US Unleashes New Sanctions Blitz on Iran

WASHINGTON — The United States has announced a new wave of sanctions targeting individuals and entities allegedly involved in financing Iran's military operations. The U.S. Treasury Department revealed on Tuesday that the sanctions focus on networks that support the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) — Quds Force and Iran's Ministry of Defense and Armed Forces Logistics (MODAF). According to the Treasury, the targeted individuals and companies—some based in Hong Kong and the United Arab Emirates—have facilitated the transfer of funds generated from Iranian oil sales. These transactions, the U.S. claims, help fund Iran's military activities and violate existing sanctions. "Iranian 'shadow banking' networks—like these—run by trusted illicit financial facilitators—abuse the international financial system and evade sanctions by laundering money through overseas front companies and cryptocurrency," the department said in a statement.



The new sanctions are part of Washington's ongoing strategy to pressure Tehran over its military activities and nuclear ambitions. U.S. authorities say these financial networks enable Iran to continue its destabilizing actions in the Middle East and beyond, despite previous international restrictions. The action freezes any U.S.-based assets of the designated parties and generally bars American individuals and companies from doing business with them. The use of cryptocurrencies to move and obscure funds has become an increasing focus of U.S. sanctions enforcement in recent years, as digital currencies offer new ways to bypass traditional financial channels. This latest move follows a broader pattern of

sanctions the U.S. has imposed on Iran in response to what it sees as Tehran's continued threats to regional stability, including support for proxy militias and development of missile and nuclear programs. The Treasury did not specify the exact number of individuals or firms affected, but stressed that operations through front companies abroad pose a persistent challenge to sanctions enforcement. The involvement of financial entities in Hong Kong and the UAE underscores how Iran-linked networks operate transnationally to access global markets. The U.S. reiterated its commitment to disrupting these financial operations and warned that further measures could follow if Iran continues its current trajectory.—RT/Agency

Shehbaz and Qatar's Emir Forge Closer Strategic Ties

DOHA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Emir of Qatar Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad agreed to maintain close ties in view of the regional situation. The prime minister met with the Emir the other day and strongly condemned the Israeli attack on a residential area in Doha and expressed sorrow over the loss of lives. Prime Minister Shehbaz once again described Pakistan-Qatar relations as historic and enduring, expressing the hope that ties between the two countries would grow even stronger in the future. He stated that Israeli aggression in the Middle



East must be halted immediately. In light of the Israeli aggression, unity among the Muslim Ummah is extremely important. He also appreciated the emergency summit of Arab and Islamic countries. Prime Minister She-

hbaz said that Pakistan supports Qatar's call for an emergency session of the UN Security Council in light of the worsening situation in the Middle East. The Emir of Qatar praised Prime Minister Shehbaz for attending the summit and thanked him

for visiting Doha on September 12 and expressing solidarity with Qatar. The Pakistani delegation included Defence Minister Khawaja Asif, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Information Minister Atta Tarar, and Adviser Tariq Fatemi. Earlier, Prime Minister Shehbaz, while addressing the Arab-Islamic Emergency Summit, stated that Israel has violated the sovereignty and security of our brotherly country Qatar. He emphasized that Israel must be held accountable for war crimes against humanity, and Pakistan stands in full soli-

darity with Qatar. He further said that humanity is suffering in Gaza and Israel must be brought to justice for war crimes. He added that Pakistan supports the proposal to suspend Israel's membership in the United Nations and demands immediate and urgent humanitarian aid for the civilian population in Gaza. Additionally, Prime Minister Shehbaz met with Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi, King Abdullah II of Jordan, and Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, during which bilateral relations were discussed.—RT/Agency

Pakistan, Iran Unite Muslim Ummah Against Israel's Brutality

DOHA : Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and President of Iran Dr. Masoud Pezeshkian expressed their solidarity and support for Qatar and called for unity among the ranks of the Ummah in the face of Israeli aggression.



The premier held a bilateral meeting with the Iranian president on the sidelines of the Emergency Arab-Islamic Summit convened in Doha and reiterated Pakistan's strongest condemnation of Israeli aggression against Qatar on September 9. He said that the Doha Arab-Islamic Summit had sent a strong and unified message on behalf of the Muslim world that Israel's aggression could no longer be tolerated. Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Muhammad

Ishaq Dar, Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir, Chief of Army Staff, Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaullah Tarar were also present in the meeting. Recalling the Iranian President's visit to Pakistan last month, the prime minister reaffirmed Pakistan's desire to enhance its bilateral relations with Iran across all areas of mutual interest. The prime minister conveyed his

warm regards and respects for Supreme Leader of Iran Ayatullah Ali Khamenei. President Pezeshkian appreciated Pakistan's strong position on the Palestine issue and expressed his desire to continue working closely with the prime minister to further strengthen Pakistan-Iran relations. The two leaders agreed to continue to remain in contact, in view of the rapidly evolving regional situation.—RT/Agency

Dar Roars: Pakistan Will Defend Sovereignty, World Must Stop Israel's Aggression



DOHA: Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar said that condemning Israel is not enough — the world must now stop Israel's actions. An unconditional ceasefire in Gaza must be ensured. Pakistan is a nuclear power; if its sovereignty is attacked, we will defend it at any cost, no matter which country is involved. In an interview with Qatar's Al Jazeera, Ishaq Dar said Pakistan strongly condemns the attacks on Qatar. There is no justification for Israel attacking a sovereign state; Israel attacking Qatar after Lebanon and Syria is unacceptable. He said the OIC forum condemned the Israeli attacks in strong terms. Pakistan has always supported resolving disputes peacefully through dialogue. After the attack on Qatar, Pakistan joined Somalia in requesting an emergency meeting of the UN Security Council. As a friendly and brotherly country to Qatar, Pakistan played an active role. The Arab-Islamic emergency meeting in Doha is very important. Israel's attack on Qatar was completely unexpected; mere condemnation of the attacks is not enough — now we must adopt a clear course of action. Ishaq Dar said the people of Gaza are facing extreme hardship; the time has come to ensure an unconditional ceasefire in Gaza. Israel's provocations show that it does not want any restraint. He added that Pakistan has always called for unity within the Muslim Ummah and believes negotiations are the best way to resolve issues. Seriousness is necessary for negotiations and dialogue to succeed.—RT/Agency

UNGA Showdown: Shehbaz Set to Meet Mercurial Trump on Sept 25

WASHINGTON: In what is being viewed as a significant diplomatic development for Pakistan, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif is likely to hold a meeting with United States President Donald Trump on September 25, sources said on Tuesday.



The insiders said that the meeting, expected on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly, will also be attended by Chief of Army Staff Field Marshal Asim Munir. The huddle — taking place with the consultation, support, and endorsement of Qatar and Saudi Arabia — will, according to sources, have a wide-ranging agenda from floods in Pakistan to the repercussions of the Israeli attack on Qatar. Pakistan-India situation is also likely to be discussed during the high-level meeting, the sources added. Diplomatic sources told this correspondent that Riyadh and Doha are supportive of this Shehbaz-Trump meeting. However, Pakistan's embassy has refrained from commenting or denying the prospective meeting. The development comes against the backdrop of improving diplomatic rela-

tions between Islamabad and Washington — especially following the armed conflict between Pakistan and India in May, which ended after President Donald Trump brokered a ceasefire between the two nuclear-armed neighbours. It may be noted that Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar held a telephonic conversation on Sunday with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio wherein both dignitaries reaffirmed their resolve to bolster Pakistan-US ties and strengthen bilateral relations across multifaceted areas of cooperation. Dar had met Rubio back in July where the two sides discussed a broad range of issues, including bilateral ties, prospects for enhanced cooperation in trade, economy, in-



vestment, counter-terrorism, and regional peace. Soon after the meeting, the two countries announced reaching a trade agreement, which aimed at boosting bilateral trade, improving market access, attracting investment, and strengthening cooperation in areas of mutual interest. Under the agreement, there will be a reduction in tariffs, particularly on Pakistani exports to the US, and a fresh start in economic cooperation between the two countries, which also includes developing oil reserves. Earlier this month, Pakistan secured around \$500 million investment from the US in its critical minerals sector under a newly signed agreement with United States Strategic Metals (USSM).—RT/Agency

Israel Vows to Hunt Hamas 'Anywhere' as Qatar Hosts Summit

DOHA/JERUSALEM: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said he did not rule out further strikes on Hamas leaders "wherever they are", as the heads of Arab and Islamic states held a summit to back Qatar after Israel's attack last week in the Gulf state.



The September 9 strike targeting leaders of the Palestinian group in Doha was a significant escalation of Israeli military action in a region shaken by conflict since the Hamas-led October 7, 2023, attacks that ignited the Gaza war. While the assembled Arab and Muslim leaders were expressing solidarity with Qatar, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio met Netanyahu and gave strong backing for Israel's hardline stance, although Washington has expressed unease over the Qatar strike. Speaking alongside Netanyahu in Israel, Rubio said the only way to end the war in Gaza would be for Hamas fighters to free all hostages and surrender. While the US wants a diplomatic end to the war, "we have to be prepared for the possibility that's not going to happen," he said. Washington has said it was not warned in advance before Israel attacked Qatar, which houses the biggest US military base in the Middle East. President Don-



ald Trump said on Sunday that Israel had to be "very, very careful". "They have to do something about Hamas, but Qatar has been a great ally to the United States," Trump said. QATAR DENOUNCES 'COWARDLY AND TREACHEROUS' STRIKE Hamas has said the Israeli strike killed five of its members, including a son of its exiled Gaza chief, but its leadership survived. Qatar says one of its security agents also died. Qatari Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani urged the summit to take "practical and decisive steps" in response to the "cowardly and treacherous" strike, saying it occurred as Hamas leaders were studying a US ceasefire proposal. The final communique of the summit, which brought together states including Iran, Turkey and Saudi Arabia, did not contain language that appeared in a draft seen by Reuters which said the Israeli attack and other "hostile acts" threaten coexistence and efforts to normalise ties in the region. A separate statement by the Gulf Cooperation Council said Israel's "continuation of these aggressive policies undermines ... the future of existing understandings and agreements with Israel". The summit's communiqué did call on countries to review diplomatic and economic ties with Israel, in what Arab League Assistant Secretary General Hossam Zaki said was an invitation to states that have relations with Israel to revise them. President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi of Egypt, a US ally which signed a peace treaty with Israel in 1979, told the meeting Israel's actions "put obstacles in the way of any opportunities for any new peace agreements and even aborts existing ones".—RT/Agency

UK Fighter Jets Rush to NATO Frontlines Over Poland

LONDON: UK fighter jets will join a NATO operation over Poland to help defend the alliance's eastern flank after Russian drones entered Polish airspace last week, the defence ministry said. "British fighter jets will fly air defence missions over Poland to counter aerial threats from Russia, including drones," the ministry said in a statement, adding the missions by RAF Typhoons would start "in the coming days".



NATO chief Mark Rutte said Friday the alliance would reinforce the defence of its eastern flank following a Russian drone raid into Polish airspace. Poland and its NATO allies last week scrambled jets to shoot down Russian drones over allied airspace for the first time since the war in Ukraine started three-and-a-half years ago. And on Saturday, Romania became the latest NATO

member state to report a drone incursion, as Poland also scrambled aircraft in response to several Russian drone strikes just over the border in Ukraine. "Russia's reckless behaviour is a direct threat to European security and a violation of international law," UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer said in a statement. He said the "aircraft are not just a show of strength, they are vital in deterring aggression" as well as securing NATO airspace and protecting the UK's national security. Allies, including France

and Germany, have already said they would send more fighter jets to Poland, while Rute said Denmark would also join the operation. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has warned that Russia is deliberately expanding its drone operations. The UK summoned the Russian ambassador to London, with the foreign ministry saying the "significant and unprecedented violation of Polish and NATO airspace by Russian drones ... was utterly unacceptable".—RT/Agency

Five Brave Soldiers Martyred in Kech IED Blast



RAWALPINDI: At least five brave soldiers, including a Captain, embraced martyrdom in an IED (Improvised Explosive Device) blast in Balochistan's Kech district while five terrorists of the Indian-backed group "Fitna al-Hindustan" were killed during clearance operation in the area. According to a press release issued by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), a vehicle of the security forces was targeted with an IED in the Sherbandi area of Kech district, Balochistan. As a result of the blast, five brave sons of the soil embraced martyrdom. The martyrs include Captain Waqar Ahmed, Naik Ismatullah, Lance

Naik Junaid Ahmed, Khan Muhammad, and Sepoy Muhammad Zahoor. The ISPR further stated that during the clearance operation, five terrorists associated with the Indian proxy network "Fitna al-Hindustan" were sent to hell. Search and sanitization operations are ongoing in the area to eliminate any remaining terrorists supported by India. The ISPR added that the great sacrifices of the martyrs further strengthen our resolve. The spokesperson for the Pakistan Army said the security forces, standing shoulder to shoulder with the entire nation, will continue their struggle until the country is completely rid of terrorism backed by India.—RT/Agency

Gunmen Storm Shikarpur School, Three Killed and One Injured in Bloody Attack

SHIKARPUR: Near Shikarpur, in the jurisdiction of Rustam Police Station, armed men attacked the Government High School in Borri village due to an ongoing dispute between the Jatoi and Mehr communities. During the attack, the school's headmaster, Nisar Arain, was physically assaulted, and an attempt was made to abduct him. Upon receiving information about the incident, villagers arrived at the scene, leading to an exchange of gunfire. As a result of the firing by the armed men, three individuals were killed: Abdul Razzaq Mahar from Borri Sethar village and Jameel Mahar from Thahirov Mahar village (both from the Mahar group), and Sobhat Gharani Jatoi from Jogi Jatoi village (from the Jatoi group). A student of the school, Faizan Sethar, was seriously injured. According to local residents, the armed



men from the Saad Khanani Jatoi group attacked the high school in Borri Sethar village, aiming to kidnap or kill clerk Niaz Mahar due to an old rivalry. This led to the gunfire exchange in which two members of the Mahar group and one from the Jatoi

Punjab Police Ramp Up Aggressive Anti-Drug Crackdown Across Province

GUJRANWALA: Under the "Drug Free Punjab" campaign, Punjab Police, led by Inspector General Dr Usman Anwar has conducted 73,850 raids across the province, including Gujranwala, targeting drug dealers' hideouts. So far, 45,298 suspects involved in drug trafficking have been arrested, and cases registered. Authorities seized massive quantities of narcotics, including 25,633 kg of hashish, 2,381 kg of heroin,



1,453 kg of opium, and over 612,000 liters of alcohol. In Lahore alone, 9,107 drug dealers were apprehended with substantial drug recoveries. IG Punjab has ordered an acceleration of special operations, emphasizing strict action against traffickers, especially near educational institutions and hostels, to ensure severe punishment for offenders and complete eradication of drug supply chains.

Massive Data Breach: 300,000 Hajj Applicants' Details Sold on Dark Web, Says PTA

Islamabad: Chairman Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), Major General (R) Hafeez-ur-Rehman, has revealed that the personal data of nearly 300,000 individuals who applied for Hajj has surfaced on the dark web.

Briefing the Senate Standing Committee on IT, chaired by Senator Palwasha Khan, the PTA chief disclosed that the breach was first reported in 2022. He

added that SIM data remains with telecom companies, and investigations into the matter were initiated at that time. "Even my own SIM data has been available on the dark web since 2022," he admitted.

During the meeting, government Senator Anwarul Khan raised concerns over external pressure, claiming that Pakistan is being discour-

aged from enacting comprehensive legislation to ensure data protection and security.

The disclosure has sparked alarm over the safety of citizens' personal information, particularly for sensitive categories such as Hajj applicants, highlighting the urgent need for robust data protection laws in the country.—RT/Agency

Academy Roof Collapse in Pindi Bhattian Claims 7 Lives, Including 5 Children

PINDI BHATTIAN: At least seven people, including five children, lost their lives and several others were injured when the roof of a private academy collapsed in Sukheke town near Pindi Bhattian on Saturday.

Rescue teams rushed to the scene immediately after the incident was reported and launched a search and rescue operation. Several individuals, including students, were trapped under the rubble. Seven bodies have been recovered so far.

The deceased include five children, while the injured have been shifted to a nearby hospital where they are receiving medical treatment.

Rescue efforts are still ongoing amid fears that more people may be trapped under the debris.

Earlier, at least four dead, seven other injured as roof collapsed in Gadoon area Swabi district.

According to 1122 rescue, the incident occurred in Sarkoi Banda area of Gadoon where the roof collapsed after torrential rain in Swabi.

The severely injured have been rushed to Bacha Khan Medical Complex Shah Mansoor, Swabi. 1122 rescue officials added.—RT/Agency

FBR to Hunt Down Social Media Show-Offs as Crackdown on Non-Filers Begins

Islamabad: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has decided to launch a crackdown on individuals flaunting wealth on social media without declaring their income in tax returns.

According to media reports, the tax authority has already compiled data of millions of citizens and, in the first phase, will audit around 100,000 wealthy individuals. Non-filers who spend lavishly on weddings—sometimes running into hundreds of thousands of dollars—will also be targeted.

The FBR will particularly scrutinize individuals showcasing luxury lifestyles, including \$20,000 designer outfits, mansions, expensive cars, and jewelry, without corresponding declarations in their income tax returns. Such individuals will be required to explain their sources of wealth.

Officials confirmed that last year's tax returns will be compared with this year's data, and in cases of discrepancies, strict action will be taken.—RT/Agency

According to officials, hunting has been prohib-

ited at key sites including Bashkar Lake, River Swat, and several other water bodies. The department stated that the ban aims to protect biodiversity and conserve waterfowl populations.

Strict action will be taken against those involved in illegal hunting, while licensed hunters will be permitted to hunt under

controlled limits. As per the department's rules, license holders are allowed to hunt no more than five ducks or other waterfowl per day.

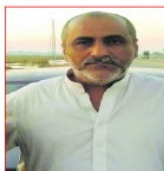
The Wildlife Department staff will closely monitor bird populations during the season to ensure compliance with the new regulations and safeguard the province's ecological balance.—RT/Agency

Man Lives Eight Years With Broken Knife Lodged in Chest

TANZANIA: A man noticed pus oozing from his chest, and it ended up revealing a knife blade in his thoracic cavity.

The patient: A 44-year-old man in Tanzania. The symptoms: For 10 days, pus oozed from an opening in the man's chest below his right nipple, prompting him to visit the emergency room. He told doctors he had no pain or difficulty breathing. He did not have a fever, and his vital signs were normal.

What happened next: When the doctors examined the man, they found that his rib cage on the right side of his chest was flattened at the front and that his chest did



not fully expand on that side when he inhaled. They confirmed that "foul-smelling" pus was leaking from a cavity under the nipple, they wrote in a report of the case.

During the examination, the man reported that eight years earlier he had been stabbed repeatedly in the chest, back, abdomen and face during a "violent alterca-

tion." No imaging tests were performed at that time, and he received only superficial first-aid treatment for the multiple knife wounds. For eight years, he had no health issues resulting from those injuries, he said.

The diagnosis: An X-ray revealed a large metallic knife blade lodged inside the man's thoracic cavity. Also known as the chest cavity, this hollow chamber is located above the abdomen and contains the heart and lungs. The blade, which extended from the rear of the rib cage to the front, had entered the man's back near his right scapula, or shoulder blade.—RT/Agency

Once again the ICC has shamelessly let India blasphemize Cricket with its poisonous politics

Cricket, once called the gentleman's game, is being dragged through the mud by India's intoxication with hatred, petty politics, and ethnocentric arrogance. The shameful spectacle during the Asia Cup 2025 clash—where India's players refused to shake hands with Pakistan's team, allegedly at the behest of match referee Andy Pycroft—was not merely an unsporting act. It was a brazen assault on the very soul of cricket.

When even India's own Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann publicly ridicules the national team for its childish antics, it is clear this was no victory. Yes, Pakistan may have lost on the scoreboard, but in the eyes of the cricketing world,

India disgraced itself as the real loser. The refusal



to perform the simplest gesture of sportsmanship—the handshake—was a declaration of venom, not valor.

This is not just about Pakistan versus India. This is about whether cricket still stands for integrity, respect, and brotherhood—or whether it has become a hostage to India's drunkenness on hate. If cricket's custodians refuse to act, the spirit of the game dies a little more with every ball bowled. The world must decide: do we allow India's venom to define cricket, or do we reclaim the gentleman's game from this pit of petty politics?

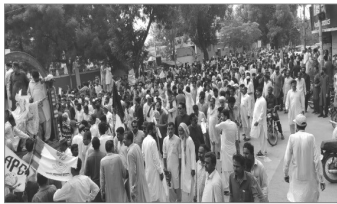

Taking to Instagram Stories, the Poosh and Lemme founder admitted she took the scissors into her own hands while battling COVID-19.

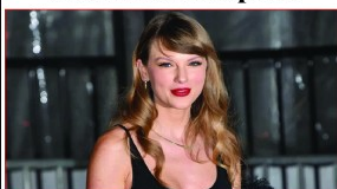
Sharing a photo of the hair drop on the floor, she wrote, "I always get the urge to cut my hair when I have COVID."

HYDERABAD: A prolonged dispute between the Sindh government and the National Highway Authority (NHA) over land payment for the M-9 Super Highway upgrade has escalated to the Sindh High Court. The Sindh government allotted land for the six-lane motorway project in

2012 on the condition that NHA pays for it, but the NHA has refused, citing funding shortages. The court has formed a high-level committee led by the Chief Secretary to resolve the matter within 30 days. The committee recommended that NHA pay the agreed price, prompting the NHA Chairman to initiate formal steps for land transfer. This resolution is critical to avoid delays in the final phase of the highway expansion, which is key to improving connectivity between Karachi and Hyderabad. However, concerns remain as the NHA continues to face financial and administrative challenges that could impact project progress.

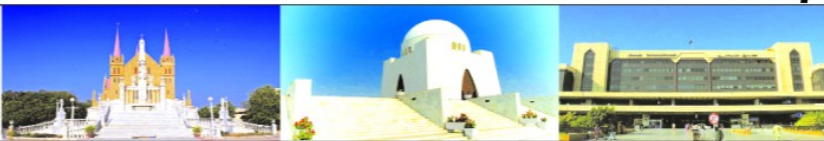

Fatima Bhutto warned that Israel's atrocities have altered the very nature of warfare, with systematic targeting of children that can only be described in religious terms. Chaos in Court: Mother and Litigants Attack Child Abuse Suspect in Qayyumabad

Karachi: Chaos broke out at the South Judicial Magistrate's court when the suspect accused of sexually assaulting minor girls in Qayyumabad was attacked by the mother of a victim and other litigants present in the courtroom.

The suspect's condition reportedly deteriorated due to the beating, prompting police to shift him to an undisclosed location for safety. Authorities confirmed that the accused remains in police custody on physical remand and is facing at least seven criminal cases.—RT/Agency

According to media reports, police had brought the suspect before the magistrate to record his confessional statement. However, the proceedings were briefly halted after the judge fell ill and the court announced a recess. During the break, the victim's mother launched an assault on the accused, joined by several litigants in the court premises.

Woman Dies as House Roof Collapses in Lyari Town

KARACHI: A tragic incident occurred in Lyari Town near Firdous Mosque when a portion of a house roof collapsed. According to Rescue 1122, the Urban Search and Rescue team, accompanied by an ambulance and disaster re-

sponse vehicle, rushed to the scene immediately after receiving the alert. The collapse claimed the life of a 33-year-old woman, identified as Sana, who died on the spot. Another woman sustained injuries and was provided with first aid at

the site before being shifted to a hospital for further treatment. Rescue officials confirmed that the affected area has now been cleared to ensure public safety. Authorities are investigating the cause of the structural failure.—RT/Agency

India Rattled as Trump's H-1B Visa Fee Hike Threatens Families

NEW DELHI: India said on Saturday that the Trump administration's move to increase US H-1B visa fees to \$100,000 per year was likely to have humanitarian consequences, warning of potential disruptions for families.

India was the largest beneficiary of the US H-1B skilled worker visas last year, accounting for 71% of approved applications. Companies will now have to pay the new \$100,000 per year fee, which is set to take effect from Saturday midnight. (0400 GMT on Sunday).

The move, announced on Friday, could further strain ties between India and the US, which hit their lowest



point in decades after President Donald Trump last month doubled tariffs on imports from India to as much as 50%, partly due to New Delhi's purchases of Russian oil.

"This measure is likely to have humanitarian consequences by way of the disruption caused for families. Government hopes that these disruptions can be addressed suitably by the US authorities," said Jaiswal, spokesperson for India's Foreign Ministry, said in a statement.

Under the current system, entering the lottery for the visa requires a small fee and, if approved, several thousand dollars — just a fraction of the new price.

Trump has embarked on a wide-ranging immigration crackdown since taking office, including moves to limit some forms of legal immigration. The step to reshape the H-1B visa programme, used heavily by the tech sector, represents his administration's effort to rework temporary employment visas.

Jaiswal said the full implications of the fee increase were being studied by "all concerned". He said both

United States and India benefited from skilled worker mobility and their contribution to innovation, wealth creation and economic growth.

"Policy makers will therefore assess recent steps taking into account mutual benefits, which include strong people-to-people ties between the two countries," he said.

The significant hike in visa application fee could dislodge the global operations of Indian technology services companies that deploy skilled professionals to the United States, India's IT industry body Nasscom said earlier in the day. —RT/Agency

Five IHC Judges Take CJ Dogar to Supreme Court in Historic Pushback

ISLAMABAD: Five judges of the Islamabad High Court (IHC) have approached the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan against an order, restraining Justice Tariq Mahmood Jahangiri from performing judicial work.

The five judges of the IHC included Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kiyani, Justice Tariq Mahmood Jahangiri, Justice Babar Sattar, Justice Saman Rifaat and Justice Ejaz Ishaq Khan, The News reported.

They arrived at the Supreme Court together through the main gate, usually used by ordinary citizens, and each of them completed biometric verification before submitting separate petitions.

Talking to reporters outside the court, Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kiyani said that rules prevented the judges from filing a joint petition.

Meanwhile, Justice Mohsin Akhtar filed the petition under Article 184(3) of the Constitution, making the IHC, through its registrar and its chief justice, as well as the Federation of Pakistan, through the secretary of the Ministry of Law and Justice, as respondents.

Justice Kiyani questioned whether the passing of an interim order against one of the petitioner judges, restraining him from performing the functions of a judge, is squarely violative of the Supreme Court judgements in Chief Justice of Pakistan Justice Ifthikhar Muhammad



Chaudhry vs. President of Pakistan (PLD 2010 SC 61) and in Malik Asad Ali and others vs. Federation of Pakistan.

Justice Kiyani prayed the apex court to declare that the administrative powers cannot be employed to undermine or trump the judicial powers of the judges of the high court.

It is the chief justice of a high court is not authorised to constitute benches or transfer cases once a bench of the high court is seized of the matter. —RT/Agency

Pentagon imposes new restrictions on media

WASHINGTON: The Pentagon has unveiled new restrictions on media covering the US military, requiring them to pledge not to disclose anything not formally authorised for publication and limiting their movements within the Department of War.

The new guidelines, laid out in a lengthy memo distributed, require them to sign an affidavit promising to comply — or risk losing their media credentials.

The move is the latest by the administration of President Donald Trump to control media coverage of his policies, and after he suggested that negative stories could be "illegal".

The Pentagon "remains committed to transparency to promote accountability and public trust," the memo says. But it adds: "Information must be approved for public release by an appropriate author[s]ing official before it is released, even if it is unclassified" — effectively barring material sourced to unnamed officials.

This new restriction would apply to both classified and "controlled unclassified information."

The memo also details sweeping new restrictions on where Pentagon reporters can actually go without official escorts within the military's vast headquarters just outside Washington.

"The press does not run the Pentagon — the people do," Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth wrote on X.

"The press is no longer allowed to roam the halls of a secure facility. Wear a badge and follow the rules — or go home." The new rules come months after Hegseth faced stark criticism for revealing timings of US air strikes on Yemen's Houthis in a Signal group chat that inadvertently included a reporter Hegseth —



former Fox News co-host and Army National Guard veteran — was also reported to have shared those details in a separate Signal group chat that included his wife.

A spokesperson for The New York Times — a frequent target of Trump's ire — called the new rules "yet another step in a concerning pattern of reducing access to what the US military is undertaking at taxpayer expense." National Press Club President Mike Balsamo hit out at the new rules and called on the Pentagon to quickly rescind them. "If the news about our military must first be approved by the government, then the public is no longer getting independent reporting," Balsamo said in a statement. —RT/Agency

Pope Leo Raises Alarm Over Troubling US Developments

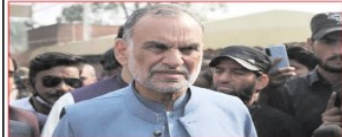


US: Vatican City: Catholic spiritual leader Pope Leo has expressed concern over certain developments taking place in the United States.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Muhammad Afzal Majoka conducted hearing on the petitions. The court is expected to announce its decision on September 27.

Senator Azam Swati, a senior member of PTI, is facing two cases under the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act (PECA), related to controversial tweets he allegedly posted on social media. —RT/Agency

Russia Pounds Ukraine with Drone & Missile Blitz, 3 Dead in Kyiv

RUSSIA: Russia launched a major drone and missile attack on Ukraine overnight, killing three people and injuring dozens, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said on Saturday.

In a statement on the Telegram app, Zelenskyy said Russia launched around 580 drones and 40 missiles targeting Ukraine's infrastructure, civilian manufacturing companies, and residential areas in different regions across the country.

"All night, Ukraine was under a massive attack by Russia," Zelenskyy said. "Every such strike is not a military necessity but a deliberate strategy by Russia to terrorise civilians and destroy our infrastructure."

In the central city of Dnipro, a missile with cluster munition hit a residential apartment building, Zelenskyy said.

One person was killed, and at least 26 people were injured in Dnipro, regional officials said.

They shared pictures on the Telegram app showing a damaged apartment building with a destroyed roof and smashed windows, people getting medical help, and rescuers working on the site.

Two people were killed in the Chernihiv region in the north and the Khmelnytskyi region in the west of the country, regional officials said.

Russia appears to have changed its tactics in its air attacks on Ukraine and now launches swarms of hundreds of drones in one strike, compared with dozens early in the war.

With air alerts lasting about 11 hours in some regions during the night, the Russian attacks were carried out in two waves, the military analysts said. Ukrainian air defence shot down 552 drones and 31 missiles, the air force said.

They shared pictures on the Telegram app showing a damaged apartment building with a destroyed roof and smashed windows, people getting medical help, and rescuers working on the site.

Two people were killed in the Chernihiv region in the north and the Khmelnytskyi region in the west of the country, regional officials said.

Russia appears to have changed its tactics in its air attacks on Ukraine and now launches swarms of hundreds of drones in one strike, compared with dozens early in the war.

With air alerts lasting about 11 hours in some regions during the night, the Russian attacks were carried out in two waves, the military analysts said. Ukrainian air defence shot down 552 drones and 31 missiles, the air force said.

Trump Says TikTok Talks Making Headway, Plans China Visit

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump hailed on Friday a call with Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping, claiming a deal to sell blockbuster app TikTok could be a "formality" and saying he would visit China, which gave a more cautious assessment of their talks.

The leaders of the world's two largest economies spoke by telephone for the second time since the return to the White House of Trump, who has tried to keep a lid on tensions despite his once virulent criticism of China.

The United States has forcefully sought to take TikTok, the social media platform hugely popular with young Americans that Trump has also used to garner support, out of Chinese hands.

Trump said that Xi "approved" the deal during the phone call, but later said: "We have to get it signed... I guess it could be a formality." China did not confirm any agreement.

"We're going to have a very, very tight control," Trump said. "There's tremendous value with Xi, and I'm a little prejudiced because I frankly did so well on it."

He also said that Xi promised to work with the United States on ending the war in Ukraine, where China is accused by Western nations of indirectly supporting Russia's invasion, even though Beijing says it is a neutral party.

Trump said earlier in a post on Truth Social that he and Xi "made progress on many very important issues" including TikTok.



He said he would meet Xi on the sidelines of an Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit in South Korea starting at the end of next month and that he would travel to China next year. Trump said Xi would also visit the United States at an unspecified time and that the two leaders would speak again by telephone. —RT/Agency

US army says 4 special ops troops presumed dead in Washington State helicopter crash

US: Four US Army special operations soldiers were presumed killed when their Black Hawk helicopter crashed this week during a routine training exercise in a remote area of Washington state near Joint Base Lewis-McChord, the Army.



The Sikorsky UH-60 Black Hawk went down at about 9pm PDT on Wednesday in rugged terrain near the base, located about 15 miles southeast of Tacoma, Washington, according to Jacqui Hill, spokesperson for the US Army Special Operations Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

No survivors were found among the four personnel who were aboard the aircraft, all members of the elite 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment, 4th Battalion, assigned to Lewis-McChord, she said.

Dubbed "Night Stalkers," this airborne unit is known for its expertise in conducting operations under the cover of darkness and for pioneering the Army's nighttime flying tactics.

"They were elite warriors who embodied our

highest values of the Army and the Army Special Operations, and their sacrifice will never be forgotten," Lieutenant General Jonathan Braga said of the four fallen soldiers in a statement. Hill said efforts to reach the accident site were complicated by the remote location, fire from the crash and thick vegetation, and that recovery operations were continuing. —RT/Agency

Russian Warplanes Violate Estonian Skies, NATO Put on Edge

RUSSIA: Three Russian military jets violated NATO member Estonia's airspace for 12 minutes in an "unprecedentedly brazen" incursion, its government said, the latest in a series of recent military actions by Russia that have rattled the alliance.

Russia's Defence Ministry denied its jets violated Estonian airspace, saying they flew over neutral waters.

With tensions already high because of the war in Ukraine, the incursion came just over a week after more

than 20 Russian drones entered Polish airspace on the night of September 9-10. That prompted NATO jets to down some of them and Western officials to say Russia was testing the alliance's readiness and resolve.

It also occurred three days after Russia and Belarus ended their "Zapad-2025" joint military exercises, which included the rehearsal of the launch of Russian nuclear weapons.

Tallinn said the three MiG-31 fighter jets entered Estonian airspace without permission and stayed for a total of 12 minutes before they were forced to withdraw, during which time the high-speed aircraft could have traversed broad swaths of the country.

"Russia has violated Estonian airspace four times already this year, which is unacceptable in itself, but today's violation, during which three fighter jets entered our airspace, is unprecedentedly brazen," Foreign Minister Margus Tsahkna said. —RT/Agency
