August 5, 2019, when New Delhi abolished the special status of the disputed region.

"India's nefarious designs are aimed at undermining the disputed status of IIOJK and denying the Kashmiri people their democratic right to decide their own future," he said.

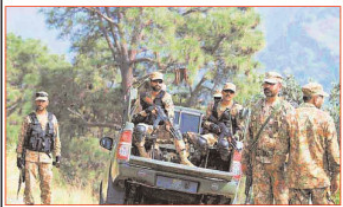
The PM promised that Pakistan will continue to extend full moral, diplomatic and political support

Security Forces Crush Terrorist Threat In KP Operations



RAWALPINDI: In two separate Intelligence-Based Operations (IBOs) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Sunday, security forces eliminated four terrorists, said the ISPR.

In this regard, a statement issued by the military media wing, an intelligence-based operation was conducted in North Waziristan district where, "after an intense exchange of fire, two khawarij including Kharij Insaf Ullah, were sent to hell."

The ISPR added that in another operation in the Khyber District, "own troops effectively engaged the khawarij location and resultantly two khawarij were

killed, while three got injured."

In the operations, weapons and ammunition were also recovered from the killed khawarij, who were "actively involved in numerous terrorist activities against the law enforcement agencies as well as the innocent civilians."

The ISPR said that sanitisation operations were in the process to "eliminate any other kharij found in the area."

"[The] security forces of Pakistan are determined to wipe out the menace of terrorism from the country," the ISPR stated.—RT/Agency

Dar: Kashmir Solution Crucial For Lasting Peace In South Asia

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar on Sunday said that Pakistan remained committed to promoting peace in South Asia and sought constructive relations with all neighbors.

He added lasting peace in the region could not be realised without a just and peaceful settlement of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, in line with the UNSC resolutions and the aspirations of Kashmiri people.

"Pakistan stands in unwavering solidarity with the Kashmiri people in their struggle and will continue to provide its full political, moral and diplomatic support to the realization of their inalienable right to self-determination," Ishaq Dar said on the observance of Kashmir Black Day.

He said October 27th marked a somber turning point in the history of Jammu and Kashmir. On this day, seventy-seven years ago, the Indian forces landed in Srinagar, marking the beginning of a prolonged and painful chapter for the region.

Over the past seven decades, India has employed various strategies to strengthen its control over Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir



(IIOJK), he added.

However, since 5 August 2019, he witnessed an accelerated effort to undermine the internationally recognised disputed status of IIOJK and to marginalize the rights and voices of the Kashmiri people.

"The actions taken by Indian authorities, including attempts to alter the demographic and political landscape of the territory, stand in direct violation of the relevant UN Security Council resolutions and the Fourth Geneva Convention.

Despite these measures, the resolve of the Kashmiri people remains undeterred," a press release quoted the deputy prime minister as saying.

Dar stated that today, the region was witnessing an intensification of repression with thousands of political leaders and activists remained behind bars, with 14

political parties effectively banned.

Draconian emergency and counterterrorism laws granted Indian forces sweeping powers, enabling them to arrest or eliminate any individual and destroy property at will, he added.

The foreign minister further said that nonetheless, the spirit and determination of the Kashmiri people endured, as they continued their peaceful struggle for justice and self-determination.

"While elections for the Legislative Assembly of IIOJK have recently been conducted, any such exercise, carried out under the framework of the Indian Constitution and amidst an overwhelming military presence, cannot be considered a substitute for the legitimate right to self-determination of the Kashmiri people," he stressed.—RT/Agency

UN Security Council Set To Meet Monday Over Israel-Iran Tensions

NEW YORK: The United Nations Security Council will meet on Monday to discuss Israel's attack on Iran, council president Switzerland said on Sunday. The Swiss UN mission said the meeting had been requested by Iran with the support of Algeria, China and Russia.



"Israeli regime's actions constitute a grave threat to international peace and security and further destabilise an already fragile region," Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi said in a letter to the 15-member council on Saturday.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran, in alignment with the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and under international law, reserves its inherent right to legal and legitimate response to these criminal attacks at the appropriate time," he wrote.

Scores of Israeli jets completed three waves of strikes before dawn on Saturday against missile factories and

other sites near Tehran and in western Iran, Israel's military said.

It was retaliation for Iran's October 1 attack on Israel with about 200 ballistic missiles, and Israel warned its heavily armed arch-foe not to hit back after the latest strike.

Israel's UN Ambassador Danny Danon rejected Iran's complaint at the United Nations, saying in a statement on Sunday that Iran was "trying to act against us in the diplomatic arena with the ridiculous claim that Israel has violated international

law."

"As we have stated time and time again, we have the right and duty to defend ourselves and will use all the means at our disposal to protect the citizens of Israel," Danon said. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres appealed "to all parties to cease all military actions, including in Gaza and Lebanon, exerting maximum efforts to prevent an all-out regional war and return to the path of diplomacy," his spokesperson said in a statement on Saturday.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: The closing ceremony of Pakistan-South Africa joint exercise 'Iqbal-I' in counter terrorism domain was conducted between the armies of Pakistan and Republic of South Africa at Cherat.

Two weeks long exercise commenced on 15th of this month. The combat teams from Special Services Group, Pakistan Army and Republic of South Africa Special Forces participated in the exercise.

The closing ceremony was attended by the Commandant Special Opera-

tion School. Chief of Staff Republic of South Africa Special Forces, Colonel SS Lechoenyo also witnessed the Closing Ceremony. The troop displayed highest standards of professional excellence in the closing ceremony.

The exercise was aimed at refining the drills, procedures and techniques involved in the counter terrorism operations through joint training, besides harnessing the historic military to military relations among the friendly countries.—RT/Agency

Supreme Court Releases Anticipated Cause List For Upcoming Week

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court has released a cause list for the judicial week for the next week.

In total, the top court would hear 968 cases from October 28 to November 1.

The eight permanent benches of the top court would hear the cases from the next week.

The first bench would be comprised Justice Yahya Afridi and Justice Shahid Bilal Hassan. In this bench, 140 cases are set to be heard.

The second bench would be consisted of Justice Mumb Akhtar and Justice Athar Minallah and it would also hear 140 cases.

Meanwhile the third bench, which would consist of Justice Aminuddin Khan and Justice Irfan Saadat Khan, would hear 140 cases.



The fourth bench — consisting of Justice Musarrat Hissari and Justice Shehbaz Ahmed Khan presided over by Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail — would hear 58 cases the upcoming week.

Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar and Justice Hasan Azhar Rizvi would make the fifth bench. It would hear 140 cases.

Meanwhile, the sixth bench would be consisted of Justice Ayesha Malik and Justice Aqeel Abbasi and it

would hear 140 cases. The seventh bench would comprise Justice Naeem Afghan and Justice Shahid Waheed and it would also hear 140 cases.

The eighth bench would hear 70 cases and comprised of Justice Sardar Tariq Masood and Justice Mazhar Alam Mian.

It merits mention that almost 57,000 cases are pending before the Supreme Court.—RT/Agency

MRDO Organizes Free Medical Camp In Sanghar

SANGHAR: The Marvi Rural Development Organization (MRDO), with support from the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) under the project "Restoring Social Services and Climate Resilience," held a free medical camp in Taluka Khipro, District Sanghar. Qualified doctors and medical professionals volunteered their time and expertise to provide free examinations, diagnoses, treatments, and medical advice to local patients. The camp aimed to assist those unable to afford medical care, offering complimentary check-ups, treatments, and medications. It also focused on raising awareness about health and hygiene within underdeveloped communities, educating residents on child health and disease prevention. Solangi noted that rural areas in District Sanghar often lack adequate medical facilities, leaving residents either far from care or unable to afford it. Thanks to the dedication of volunteer doctors, MRDO was able to provide treatment to around 250 impoverished individuals at no cost, significantly benefiting the local community.

UN chief 'shocked' at 'harrowing' death and destruction in besieged north Gaza

UNITED NATIONS: UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has expressed shock at the "harrowing levels of death, injury and destruction" in north Gaza amid an ongoing intense Israeli military attack, his spokesperson said on Sunday. Since the offensive began earlier this month, hundreds of people have been killed, according to Gaza's Ministry of Health, with more than 60,000 others displaced again, many fearing they may never return. Civilians are reportedly trapped under rubble, while the sick and wounded lack access to life-saving care. They also face severe shortages of food and shelter, amid reports of family separations and mass detentions. "The plight of Palestinian civilians trapped in North Gaza is unbearable," read a statement from the UN chief's Spokesperson. The UN chief warned that the "widespread devastation and deprivation" caused by Israel's military operations—particularly around Jabalya, Beit Lahiya and Beit Hanoun—have made life "untenable" for the Palestinian population there. Despite repeated efforts to deliver essential humanitarian supplies, including food, medicine, and shelter,



access continues to be denied by Israeli authorities, with few exceptions, putting countless lives in jeopardy. Adding to the crisis, the postponement of the final phase of the polio vaccination campaign in northern Gaza has endangered thousands of children. "This conflict continues to be waged with little regard for the requirements of international humanitarian law," the statement noted. Guterres emphasized that the parties to the conflict must respect and protect civilians, including humanitarian workers and first responders, whose essential work must be facilitated and protected, not impeded or jeopardized. "In the name of humanity, the Secretary-General reiterates his calls for an immediate ceasefire, the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages, and accountability for crimes under international law," the statement added. On Saturday, other top UN officials echoed the urgent calls for a halt to Israel's military actions in northern Gaza. Joyce Msuya, acting Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs, warned that the entire population of northern Gaza is "at risk of dying", calling for an immediate stop to "blatant disregard for basic humanity" by Israeli forces. Meanwhile, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus described the situation as "catastrophic", highlighting the collapse of Gaza's healthcare system amid ongoing attacks on hospitals and healthcare workers, calling for an immediate ceasefire to save lives.—Agency

Chinese Woman Suffers Psychological Breakdown After Boss Scolds Her, Stops Eating, Drinking And Moving

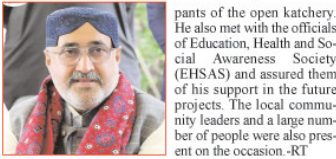
A young Chinese woman, Li, from Henan province, suffered a severe psychological breakdown after being scolded by her supervisor at work. According to South China Morning Post, Li became catatonic and stopped eating, drinking, moving, or engaging in conversation. This disturbing incident began a month prior when her team leader reprimanded her, leaving her unhappy and ultimately leading to a complete emotional and physical shutdown. As Li's condition continued to deteriorate, her physical abilities also severely declined. Her family reported that if they removed the pillow from beneath her head, it would hang limply in mid-air, unable to support itself. Furthermore, she lost control over basic bodily functions, requiring constant assistance from her loved ones to remind her to use the toilet. Dr. Jia Dehuan, Li's physician at Zhengzhou Eighth People's Hospital, described her condition as resembling a "wooden" figure, devoid of movement or responsiveness. According to Dr. Jia, Li was suffering from a catatonic stupor, a severe symptom of depression characterized by im-



Another commented, "She had been torturing herself due to her boss's actions." A recent survey by the Chinese Psychological Society shed light on the alarming state of workplace mental health in China. The findings revealed that 4.8% of employees experienced workplace depression, while 80% reported feelings of agitation at work. Additionally, 60% of respondents cited anxiety, and nearly 40% exhibited symptoms of depression, according to Shangguan News (2023). The survey's results highlight the pressing issue of workplace mental health in China, where high work demands, limited job security, poor work-life balance, and inadequate communication contribute to the problem.—Agency

14th Lifeline Shipment From Karachi Departs For Gaza And Lebanon Amid Crisis

KARACHI: Following the Prime Minister's directives, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) dispatched the 14th aid shipment to Gaza and Lebanon from Karachi on Sunday, in collaboration with the Al-Khidmat Foundation.

The relief consignment, weighing 17 tons, includes essential supplies such as tents, food tins, dry milk, clothing, and hygiene kits.

A send-off ceremony took place at Jinnah International Airport, attended by Federal Minister for Maritime Affairs Qaisar Shah, along with representatives from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, NDMA, and



Al-Khidmat Foundation. The aid was transported by plane from Karachi to Beirut, Lebanon. With this latest shipment, Pakistan has now delivered a total of 1,398 tons of aid across 14 shipments to the affected regions, following the 13th shipment sent from Islamabad just a day earlier.—RT

Hussain has appointed Dr Muhammad Amdad as party chief organizer and notification has also been issued for this regard.

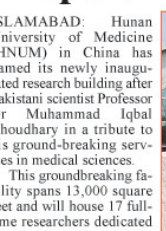
PM-Q president directed Amdad to reconstitute the party by persuading disgruntled allies, activating the wings and restructuring the party abroad.

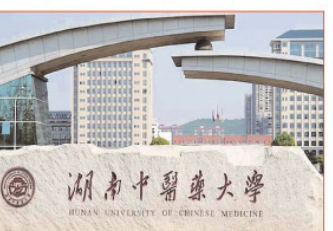
Founded in 1912 by renowned medical educator Mr Yan Fuqing, HNUM has established itself as one of the leading national public medical universities in China.

Fugitive Captured In Punjab After Bold Escape From Karachi's Malir Jail



KARACHI: A fugitive who recently broke out of Malir Jail has been apprehended in Punjab, where he was found injured during an operation by Shah Latif Investigation Police. The suspect, who sustained a leg fracture while scaling the prison wall, was captured in Dera Ghazi Khan on Friday.

Acting on a tip-off, a team from the Shah Latif Town Police Station, including four officers and the station's Investigation Officer, collaborated with Punjab Police to execute the raid and successfully detain the escaped inmate.

Inspector Zakirullah, the investigation head at Shah Latif Town, confirmed the arrest and indicated that further details would be disclosed upon the suspect's return to Karachi. The prisoner had been arrested two years prior by SITE Superhighway Police on charges of kidnapping and assault. On October 20, he escaped from Malir Jail after cutting through a bathroom window in Barrack No. 5 and climbing over the prison wall. In response to the escape, senior officials have ordered the registration of a case (FIR No. 24/1350) against eight prison staff members, including the assistant superintendent and the duty officer, for negligence.—RT/Agency

As the 2024 U.S. Presidential race heats up, Vice President Kamala Harris finds herself in a precarious position. Her unwavering alignment with President Biden's staunch support for Israel amid the escalating Gaza conflict has alienated a crucial segment of voters, especially Muslim Americans in key swing states like Michigan. This disillusionment is not just a ripple but a wave, with many Arab and Palestinian Americans now gravitating towards former President Donald Trump—a shift few could have predicted, given his controversial past rhetoric towards the Muslim community.

The frustration stems from a perceived indifference

by the Biden administration to the Palestinian humanitarian crisis. Despite appeals for a more balanced approach, Harris has

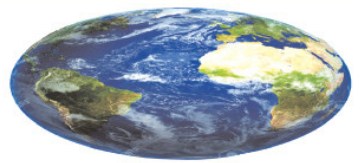

Trump unbound as US presidential race nears its end

With his third straight US presidential campaign coming down to the wire, Donald Trump mused at a rally about hydrogen-powered cars exploding, lamented how difficult it is to get spray paint off limestone and marvelled at how billionaire backer Elon Musk's rocket had returned to Earth in one piece.

He complained Democratic rival Kamala Harris wasn't working as hard as he was, praised Chinese President Xi Jinping as "fierce" and called former President Barack Obama "a real jerk."

His aides had billed the event in battleground North Carolina as economy focused, but that issue was just the warm-up.

To witness Trump as the November 5 election approaches and his race against Vice President Harris nears its end is to watch a candidate almost fully unbound.

At a time when most politicians would be honing their closing arguments to voters, Trump often acts more like an entertainer on a farewell tour than someone who aims to lead the world's most powerful nation.

His unfocused behaviour and dark rhetoric alienating some voters in a race that, despite all he says, remains so tight that any swing of a few thousand votes in several competitive states could determine the next president.

He is giving Harris' campaign ample ammunition to argue that he is more "unstable" and "unhinged" than ever. The Democratic candidate is increasingly embracing those terms and pointing to Trump's ramblings as evidence of a tired, old man who



isn't fit for the presidency. "In many, many ways Donald Trump is an unserious man, but the consequences of him being president of the United States are brutally serious," Harris said last week.

Trump, 78, defends his scattershot approach by saying he does something he calls "the weave" in which he claims he always returns to his initial point, and supporters say his unscripted style is part of his appeal.

"His patented weave is a brilliant method to convey important stories and explain policies that will help everyday Americans turn the page from the last four years of Kamala Harris' failures," said Steven Cheung, a spokesperson for Trump's campaign.

Trump's rallies have always featured their share of diversions and odd tangents. But with the clock ticking, the former president seems content to burn precious minutes telling stories about his White House days, musing about long-dead athletes or simply going where his mind takes him.

"They gave Obama the Nobel Prize," he said on Thursday in Las Vegas. "He didn't even know why the hell he got it. He still doesn't. He got elected and they announced he's getting the Nobel Prize. I got elected in a much bigger, better, crazier election but they gave him the Nobel Prize."

Though no rally is ever exactly alike, a consistent theme is Trump's false assertion that in four short years, Democrats have transformed the nation into a dystopian state.

He denounces his political opponents as the "enemy from within" and peppers his remarks with graphic accounts of murders and rapes of young women, false tales of violent gangs taking over small towns, and debunked claims about immigrants eating stolen pets.

"We're like a rubbish bin for the world," he bemoaned in Arizona. Trump aides say he sets the pace and talks as long as he wants. They don't try to contain him, and they have put him in forums such as podcasts where his rambling ways can find a home and he won't be subjected to a battery of questions. During a lengthy interview with podcaster Joe Rogan on Friday, Trump asserted that there may be life on Mars even though, as Rogan noted, probes have found no evidence of it. He also claimed windmills have a negative effect on whales.—Agency

Hezbollah Operative Behind 1992, 1994 Bombings In Argentina Identified



In 1992, the Israeli embassy in Argentina's capital Buenos Aires was bombed, killing 29 and injuring over 240. Two years later, a Jewish community centre in the capital was bombed, killing 86 and injuring over 300. Now over three decades later, the alleged mastermind behind the attacks has been identified as Hussein Ahmad Karaki, a notorious Hezbollah operative.

Long known to law enforcement as a shadowy figure operating under numerous aliases, Karaki has evaded capture for decades, thanks in part to an extensive network and forged documentation allegedly supplied by Venezuela.

On Saturday, Argentina's Defence Minister Patricia Bullrich shared new details about Karaki's alleged role as the head of Hezbollah operations in Latin America. According to Ms Bullrich, Karaki was not only responsible for the planning and execution of the two infamous Argentine bombings but also remains active in the region, with evidence linking him to a series of thwarted terrorist attempts across Peru, Bolivia, and Brazil.

Karaki was responsible for overseeing the logistics behind the 1992 and 1994 attacks in Argentina, Ms Bullrich said, adding that he was operating under the alias "David Assi." "We want the Argentine people to know the identity of the person responsible for these heinous acts," she stated. Bullrich further described Karaki as a "ghost," one who has effectively evaded detection for years, thanks to sophisticated tactics.

Israeli Army Says 5 Soldiers Killed In "Combat" In South Lebanon



Jerusalem: The Israeli military on Sunday said five soldiers were killed in southern Lebanon, bringing to 37 the death count for soldiers fighting there since the start of ground operations on September 30.

The soldiers "fell during combat in southern Lebanon," the army said in a statement, adding that they were killed on Saturday.

Hezbollah began launching rockets at Israel on October 8, 2023, in support of Hamas after the Palestinian group launched its unprecedented attack on Israel the previous day. Israel dramatically escalated its air strikes on Lebanon late last month before launching ground operations in southern Lebanon. The war has left at least 1,615 people dead in Lebanon since September 23, according to an AFP tally based on official figures, though the real number is likely to be higher due to gaps in the data.—Agency

Death toll in Philippines storm rises to 100

MANILA: Rescuers in the Philippines were diving into a lake and scouring isolated villages on Sunday to locate dozens of missing people as the death toll from Tropical Storm Trami hit 100.

Trami, which raged into the Philippines on October 24, was among the deadliest storms to hit the Southeast Asian country this year.

According to the national disaster agency, it forced more than half a million people to flee their homes and at least 36 people remain missing.

Police in the hardest-hit Bicol region have recorded 38 deaths, most due to drowning.

"We are still receiving many calls and we are trying to save as many people as we can," Bicol regional police director Andre Dizon told AFP.

"Hopefully, there will be no more deaths."

Dizon added that "many residents" in the region's Camarines Sur province are still trapped on roofs and the upper floors of their homes.

The death toll in Batangas, south of Manila, has risen to 55, provincial police chief Jacinto Malinao told AFP.

Two were reported dead in separate incidents of electrocution and drowning in Cavite province, police said.

Five more bodies were recovered in other provinces, bringing the total to 100, according to an AFP tally based on official police and disaster agency sources.

"A higher death toll is possible in the coming days since rescuers can now reach previously isolated places," Edgar Posadas of the Civil Defence Office told AFP.

The police, coast guards and a Marines diving team were searching on Sunday for a family of seven at Taal Lake in Batangas.

"The waters from the mountains hit their home in Balete town, causing it to be swept away with them possibly inside," Malinao, the provincial police chief, said.

American Muslim leaders publicly endorse Trump at Michigan rally

Former United States president Donald Trump invited several Muslim leaders onstage during a campaign rally in Detroit, Michigan, in an effort to engage Arab American and Muslim voters angry over Washington's policy in the Middle East situation.

In the critical battleground state, the 77-year-old Republican presidential candidate emphasised the potential impact of this demographic, stating: "They could turn the election one way or the other."

At the rally in Detroit, Trump invited several prominent leaders of Michigan's Muslim community" on stage, including Imam Belal Alzuhairi who labelled Trump as the "peace" candidate, CNN reported.

"We, as Muslims, stand with President Trump because he promises peace — not war," Alzuhairi said. "We are supporting."

Donald Trump because he promised to end war in the Middle East and Ukraine."

Earlier, Trump held a meeting with these leaders to discuss their concerns.

In 2017, during his first month as president, Trump issued an executive order that temporarily banned entry for 90 days from seven Muslim-majority countries, including Iraq, Syria, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan and Yemen.

The order indefinitely banned Syrian refugees and blocked all refugees from entering the US for four months.



During his rally on Saturday, Trump claimed that "Jews, Catholics, evangelicals, Mormons, Muslims are joining our cause in larger numbers than ever before and now the most wonderful thing is happening."

"The Muslim and Arab voters in Michigan and across the country want a stop to the endless wars and a return to peace in the Middle East. That's all they want," Trump added.—Agency

US fighter jets were on standby to aid Israeli pilots if Iran strike failed

The US positioned a fleet of fighter jets on standby to rescue Israeli pilots if Tel Aviv's Saturday attack on Iran had gone badly, Israeli media reported.

"Israel and the US coordinated a plan to ensure the safe extraction of pilots should the operation have not succeeded," said Israeli Army Radio on Sunday.

The report stressed that while the US did not take part in the attack itself, a fleet from US Central Command (AFCENT) was prepared to intervene if necessary.

"The Americans' advanced capabilities in the region would allow them to carry out a rescue operation," the report stated.

Despite this readiness for potential US intervention, the Israeli Air Force had already devised an "in-



dependent plan for pilot rescue without relying on American support," it added.

Israeli on Saturday said it had carried out a four-pronged assault on Iran, with Tehran stating that it had successfully repelled "attempts by the Zionist entity to attack some points in Tehran and across the country."

According to the Iranian military, the Israeli strikes killed four soldiers. This attack followed Iran's launch of over 180 missiles at Israel on Oct. 1, which Tehran described as "retaliation" for the assassinations of top leaders of Palestinian group Hamas and Lebanese Hezbollah. Iran had previously warned that any Israeli attack would be met with a "harsher response."—Agency

PCB Supremo Naqvi Drops Bombshell On Fakhar Zaman's Ouster From Central Contract And Squad



LAHORE: The chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Mohsin Naqvi has explained the reason behind the exclusion of opening batter Fakhar Zaman from the central contracts as well as white-ball squads for the tour of Australia and Zimbabwe.

Earlier today, the cricket board announced the central contracts for the 2024-25 international season, along with the squads for the tour to Australia and Zimbabwe.

The Australia tour will run from 4-18 November, while the matches in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, will be played from 24 November to 5 December.

However, Fakhar Zaman's name was missing from the central contract list and squads for the upcoming tours.

During a press conference in Lahore, a journalist asked the PCB chairman, Mohsin Naqvi, if Fakhar was left out due to his social media post defending Babar Azam.

In response, Naqvi acknowledged the controversy surrounding Fakhar's social

media post, which has been deemed a violation of the central contract.

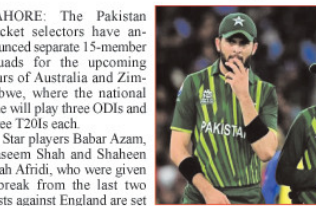
However, he emphasized that the primary factor leading to Fakhar's exclusion was due to concerns over the batter's fitness.

"There is the twist issue definitely. But that doesn't matter as much as his fitness tests. He had two issues: the fitness test and the show-and-tell notice, which is still pending. That is why he hasn't been included (in the central contracts list)," Naqvi said.

"If a player is dropped by the selection committee, another player starts tweeting against it. This isn't allowed and will not be permitted. However, the bigger issue is his fitness test."

For the unversed, earlier this month Fakhar Zaman expressed his disappointment through a social media post over the selection committee's decision to drop star batter Babar Azam after the first Test against England.—Agency

LAHORE: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman Mohsin Naqvi on Sunday announced the appointment of wicket-keeper Mohammad Rizwan as the white-ball captain of the national cricket team.

Meanwhile, Salman Ali Agha has been appointed as the vice-captain of Pakistan's white-ball team.

Naqvi made the announcement during a press conference in Lahore, accompanied by newly appointed captain and vice-captain Mohammad Rizwan and Salman Ali Agha respectively. They were joined by the members of the selection committee Aqib Javed and Azhar Ali. It's worth noting that Rizwan replaced fellow batter Babar Azam, who stepped down as Pakistan's white-ball captain earlier this month.

Babar's resignation came in the wake of the national team's disastrous campaign at the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 where they suffered their first-ever group-stage exit, mainly pertaining to their shock loss against the United States of America (USA) and gut-wrenching defeat at the hands of arch-rivals India.

Mohammad Rizwan will kick off his stint as Pakistan captain from the upcoming tour of Australia, where Pakistan will play a three-match ODI series followed by three T20Is, scheduled to run from November 4 until November 18.

Earlier today, the PCB announced squads for the upcoming white-ball series against Australia and Zimbabwe.

The 32-year-old wicket-keeper will lead the team during the Australia matches and Zimbabwe ODIs but will be rested from the Zimbabwe T20Is. In his absence, Salman Ali Agha will lead Pakistan in the T20I series against Zimbabwe.—Agency

El Clasico Chaos: Real Madrid Blasts Racist Abuse Targeting Barcelona Stars



BARCELONA: Real Madrid condemned racism from some of their supporters aimed at Barcelona players including teenager Lamine Yamal and Alejandro Balde during the club's 4-0 El Clasico defeat.

"Real Madrid strongly condemns any kind of behaviour involving racism, xenophobia or violence in football and sport, and deeply regrets the insults that a few fans uttered last night in one of the corners of the stadium," said Los Blancos in a statement Sunday.

Videos emerged on social media after the game of racial abuse aimed at Barcelona players.

The Spanish champions said they had "opened an investigation in order to locate and identify the perpetrators of these deplorable and despicable insults".

Spanish football is struggling to combat racism in

stadiums across the country. Real Madrid striker Vinicius Junior has become a figurehead in the fight against racism and has been targeted on numerous occasions since arriving in Spain in 2018.

The Brazilian winger earned worldwide support in May 2023 when he squared off with Valencia supporters after suffering abuse at their Mestalla stadium.

In January 2023, an effigy in a Vinicius shirt was found hanging from a bridge near the club's training ground alongside a banner saying: "Madrid hates Real". In December, four Atletico Madrid fans were charged over the incident, with prosecutors pushing for jail terms of four years.

This week Spanish police arrested four men suspected of inciting an online hate campaign against Vinicius.—Agency

Dodgers' Disaster: Shohei Ohtani's Season In Jeopardy With Shoulder Injury



Los Angeles Dodgers designated hitter Shohei Ohtani suffered what manager Dave Roberts called a partial dislocation of his left shoulder during game two of the 2024 Major League Baseball World Series, leaving his status for future games unknown.

Speaking with reporters after his team's 4-2 victory over the visiting New York Yankees to take a 2-0 series lead, Roberts said that the 30-year-old baseball star awaits tests to decide his status for future games.

Roberts said: "He had a little left shoulder subluxation so we're going to get some tests tonight or tomorrow and then we'll know more in the next couple days. But the strength was great. Beyond the range of motion good, so we're encouraged."

"Once we get the scans, we'll know more."

Ohtani left Dodger Stadium before speaking with reporters and did not appear to be in any discomfort when leaving the locker room.

The best-of-seven series shifts to New York for game three on Monday and game four on Tuesday, with game five also in New York on Wednesday, if necessary.

The National League MVP favourite left the field with a member of the medical staff holding his left arm after he was thrown out on a stolen-base attempt to end the seventh inning.

Ohtani walked against Clay Holmes and was thrown out on his steal attempt by Yankees catcher Austin Wells. Ohtani remained on the ground, favouring his left arm, as Yankees players left the field.

"When you see him come off the field and the trainer is holding his arm, obviously there is a level of concern," Dodgers first baseman Freddie Freeman said.

"But we'll see how it is in the next couple of days. I don't have any info, but when you have a group like this, they picked me up when I have been down and we'll try to do the same for him."

Ohtani's first World Series has been a quiet one so far. He was 0-for-3 with a walk in game two after he went 1-for-5 with a run scored in game one.

In his first season with the Dodgers after signing a 10-year, heavily deferred \$700 million contract, Ohtani notched the first 50-50 season in major league history. He finished with 54 home runs and 59 steals.—Agency

PCB Shake-Up: Shaheen Demoted As Fakhar And Big Names Miss Out On Contracts



LAHORE: Pakistan's left-arm pacer and former skipper Shaheen Shah Afridi has been demoted while batter Fakhar Zaman and others have missed out on the 12-month central contracts, according to an official announcement made by the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Sunday.

In its list of central contracts for 25 players, the board has placed Shaheen - who was previously in Category A along with Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan - in Category B.

With Babar and Rizwan being the only players in Category A, several players are not even part of the central contracts. These players include Fakhar, former skipper Sarfaraz Ahmed, Hasan Ali, Imam-ul-Haq, Iftikhar Ahmed, Imad Wasim, Mohammad Nawaz, Moham-

mad Haris, Ihsanullah, Shah Nawaz Dahi and others.

Fakhar was previously placed in Category B of the central contract by the board.

The development comes as the PCB, back in July, announced going back to its old model of granting a one-year central contract to the national side's players - conditional to their performance. The board had also decided that players' fitness would be checked every three months and that it would be mandatory for the athletes to participate in domestic cricket. The move came following the team's dismal performance in the T20 World Cup 2024 wherein the national side crashed out of the tournament before even entering the Super 8 stage.—Agency

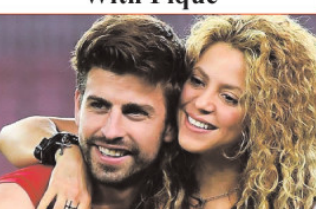

The operation was launched following intelligence reports of the presence of 10 to 15 terrorists in the region. A Punjab Police spokesperson confirmed the success of the operation, emphasizing the determination to crush the terrorists' nefarious intentions and eradicate the scourge of terrorism. FIA Cracks Down On Human Traffickers And White-Collar Crime Syndicates

GUJRANWALA: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) Gujranwala zone registered 27 cases last week against human traffickers, advertisers, and individuals involved in white-collar crimes. Director FIA Abdul Qadir Qamar provided details to senior journalist Dr. Mirza MB Qamar.

In total, 17 human traffickers were apprehended, including five notorious advertising suspects. The FIA Immigration team in Sialkot offloaded 38 suspicious passengers, among them five individuals attempting to travel to Gulf states and Iraq for illegal activities. Legal action is being taken against those tarnishing Pakistan's reputation abroad through such offenses.

Additionally, the Ceylon proceedings. A dedicated Anti-Money Laundering Circle has been established to target money laundering activities, with inquiries initiated against 27 individuals last week.

To enhance the capabilities of FIA officers, regular training sessions have been organized with the support of international organizations. In total, 22 individuals were arrested during the past week, including five for electricity theft, leading to the recovery of over 5.5 million rupees.

Director Abdul Qadir Qamar emphasized that the FIA is committed to taking stringent action against human traffickers who endanger lives and property, ensuring timely justice for the citizens. Internal accountability measures are also underway to maintain high standards within the agency.

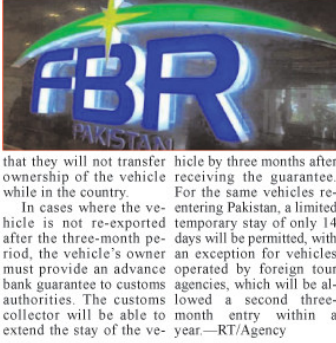

FBR Unveils Proposed Overhaul Of Vehicle Import Regulations

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) issued a draft amendment to Pakistan's Customs Rules 2001, introducing significant changes to the temporary import rules for vehicles brought into the country by tourists.

The amendment allows tourists to keep their vehicles in Pakistan duty-free for up to three months, provided specific conditions are met, said an FBR notification issued here.

According to the FBR's notification, tourists wishing to bring their vehicles into Pakistan must submit a declaration affirming



that they will not transfer ownership of the vehicle while in the country.

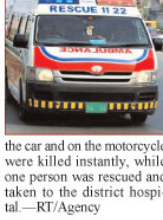
In cases where the vehicle is not re-exported after the three-month period, the vehicle's owner must provide an advance bank guarantee to customs authorities. The customs collector will be able to extend the stay of the vehicle by three months after receiving the guarantee.

For the same vehicles re-entering Pakistan, a limited temporary stay of only 14 days will be permitted, with an exception for vehicles operated by foreign tour agencies, which will be allowed a second three-month entry within a year.—RT/Agency

KARACHI: Sindh Senior Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon emphasized the importance of the Yellow Line BRT project for Karachi, which has been launched with the support of the World Bank at a cost of 100 billion rupees. The project will operate under a Public-Private Partnership.

Speaking to the media after inspecting the development work, Memon noted, "We are considering discussions with the World Bank about potentially operating electric vehicles (EV) on this route." He mentioned that the Yellow Line will span 21 kilometers, with a new bridge



being built alongside the Jam Sadiq Bridge. The contractor has pledged to complete the project within 18 months,

though the government aims for an earlier finish. Memon also announced plans to introduce double-decker and environmentally friendly buses in Pakistan under the leadership of the People's Party.

In response to questions about Imran Khan, Memon claimed that "the Israeli lobby supports him worldwide," and accused Khan of being favored due to connections with his ex-wife and brother-in-law, the Goldsmiths. He reiterated controversial remarks about Khan being an agent of foreign interests and expressed concerns over funding linked to India and Israel.

Memon praised Maulana Fazlur Rehman for his dialogue-oriented approach in politics and highlighted allegations made by Shaheed Arshad Sharif regarding secret funding to PTI from abroad. He distanced himself from condemning all PTI workers, suggesting the problem lies with Imran Khan's alleged connections to Israel.

He concluded by thanking the media for their presence at the project site.—RT

Dr. Amjad Leads Aam Loeg Itehad Rally, Urging Party Unity Amid Political Challenges



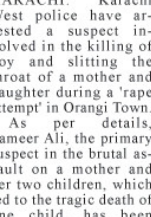

The incident occurred on Saturday night, igniting a fierce fire that consumed the victims. Their bodies have since been transferred to a nearby hospital.

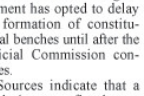

LONDON: Former chief justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa, the first Pakistani judge to be invited to a dinner by The Honourable Society of the Middle Temple on Tuesday, is likely to face protest by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) UK chapter.



Jahanzeb Khan, former senior vice president of PTI UK, and Sahibzada Jahangir, party founder Imran Khan's friend and former adviser confirmed to Geo News that a demonstration has been called at the Middle Temple in Central London to protest ex-CJP Isa's participation and condemn the society for inviting him and elevating him in the Temple.

The Calles include Isa, Professor Adrian Briggs, Isabel Hitching KC and Nikki Singla KC. They will be called to the bench before dinner and asked to take their place at the high table.

Isa will give a short speech to the benchers and members, the Middle Temple confirmed.

The former chief justice became the first Pakistani judge to get elected as a bench at the Middle Temple, a prestigious legal institution in the United Kingdom (UK).

Finance Minister Aurangzeb Sees US Stakeholder Meetings As Key Breakthrough

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb on Sunday said that his meetings with stakeholders in the United States remained positive, adding that the stakeholders appreciated the scaling down of inflation in Pakistan.



He made these remarks after concluding his visit to Washington to participate in the World Bank (WB) and International Monetary Fund (IMF) Annual Meetings from October 21 to 26.

The finance minister held a series of meetings with the leaders from several international finance institutions and authorities including rating agencies, multinational banks, WB, IMF and the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

Aurangzeb said the US business communities were willing to invest in Pakistan as all rating agencies stated the economy was moving in the right direction.

He also apprised media that the WB would give Pakistan a grant instead of loan. Whereas, he said, the government would try not to take a loan from the IMF anymore.

Hafiz Naem Asserts: Only Jihad Can Lead Kashmir To Freedom

Hafiz Naem, asserted that a mere advertisement on October 27 cannot absolve the government of its responsibility towards Kashmir.

Referring to Syed Ali Gilani, he noted that half of Gilani's life was spent in prison, and his sacrifices were aimed at fulfilling Pakistan's independence.

"Rights cannot be granted to Kashmiris through phone messages; Kashmir will only be freed through jihad. If dialogue were the solution, the issue would have been resolved long ago," he stated.

He also mentioned the assassination of Yahya Siyar, stating that Israel and America fear such sacrifices. Despite turning Gaza into rubble, Israel could not break the spirit and strength of Gaza and Hamas, with Palestinians standing firm. While Palestine has yet to gain freedom, Hafiz Naem expressed hope for a new dawn with the bloodshed endured by Ismail Haniyeh's family.

He called on both the government and military to clarify their stance on Kashmir, urging for action rather than slogans.

He further criticised powerful nations, noting that they support occupying forces, and accused American and Indian authorities of deceiving the global community. "Those who fight for freedom are labelled as terrorists," he said, highlighting the double standards of international powers.

Shehbaz Vows Unyielding Fight Against Terrorism

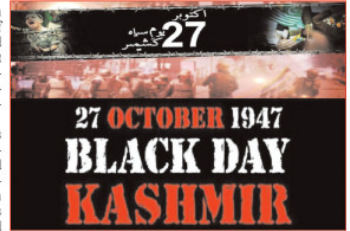

On this solemn day, he said, we reaffirm our unwavering commitment to standing by the Kashmiri people, advocating for their human rights, and striving for a future of peace, freedom, and dignity for them.

"Tragically, this denial of rights has only intensified, especially following the unilateral and unlawful actions of August 5, 2019."

Today, Ambassador Akram said, as we observe Kashmir Black Day, we remember the grave injustices faced by the people of Jammu and Kashmir. The events of October 27, 1947, marked the beginning of an occupation that has denied Kashmiris their fundamental right to self-determination, a right enshrined in the UN Charter and affirmed through Security Council resolutions, he added.

Since that fateful day, he said that the people of Indian occupied Jammu and Kashmir had been subjected to an unprecedented lockdown, systematic human rights violations and severe restrictions on their freedom and dignity. "Countless reports by international human rights organizations and independent observers have documented instances of excessive use of force, extra-judicial killing en masse, forced disappearances, arbitrary detentions and col-
