Pakistan Army Showcases Power With Fatah-4 Cruise Missile Launch

A successful training launch of the newly-inducted indigenously developed Fatah-4, a ground-launched cruise missile, was conducted by the Pakistan Army at a range of 750 kilometres, Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Tuesday.

Equipped with advanced avionics and state-of-the-art navigational aids, this weapon system is capable of evading an enemy's missile defence system due to terrain-hugging features and engaging targets with high precision, it added.

As part of the Army Rocket Force Command, Fatah-4 will further enhance the reach, lethality and survivability of Pakistan Army's conventional missile systems.



Today's launch was witnessed by the chief of general staff, senior officers from Pakistan's armed forces, dedicated scientists and engineers. The president, prime minister, Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (JCSC) and services chiefs have also congratulated the participating troops, scientists and engineers on the successful conduct of Fatah-4's training fire. Amid heightened tensions with India in May, Pakistan had carried out the training launch of a Fatah series surface-to-surface missile with a range of 120 kilometres, as part of the ongoing military exercise, Indus, twice.—RT/Agency

Trump's Peace Plan Missing Pakistan's Demands: Dar

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar has said that United States President Donald Trump's proposed Gaza peace plan is not the one that contains all of Pakistan's suggestions. Dar explained that Islamabad held detailed discussions with Trump's team, asking them what Washington had in mind. He, during a conversation on Geo News programme "Aaj Shalhez Khanzada Kay Sath" said Trump's team shared certain points, and Pakistan responded that within 24 hours it would submit its amendments to those points. However, Dar stressed that the draft subsequently prepared by Washington did not include all of Pakistan's proposed changes. "This draft does not incorporate all our amendments," he reiterated.

He noted that Pakistan, along with several partner countries, issued a joint statement appreciating Trump's efforts. At the same time,



they repeated their own agenda, with Dar underlining that Islamabad would continue to pursue this agenda alongside Trump and his team. Dar added that Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Jordan, Egypt, Pakistan, Turkey and Indonesia, along with another coun-

try, decided to quietly make serious efforts regarding Gaza. Leaders and foreign ministers of these eight nations scheduled a meeting with Trump and his team. Before this meeting, the eight countries' foreign ministers devised a joint strategy. According to Dar, Trump told them that within 48 hours his team and representatives of the eight nations should sit together to prepare a workable plan.

Dar's statement came a day after Trump—standing alongside Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu—asserted that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Chief of Army Staff (COAS), Field Marshal Asim Munir, have fully backed his Gaza peace plan. Just hours before the US president's announcement, PM Shehbaz had welcomed Trump's plan, saying—a durable peace between the Palestinian people and Israel is essential for regional stability and economic growth. White House released Trump's 20-point plan that calls for a ceasefire, a swap of hostages held by Hamas for Palestinian prisoners held by Israel, a staged Israeli withdrawal from the Palestinian enclave, Hamas disarmament, and a transitional government led by an international body.—RT/Agency

Trump Lauds Field Marshal Munir's Praise As A Great Honour

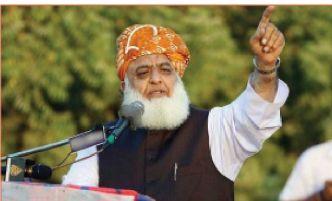
US: US President Donald Trump said that he considered the praise extended to him by Pakistan's Field Marshal Asim Munir as an "honour". Speaking to US military leaders on Tuesday, Trump said that the Pakistani Field Marshal had lauded his role in stopping the Pakistan-India war, which ultimately saved millions of lives.

"He said if the war had taken place, it would have been much worse," Trump noted. The US president added that Field Marshal Munir's remarks had left a positive impression on him. "I really liked his comment," Trump remarked. Trump further said that Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Munir had made these observations in the presence of others, including two generals, adding weight to his words. His statement came after his meetings with the army chief twice in



July. Trump and COAS Munir met over lunch at the White House Cabinet Room, where the field marshal acknowledged President Trump's statesmanship and his ability to comprehend and address the multifaceted challenges faced by the global community. Their second meeting was held earlier this month, as Trump, PM Shehbaz Sharif, and Field Marshal Munir held a meeting at the White House. Prime Minister expressed his "deep admiration" for United States President Trump, describing him as a "man of peace" engaged in sincere efforts to end conflicts around the world. Speaking during a warm and cordial meeting with President Trump at the Oval Office, the prime minister said the US leader's bold, courageous, and decisive actions had helped facilitate the ceasefire between Pakistan and India, thereby averting what he called a potential "major catastrophe" in South Asia, a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office read.—RT/Agency

Fazlur Rehman Blasts US, Declares No Peace Without Hamas



LAHORE: Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam Pakistan (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman has criticised US foreign policy, stating that the United States should not pursue "extremist or forceful policies". He asserted that Hamas is a central stakeholder in the Palestine issue, and excluding it from negotiations is unrealistic.

Speaking to the media, Maulana Fazlur Rehman emphasised that the Palestinian issue is currently the most pressing global concern. He referenced the founder of Pakistan, who once described the creation of Israel as "a dagger in the back of the Arab world." The JUI-F chief reaffirmed his party's stance that Israel is an illegitimate state. He criticised US President Donald Trump, accusing him of "imposing decisions" and condemned such behaviour as neither ethical nor political. Hamas says it will study Trump's peace plan before responding. Rehman stated that no solution can be imposed on Palestinians, and any discussion about a two-state solution must be based on mutual acceptance, which currently does not exist—Israel doesn't accept Palestine, and vice versa.—RT/Agency

Deadly Quetta Blast Near FC HQ Claims 10 Lives

QUETTA/RAWALPINDI: At least 10 people, including two Frontier Corps personnel, were martyred and more than 20 sustained injuries in a blast near Quetta's FC headquarters, Balochistan Health Minister Bakh Muhammad Kakar confirmed on Tuesday.

The explosion was followed by intense gunfire, sparking chaos and fear across the area. Security sources said that the blast was a suicide bombing carried out using an explosives-laden vehicle by Indian-sponsored terrorists dressed as FC personnel.

They said that a terrorist drove the vehicle into the FC headquarters, while five other terrorists attempted to storm inside the building's premises.

However, all six terrorists, including the suicide bomber, were killed as a result of swift action by security forces, the sources said. A clearance operation was also underway, they added.



Speaking to journalists at the Trauma Centre, Minister Kakar said that 26 injured were under treatment at Civil Hospital and the Trauma Centre, with the condition of five reported as critical. He condemned the incident, calling it another cowardly act of terrorism. He added that the security forces showed bravery during the attack and killed six terrorists in the encounter. The minister added that such attacks would not deter the resolve of the nation or its forces in the fight against terrorism. The initial reports by police suggested three

people were killed, with over a dozen injured. However, the toll was revised to five dead and over 20 hurt after Medical Superintendent of Civil Hospital Quetta Dr Abdul Hadi confirmed the number of casualties. The official said that all the casualties were civilians. Injured are being given medical aid, he added. In response to the emergency, a spokesperson for the Health Department confirmed that emergency protocols were imposed at the Civil Hospital, Bolan Medical College (BMC), and the Trauma Centre.—RT/Agency

Qatar Sets Stage For Gaza Peace Talks With Hamas, Turkey

DOHA Qatar: Qatar said it was set to hold talks with Hamas negotiators and Turkey Tuesday to discuss US President Donald Trump's Gaza plan, with a foreign ministry spokesman saying Hamas would study it "responsibly".

The comments come just hours after US President Donald Trump unveiled a plan in Washington calling for a ceasefire, release of hostages by Hamas within 72 hours, disarmament of the group and a gradual Israeli withdrawal from Gaza, followed by a post-war transitional authority headed by Trump himself.

Qatar and Egypt handed the proposal to Hamas on Monday, and "the (Hamas) negotiating delegation prom-



ised to study it responsibly," foreign ministry spokesman Majed al-Ansari told a press conference. He added: "There will also be another meeting today, also attended by the Turkish side, with the negotiating delegation."

The latest talks follow an earlier meeting on Monday between Hamas representatives and Egyptian and Qatari mediators in Doha. "It is still too early to speak about re-

Trump Warns Hamas, Recalls India's Humiliation By Pakistan



WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump has said that Hamas fighters have only three to four days to respond to Washington's Gaza peace plan, otherwise they could face severe consequences. Speaking to reporters at the White House, Trump stressed that Israeli and Arab leaders had already approved the proposal, leaving Hamas with a critical choice.

The president underlined that the plan is not open to much negotiation. "Hamas is either going to be doing it or not, and if it's not, it's going to be a very sad end," he told the media. According to him, Arab and Muslim nations, alongside Israel, have all expressed their support for the initiative. Peace plan deadline Trump said Hamas must decide swiftly on whether to

agree to the peace framework. "We're just waiting for Hamas," he added, pointing out that they have between three and four days to deliver a formal response. He warned that rejecting the offer would lead to a "very unfortunate outcome". The president insisted that the plan represents a rare consensus in the region, noting that multiple Arab leaders have already aligned with the proposal. Pakistan-India conflict During his remarks, Trump unexpectedly recalled past hostilities between Pakistan and India. He noted that in one of the military confrontations, Pakistan had successfully shot down seven Indian fighter aircraft. Without elaborating further, he described it as an example of the intensity of regional conflicts.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Not To Recognize Israel: Gohar

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan said on Tuesday that Pakistan will not accept any decision related to the recognition of Israel.

Addressing the media in Islamabad, Barrister Gohar said that Gaza holds great importance for Pakistan. He described the situation as a serious matter and said that Pakistan should only accept a resolution on Palestine that meets the approval of the Muslim Ummah.

He affirmed opposition to all decisions that seek to recognise Israel. The PTI chairman called on the government to provide an explanation in parliament regarding the woman seated behind



Defence Minister he had heard reports of the transfer of PTI founder Imran Khan from Adiala Jail. He said that, if true, the move would be condemned. He added that no one can be moved to another location in such a manner. He also made it clear that there are no talks currently underway with the government or the establishment.—RT/Agency

Seven Indian-Backed Militants Eliminated In Khuzdar Operation

KHUZDAR: Security forces killed seven Indian-sponsored terrorists in an intelligence-based operation (IBO) in the Zehri area of Balochistan's Khuzdar district, security sources said on Tuesday.

According to the sources, the security forces carried out the operation on the reported presence of "terrorists belonging to Indian proxy, Fitna al Hindustan". During the operation, seven terrorists have been killed so far, while ten others sustained injuries, they added.

Security forces also recovered improvised explosive devices (IEDs), transmitters, and US-made



automatic weapons from the killed terrorists. Grenades, ammunition, and motorcycles were also seized during the operation. The sources added that security forces further neutralised an IED planted by the terrorists at the Badukash bridge. The operation, they added, involved the use of both ground troops and helicopters. The Khuzdar IBO comes days after four terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy "Fitna al Hindustan" were killed in the same district on September 18. In May this year, the government designated all terrorist organisations in Balochistan as Fitna al Hindustan. The country has witnessed a surge in cross-border terror incidents since Taliban rulers returned to Afghanistan in 2021, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan. In August, the incidents surged by 74% compared to July, according to a report by the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies (PICSS)—RT/Agency

Political Earthquake In KP As Two Ministers Quit Cabinet

PESHAWAR: Two ministers from the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa cabinet have resigned from their posts.

Provincial Minister for Elementary and Secondary Education, Faisal Tarakai, has submitted his resignation to Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur.

Similarly, Provincial Irrigation Minister Aqibullah has also sent his written resignation to the Chief Minister.

According to sources, CM Gandapur had been



planning to remove both ministers. Discussions regarding their performance reportedly took place during a recent meeting between CM Gandapur and the party's founding chairman.—RT/Agency

For 725 long, bloody days, Gaza has been a graveyard of hope. More than 65,000 Palestinians and 400 Israeli soldiers lie dead, famine stalks the children, and an entire people have been driven from their homes. The world has failed them — again and again. Now, President Donald Trump has thrown down a peace plan that could be the last, best chance to stop this endless nightmare.

Let us be clear: the plan is far from perfect. Critics call it neo-colonial, accuse it of land grabs, and warn it ignores justice for Palestinians. Israel's far-right dismisses it outright, while Hamas drags its feet. Yet the

United Nations, Germany, China, Pakistan,



and others see in it a glimmer of hope. And in a war so cruel, even a glimmer is worth fighting for.

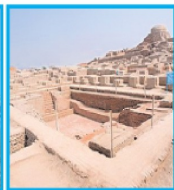

However, on the orders of SSP Badin Qamar Raza dered and was being buried quietly to cover up the crime. They appreciated the SSP's timely action, stating it would help reveal the truth and ensure justice for the deceased.

South Africa vs West Indies: T20I Series Cut Down to Three Matches



South Africa's only men's home international series this summer, against West Indies, has been shortened from five T20Is to three due to a clash with the T20 World Cup.

The series, initially scheduled between January 27 and February 6, will now conclude by January 31, when the World Cup support period begins. As a result, two fixtures have been dropped from the calendar.

The biggest casualties of this change are Newlands in Cape Town and Buffalo Park in East London, which will no longer host matches.

Instead, the three games will be staged at Boland Park in Paarl, SuperSport Park in Centurion, and the Wanderers in Johannesburg on January 27, 29, and 31.

With no home ODIs this season, the final T20I will serve as "Pink Day" — the annual event where the South African men's team plays in pink to raise awareness and

funds for breast cancer treatment.

In addition, South Africa have scheduled three Under-19 one-dayers against India from January 3 to 7 at Willemoore Park in Benoni, as preparation for the Under-19 World Cup. The tournament, co-hosted by Zimbabwe and Namibia, is set to begin in mid-January, with fixtures yet to be announced. South Africa's curtailed home summer is partly due to their packed international schedule abroad. They will defend their World Test Championship title in Pakistan next month, alongside three ODIs and three T20Is, followed by a full tour of India featuring two Tests, three ODIs, and five T20Is. Another factor behind the limited home fixtures is the ongoing preparation of venues for the 2027 ODI World Cup, which will be hosted by South Africa, Zimbabwe, and Namibia. —Agency

Ex-Pakistan Stars Slam Asif Afridi's Surprise Test Inclusion Against South Africa

Former Pakistan pacer Tanveer Ahmed and batter Sohaib Maqsood have raised concerns over the inclusion of spinner Asif Afridi in the national squad for the upcoming two-match Test series against South Africa.

Tanveer, voicing his criticism on social media platform 'X', questioned Afridi's selection by highlighting his age and statistics.

"Who is this Asif Afridi, the left-arm spinner? If it's him, then what's his performance — only 83 wickets in 60 first-class matches, and he's 38 years old. If it's really him, then it seems like a huge blunder has been made. He doesn't deserve a place in the Test team at all," Ahmed wrote.

The former fast bowler



went on to allege favoritism in selection, claiming that certain selectors were pushing Lahore Qalandars players into the national team regardless of merit.

"Brother, just say it once — as long as I am the selector, I will make every Lahore Qalandars player play for Pakistan, whether he deserves it or not. For example, Asif Afridi — it's a matter of shame that a 38-year-old has been named in the Test squad," he added.

Meanwhile, Maqsood also criticised the inconsistency of Pakistan's domestic cricket policies, pointing out the irony of barring players above 35 from the domestic

circuit while naming 38 and 39-year-olds in the Test squad.

"From banning 35-year-old players from domestic cricket to selecting 38, 39-year-old players in the Test squad — what a great cricket system. No vision, just a forced start," Maqsood wrote sarcastically.

It is pertinent to mention that the 38-year-old left-arm spinner has played 57 first-class matches, claiming 198 wickets at an economy of 2.92. His tally includes 13 five-wicket hauls and two ten-wicket match hauls.

Afridi was also the stand-out performer in the recently concluded Hanif Mohammad Trophy 2025-26, where he represented FATA Region. —Agency

Maxwell Sidelined from New Zealand T20Is with Fractured Wrist, Replacement Steps In

MOUNT MAUNGANUI: Australia have dealt another injury setback with Glenn Maxwell ruled out of the T20I series against New Zealand after suffering a fractured right wrist.

The all-rounder was struck by a Mitchell Owen straight drive while bowling in the nets and has since been sent home for further assessment.

Maxwell will consult a specialist in the coming days, with medical staff hopeful of a relatively quick recovery. However, he remains doubtful for the five-match home T20I series against India beginning on October 29.

His likeliest return is now expected for the start of the Big Bash League in mid-December, subject to medical clearance. The setback continues Maxwell's troubling run of injuries dating back to his broken leg in 2022.



Sydney Sixers and New South Wales wicketkeeper-batter Josh Philippe has been drafted into the squad.

Philippe was close to selection when Josh Inglis was ruled out with a calf injury, but Alex Carey was preferred ahead of him.

While Philippe is not a direct replacement for Maxwell, his inclusion provides backup in case Carey is unavailable, as Maxwell had been considered a stopgap wicketkeeping option.

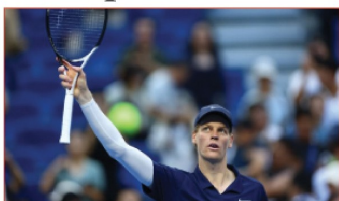
India series due to a back issue, while Nathan Ellis is unavailable for the Black Caps leg as he awaits the birth of his first child.

Sinner Survives Epic Battle to Reach China Open Final



BEIJING: Jannik Sinner extended his hardcourt dominance with a gritty 6-3, 4-6, 6-2 win over Alex de Minaur here at Diamond Court on Tuesday, booking his place in a third consecutive China Open final.

The Italian, defending champion in Beijing, reached a 4-2 lead in the opening set with a break to love and held firm under pressure to close out the set with confidence.

The third-seeded De Minaur rallied in the second set, Sinner's enthusiasm to tie the match and win just the second set against the world No. 4.

Sinner found another gear in the decider, even though he showed physical indications of exhaustion in the second set.

He then broke right away and never looked back, reaching his seventh straight hardcourt final and extending his winning streak over De Minaur to 11 games.

Sinner, a four-time Grand Slam winner, awaits the winner of the other semi-final

between rising American teenager Learner Tien and former US Open champion Daniil Medvedev.

Reflecting on his triumph, Sinner cited that both players got chances, and breaking De Minaur early provided him with confidence.

"I felt like the level was very high," Sinner said. "Many great rallies, many great chances for both. I had my chances in the second set and couldn't use them but he had his chances and it was quite an even match. In the third set I tried to raise my level."

"I broke him very early, which gave me confidence to then serve better. I am very happy about today. It was a different match than usual against him, it was a very even match." With this latest victory, Sinner continues to establish himself as a dominant force on hard courts, especially during the Asian swing, and remains a strong contender for the title in Beijing. —Agency

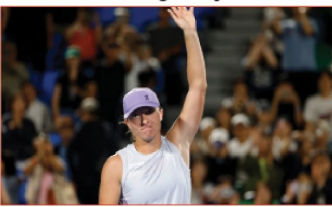
Iga Swiatek Blasts Grueling Tennis Calendar as Injury Toll Grows

World No. 2 Iga Swiatek has voiced concerns over the demanding length of the professional tennis calendar, describing it as "too long and too intense."

The 22-year-old four-time Grand Slam champion warned that the current schedule could eventually force her to skip even mandatory tournaments in order to protect her health.

Her comments come amid a spate of injuries during the WTA Tour's ongoing Asian swing. On Monday alone, five matches at the China Open were abandoned after players retired hurt.

Among them, Camila Osorio withdrew from her clash with Swiatek after the opening set, while Lorenzo Musetti and Zheng Qinwen were also unable to finish their matches.



Swiatek highlighted that the final stretch of the season is particularly difficult, especially in Asia.

"Unfortunately, the Asian swing is the hardest part because you feel like the season is going to finish soon, but you still need to push," Swiatek said.

"I don't know yet how my career is going to look in a couple of years. Maybe I will have to choose some tournaments and skip them, even though they are mandatory. The WTA, with these mandatory rules, made this pretty crazy for us."

Under current WTA regulations, top players are required to compete in all four Grand Slams, ten WTA 1000 events, and six WTA 500 tournaments. The WTA, however, defended its structure, stating that recent reforms aimed at balancing workload and rewards, with player wellbeing remaining a priority. —Agency

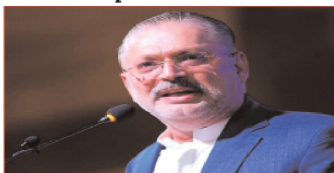
Sindh Narejo Welfare Team Reaches Out in Sujawal and Jhok Sharif Villages

Gas Mafia Cut Down: 3,000 Illegal Karachi Connections Wiped Out in Shah Latif Town



KARACHI: A major gas theft operation was uncovered in Shah Latif Town, Karachi, where 3,000 illegal gas connections were cut off by the Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC). According to the SSGC spokesperson, gas was being stolen directly from the main distribution line and supplied to over 2,600 homes. The perpetrators charged Rs20,000 for each illegal hookup and collected Rs1,500 monthly from consumers. Despite facing an angry mob attack, SSGC teams successfully disconnected the illegal lines. FIRs have been registered against those involved, and the company will pursue theft recovery claims against the gas theft mafia in court.—RT/Agency

Karachi Crime Wave: Comedian Wali Sheikh's Car Stolen, Robbed Twice in 15 Months



KARACHI: Karachi comedian Wali Sheikh reported his car stolen from outside his Malir home, calling it a devastating loss. This marks his second ordeal—he was robbed at gunpoint in June 2023 near the Northern Bypass, losing mobile phones and Rs85,000. Pakistan Considering Proposal To Send Troops For Palestine Peace Force: Dar

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar on Tuesday said Pakistan's leadership will decide on the possible deployment of personnel to a proposed peace force for Palestine, reaffirming that the country's policy on the issue remains clear with no change in its stance.

Addressing a press conference, the foreign minister defended the country's decision to back the Gaza peace plan, floated by US President Donald Trump, saying that ground operations in Palestine would primarily be handled by local law enforcement agencies.

"Indonesia has offered 20,000 personnel for the peace force," he said, adding that Pakistani leadership would also take a decision in this regard.

"I'm sure Pakistan will also decide — the leadership



will make the decision — and we have told them that whatever arrangement is made should be documented at the United Nations. There is also the UN peacekeeping force, but this was about a special force only for Gaza," he added.

His remarks came a day after the White House released Trump's 20-point plan that calls for a ceasefire, a swap of hostages held by Hamas for Palestinian prisoners held by Israel, a staged Is-

raeli withdrawal from the Palestinian enclave, Hamas disarmament and a transitional government led by an international body.

Addressing a presser, Trump said Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has agreed to a US-backed peace plan for Gaza, even as Israeli forces press one of their fiercest offensives in the battered Palestinian enclave.

The proposal calls for a ceasefire and the release of

hostages, but its success still hinges on whether Hamas will come on board.

During today's presser, Dar pointed out that five countries believe Hamas will accept the plan, and "we should trust their assurances." Dar added that the idea also includes establishing an independent technocrat government in Palestine, overseen by a supervisory body largely made up of Palestinians.

Dar clarified that Pakistan had not struck any deal directly with Israel. "If we had to deal with Israel, we would have done it directly. We deal with the United States and the United States deal with Israel," he asserted.

The deputy PM further confirmed that in his meeting with President Trump, Pakistan, along with seven other nations, agreed to the Gaza agenda. "We raised the mat-

ter of ceasefire and aid, and a secret understanding was reached for foreign ministers of the eight countries to hold further consultations with Trump's team," he disclosed.

He reiterated that Pakistan, alongside seven other nations, stands firmly united on the Palestinian policy. "Pakistan's policy is absolutely clear, and there has been no change in it," Dar underlined.

Engagements at UN-GA highlighting Pakistan's diplomatic role at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) session, Dar said Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif led the delegation and held meetings with International Monetary (IMF) officials, the Chief Adviser of Bangladesh, the President of Sri Lanka, as well as leaders from Arab states.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Vows Constructive Role In US-Led Palestine Peace Plan At UN

At the United Nations Security Council, Pakistan welcomed US President Donald Trump's initiative to advance a peace plan for Gaza and the wider Middle East, in coordination with eight OIC and Arab states.

Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad, Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the UN, told the Council members that Islamabad would actively participate in the consultative process to support a sustainable resolution.

"We value the initiative of President Donald Trump, working with eight OIC and Arab countries to advance peace through concrete measures," Ahmad said, addressing a briefing on the Middle East, including the Question of Palestine (SCR 2334).

"As a participant in this consultative process, Pakistan will closely engage and play a constructive role in promoting a consensus," Ahmad said, stressing that the goal is to alleviate the suffering of Palestinians and achieve a just, comprehensive, and lasting peace consistent with UN resolutions.

Mohsin Naqvi Rejects BCCI VP's Trophy Demand On Asia Cup 2025

Asian Cricket Council (ACC) Chairman Mohsin Naqvi on Tuesday rejected BCCI Vice-President Rajeev Shukla's repeated demand to hand over the Asia Cup 2025 trophy, asserting that the silverware should be collected by the Indian skipper in person, sources told Geo News.

The matter came up during a routine ACC meeting in Dubai, chaired by Naqvi, where Shukla repeatedly pressed for the trophy handover.

Naqvi, however, responded that the issue was not part of the meeting's agenda. After further insistence, he remarked that if the Indian team wanted the trophy, its captain should visit the ACC office personally to receive it.

No decision has been taken yet on whether the trophy will be handed over to the Indian side.



According to sources close to regional cricket bodies, BCCI officials — who attended the meeting virtually — reacted sharply to Naqvi's stance, demanding instead that the trophy be transferred to the International Cricket Council (ICC) headquarters.

Other ACC members reportedly attempted to defuse tensions, urging Indian officials to show restraint. However, the BCCI delegation abruptly left the meeting and

cut its digital feed.

The row follows a series of controversies involving the Indian team during the Asia Cup — from players snubbing handshakes to refusing to receive the trophy from Naqvi, who also heads the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB). The handshake incident had already drawn attention amid heightened tensions between the arch-rivals, stemming from the group-stage clash through to the final.—RT/Agency

IMF Demands Crackdown On Trade-Based Money Laundering

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has called on Pakistan to adopt effective measures to curb trade-based money laundering.

It urged monitoring of lawyers, law firms, and traders dealing in gold and silver, while also emphasizing the identification of beneficial owners. A target was set to implement an electronic system to ensure transparency in government procurement.

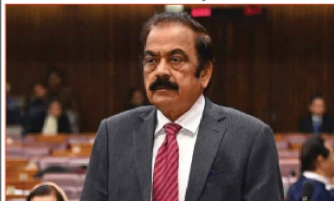
These demands emerged during the second economic review negotiations for the third tranche of \$1.2 billion from the international lender. The IMF sought a report from Pakistan outlining the risks and potential consequences of trade-based money laundering. It pressed for strict oversight of non-financial businesses and professional services. The Fund also underscored the need for transparency in the sale of re-



dundant government assets.

According to sources, the IMF listed several business sectors for monitoring, including lawyers, law firms, accountants, auditors and real estate agents. The scope of oversight also covers individuals and entities involved in the trade of gold, silver, gemstones and other precious metals. The monitoring extends to those registering new companies and managing shareholders and directors. The IMF has urged the government to implement an electronic procurement system to improve transparency in public purchases and sales. The sale or disposal of state-owned assets should also follow transparent procedures.—RT/Agency

Rana Sanaullah Sworn In As Senator Amid Political Frenzy



ISLAMABAD: Newly elected Senator Rana Sanaullah was sworn in on Tuesday during a Senate session.

The oath was administered by Senator Sherry Rehman. Later, Acting President Yousaf Raza Gillani hosted a luncheon at Awan-e-Sadr in honor of the senators, which was attended by lawmakers from various political parties.

During the gathering, participants discussed the overall political situation at home and abroad. They also reviewed ongoing relief and rehabilitation efforts in flood-affected areas.—RT/Agency

Flood-Battered Economy Shows Signs Of Resilience: Report

ISLAMABAD: The country's economy maintained its trajectory of stabilisation and growth during the first two months of the current fiscal year, despite disruptions caused by severe floods, the finance ministry reported here Tuesday.

Economy showed stability supported by moderating inflation, strong large-scale manufacturing (LSM), and improved fiscal discipline, according to the "Monthly Economic Update and Outlook" for September 2025 issued by the Finance Division.

Industrial momentum strengthened with the LSM sector posting 9% year-on-year growth in July, led by textiles, automobiles, and cement, it added.

Cement dispatches rose over 20%, while automobile production recorded sharp gains across vehicles.

Inflationary pressures eased considerably, with Consumer Price Index (CPI)



inflation dropping to 3.0% in August compared to 9.6% a year earlier.

On a cumulative basis, inflation stood at 3.5% during July–August FY26, down from 10.4% in the same period last year.

Fiscal accounts reflected resilience, with revenue mobilization and expenditure discipline helping to contain the deficit at 0.2% of GDP and yielding a primary surplus of Rs228.9 billion.

Federal Board of Revenue's collection rose 14.1% to Rs1.66 trillion during the period.

The external sector remained broadly stable.

Exports increased 10.2% to \$5.3 billion, while remittances climbed 7% to \$6.4 billion.—RT/Agency

Pentagon Chief Targets Fat Generals, Demands Resignations

US: US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth slammed "fat generals" and diversity initiatives that he said led to decades of decay in the military and told a rare gathering of commanders on Tuesday they should resign if they don't support his agenda.

"Foolish and reckless political leaders set the wrong compass heading and we lost our way. We became the 'Woke Department,'" Hegseth said as he kicked off the event in Quantico, Virginia. "But not anymore," he said.

Addressing a room full of America's top generals and admirals, summoned from around the world without explanation last week, Hegseth defended his firings of flag officers, which include the top US general, who is Black, and the Navy's top ad-



miral, who is a woman. He said the officers he relieved were part of a broken culture.

He promised sweeping changes to how discrimination complaints are handled and how accusations of wrongdoing are investigated at the Pentagon, saying the current system has top brass walking on "egg shells."

"If the words I'm speaking today are making your hearts sink, then you should do the honorable thing and resign," Hegseth said.

"I know the overwhelming majority of you feel the opposite. These words make your hearts full."

Hegseth criticised the look of overweight troops, saying: "It's completely unacceptable to see fat generals and admirals in the halls of the Pentagon."—RT/Agency

Govt Unveils Rs389bn Flood Relief Plan, Awaits IMF Nod

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has finalized preparations for a Rs389 billion relief package for flood-affected communities.

The package will be introduced through emergency funds allocated in the federal budget.

According to sources, the government plans to formally request the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to allow the launch of the Prime Minister's Relief Package for rehabilitation of flood victims.

The IMF, however, has asked Pakistan to provide detailed estimates of essential needs arising from flood-related damages.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has submitted an initial estimate of Rs40–50 billion in damages, while Sindh has projected around Rs40 billion in



losses.

Punjab is also expected to present preliminary figures for affected areas shortly. Provincial governments have agreed to mobilize additional revenues to support relief and rehabilitation.

Sources further disclosed that discussions with the IMF entered their fifth day, with dedicated sessions on National Finance Commission (NFC) matters and flood-related losses.

Officials from the finance ministry and the governments of Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and Balochistan participated in the talks. The IMF was briefed that Balochistan did not suffer significant damage from recent floods.

On the sixth day of negotiations, IMF representatives are scheduled to receive a detailed briefing from Punjab government officials, sources confirmed.—RT/Agency

US Starts Mass Deportation Of Iranians After Tehran Accord

DUBAI/WASHINGTON: The first group of about 400 Iranians expected to be deported from the US under President Donald Trump's immigration crackdown were due to land in Qatar on Tuesday before flying to Tehran, a US and an Iranian official said.

The group included both convicted criminals and people who had entered the country illegally, said the US official, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

The transfer marks an unusual moment of coordination between two nations at loggerheads over Iran's nuclear programme, which Tehran says is purely civilian but Washington asserts is aimed at building a nuclear



bomb.

The Iranian official, who also spoke on condition of anonymity, played down the idea of any political deal with the US, which joined Israeli air strikes on Iran and its nuclear facilities in June. The matter was consular, not political, the official said.

The Iranian foreign ministry's director general for parliament affairs, Hossein Nioushabadi, said the US was planning to deport around 400 Iranians, most of whom entered the country illegally, in line with the new anti-migrant approach of the US government.—RT/Agency

ADB Warns Floods Could Push Pakistan Deeper Into Crisis

ISLAMABAD: The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has cautioned that recent Pakistan floods could trigger inflationary pressures and slow economic growth, despite signs of recovery.

In its Asian Development Outlook report, the ADB said natural disasters such as floods pose serious risks to Pakistan's economic stability and growth trajectory.

The report highlighted that GDP growth is expected to remain around 3% in FY2026, with inflation averaging 6% due to supply chain disruptions, higher food prices, and an increase in gas tariffs.

According to the ADB, Pakistan's economy has shown improvement in 2025 under the IMF reform pro-



gram, supported by policy reforms and macroeconomic stability. The report projects further improvement in foreign exchange reserves and higher investment inflows, with a potential boost in business confidence from a forthcoming Pakistan-US trade agreement in FY2026. ADB Country Director Emma Fan said Pakistan's medium-term growth outlook remains positive, though structural challenges persist. She added that repeated natural disasters and the recent floods could weigh heavily on infrastructure, agriculture, and food supplies. The report noted that budgetary incentives for the construction sector may partly offset the damage, while the State Bank of Pakistan is expected to pursue a cautious monetary policy to manage inflation.—RT/Agency
