## Supreme Court Demands Lawmakers Fix Army Act To Protect Civilians' Appeal Rights

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court has ruled that while the Army Act provides formal due process protections, it remains constitutionally incomplete in its application to civilians due to the absence of an independent right of appeal in civilian courts.

In May 2025, the SC's constitutional bench gave its go-ahead for civilians to be tried in military courts. The apex court, in its short order, had delivered the verdict with a 5-2 majority. Justices Jamal Khan Mandokhail and Naem Akhtar Afghan dissented.

The case pertains to the military trials and the subsequent sentencing of civilians for their role in attacks on army installations during the riots that followed Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan's arrest on May 9, 2023.

In its detailed order issued on Monday, the apex court noted that the provisions of the Pakistan Army Act, 1952, were "not inherently unconstitutional," but underscored that the lack of a statutory



right of appeal to the High Courts required legislative intervention.

The court referred the matter to parliament, directing the government and lawmakers to enact suitable amendments in the Army Act and allied rules within 45 days.

It stressed that the amendments must establish an independent appellate forum for civilians convicted by Court Martial or Military Courts under offences specified in Section 2(1)(d)(i) and (ii), read with Section 59(4) of the Act.

The bench further observed that such institutional deference to parliament was necessary and expressed the

expectation that the legislature would accord due respect to its directions while safeguarding civilian rights in the military justice framework.

Citing international law, including Article 14 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), the court held that military tribunals are not inherently unconstitutional, provided they afford minimum guarantees of fairness, particularly an independent appellate process. The court rejected the argument that military courts violate Article 17(3) of the Constitution, which deals with separation of judiciary from executive.—RT/Agency

## PM Shehbaz Jets From London To New York For High-Stakes 80th UNGA Session

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday departed for New York from London to participate in the 80th session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA).

Premier Shehbaz — accompanied by Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, as well as other ministers and senior government officials — will lead Pakistan's delegation to the high-level segment of the UNGA, scheduled for today.

During his visit, the prime minister is scheduled to address the 80th session of the UN General Assembly. On the sidelines of the UNGA session, the prime minister is also expected to hold meetings with several world leaders.

In a statement issued earlier, the Foreign Office had



mentioned that PM Shehbaz will participate in a meeting of "select" Muslim leaders with US President Donald Trump on the sidelines of the UNGA session.

"The prime minister will also participate in a meeting of select Islamic leaders with US President Trump to exchange views on issues pertaining to regional and international peace and security,"

the FO said.

At UNGA, PM Shehbaz will urge the international community to resolve the situations of prolonged occupation and denial of the right to self-determination from Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK) and Palestine.

"He will draw the attention of the international community towards the grave crisis in Gaza, and call for decisive action to end the suffering of the Palestinians," the FO statement read.

The statement said that PM Shehbaz would also highlight Pakistan's perspective on the regional security situation, as well as other issues of international concern, including climate change, terrorism, Islamophobia, and sustainable development.

The premier will further attend several high-level events on the sidelines of the UNGA session, including important meetings of the UN Security Council, a high-level meeting of the Global Development Initiative (GDI), and a Special High-Level Event on Climate Action, among others, it added.

During the visit, the prime minister will have bilateral meetings on the sidelines with several world leaders and senior UN officials for an exchange of views on issues of mutual interest.

"He will also underline Pakistan's resolve to work with all UN member states to uphold the UN charter, prevent conflict, foster peace and promote global prosperity in Pakistan's current role as a member of the Security Council."

"The prime minister's participation in this biggest annual gathering of global leaders will showcase Pakistan's strong commitment to multilateralism and the United Nations and to highlight Pakistan's long-standing contribution towards the shared objectives of peace and development," it was further added.—RT/Agency

## Trump Declares Kirk A 'Martyr For Freedom' As Erika Forgives Husband's Killer

US: President Donald Trump hailed slain conservative activist Charlie Kirk as a "martyr for American freedom" on Sunday and vowed at his memorial service to carry on his work, while again accusing what he called the "radical left" for Kirk's murder.

"The violence comes largely from the left," Trump said without citing any evidence, in remarks that downplayed political violence from the right and often turned starkly partisan in contrast to the more solemn tone that most other speakers adopted.

Trump has been blaming the left for the deadly shooting before a suspect was even detained. His messaging reflected the dual nature of Kirk's memorial, which had the feel of a religious revival mixed with a "Make America Great Again" (MAGA) rally.

The memorial, organized by Kirk's conservative youth advocacy organization Turn-



ing Point USA, drew tens of thousands of mourners dressed in red, white and blue who filled State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Arizona.

Kirk's wife, Erika, who has taken the helm of Turning Point, delivered an emotional tribute to her late husband, looking up at the heavens and mouthing, "I love you," before speaking about his devotion to Christianity, his family and his activism. The Kirks have two young children.

"I want all of you to know, while Charlie died far

too early, he was also ready to die," she said. "He left this world without regrets. He did 100 percent of what he could every day."

She also offered forgiveness to the 22-year-old man who has been charged with Kirk's murder, citing the Bible's account that Jesus Christ urged his followers to forgive his tormentors while on the cross. "My husband Charlie wanted to save young men, just like the one who took his life," she said, before adding tearfully, as the crowd applauded solemnly.—RT/Agency

## Lebanon Says 5 Killed In Deadly Israeli Strike On South



Beirut: At least five people were killed by an Israeli drone strike on southern Lebanon on Sunday, including three children, the Lebanese health ministry said, with the president denouncing it as a "massacre".

The state-run National News Agency reported that the strike, near Bint Jbeil, had targeted a motorcycle. The Israeli military later said it had "struck and eliminated a Hezbollah terrorist in the Bint Jbeil area of southern Lebanon."

Israel launches frequent strikes inside Lebanon, saying it is targeting Hezbollah, despite a November ceasefire meant to end more than a year of hostilities between them.

Lebanese President Joseph Aoun condemned the strike as a "massacre" and called on the international community to press Israel to

respect the ceasefire.

"As we are in New York to discuss matters of peace and human rights, Israel continues its ongoing violations of international resolutions," Aoun said, according to a presidency statement on X.

He accused Israel of "committing a new massacre in Bint Jbeil, which claimed the lives of five martyrs, including three children."

The president was in New York to attend the United Nations General Assembly.

"We call on the international community, whose leaders are present in the halls of the United Nations, to exert every effort to stop violations of international resolutions," he added.

He further called on countries "to pressure Israel to withdraw from Lebanese territory and abide by" the ceasefire agreement.—RT/Agency

## KP Govt Slams Tirah Civilian Deaths—Rs10m Compensation Announced For Families

KP: The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government on Monday condemned the deaths of civilians during "operations against terrorists" in the province's Tirah area.

Earlier, a senior police officer in the area told AFP on condition of anonymity that "jets targeted four houses, which were completely destroyed." He, however, did not say who carried out the attack. The incident generated criticism from multiple quarters.

A statement issued by the Chief Minister's Secretariat said CM Ali Amin Gandapur met a delegation from the district following the incident with PTI MNA Iqbal Afzidi, the KP chief secretary, additional chief secretary (home), Peshawar commissioner and other officials also present in the meeting that reviewed the law and order situation in the "context of the unfortunate incident" that occurred in Tirah.

"Martyrdom of civilians in the incident is regrettable and condemnable. Martyrdom of civilians as a result of operations against terrorists is unacceptable," the statement quoted CM Gandapur as saying.

It added that regret was



expressed over the unfortunate incident in the meeting, and prayers were offered for the deceased as well.

The statement said the chief minister announced compensation of Rs10 million each for the families of the victims. The session also held a detailed consideration of an action plan to prevent such incidents in the future.

"In this regard, it was decided to hold a meeting of the jirga consisting of elected public representatives of the area, leaders of all political parties, and local elders with top military officials."

"The future course of action for peace and order in the area will be decided in the meeting of the jirga with military officials," the statement said, adding that an agreement was reached to adopt a strategy in Tirah to establish peace and order on

the model of Bajaur.

During the meeting, special emphasis was laid on the need to gain the trust of locals and residents for peace in the area, the statement said.

Earlier in the day, the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan said it was "deeply shocked" to hear about reports of the killing of several civilians caused by alleged "aerial bombing" in Tirah, and demanded a probe into the matter.

It demanded that "the authorities carry out an immediate and impartial inquiry into the incident and hold to account those responsible."

"The state is constitutionally bound to protect all civilians' right to life, which it has repeatedly failed to secure," the HRCP statement read.—RT/Agency

## Fitch Applauds Pakistan's Green Finance Framework—Globally Aligned!

Islamabad: Global credit rating agency Fitch has lauded Pakistan's Sustainable Financing Framework, calling it well-structured and in full alignment with international green and social financing principles. The development is being seen as a significant step forward in Pakistan's efforts to tackle climate change and promote inclusive development.

According to a statement issued by Fitch, the framework ensures that both environmental and social benefits are achieved under government-led initiatives. It will be utilized for issuing green and social bonds to support a wide range of sustainable development projects across the country.

Fitch highlighted that Pakistan's framework meets global benchmarks, making it eligible for attracting international climate financing and ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) investments. The green projects under the framework include renewable energy, energy efficiency, and eco-friendly transportation systems. On the social side,



projects will target affordable housing and essential infrastructure for underserved communities.

The agency further emphasized that climate change poses a major threat to Pakistan, underlining the urgency of action. Projects for the protection and restoration of the Indus Basin are also expected to be rolled out under this framework, aiming to preserve one of the country's most critical natural resources.

Moreover, the sustainable projects are expected to help Pakistan meet its Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement. These include a target to cut 15% of carbon emissions by 2023 uncondi-

tionally, with an additional 35% reduction subject to international financial support.

The recognition by Fitch is a boost to Pakistan's credibility in the global financial markets and could open doors to green and social investments from multilateral institutions and private investors alike.

Analysts suggest this may also enhance Pakistan's ability to secure concessional financing at a time when fiscal space remains constrained.

As Pakistan continues to face the dual challenges of economic recovery and climate resilience, the positive endorsement by Fitch marks a step in the right direction.—RT/Agency

## Ex-MNA Jamshed Dasti Jailed 7 Years In Explosive Fake Degree Scandal



MUZAFFARGARH: Former Member of the National Assembly Jamshed Dasti has been sentenced to seven years in prison in a fake degree case.

A district and sessions judge in Multan announced the verdict in the BA fake degree case. Dasti — who is also the chairman of Awami Raj Party — was handed a seven-year prison term under Articles 62 and 63 of the Constitution. In addition, he was convicted under Sections 420 (cheating) and 471 (using forged documents), among other offences, bringing his total sentence to 17 years. Out of this,

10 years are bailable.

The development comes two months after the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) disqualified Dasti over fake academic credentials. In its verdict, the ECP's three-member bench declared the seat vacant following the lawmaker's disqualification. "Dasti has made false statements and incorrect declaration, therefore he has also committed offence of corrupt practices defined under Section 167 and 173 of the Elections Act, 2017, punishable under Section 174 of the Elections Act, 2017.—RT/Agency

## Aleema Drops Bombshell: Imran Khan's Release Expected This Week

Lahore: Aleema Khan, the sister of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder and former Prime Minister Imran Khan, has claimed that Imran Khan is expected to be released from jail this week. Her statement has reignited political discussions across the country amid growing anticipation over potential developments in high-profile legal cases.

Speaking to the media outside the Lahore High Court, Aleema Khan expressed optimism regarding the legal proceedings involving her brother. She said, "Insha'Allah, Imran Khan will be released this week. We have full faith in the justice system, and we are hopeful that the truth will prevail."

Imran Khan has been behind bars since 2023, facing multiple legal challenges, including convictions in the Toshakhana and Cipher cases. His legal team has filed several appeals, some of which are currently under review in the Supreme Court and Islamabad High Court. Reports suggest that recent



developments in these cases could potentially lead to relief for the PTI founder.

Aleema Khan also criticized the current government, alleging that political victimization was used to suppress PTI leadership and its supporters. She praised PTI workers for their resilience and urged the judiciary to ensure justice is served without political interference.

Political analysts believe that if Imran Khan is released, it could significantly impact Pakistan's political landscape, especially amid growing dissatisfaction with the current coalition government. PTI leaders have already hinted at mass mobilization plans once Khan is

free, including nationwide rallies and legal campaigns for fresh elections.

Meanwhile, government officials have refrained from commenting on Aleema Khan's statement, saying that judicial matters are under the purview of the courts. However, security agencies are reportedly preparing for any large-scale public reaction in case of Imran Khan's release.

As legal proceedings continue, all eyes remain on Pakistan's courts this week. The nation waits to see whether Imran Khan's long-awaited release will finally materialize and what implications it may have on the already tense political environment.—RT/Agency

### Sindh Assembly PAC Slams Local Councils, Demands Strict Monthly OZT Fund Reports

KARACHI: The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of the Sindh Assembly has expressed no confidence in the performance of all local councils across Sindh, including Union Councils (UCs), Town and Municipal Committees, and Municipal Corporations. The committee has demanded monthly utilization reports of the OZT (Own Source Tax) funds from all local councils. PAC has also ordered submission of detailed accounts regarding the annual Rs. 168 billion

OZT funds allocated by the Sindh government to local councils. Chairman Nisar Khoro criticized that despite the hefty allocation, there is no clarity on how these funds are being spent, with local councils failing to utilize even 30% of the development budget.

The committee directed the Finance and Local Government departments to withhold OZT fund releases from councils that do not submit monthly utilization reports. PAC

also ordered inspections of local councils by regional directors of the Local Government Department and mandated computerization and biometric registration of local council employees. Additionally, PAC suspended the Chief Municipal Officer of Gambia Municipal Committee for failing to deposit Rs. 7 million in sales tax to the government treasury.—RT/Agency

### BHC Grants Bail to Tribal Leader Satakzai in Shocking Degari Honour Killing Case

QUETTA: The Balochistan High Court on Monday approved the bail plea of tribal leader Sardar Sherbaz Satakzai, who was arrested in the Degari honour killing case in which a couple was shot dead in the name of 'honour'.

Justice Iqbal Kasi of the BHC approved the bail plea and directed the accused to submit surety bonds of Rs500,000.

Satakzai had approached the high court following the rejection of his bail from the lower court.

The incident came to light after a video circulating on social media showed more than a dozen men gathered in a remote, mountainous desert area, with SUVs and pickup trucks parked nearby.

The woman was ordered to stand facing away from the group before a man pulled out a gun and shot her in the back. He then turned the weapon on a man and shot him dead.

The woman was shot seven times and the man nine times, according to police surgeon Dr. Ayesha.—RT/Agency

"How can terrorism clauses be invoked in a case where a man killed his wife?" he contended.

However, Punjab Prosecutor Mirza Abid Majeed maintained that the convict

had murdered his wife inside the Gujrat Family Court. This act alone was performed to spread fear and panic in a packed courtroom.

"There are multiple precedents on the application of terrorism charges," he said.

Justice Athar Minallah, heading the three-member bench, observed that a woman seeking justice was killed inside the court itself.

"Murdering a woman who came to court for justice constitutes terrorism.—RT/Agency

## Supreme Court's Landmark Verdict: Respect It, Implement It, Own It

The Supreme Court's latest ruling on military trial convicts' right to appeal is nothing short of historic—a moment of clarity in a fog of constitutional uncertainty. By directing the government to legislate within 45 days, the apex court has drawn a clear red line: no justice system is complete without an independent and credible avenue of appeal.

For decades, the debate on military trials has divided Pakistan, raising questions about fairness, transparency, and due process. This landmark verdict does not abolish military courts, but it strengthens the constitutional principle enshrined in Article 10-A—the right to a fair trial. By ensuring appeals can now be heard in civilian high courts, the judiciary

has balanced national security with fundamental



rights. This balance is the cornerstone of any democratic order.

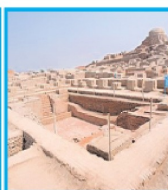
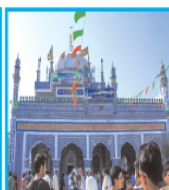
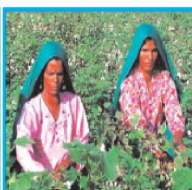
The government, parliament, military establishment, and legal fraternity must now act with responsibility and urgency. What is at stake is not only the fate of those tried under military law but also the integrity of the justice system itself.

It is time to put the culture of defiance aside. The verdict must be respected, the legislation enacted, and justice made visibly accessible. Pakistan has waited too long—judicial closure is now the need of the hour.

The team conducted a successful raid near New Cafe Imran and apprehended the suspect Abdul Malik Korai. During initial interrogation, the suspect confessed to the crime.

Torres, who replaced Robert Lewandowski in Flick's rotation policy, put Barcelona ahead in the 15th minute after he was set up by Olmo.

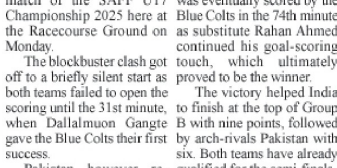
The Spanish forward scored his second to put Barcelona 2-0 ahead in the 34th minute, capitalising on an assist by Raphinha.

Pakistan, however, responded 10 minutes later as Muhammad Abdullah successfully converted the penalty, lifting his side tied at 1-1 with India heading into their first two matches.

India pulled ahead in the 64th minute through Gunleiba Wangkheirakpam, only for Pakistan to equalise seven minutes later, thanks to

Hamza Yasin. Pakistan and India then made several attempts to score the tie-breaker and it was eventually scored by the Blue Colts in the 74th minute as substitute Rahan Ahmed continued his goal-scoring touch, which ultimately proved to be the winner.

The victory helped India to finish at the top of Group B with nine points, followed by arch-rivals Pakistan with six. Both teams have already qualified for the semi-finals.

## Election Duty Revolt Looms as Govt Employees Threaten Strike at Bilawal House

TANDO ALLAHYAR: Employees under the banner of the Sindh Employees Alliance have issued a stern warning: if the central leadership directs them to boycott duties for the upcoming local government by-elections, they will comply and fully boycott election duties on September 24.



According to Abdul Razaq Shah, President of the P.T. Alpha Taluqa chapter, and Fareed Laghari, a leader of the Clerks Association, along with representatives of other departments, all government departments across Sindh will participate in the boycott if instructed.

The employees' protest continues over unresolved issues including pension rights, DRA allowance, and other legitimate demands. A province-wide strike has been announced from September 23 to 27, and if their demands remain unmet, a massive sit-in will be held outside Bilawal House on

October 6, with participation from hundreds of thousands of government workers from various departments. The leaders urged the Sindh government to immediately accept their legitimate demands or prepare for an intensified protest movement.

Following that incident, on July 7, the then DG SBCA, Muhammad Ishaq Khuuro, was suspended, and Grade-20 officer Shah Mir Khan Bhutto was appointed in his place.

However, within a short span, the Sindh government has once again changed the top leadership of the building authority, reflecting ongoing concerns about administrative efficiency and accountability within the SBCA. Authorities hope the new appointment will bring stricter monitoring and prevent further tragedies. —RT

## Justice Zafar Ahmed Rajput Sounds Alarm on Corruption Plaguing Health Sector

KARACHI: Acting Chief Justice of the Sindh High Court, Justice Zafar Ahmed Rajput, has cautioned that Pakistan's health sector must not fall prey to commercialization and corruption, warning that years of malpractice in medicine have become alarming. Addressing the 5th Health Care Summit 2025 and Awards Ceremony organized by the Consumers Association of Pakistan (CAP), he said the government must focus on justice, health, and education rather than only political demands.

Justice Rajput highlighted unethical practices in the pharmaceutical industry, in-



cluding incentives offered to CAP doctors for prescribing certain drugs, which he termed "bribery that must stop." He also stressed the need to regulate medicine registrations, noting that Pakistan has far more registered medicines than the WHO list.

Chairman of the CAP, Dr. Mirza Ikhthiar Baig, Khalid Tawab, Dr. Abdul Bari Khan, and other dignitaries also addressed the event, calling for action against quackery, exploitative hospitals, and rising drug prices. —RT

## PIA in Turmoil as 13 Flights Axed, Dozens More Face Long Delays

KARACHI: Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has cancelled at least 13 flights due to operational and administrative problems, media reports said on Monday. Six flights from Karachi were cancelled after one aircraft developed technical faults,

while two Karachi-Dubai flights were also scrapped. In addition, flights from Lahore to Dubai and Islamabad to Abu Dhabi were cancelled.

According to the flight schedule, three flights from Peshawar to Dubai and Abu Dhabi were also

called off. Meanwhile, several flights experienced significant delays: four flights from Karachi and 16 from Islamabad were delayed between one and 12 hours, while the Islamabad-Kuala Lumpur service was delayed by nearly 12 hours. —RT/Agency

## Music Teachers' Protest Shakes Karachi, Police Seal Off Red Zone

KARACHI: Members of the All Sindh Test Pass Music Teachers Action Committee staged a protest demonstration near the Karachi Press Club on Monday, demanding the acceptance of their pending demands. The protest, held on September 22, saw dozens of teachers raising slogans for job regularization,

timely promotions, and the release of long-delayed salaries.

## PM Shehbaz Orders Bold Roadmap To Supercharge Trade & Investment

LONDON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday directed authorities to develop a comprehensive roadmap and a reform agenda with practical projects to promote investment and trade in all key sectors.

Chairing a high-level meeting on enhancing investment volume, economic and trade activities in Pakistan, the premier emphasised that agriculture, IT, minerals, tourism, and renewable energy were important sectors that could attract foreign investment.

Along with investment, he said, promoting trade was also part of the government's policy to significantly increase exports of the country.

PM Shehbaz said that targets had been given to the ministries to utilise all available resources to ensure the timely completion of all on-



going projects.

He also instructed all ministers to identify feasible projects and take immediate steps to put them into practice.

For this purpose, he said a roadmap and a reform agenda should be devised with the future in mind, so that progress toward our goals can be made in an organised manner.

The prime minister emphasised that the private sec-

tor will play a pivotal role in the economic roadmap and its participation will be ensured.

"Our ongoing economic and financial reform policies have given a new direction to the economy, and due to the innovation and transparency, the country is now on the path of development," he added.

The meeting, held via Zoom from London, was attended by Federal Minister

for Environment Musadik Malik, Federal Minister for Petroleum Ali Pervaz Malik, Federal Minister for Finance Muhammad Jehanzeb, Federal Minister for Commerce Jam Kamal, Federal Minister for Information Attaulah Tarar, and Federal Minister for Economic Affairs Ahmad Khan Cheema.

The premier's remarks come as he reached the UK after signing a historic mutual defence pact with Saudi Arabia.

The PM is now set to lead Pakistan's delegation at the 80th Session of the United Nations General Assembly, set to commence on Monday (today).

During his time in the US, the PM, as per the Foreign Office, will participate in a meeting of select Islamic leaders with US President Trump to exchange

views on issues pertaining to regional and international peace and security.

Meanwhile, at the UNGA, the premier will urge the international community to resolve the situation of prolonged occupation and denial of the right to self-determination to the people in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK) and Palestine.

Apart from holding bilateral meetings on the UNGA sidelines with several world leaders, he will also attend multiple high-level events, including important meetings of the UN Security Council, a high-level meeting of the Global Development Initiative (GDI), and a Special High-Level Event on Climate Action, among others.—RT/Agency

## At UN, Pakistan Demands Urgent Action To Free Women & Girls From Poverty

NEW YORK: Pakistan has urged the international community to take urgent steps to ensure that women and girls everywhere live free from poverty and violence, with equal opportunities to contribute to inclusive development.

Addressing the UN General Assembly in New York on the 30th anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar said on Monday that the commemoration was a call to renew the historic pledges made in Beijing three decades ago with bold and measurable action.

Dar highlighted Pakistan's progress on gender equality, pointing out that women hold senior roles in politics, the judiciary, civil service, law enforcement, and the armed forces.

He noted Pakistan's record of electing the first female prime minister in the Muslim world and the recent election of the first woman chief minister of Punjab,



Maryam Nawaz.

He further cited measures such as gender-based violence courts, women's police stations, commissions on the status of women, and progressive laws against violence and discrimination.

Social programmes, including the Benazir Income Support Programme and the Prime Minister's Youth Programme, were credited with enabling women to access finance, escape poverty, and build entrepreneurial ventures.

While acknowledging advances, the deputy prime minister stressed that progress across the world re-

mained uneven.

He called for scaled-up financing through national budgets, international cooperation, and innovative partnerships to translate commitments into meaningful change.

Reaffirming Pakistan's commitment to women's rights, Dar described the Beijing Declaration as the boldest global compact for gender equality.

He urged the international community to act with urgency and solidarity to secure a future where every woman and girl lives with dignity and equal opportunity.—RT/Agency

## Global Momentum Builds: World Summit To Push Two-State Solution For Palestine

France and Saudi Arabia will convene dozens of world leaders on Monday to rally support for a two-state solution, with several of them expected to formally recognise a Palestinian state - a move that could draw harsh Israeli and U.S. responses.

Israel and the United States will boycott the summit, said Israel's U.N. Ambassador Danny Danon, describing the event as a "circus." "We don't think it's helpful. We think it's actually rewarding terrorism," he told reporters on Thursday.

Israel is considering annexing part of the occupied West Bank as a possible response as well as specific bilateral measures against Paris, Israeli officials have said.

The U.S. administration has also warned of possible consequences for those who take measures against Israel, including against France, whose president, Emmanuel



Macron, is hosting the New York summit.

The summit, ahead of this week's United Nations General Assembly, follows Israel's launch of a long-threatened ground assault on Gaza City and amid few prospects for a ceasefire two years after Palestinian Islamist militants Hamas attacked Israel, triggering the war in the Palestinian enclave.

Amid Israel's intensified Gaza offensive and escalating violence by Israeli settlers in the West Bank, there is a growing sense of urgency

to act now before the idea of a two-state solution vanishes forever.

The General Assembly endorsed a seven-page declaration, opens new tab this month outlining "tangible, timebound, and irreversible steps" towards a two-state solution, while also condemning Hamas and calling it to surrender and disarm. Those efforts drew immediate rebukes from Israel and the United States, calling them harmful and a publicity stunt.—RT/Agency

## US Dismisses Allies' Recognition Of Palestine As 'Performative' Gesture

US: The US has described the recognition of a Palestinian state by several key allies, including Britain, Australia, and Canada, as "performative."

"Our focus remains on serious diplomacy, not performative gestures. Our priorities are clear: the release of the hostages, the security of Israel, and peace and prosperity for the entire region," a US State Department spokesperson said on Sunday on condition of anonymity, placing blame on Hamas.

The move followed a historic shift earlier in the day, when the United Kingdom, Canada, Australia, and Portugal formally recognised Palestine.

"In the face of the growing horror in the Middle East, we are acting to keep alive the possibility of peace and the two-state solution," British Prime Minister Keir Starmer said.

Canadian Prime Minister



Mark Carney proposed a partnership to create "a promise of a peaceful future for both the State of Palestine and the State of Israel."

More countries are expected to recognise Palestine at this year's UNGA, including France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Malta, Andorra, and San Marino, isolating Israel and, by extension, the United States.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu stated that Israel's response will be announced when he returns from the United States, where he is scheduled to meet President Donald Trump.—RT/Agency

## Crackdown Escalates—Non-Bailable Warrants Issued For Imaan Mazari, Hadi Ali



ISLAMABAD: An Islamabad court has issued non-bailable arrest warrants for Advocate Iman Mazari and Advocate Abdul Hadi Ali Chattha in the controversial tweet case involving state and national security institutions.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Muhammad Afzal Majuka heard the case. During the hearing, the court directed that both accused be arrested and produced before it on September 24.

Lawyers representing Mazari and Chattha filed petitions seeking cancellation of the arrest warrants. However, the judge immediately rejected the pleas, maintaining the earlier orders.

Previous summons The court had previously issued summons notices to both individuals in connection with the case. Following their non-compliance, the court proceeded with non-bailable arrest warrants.—RT/Agency

## Hamas Sets Condition: Trump Must Guarantee Ceasefire



WASHINGTON: According to US media reports, Hamas has sent a letter to US President Donald Trump, requesting a formal guarantee of a ceasefire in exchange for the release of hostages.

The letter reportedly outlines a proposal for a 60-day ceasefire during which Hamas would release half of the hostages, contingent on

Trump providing a credible guarantee that the truce would be upheld.

Sources indicate that Hamas emphasized the need for a "reliable and lasting peace" rather than a temporary pause in hostilities.

The group stressed that any ceasefire must be assured on humanitarian grounds.—RT/Agency

## PTI Stands Firm: 'We Follow Our Founder, Not Social Media,' Says Barrister Gohar

Rawalpindi: Chairman of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, stated on Sunday that the party operates strictly under the guidance of its founder, not under the influence of social media narratives.

Speaking to media outside Adiala Jail, Barrister Gohar expressed concern over being denied permission to meet the PTI founder, emphasizing that such restrictions only widen the gap between leadership and its key members.

"Today, I was not allowed to meet the PTI founder, but I hope the meeting will take place tomorrow," Gohar said, adding that the meeting is not just essential but also supported by court orders.

He stressed that dialogue with the PTI founder is crucial for improving the current political climate and ensuring smooth decision-making within the party.



Barrister Gohar reiterated that PTI does not have any anti-state agenda and remains a legitimate political party committed to democratic principles and the supremacy of the Constitution. "We are talking about democracy, constitutional rule, and civilian supremacy," he said.

He further quoted the PTI founder, stating, "The country is ours, and the army is ours too," underlining that the party seeks harmony, not confrontation. Gohar clarified that the party respects

national institutions, including the judiciary and the military, and aims to contribute positively to Pakistan's democratic process.

The PTI chairman's comments come amid ongoing political tensions and challenges faced by the party, especially concerning limited access to its imprisoned founder. PTI has consistently demanded fair political participation, level playing fields in upcoming elections, and the implementation of rule of law.—RT/Agency

## Kim Opens Door—North Korea Will Talk If US Drops Denuclearisation Demand

SEOUL: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un said there is no reason to avoid dialogue with the US if Washington stops insisting his country give up nuclear weapons but he will never trade away the nuclear arsenal to be free of sanctions, state media reported on Monday.

In a speech at the Supreme People's Assembly on Sunday, Kim said: "Personally, I still have fond memories of US President Trump." KCNA reported. The two leaders met three times during Trump's first presidency.

The comments come at a time when the new liberal government in Seoul is urging Trump to take the lead in reopening dialogue with Kim, six years after all peace talks with Pyongyang collapsed over a clash on sanctions and nuclear dismantlement.



If the United States drops the absurd obsession with denuclearising us and accepts reality, and wants genuine peaceful coexistence, there is no reason for us not to sit down with the United States," Kim was quoted as saying.

It was a matter of survival for the country to build nuclear weapons to safeguard its security against grave threats from the United States and South Korea, Kim said, adding a phased proposal by the South on ending the North's nuclear programmes was proof of

said, listing a series of regular military drills by the allies that he said have evolved into exercises for a nuclear war.

## Russia Offers Extension Of Nuclear Arms Limits With US

MOSCOW: Russia on Monday offered to keep abiding by nuclear warhead limits agreed with the United States once a key treaty expires, but only for one year and if Washington did the same.

The New START treaty, signed in 2010, limits the number of nuclear warheads each side can deploy and is the last major arms proliferation agreement between the two nuclear powers.

It is set to expire on February 5, 2026, and neither side has agreed to an extension.



Russia is prepared to continue adhering to the central quantitative limitations of the New START Treaty for one year after February 5, 2026," Russian President Vladimir Putin said in a televised meeting.

He said the measure was needed to prevent "a strategic arms race" with Washington.

"We believe that this measure will only be viable if the United States acts in a similar manner and does not take steps that undermine or disrupt the existing balance of deterrence potentials," Putin added.

Russia froze its participation in New START in 2023 but has continued to voluntarily follow the numerical limits in the treaty.—RT/Agency

## Philippines Boils Over—Arrests Soar After Anti-Corruption Protests Turn Violent

MANILA: Police in the Philippine capital arrested more than 200 people during clashes with masked protesters that erupted on a day of largely peaceful anti-corruption demonstrations, a spokeswoman said Monday.

At least 88 minors were among the initial count of 216 taken into custody Sunday as police deployed water cannons and deafening sirens against crowds of mostly young, rock-throwing protesters.

Manila City Mayor Isko Moreno said a 12-year-old boy was the youngest detained. Thousands of Filipinos rallied in Manila on Sunday to vent their anger over a ballooning scandal in-



volving bogus flood-control projects believed to have cost taxpayers billions of dollars. The scandal has seen numerous lawmakers implicated and the Congress step down from their positions during an investigation. But Sunday's street battles, which saw multiple police vehicles set ablaze and the windows

of a precinct headquarters shattered, threatened to overshadow demonstrations that had been filled with families, activists, clergy and politicians. "So far, none of them are saying the reasons behind their actions or if someone paid them to do it," regional police spokesperson Major Hazel Asilo told AFP.—RT/Agency
