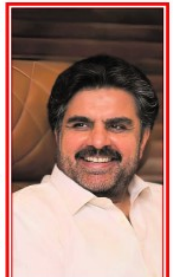

"Very Encouraging!" — PM Shehbaz Calls Trump Talks a Game-Changer in Global Diplomacy

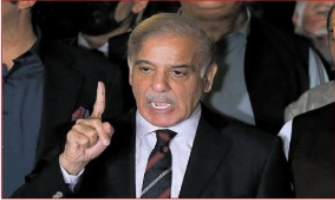
NEW JERSEY: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif described his meeting with US President Donald Trump as "encouraging."

He told reporters in the United States that he discussed economy, counterterrorism, minerals, AI, IT, and cryptocurrency meeting with President Trump. The US is prepared to invest in trade, IT, and other sectors, he added.

Shehbaz also thanked President Trump for addressing tariff issues and added that the valuation of minerals between Pakistan and the US would be determined appropriately, and trade agreements between the two countries would be based on mutual interests.

He stated that from May 6 to 10, the Pakistani Armed Forces defeated India in war. "No amount of gratitude is enough for the divine help bestowed upon the Pakistan Army during the war."

He added that Field Marshal Asim Munir wisely led the Pakistan Army during the



war. Shehbaz Sharif repeated Field Marshal Asim's words who said that "we have won the war. We shot down seven of their aircraft, carried out attacks everywhere, and left them confused."

The prime minister also mentioned his visit to Saudi Arabia, where he said he was given a grand reception. "In the past 40 years, I have never seen such a reception," he remarked.

He said that the country was facing challenges a few years ago. "When I took office, there were economic challenges, inflation was at 32%, but now it has come

down to single digits within a year and a half. At that time, the policy rate was 22.5%, but now it is down to 11%."

He praised overseas Pakistanis as great ambassadors of the country, stating that they remitted \$38.5 billion to Pakistan during the previous fiscal year 2024-25.

He termed the economic situation of the country as stable "at the micro level." Earlier, talking to media in New York, Prime Minister Shehbaz said that Pakistan had won the war against India and now it wanted peace with its neighbor.—RT/Agency

Axis of Power: Pakistan, China, Iran & Russia Forge Front Against Afghan Terror Havens

NEW YORK: Pakistan, China, Iran, and Russia have jointly expressed deep concern over the continued presence and operations of terrorist organisations in Afghanistan, including Al-Qaeda, the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA), and other such outfits.

The statement was issued following the fourth quadrilateral meeting on Afghanistan, convened by Russia on the sidelines of the 80th session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) in New York.

During the meeting, the four countries underscored the threat these groups pose to regional stability and urged for coordinated international efforts to neutralise terrorist



infrastructure operating from Afghan territory.

According to Foreign Office, the meeting reaffirmed the collective commitment of the four nations to support Afghanistan as a free, sovereign, united, and peaceful state.

The four foreign ministers emphasised the need to improve Afghanistan's economy

and alleviate the humanitarian suffering of its people. The participants agreed to strengthen trade cooperation and regional connectivity with Afghanistan. They also called for adjustments to the 1988 UN sanctions regime to reflect the current ground realities. The meeting called for scaling up emergency humanitarian assistance to

Afghanistan and stressed that such aid should not be politicised. The ministers urged Afghan authorities to take effective action against terrorist groups and to disrupt networks involved in terror financing, recruitment, and weapons access. Elimination of terrorist training centers and infrastructure within Afghanistan was highlighted as a priority. The four sides also agreed to enhance bilateral and multilateral cooperation on counter-terrorism. The need for a dignified and voluntary return of Afghan refugees was also underscored.

Both Iran and Pakistan were commended for hosting millions of Afghan refugees, with the international community being urged to extend

greater support to both countries. The ministers reiterated the importance of forming an inclusive and broad-based government in Afghanistan.

The meeting emphasised the rights of Afghan women and girls, particularly in education, employment, and participation in public life, and called for the protection of the fundamental rights and welfare of the Afghan people.

NATO countries were also held accountable for Afghanistan's current situation. The foreign ministers opposed the establishment of foreign military bases in or around Afghanistan and expressed support for regional and international efforts toward a political solution to the Afghan crisis.—RT/Agency

Red Line Drawn: Russia Warns of Decisive Response to Provocations



UNITED NATIONS: As new tensions rise between Russia and NATO powers, Moscow's top diplomat insisted to world leaders Saturday that his nation doesn't intend to attack Europe but will mount a "decisive response" to any aggression.

Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov spoke at the UN General Assembly after weeks in which unauthorised flights into NATO's airspace — intrusions the alliance blames on Russia — have raised alarm around Europe, particularly after NATO jets downed drones over Poland and Estonia said Russian fighter jets flew into its territory and lingered for 12 minutes. Russia has denied that

its planes entered Estonian airspace and has said the drones didn't target Poland, with Moscow's ally Belarus maintaining that Ukrainian signal-jamming sent the devices off course. But European leaders see the incidents as intentional, provocative moves meant to rattle NATO and to suss how the alliance will respond. The alliance warned Russia this week that NATO would use all means to defend against any further breaches of its airspace. At the UN, Lavrov maintained it's Russia that's facing threats: "Russia has never had and does not have any such intentions" of attacking European or NATO countries, he said.—RT/Agency

FO Fires Back: Pakistan Denies Any Role in Shama Junejo's UN Appearance

UNITED NATION: Amid speculation on social media, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs clarified that the woman seated behind Defence Minister Khawaja Asif during his address to the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) did not have the approval of Pakistan's authorities.

The clarification comes amid a controversy over the presence of columnist Shama Junejo at the UNSC session on 24 September 2025. Junejo was seen in visuals seated directly behind the defence minister during his speech, sparking backlash on social media.

Critics accused the government of including her in the official delegation despite her alleged support for Israel. The incident triggered widespread criticism and calls for accountability.

In response to the online outrage, defence czar Asif explained that he delivered the speech on behalf of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, who could not attend due to prior commitments.

"It was the discretion and authority of the Foreign Office to decide who should sit behind



me, be it the woman [Shama Junejo] or anyone else. I have had an emotional attachment and commitment to the Palestinian issue for 60 years," the defence minister wrote on X.

"During my employment at the Abu Dhabi Bank, I made Palestinian friends and colleagues, and I still maintain contact with them to this day. My views on Gaza are clear, and I express them openly."

"My views on Israel and Zionism are nothing but hatred," Khawaja Asif added.

He was of the view that only the FO can answer the queries about the controversy.

"Who is this woman? Why was she with our delegation, and why was she seated behind me — the Foreign Office is the

one that can answer these questions. It is not appropriate for me to respond on their behalf. The history of my Twitter account bears witness to the fact that my relationship with Palestine is a part of my faith."

Later, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a statement addressing the matter on their official X account, saying that the individual in question was "not authorised by the FO" to sit with Pakistan's delegation.

"To clarify, the individual in question was not listed in the official letter of credence for the Pakistan delegation to the 80th UNGA Session, signed by the Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister," the Ministry of Foreign Affairs posted on X.—RT/Agency

Comey Indicted: Trump's Campaign Accused of Weaponizing Justice to Silence Rivals



WASHINGTON: The US criminal case against former FBI director James Comey shatters norms of independence in federal investigations and will face significant hurdles in court, according to legal experts.

But for President Donald Trump, the final verdict may matter less than the move to exact retribution against an official who investigated him and

the warning to others he sees as political enemies. Comey, who was indicted on Thursday on charges of false statements and obstruction of a congressional proceeding, led the FBI when it began an investigation into ties between Trump's 2016 campaign and the Russian government. Comey has professed his innocence and vowed to fight the case in court.—RT/Agency

Miracle at Sea: 24 Pakistanis Cheat Death in Israeli Drone Strike on LPG Tanker

ISLAMABAD: The Foreign Office has confirmed that all 24 Pakistanis aboard a liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) tanker attacked and set ablaze in Yemen are safe.

The incident occurred on 17 September when the vessel, docked at Ras Issa port under the control of Houthi rebels, came under attack from an Israeli drone. A total of 27 crew members were on board, including 24 Pakistanis, two Sri Lankans, and one Nepali. The captain of the tanker was also

Pakistani. Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said the drone strike caused an LPG tank to explode, sparking a fire on the ship. The crew managed to bring the flames under control, but the vessel was subsequently stopped by Houthi boats and the crew was held hostage aboard the tanker. According to the Foreign Office, as soon as the incident was reported, Pakistani embassies in the region established contact with Yemeni authorities to ensure the safety of the crew.—RT/Agency

Maryam Nawaz welcomed the visiting delegation and reiterated her support for the Palestinian

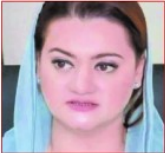

Karachi Exposed: Gender Gap in Voter Registration Among Nation's Worst

ISLAMABAD: Out of 144 districts nationwide, 31 show a shocking gender gap of 10% to 29% between male and female voters. Alarmingly, three of these districts are in Karachi, with discrepancies ranging from 12.39%

to 15.34%. To tackle this imbalance, the Election Commission has launched its fifth special campaign across 62 districts—including 24 in Punjab, 16 in Sindh, 13 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 8 in Balochistan, and Islam-

abad—to boost female voter registration. Currently, out of 134.9 million registered voters, men make up 53.62% while women account for only 46.38%, leaving a staggering gap of over 9.7 million voters.—RT/Agency

Gold Fever: Tola Price Nears Rs400,000 After Rs1,900 Surge

KARACHI: A major spike hit gold prices across the country as rates soared by Rs. 1,900 per tola, bringing the new price to Rs. 397,700. According to the All Pakistan Gems and Jewellers Association, the price of 10 grams also surged by Rs. 1,629, reaching Rs. 340,963. This sharp in-



crease comes in response to a global market jump,

where the price of gold rose by \$19, pushing it to \$3,759 per ounce. The sudden hike has sparked concerns among buyers and investors alike, as domestic rates inch closer to record highs. Market watchers expect continued volatility in the coming.—Agency

PCML Delivers 10,000 Relief Packages to Flood-Hit Families from Karachi

KARACHI: The Pakistan Central Muslim League has dispatched 10,000 ration bags, clothing, and utensils from Karachi to assist flood-affected families. Sindh President Faisal Nadeem and Karachi President Ahmed Nadeem Awan stated at the relief camp that the PCML has been actively engaged in relief efforts since day one and will continue its struggle until full rehabilitation of the



victims. Faisal Nadeem shared that various measures have been taken to help flood victims in affected areas, including clearing debris, providing

cash aid to widows, restoring schools and water supply, establishing model tent settlements, and relocating over 75,000 people to safe places.

Sindh Govt Rolls Out Massive Rs58bn Support Plan for Wheat Farmers

KARACHI: Sindh Minister for Agriculture Sardar Muhammad Bux Mahar has unveiled the Wheat Growers Support Policy, terming it a "historic initiative" to provide immediate relief to small-scale wheat farmers. The policy aims to support farmers owning between one and 25 acres of land, with the government allocating Rs58 billion for the scheme.

Under the package, 411,000 farmers will receive fertilizer and urea to

cultivate 2.26 million acres of wheat across Sindh. Each farmer will be given Rs24,700 worth of inputs per acre. Registration will be carried out through the Benazir Hari Card database, CNICs, and land revenue records, with committees set up at provincial, district, and local levels to monitor the process.

According to Mahar, distribution of DAP fertilizer will be completed by November 2025, while two additional bags of urea

will be provided after January 20, 2026, following verification of cultivation. To ensure smooth implementation, agricultural officers' leaves have been cancelled for 90 days and officers will remain open on Saturdays.

He said these steps were being taken under the directives of PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, adding that Sindh remains the only province providing consistent subsidies to farmers despite IMF restrictions.—RT/Agency

Port Qasim Cracks Global Top 10 in World Bank's Most Advanced Ports List

ISLAMABAD: In a major recognition for Pakistan, the World Bank has ranked Port Qasim as the 9th most advanced port in the world, marking a significant milestone in the country's maritime sector. Federal Minister for Maritime Affairs, Muhammad Junaid Anwar Chaudhry, called the achievement a national honor, crediting it to the government's reforms and modernization

Underdogs or Broken Giants? Pakistan's Date With Destiny Against Arrogant India

For years now, Pakistan cricket has been a heartbreak machine — full of promise but delivering mostly frustration. Today, however, brings a rare chance to flip the script. In Dubai, under the glare of a global audience, Pakistan faces its fiercest rival, India, in the Asia Cup final. It is their third meeting in two weeks, and the record could not be more lopsided: India has won both contests convincingly and is riding an intimidating seven-match streak over Pakistan.

India, with Abhishek Sharma blazing at the top and a spin attack suffocating opponents in the middle overs, have looked unstoppable. Their swagger, their depth, and their unbeaten march

make them clear favourites. Pakistan, on the



other hand, has staggered into this final with flashes of brilliance but a trail of inconsistency. For many, this imbalance has sucked the life out of what was once sport's most electrifying rivalry.

Salman Agha's men already proved their resilience in the thrilling win over Bangladesh. Today, with the trophy at stake, they must summon the same defiance against India's arrogance and firepower. A Pakistan victory would not only end the barren run against India but also rekindle belief in a team accused of failing its fans. It would be the ultimate underdog story — the mercurial side finally delivering on the grandest stage. Cricket, after all, thrives on rivalries that are competitive, not one-sided. A triumph today can restore that balance, and more importantly, heal a nation's battered sporting pride. For Pakistan, the Asia Cup final is more than a match. It is redemption waiting to be seized.

Aaron Nola On Fire as Phillies Crush Twins' Playoff Hopes

PHILADELPHIA: Aaron Nola delivered a stellar performance in his final post-season tune-up, pitching eight dominant innings to lead the Philadelphia Phillies past the Minnesota Twins 3-1 at Citizens Bank Park.

Nola was in peak form, allowing just two hits and one run while striking out nine without issuing a walk.

He retired the first 17 batters he faced before Christian Vazquez broke up the perfect game with a two-out homer in the sixth. Nola recovered to finish eight strong innings and exited to a standing ovation.

The Phillies' win, combined with the Milwaukee Brewers' 3-1 loss to the Cincinnati Reds, moved Philadelphia within one game of Milwaukee for the top spot in the National League playoff race.

Closer Jhoan Duran, facing his former team, recorded his 32nd save of the season—and 16th since joining the Phillies at the trade deadline. He secured the win by working around two hits in the ninth inning.

Philadelphia struck early when Kyle Schwarber and Bryce Harper singled in the first inning, setting up Alec Bohm's sacrifice fly to make it 1-0.

Edmundo Sosa added a solo homer in the fifth, and Brandon Marsh delivered an RBI double in the sixth to extend the lead.—Agency

Cristiano Ronaldo Lights Up the Pitch as Al-Nassr Stuns Al-Ittihad



JEDDAH: Al-Nassr continued their perfect start to the Saudi Pro League season with a 2-0 victory over defending champions Al-Ittihad in a blockbuster clash at the Alinma Stadium.

Goals from Sadio Mané and Cristiano Ronaldo sealed the win, sending Jorge Jesus's side to the top of the table with four wins from four matches.

Mané opened the scoring in the ninth minute with a clinical first-time finish. Ronaldo then doubled the lead in the 34th minute, rising high to head home from close range after the Senegalese winger's cross into the six-yard box.

Earlier, Al-Ittihad came close when Steven Bergwijn was denied by goalkeeper Bento from a tight angle, but Al-Nassr quickly regained control and punished the hosts.

Ronaldo almost added a second after the break when Predrag Rajkovic was caught off his line, but the Portuguese star's effort flew over the bar.

The result means Al-Nassr have now won their opening four league matches of the season for only the third time in their history. On both previous occasions—in 2014-15 and 2018-19—they went on to lift the title.

Ronaldo, now 40, has scored six goals in as many appearances against Al-Ittihad and has already netted four goals in this league campaign, converting from just 12 shots on target.—Agency

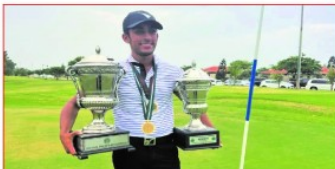
Saad Habib Storms Into Sri Lanka Amateur Golf Championship Final

KARACHI: Pakistan's Saad Habib Malik booked his place in the final of the 134th Sri Lanka Amateur Golf Championship after defeating Sri Lanka's Reshan Algama in the semifinals at the Royal Colombo Golf Club.

Habib sealed a commanding 4-up victory on the 16th hole in Saturday's semifinal, a performance powered by four birdies and a remarkable eagle on the par-5 seventh.

His aggressive play and calm temperament under pressure carried him through to the 36-hole final.

Earlier in the tournament, Habib produced one of the standout performances of the championship when he overpowered



India's Vivaan Ubhayakar in the quarterfinals, clinching a 5-up win on the 14th hole with the help of five birdies.

Pakistan's other representative, Nouman Ilyas, could not advance beyond the quarterfinals as he was beaten by Reshan Algama.

In Sunday's final, Habib will face Sri Lanka's Chanaka Perera, who advanced after winning the other semifinal.

The title decider will be contested over 36 holes, testing both players' stamina and composure in what promises to be a thrilling finale.

Habib enters the match on the back of strong form. Earlier this month, he staged a sensational comeback to capture the 64th Pakistan Amateur Golf Championship.

Despite slipping to 15th place after a disappointing second round that included a costly mistake on the 8th hole, Habib fought back with a steady 73 in the third round.

Starting the final day in sixth place, he delivered his best golf of the week—firing six birdies against two bogeys for a 4-under-par 68. His four-round total of 294 (+6) edged out Sri Lanka's Danushan Kanas Kumar by a single stroke.

The victory was sealed with three consecutive birdies on the 15th, 16th, and 17th holes. "His resilience and composure under pressure were outstanding," the Pakistan Golf Federation said in praise of his triumph.—Agency

Jannik Sinner Battles Past Atmane to Secure China Open Quarterfinal Spot



BEIJING: Top seed Jannik Sinner survived a stern test from French qualifier Terence Atmane to advance to the quarterfinals of the China Open, clinching a hard-fought 6-4, 5-7, 6-0 victory at the Diamond Court on Saturday.

The Italian star, who had comfortably defeated Atmane in Cincinnati last month, found himself in a much tighter battle this time.

After Sinner edged the opening set, Atmane mounted a strong comeback, breaking the World No. 2's serve three times in the second set to level the contest.

However, Sinner regrouped impressively in the decider, taking full control with aggressive baseline play and wrapping up the match in two hours and 22 minutes.

The victory marks his 13th consecutive quarterfinal appearance on hard courts—a testament to his consistency this season.

Reflecting on the match, Sinner praised his opponent's unique style and improvement.

"The game style he plays is quite unique—he's a lefty and we don't have so many. He's a great player and has improved a lot since Cincinnati," Sinner said. The Italian admitted that he let opportunities slip in the second set and noted that Atmane struggled with cramping in the decider. "Today he struggled a little bit in the third set with some cramp, but it was a tough, tricky second-round match.—Agency

Asia Cup Showdown: Will Pakistan and India Captains Share the Trophy Stage?

DUBAI: The much-anticipated Asia Cup 2025 final between Pakistan and India will be played on Sunday at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium.

However, the traditional pre-final trophy shoot featuring both captains will not take place this time.

Organisers confirmed on Saturday that no such event would be held, adding that a final decision on whether the captains would pose together with the trophy could only be taken on Sunday before the match.

Meanwhile, Pakistan skipper Salman Ali Agha is scheduled to address a press conference at 7:00 PM (PST) today, while the national team will conduct their final training session at the ICC Academy in Dubai from 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM (PST).



The controversy surrounding player interactions began during the group stage clash, when Indian vice-captain Suryakumar Yadav declined the customary handshake with Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha at the toss.

The situation repeated at the end of the match when Suryakumar, after scoring the winning runs, walked off without greeting the opposition.

Following that clash, Indian captain Shivam Dube and his teammates immediately returned to the dressing room, closing the doors while Pakistan players waited on the field for the traditional post-match courtesy.

This sparked a protest from Pakistan team manager Naveed Akram Cheema, who lodged a complaint against India's conduct and also against match referee Andy Pycroft for mishandling the matter.

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) later revealed that Pycroft apologised, calling the incident a "miscommunication," which allowed the delayed proceedings to continue.

Tensions resurfaced on September 21 during the Super Four clash, where both teams once again avoided handshakes before and after the game.

According to the PCB, Pycroft later apologised once more to Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha and team management, reiterating that the incident was the result of a miscommunication.—Agency

Ruben Amorim Sparks United Revival, Eyes Brentford Clash as Momentum Builder



BRENTFORD: Manchester United manager Ruben Amorim has urged his players to seize the momentum as they prepare for a crucial clash with Brentford on Friday, stressing the importance of back-to-back victories to boost confidence and push their season forward.

Amorim acknowledged that some members of his squad are still burdened by the struggles of last season, which saw United slump to 15th place in the Premier League.

He emphasised that building consistency through victories is the only way to move past those memories.

"We were really excited to start the season. We should have that feeling all the time," Amorim said.

The Portuguese coach added that a winning run could transform the atmosphere around the club.

"I am talking about the second win, then the third one. The feeling will change, and that's something about the environment we've been living in for a while."

In the group-stage clash, the opening batter gave India a flying start with 31 off just 13 deliveries at a strike rate of 238.46, while Shaheen struggled, conceding 23 runs in two overs.

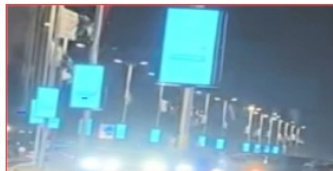

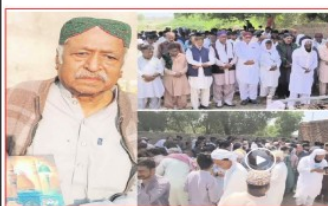

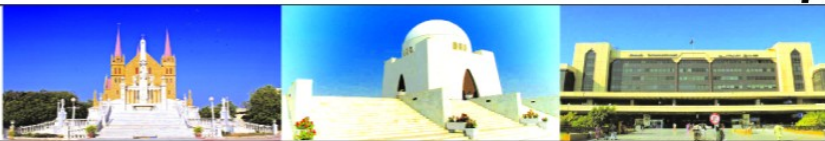

Because kneeling on painful knees is considered a fitting punishment. Let's be clear: beating children is not discipline. It's aggression. It's sadism. It's assault. It's a crime against childhood itself. What lesson do we teach when violence is the method? Do we inspire admiration or breed fear? Do we open minds or shut them forever? Do we nurture scholars or criminals? Do we unlock doors to discovery or slam them shut with trauma? Every slap whispers to a child: you are worthless. Every whipping screams: your voice doesn't matter. Every blow steals a bit more of their innocence. Is this education—or strangulation? They say, "Without beating, children won't learn." Really? Did Albert Einstein need a slap to understand relativity? Did Alama Iqbal suffer ruler blows to express his spiritual vision? Did Leonardo da Vinci need punishment to paint the Mona Lisa? Did Marie Curie require beatings to win two Nobel Prizes? Did Shakespeare depend on leather belts to write Romeo and Juliet? Did Stephen Hawking have to be battered to theorize about black holes? No—knowledge grows with encouragement, creativity blooms with freedom, not fear. In truth, corporal punishment is the coward's tool and the currency of bullies. If we cannot protect children at their ABCs, what right do we have to build a just and peaceful society?

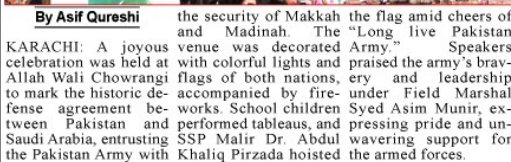

Pakistan Stands Firm: PM Tells UN Chief Multilateralism Must Be Protected

NEW YORK : Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif met United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly Session here and discussed matters of mutual interest.

During their warm and cordial meeting, the Prime Minister reaffirmed Pakistan's resolute commitment to strengthening multilateralism with the United Nations playing a central role in addressing the most pressing global challenges.

The Prime Minister appreciated the Secretary-General's remarkable leadership in promoting international peace and stability, as well as



UN's role in strengthening global governance with enhanced voice of the developing countries.

Expressing gratitude for the Secretary-General's appreciation of the Government's rescue and relief efforts during the recent

like Pakistan.

The Prime Minister emphasized issues of critical national and regional importance to Pakistan, particularly the Jammu and Kashmir dispute, violation of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) and externally sponsored terrorism in Pakistan. He urged a just and peaceful settlement of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with the resolutions of the Security Council.

The Prime Minister commended the Secretary-General's leadership and sincere efforts for de-escalation of recent tensions between Pakistan and India. Sharing serious concern over the burning

Khawaja Asif says Pakistan not selling nukes under Saudi defence pact

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has clarified that Pakistan is not selling nuclear weapons to Saudi Arabia under the recently signed landmark defence agreement, stressing that "we are responsible people".

Riyadh and Islamabad signed a "Strategic Mutual Defence Agreement" on September 17, significantly strengthening a decades-old security partnership, pledging that any attack on either nation would be treated as an act of aggression against both.



The deal was signed by Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in Riyadh, a week after Israel's strikes on Qatar ended the diplomatic calculus in the region. After the landmark defence agreement was signed, several international media outlets speculated that Pakistan's nuclear programme had been made part of the pact — a claim that quickly drew attention and fuelled debate. During an interview with journalist Mehdi Hasan for Zeteo, the defence czar was

questioned about the recently signed defence pact. Mehdi asked, "How much of it is a reaction to the Israeli bombing of Qatar?" In response, Asif clarified that the agreement was not a reaction to the Qatar attack. He emphasised that discussions on the pact had been ongoing for a considerable period of time. —RT/Agency

Diplomatic Earthquake: Iran Recalls Envoys from Europe Over UN Sanctions Clash

IRAN: Iran has recalled its ambassadors to Germany, France and the United Kingdom on Saturday for consultation over the dispute mechanism to reinstate UN sanctions, the country's Mehr state.

The move comes after a Russian and Chinese push on Friday to delay the revival of the international sanctions on Iran failed at the 15-member UN Security Council after only four countries supported their draft resolution, opening the door for the reimposition of sanctions.

A raft of UN sanctions on Iran over its nuclear program lifted under a landmark 2015 deal, will go back into force at the end of Saturday — barring a diplomatic breakthrough, thought to be unlikely.

The sanctions will be reimposed because the "E3" European group — Britain, France and Germany — triggered a mechanism in the deal alleging Tehran was not meeting its obligations.

Here are some key facts about the so-called "snap-back" process:

What do the sanctions target?

The sanctions target com-



panies, organizations and individuals that contribute directly or indirectly to Iran's nuclear program or the development of its ballistic missiles.

Providing necessary equipment, expertise, or funding are all grounds for sanctions that could help Iran's nuclear or ballistic programs.

Swath of the economy affected. The sanctions that will be reimposed include an embargo on conventional weapons with the prohibition of any sale or transfer of arms to Iran. Imports, exports or transfers of parts and technologies related to the nuclear and ballistic program will be prohibited. The assets of entities and individuals abroad belonging to Iranian persons or groups linked to the nuclear program will be frozen.

Individuals designated as participating in prohibited nuclear activities may be banned from traveling to UN member states.

UN member states will be required to restrict access to banking and financial facilities that could help Iran's nuclear or ballistic programs. Anyone violating the sanctions regime could see their assets frozen worldwide. The EU had its own sanctions. Separate measures by the European Union could now be reimposed alongside the core, global sanctions. Their goal was to hit the Iranian economy, not only to hamper nuclear activity but also to inflict fiscal pain to force Tehran to comply. —RT/Agency

UAE's Plea: Foreign Minister Presses Israel to End Gaza War Now

NEW YORK : UAE Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed stressed the urgent need for ending the Gaza war during a meeting with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York, UAE state news agency WAM reported on Saturday.

It was Netanyahu's first meeting with a senior Arab official since Israel's Sept. 9 attack on Hamas leaders in Qatar, which the UAE condemned and protested by summoning Israel's deputy ambassador.

The UAE, a major oil producer and regional trade and commerce hub with diplomatic sway across the Middle East, signed a US-brokered normalisation agreement with Israel under the Abraham Accords in 2020, which paved the way for close economic and security ties, including defence cooperation.

The Abraham Accords,



brokered by US President Donald Trump during his first term in office, saw the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Morocco normalise diplomatic relations with Israel.

Sheikh Abdullah reiterated the UAE's "unwavering commitment to supporting all initiatives aimed at achieving a comprehensive peace based on the two-state solution, in a way that fulfills the aspirations of both the Palestinian and Israeli peoples," WAM said. —RT/Agency

High-Stakes Talks: Ishaq Dar, German FM Grapple With Global and Regional Flashpoints



NEW YORK : Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Muhammad Ishaq Dar met German Foreign Minister Dr. Johann Wadepuhl on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly session and discussed matters of mutual interest.

They discussed bilateral, regional and global issues, and ways to strengthen Pakistan-Germany cooperation in

trade, investment, development, climate, skilled migration and people-to-people ties.

Earlier, Deputy Prime Minister/Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar held a constructive meeting with the Foreign Minister of Costa Rica Arnoldo Andre Tinoco in New York.

Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to enhancing bilateral ties as well as strengthening multilateral cooperation. —RT/Agency

Rally Disaster: 31 Killed, Dozens Injured in Stampede at Indian Star Vijay's Event



INDIA: At least 31 people were killed and more than 50 injured on Saturday at a rally held by Tamil actor Vijay, who is campaigning for election, state officials said.

"Thirty-one people died with more than 50 people now hospitalised," said V Selvaraj, a senior police official in the district of Karur in Tamil Nadu, where the incident occurred.

Large crowds had gathered for the meeting, part of Vijay's ongoing state tour for his political party Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam.

Vijay, who is a well-known actor and goes by

only one name, launched a political party last year and began campaigning this month ahead of state elections that are to be held early next year.

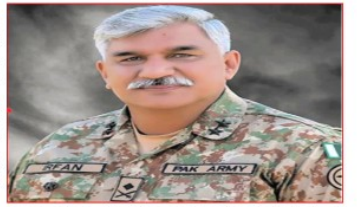
State lawmaker Senthil Balaji told reporters that 58 people were hospitalised after what he said was a stampede. He added that Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin will visit the area on Sunday.

You're Losing Friends!" — Greek PM Issues Stunning Rebuke to Israel Over Gaza

UNITED NATIONS: Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, a key partner of Israel within the European Union, warned that Israel risked losing remaining friends with its destructive war in Gaza.

Addressing the UN General Assembly, the center-right Greek leader said Israel had a right to self-defence after the October 7, 2023 at-

tacks by Hamas but cannot "justify the death of thousands of children." Greece maintains a strategic partnership with Israel, but this does not prevent us from speaking openly and frankly," Mitsotakis said. "The continuation of this course of action will ultimately harm Israel's own interests, leading to an erosion of international support," he

said. "I tell my Israeli friends they risk alienating all their remaining allies if they persist on a path that is shattering the potential of a two-state solution." Greece did not join European powers including France and Britain, which in recent days recognized a Palestinian state as they voiced exasperation with Israel. —RT/Agency

Beijing's Rising Star: China's No. 2 Makes Bold UN Debut Against US Pressure

NEW YORK: China's second-in-command sounded his nation's oft-repeated alarm against aggressive and unilateral action in global politics, addressing world leaders in a speech brimming with references that echoed long-standing concerns about the United States and the Trump administration in particular — and cast Beijing as a defender of the world order in an era of encroaching chaos.

Li Qiang's remarks also reflected his own continuing rise to prominence after being elevated to premier more than two years ago. Li made no major announcements and offered no specific policy revelations in



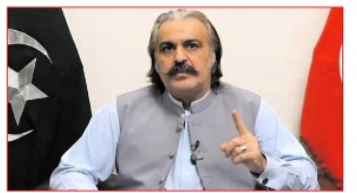
his speech to the U.N. General Assembly, as has typically been the practice of China in that forum in recent years. But his comments, in sweep and assertive tone, revealed several things — including what might be seen as his official debut on the world stage since his promotion 2½ years ago. "Unilateralism and Cold War mentality are resurfacing," Li said. "History keeps reminding us that when might dictates right, the world risks division and the law of the jungle return and the weak be left as prey to the strong, human society would face even more bloodshed and brutality." —RT/Agency

Judicial Magistrate Mubashir Hassan Chishti presided over the hearing.



As Ali Amin Gandapur did not appear before the court, the magistrate ordered that his arrest warrants remain in effect. The court adjourned the hearing until

October 4. The case was registered at Bara Kahu police station, involving the alleged recovery of liquor and weapons from the Chief Minister. —RT/Agency

Show of Force: Trump Deploys Federal Troops to Portland and ICE Sites Amid Chaos

US: US President Donald Trump on Saturday said he was directing Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth to send troops to Portland, Oregon and to protect federal immigration facilities against "domestic terrorists", saying he was authorising them to use "full force, if necessary."

"At the request of Secretary of Homeland Security, Kristi Noem, I am directing Secretary of War, Pete Hegseth, to provide all necessary troops to protect War ravaged Portland, and any of our ICE facilities under siege from attack by Antifa, and other domestic terrorists," Trump said in a post on his Truth Social platform.

Portland's mayor, Keith



Wilson, did not immediately respond to a request for comment. In a press conference on Friday, Wilson said an apparent influx of federal officers did not come at the request of the city, and called it an overreach and a distraction.

On Thursday, Trump told reporters that "crazy people" were trying to burn buildings in Portland. "They're

professional agitators and anarchists," he said, without providing evidence.

Trump has made crime a major focus of his administration even as violent crime rates have fallen in many US cities. His crackdown on Democratic-led municipalities including Los Angeles and Washington has fueled legal concerns and spurred protests. —RT/Agency

UN Spectacle: Netanyahu's Prop Show Sparks Global Eyebrows

JERUSALEM: In his speeches to the United Nations when world leaders gather, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has quite the history of turning to props and visual aids to hammer his points home. But even by the Israeli leader's elevated standards of showmanship, this year's address took things to a new level.

Moments into the speech, Netanyahu unfurled a map — titled "THE CURSE" (the all-caps were his) — in which he methodically used a fat marker to check off the countries where Israel has killed its enemies during a nearly two-year region-wide war.

He then addressed the audience with a pair of multiple-choice questions, depicted on a large card.



"Who shouts 'Death to America'?" he asked as he read off the names of Iran, Hamas, Hezbollah and Yemen's Houthi militia. The answer, familiar to anyone who has taken a standardized test: "All of the above."

Even before he took to the podium, Netanyahu's office said it had set up massive loudspeakers on trucks along the Gaza border to blare the speech to the people inside. He said

his intended audience included the Israeli hostages held captive in Gaza. "We have not forgotten you," he said. His office later claimed the Israeli army had hacked the phones of people of Gaza, including Hamas operatives, to make sure they heard his words. Inside Gaza, Palestinians said they could not hear the speech, and there were no immediate reports of phones being hacked. —RT/Agency
