US Unleashes New Sanctions Blitz on Iran

WASHINGTON — The United States has announced a new wave of sanctions targeting individuals and entities allegedly involved in financing Iran's military operations. The U.S. Treasury Department revealed on Tuesday that the sanctions focus on networks that support the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) — Quds Force and Iran's Ministry of Defense and Armed Forces Logistics (MODAF). According to the Treasury, the targeted individuals and companies — some based in Hong Kong and the United Arab Emirates — have facilitated the transfer of funds generated from Iranian oil sales. These transactions, the U.S. claims, help fund Iran's military activities and violate existing sanctions.



The new sanctions are part of Washington's ongoing strategy to pressure Tehran over its military activities and nuclear ambitions. U.S. authorities say these financial networks enable Iran to continue its destabilizing actions in the Middle East and beyond, despite previous international restrictions. The action freezes any U.S.-based assets of the designated parties and generally bars American individuals and companies from doing business with them. The use of cryptocurrencies to move and obscure funds has become an increasing focus of U.S. sanctions enforcement in recent years, as digital currencies offer new ways to bypass traditional financial channels.

This latest move follows a broader pattern of sanctions the U.S. has imposed on Iran in response to what it sees as Tehran's continued threats to regional stability, including support for proxy militias and development of missile and nuclear programs. The Treasury did not specify the exact number of individuals or firms affected, but stressed that operations through front companies abroad pose a persistent challenge to sanctions enforcement. The involvement of financial entities in Hong Kong and the UAE underscores how Iran-linked networks operate transnationally to access global markets. The U.S. reiterated its commitment to disrupting these financial operations and warned that further measures could follow if Iran continues its current trajectory. —RT/Agency

Shehbaz and Qatar's Emir Forge Closer Strategic Ties

DOHA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Emir of Qatar Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad agreed to maintain close ties in view of the regional situation. The prime minister met with the Emir the other day and strongly condemned the Israeli attack on a residential area in Doha and expressed sorrow over the loss of lives.



Prime Minister Shehbaz once again described Pakistan-Qatar relations as historic and enduring, expressing the hope that ties between the two countries would grow even stronger in the future. He stated that Israeli aggression in the Middle

East must be halted immediately. In light of the Israeli aggression, unity among the Muslim Ummah is extremely important. He also appreciated the emergency summit of Arab and Islamic countries. Prime Minister Shehbaz said that Pakistan supports Qatar's call for an emergency session of the UN Security Council in light of the worsening situation in the Middle East.

The Emir of Qatar praised Prime Minister Shehbaz for attending the summit and thanked him

for visiting Doha on September 12 and expressing solidarity with Qatar. The Pakistani delegation included Defence Minister Khawaja Asif, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Information Minister Atta Tarar, and Adviser Tariq Fatemi. Earlier, Prime Minister Shehbaz, while addressing the Arab-Islamic Emergency Summit, stated that Israel has violated the sovereignty and security of our brotherly country Qatar. He emphasized that Israel must be held accountable for war crimes against humanity, and Pakistan stands in full solidarity with Qatar.

He further said that humanity is suffering in Gaza and Israel must be brought to justice for war crimes. He added that Pakistan supports the proposal to suspend Israel's membership in the United Nations and demands immediate and urgent humanitarian aid for the civilian population in Gaza. Additionally, Prime Minister Shehbaz met with Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi, King Abdullah II of Jordan, and Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, during which bilateral relations were discussed. —RT/Agency

Dar Roars: Pakistan Will Defend Sovereignty, World Must Stop Israel's Aggression

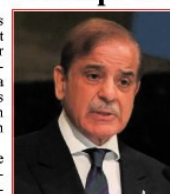


DOHA: Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar said that condemning Israel is not enough — the world must now stop Israel's actions. An unconditional ceasefire in Gaza must be ensured. Pakistan is a nuclear power; if its sovereignty is attacked, we will defend it at any cost, no matter which country is involved. In an interview with Qatar's Al Jazeera, Ishaq Dar said Pakistan strongly condemns the attacks on Qatar. There is no justification for Israel attacking a sovereign state; Israel attacking Qatar after Lebanon and Syria is unacceptable.

He said the OIC forum condemned the Israeli attacks in strong terms. Pakistan has always supported resolving disputes peacefully through dialogue. After the attack on Qatar, Pakistan joined Somalia in requesting an emergency meeting of the UN Security Council. As a friendly and brotherly country to Qatar, Pakistan played an active role. The Arab-Islamic emergency meeting in Doha is very important. Israel's attack on Qatar was completely unexpected; mere condemnation of the attacks is not enough — now we must adopt a clear course of action.

UNGA Showdown: Shehbaz Set to Meet Mercurial Trump on Sept 25

WASHINGTON: In what is being viewed as a significant diplomatic development for Pakistan, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif is likely to hold a meeting with United States President Donald Trump on September 25, sources said on Tuesday.



The insiders said that the meeting, expected on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly, will also be attended by Chief of Army Staff Field Marshal Asim Munir. The huddle — taking place with the consultation, support, and endorsement of Qatar and Saudi Arabia — will, according to sources, have a wide-ranging agenda from floods in Pakistan to the repercussions of the Israeli attack on Qatar. Pakistan-India situation is also likely to be discussed during the high-level meeting, the sources added.

Diplomatic sources told this correspondent that Riyadh and Doha are supporting this Shehbaz-Trump meeting. However, Pakistan's embassy has refrained from commenting or denying the possible meeting. The prospective development comes against the backdrop of improving diplomatic relations between Islamabad and Washington — especially following the armed conflict between Pakistan and India in May, which ended after President Donald Trump brokered a ceasefire between the two nuclear-armed neighbors.

It may be noted that Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar held a telephonic conversation on Sunday with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio wherein both dignitaries reaffirmed their resolve to bolster Pakistan-US ties and strengthen bilateral relations across multifaceted areas of cooperation. Dar had met Rubio back in July where the two sides discussed a broad range of issues, including bilateral ties, prospects for enhanced cooperation in trade, economy, investment, counter-terrorism, and regional peace. Soon after the meeting, the two countries announced reaching a trade agreement, which aimed at boosting bilateral trade, improving market access, attracting investment, and strengthening cooperation in areas of mutual interest. Under the agreement, there will be a reduction in tariffs, particularly on Pakistani exports to the US, and a fresh start in economic cooperation between the two countries, which also includes developing oil reserves. Earlier this month, Pakistan secured around \$500 million investment from the US in its critical minerals sector under a newly signed agreement with United States Strategic Metals (USSM). —RT/Agency

Pakistan, Iran Unite Muslim Ummah Against Israel's Brutality

DOHA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and President of Iran Dr. Masoud Pezeshkian expressed their solidarity and support for Qatar and called for unity among the ranks of the Ummah in the face of Israeli aggression.



The premier held a bilateral meeting with the Iranian president on the sidelines of the Emergency Arab-Islamic Summit convened in Doha and reiterated Pakistan's strongest condemnation of Israeli aggression against Qatar on September 9.

He said that the Doha Arab-Islamic Summit had sent a strong and unified message on behalf of the Muslim world that Israel's aggression could no longer be tolerated.

Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Muhammad

Ishaq Dar, Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir, Chief of Army Staff, Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaullah Tarar were also present in the meeting. Recalling the Iranian President's visit to Pakistan last month, the prime minister reaffirmed Pakistan's desire to enhance its bilateral relations with Iran across all areas of mutual interest. The ISPR further stated that during the clearance operation, five terrorists associated with the Indian proxy network "Firma al-Hindistan" were sent to hell. Search and sanitization operations are ongoing in the area to eliminate any remaining terrorists supported by India. The ISPR added that the great sacrifices of the martyrs further strengthen our resolve. The spokesperson for the Pakistan Army said the security forces, standing shoulder to shoulder with the entire nation, will continue their struggle until the country is completely rid of terrorism backed by India. —RT/Agency

While the assembled Arab and Muslim leaders were expressing solidarity with Qatar, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio met Netanyahu and gave strong backing for Israel's hardline stance, although Washington has expressed unease over the Qatar strike.

Speaking alongside Netanyahu in Israel, Rubio said the only way to end the war in Gaza would be for Hamas fighters to free all hostages and surrender. While the US wants a diplomatic end to the war, "we have to be prepared for the possibility that's not going to happen," he said.

Washington has said it was not warned in advance before Israel attacked Qatar, which houses the biggest US military base in the Middle East. President Don-

ald Trump said on Sunday that Israel had to be "very, very careful."

"They have to do something about Hamas, but Qatar has been a great ally to the United States," Trump said.

A separate statement by the Gulf Cooperation Council said Israel's "continuation of these aggressive policies undermines ... the future of existing understandings and agreements with Israel."

The summit's communiqué did call on countries to review diplomatic and economic ties with Israel, in what Arab League Assistant Secretary General Hossam Zaki said was an invitation to states that have relations with Israel to revise them.

President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi of Egypt, a US ally which signed a peace treaty with Israel in 1979, told the meeting Israel's actions "put obstacles in the way of any opportunities for new peace agreements and even aborts existing ones." —RT/Agency

UK Fighter Jets Rush to NATO Frontlines Over Poland

LONDON: UK fighter jets will join a NATO operation over Poland to help defend the alliance's eastern flank after Russian drones entered Polish airspace last week, the defence ministry said. "British fighter jets will fly air defence missions over Poland to counter aerial threats from Russia, including drones," the ministry said in a statement, adding the missions by RAF Typhoons would start "in the coming days."



NATO chief Mark Rutte said Friday the alliance would reinforce the defence of its eastern flank following a Russian drone raid into Polish airspace.

Poland and its NATO allies last week scrambled jets to shoot down Russian drones over allied airspace for the first time since the war in Ukraine started three-and-a-half years ago. And on Saturday, Romania became the latest NATO member state to report a drone incursion, as Poland also scrambled aircraft in response to fresh Russian drone strikes just over the border in Ukraine. "Russia's reckless behaviour is a direct threat to European security and a violation of international law," UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer said in a statement. He said the "aircraft are not just a show of strength, they are vital in deterring aggression" as well as securing NATO airspace and protecting the UK's national security. Allies, including France

and Germany, have already said they would send more fighter jets to Poland, while Ruffe said Denmark would also join the operation. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has warned that Russia is deliberately expanding its drone operations. The UK summoned the Russian ambassador to London, with the foreign ministry saying the "significant and unprecedented violation of Polish and NATO airspace by Russian drones ... was utterly unacceptable." —RT/Agency

The earthquake intensity measured 4.8 on the Richter scale, a spokesman of the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) said in its report.



"The epicentre of the earthquake was 126 kilometers' distance in the west of Multan at a depth of 55 kilometers," PDMA stated. Provincial administration engaged in scrutiny of damage to building structures. —RT/Agency

Official Report Denies Roof Collapses, Dam Breaks or Bridge Damage in Lahore Flood



LAHORE: The Lahore district administration has issued a comprehensive report on the recent floods, confirming that over 82,000 people and dozens of villages across the city's five tehsils were affected. According to the findings, 26 villages in City, Ravi, Allama Iqbal, Raiwind, and Wagah tehsils were impacted, with Ravi suffering the highest number of affected villages. In total, 82,952 people were directly affected by the flooding. Relief operations were carried out on a large scale, with 7,888 people provided transport to safe areas, while 36,658 individuals trapped in floodwaters were successfully evacuated. Fortunately, no deaths were reported, though three people sustained injuries. The damage to infrastructure remained minimal, with only one road affected, while no bridges, dams, or roofs were damaged. —RT/Agency

Once again the ICC has shamelessly let India blasphemize Cricket with its poisonous politics

Cricket, once called the gentleman's game, is being dragged through the mud by India's intoxication with hatred, petty politics, and ethnocentric arrogance. The shameful spectacle during the Asia Cup 2025 clash—where India's players refused to shake hands with Pakistan's team, allegedly at the behest of match referee Andy Pycroft—was not merely an unsporting act. It was a brazen assault on the very soul of cricket.

When even India's own Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann publicly ridicules the national team for its childish antics, it is clear this was no victory. Yes, Pakistan may have lost on the scoreboard, but in the eyes of the cricketing world,

India disgraced itself as the real loser. The refusal



to perform the simplest gesture of sportsmanship—the handshake—was a declaration of venom, not valor.

What is even more sickening is the International Cricket Council's (ICC) deafening silence and refusal to act. Instead of defending the game's traditions and penalizing those responsible, the ICC has once again bent to India's political weight. By rejecting Pakistan's rightful demand to remove

Pycroft, the ICC has proven itself complicit in letting India blasphemize cricket. The governing body has become nothing more than a spineless bystander, hiding behind bureaucracy while the game it is meant to safeguard is mutilated before millions.

This is not just about Pakistan versus India. This is about whether cricket still stands for integrity, respect, and brotherhood—or whether it has become a hostage to India's drunkenness on hate. If cricket's custodians refuse to act, the spirit of the game dies a little more with every ball bowled. The world must decide: do we allow India's venom to define cricket, or do we reclaim the gentleman's game from this pit of petty politics?

Sindh Civil Servants Stage Major Uprising Against Pension Cuts and Pay Reforms

HYDERABAD: Thousands of civil servants across Sindh, led by the Sindh Employees Alliance (SEA), have launched a major protest against recent government austerity policies, bringing government services across the province to a near standstill. The strike began in Hyderabad and quickly spread, paralyzing administrative and educational activities. The protesters demand the rollback of the new contributory pension scheme introduced under the Sindh Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2024, which replaces the traditional defined-benefit pension with a contributory model, significantly



reducing retirement security. Other demands include restoring old pension benefits slashed under austerity, reviving job quotas for families of deceased employees, continuing group insurance payments after retirement, and substantial salary and pension increases to match soaring inflation. Protesters criticized the government for imposing tough austerity

on employees while granting massive pay hikes to parliamentarians, calling it a glaring hypocrisy. Despite sporadic clashes with police, the protesters remain united and determined to continue until their demands are met, challenging the provincial government to negotiate or face prolonged disruption of public services.

HESCO Ramps Up Crackdown on Power Theft and Defaulters Across Sindh

HYDERABAD: Under the strict directives of HESCO Chief Executive Officer Faizullah Dahri, the Hyderabad Electric Supply Company (HESCO) has ramped up its crackdown on electricity theft and non-payment of dues across multiple districts in Sindh. With support from the DSU, recent operations were conducted in key sub-divisions including Shaheed Umeed Ali, Citizen Colony, Talhar, Nawabshah I & II, Khipiro, Mirpurkhas City, and Mirwah Gorchani, resulting in the disconnection of 225 illegal connections, seizure of 1,273 meters of PVC wires, and recovery of over Rs. 2.7



million in dues. Since the launch of the anti-theft campaign on January 19, 2025, HESCO has disconnected 23,197 illegal connections, arrested 650 culprits, cut 1,443 meters, removed over 158,000 meters of illegal wires, disconnected 684 transformers, and recovered more than Rs. 561.2 million. Subdivisions continue to make local announcements urging residents to clear dues or face strict legal action, including arrest. HESCO emphasized that electricity theft is a national crime and will no longer be tolerated. The company also urged consumers to participate in open courts, pay bills on time, and support efforts to improve service quality and eliminate theft entirely.

World Athletics Championship Unveils Javelin Throw Qualifying Groups



JAPAN: The groups for the javelin throw qualifying round at the World Athletics Championship have been announced, with Pakistan's Olympic gold medalist Arshad Nadeem and India's Neeraj Chopra placed in separate groups.

Arshad Nadeem will compete in Group B, with his qualifying round scheduled to start at 4:45 PM Pakistan Standard Time.

Group B also includes Indian athletes Rohit Yadav and Yashvir Singh, along with World No. 3 Anderson Peters, former world champion Julius Yego, and Luis Mauricio da Silva.

According to the qualification rules, any athlete throwing 84.50 meters or more will automatically advance to the final. Additionally, scheduled for the next day, the top 12 performers overall will also qualify.

Ahead of the event, Arshad Nadeem appealed to his fans for support, saying: "You all know I have come to Tokyo for the World Athletics Championship. Tomorrow, I will compete in the qualifying round. Pray for me that I perform well and qualify for the final."

In 2025, Julian Weber of Germany has recorded the season's longest throw at 91.51 meters.

While Neeraj Chopra has surpassed 90 meters, Nadeem's best this year is 86.40 meters, achieved in May — his only competition since the 2024 Paris Olympics.

For the unversed, the qualifying round will start on September 17, with the final, scheduled for the next day. —Agency

Doping Scandal Jeopardizes India's Olympic Dreams and Athletes' Futures



Indian sport is battling to shake off its reputation for being one of the world's worst doping offenders as the country pushes an ambitious bid to host the 2036 Olympics.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) has raised concerns about the number of Indian competitors taking performance-enhancing drugs and so too has the country's best-known athlete.

The 2021 Olympic javelin champion Neeraj Chopra made a blunt admission earlier this year.

"Doping is a big problem in India among our athletes," he told local media, saying they instead should "eat well, rest well and work hard".

The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) last month formed a new anti-doping panel after the IOC flagged India's poor record.

The government has passed a new national anti-doping bill aiming to tighten enforcement, expand testing facilities and "ensure the highest standards of integrity" in sports.

"Obviously the IOC would want to make sure that in awarding the Games to a country, the host has a robust doping policy and governance," Michael Payne, former IOC marketing director, told AFP.

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) lists India among the worst offenders among nations submitting more than 1,000 samples.

India's national anti-doping agency, NADA, insists the figures reflect more aggressive testing in the nation of 1.4 billion people.

From 5,606 samples collected in 2023, 213 came back positive.

The synthetic steroid stanozolol is the most widely used banned substance taken by Indian athletes, experts say. —Agency

Bangladesh Crush Afghanistan to Keep Super Four Hopes Alive

ABU DHABI: A disciplined bowling performance handed Bangladesh an eight-run victory over Afghanistan in the 9th match of the Asia Cup 2025 at the Sheikh Zayed Cricket Stadium in Abu Dhabi on Tuesday.

Set to chase 155, Afghanistan could score 140 before getting bowled out on the final delivery of the innings and thus succumbed to their first defeat in the eight-team tournament.

Experienced opener Rahmatullah Gurbaz remained the top-scorer with a cautious 35 off 31 deliveries, while all-rounders Azmatullah Omarzai (30) and Rashid Khan (20) made notable contributions down the order with brisk cameos.

Mustafizur Rahman led the bowling charge for Bangladesh with three wickets, while Rishad Hossain, Nasum Ahmed and Taskin Ahmed chipped in with two each.

Bangladesh captain Litton Das's decision to bat first bore fruit as his team's batting unit yielded 154/5 in the allotted 20 overs.

The Tigers got off to a flying start to their innings, with their opening pair of Tanvir and Saif Hassan putting together a brisk 63 before



respectively, until eventually falling victim to Noor Ahmad in the 13th over. He remained the top-scorer for Bangladesh with 52 off 31 deliveries, studded with four fours and three sixes.

Middle-order batter Hridoy took the reins of Bangladesh's innings following Tanvir's departure and scored a 20-ball 26 until eventually falling victim to Azmatullah Omarzai in the penultimate over.

Jaker Ali and Nurul Hasan then added valuable runs at the backend, scoring 12 not out each.

For Afghanistan, Noor and Rashid picked up two wickets each, while Omarzai made one scalp. —Agency

Hong Kong Captain Murtaza Proud of Batters Despite Sri Lanka Defeat



DUBAI: Hong Kong captain Yasim Murtaza lauded his team's batting unit for their grit against Sri Lanka in the eighth match of the ACC Men's T20 Asia Cup 2025 here at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium.

Put into bat first in the must-win fixture, Hong Kong accumulated a decent total of 149/4 in their 20 overs, courtesy of Nizakat Khan's unbeaten half-century and Anshay Rath's anchoring 48-run knock.

In response, Sri Lanka had to make hard yards to amass the modest target, losing six wickets in the process.

Murtaza stood out with the ball for Hong Kong, returning figures of 2/37 in his four overs, which caused a major stir in the defending champions' pursuit as they slipped from 119/2 to 127/6 in the span of two overs.

But

Hasaranga's counterattacking blitz steered Sri Lanka over the line after opening Patham Nissanka's 68-run knock, which laid a solid foundation.

Reflecting on the narrow defeat in their final Asia Cup 2025 match, Murtaza lauded the batting unit, especially opener Rath and veteran Nizakat, for stepping up against Sri Lanka, but rued that dropped catches cost them the game.

"I am really proud of the way the boys stood up today, especially in the batting. Nizakat and Anshay, their partnership was crucial. We missed a few chances, but in the end, the way the bowlers and batters (played), very proud of them," said Murtaza.

"We wanted 150-160, so to get what we wanted, we dropped a few catches and that cost us the game," he added. —Agency

Ricky Ponting Finally Breaks Silence on Viral India-Pakistan Handshake Row



Former Australian captain Ricky Ponting has broken his silence over a statement falsely attributed to him on social media regarding the no-handshake controversy during the India-Pakistan Asia Cup 2025 clash at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium on Sunday.

A fabricated comment, widely circulated online, suggested that Ponting had criticised India for avoiding a post-match handshake with Pakistan.

"This match will be remembered forever, India the big loser. Pakistan's gesture to shake hands despite defeat has immortalised them as true champions of the gentleman's game, while India remains the perpetual sore loser," the rumoured comment read.

However, the 50-year-old

clarified through social media platform 'X' that he had made no such remarks.

"I am aware of certain comments being attributed to me on social media. Please know that I categorically did not make those statements and indeed have made no public comment about the Asia Cup at all," Ponting wrote.

Meanwhile, on the field, India clinched the high-octane encounter by restricting Pakistan to 127-9 before chasing the target with seven wickets in hand inside 16 overs.

Suryakumar Yadav sealed the victory with a six, after which he and teammate Shivam Dube exchanged a hug and handshake before heading straight to the dressing room.

Notably, Indian players avoided any handshake with the opposition.

In contrast, Pakistan's players shook hands among themselves before returning to their dressing room.

The Pakistan team even waited for their opponents for the customary gesture, but the Indian players closed the dressing room gate instead.

The snub echoed an earlier incident during the toss, where neither Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha nor his Indian counterpart offered a handshake.

Following the match, Salman also skipped the post-match presentation ceremony. Pakistan coach Mike Hesson addressed the media, expressing disappointment over India's actions.

"Obviously, we were ready to shake hands at the end of the game. We were disappointed that our opposition didn't do that." —Agency

The Dodgers scored two runs to lead 3-1 in the fifth inning. Max Muncy hit a lead-off home run to start the inning, his 18th, and Betts delivered a second sacrifice fly.

The Phillies rallied in the seventh inning to go ahead 4-3 thanks to Bryson Stott, who drove in an RBI single and Weston Wilson, who hit a two-run homer, his fifth, both against Jake Dreyer. —Agency

Ton-up Kapp, Brits hand South Africa dominant victory over Pakistan



South Africa clinched a commanding win in the opening match of the women's ODI series on Tuesday as unbeaten centuries from Marizanne Kapp and Tazmin Brits guided them to an eight-wicket triumph over Pakistan at the Gaddafi Stadium.

Sidra Amin's resilient 121 not out could not prevent the defeat.

Set to chase 256, the Proteas women comfortably knocked the winning runs for the loss of just two wickets and 10 balls to spare, courtesy of a monumental 216-run partnership for the third wicket between centuries Kapp and Brits.

The visitors, however, had a contrasting start to the pursuit as Sadia Iqbal cleaned up their captain, Laura Wolvaardt (four), on the third delivery of the second over with just five

MADRID: A framework deal has been reached between China and the U.S. for the ownership of popular social video platform TikTok. U.S. Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said after weekend trade talks in Spain.

Bessent said in a press conference after the latest round of trade talks between the world's two largest economies concluded in Madrid that U.S. President Donald Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping would speak Friday to possibly finalize the deal. He said the objective was to switch to U.S. ownership from China's ByteDance.

"We are not going to talk about the commercial terms of the deal," Bessent said. "It's between two private parties. But the commercial terms have been agreed upon."



Li Chenggang, China's international trade representative, told reporters the sides have reached "basic framework consensus" to resolve TikTok-related issues in a cooperative way, reduce investment barriers and promote related economic and trade cooperation.

The meeting in Madrid is the fourth round of trade talks between U.S. and Chinese officials since Trump

launched a tariff war on Chinese goods in April. A fifth round of negotiations is likely to happen "in the coming weeks," Bessent said, with both governments planning for a possible summit between Trump and Xi later this year or early next year to solidify a trade agreement.

However, nothing has been confirmed, and analysts say possible trade bumps could delay the visit.—RT/Agency

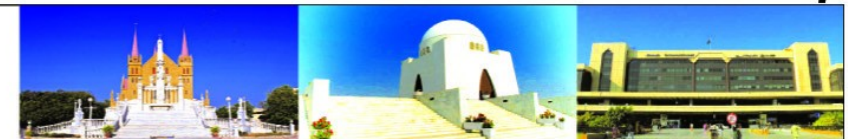
Water Line Bursts on University Road, Karachi Drowns in Traffic Chaos

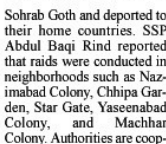

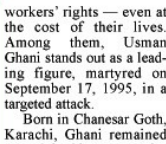

Born in Chanesar Goth, Karachi, Ghani remained rooted in his community throughout his life. He began his career at Muslim Commercial Bank (MCB) and became politically active through the Pakistan People's Party (PPP). His union involvement quickly elevated him to the role of President of the CBA Union and later, Deputy Secretary General of the Pakistan Banks Employees Federation, one of the most influential labor organizations from the 1970s to 1990s. Ghani's activism led to repeated arrests, beginning with a protest speech at MCB's head office. His final arrest came in 1991, when he helped form APSEWAC, a national alliance against privatization. Following a successful nationwide strike, he was detained for MCB's head office. The author was also arrested days later during a protest in Ghani's support. Both were imprisoned in Karachi Central Jail, only released after the Nawaz Sharif government privatized MCB. Usman Ghani's legacy remains a symbol of unwavering commitment to labor rights — a martyr in the true sense.

Trump Slaps \$15 Billion Defamation Suit on New York Times

US President Donald Trump sued the New York Times, four of its reporters, and publisher Penguin Random House for at least \$15 billion on claiming defamation and libel, and citing reputational damage, a Florida court filing showed.

Trump's suit cites a series of New York Times articles, one an editorial prior to the 2024 presidential election, which said he was unfit for office, and a 2024 book published by Penguin titled "Lucky Loser: How Donald Trump Squandered His Father's Fortune and Created the Illusion of Success".

"Defendants maliciously



published the Book and the Articles knowing that these publications were filled with repugnant distortions and fabrications about President Trump," according to the filing lodged on in the US District Court, Middle District Florida.

The New York Times and Penguin did not immediately respond to a request for comment outside regular business hours.

The publications have harmed Trump's business and personal reputation, thereby causing massive

economic damage to his brand value and significant damage to his future financial prospects, Trump's lawyers said in the filing.

"The harm to the value of TMTG (Trump Media and Technology Group) stock is one example of how the Defendants' defamation has injured President Trump," said his lawyers, citing "a precipitous decline in the stock price."

TMTG stock has been under pressure in recent months fueled by worries about the end of a so-called lock-up period related to its stock market debut in March.

The filing comes after

Trump threatened last week to sue the New York Times for its reporting on an allegedly sexually suggestive note and drawing given to Jeffrey Epstein.

Epstein, the disgraced financier and sex offender, died by suicide in a New York jail cell in 2019.

Trump has said he parted ways with Epstein before the financier's legal troubles became public in 2006.

"Today, I have the Great Honor of bringing a \$15 Billion Dollar Defamation and Libel Lawsuit against The New York Times," Trump said earlier in a post on his social media platform Truth Social.—RT/Agency

Tarar Slams India's Shameful Spillover of Hostility Into Sports

ISLAMABAD : Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Atta Tarar has said that India's irresponsible conduct has now extended to the sporting arena.

Information Minister Atta Tarar expressed these views during the launch of edited volume titled "Strategic Reckoning: Perspectives on Deterrence and Escalation Post-Pahalgam - May 2025" by the Institute of Regional Studies (IRS), Islamabad, in collaboration with the Center for Security Strategy and Policy Research (CSSPR).

Tarar said that after suffering defeats on the battlefield, India is resorting to petty tactics in sports.

He added that Pakistan has exposed India's false propaganda and given a befitting response to its unprovoked aggression. He noted that Pakistan's achievements during the four-day war forced India to seek a cease-



fire.

The minister emphasized that Pakistan has always played a constructive role in ensuring sustainable peace in the region. He said the Modi government and the Hindutva ideology have faced a humiliating defeat, while India, despite being an aggressor, is trying to portray itself as a victim.

Tarar further said that the truth about incidents such as Pahalgam has been revealed before the world, and Pakistan had even offered independent investigations. "Our fight against terrorism is not

only for ourselves but also to ensure global safety," he added.

He underlined that a country violating international principles cannot feign victimhood. Pakistan, he said, strongly believes in peaceful coexistence and has played a crucial role in regional peace and stability.

Atta Tarar reaffirmed Pakistan's unwavering political, moral, and diplomatic support for the people of Indian-occupied Kashmir, stressing that the Kashmir issue must be resolved in line with UN resolutions.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Joins Global Cry to Safeguard Sumud Flotilla After Attacks

ERMOUPOLIS: Pakistan has joined the global call for the security of the Global Sumud Flotilla, a civil society initiative in which citizens of several countries are participating, following attacks on the vessels of pro-Palestinian activists carrying humanitarian aid to Gaza.

The foreign ministers of Pakistan, Bangladesh, Brazil, Colombia, Indonesia, Ireland, Libya, Malaysia, Maldives, Mexico, Oman, Qatar, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain and Türkiye express their concern about the security of the aid flotilla.

Former senator Mushtaq Ahmed Khan, Swedish climate campaigner Greta Thunberg, and Hollywood actress Susan Sarandon are also among the pro-Palestinian activists in the aid flotilla aiming to break the Israeli siege on the enclave.

Jamaat-e-Islami's senior leader and former senator Mushtaq, speaking on programme "Capital Talk", said that Israeli drones were continuously flying over the maritime convoy travelling from Tunisia to



Gaza.

"In one drone strike, two vessels have already been damaged. However, we will not be intimidated and will certainly proceed to Gaza with relief supplies," he added.

Mushtaq demanded that the Pakistani government should establish a rescue and relief mission for Gaza.

Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said in a statement on Tuesday: "The Global Sumud Flotilla has

informed about its objective of delivering humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip, and raising awareness about the urgent humanitarian needs of the Palestinian people and the need to stop the war in Gaza."

It added: "Both objectives, peace and humanitarian aid delivery, together with the respect of international law, including humanitarian law, are shared by our governments."

Pakistan, along with 15 other countries, called on "everyone to refrain from any unlawful or violent act against the Flotilla, to respect international law and international humanitarian law."

"We recall that any violation of international law and human rights of the participants in the Flotilla, including attack against vessels in international waters or illegal detention, will lead to accountability," it concluded.—RT/Agency

UTAH: Robert Redford, iconic actor and Sundance Film Festival founder, died peacefully in his sleep at 89 in Utah. Zelenskyy Demands United European Air Shield as Russia Strikes Again

KYIV : Russian forces bombed the southern Ukrainian city of Zaporizhzhia with rockets overnight, wounding 13 people, including two children, officials said Tuesday, as President Volodymyr Zelenskyy urged European leaders to make the continent safe by building an ambitious air defense umbrella.

With the war grinding on since Russia's full-scale invasion of its neighbor more than 3½ years ago, there has been no let-up in Russian strikes on civilian areas of Ukraine and its army's push on the roughly 1,000-kilometer (620-mile) front line.

A peace settlement appears to be no closer despite months of U.S.-led



peace efforts. U.S. President Donald Trump's ultimatums and deadlines for Putin to engage with proposals to stop the fighting have passed without obvious consequences.

Just over the past two weeks, Zelenskyy said on Telegram, Russia has launched more than 3,500 drones, more than 2,500 powerful glide bombs and almost 200 missiles at targets inside Ukraine.—RT/Agency

Trump Shocks Europe with Russia Sanctions Ultimatum

BRUSSELS: US President Donald Trump has demanded that allies stop buying Russian oil before he moves on punishing Moscow, and told them to hit China with tariffs.

But Trump's requests do not seem feasible, and the EU notes that it has already hammered the Kremlin with sanctions. Meanwhile, diplomats fear it could be a ploy by Trump to again stall on taking a tough stance against Russia himself. In a Truth Social post over the weekend, Trump said he would impose "major sanctions" on Moscow if all NATO countries stopped buying Russian



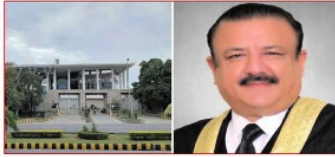
oil. The 27-nation EU has already banned most imports of Russian oil after the Kremlin's 2022 invasion of Ukraine, slashing the share of oil it imports from Russia from 29 percent in early 2021 to two percent by mid-2025. Currently Hungary and

Slovakia, both countries friendly to both Moscow and Trump, still buy oil from Russia. The EU is planning to end that entirely and has announced a plan to phase out purchases of all Russian oil and gas by the end of 2027.—RT/Agency

Justice Tariq Jahangiri Barred From Bench Over Fake Degree Scandal

ISLAMABAD : A major development has emerged in the alleged fake degree case of Justice Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri, as the Islamabad High Court has barred him from judicial work.

The Islamabad High Court ordered him to stop working until the decision of the Supreme Judicial Council. A two-member bench of the IHC issued the order against Justice Tariq Jahangiri. Chief Justice Sardar Sarfraz Dogar and Justice Azam Khan passed the order



and also appointed two judicial assistants in the alleged fake degree case. Senior lawyer Barrister Zafarullah Khan and former Attorney General Ashtar Asuf have been appointed as judicial as-

stants. The court also issued a notice to the Attorney General of Pakistan for assistance, seeking his input on the maintainability of the case, and released a written order.—RT/Agency

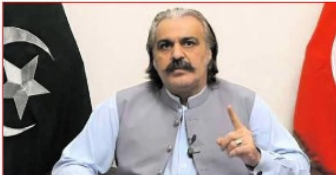
CM Gandapur Blasts PTI 'Hypocrites' for Sabotaging Party From Within

ISLAMABAD : Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur has dropped a bombshell, saying that "hypocrites" within Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) are busy weakening the party with their own agendas.

Speaking to the media at Dahlgat checkpoint, Gandapur claimed that no one has worked harder than him to secure PTI founder's release. "Not a single day passes when I don't try to get him out," he remarked.

He stressed that PTI's stance is crystal clear: "We follow the founder's vision, nothing else. Whoever spins a new narrative is on their own — not answerable to us."

On a question about social media, Gandapur clarified that the PTI founder's Twitter handle is managed only by those he personally authorized. Oth-



ers, he said, have no authority to speak for the party.

The KP CM blamed restrictions on meeting the founder for fueling confusion and unnecessary statements. He said the founder has always been willing to negotiate, but talks can only be held with those who truly hold power.

Gandapur further revealed that before the budget session, he had repeatedly requested a meeting with the PTI founder

but was barred due to internal party divisions. He warned that some individuals are pushing their own agenda: "I'm cautioning them — you are damaging the party."

He also rejected propaganda about Senate nominations, calling it baseless. "We've led some of the biggest marches and rallies in the country's history. On the 27th, we'll hold another massive rally in KP to get our message across.—RT/Agency

Rubio Presses Qatar to Keep Gaza Lifeline Alive Amid Israeli Onslaught

JERUSALEM/CAIRO: US Secretary of State Marco Rubio on Monday called on Qatar to continue to play a constructive role in resolving the Gaza conflict, speaking in Jerusalem on the same day that Arab leaders were meeting in Doha to respond to an Israeli strike.

Qatar, a US ally which has been co-mediating talks between Israel and the Palestinian group Hamas, was angered last week by Israel's attack on its capital, which targeted Hamas leaders who reside there.

Speaking alongside Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at his office in Jerusalem, Rubio said Qatar could help reach the goals of releasing all 48 hostages still held in Gaza, dismantling Hamas and building a better future for Gazans.

"And so we're going to continue to encourage Qatar to play a constructive role in that



regard," he said.

Netanyahu, who has not backed down an inch since the Doha strike drew widespread condemnation, said he did not rule out further strikes on Hamas leaders "wherever they are".

While diplomacy was unfolding in Jerusalem and Doha, Israeli forces were continuing their assault on Gaza City, where they killed at least 16 Palestinians in strikes on two homes and on a tent housing a displaced family, local health authorities said.

The army also hit and de-

stroyed a 16-floor building in the west of the city, believed to be the tallest in the Gaza Strip, about an hour after warning displaced families sheltering inside and nearby to leave. It said the building was being used to hide "terrorist infrastructure".

Rubio gave strong backing to Israel, which has grown increasingly isolated on the world stage because of widespread indignation at the enormous death toll in Gaza and the ongoing humanitarian and hunger crisis in the Palestinian enclave.—RT/Agency

IHC Orders Immediate Removal of PTA Chairman Hafeez Ur Rehman



ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday directed the removal of Major General (retd) Hafeez Ur Rehman from his position as the chairman of the Pakistan Telecommunications Authority (PTA).

Justice Babar Sattar issued a detailed 99-page judgement, declaring the appointment unlawful and instructing that a senior member of the authority be appointed on a temporary basis.

In his verdict, Justice Sattar stated that the appointment of the PTA chairman was "not legally valid". The court observed that the recruitment process "lacked integrity" and was tainted by "malafide in law". The judgement noted that all subsequent

steps taken by the federal government in filling the post of Member (Administration) through the contested advertisement held no legal effect.

The one-member bench said that an entire edifice of processes built on an "illegal foundation" must crumble upon such a basis. Consequently, the appointment of Hafeez Ur Rehman as chairman was deemed invalid.

During proceedings, the petitioner argued that under Section 3 of the Telecom Act, three member posts were created within the PTA, and the government had not authorised any additional position. The introduction of the post of Member (Administration), the petitioner said, was in breach of the PTA Appointment Rules.—RT/Agency

Taiwan Rolls Out Civil Defense Playbook Amid Soaring China Tensions

BANGKOK: Taiwan launched a new civil defense handbook Tuesday, providing a more user-friendly ramp highlighting the urgency of strengthening a civilian response in case of an invasion by China.

The handbook, issued by the All-out Defense Mobilization Agency, features checklists and questions to help residents plan for crises ranging from military invasion to natural disasters on the earthquake-prone island.

"Since the outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine war, we have felt that much more information needs to be added," said Shen Wei-chih, director of the All-out Defense Mobilization Agency. "Today's new edition of the National Defense Handbook is about how to enhance and raise public awareness of



crises, as well as strengthen the ability for self-defense."

Taiwan, a self-ruled island off the coast of China, is claimed by Beijing as part of its sovereign territory. In recent years, tensions between the two sides have risen sharply, as the governments have ceased official communications. While China has long made claims over Taiwan, it also has stepped up the number of Coast Guard patrols and the scope and scale of its military

exercises aimed at the island, such as large-scale exercises simulating a blockade. China's People's Liberation Army sends military planes and navy ships toward Taiwan on a daily basis. Between Monday and Tuesday, the PLA sent 24 fighter jets, drones and support aircraft towards the island, according to a statement from Taiwan's Ministry of National Defense, which counted 11 navy vessels and six other Chinese ships.—RT/Agency

Pakistan's Gaza Relief Consignment Reaches Egypt

CAIRO: On the special directives of Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif, Pakistan's National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in collaboration with Al-Khidmat Foundation dispatched another shipment under the latest batch of humanitarian and relief consignment for the brotherly people of Gaza Strip through Egypt on a special chartered aircraft from Pakistan carrying 100 tonnes of humani-



tarian and relief supplies landed at El-Arish International Airport. Officials from Embassy of Pakistan, Cairo received the relief consignment, and handed

over to Egyptian Red Crescent Society for onward dispatch to Palestinian citizens inside Gaza. Pakistan's embassy in Cairo said the government and people of Pakistan express profound gratitude to the leadership of Egypt under President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, and Egyptian Red Crescent Society for facilitation in delivering aid from the government and people of Pakistan for the Palestinian brethren.—RT/Agency
