President Zardari Touches Down In China For 10-Day Official Visit

BEIJING: President Asif Ali Zardari arrived in Chengdu on Friday to begin his 10-day official visit to China, where he will hold discussions with the Chinese leadership on matters related to bilateral ties, including China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

On arrival at Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport, he was warmly received by Vice Foreign Minister Sun Weidong and Vice Governor of Sichuan Province Huang Ruixue, said a statement issued by the President's Secretariat.

Pakistan's Ambassador to China Khalid Hashmi, as well as the Chinese Ambassador to Pakistan, Jiang Zaidong, were also present on the occasion.

"During the visit, the president will hold meetings with the Chinese leadership and senior officials to strengthen Pakistan-China relations further, enhance cooperation in diverse fields and advance shared objectives under the All-Weather Strategic Cooperative Partnership," read the statement.



Earlier, the Foreign Office—in a statement—said that the president was undertaking a 10-day official visit to China on the invitation of the Chinese government.

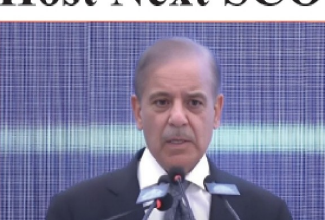
During the visit, the President will grace Chengdu, Shanghai and Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region and hold meetings with the provincial leadership.

"The discussions will encompass Pakistan-China bilateral relations, with a particular focus on economic and trade cooperation, China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and future connectivity initiatives," the FO added.

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has announced that Pakistan will host the next Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit to be held in 2027 and ordered to immediately begin preparations for the key summit.

The announcement was made after PM Shehbaz performed the groundbreaking of T-Chowk Flyover Project at Islamabad Expressway, terming it a milestone initiative for the residents of the twin cities, Rawalpindi and Islamabad.

The total project cost is Rs 1,495 million, with a duration of 150 days. The project officially starts today and is expected to be completed by February 9 next year.



The project is being constructed on existing available land with no need for land acquisition and is financed through self-financing by the CDA.

Addressing the groundbreaking ceremony, the prime minister praised the interior minister, Capital Development Authority

(CDA) chairman, and their teams for initiating such a vital public interest project.

He directed all concerned authorities to ensure the highest standards of quality throughout the construction and emphasized that there should be no compromise on quality while completing the project in the shortest possible time.

The prime minister highlighted that Pakistan will be hosting the next SCO Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, and preparations must begin immediately.

This includes constructing new accommodations and further beautifying Islamabad. In this regard, he mentioned that Tajikistan has gifted saplings, and the CDA and other teams are working on plantation efforts.

PM Shehbaz also stressed that government was also planning to embark upon another public interest project of rail car in the twin cities.

"If it happens (the project completes), it will be a great gift for the residents of the twin cities," he said directing the relevant authorities to begin work on the project without delay.

Speaking on the occasion, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said the project Islamabad Expressway was already completed but it was decided that the formal inauguration will be held once the final segment (T-Chowk Flyover) was done. He commended the CDA, National Engineering Services Pakistan (Nespak), and other relevant stakeholders for designing the project in a way that no additional land acquisition is required, saving Rs7 billion in the process.—RT/Agency

Trump Announces Arrest Of Suspect In Charlie Kirk Killing

US: A suspect in the fatal shooting of conservative activist Charlie Kirk at a Utah university has been taken into custody, US President Donald Trump said on Friday, ending an intense manhunt that followed what Trump described as a "heinous assassination."



Kirk's killer has eluded police and federal agents for more than 24 hours after Wednesday's shooting, in which a sniper fired a single gunshot that killed Kirk during an appearance at Utah Valley University in Orem.

"I think we have him," Trump told Fox News in an interview, adding that a person who knows the suspect had turned him in.

Previously, US investigators said they had found the bolt-action rifle believed to have been used to kill Kirk and released images of a person of interest.

sleeved top appears to have been emblazoned with an image of a bald eagle flying across a US flag.

Kirk, an author, podcaster and close ally of Trump, helped build the Republican Party's support among younger voters.

FBI and state officials said the killer arrived on the campus a few minutes before the start of the event, a debate led by Kirk titled "Prove Me Wrong" in front of 3,000 people at Utah Valley, about 40 miles (65 km) south of Salt Lake City.

Security-camera videos showed a person going up stairwells to gain access to a roof before firing at Kirk, the officials said at a press briefing. Kirk, a staunch defender of gun rights, was answering an audience question about mass shootings when the bullet struck his neck. Audience members fled in panic.

The shooter jumped off the roof and fled into an adjoining neighborhood, said Robert Bohls, an FBI special agent in charge.

Investigators found a "high-powered, bolt-action" rifle in a nearby wooded area, and were examining that along with palm prints and footprints for clues.—RT/Agency



US: US President Donald Trump's top diplomat, Marco Rubio, will fly to Israel this weekend amid tensions with fellow US allies in the Middle East over Israel's strike on Hamas leaders in Qatar and expansion of settlements in the occupied West Bank.

State Department deputy spokesperson Tommy Pigott said on Friday that Rubio would depart on Saturday to visit Israel before joining up with Trump's planned visit to Britain next week.

Rubio in Israel will emphasise Washington and Israel's shared goals, Pigott said in a statement, citing the need to ensure Hamas never rules Gaza again and the return of hostages of October 7, 2023.

Rubio's visit comes ahead of high-level meetings at the United Nations in New York later this month, where countries including France and Britain are expected to recognize Palestinian statehood.—RT/Agency

Defense Minister Khawaja Asif Says Qatar Betrayed, Urges Muslim Unity



ISLAMABAD: Defense Minister Khawaja Asif has said that Qatar feels it has been betrayed, stressing that the matter has now moved forward and requires broader resolution. He made these remarks during a talk show on Media, after accompanying Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in his meeting with the Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani.

Khawaja Asif noted that the issues faced by Qatar go beyond mere diplomatic tensions, adding that the sense of betrayal within Doha highlights the gravity of the situation. He pointed out that the crisis is not just about one country but has implications for the Muslim world at large.

Commenting on the role of global powers, the Defense Minister criticized the notion that pressure from the United States could resolve the issue. "The dis-

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar has categorically rejected reports of a political "deal," saying such claims are fabricated and intended to mislead the public.

He asserted that if there had been any arrangement, the PTI founder would not have endured two years in prison.

Addressing the media on Thursday, Barrister Gohar emphasized that PTI's struggle is not about striking compromises but about ensuring the supremacy of the judiciary and the protection of democratic values in Pakistan. "There is no question of a deal. Our movement is for justice and democracy," he said.

He argued that the cases registered against PTI members were politically motivated. "Those who abandoned the party faced no legal challenges, while our loyal workers and leaders were disqualified and punished," he pointed out. According to him, this selective accountability makes it clear that PTI has been unfairly targeted.

The PTI chairman also reminded that the founder of the party had repeatedly demonstrated flexibility in the past three years, despite facing immense political challenges. "He is not rigid," Gohar said, adding that when PTI's electoral mandate was allegedly stolen, the founder urged dialogue to resolve the crisis.

"Yet nothing came out of it," he lamented. Declaring himself the representative voice of the PTI founder, Gohar said the leader's resilience remains unshaken whether he is inside jail or outside. He underscored that a political solution to the ongoing crisis is still necessary, stressing, "It is not too late even now."

He urged all stakeholders to act responsibly, saying that the way forward lies in meaningful political dialogue rather than fabricated narratives about secret deals. "The people of Pakistan deserve transparency, justice, and democracy. That is what PTI stands for," he concluded.

The statement comes at a time when rumors of backchannel negotiations have been circulating in political circles, with PTI leadership facing mounting legal and political pressures. Barrister Gohar's remarks appear aimed at dispelling confusion and reaffirming PTI's position as a party committed to democratic struggle rather than compromises.—RT/Agency

ISLAMABAD: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has officially signed off on the controversial E1 settlement development plan, defining the vision of his government that a Palestinian state will never be established.

The signing ceremony was held in Ma'ale Adumim, which is a large Israeli settlement in the occupied West Bank, where Netanyahu declared, "There will not be a Palestinian state. This place is ours."

The E1 settlement development plan has had international opposition for years, and it aims to connect Ma'ale Adumim with East Jerusalem through the establishment of thousands of housing units.

Critics call this wrong as this move will effectively divide the West Bank, severing East Jerusalem from Palestinian territories and rendering the prospect of a contiguous Palestinian state geographically impossible.

Human rights organisations and international observers have denied the plan, warning that it will

lead to the movement of Palestinian communities and violate international law.

The United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres considered the settlement expansion an "existential threat" to the two-state solution.

The E1 settlement development plan, spanning approximately 12 square kilometres, has long been considered a strategic zone by Israeli authorities.

The development is viewed as a move towards Netanyahu's goal of "Greater Israel," strengthening Israeli control over land that is occupied by Palestinians.

The Jerusalem Governorate has criticised the plan, saying it is a way to change the population balance in East Jerusalem.

At the same time, reports indicate that attacks by settlers on Palestinian properties have gone up in recent months, causing more tension in the area.

Earlier, Qatar officially announced it will host an emergency Arab-Islamic summit in Doha, in response to a recent Israeli airstrike on Doha targeting Hamas officials in the Qatari capital.

The Arab-Islamic summit will commence on September 14 and 15, 2025, and aims to form a collaborative regional viewpoint on the incident and its wider consequences.

According to the Qatari Ministry of Foreign Affairs, an introductory meeting of foreign ministers will take place on September 13, before the main summit.—RT/Agency

Four Indian-Backed Terrorists Neutralized In Mastung Operation

MASTUNG: Security forces on Friday eliminated four terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy, Fitna al Hindustan, during an intelligence-based operation (IBO) in Balochistan's Mastung.



During the conduct of the operation, the security personnel effectively engaged the terrorists' location, and after an intense fire exchange, four Indian-sponsored terrorists were neutralised, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said in a statement.

Weapons, ammunition and explosives were also recovered from the terrorists, who remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities in the area.

The security forces were conducting a sanitisation operation to eliminate any other terrorists found in the area, it added.

The security forces "are determined to wipe out the menace of Indian sponsored terrorism from the country, and reaffirm the nation's unwavering

resolve to bring the perpetrators of terrorism to justice," it concluded.

Pakistan witnessed a surge in terror activities, particularly in its Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Balochistan provinces since 2021.

According to a report released by the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies (PICSS), an Islamabad-based think tank, the country witnessed 78 terrorist attacks during the month of June, which resulted in at least 100 deaths. Among the fatalities were 53 security personnel, 39 civilians, six militants, and two mem-

bers of local peace committees. A total of 189 people were injured, including 126 members of the security forces and 63 civilians. Altogether, the violence and operations led to 175 deaths in June—among them, 55 security personnel, 77 militants, 41 civilians, and two peace committee members.

The security forces, along with the law enforcement agencies (LEAs) have been carrying out operations against the terrorists and even launched a targeted action against militants in KP's Bajaur.—RT/Agency

pad.

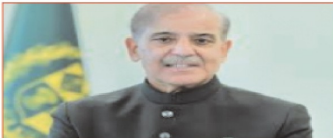

ISLAMABAD: A Lahore-based lawyer, Advocate Li-aquat Ali, has formally filed a Right to Information (RTI) request under the RTI Act 2017, directed to the Vice Chancellor of Rawalpindi Women University (RWU), seeking detailed information regarding academic policies and student affairs. The application specifically inquires about the performance of M.Phil Sociology students in the 2025 first semester exams, including pass, fail, and dropout statistics, along with reasons and rules governing student withdrawals. The lawyer also requested clarification on

conditional promotions and academic probation policies, demanding access to official documents supporting such decisions. Notably, the RTI request questions whether RWU has approved policies on sexual harassment and grievance redressal mechanisms for students, requesting copies if they exist. Advocate Ali emphasized the students' right to information and the need for transparency in academic institutions. The case reflects rising concerns over accountability in Pakistan's higher education sector, as more individuals and civil society actors invoke the RTI law to hold institutions accountable.

PMDC Postpones MDCAT to October 26 Amid Flood Crisis

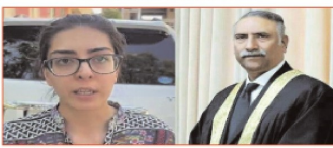

Two-State Solution or World War: The UN Has Spoken, Will Trump Listen?

The United Nations General Assembly has spoken with rare clarity: 142 nations voted to endorse a declaration demanding “tangible, timebound, and irreversible steps” towards a two-state solution between Israel and Palestine. This is no ordinary vote. It is the world’s most resounding reminder that peace in the Middle East cannot come through military might, occupation, or endless retaliation. It can only come through justice — and justice means two sovereign states, side by side.

Yet, Israel and its Western backers, especially the United States, have once again chosen to dismiss global consensus. By calling the resolution a “publicity stunt,” Washington has dangerously aligned it-

self against the tide of history. When 142 nations, in-



cluding all Gulf states and European powers like France, demand change, it cannot be brushed off as theatrics. It is the will of humanity.

The grim numbers speak for themselves: more than 64,000 civilians dead in Gaza since October 7, 2023, and millions displaced. No rhetoric about “security” can mask the humanitarian catastrophe unfolding before the world’s eyes. Unless addressed through a political settlement, this spiral of violence

risks igniting a wider regional conflict — one that could easily engulf superpowers and drag the world towards a catastrophic third world war.

US President Donald Trump has long claimed that he seeks peace in the Middle East. Now is his moment of truth. The UN vote offers him a historic opportunity to pressure Israel to abandon its path of endless bloodshed and embrace a two-state solution. Will Trump rise to the challenge and use his influence to steer Israel towards peace, or will he remain complicit in prolonging a war that could consume the world?

History will not forgive indifference. The two-state solution is no longer an option — it is the only lifeline left.

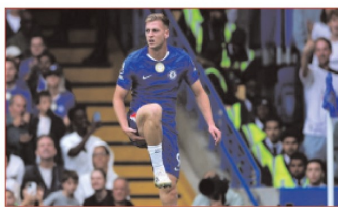
Thatta Court Hands Life Sentences to Three in Gruesome Landowner Murder Case

Chelsea Rocked as Liam Delap Ruled Out Until December



LONDON: Chelsea suffered a big blow as forward Liam Delap's hamstring injury has worsened and could keep him out until December.

Delap, who moved to Chelsea from Ipswich Town in a deal worth 30 million pounds (\$41 million) in June, sustained an injury against Fulham before the international break.

Initially, he was believed to miss six to eight weeks, however, the situation has deteriorated now.

Enzo Maresca, the manager of Chelsea on Friday, ahead of his side's Premier League clash away to London rivals Brentford, said that it would take around 10 to 12 weeks for Delap to be back.

"It's around 10 to 12 weeks," Maresca told reporters.

Meanwhile, Maresca also provided some good news about Chelsea's cornerstone Cole Palmer, who was ruled out of the England squad because of a groin injury, saying he is back in training and likely to feature in the Brentford clash.

"Cole took part in the session yesterday for the first time, not the entire session," the Italian coach said.

"We have one more session this afternoon and we are going to try with him to see if he's okay, otherwise he will be out tomorrow."

"When he is available, we need to manage him because of the amount of games."

Alejandro Gamacho, who joined Chelsea from Manchester United, has also yet to appear for the Blues as he has not played football this season.—Agency

All-rounder Ben Stokes was named captain, while former Proteas batter AB de Villiers was chosen as the wicketkeeper.

The Indian Premier League (IPL) franchise Punjab Kings has come under fire after releasing a promotional banner for the highly anticipated Pakistan-India clash at the 2025 Asia Cup.

The fixture, scheduled for Sunday at the iconic Dubai International Cricket Stadium, featured India's logo but conspicuously left out Pakistan's, while the accompanying hashtag mentioned only India.

This exclusion sparked widespread criticism from fans and cricket followers, who accused the franchise of being politically motivated and disrespectful towards Pakistan.

Some fans claimed there was "fear in even mentioning Pakistan" before the game,

while others argued, "Why accept defeat before the match? It's not like the game is against an invisible team, so why the fear?"

While a few fans claim that India's match is against John Cena, who uses the catchphrase 'You Can't See Me', a few went further, remarking that such moves only humiliate those behind them.

This is not the first time controversy has marred an India-Pakistan clash. Recently, during the second edition of the World Championship of Legends (WCL), India Champions refused to play Pakistan not only in the league-stage fixture but also in the semifinal, citing heightened tensions between the two nations.—Agency

Pakistan make triumphant Asia Cup 2025 start with thumping win over Oman

DUBAI: Mohammad Harris's maiden half-century, followed by a collective bowling effort, led Pakistan to a resounding 93-run victory over Oman in the fourth match of the ACC Men's T20 Asia Cup 2025 here at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium on Friday.

Chasing a 161-run target, Oman's batting unit could yield 67 runs before getting bowled out in 16.4 overs and thus suffered a gruelling defeat in their maiden Asia Cup appearance.

Middle-order batter Hamid Mirza waged a lone battle for Oman, scoring 27 off 23 deliveries with the help of three fours and a six.

Besides him, only opening batter Amir Kaleem (13) and number nine batter Shaheem Ashraf (10) could manage a few runs.

For Pakistan, Saim Ayub, Suftuyan Muqem and Fa-



heem Ashraf picked up two wickets each, while Shaheen Shah Afridi, Abrar Ahmed and Mohammad Nawaz chipped in with one scalp apiece.

Opting to bat first, Pakistan registered 160/7 in their allotted 20 overs despite the middle-order collapse.

Djokovic, who has won a record 24 Grand Slams, is still competitive at the top level, having reached the semi-finals of all four majors this year, and giving tough times to the new undisputed kings of tennis, Jannik Sinner and Carlos Alcaraz.

During an interview, Djokovic revealed his daily routine, which keeps him competitive and way ahead of most young players at the age of 38.

"The very moment I wake up is always a prayer," Djokovic said.

"It's always an expression of gratitude first of all for being alive and having



another chance to live that day."

"And then I would hydrate. I would take lukewarm water, lemon and salt. I would then take my hydration formula normally that I would want to hydrate myself with. Something more than just the water. Just to replenish the electrolytes, minerals - and get myself going."

"I like to have like fruits and smoothies, juice, or something to get some vitamin, multivitamin inside."

When he was asked about his favourite smoothie, the Serb added that mixed berries and dates are his favourite.

"Mixed berries, dates are my favourite. I love dates, dates all day! I would add some hemp seeds, different seeds and stuff like this. Superfoods, maca powder, spirulina - although not great tasting!" Djokovic added.

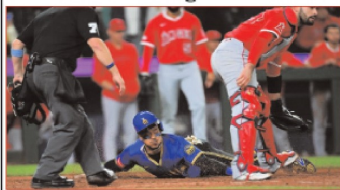
"I have a green powder blend where I have all these, like seaweeds, but they taste well because they're mixed with the other stuff, so I put a scoop of that in and I'm happy that it hides the horrible flavour."

Novak Djokovic then revealed his caffeine intake and hobbies other than tennis to keep himself active and fit.

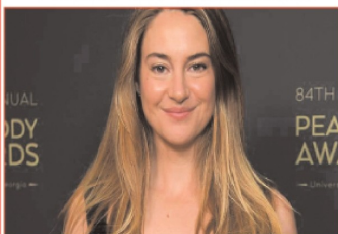
Onana joined United in a deal worth an initial 43.8 million (\$59.1m) from Inter Milan in 2023.

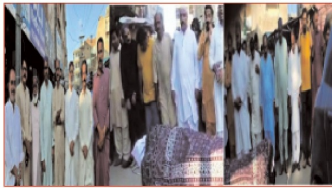

At UN, Pakistan Slams Israel's Aggression On Qatar Strikes As Part Of Broader Pattern

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Asim Iftikhar, on Friday assailed Israel's strike on Qatar, terming it a violation of international law and the UN Charter.

Speaking at the United Nations Security Council's (UNSC) emergency meeting on the Middle East, Iftikhar said the attack was not only an assault on a sovereign country but also a blow to international peace and security.

"This reckless and provocative attack constitutes a flagrant violation of the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Qatar, contrary to the fundamental principles of international law, including



the UN Charter," the envoy remarked.

Ambassador Iftikhar further added: "At a time when delicate negotiations on the Gaza peace deal were progressing towards a possible breakthrough, striking the territory of a principal mediator and those directly involved in negotiations is a

deliberate attempt to sabotage diplomacy, derail peace efforts, and prolong the suffering of civilians."

The UNSC condemned the strikes on Qatar's capital Doha but did not explicitly name Israel in its statement, which was supported by all 15 members, including the United States.

In his UNSC address, Iftikhar reaffirmed Pakistan's support for Qatar's mediation role in the Middle East and reiterated Islamabad's backing of a two-state solution. He said Israel's aggression undermined both regional stability and prospects for a just and lasting peace.

"This brazen and illegal assault is not an isolated incident, rather it is part of a broader and consistent pattern of aggression and violation of international law by Israel."

"Pakistan stands shoulder to shoulder with Qatar," he added, warning that violations of international law and peace must not be ignored. "It is evident, that Israel, the occupying power is bent

on doing everything to undermine and blow up every possibility of peace. Clearly, Israel's destructive policies are incompatible with the international community's quest for peace and stability. Sadly, it has been emboldened by the weak response, and inaction by this Council."

While speaking on the water dispute, Iftikhar also raised concerns over the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT), emphasising that water should never be used as a weapon. He underlined that the treaty, in place for more than six decades, remained Pakistan's lifeline and could not be suspended unilaterally by any party.—RT/Agency

UK Commits £3m In Flood Aid For Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: The United Kingdom on Friday announced £3 million in emergency aid to support Pakistan's relief efforts amid the ongoing floods in the country.

According to the Foreign Office, UK High Commissioner Jane Marriott met Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar and expressed the UK's solidarity with Pakistan in responding to the devastating impacts of the floods and the ongoing monsoon season.

She highlighted that the £3 million aid would support emergency relief and response efforts, with additional humanitarian assistance for recovery to follow in coordination with the Pakistan government and the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA).

The deputy prime minister appreciated the timely commitment and the UK's understanding of the scale of devastation and urgent needs, and conveyed gratitude for the UK's support in relief and



recovery efforts.

Both sides also discussed bilateral relations, the importance of high-level exchanges, and recent regional and international developments.

Meanwhile, the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) has issued a detailed report highlighting the devastating impact of floods across Punjab, with millions affected and relief operations underway.

According to the PDMA report, widespread flooding has affected 4,489 villages across Punjab, impacting more than 4.49 million people, according to the latest report from

The report stated that 672 villages along the Sutlej River and 1,482 along the Ravi River were inundated. Around 2.45 million people have been shifted to safe locations, while 396 relief camps, 490 medical camps, and 405 veterinary camps have been set up in affected districts.

The floods also forced the relocation of more than 1.9 million livestock. Meanwhile, Mangla Dam has reached 92% of its capacity, while Tarbela Dam is completely filled. On the Indian side, Bhakra Dam is 90% full, Pong 99%, and Thein 97%, the report added.—RT/Agency

Govt Approves Rs25.5bn Rescue Package For 11,000 Laid-Off Utility Stores Staff

ISLAMABAD: The government laid off all 11,406 employees of the Utility Stores Corporation effective September 1, offering over Rs25 billion severance package as part of a sweeping restructuring plan, official documents show.

The package covers the country's largest state-run retail chain's 5,229 regular employees (Rs13.18 billion set aside), 3,323 contract employees (Rs3.6 billion) and 2,854 daily wage workers (Rs2.71 billion). An additional Rs5.75 billion has been earmarked for organisational closure costs and support for widows of deceased employees.

Under the circular, permanent staff with two years or less remaining in service will receive gross pay for the remaining months. Employees with more than 20 years of service will receive two times their current basic pay for each completed year.

Those with fewer than 20 years may receive three current basic pays for each com-



pleted year or 1.25 times their running basic pay for remaining months of service — capped at 50 months — whichever is higher.

Contract employees will be paid as follows: running basic pay for each remaining month for staff with two or fewer years left; 30 running basic pay for employees with up to 16 years' service; and 35 running basic pay for those with more than 16 years. Daily wagers will receive a flat calculation based on a Rs37,000 benchmark. Rs37,000 for each remaining month for those with two or fewer years remaining; 15 × Rs37,000

(Rs555,000) for up to 10 years of service; 28 × Rs37,000 (Rs1,036,000) for those who had served for 10 to 15 years; and 30 × Rs37,000 (1,110,000) for those who had served USC for more than 15 years. The circular also instructs that pending salaries, wages and terminal dues admissible under USC service rules will be paid and that affected employees are being notified separately and will be helped to obtain NOCs from relevant departments so that the dues can be processed once federal funds are released.—RT/Agency

UN Endorses Declaration Backing Two-State Solution For Israel And Palestinians

US: The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) overwhelmingly voted to endorse a declaration outlining "tangible, timebound, and irreversible steps" towards a two-state solution between Israel and the Palestinians ahead of a meeting of world leaders.

The seven-page declaration is the result of an international conference at the UN in July — hosted by Saudi Arabia and France — on the decades-



long conflict. The United States and Israel boycotted the event.

A resolution endorsing the declaration received 142 votes in favour and 10 against, while 12 countries abstained.—RT/Agency

Govt Stands Firm On PTI Committee Resignations Strategy



ISLAMABAD: The government has finalised its strategy regarding the issue of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) members' resignations from the standing committees.

According to details surfaced on Friday, the decision of National Assembly Speaker Ayaz Sadiq not to accept the resignations of opposition members remained unchanged, and government members have been directed to ensure the quorum is met.

Standing committee meetings will continue as usual in the absence of PTI

members. The Speaker has issued instructions to the Assembly Secretariat in this regard. According to sources, in the absence of an opposition chairman, the convenor will chair the meetings.

Government members have been directed to ensure quorum for the committee meetings.

The Speaker said the work of standing committees will not be disrupted by the opposition's resignations. It is necessary for the committees to remain active for legislative work and parliamentary oversight.—RT/Agency

US Strategy Falters As India Tilt Strains Relations With Pakistan

US: The United States strategy of leaning on India over Pakistan has been faltered.

According to details surfaced on Friday, despite being backed by the US frequently, India failed to become the trustworthy partner of it. The US magazine has emphasised with the historical facts that India has never fulfilled the expectations of the US.

The magazine said that Pakistan can once again bridge the gap between China and the US. Moreover, the magazine said that India has purchased the defence system from Russia. India has invested in Iran despite the US sanctions. The US singled a nuclear deal with India by ignoring the priorities of the New Delhi.



According to the magazine, the US will have to re-define confidence in Pakistan. It has been said that showing confidence in India might put the region on the verge of further escalation.

Addressing the "Khatme-e-Nabuwat and Defence of Pakistan Conference," Fazlur Rehman said the Muslim Ummah is facing challenges on multiple fronts. He stressed the need for Muslim nations to unite under a joint defence agreement and proposed the creation of an Islamic bloc to collectively safeguard Islamic interests.



He urged Muslim rulers to use such a defense pact for the liberation of Battuliah, emphasizing that unity was the only way to counter global threats. Criticizing the two-state solution narrative,

Fazlur Rehman warned that Israel harbors ambitions of encroaching on the Haramain Sharifain, and therefore, Muslim nations must adopt a stronger and more united stance.—RT/Agency

Singapore Pledges \$50,000 Aid For Pakistan Flood Victims

ISLAMABAD: The Government of Singapore on Friday announced a contribution of \$50,000 in humanitarian assistance for the people of Pakistan affected by devastating floods.

According to a statement from Singapore's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the amount will serve as seed money to support the Singapore Red Cross (SRC)'s public fundraising efforts for the hu-



manitarian crisis caused by the floods in Pakistan.

The ministry said the Singapore government's contribution will supplement the SRC's own pledge of \$50,000 to support the immediate needs of affected

communities. It also conveyed its deepest condolences to the families of the flood victims.

In a statement, the Pakistan Embassy in Singapore said the contribution reflected Singapore's solidarity with the people of Pakistan during this difficult time and would support ongoing relief and recovery efforts to assist affected families and communities.—RT/Agency

Chahat Fateh Ali Khan Explodes At UK Restaurant Over 'Deceptive Egg Attack Video'

LONDON: Viral sensation Chahat Fateh Ali Khan has vowed legal action against a Blackburn restaurant after it released footage of him being egged—months after claiming no such video existed. The attack, carried out by masked men on June 19, left Chahat shaken and unwell for days. Furious over the



restaurant's denial and be-

lated Instagram post, the singer accused its management of staging the drama for publicity. "They lied to me and used my humiliation for views," he said. Chahat now plans to sue, warning he will "shut down their business" while receiving overwhelming support from Pakistani showbiz stars.—RT

Chinese Envoy Reaffirms Full Support For Pakistan's Flood Relief

BEIJING: Chinese Chargé d'Affaires Shi Yuanqiang has vowed to extend full support for the Pakistan's flood victims.

According to details, a Chinese delegation led by Yuanqiang has visited the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) at the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). The Chinese envoy has been briefed about the flood-relief operations conducted by the NDMA teams.

NDMA Chairman Lieutenant General Inam Haider Malik has apprised the Chinese envoy of the measures



taken to provide relief to people in the flood-hit areas. The Chinese envoy was also informed about the ongoing measures for rehabilitation of the flood victims.

The Chinese envoy has acknowledged the efforts of the NDMA for taking the timely and effective measures for combating the challenges posed by the natural calamities.—RT/Agency

Former CJ Karki Named Nepal's First Female Leader After Unrest

KATHMANDU: Sushila Karki, a former chief justice, will become the first woman to lead Nepal, to be sworn in as interim leader later on Friday after violent anti-graft protests forced Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli to resign, the president's office said.

President Ramchandra Paudel's office announced Karki's appointment following negotiations between Paudel, army chief Ashok Raj Sigdel and the protesters who led Nepal's worst upheaval in years.

Fifty-one people were killed and more than 1,300 injured this week in the anti-graft protests by the "Gen Z"



after Oli resigned on Tuesday.

Karki, 73, would take the oath of office at 9:15pm local time, said Archana Khadka Adhikari, information officer at the president's office.

Two other ministers would also be sworn in along with her, local TV channels reported.

The only woman to have served as chief justice, Karki was the preferred choice of the protesters who cite her reputation for honesty and integrity and a stance against corruption.

She held the top judicial post for about a year until mid-2017.—RT/Agency
