Sharif invited the Kuwaiti Crown Prince to visit Pakistan later this year. The invitation was received warmly, reflecting the mutual intent to further elevate bilateral ties. The Kuwaiti Crown Prince praised Pakistan's diplomatic efforts and particularly acknowledged its consistent support for the Palestinian cause.

Both leaders also held a wide-ranging discussion on Middle East developments, as well as regional and global affairs. They reaffirmed their commitment to continue working together at bilateral and multilateral forums.—RT/Agency

At UNGA, Trump Demands Immediate Halt To Gaza War

NEW YORK: United States President Donald Trump on Tuesday called for an immediate end to the ongoing war in Gaza.



Addressing the 80th United Nations General Assembly at UN headquarters in New York City, the US president said, "We have to stop the war in Gaza immediately. We have to immediately negotiate peace."

Dozens of world leaders gathered at the United Nations to embrace a Palestinian state, a landmark diplomatic shift that faces fierce resistance from Israel and its close ally, the US.

Trump rejected statehood for Palestinians, adopting the stance of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. "The rewards would be too great for Hamas," he said,

repeating his call for the return of hostages taken by the Palestinian group.

Trump said the US wants a ceasefire-for-hostages deal that would see the return of

all remaining hostages, alive or dead.

Turning to Russia, Trump warned he was ready to impose tough economic measures over the war in Ukraine.

In his first UN address since regaining power in January, Trump said he wants US allies to impose the same measures on Russia he is proposing to try to force Russian President Vladimir Putin to pull back from the biggest war in Europe since World War II.

The US president has warned about the possibility of sanctions on Russia several times but has yet to fol-

low through.

Lately he has demanded Europe stop all Russian oil purchases before he will take action.

"At the event that Russia is not ready to make a deal to end the war, then the United States is fully prepared to impose a very strong round of powerful tariffs, which would stop the bloodshed, I believe, very quickly," he said.

But for the measures to be effective, he said, "European nations, all of you gathered here, would have to join in adopting the exact same measures."—RT/Agency

NATO Warns Russia To Cease Provocative Airspace Violations On Eastern Flank

BRUSSELS, Belgium: NATO on Tuesday warned Russia to stop an "escalatory" pattern of airspace violations along its eastern flank, after the alliance held urgent talks about a jet incursion over Estonia last week.



"Russia bears full responsibility for these actions, which are escalatory, risk miscalculation and endanger lives. They must stop," NATO's 32 member states said in a statement.

"Russia should be in no doubt: NATO and allies will employ, in accordance with international law, all necessary military and non-military tools to defend ourselves and deter all threats from all directions."

It added that NATO would "continue to respond in the manner, timing, and domain of our choosing" and that the alliance's commitment to its collective defence pact remained "ironclad".

Estonia convened emergency consultations under

Article 4 of NATO's founding treaty after armed Russian fighter jets violated its airspace for some 12 minutes on Friday.

That incident — which saw NATO scramble jets — came just over a week after the alliance shot down Russian drones over Poland and led Warsaw to demand similar talks.

In response to the drone raid in Poland, NATO announced it was bolstering its eastern defences to help to counter the threat from Moscow.

Romania, other eastern flank countries including Romania, Lithuania, Latvia and Finland have seen recent violations of their airspace.

The spike in tensions has spurred fears that the Russia war in Ukraine could be spilling across NATO's border.

In their statement the NATO countries vowed that "allies will not be deterred by these and other irresponsible acts by Russia from their enduring commitments to support Ukraine".—RT/Agency

Palestinian President Presses Hamas To Surrender Arms



UNITED NATIONS: Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas called Monday for Hamas to surrender its weapons to its forces while condemning the group's deadly attack on Israel in an address at a UN summit on a two-state solution.

"Hamas will have no role in governing (Gaza). Hamas and other factions must surrender their weapons to the Palestinian Authority," he said via video link, having been denied a visa to attend the United States.

"We also condemn the killing and detention of civilians, including Hamas actions on October 7, 2023."

It is to be mentioned here that Israel in its brutal assault of Gaza has killed over 65,000 people, most of them civilians.

Abbas called for an immediate ceasefire adding that

Gaza needs relief. He also demanded release of prisoners.

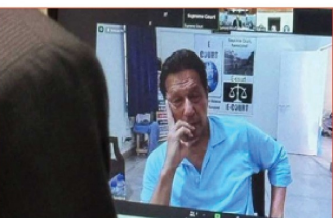
Palestinian president also lauded mediation efforts made by Egypt and Qatar.

Six European nations — France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Malta, Andorra and Monaco — added their names to the list of the countries recognizing the State of Palestine with their statements at the UN on Monday.

The day before, the United Kingdom and Canada became the first G7 countries to make such a recognition, with Australia and Portugal also following suit. A majority of European countries now recognize the State of Palestine, following official declarations in New York on Monday by France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Malta and others, after nearly two years of war in Gaza.—RT/Agency

ATC Rejects Imran's Bid To Halt GHQ Attack Trial

RAWALPINDI: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Tuesday rejected Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan's plea seeking the halt of court proceedings in May 9 case involving attack on General Headquarters (GHQ).



ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah conducted the hearing today over two petitions filed by Khan, urging the court to provide the CCTV footage of the court proceedings on September 19 and stopping the proceedings till the high court's order on the transfer of the jail trial.

During the hearing, where Khan was presented virtually before the court via WhatsApp link, the PTI founder's lawyer Faisal Malik contended that they did not want to become part of the case proceedings sans consultation with the former prime minister.

To this, the court said: "During the last hearing, you consulted with the PTI founder who [then] boycotted the proceedings".

When advised by the court to challenge the WhatsApp communication in the high court, counsel Malik said that they had already done so.

"[A] WhatsApp call cannot be considered as [attendance] via a video link," the

lawyer said while requesting the court for more time to challenge the court's previous order.

"You can challenge it [however] the court proceedings cannot be stopped," the court responded.

Highlighting that the defence lawyers boycotted the previous hearing, prosecutor Ikram Amin said that the prosecution was not obligated to answer any of their queries.

"The defence lawyers boycott court hearing and then ask for more time the next day. Their conduct shows that they are not serious about the trial," the prosecutor said, adding that the defence team was wasting the court's time.

Responding to prosecutor Zaheer Shah's argument that questioning the court's order amounted to contempt of court, lawyer Malik said that they were merely seek-

ing a fair trial.

"If the suspect cannot listen to his lawyer and vice versa, how is this a fair trial," the defence lawyer contended.

On the defence team's request for the CCTV footage, prosecutor Zaheer said that as per the Lahore High Court (LHC) directives, neither any footage nor a transcript can be provided to anyone.

At this, Khan's lawyer Salman Akram Raja said that the court does not operate on government instructions but works as per the constitution.

"It is not possible to present a person locked in a cell on WhatsApp," Raja stressed, to which the court said that they have the right to challenge the court order.

After hearing both side's arguments, the court rejected the petitions filed by the former PM.—RT/Agency

Asia Cup 2025: Pakistan Sink Sri Lanka To Keep Final Dream Alive

Pakistan grabbed a five-wicket victory over Sri Lanka on Tuesday in the crucial Super Fours match to keep hopes alive for advancing to the Asia Cup 2025 final.



Chasing a modest 134-run target on a challenging surface and testing conditions here, the Green Shirts eventually knocked the winning runs for the loss of five wickets and 12 balls to spare.

Pakistan got off to a decent start for the pursuit as their opening pair of Sahibzada Farhan and Fakhar Zaman yielded 45 runs inside the batting powerplay before both fell victim to Maheesh Theekshana in the sixth over.

Farhan scored 24 off 15 deliveries with the help of two sixes and a four, while Fakhar made a 19-ball 17.

Wanindu Hasaranga further added to Pakistan's woes by dismissing Saim Ayub and captain Salman Ali Agha in consecutive overs, bringing the total down to 57/4 in 8.1 overs.

Wicketkeeper batter Mohammad Harris and Hussain Talat briefly stabilised the run chase with their 23-run partnership for the fifth wicket, but Dushmanta Chameera cleaned up the former in the 12th over to dent their recovery.

With the scoreboard reading 80/5 in 11.1 overs and a further 58 required off 53 deliveries, Mohammad Nawaz joined Talat, and the duo bat-

ted sensibly under pressure to steer their side over the line unbeaten.

Mohammad Nawaz topped scored for Pakistan with an unbeaten 38 off 24 deliveries, studded with three sixes and as many fours, while Talat made 32 not out from 30 balls, comprising four fours.

For Sri Lanka, Theekshana and Hasaranga bagged two wickets each, while Chameera could claim one.

Put into bat first, the defending champions managed to accumulate 133/8 in their allotted 20 overs despite Kamindu Mendis's half-century.

Sri Lanka got off to a shaky start to their innings as Shaheen Shah Afridi dismissed both openers — Kusal Mendis (zero) and Pathum Nissanka (eight) — in his first two overs.

The 2022 champions, however, were in a comfortable position by the end of the batting powerplay as they had piled up 53 runs despite losing another wicket.

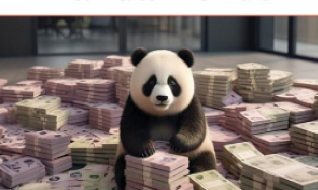

Pakistan Eyes \$750 Million Financing Push Through Panda Bonds



ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan government has prepared a plan to raise \$750 million through commercial financing and the issuance of Panda Bonds citing Finance Ministry sources.

The raised funds are expected to be utilized for the repayment of upcoming Euro-bond maturities.

According to sources, the financing will be arranged through a consortium of banks.

The government is considering mobilizing funds through both Panda Bonds and commercial loans to meet external obligations.

Pakistan faces a \$500 million Eurobond repayment due on September 30, followed by a \$1 billion Euro-bond maturity scheduled for April next year.

Sources added that these measures are part of the government's broader strategy to

ensure timely debt servicing while maintaining external financial stability.

Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb earlier stated that the Pakistan Panda Bond will be settled in Chinese yuan and is likely to increase between \$200 million and \$300 million.

The issuance is being structured with support from multifaceted development institutions, including the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), which may provide credit guarantees.

The Pakistan Panda Bond is a component of a wider strategy to expand funding sources and reduce dependence on dollar borrowing. It also aligns with Pakistan's aim to progress its credit rating to single 'B' and deepen incorporation with China's capital markets.—RT/Agency

Trump Slams Palestine Recognition As Dangerous Reward To Hamas

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump has strongly criticised the recent decisions by several Western countries to recognise a Palestinian state, calling the move a "reward to Hamas," according to the White House.



White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told reporters on Monday that President Trump firmly opposed the recognition, arguing that it neither contributes to resolving the conflict in Gaza nor advances the cause of peace in the region.

"He feels this does not do anything to release the hostages, which is the primary goal right now in Gaza. It does nothing to end this conflict and bring this war to a close," Leavitt said, reflecting the administration's headline position on the matter.

She added that the president views such recognition as premature and counterproductive at a time when Hamas remains in control of Gaza. "Frankly, he believes it's a reward to Hamas. He believes these decisions are just more talk and not enough action from some of our friends and allies,"

Leavitt remarked.

The comments came in response to announcements by several European nations and other Western allies that they would formally recognise Palestine as a state, citing the need for a two-state solution and long-term peace. Supporters of the move argue that recognition is an essential step toward establishing equity in negotiations and securing Palestinian rights.

However, the Trump administration insists that recognition without security guarantees for Israel and without Hamas being disarmed undermines efforts to achieve a lasting settlement. Trump has repeatedly emphasised that the immediate priority must be the safe release of hostages held by Hamas

and the cessation of violence in Gaza.

Political analysts note that Trump's comments reflect longstanding US policy, which traditionally opposes unilateral recognition of Palestine outside of a negotiated settlement. The latest remarks are also being interpreted as a message to Washington's European partners, many of whom are pushing for a stronger diplomatic stance on the issue.

While the debate over recognition continues, the White House has reaffirmed its commitment to supporting Israel's security and working toward a resolution that ensures peace for both Israelis and Palestinians — but only through direct negotiations, not unilateral moves.—RT/Agency

The 2022 champions, however, were in a comfortable position by the end of the batting powerplay as they had piled up 53 runs despite losing another wicket.

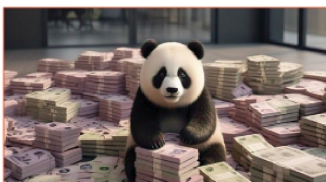

Pakistan Eyes \$750 Million Financing Push Through Panda Bonds



ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan government has prepared a plan to raise \$750 million through commercial financing and the issuance of Panda Bonds citing Finance Ministry sources.

The raised funds are expected to be utilized for the repayment of upcoming Euro-bond maturities.

According to sources, the financing will be arranged through a consortium of banks.

The government is considering mobilizing funds through both Panda Bonds and commercial loans to meet external obligations.

Pakistan faces a \$500 million Euro-bond repayment due on September 30, followed by a \$1 billion Euro-bond maturity scheduled for April next year.

Sources added that these measures are part of the government's broader strategy to ensure timely debt servicing while maintaining external financial stability.

Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb earlier stated that the Pakistan Panda Bond will be settled in Chinese yuan and is likely to increase between \$200 million and \$300 million.

The issuance is being structured with support from multifaceted development institutions, including the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), which may provide credit guarantees.

The Pakistan Panda Bond is a component of a wider strategy to expand funding sources and reduce dependence on dollar borrowing. It also aligns with Pakistan's aim to progress its credit rating to single 'B' and deepen incorporation with China's capital markets.—RT/Agency

Trump Slams Palestine Recognition As Dangerous Reward To Hamas

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump has strongly criticised the recent decisions by several Western countries to recognise a Palestinian state, calling the move a "reward to Hamas," according to the White House.

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told reporters on Monday that President Trump firmly opposed the recognition, arguing that it neither contributes to resolving the conflict in Gaza nor advances the cause of peace in the region.

"He feels this does not do anything to release the hostages, which is the primary goal right now in Gaza. It does nothing to end this conflict and bring this war to a close," Leavitt said, reflecting the administration's headline position on the matter.

She added that the president views such recognition as premature and counterproductive at a time when Hamas remains in control of Gaza.

"Frankly, he believes it's a reward to Hamas. He believes these decisions are just more talk and not enough action from some of our friends and allies,"



Leavitt remarked.

The comments came in response to announcements by several European nations and other Western allies that they would formally recognise Palestine as a state, citing the need for a two-state solution and long-term peace. Supporters of the move argue that recognition is an essential step toward establishing equity in negotiations and securing Palestinian rights.

However, the Trump administration insists that recognition without security guarantees for Israel and without Hamas being disarmed undermines efforts to achieve a lasting settlement. Trump has repeatedly emphasised that the immediate priority must be the safe release of hostages held by Hamas

and the cessation of violence in Gaza.

Political analysts note that Trump's comments reflect longstanding US policy, which traditionally opposes unilateral recognition of Palestine outside of a negotiated settlement. The latest remarks are also being interpreted as a message to Washington's European partners, many of whom are pushing for a stronger diplomatic stance on the issue.

While the debate over recognition continues, the White House has reaffirmed its commitment to supporting Israel's security and working toward a resolution that ensures peace for both Israelis and Palestinians — but only through direct negotiations, not unilateral moves.—RT/Agency

Barcelona's Gavi faces another surgery blow



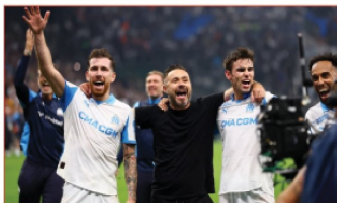
The 21-year-old Spain international, Gavi, will undergo knee surgery to resolve a lingering meniscus injury, Barcelona confirmed in a statement.

Ravichandran Ashwin eyes historic BBL run as four franchises battle for him

MELBOURNE: Veteran Indian spinner Ravichandran Ashwin is poised to make history as the first capped Indian male cricketer to feature in Australia's Big Bash League (BBL), with four franchises competing to secure his services for the latter stages of the upcoming season.

According to reports, Sydney Thunder, Hobart Hurricanes, Sydney Sixers and Adelaide Strikers are in the race to sign the India great. Thunder and Hurricanes are believed to be leading the chase, with a final decision expected later this week.

No internationally capped Indian male player has previously participated in the BBL. However, Ashwin's retirement from the Indian Premier League (IPL) earlier this year has opened the door for him to feature in overseas franchise leagues for the first time.



Under the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) regulations, only retired Indian cricketers are permitted to play in foreign T20 competitions. In recent years, several former India stars have taken that route.

Dinesh Karthik turned out for Paarl Royals in SA20, Ambati Rayudu featured for St Kitts & Nevis Patriots in the CPL, and MI Emirates in the ILT20, while Robin Uthappa, Yusuf Pathan, and Suresh Raina have all represented franchises in overseas leagues.

Chaos in PHF as players wait endlessly for daily allowance payments



LAHORE: The Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) has come under scrutiny for overlooking the issue of players' daily allowances, sources revealed.

According to the sources, while the federation was busy finalising arrangements with the government for the upcoming Pro Hockey League, it neglected to address the players' dues.

Each player is entitled to an international daily allowance of PKR 30,000, amounting to nearly PKR 500,000 per tour.

The delay has sparked frustration among national players, who have yet to receive their international allowances more than six weeks after the conclusion of the FIH Nations Cup.

In contrast, players have only been paid domestic allowances, reportedly at a reduced rate of PKR 2,500 per day instead of PKR 3,000.

"It's difficult to manage household expenses on just domestic allowances. We remain committed to representing Pakistan, but we also have families to support," players expressed.

The uncertainty has pushed several players to explore alternative opportunities, including participation in international leagues and tournaments abroad. "What can players do? Life has to go on, and we must grab any chance to play overseas," they added.—Agency

35,000 parents across Sindh refuse polio drops for children, sparking health alarm

According to media reports, 34,000 refusals came from Karachi alone, where in District East over 8,000 parents declined vaccination. The province-wide campaign was conducted from September 1 to 7 across 25 districts, with a target of administering polio drops to more than 2.1 million children in Karachi.

Health officials have expressed concern over the high refusal rate, warning that such resistance poses a serious threat to Pakistan's ongoing efforts to eradicate polio. Despite extensive awareness campaigns, misconceptions and mistrust surrounding vaccination continue to hinder progress. Authorities have urged parents to cooperate, stressing that polio vaccination is critical for protecting children from lifelong disability and for achieving a polio-free Pakistan. —RT/Agency

KCCI urges FBR to extend income and sales tax filing deadlines

In a communication to the FBR chief, KCCI President Muhammad Jawed Bilwani requested that the last date for filing Income Tax Returns for Tax Year 2025 be extended from September 30 to October 31, 2025. He also sought a one-month extension in the deadline for submission of Sales Tax Returns for August 2025.

KARACHI: A powerful seminar on "Anti-Tobacco, Quitting Tobacco, and the Use of New Tobacco Products" was recently held under the banner of the Sukhar Welfare Organization. Dr. Zeeshan, a prominent lecturer and keynote speaker, shocked attendees

by revealing that nearly 800,000 people in Karachi alone are addicted to cigarette smoking, and the total number for all forms of tobacco usage in the city soars to a staggering 2.5 million. Dr. Zeeshan passionately called for an immediate, city-wide anti-tobacco campaign, urging mandatory educational sessions to combat this growing crisis. He emphasized that smoking is often the first gateway to more dangerous drug addictions. Siddique Singhar, General Secretary of the Karachi Foundation, voiced strong criticism of law enforcement's approach, advocating for a "people-friendly" rather than "crime-friendly" stance.

Karachi street vendor admits to shocking child abuse in court

KARACHI: Shabbir Tanoli, a sherbet vendor accused of sexually assaulting multiple children in Karachi, confessed his crimes before a judicial magistrate at City Court. The accused recorded his statement under Section 164 in six registered cases, admitting to abusing five children. He revealed that he lured children with money before taking them to secluded rooms or bushes to commit the assaults.

During the hearing, the magistrate questioned

whether the police had subjected him to torture or coercion, to which Tanoli replied in the negative. The court further ensured that the confession was made voluntarily and without external pressure. Following the admission, the magistrate ordered the accused to be placed in judicial custody. The case has sparked outrage in the city, raising demands for protect children from predatory crimes. —RT/Agency

UNITED NATIONS: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday joined the world leaders at the opening ceremony of the 80th United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) Session in New York.

The premier was accompanied by Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Ishaq Dar, Minister for Defence Khawaja Asif, Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaullah Tarar, and Special Assistant to the Prime Minister Tariq Fatemi.

PM Shehbaz, who reached New York late Monday night mainly to attend the UNGA session, will also partake in the special summit



of Arab and Islamic countries, co-hosted by the United States and Qatar.

The prime minister has been specially invited to participate in the summit, which will also be attended by US President Donald Trump.

At the UN, the prime minister, while speaking to

the reporters, praised the US president and his team for playing a significant role in the ceasefire between Pakistan and India.

The prime minister described President Trump as a strong advocate for peace and stability across the globe.

is a man of peace. He, along with his team, played a key role in bringing about the ceasefire between Pakistan and India," said the PM.

During the day, the premier met Austrian Chancellor Christian Stocker, Kuwait's Crown Prince and Prime Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khalid and other world leaders on the sidelines of the UNGA session.

PM Shehbaz and the Austrian chancellor expressed their desire to further enhance bilateral cooperation in diverse sectors.

The premier highlighted trade, tourism, climate change and education as possible avenues of positive collaboration and stressed the need to enhance bilateral trade ties.

The Austrian chancellor thanked the prime minister for the meeting and also conveyed his desire to work together to create new avenues of cooperation between the two countries.

Both sides agreed to exchange delegations to enhance cooperation in the field of tourism between the two countries.

According to the Foreign Office spokesperson, the two ministers agreed to further strengthen bilateral relations between Pakistan and Hungary. The meeting emphasized enhancing collaboration in key sectors including trade, investment, and higher education.

Dar calls for unity on Palestine, strengthens ties at UN

The spokesperson added that both leaders stressed the



need to give a new dimension to Pakistan-Hungary ties by fostering deeper cooperation and people-to-people linkages.

Earlier during the UNGA session, Ishaq Dar also held meetings with GCC Secretary General Jassem Mo-

hammad AlBudaiwi and Canadian Foreign Minister Anand. In both meetings, regional cooperation and bilateral relations were discussed, with a shared commitment to strengthening institutional ties and boosting economic collaboration.—RT/Agency

US Lawmaker Warns China Tensions Could Spark Deadly Military Misunderstanding

BEIJING: The leader of a US congressional delegation to China warned Tuesday of the "risk of a misunderstanding" between the two countries' militaries as advances in defence technology move at breakneck speed.

Adam Smith, the most senior Democrat on Washington's Armed Services Committee, told journalists in Beijing that China needs to talk more about its military with other global powers "for basic de-confliction".

"We've seen this with our ships, our planes, their ships, their planes coming entirely too close to one another," he said at a news conference at the US Embassy.

"We need to have a better conversation about de-conflicting those things."

The four-person delegation also includes other members of the same Armed Services Committee — Democrats Ro Khanna and Chrissy Houlahan — as well as Republican congressman Michael Baumgartner, a member of the Foreign Affairs Committee.



The group on Monday met Chinese Defence Minister Dong Jun, with whom they talked about the importance of "working through our differences" and more candid dialogue, according to a statement from the US side.

Dong called on the visitors to "remove disruptive and restrictive factors" between them, China's Xinhua state news agency reported.

Speaking on Tuesday alongside the other lawmakers and the US Ambassador to China, David Perdue, Smith said: "AI and drone warfare and cyber and space is moving so rapidly and innovation is happening so quickly."

"The risk of a misunderstanding of capabilities on one side or the other is great," he said, adding the two sides need to talk so they "don't stumble in any sort of conflicts".

Tariffs and TikTok The bipartisan congressional delegation comes just days after Presidents Xi Jinping and Donald Trump spoke by telephone for the second time since the return to the White House of Trump, who has tried to keep a lid on tensions despite his once virulent criticism of China.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Hails Wave Of International Recognition For Palestinian Statehood

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has welcomed the announcements made by several countries regarding the recognition of the State of Palestine.

According to details, Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar, in a post on X (formerly Twitter), said he welcomes the declarations made by France, the United Kingdom, Canada, and others.

He described these announcements as a victory for the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people and urged more countries to recognize Palestine in line with international law. He further emphasized that the two-state solution is a vital step towards achieving just, comprehensive, and lasting peace in a statement, the Foreign Office spokesperson said that Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar represented Pakistan at a high-level meeting on the



Palestine issue, co-hosted by Saudi Arabia and France. The spokesperson added that the growing number of countries recognizing Palestine has enhanced the importance of the meeting. At the conclusion of the conference, Pakistan expressed its full support for the "New York Declaration" aimed at resolving the Palestinian issue. The Foreign Office reiterated that Pakistan's backing of the declaration reflects its longstanding commitment to a just and sustainable peace.

It also recalled that Pakistan was among the first countries to recognize Palestine in 1988 and continues to advocate for Palestine's full membership at the United Nations. Pakistan Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan, in his address, termed the two-state solution conference a historic opportunity for peace and welcomed France's step to recognize the Palestinian state.—RT/Agency

Saudi Arabia's Grand Mufti Sheikh Abdulaziz Al Sheikh dies At 82

RIYADH: The Royal Court of Saudi Arabia on Tuesday announced the death of the Kingdom's Grand Mufti, Sheikh Abdulaziz bin Abdullah Al Sheikh, at the age of 82.

King Salman bin Abdulaziz directed that Salat al-Ghaib—funeral prayers in absentia—be held for the late scholar at the Grand Mosque in Mecca, the Prophet's Mosque in Medina, and mosques across the Kingdom following Asr prayers.

In addition, funeral prayers will take place today at Imam Turki bin Abdullah Mosque in Riyadh after Asr. Sheikh Abdulaziz Al Sheikh was serving as Grand



Mufti of Saudi Arabia, Chairman of the Council of Senior Scholars, and head of the General Presidency of Islamic Research and Ifta. He was the Kingdom's third Grand Mufti, succeeding Sheikh Mohammed bin Ibrahim Al Shaikh and Sheikh Abdulaziz bin Baz. Born in Mecca in 1943,

Sheikh Abdulaziz Al Sheikh memorized the Quran at a young age. Despite losing his father in childhood and his eyesight in early adulthood, he pursued Islamic scholarship, becoming a prominent preacher at Riyadh's Imam Turki bin Abdullah Mosque and the Nimrah Mosque.—RT/Agency

World Bank Says Pakistan's Poverty Rate Has Surged 7% In Four Years

ISLAMABAD: The poverty rate has increased by seven percent in Pakistan during last four years according to a report released by the World Bank.

The World Bank's country director Pakistan Ms. Bolormaa Amgaabazar in a press briefing said that the poverty rate in the country has reached to 25.3 percent as hike recorded in the poverty rate in recent years.

"The poverty rate was 18.3 percent in Pakistan in Year 2021-2022, which soared to 24.8 percent in 2022-2023. The poverty rate further enhanced to 25.3 percent in year 2023-2024," according to the World Bank report.

According to the report,



the poverty rate was declining by 3 percent in the country per annum up to the Year 2015. "From 2015 to 2018 poverty rate decreased by one percent yearly."

The World Bank said that the country's poverty rate started increasing after 2020.

"The income increased by only two to three percent from Year 2011-2021," according to the report. The poverty rate in the country decreasing with agriculture and other sources of income, the report said.—RT/Agency

ATC Summons Aleema Khan In November 26 Protest Case



RAWALPINDI: The Anti-Terrorism Court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Tuesday summoned PTI founder's sister, Aleema Khan, as an accused on September 29 in connection with the November 26 protest case.

The case was heard by ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah, during which the prosecution submitted the challan against Aleema Khan in court.

The prosecutor informed the court that Aleema Khan was named as the prime accused in the November 26 protest, alleging that she incited party workers to protest despite Section 144 being in force.

It is pertinent to mention that a case against Aleema Khan has been registered at Sadighabad Police Station, Rawalpindi.—RT/Agency

Jaffar Express Derails In Mastung After Deadly Track Explosion

QUETTA: Several passengers were injured when three carriages of the Jaffar Express derailed in Mastung's Dasht area on Tuesday following an explosion on the railway track, officials said.

According to railway authorities, one carriage overturned while two others came off the track. The train was travelling from Peshawar to Quetta at the time of the incident.

Rescue sources confirmed that ambulances had been dispatched from Quetta to Dasht to transport the injured to hospitals. Levies officials said multiple passengers sustained injuries in the accident.

This is not the first time the train service has been attacked.



Earlier in June, five bogies of Jaffar Express derailed after a blast took place on a railway track near Jacobabad. The train was en route from Peshawar to Quetta. The explosion damaged the railway line, disrupting train services in the area, however, no casualties were reported, they added.

On March 11, the outlawed Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) militants blew up train tracks and assaulted the Jaffar Express, holding over 440 passengers hostage in a day-long standoff with security services in a remote mountain pass in the Bolan district. The military, after clearing the train and rescuing hostages, killed 33 attackers.—RT/Agency

Pakistan To Launch 5G Services In Coming Months, Vows IT Minister

KARACHI: Federal Minister for Information Technology and Telecommunication Shaza Fatima Khawaja on Tuesday announced that Pakistan will introduce 5G services within the coming months, with the initial launch planned in seven major cities.

The promise of 5G internet, however, comes after the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) in its annual report for 2024 stated that even with rising broadband penetration, Pakistan will have a difficult transition to 5G. The News reported last year in December.

There are worries over the



financial difficulties associated with Pakistan's transition to 5G wireless technology, even as the country's use and penetration of wireless telecommunication services, such as broadband and mobile, continue to grow.

Addressing the inauguration ceremony of the 26th ITCN Asia Expo at Expo Centre Karachi today, she noted that measures were also being taken to ensure more reliable internet access nationwide.—RT/Agency
