13 Indian-Backed Terrorists Eliminated In Daring DI Khan Operation

DI KHAN: Security forces have eliminated 13 Indian-sponsored terrorists during an intelligence-based operation (IBO) in Khayber Pakhtunkhwa's Dera Ismail Khan district, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Wednesday.

The IBO was conducted in DI Khan's "Daraban general area on reported presence of khawarij belonging to Indian Proxy, Fitna al Khawarij," said the military's media wing.

During the operation, our troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location, resulting in the killing of over a dozen Indian-sponsored terrorists, read the statement.

Weapons and ammunition were also recovered from the killed terrorists, who remained actively involved in numerous terrorist activities in these areas, said the ISPR. The military's media wing added that the eliminated terrorists were also involved in facilitating a suicide bombing attack in Daraban in December 2023, abduction and target killing of government officials and innocent civilians.



A sanitisation operation was also conducted in the area to eliminate any other terrorists.

"The security forces of Pakistan are determined to wipe out the menace of Indian-sponsored terrorism from the country," it concluded.

The country has witnessed a surge in cross-border terror incidents since Taliban rulers returned to Afghanistan in 2021, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan.

In August, the incidents surged by 74% compared to July, according to a report by the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies (PICSS).

The Islamabad-based think tank recorded 194 fatalities from militant attacks during the month.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has reiterated his resolve to eliminate terrorism from the country, saying that Afghanistan must choose between siding with terrorists or standing with Pakistan. He warned there would be zero tolerance for ambiguity on the issue.

Pakistan has hosted Afghans for more than four decades, from the Soviet invasion through the Taliban takeover in 2021. Some refugees were born and raised in Pakistan; others are still waiting for third-country relocation.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Confronts IMF Chief At UNGA, Cites Floods Crippling Pakistan's Economy

New York: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that Pakistan is making steady progress in meeting targets set under the International Monetary Fund (IMF) programme, but stressed that the economic impact of recent floods should be taken into account during its upcoming review.

Massive floods across the country have struck both the rural heartland and industrial centres for the first time in decades, causing billions of dollars in damage while straining food supplies, exports and a fragile economic recovery.

Record monsoon rains since late June, amplified by



dam releases from India, have submerged large swathes of Punjab and Sindh, the two most populous and economically vital provinces.

Over 1,000 people have been killed since June 26, the National Disaster Management

Authority said, while over 2.5 million people have been evacuated in Punjab and Sindh.

The prime minister, in a meeting with IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva, on the sidelines

of the UNGA on Wednesday, appreciated the IMF's long-standing constructive partnership with Pakistan, which has further strengthened under the incumbent chief's leadership.

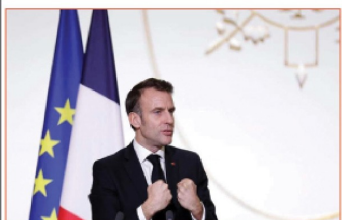
He acknowledged the IMF's timely support under various instruments, including the Stand-By Arrangement for \$3 billion in FY 2024, followed by the Extended Fund Facility (EFF) of \$7 billion.

"Today, with the institution of deep-rooted structural reforms, Pakistan's economy [is] showing positive signs of stabilisation and is now moving towards recovery," said PM Shehbaz and appreciated the IMF's support for being instrumental in guiding the government's economic reform efforts.

The IMF Managing Director expressed her sympathy to all people affected by the floods and noted the importance of the damage assessment to underpin recovery policies.

The IMF chief commended the prime minister's commitment to pursuing sound macro-economic policies and reiterated the IMF's continued support as Pakistan advances the necessary economic reforms to ensure sustainable long-term economic growth.—RT/Agency

Macron Dares Trump: End Gaza War If You Want The Nobel



FRANCE: If US President Donald Trump really wants to win the Nobel Peace Prize, he needs to stop the war in Gaza, French President Emmanuel Macron said on Tuesday.

Speaking to France's BFM TV from New York, Macron said only Trump had the power to put pressure on Israel to end the war.

"There is one person who can do something about it and that is the US president," Macron said. "And the reason he can do more than us, is because we do not supply weapons that allow the war in Gaza to be waged. We do not supply equipment that allows war to be waged in Gaza. The United States of America does."

Trump gave a combative, wide-ranging speech to the United Nations General Assembly on Tuesday that rejected moves by Western allies to endorse a Palestinian state, saying that would be a reward for Hamas militants.

"We have to stop the war in Gaza immediately. We have to immediately negotiate peace," Trump said.

Discussing Trump's speech, Macron said: "I see an American president who is involved, who reiterated this morning from the podium: 'I want peace. I have resolved seven conflicts', who wants the Nobel Peace Prize. The Nobel Peace Prize is only possible if you stop this conflict," Macron said.

Countries such as Cambodia, Israel and Pakistan are among those that have nominated Trump for the annual prize for brokering peace pacts or ceasefires.

Trump has said he deserves the Norwegian-bestowed accolade given to four of his White House predecessors.

President Trump has done more for peace than every one present at the United Nations combined," said White House spokeswoman Anna Kelly.—RT/Agency

Israeli Media Admits Pak-Saudi Alliance Not Aimed At Hostility

The Jerusalem Post has published an opinion piece by Israeli researcher Noa Guzan, analysing the defence pact between Saudi Arabia and Pakistan, describing it as a declaration with more symbolic than operational weight.

The op-ed, titled 'A complex reality: Saudi-Pakistani alliance is not a hostile pact against Israel', argues that while the agreement was widely perceived as a 'Muslim version of NATO's Article 5', it largely builds on decades of existing ties between the two countries rather than marking a new strategic breakthrough.

The News reported: The defence pact signed last week between Saudi Arabia and Pakistan rightly made headlines, Guzan wrote. "Its central clause — stipulating that any attack on one will be considered an attack on both — was widely perceived as dramatic, almost a Muslim version of NATO's Article 5. Yet behind the declarative language lies a far more complex reality." According to the article, Pakistan has had a longstanding military presence in Saudi Arabia, with "between 1,500 and 2,000 Pakistani soldiers" stationed in the kingdom in training, advisory, and security roles. Guzan noted that Pakistani troops have been deployed at times of crisis since the 1960s, making the current agreement "part of a long continuum of cooperation rather than a genuine turning point".

One of the most sensitive aspects, he argued, lies in the nuclear question. "Rumours of a Pakistani 'nuclear umbrella' for Saudi Arabia have circulated for years," Guzan observed, adding that Riyadh's financial support for Islamabad's uranium enrichment programme has fuelled such speculation. However, he stressed that "the agreement as published makes no reference to nuclear weapons", and Pakistan maintains that its arsenal is intended only as deterrence against India. Guzan said the timing of the pact reflects Saudi anxieties and heightened regional tensions, particularly after "Israel's rare strike in Qatar, a close American ally", and ongoing clashes between Israel and Iran. "In an environment of perpetual regional warfare,



Riyadh seeks to project that the pact should not be mistaken for an unconditional guarantee. "Pakistan has previously drawn redlines vis-a-vis Riyadh — for example, its refusal in 2015 to join the Saudi-led war in Yemen".

Similarly, he said that Saudi Arabia is unlikely to intervene militarily in a potential Pakistan-India conflict. "Above all, this is a political declaration: a signal to adversaries, reassurance for domestic audiences, and a reminder to Washington that the Gulf is exploring alternative security options." The op-ed stressed that the alliance is underpinned not only by defence but also by "oil credits, financial aid, millions of Pakistani workers in the kingdom, and the binding framework of the Hajj".—RT/Agency

Pakistan Demands Kabul Crush Terror Safe Havens Once And For All

NEW YORK: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Ishaq Dar on Wednesday called on the Afghan interim government to take concrete and verifiable measures to ensure their soil is not used for terrorism against neighbouring countries, particularly Pakistan.

Addressing the Inaugural Meeting of the OIC Contact Group on Afghanistan, the deputy premier voiced Pakistan's grave concerns over the presence of more than two dozen terrorist groups operating inside Afghanistan.

He named groups including the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), Baloch Liberation Army (BLA), Majeed Brigade, and East Turkestan Islamic Movement (ETIM), highlighting their active collaboration with Al-Qaeda and the serious threat they posed to regional and international peace and security.

The country has witnessed a surge in cross-border terror incidents since Taliban rulers returned to Afghanistan in 2021, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan. The two nations share a porous border spanning around 2,500 kilometres with several crossing points which hold significance as a key element of regional trade

NEW YORK: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's meeting with US President Donald Trump has been scheduled for tomorrow at the White House, with peace in Gaza at the heart of the discussions.

The prime minister will travel to Washington from New York today, accompanied by top Pakistani officials.

High-stakes meeting at White House

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and US President Donald Trump will hold formal talks tomorrow in Washington. The meeting comes after Sharif joined the most important gathering of Arab and Islamic leaders in New York, aimed at stopping what they described as the genocide of oppressed Palestinian citizens in Gaza.

Trump called the talks "very important", saying he wanted an end to the war and stressing the release of hostages.

Trump's role

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif praised Trump's commitment to establishing peace, calling him "truly a champion of peace." He highlighted Trump's role in preventing a potentially devastating war between Pakistan and India.

Sharif, joined by Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, stressed that a permanent solution between Palestinians and Israelis was only possible through negotiations.

Prior to the meeting, Prime Minister Sharif met with the Emir of Qatar, King Abdullah of Jordan and the Indonesian president and talked about the situation in Gaza.—RT/Agency

Trump Shocks NATO By Claiming Ukraine Can Reclaim Every Inch Of Lost Land

UNITED NATIONS: President Donald Trump said Tuesday that he believed Ukraine could win back all territory lost to Russia, a dramatic shift from the U.S. leader's repeated calls for Kyiv to make concessions to end the war.

Trump posted on social media soon after meeting with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly gathering of world leaders.

During a quick pull-aside meeting at the U.N. General Assembly, President Donald Trump emphasized his new position that Ukraine can win back all territory lost to Russia during a bilateral meeting with French President Emmanuel Macron.

"I think Ukraine, with the support of the European Union, is in a position to fight and WIN all of Ukraine back in its original form," Trump wrote. "With time, patience, and the financial support of Europe and, in particular, NATO, the original Borders from where this War started, is very much an option."

The strengthened support from Trump, if it sticks, is a



huge win for Zelenskyy, who has urged the American president to keep up the pressure on Russian President Vladimir Putin to end his war. It was a departure from Trump's previous suggestions that Ukraine would never be able to reclaim all the territory that Russia has occupied since seizing the Crimean Peninsula in 2014.

That had disheartened Zelenskyy, Europeans and Ukrainians and called into question the U.S. commitment to U.N. principles of sovereignty and territorial integrity. But now, Trump's view of the battlefield coincides more with Ukraine's, Zelenskyy said. "Trump is a game changer by himself," Zelenskyy told reporters after their meeting. Trump, going back to his 2024 campaign,

insisted he would quickly end the war, but his peace efforts appear to have stalled following a diplomatic blitz last month, when he held a summit with Putin and a White House meeting with Zelenskyy and European allies. Trump has acknowledged, including in his U.N. speech to world leaders, that he thought a resolution to this conflict would be "the easiest" because he has had a good relationship with Putin. Trump said he is open to imposing more sanctions on Russia and urged Europe to join in. "Russia has been fighting aimlessly for three and a half years a War that should have taken a Real Military Power less than a week to win," Trump wrote on social media.—RT/Agency

Sharif And Sri Lankan President Forge Stronger Ties On UNGA Sidelines

NEW YORK: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif met Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake on the sidelines of the 80th United Nations General Assembly, reaffirming the longstanding goodwill between Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

During the meeting, the two leaders discussed ways to further expand cooperation in diverse fields including trade, education, culture, and defense. Both sides emphasized the importance of maintaining high-level exchanges to deepen mutual understanding and partnership.

Focus on sports and people-to-people links

Highlighting the close bond between the people of both countries, the leaders



agreed to enhance cooperation in sports — with a special focus on cricket, a sport cherished in both nations. They also expressed satisfaction with existing ties and vowed to build stronger cultural and educational linkages.

PM Shehbaz and the Sri

Lankan President also exchanged views on regional and global developments.

Shehbaz Sharif appreciated Colombo's cooperation with Pakistan at international forums and reaffirmed Islamabad's commitment to supporting Sri Lanka in areas of shared interest.—RT/Agency

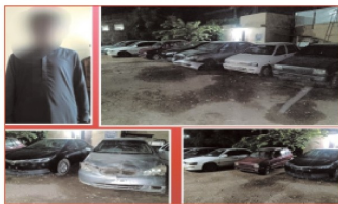

Hyderabad Police Smash Car Theft Gang, Recover 9 Hot Wheels

As a result, government work remained paralyzed, and thousands of children returned home without attending school. Hundreds of employees from 45



provincial departments, including education, health, revenue, and irrigation, criticized the provincial government for betraying its promises after coming to power. GSTA leaders vowed to continue protests until demands are met.—RT

SEF Teachers Rise Up Against Exploitation, Demand End to Contractor Rule

SANGHAR: Teachers working under the Sindh Education Foundation (SEF) in Sanghar have voiced serious concerns over extremely low wages, receiving only Rs 8,000 to 10,000 monthly through a contractor system. This is despite the govern-

ment's fixed minimum wage of Rs 40,000. Teachers allege that raising concerns leads to threats of job termination, forcing many to remain silent. They claim contractors are making huge profits, running multiple schools under different names, and misusing funds. Several SEF schools are also illegally operating near government schools, violating policy. Teachers appealed to the Education Minister for justice, demanding fair salaries and an immediate end to the exploitative contractor system to ensure transparency, accountability, and better quality of education in the province.

The investigation also included reviewing footage from hundreds of CCTV cameras, including those from the Safe City project, to track the kidnapper's movements.

Due to the effective monitoring and prompt response, the kidnapper abandoned the girl and fled the scene, police said in a statement on social media.—RT/Agency

Sardar Akhtar Mengal had filed a petition in the BHC against the government's decision to place his name on the PNIL, a temporary travel restriction.

Mengal was prevented at the Quetta airport from boarding a flight to Dubai in July, citing his inclusion on the no-fly list.—RT/Agency

The shocking recovery of 18 children from a so-called orphanage in Chichawatni is not just another isolated case of brutality—it is a mirror reflecting the horrifying reality that Pakistan's children live with every single day. These innocent souls, many under ten years old, were allegedly beaten, tortured, and dehumanized in an unregistered "welfare" institution, while their tormentors operated freely under the nose of a sleeping system.

How many more viral videos will it take before the State wakes up? How many more Shahzads must endure beatings before Pakistan admits that child abuse is not the exception—it is the rule in a country where over 3,350 cases were reported just last year, and

countless more remain buried in silence?

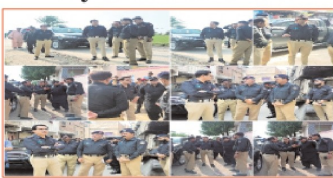

Barcelona City Council (BCC) has refused to grant a permit for Sunday's La Liga match against Real Sociedad, citing safety and security concerns with the revamped Camp Nou.

Barcelona had hoped to return to a reduced-capacity Camp Nou with 27,000 spectators, but have failed to secure the necessary permits from the council.

Instead, the match will be played at the Lluís Companys Olympic Stadium in Montjuïc, which holds 55,000 seating capacity and served as Barca's home ground during the 2023-24 and 2024-25 seasons.

He said the gas, water and K-Electric lines are required to be shifted from the bus route.

"We are not responsible for the disgrace, faced by the government owing to the BRT project," he said.

Authorities stated that the boy was reported missing earlier this week, and a search operation was immediately launched. His body was later discovered, confirming suspicions of abduction and assault. Investigators swiftly traced evidence

leading to the suspects, who were then taken into custody. Police officials said the case has been registered, and further investigations are underway to determine the motive and whether additional individuals were involved.—RT/Agency

Weed Kingpin Supplying Karachi's Elite Youth Busted in Police Raid

KARACHI: The Special Investigation Unit (SIU) arrested a suspect involved in supplying weed to young men and women in the city's upscale neighborhoods. The operation was carried out in the Jamshed Quarters area, where the accused, identified as Irfan, was taken into custody.



According to police, nearly one kilogram of narcotics (weed) was recovered from his possession.

Initial investigations revealed that the suspect used WhatsApp to take orders and collected advance payments from buyers. Authorities further dis-

closed that he frequently supplied drugs to youth in posh localities, sometimes using courier services to deliver the substance.—RT/Agency

PPP Surges Ahead as Unofficial Results Shake Up Sindh LG By-Polls

KARACHI: The Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) has secured victory in 11 districts during Sindh's local government by-elections, unofficial results showed on Wednesday.

As per unofficial and unconfirmed results, the PPP won five vice-chairman seats, while an independent candidate bagged one.

The Grand Democratic Alliance (GDA) secured one general council seat, while Theek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) and independent candidates won two seats each.

Meanwhile, Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah congratulated the PPP candidates on their "victories" in the local body by-polls. He said that PPP's triumph reflects people's confidence in the leadership of Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari.

By-elections were

held in 14 districts of Sindh for 28 local government (LG) by-election seats.—RT

Azerbaijan Cargo Plane Forced Into Emergency Landing at Karachi Airport

KARACHI: An Azerbaijan-based Silk Way Airlines cargo flight made an emergency landing at Jinnah International Airport due to a technical fault, according to a report published by Jang.

Flight ZP 4771 was en route from Baku to Chennai when it developed a malfunction while cruising at 31,000 feet. The aircraft had crossed into Indian airspace over the Arabian Sea when the issue was detected. The pilot immediately contacted Karachi Air

Traffic Control to request permission for an emergency landing. Clearance was granted, and the IL-76 cargo aircraft safely landed in Karachi, where engineers began inspecting the plane. Airport officials confirmed that the landing was carried out without incident, and no casualties were reported. The technical fault is being assessed before the aircraft is cleared for onward travel.—RT/Agency

Mayor Murtaza Wahab Slams Federal Govt Over Stalled Red and Green Line Projects



Karachi: Mayor Murtaza Wahab has criticized the federal government for its failure to complete the Green Line project up to Tower, stating that the route is being restricted only to Jama Cloth Market. Speaking to the media, he questioned why the federal government has kept the No-Objection Certificate

(NOC) pending for nine years, adding that it is shameful to deny funds to the mayor's office under the pretext of lacking a standard operating procedure.

Wahab pointed out that during Mustafa Kamal's tenure, the federal government used to provide funds directly to local governments.—RT

Sindh Govt Tightens Vehicle Rules, Rolls Out Modern Tracking Systems

KARACHI: The Sindh government has amended the Sindh Motor Vehicle Rules, 1969, introducing strict conditions for heavy commercial vehicles to improve traffic safety and enforcement. A notification has been issued, and the rules will take effect within one year.

Senior Minister for Information and Transport, Sharjeel Inam Memon, announced that all heavy vehicles must obtain road fitness certificates from Transport Department centers. Age limits have been set: vehicles older than 20 years will not operate on inter-provincial routes, 25 years on inter-city routes, and 35 years within cities.

All commercial vehicles will be required to install GPS trackers, high-definition cameras, driver monitoring systems, and 360-degree cameras. Under-run protection guards will also be mandatory.

Shehbaz And Muslim Leaders Press Trump For Gaza Ceasefire Deal

US President Donald Trump's meeting with leaders of Muslim-majority nations, including Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly focused on the situation in Gaza and the wider Middle East.

Participants included Türkiye, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Egypt, the UAE and Jordan.

The 50-minute meeting saw Trump call it an honour to meet Islamic leaders and praise their efforts, saying, "You all have done an excellent job, which is commendable".

The Turkish President described the talks as extremely productive.

As reported by the Emirati state news agency WAM,



the meeting mulled taking steps towards addressing the worsening humanitarian crisis in the war-torn enclave.

NATO member Turkey has harshly criticised Israel's attacks on Gaza and said they amount to genocide. It has halted all trade with Israel, urged international measures

against it, and called for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza.

Speaking to reporters in New York after the meeting, Erdogan said a joint declaration from the meeting would be published and that he was "pleased" with the outcomes of the meeting, but did not elaborate.

None of the other Muslim

leaders spoke to the media after the meeting.

Later, Trump declared the meeting extremely important and spoke to the media about ending the Gaza war, saying it could possibly be concluded soon. He added, "We are going to end something that we did not start".

He also outlined US plans for an Israeli withdrawal and post-war governance in Gaza without Hamas involvement, according to US media.

Washington is seeking Arab and Muslim nations' agreement to send troops to Gaza to enable Israel's withdrawal and to fund transition and rebuilding programmes, Axios had earlier reported.

As per Al-Jazeera, the Gaza plan was reportedly not

drafted by Israel, but Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has been made aware of the details. It is believed to envisage some future involvement by the Palestinian Authority (PA), something Israel has repeatedly said it will not tolerate.

Israel faces global condemnation over its military conduct in Gaza, where local health authorities say more than 65,000 Palestinians have been killed.

In recent weeks, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government has begun a long-threatened ground assault on Gaza City, with no ceasefire in sight. But Washington remains Israel's staunchest ally.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Declares Gaza A Graveyard For Humanity And A Test For Global Conscience

UNITED NATIONS: Pakistan highlighted the "historic suffering" of the Palestinian people and called on the UN Security Council to take decisive action to uphold human dignity, ensure accountability, and deliver justice, while emphasizing the need for a two-state solution for peace in the Middle East.

"The time for words has passed, the time for action is now," Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Ishaq Dar told the 15-member Council during a session focused on the dire situation in Gaza.

He went on to describe Gaza as "a graveyard for humanity and the global conscience," reaffirming Pakistan's steadfast support for the Palestinian people in their struggle for dignity, justice, and self-determination. He called for the establishment of a sovereign, independent, and contiguous Palestinian state based on pre-1967 borders, with Al-Quds Al-Sharif as its capital.



DPM/FM commended the recent recognitions of Palestine by numerous member states, saying that Pakistan had the honour to be among the first few countries to recognize Palestine, following the declaration of independence in 1988.

"This positive momentum must be sustained with resolute determination, seriousness of purpose, and an unwavering commitment to achieving a just and lasting solution," he said.

"The people of Palestine are facing a crisis of historic proportion, the suffering is a stain on our collective consciousness." Dar called for an immediate permanent ceasefire, unhindered humanitarian access to Gaza and the immediate lifting of the blockade to allow life-saving aid to reach those in need, and an end to any forced displacement of Palestinians from their lands, while upholding the right of return for refugees, and establishing an international protection mechanism.

Opening the debate, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said, "We are confronting one of the darkest chapters of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, noting that violence has only escalated across the Occupied Palestinian Territory nearly two years after the Israeli war in Gaza.—RT/Agency

US Envoy Reveals Syria And Israel Close To Explosive De-escalation Pact

Syria and Israel are close to striking a "de-escalation" agreement in which Israel will stop its attacks while Syria will agree to not move any machinery or heavy equipment near the Israeli border, a senior US envoy said.

Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of UN General Assembly meetings in New York, US Special Envoy for Syria Tom Barrack said the agreement would serve as the first step towards the security deal that the two countries have been negotiating.

Syria and Israel are in talks to reach an agreement that Damascus hopes will secure a halt to Israeli airstrikes and the withdrawal of Israeli troops who have pushed into southern Syria.

US President Donald Trump has sought to strike an agreement between the two sides that would be announced this week but not enough progress has been made so far and the Rosh Hashana holiday, the Jewish New Year this week, has slowed down the process,



Barrack said. "I think everybody is approaching it in good faith," Barrack said.

Israel and Syria have been Middle East adversaries for decades. Despite the overthrow of Syria's longtime President Bashar al-Assad last December, territorial disputes and deep-seated political mistrust between the two countries remain.

Israel has voiced hostility to Syria's government, pointing to President Ahmed al-Sharaa's former jihadist links, and has lobbied Washington to keep the country weak and decentralised.

After months of encroaching into the demilitarised zone, Israel abandoned the 1974 truce on December 8, the day a rebel offensive ousted Assad. It struck Syrian military assets and sent troops to within 20km (12 miles) of Damascus.

Since then, Israel has carried out more than 1,000 strikes on Syria and conducted more than 400 ground incursions, Sharaa said last week. Speaking shortly before Barrack at an event in New York, Sharaa, a former al-Qaeda leader who led rebel forces that overthrew Assad's government last year, expressed concern that Israel may be stalling the talks.—RT/Agency

Organisers Claim Gaza Aid Flotilla Hampered By Drone Attacks



ATHENS, Greece: Organisers of a Gaza-bound flotilla carrying aid and pro-Palestinian activists said Wednesday that several of their boats had been targeted by multiple drones.

The Global Sumud Flotilla said more than a dozen explosions were heard around the flotilla as it sailed off Greece late on Tuesday, with damage caused by "unidentified objects" dropped on deck.

"Multiple drones, unidentified objects dropped, communications jammed, and explosions heard from a number of boats," it said.

Polish lawmaker Frank Storzewski, who is on board one of the vessels, posted on X that there had been 13 attacks on a total of 10 vessels, including the one he is on.

"Three of the ships were damaged," he added. German human rights activist and flotilla member Yasemin Acar said in a video she posted on Instagram that five vessels had been attacked.—RT/Agency

Iran's President Tells UN: Tehran Will Never Build A Nuclear Bomb

UNITED NATIONS: Iran has no intention to build nuclear weapons. Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian told the UN General Assembly on Wednesday, just days before international sanctions could be reimposed on his country over Tehran's nuclear ambitions.

"I hereby declare once more before this assembly that Iran has never sought and will never seek to build a nuclear bomb. We do not seek nuclear weapons," Pezeshkian said.

On August 28, Britain, France and Germany launched a 30-day process to reimpose UN sanctions that ends on September 27, accusing Tehran of failing to abide by a 2015 deal with world powers aimed at preventing it from developing a nuclear weapon.



"The European powers have offered to delay reinstating sanctions for up to six months to allow space for talks on a long-term deal if Iran restores access for UN nuclear inspectors, addresses concerns about its stock of enriched uranium, and engages in talks with the United States."

SAYS E3 'SET ASIDE GOOD FAITH' Pezeshkian criticised the move by European powers as "illegal", saying it was made

at "the behest of the United States of America". The United States, its European allies and Israel accuse Tehran of using its nuclear programme as a veil for efforts to try to develop the capability to produce weapons. Iran says its nuclear programme is for peaceful purposes only.

"In doing so, they (the E3) set aside good faith. They circumvented legal obligations. They sought to portray Iran's lawful remedial measures... as a gross violation," Pezeshkian said.

But amid the looming threat of sanctions and last-ditch talks on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly, gaps remain between Tehran and European powers over a deal to avert the snapback of sanctions.—RT/Agency

Imran And Bushra Point Fingers At Establishment As Toshakhana 2 Verdict Nears

ISLAMABAD: As the Toshakhana-2 reference moves towards its final stages, PTI founder and former prime minister Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi have accused the NAB of acting as a tool of the establishment and their political opponents to keep them out of the political arena.

In their statements during the investigation of the case, Imran had alleged that he was ousted from power through a "local and foreign conspiracy" and had since November 2022, faced ruthless and unprecedented victimisation. He said that dozens of cases were manufactured against him and the PTI leadership, but all major prosecution cases have collapsed either through acquittals or suspension of sentences.

Khan questioned why



only he and his wife were being singled out in the Toshakhana reference, when Nawaz Sharif and Asif Ali Zardari illegally retained luxury vehicles from Toshakhana, yet no action was taken against them. He maintained that all gifts retained during his premiership were evaluated by government-approved appraisers and in line with policy.

There has been absolutely no influence used in this or

any previous case, he said, declaring that responsibility lay with the appraisers themselves. Naming Inam Shah, the key prosecution witness, in particular, Khan accused him of dishonesty and of working under the influence of Jehangir Tareen and Awn Chaudhry. He claimed both JKT and Chaudhry were used by the establishment to break the PTI and weaken him politically before the February 8 elections.—RT/Agency

PIA Regains UK Certification, Sets Sights On Flight Resumption Next Month



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) said on Wednesday that it has received Third Country Operator (TCO) certification from UK authorities, paving the way for the resumption of operations to Britain as early as next month.

The airline shared the update on its official X account, confirming plans to restart UK flights and thanking Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif, the Ministry of Defence, Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority (PCAA), and other affiliated institutions for their support.

Meanwhile, a letter issued by the UK Department for Transport (DfT) confirmed permanent approval for PIA to operate cargo flights from Islamabad, Lahore, and Karachi to Britain. The designations under the UK's ACC3 aviation security framework are valid until August 2030.—RT/Agency

Islamabad Announces 22 Mega Projects Worth Rs334 Billion To Transform Karachi

KARACHI: The spokesperson for the Federal Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Barrister Raja Khaliq uz Zaman Ansari, announced on Wednesday that the federal government is set to launch 22 mega projects in Karachi, valued at Rs. 334 billion, in collaboration with the Sindh government and the city's mayor.

In a press conference held in Karachi, Raja Ansari alleged that Karachi Mayor Barrister Murtaza Wahab had halted the ongoing work on the Green Line expansion project, despite the federal government's commitment to completing the project in partnership with the Sindh government and the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC).

He informed that around 42,000 passengers travel daily through the Green Line



and the 21-kilometer main corridor has already been completed. The second phase, stretching from Gurusamundir to Municipal Park Saddar, had also been approved and its construction recently began.

However, he claimed that Karachi Mayor abruptly halted the work without offering any explanation, resulting in significant financial losses for the government.

"If we are allowed to continue the work, the Green Line expansion will be completed by June next year," he said.

Additionally, he revealed that the federal government plans to launch 22 mega projects in Karachi, worth Rs. 334 billion. These projects will include connecting traffic from Nizamuddin to Municipal Park, integrating the Red, Yellow, and Blue Lines with the Green Line, and allocating substantial funds for the Karachi Water Filter Plant.—RT/Agency

Opposition Jolted As Hamid Raza Quits TTAP Info Secretary Post

ISLAMABAD: The opposition alliance faced a setback on Tuesday as Sahibzada Hamid Raza, head of the Sunni Ittehad Council, resigned from his position as information secretary.

According to sources within the Tehreek-e-Tahafuz Ayeen-e-Pakistan (TTAP), Raza was deeply upset over alleged trolling by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) social media activists after he declined to join the September 20 "mission nor".

PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, addressing the media a day earlier, clarified that no official announcement regarding "mission nor" had been made from the party's platform and



suggested that the call may have originated from an unknown source.

However, some opposition leaders and central leaders were seen on social media marking the "mission nor" by reciting "Azaan", including Senator Allama Raja Nasir Abbas Jafri.

It was learnt that Hamid Raza and his party had strong reservations about this mode of protest and declined to be part of it, prompting a sharp and unending reaction in the

shape of his bashing by PTI social media.

"We are in touch with the SIC leadership and hopefully very soon sort out and allay the concerns of Sahibzada Hamid Raza. Since the party did not give any such call, then how can he be trotted for not subscribing to it," a senior PTI leader said when contacted.

However, TTAP spokesman Akhunda Husain posted a statement on the opposition alliance's X account, which says that Raza, an ally of the opposition alliance, had submitted his resignation to the TTAP leadership a few days ago, which was rejected by the leadership.—RT/Agency

Sniper Strikes Dallas ICE Office: 1 Dead, 2 Injured Before Shooter Kills Himself

US: A gunman opened fire on an ICE field office in northwest Dallas early Wednesday, killing one person and wounding two others before taking his own life. The shooter reportedly fired from a nearby rooftop around 6:40am. ICE officers were unharmed, though

it's unclear who the victims were. Authorities suspect a sniper-style attack, echoing fears sparked by the recent sniper killing of activist Charlie Kirk. The incident heightens tensions amid political unrest and debate over Trump's ICE policies.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Aligns With Global Push To End Russia-Ukraine War, Calls For Restraint

UNITED NATIONS: Pakistan supports every international effort to end the war between Russia and Ukraine, Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Foreign Affairs Tariq Fatemi told the UN Security Council on Tuesday.

"The conflict has dragged on for more than three and a half years and has taken a heavy toll on innocent lives," Fatemi said. "No dispute can be settled by the use of force."

He explained that Pakistan has backed Security Council resolutions on the war and will continue to do so. "The fighting has already created a serious humanitarian crisis," he warned. "It is also fuelling food and energy shortages and pushing up global inflation."

Fatemi appealed to both Moscow and Kyiv to "show patience and tolerance" and to look for a negotiated way forward. "Pakistan stands ready to support any genuine move that can bring this conflict to an end," he added.

The UN Security-General told the Security Council it's important not to lose the



"fragile diplomatic momentum" between Ukraine and Russia — and international mediators — over ending the war. He was briefing ambassadors in back-to-back meetings where calling for a ceasefire in Gaza, he said the "day after" war ends there, must be anchored in international law, rejecting any "ethnic cleansing" of Palestinians. Meanwhile, US President Donald Trump has said that he believed Ukraine could take all its land occupied by Russia and that Kyiv should act "big" with Moscow facing a sudden and striking rhetorical shift in Ukraine's favour.—RT/Agency
