

PM Shehbaz, Field Marshal Munir Fully Support Gaza Peace Plan: Trump

WASHINGTON: United States (US) President Donald Trump on Monday asserted that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Chief of Army Staff (COAS), Field Marshal Asim Munir, have fully backed the Gaza peace plan. "PM [Shehbaz] and Field Marshal, they were right with us from the beginning — incredible, in fact. They just put out a statement that they fully believe in this pact. They back this 100%," Trump said while addressing a joint press conference along with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. His remarks came hours after the prime minister welcomed Trump's plan aimed at ending the war in Gaza, saying a durable peace between the Palestinian people and Is-



rael is essential for regional stability and economic growth. In a post on X, the prime minister said he was "convinced that durable peace between the Palestinian people and Israel would be essential in bringing political stability and economic growth to the region." He added: "It is also my firm belief that President Trump is fully prepared to assist in whatever way neces-

Netanyahu Apologizes To Qatari PM Over Israeli Strike On Doha

WASHINGTON: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has reportedly formally apologized to Qatar's Prime Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani for the September 9 strike on Doha, which violated Qatari sovereignty, according to multiple media reports. Hamas had claimed that its central leadership remained safe in the strike, but six people, including the son of Khalil Al-Hayya, were martyred. Among the dead was also a Qatari security officer. Apology call from White House A source close to Netanyahu told Reuters, as well as according to Channel 12 and Axios report, that Netanyahu spoke with Al Thani where Trump expressed his desire to improve Israel-Qatar relations after recent grievances and misunderstandings. Qatar has been a critical mediator in negotiations between Israel and Hamas but had suspended its involvement after the September 9 strike. The attack, aimed at targeting Hamas leaders believed to be in Doha, failed to hit its intended targets and instead killed lower-level officials and a Qatari security officer. LONDON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday welcomed US President Donald Trump's plan aimed at ending the war in Gaza, saying a durable peace between the Palestinian people and Israel is essential for regional stability and economic growth. In a post on X, the prime minister said he was "convinced that durable peace between the Palestinian people and Israel would be essential in bringing political stability and economic growth to the region." He added: "It is also my firm belief that President Trump is fully prepared to assist in whatever way necessary to make this extremely important and urgent understanding to become a reality." PM Shehbaz praised President Trump's leadership and the role of US Special Envoy Steve Witkoff in bringing an end to this war. The prime minister reiterated his support for a two-state solution, saying, "I also strongly believe that the implementation of the two-state proposal is essential to ensure lasting peace in the region." Earlier on Sunday, PM Shehbaz told reporters that



the recent meeting in New York between President Trump and leaders of eight Arab-Islamic countries was encouraging. He said he was confident the talks would yield a positive outcome for a ceasefire in Gaza. The US president met key Arab and Muslim leaders at the United Nations last week and said on social media on Sunday that "All are on board for something special, first time ever."—RT/Agency

Nine Security Personnel Martyred In Ruthless South Waziristan Car Bombing

S. WAZIRISTAN: At least nine security personnel were martyred and eight others injured in a car bomb blast in the Sarwaki area of Upper South Waziristan on Monday, police confirmed. Car bomb targets security convoy According to police, the explosion took place in Molay Khan Sarai, where a vehicle packed with explosives detonated, hitting security personnel on duty. The attack was sudden and powerful, causing significant casualties on the spot. Casualties and injured shifted to hospital Police said nine personnel were martyred in the blast. At least eight others sustained injuries and were immediately shifted to a nearby hospital for medical treatment. Emergency teams and law enforcement rushed to the site to secure the area. Police confirmed blast in South Waziristan. Officials confirmed that the incident was indeed a bomb blast caused by an explosive-laden car. Additional contingents of police and security forces have been deployed to the area, while an investigation has been launched.—RT/Agency



Top Adviser Urges Iran To Join Pakistan-Saudi Defense Alliance

TEHRAN: Senior adviser to Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, Major General Yahya Rahim Safavi has said that Tehran should also join the defence pact agreed between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia. "Iran, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan and Iraq can reach a collective defence pact," said Iranian Revolutionary Guard's (IRGC) General Safavi, reported Iran International. The senior Iranian official's remarks refer to the "Strategic Mutual Defence Agreement" inked between Islamabad and Riyadh — marking a key milestone in strengthening a decades-old security partnership, pledging that any attack on either nation would be treated as an act of aggression against both. The deal was signed by Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in Riyadh, a week after Israel's strikes on Qatar upended the diplomatic calculus in the region. After the landmark defence agreement was signed, several international media outlets speculated that Pakistan's nuclear programme had been made part of the pact — a claim that quickly drew attention and fuelled debate. Defence Minister Khawaja Asif, an interview with journalist Mehdi Hasan for Zetex, has clarified that Pakistan is not selling nuclear weapons to Saudi Arabia under the defence pact.—RT/Agency



Dar Reveals Global Rush To Sign Defense Pacts With Pakistan Post-Saudi Deal

LONDON: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar has stated that several other countries are interested in signing defence agreements with Pakistan after Saudi Arabia. Speaking outside the Pakistani High Commission here, he said that Pakistan has proven its defence capability during Marka-e-Haq, and now it is time to become an economic power. He added that the agreement between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia is mutually beneficial, and no country has expressed reservations over it. In fact, several other countries are also interested in entering into similar agreements with Pakistan. In response to a question, Dar said that the government has nothing to do with the



legal cases against PTI founder Imran Khan. Dar has said Pakistan's economy is on the path to recovery, marked by growing international confidence and a surge in fresh investments. He said Pakistan has earned great respect within the global community and is now focused on further strengthening its economy while ensuring peace in the region and beyond. He further said that the recent five-hundred million dollars deal with a US company in the minerals sector is clear evidence of renewed economic engagement. He said the country is now moving towards genuine economic improvement and poverty alleviation.—RT/Agency

Imran Bars Aleema Khan From Meddling In Party Affairs

ISLAMABAD: The founder of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf has reportedly restrained his sister, Aleema Khan, from interfering in PTI matters, well-placed sources told media on Monday. According to details, two senior PTI figures from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa recently "lodged" complaints with the party founder against Aleema Khan. They informed him that he had been receiving misleading information about the provincial government. The leaders further conveyed that their lack of direct meetings with him had led to misunderstandings. Sources added that Aleema Khan was accused of providing inaccurate reports regarding the KP government. They noted that Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur's meeting with the PTI founder was aimed at clearing these misunderstandings. In August, Aleema Khan clarified that there has been no disagreement or argument with Salmun Akram Raja, stating that he remains their legal counsel and is considered "like family."—RT/Agency



Imran Expected To Be Shifted Out Of Adiala Jail

RAWALPINDI: There is a strong possibility that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan will soon be transferred from Adiala Jail, following the expected verdict in the Toshakhana-II case. Reliable sources indicate that a special prison facility has been prepared in the Qasim Market area of Rawalpindi, and all legal and administrative arrangements for the transfer have been completed. It is also being reported that Bushra Bibi, wife of Imran Khan, may be moved to the same special facility. A 40-member prison staff has been deployed there since July 31. The responsibility for the special jail has been handed over to the Deputy Superintendent of Prisons (DSP) Prisons for the Rawalpindi Region, Rana Rauf, has issued a formal notification regarding the staff transfers. A detailed security and surveillance plan has also been implemented. The dedicated team will provide round-the-clock supervision and management of the special facility.—RT/Agency



Trump Touts Strong Global Response To Gaza Peace Push

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump on Sunday expressed optimism about his proposal to end the war in Gaza, saying he has received a "very good response" and expects Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to support it when they meet at the White House on Monday. In a phone interview with Reuters, Trump said US special envoy Steve Witkoff and his son-in-law Jared Kushner, who played a key role in Middle East diplomacy during his first term, were already in discussions with Netanyahu in New York ahead of the meeting. "We're getting a very good response because Bibi wants to make the deal too," Trump said, referring to Netanyahu by his nickname. "Everybody wants to make the deal." The comments came as world leaders convened in New York for the United Nations General Assembly, where the US unveiled a 21-point Middle East peace plan aimed at ending nearly two years of fighting between Israel and Hamas in Gaza. According to a White House official, the proposal includes the return of all hostages, both living and deceased, an end to Israeli attacks on Qatar, and the initiation of renewed dialogue between Israel and Palestinian leaders with the goal of achieving "peaceful coexistence." Trump emphasized that the plan seeks to balance humanitarian concerns with security guarantees, while ensuring regional stability. "We're very serious about making this happen," he said. The Gaza conflict has killed tens of thousands and displaced millions, drawing sharp criticism of Israel's military campaign and growing calls for a permanent ceasefire.—RT/Agency



Russia Warns US Tomahawk Missile Supply To Ukraine Could Ignite Escalation

MOSCOW: Russia said on Monday that its military was analysing whether or not the United States would supply Tomahawk cruise missiles to Ukraine for strikes deep into Russia, a step that Russian officials say could trigger a steep escalation. US Vice President JD Vance said on Sunday that Washington was considering a Ukrainian request to obtain Tomahawks. President Donald Trump has not made a final decision, and he has been wary of escalating the Ukraine war into a direct confrontation with Russia. But the fact he is now weighing such a move shows the extent of his frustration with President Vladimir Putin's refusal to agree to a ceasefire since he hosted the Russian leader at a summit in Alaska last month. Tomahawks have a range of 2,500 km (1,550 miles) — easily far enough to hit Moscow and most of Europe. Russia if fired from Ukraine. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy cautioned Kremlin officials last week that they should "know where the bomb shelters are." Pentagon Orders Missile Makers To Double Production Amid Rising China Threat

The Pentagon has raised alarms over dwindling missile stockpiles, pushing major U.S. defense contractors to dramatically increase production in preparation for a potential conflict with China. Military leaders are pressing manufacturers to double—or even quadruple—the output of 12 critical weapons systems, including Patriot interceptors, SM-6, LRASM, JASSM, and PrSM. Pressure on contractors comes as the Pentagon fears current stockpiles would be insufficient in the event of a prolonged conflict in the Indo-Pacific. Missiles like the SM-6 and Patriot interceptors take more than two years to build, creating concerns about replenishment timelines. Lockheed Martin, Raytheon, Boeing, and Northrop Grumman have been asked how they could achieve a 2.5x boost in output within 6-24 months. Options being considered include tapping private capital, accelerating licensing, and expanding production capacity. The effort is being spearheaded by Deputy Defense Secretary Steve Feinberg through the newly formed Munitions Acceleration Council, with Feinberg personally calling company executives on a weekly basis to track progress.—RT/Agency

The district headquarters hospital is nominally called a 'civil hospital,' but lacks essential services and doctors. Many key specialist posts, including ophthalmology, dentistry, dermatology, ENT, anaesthesia, cardiology, and nephrology, remain vacant. Pa-

tients from remote areas face hardships and are often referred to hospitals in Thatta, Karachi, or Hyderabad due to inadequate local care. The hospital has only one doctor in its large emergency ward. Despite promises by the provincial health minister to improve services, the situation remains dire. Social activists and the People's Party chairman have urged the Sindh government to fill the vacancies and improve healthcare facilities urgently.

Shameful Spectacle: India Turns Cricket into a Stage for Arrogance and Ugly Politics

What unfolded in Dubai on Sunday was not just a sporting controversy—it was an ugly spectacle that revealed India's true face: arrogant, politicized, and contemptuous of the very spirit of cricket. By refusing to accept the Asia Cup trophy because it was to be presented by Pakistan's Mohsin Naqvi, India dragged its festering political insecurities into what should have been a moment of sporting triumph.

Cricket, the gentleman's game, is built on tradition, respect, and sportsmanship. Yet India once again shattered that sacred foundation, turning a glorious victory into a global embarrassment. Players pretending to celebrate with an "imaginary trophy" only highlighted their petty theatrics and exposed how far India has

fallen from its once-proud cricketing legacy.



The International Cricket Council (ICC), meanwhile, continues its disgraceful pattern of appeasement. Time and again, India behaves like the spoiled brat of world cricket, bending rules, hijacking narratives, and staining the game's reputation. Instead of holding India accountable, the ICC looks the other way—compromising its very purpose as custodian of fairness in cricket.

Equally baffling is the silence of the UAE government. The Emirates boast of being a neutral haven

where politics is kept out of sport and business, yet in this case, it allowed India to pollute the tranquility of its apolitical soil with ugly displays of chauvinism. Why has the UAE not publicly condemned India's actions? The credibility of its "politics-free" stance hangs in the balance.

Let us be clear: this is not about cricket alone. It is about a wounded nation exposing its insecurities, its arrogance, and its ethnocentrism for the world to see. Post the May standoff with Pakistan, India has once again shown that its pride is fragile, its behavior disgraceful, and its sportsmanship nonexistent.

What a shame. A victory that could have united fans across borders has instead become a lasting symbol of India's arrogance and cricket's betrayal.

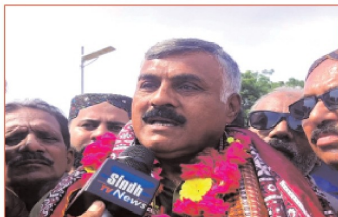

Chris Woakes Bows Out, Announces Retirement from International Cricket

KARACHI: England's experienced bowling all-rounder Chris Woakes on Monday announced his retirement from international cricket with immediate effect. The 36-year-old made the announcement on his Instagram handle with a detailed statement, captioned, "Pleasure has been all mine! No regrets." Woakes, who made his international debut in January 2011 against Australia, went on to represent England in 62 Tests, 122 ODIs and 33 T20Is. He was also a part of the England sides that won



the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup in 2019 and the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2022 in Australia. Woakes's last international appearance came in August this year during the fifth and final Test of the five-match home series against India, which was hindered by a shoulder injury. In his retirement statement, Woakes said representing England for around 15 years has been the biggest pride of his glittering career besides lifting the two World Cups and reiterated that it was the right time to step away from the sport. "The moment has come, and I've decided that the time is right for me to retire from international cricket," Woakes said in a statement. "Playing for England was something I aspired to do since I was a kid dreaming in the back garden, and I feel incredibly fortunate to have lived out those dreams. Representing England, wearing the Three Lions and sharing the field with teammates over the last 15 years, many of whom have become lifelong friends, are things I'll look back on with the greatest pride.—Agency

Nick Woltemade Rejects Gabriel's Apology After Brutal Elbow Clash in Arsenal Win



NEWCASTLE: Newcastle United forward Nick Woltemade has refused to accept an apology from Arsenal's Gabriel Magalhães, after the defender allegedly "elbowed him in the face" during a celebration at St James Park. The German striker voiced frustration over dangerous challenges and poor sportsmanship in the Premier League. Woltemade, who joined Newcastle this summer for a club-record £65m from VfB Stuttgart, had put Eddie Howe's side ahead with a 34th-minute header. "Television replays show Gabriel's arm catching Woltemade after the Brazilian scored a stoppage-time winner to seal Arsenal's 2-1 victory. Match officials and VAR took no action, and Gabriel later told teammates he had been pushed before the contact. In a post-match analysis, Newcastle's midfielder described the clash in detail, stressing that Gabriel's contact was deliberate and avoidable as it is not my type of game. "After the goal there was a situation I felt my elbow in my face in two metres, but I'm not the type of player to fall down for a club-record £65m from this. It's hard because sometimes maybe you have to do this, but this is not my type of football," Woltemade said. The 23-year-old said Gabriel apologised afterwards but insisted that it was not enough, adding that apologies do not excuse dangerous play.—Agency

Saad Habib Shines as Runner-Up at Sri Lanka Amateur Golf Championship

KARACHI: Pakistan's Saad Habib Malik finished runner-up at the 134th Sri Lanka Amateur Golf Championship after losing a tense playoff to local favourite Chanaka Perera at the Royal Colombo Golf Club. Habib was unlucky on the 17th hole, where he missed a putt by just a few inches that could have given him the lead. With both players even after 36 holes, the championship was decided in a playoff. Perera, benefiting from his familiarity with the home course, edged Habib in the playoff to lift the title. Habib's solid driving and iron play were offset by missed opportunities on the greens, while Perera's confidence in putting on familiar turf proved crucial.—Agency

Federer Reveals Secret to Outsmart Alcaraz, Applauds Fritz's Stunning Laver Cup Upset



Swiss tennis legend Roger Federer, at the 2025 Laver Cup, has praised Taylor Fritz's stunning win over Carlos Alcaraz and outlined the aggressive strategy needed to stop the World No. 1. The Spaniard has lost just seven matches all season, and his victory at the US Open saw him move ahead of long-time rival Jannik Sinner. That momentum makes him the favourite for the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) Finals to close out the year. Still, Federer shared his thoughts on how he would approach beating Alcaraz. He suggested that outmanoeuvring is one possible tactic to defeat Alcaraz, 22, although it is challenging to execute. "I mean, obviously it's surface-based, not every surface allows you just to power through. Maybe against Alcaraz, sometimes you have to outmanoeuvre him, which is obviously super difficult," Federer said. "What I did see is just what he's able to cover, and with the speed that he has, you have to go in with a mindset that you need to win the point twice." Federer, 44, also acknowledged that Alcaraz's athleticism often forces opponents into extra-pressure situations.—Agency

Agha Accuses India of Disrespecting Cricket with Asia Cup Trophy Snub

DUBAI: Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha voiced strong disapproval of India's stance during the recently concluded ACC Men's T20 Asia Cup 2025, stating that they are bringing disrepute to the sport. This year's continental tournament has been marred by controversies, with the Indian players denying handshakes with their Pakistani counterparts and eventually refusing to receive the prestigious trophy from Asian Cricket Council (ACC) President Mohsin Naqvi, who is also the chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board. The Indian team's stubbornness caused an hour-long delay in the commencement of the post-match presentation, drawing criticism from the cricket fraternity, including Ravi Shastri. The closing ceremony of the eight-team tournament eventually started after a long delay, with India's Kuldeep Yadav, Shivam Dube and Tilak Varma receiving individual awards for their respective performances in the summit clash, while Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha collected the prize money cheque for finishing as the runners-up. Later, Kuldeep was invited again to collect the award for finishing as the highest wicket-taker of the Asia Cup 2025, followed by left-handed opener Abhishek Sharma, who was adjudged the Player of the Tournament for scoring 314 runs in seven innings at an average of 44.85. The closing ceremony concluded without the winning team receiving the trophy, as presenter Simon Doull confirmed its conclusion. "I have been informed by the ACC that the Indian cricket team will not be collecting their awards tonight. So that does conclude the post-match presentation," informed Doull. Later, Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha addressed the post-match press conference and expressed his disappointment with India's rigid approach throughout the tournament. "What India have done this tournament is very disappointing," Agha told reporters. "They're not disrespecting us by not shaking hands, they're disrespecting cricket. Good teams don't do what they did today. We went to pose with the trophy on our own because we wanted to fulfil our obligations. We stood there and took our medals. I don't want to use harsh words but they've been very disrespectful.—Agency

The Board has been ordered to submit attested copies of NITs, bidder lists, contracts, delivery documents, payment details, and procurement committee member names by October 2, 2025. Statements will then be recorded. A copy of the directive is also with the DG of Anti-Corruption Sindh for further action.

Horror in Orangi Town as Father Gunned Down Before Children in Robbery Resistance

Karachi: In a tragic incident, robbers shot dead a citizen in front of his children during a robbery attempt in MM Colony, Rahmat Chowk, Sector 11½ of Orangi Town.

According to CCTV footage, the victim, Sajjad Shaikat, who had recently arrived from Faisalabad, was standing at his doorstep with his children when two armed men on a motorcycle approached. One suspect got off the bike and moved toward him. Sajjad resisted the robbery attempt, prompting the assailant to fire at close range. At the time of the shooting, Sajjad was holding his child, who ran inside the house in terror after witnessing the attack. The victim died on the spot. Police have obtained the CCTV footage and launched a search operation to trace the culprits. With this case, the number of people killed in Karachi during robbery resistance this year has risen to 65.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Asserts Civil-Military Unity On Economic And Foreign Policy Fronts

LONDON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that there is a consensus on all key issues, including foreign policy, between the country's political and military leadership, and the two are "on the same page."

"We consult on every issue. We are on one page and making sincere efforts [...] Mutual consultations are also held regarding the economic situation," PM Shehbaz said while speaking in London.

"I pray for this coordination and harmony among political leadership and institutions to make Pakistan not only overcome the past losses, but also reach new heights," he added.



Underlining the close working relationship between the civil and military leadership, the prime minister lauded the army chief, saying, "COAS Muneer is a true nationalist. He only cares for Pakistan. Under his leadership, both the army and air force have achieved remarkable successes. He is a man of vision and bravery. We discuss all important matters and make decisions in unity. It's all for Pakistan."

Speaking at the Pakistan High Commission following his return from a high-level diplomatic tour of the United States and Saudi Arabia, the

premier said that South Asia would have witnessed a major war if not for the intervention of US President Donald Trump.

He said Pakistan had nominated Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for his peace efforts in DRC, Ethiopia-Egypt conflict, and ongoing efforts for peace in Ukraine, recognising him as a "man of peace."

Referring to the recently signed Strategic Mutual Defence Agreement (SMDA) with Saudi Arabia, PM Shehbaz said that the pact is not against any other country, as Pakistan is not in any power struggle but is pursuing a focused approach to achieve economic prosperity by ex-

plotting its immense resources. "Saudi Arabia and Pakistan are brotherly countries, bound by decades and centuries-old ties. This pact is against no one but a formalisation of these ties... Every Muslim has a belief and is ready to sacrifice his life to safeguard Roza-e-Rasool and Makkah," he added.

He said that without indulging in any power struggle, Pakistan is striving to achieve its economic goals by addressing poverty, unemployment and exploiting immense potential in agriculture, artificial intelligence, mines and minerals as well as youth bulge by providing them education and skill training.—RT/Agency

National Assembly Passes Resolution Condemning Imran's Conduct Toward Senior Journalist

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly (NA) on Monday adopted a resolution condemning PTI founder Imran Khan's alleged mistreatment of senior journalist Ijaz Ahmed during court proceedings at Adiala Jail.

The episode began when members of the Parliamentary Reporters Association of Pakistan (PRA) walked out of the National Assembly proceedings to protest against the mistreatment of Ahmed.

The senior journalist had informed NA Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq and other parliamentary leaders about the exchange, saying that the PTI founder used abusive language against him when he asked a question.



In response, the PRA Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar, said such behaviour towards journalists was condemnable. He added that levelling accusations and issuing threats was a hallmark of the PTI founder.

Later in the proceedings, the House suspended rules to allow the resolution to be tabled.—RT/Agency

PM Claims Pakistan Offering Full Cooperation On Economic Revival

LONDON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that US President Donald Trump has assured Pakistan of complete cooperation in the fields of trade, economy, and investment, following a "very pleasant" meeting in Washington.

Speaking to journalists in London, Shehbaz Sharif said Pakistan's relations with the US have become more stable over the past few months.

"We discussed trade and investment, oil and gas exploration, and opportunities in mines and minerals," the PM said.

He added that Trump's commitment to economic cooperation could open new doors for bilateral investment.

PM Sharif revealed that he told Trump Pakistan nominated him for the Nobel Peace Prize for his role in preventing escalation with



India and for mediating conflicts elsewhere.

"If you had not intervened in time and the matter had escalated, who knows what would have happened?" he said, "We pray for your success and acknowledge your efforts for ceasefire in Gaza."

Imran Voices Unwavering Confidence In Ali Amin Gandapur

FBR Confirms No Extension For 2025 Tax Filing Deadline

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) on Monday rejected reports of an extension in the deadline for filing income tax returns for Tax Year 2025, reiterating that September 30 remains the final date.

In a statement, the tax body said it had taken notice of unverified reports circulating on various media platforms suggesting the deadline would be extended.

It is pointed out that a vast majority of taxpayers reside in areas unaffected by



floods and have had ample time to discharge their national obligation of filing returns."

The reports suggesting that the IRIS system has slowed down are also unfounded," the tax-collecting body further said, adding that FBR's IRIS platform is fully operational, functioning

smoothly, and taxpayers can easily file their returns using the new simplified income tax return form.

The tax authority also cautioned that failure to file returns by the due date will result in late-filer status and imposition of penalties under the law. FBR also urged all eligible taxpayers to act responsibly and file their income tax returns with accuracy and honesty before the deadline of 30th September, 2025, to avoid any legal consequences.—RT/Agency

Bloomberg Says Pak-Saudi Deal Signals Dawn Of Post-US Global Order

With decades of collaboration behind them, Pakistan and Saudi Arabia's recent announcement of a mutual security agreement might seem like just a formality confirming their ongoing partnership. However, it represents something far more significant.

According to Bloomberg, this pact serves as a first tangible sign of what a post-American world could entail, one characterised by increased insecurity, instability, and uncertainty.

The two nations were indeed close for decades. In 1967, two months after Israel's victory in the Six-Day



War, they signed a security agreement in which the country's battle-hardened military promised training and support to the Kingdom. Two years later, Pakistani pilots flew for Saudi Arabia in its war against communist South Yemen.

By the 1980s, the generals in Rawalpindi had sent their ally 15,000 soldiers to help protect a regime un-

nerved by the siege of Mecca in 1979. There were even Pakistani tanks stationed at Tabuk near the Kingdom's northwest border, a short drive from Israel's Red Sea port of Eilat. But such closeness seemed consigned to the history books in 2015 after Pakistan's National Assembly unexpectedly defied Riyadh — and perhaps their own military — by refusing to send soldiers to fight the Houthis.

The Saudis were outraged, especially since they had long been bankrolling their increasingly imprudent friends.—RT/Agency

Pakistan And IMF Launch Talks On \$1 Billion Loan Tranche

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has kicked off crucial talks with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to secure the next \$1 billion tranche under the \$7 billion loan programme.

The IMF review mission met with Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb and his economic team at the Ministry of Finance, holding in-depth discussions on the second economic review linked to the loan disbursement.

The meeting was also attended by Finance Secretary Imdadullah Bosal, State Bank Governor Jameel Ahmed, and Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) Chairman Rashid Mahmood Langrial,



among other top officials.

According to sources, both sides went back and forth over IMF conditions, Pakistan's recent economic performance, revenue collection, spending discipline, and ongoing reform efforts.

The IMF also asked for updates on anti-money laundering measures as well as

Petrol Prices In Pakistan Set To Surge From October 1

ISLAMABAD: The federal government is expected to increase the prices of petroleum products by up to Rs4.65 per litre for the next fortnight, beginning October 1, 2025 as part of its regular fuel price adjustment mechanism.

According to sources, the price of petrol is likely to rise by Rs1.97 per litre, while other petroleum products are also expected to experience significant hikes. The sources further indicated that the price of High-Speed Diesel (HSD) may increase by Rs2.48 per litre, light diesel by Rs1.76 per litre and kerosene oil by Rs4.64 per litre. Initial calculations for the revised prices have al-



ready been completed, and a summary of the proposed changes will be sent to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif for final approval. The Oil & Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) will forward the summary to the Petroleum Division, which, in consultation with the Ministry of Finance, will prepare the pricing proposal. Once approved by the Prime Minister, the new prices will be officially announced and set to take effect from October 1, 2025.—RT/Agency

SC Strikes Back: Justice Tariq Jahangiri Restored Amid Legal Firestorm

ISLAMABAD: In a dramatic twist, the Supreme Court on Monday suspended the Islamabad High Court's interim order that had barred Justice Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri from judicial work. The ruling immediately restored him to the bench. Senior lawyer

Muneer A. Malik argued the IHC order was unlawful, while bar councils rallied behind Justice Jahangiri.

The SC issued notices to the Attorney General's Office and petitioner Mian Dawood, adjourning further hearing till tomorrow.—RT

Mob Violence In Sialkot: Ahmadi Community Properties Torched, FIR Registered

SIALKOT: Police have booked multiple suspects after a violent mob attacked members of the Ahmadi community in Piro Chak village, vandalising and torching their properties.

The FIR, invoking terrorism charges, states that 200-250 armed men clashed with police, even snatching weapons. At least eight people, including five Ahmadis, were injured. Authorities

say the violence stemmed from a burial dispute, with investigators now probing those inciting religious hatred. Law enforcement has tightened security in the area.—Agency

Mohsin Naqvi Slams Modi For Dragging War Rhetoric Into Cricket

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Chairman and Asian Cricket Council (ACC) Chief Mohsin Naqvi has strongly criticised Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for "dragging war into sport", saying that such remarks undermine the spirit of the game. Hitting back at Modi, Naqvi, who is also the country's interior minister, said history has already recorded India's humiliating defeats at Pakistan's hands in the battlefield and cautioned that politicising sport with conflict reflected desperation rather than pride. "If war was your measure of pride, history already records your humiliating defeats at Pakistan's hands. No cricket match can rewrite that truth. Dragging war into sport only



exposes desperation and disgraces the very spirit of the game," Naqvi said in a post on X. The statement came in response to Modi's illogical tweet after India's win over Pakistan in Sunday's Asia Cup 2025 final, where the Indian premier had equated the cricket victory to "Operation Sindoor" to congratulate his players, only to invite wide-

Targeted Terror Returns: Policeman Gunned Down In Karachi's Landhi

KARACHI: A police constable, Qaiser of Sudaabad Police Station, was brutally shot dead by unidentified assailants in Bhains Colony, Landhi. The attackers fled after opening fire near 10 Number Road. Qaiser's body was shifted to Jinnah Hospi-

tal for autopsy before being lodged to heirs. Police handed an FIR and launched an investigation. The killing adds to a disturbing series of targeted attacks on police officials in Karachi, sparking alarm over worsening law and order.—RT

PIA Soars Again: Toronto Flights Resume After Suspension

KARACHI: Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) resumes its Canada operations today as the first Boeing 777 departs for Toronto at 8:30 am. The service was suspended from September 13 to 27 for mandatory aircraft maintenance. To facilitate travelers, PIA has announced a 15% discount on Canada flights valid until October 10, covering travel until December 19. The airline says the move ensures passenger safety while restoring much-needed international connectivity.—RT

Trump's Shock Move: 100% Tariff On Foreign Films

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump announced a sweeping 100% tariff on all foreign-made films imported into America, warning Hollywood's global model faces disruption. Dawn.com re-

ported. Trump claimed the US movie industry had been "stolen" by other countries, but provided no clarity on legal authority or implementation. Analysts warn the move could raise costs for studios and consumers, while sparking uncertainty for cross-border productions that have long fueled Hollywood's \$15.3 billion trade surplus. Industry leaders remain silent on the announcement.—RT

Afghanistan Plunged Into Blackout As Taliban Cut Communications Nationwide

KABUL: Taliban authorities on Monday imposed a sweeping nationwide communications shutdown, crippling internet and mobile services across Afghanistan, AFP reported. Connectivity dropped to

less than one percent of normal levels, according to watchdog NetBlocks, which called it a "total blackout." Officials said the move, ordered by Supreme Leader Hibatullah Akhundzada to curb

"vice," will last until further notice. Banking, customs, and essential services have been severely disrupted, deepening isolation for millions already struggling under strict Taliban restrictions.—RT

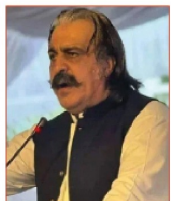
Court Issues Non-Bailable Warrant For CM Gandapur In Explosive Audio Leak Case

ISLAMABAD: A district and sessions court on Monday issued a non-bailable arrest warrant for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur in the audio leak case.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Nasr Minalah Baloch issued the warrants and ordered authorities to arrest the KP chief executive and produce him before the court.

The other suspect in the case appeared before the court for the hearing.

Following the issuance of a warrant for Gandapur, the



court adjourned the hearing till November 5.

It is to be noted here that the case was registered at the Gogra Police Station after an audio leak surfaced in which

the KP chief minister was purportedly asking about the number of weapons, licences, and people.

This is the second warrant issued for CM Gandapur this month. On September 10, a district and sessions court in the federal capital issued an arrest warrant for him in the alleged liquor and illegal weapons recovery case. Judicial Magistrate Mubashir Hassan issued the warrant after no representative appeared on behalf of Gandapur in the hearing.—RT/Agency
