Pak Army Warns India of Catastrophic Consequences Over Provocative Rhetoric

RAWALPINDI: The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) has expressed deep concern over what it described as "unrealistic, provocative and war-mongering" statements issued by the senior leadership of Indian military.

In a statement, the Pakistan Army's media wing said that these irresponsible remarks indicate that India is once again provoking aggression and warned that such rhetoric could have serious consequences for peace and stability in South Asia.

The ISPR spokesperson asserted that for decades India has benefited from portraying itself as a victim while casting Pakistan in a negative light, but in reality has been involved in stoking violence and promoting terrorism across the region.

According to the ISPR, this narrative has now been fully exposed, and the world increasingly recognizes India as a source of cross-border terrorism and regional instability.



"The Indian aggression had earlier brought two nuclear powers to the brink of conflict," it added.

The ISPR added that it seems that India has forgotten the wreckage of its downed fighter jets.

India also appears to have ignored Pakistan's long-range strike capabilities, it added.

The spokesperson stressed that any future confrontation could result in catastrophic destruction, and warned that if the enemy resumes hostilities, Pakistan will not remain silent.

"We will respond decisively and without restraint," the ISPR said, adding that those contemplating a new pattern of behavior should be made aware of this.

Pakistan, it said, has already established a new benchmark for retaliation: its response will be swift, decisive and devastating, and the nation and its armed forces possess the capability and resolve to take the fight to every corner of the enemy's territory.

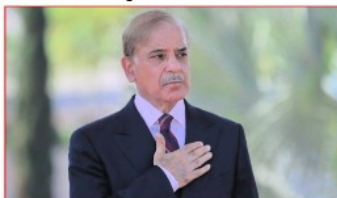
The ISPR also warned that Pakistan would break the notion of geographic immunity and target deep into Indian territory if necessary.—RT/Agency

Hamas' Response to Trump's Peace Plan Clears Way for Gaza Ceasefire: PM

ISLAMABAD: Hailing Hamas' response to the Trump-brokered Gaza peace plan, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Saturday that the statement issued by the Palestinian group opened a potential path to a ceasefire, urging the international community to seize the opportunity to end the war.

In a post on X, the prime minister reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to supporting lasting peace and stability in Palestine, saying that diplomatic progress must now translate into relief for the people of Gaza.

The statement comes after Hamas announced that it had accepted parts of US president Donald Trump's proposal aimed at ending the nearly two-year conflict and securing the release



of all remaining hostages from the October 7, 2023 attack.

The prime minister expressed gratitude to President Trump, as well as the leadership of Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, Jordan, and Indonesia, for their efforts during the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) sidelines meetings.

The premier said: "Alhamdulillah, we are closer to a ceasefire than we have been since this genocide was launched on the Palestinian people. Pakistan has always stood by the Palestinian people and shall always do so."

"The statement issued by Hamas creates a window for a ceasefire and ensuring peace that we must not allow to close again," he said, adding that Pakistan would continue to work with all brotherly nations and partners to [ensure] everlasting peace in Palestine.

Separately, the Foreign Office (FO) in a statement also welcomed the Palestinian group's response.

"This offers an important opportunity to secure an immediate ceasefire, end the bloodshed of innocent Palestinians in Gaza, release of hostages and Palestinian prisoners, ensure unhindered humanitarian assistance, and pave the way for a credible political process toward lasting peace. Israel must immediately cease attacks."

"Pakistan will continue to contribute constructively and meaningfully to this process," it said.

Hamas' response was also hailed by global leaders and allies, Palestinian Islamic Jihad.

"Hamas' (reaction) to Trump's plan represents the position of the Palestinian resistance factions, and the Islamic Jihad participated responsibly in the consultations that led to this decision," it said in a statement.

The group's approval of the plan could help facilitate the release of hostages held by both groups in Gaza.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said early on Saturday that Israel was preparing for an "immediate implementation" of the first stage of Trump's Gaza plan for the release of Israeli hostages following Hamas' response.—RT/Agency

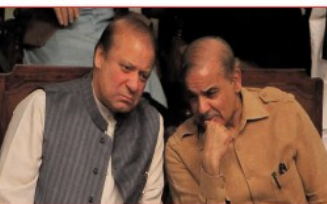
PM Claims Victory as Govt-JAAC Deal Restores Fragile Peace in AJK

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Saturday welcomed the successful outcome of the negotiations between the government and the Joint Awami Action Committee (JAAC), calling the restoration of peace and return to normalcy a positive development.

After carefully vetting the draft agreement, the government's negotiation committee and JAAC reached a deal that ended days of tension, which had sparked violent riots in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK).

The premier praised the efforts of the government's negotiation committee, commending its members for their dedication and hard work in resolving the crisis through dialogue.

"The government stands fully prepared to address the issues faced by our Kashmiri brothers," the prime minister said.



"Public interest and peace are our top priorities, and we will continue to serve the people of Azad Kashmir with full commitment."

"We have always been staunch defenders of the rights of our Kashmiri brothers and sisters. The concerns of Azad Kashmir have always remained a key focus for our government," he added.

Talks between JAAC, the AJK government, and federal ministers over special privileges and refugee seats

had collapsed last week. What began as a largely peaceful movement in AJK spiraled into unrest, with rival groups staging protests and accusing each other of inciting violence.

Deadly clashes between demonstrators and security forces left at least 10 people dead and dozens seriously injured.

A new round of negotiations took place between a senior government team and a civil society alliance, followed by another meeting.—RT/Agency

14 Indian Proxy Militants Sent to Hell in Balochistan's Khuzdar Operation: Sources



RAWALPINDI: Security forces gunned down 14 terrorists linked to Indian proxy Fina al-Hindistan during an operation in the Zehri area of Balochistan's Khuzdar, security sources said on Saturday.

They added that the operation was carried out on the reported presence of terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy, Fina al-Hindistan, resulting in the killing of at least 14 terrorists, while 20 militants were also injured.

Residents of Khuzdar's Zehri area praised the operation, acknowledging the efforts of the security forces in restoring peace and stability to the region, they said.

Sources added that the security forces remain fully committed to eliminating the remaining militants of the Fina al-Hindistan.

The Zehri operation comes days after security forces killed seven Indian-sponsored terrorists in an intelligence-based operation (IBO) conducted in the Sherani district of Balochistan. According to the ISPR, the security forces conducted an IBO on the reported presence of terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy, Fina al-Khawarij or the outlawed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP).

"During the operation, own troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location, and after an intense fire exchange, seven Indian-sponsored terrorists were sent to hell," the ISPR added.

Pakistan witnessed an alarming 46% surge in overall violence in the third quarter (Q3) of 2025, as per the latest statistics issued by the Centre for Research and Security Studies (CRSS).

The country reported at least 901 fatalities and 599 injuries, including civilians, security personnel and the terrorists, in a total of 329 incidents of violence, which also included terror attacks and counter-terror operations. The CRSS report highlights that by Q3, the ongoing year has proven nearly as deadly as last year, with 2,414 fatalities recorded compared to the entire tally of 2024, which reported 2,546 deaths in total.—RT/Agency

United We Stand: CM Maryam Calls for Unity in Face of National Challenges

LAHORE: Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz stated that Pakistan can overcome its current challenges only through unity and collective effort.

Addressing participants—both local and international—at the National Security War Course in Lahore, she said such joint training programs help strengthen inter-country relations. She also lauded Pakistan's armed forces for their professionalism and celebrated the historic success of Operation Bunyan-un-Marsoos.

She credited Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir's strategic brilliance for the military's significant achievements.

Maryam Nawaz highlighted Pakistan's vital geographical importance and acknowledged the nation faces both internal and external challenges. She stressed that only through united action, sound policies, and dedicated hard work can these be resolved.



"Good governance is the key to solving public issues, and providing top-quality services to citizens remains my top priority," she added.

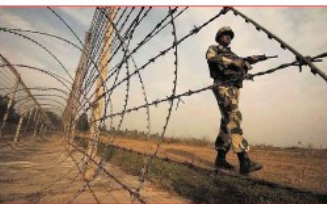
She reiterated her commitment to selfless and non-discriminatory service to the people, recalling the large-scale flood that recently struck Punjab. She detailed a massive rescue and relief operation that safely relocated 2.5 million people, ensured regular meal supplies, and provided top-tier healthcare in the affected areas. Indian Forces Slaughter Goats Near Zero Point in Tharparkar

ISLAMABAD: Indian forces have killed and injured several goats near Zero Point, land border crossing, in Tharparkar district of Sindh, in what livestock owners denounced as a "brutal act of aggression" that even targeted innocent animals. According to the owners, the incident occurred last evening in the village of Sunani in Delhi Tehsil. They said that in such situations, livestock are usually returned, but this time the animals were brutally attacked.

At least five goats were killed while the legs of 15 others were broken, the owners said, adding that the injured goats' legs had been cut



with a sharp tool. The incident comes amid heightened tensions between Pakistan and India following the four-day armed conflict in the backdrop of terrorists attack in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK). The May fighting,

the worst between the old foes in decades, was sparked by a terrorist attack on tourists in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir's (IIOJK) Pahalgam area, which New Delhi said was backed by Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Trump Weighs Sweeping Tariff Relief to Boost US Auto Production

U.S. President Donald Trump is considering significant tariff relief for U.S. auto production that could effectively eliminate much of the costs major car companies are paying, Republican Senator Bernie Moreno and auto officials told Reuters on Friday.

The signal to the car companies around the world is look, you have final assembly in the U.S.: we're going to reward you, Moreno said in an interview.

"For Ford, for Toyota (7203.T), for Honda (7267.T) for Tesla for GM, those are the almost in order of the top five domestic content vehicle producers, they'll be immune to tariffs."

Moreno, a former car dealer, serves on the Senate Commerce Committee that oversees auto issues and is



active in automotive policy matters. Automakers' shares rose on the news first reported by Reuters. Ford closed up 3.7 percent, Chrysler-parent Stellantis rose 3.2 percent and GM closed up 1.3 percent.

The extended tariff relief if finalized would give automakers more incentive to move car production to the United States, which would

fulfill a key Trump policy aimed at creating more jobs for Americans. The Commerce Department said in June that it planned an import adjustment offset equal to 3.75 percent of the suggested retail price for eligible U.S. assembled vehicles through April 2026 and then a second year at 2.5 percent to address tariffs from imported automobile parts.—RT/Agency

IMF Talks Loom as Pakistan Confronts Flood Losses and Economic Targets Review

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Saturday discussed review of economic targets in talks for third tranche of the IMF loan with the visiting team of the lender, owing to the losses in recent flooding. Pakistani officials briefed the visiting IMF team over flood losses as the flood affected provinces requested for review of the economic targets during the talks for third installment of the IMF loan. Sources said that the provinces in their demand for review of the set targets argued



that surplus provincial budgets could not be materialized owing to the devastating flooding. A target of 1,464 billion surplus budget was set for the provinces during the current financial year, papers read. According to sources Punjab could not achieve the target of Rs 740 billion surplus primary budget. Sindh has also requested the mission for reviewing Rs 370 billion budget surplus.—RT/Agency

Pakistan and Egypt Forge Joint Path for Lasting Gaza Peace

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Egypt on Saturday agreed to remain engaged and aligned in their efforts to help achieve a just and lasting peace in Gaza. Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar held a telephone conversation with the Egyptian Foreign Minister Dr. Badr Abdelatty. The two ministers

exchanged views on key matters of bilateral relations and regional developments, particularly the grave situation in Gaza. They discussed ongoing diplomatic efforts, including consultations held among Arab and Islamic countries in New York, aimed at securing an immediate and durable ceasefire, ensuring unhindered humanitarian assistance, and advancing collective initiatives to achieve lasting peace in Gaza. DPM Dar reaffirmed Pakistan's support for these efforts and noted Pakistan's welcoming of recent developments, including Hamas' response to the proposed peace plan, which offer hope for an end to the bloodshed.—RT/Agency

Punjab Govt Slaps Heavy Penalties on Delayed Car Transfers

LAHORE: Punjab government has imposed stricter penalties for individuals who fail to report vehicle ownership transfers within the specified timeframe.

The Punjab Excise, Taxation & Narcotics Control Department has issued a new notification announcing amendments to the Punjab Motor Vehicles Rules, 1969.

Details of the Amendment: The amendment applies to Rule 47(3) of the Punjab Motor Vehicles Rules. Under the revised law, if a transferee does not report a change in ownership within the prescribed period, they will be required to pay an in-



creased penalty in addition to the standard transfer fee. The fines are categorized by vehicle type and the duration of delay: For Motorcycles and Scooters 31-60 days late: Rs. 1,00,000-120 days late: Rs. 2,00,000 For All Other Vehicles (Cars, Jeeps, etc.) 31-60 days late: Rs. 1,00,000-90 days late: Rs. 20,00,000-120 days late: Rs. 30,00,000

According to officials, the revision is designed to ensure the timely reporting of ownership transfers, thereby maintaining accurate vehicle records and reducing fraudulent practices. The government also emphasized that failure to comply with the rules beyond 120 days could lead to additional legal complications.—RT/Agency

Tremors Strike KP: 4.3-Magnitude Quake Rattles Region

KP: A 4.3-magnitude earthquake shook parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Saturday night, according to the Pakistan Meteorological Department. Global Giants Abandon Pakistan

The steady exodus of multinational giants from Pakistan — with Procter & Gamble now joining the long list that already includes Microsoft, Uber, Shell, Eli Lilly, and Yamaha — is nothing short of an economic indictment. When corporations with decades of brand loyalty, billion-dollar balance sheets, and unmatched resilience decide that Pakistan is no longer worth the trouble, it should send shivers down the spines of policymakers. If global heavyweights with deep resources cannot make business viable here, how on earth are smaller firms supposed to survive?

While some analysts point to global restructuring as a reason, such explanations are convenient fig leaves. Yes, companies shift focus and streamline operations worldwide. But the common thread running through

these departures is Pakistan's increasingly inhospitable



business climate: unpredictable policies, crippling taxes, weak intellectual property enforcement, currency volatility, and an informal sector that undercuts legitimate enterprises. Add to that a deteriorating security perception, bureaucratic paralysis, and an almost deliberate indifference to investor concerns, and the picture becomes clearer.

The government may attempt to shrug off these exits as isolated corporate decisions. But perception matters

in business, and the perception today is brutal: Pakistan is seen as a market where investment is punished, not protected. Once that reputation hardens, attracting new capital becomes nearly impossible.

This is not merely about lost jobs or shuttered offices. It is about confidence — the confidence of the international business community in Pakistan's stability and seriousness as an investment destination. Losing that confidence is far more damaging than losing any single corporation.

The exit of these giants should not just be a source of embarrassment; it should be a wake-up call. Unless decisive reforms are enacted to restore predictability and investor trust, Pakistan risks being left behind in a world where capital is always welcome — just not here.

A significant portion of the revenue collected through these deals was allegedly distributed as commission to internal staff and

agents. Furthermore, GFS is reported to have acquired land using disputed documentation, with claims of misleading government projects and launching schemes on non-approved sites. Buyers were reportedly shown promising visuals and were offered bookings on these lands, the legal status of which remains uncertain. The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) is reportedly initiating inquiries to examine the matter in detail.

Grisly Discovery: Police Recover Tortured Bodies From Locked House

Shubman Gill Takes Charge as BCCI Axes Rohit Sharma From ODI Captaincy



The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has removed Rohit Sharma as India's One Day International (ODI) captain, handing the leadership to Shubman Gill in a significant generational shift.

Gill's vice-captain for the Australia series will be Shreyas Iyer.

According to Indian media, the decision, taken by the Ajit Agarkar-led selection committee in consultation with head coach Gautam Gambhir, comes just months after Rohit lifted the Champions Trophy, a triumph that proved insufficient to extend his captaincy tenure.

At 26, Gill has quickly established himself as the face of India's new cricket-

ing era. Having already replaced Rohit as Test captain following his retirement from the format, Gill was widely seen as the natural successor in ODIs. The management made the switch with an eye on the 2027 ODI World Cup, which will be co-hosted by South Africa, Namibia and Zimbabwe.

"A couple of things really, firstly it's practically impossible to have three different captains for three formats, just in terms of planning, obviously at some stage you got to start looking at where the next World Cup is, it's also a format which is played the least now," Agarkar said at a press conference in Ahmedabad.—Agency

Skyrocketing Costs Force Man Utd Fan to Pay Double for Match Experience

The football might be worryingly similar at Manchester United this season but as Sunderland prepare to come to Old Trafford and heap more pressure on beleaguered head coach Ruben Amorim, one thing has certainly changed.

The protests in front of the directors' box that were a recurring feature of United home games have gone.

"They've shifted everyone out," said 81-year-old Michael Carney.

"They have padded seats now. Thrown in a meal in Manchester and a couple of drinks before the game... I saw an advert, a seat near where I was, it was £599. I was paying £23."

Carney was one of the season ticket holders told by the club they were being relocated at the end of last season as the area was turned into a corporate zone.

He had been sitting in the same seat since 1980. Many of the fans he sat with had become friends.

The protests - with the homemade messaging - captured attention but did nothing to alter the club's stance. Minority shareholder Sir Jim Ratcliffe pushed on in his quest to drive up revenues, cut costs and slash losses.

Keep doing what I'm doing, keep working hard, keep showing up, and just keep the confidence and momentum going," he added.—Agency

Ruben Amorim Admits Manchester United Job Hanging by a Thread Amid Dismal Run

Ruben Amorim has admitted that his position as Manchester United manager is under growing scrutiny, saying it would be 'naive' to expect to remain in the job without improved results.

United have won only nine of their 33 Premier League games since Amorim's arrival 10 months ago, and the pressure is set to intensify if his side fail to beat newly promoted Sunderland at Old Trafford on Sunday.

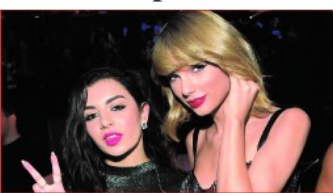

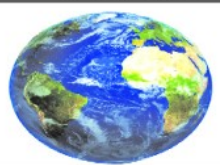

Egyptian Wrestler Stuns World by Dragging Ship With His Teeth

Ashraf Mahrous, 44, pulled it across the water in Egypt's Red Sea resort of Hurgada on Saturday. Mahrous, nicknamed 'Kabonga' and known to Egyptians as 'strongman', later pulled two ships weighing about 1,150 tons (1,043,000kg) together.

Mahrous said afterwards: "Today, I have come to break the world record. I pulled them both, thanks to God, to prove to my friends and the whole world that God blessed me by being the strongest man in the world." The wrestler, from the port city of Ismailia, said he will send videos and photos of his attempt to Guinness World Records to see if he has set a new mark, as the current record is a 614-ton (557,000kg) ship set in 2018.

In March, Mahrous pulled a train weighing 279 tons (253,105kg) with a rope in his teeth for nearly 10 metres (33ft) and was formally recognised by Guinness World Records for the heaviest rail pull, along with certificates for the heaviest locomotive pull and for the fastest 100-metre road vehicle pull.—RT/Agency

The Punjab and Haryana High Court held the right to a legible medical prescription was part of the fundamental right to life under Indian constitution.

"The right to know the medical status of a human being is inseparably linked with the right to life," Justice Jagdeep Singh Puri said, adding that ambiguity caused by bad handwriting could put lives at risk.

Justice Puri was hearing a criminal case from the



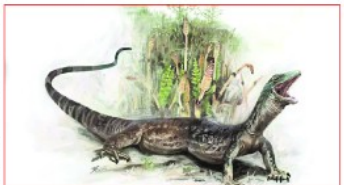
northern state of Haryana and was unable to read the medico-legal report of a victim.

"It shook the conscience of this court as not even a word or a letter was legible," he said, according to a media report.

"It is very surprising and shocking to note that in this era of technology and accessibility of computers, the notes on the medical history and on the prescriptions by government doctors are still written by hand, which cannot be read by anybody except perhaps some chemists."—RT/Agency

Scotland Unearths 160-Million-Year-Old Beast, Part Lizard and Part Snake

SCOTLAND: Researchers have discovered a mysterious ancient lizard with snake-like teeth in Scotland. Breugnathair elgolensis is one of the oldest relatively complete lizard fossils and helps scientists better understand the origins of snakes in the Jurassic period. The fossilized skeleton of a Jurassic reptile that appears to be part lizard, part snake, has been unearthed on Scotland's Isle of Skye. This mysterious lizard had hooked, snake-like teeth for hunting down prey 167 million years ago, a new study has found. The



newly discovered species is named Breugnathair elgolensis, which means "false snake of Elgol," honoring the creature's confusing anatomy and the Elgol area of southern Skye, where the fossil was found, according to the study published Wednesday (Oct 1) in the journal Nature.—RT/Agency

Climate Shift Leaves Yellow Warblers Trapped With Wrong Beaks

COLUMBIA: Climate change is not waiting for the next century. It is changing local conditions today, and some wild populations are struggling to keep up.

In a new study, researchers have tracked how genetics, beak shape, and weather combine to affect the yellow warbler's health across North America. The results reveal where birds are already mismatched with the climate they now face.

The study was led by Ma-



rina Rodriguez at Colorado State University (CSU). Her team focused on the bill because it affects heat and water balance, two pressures that rise as landscapes dry and warm.

A bird bill can function as

a controllable thermal radiator, as shown with infrared imaging in toucans in previous research. Birds direct blood toward the bill to dump heat when hot, then restrict flow to conserve warmth when cool.

The team measured bills, sequenced DNA, and linked both to local climate across the breeding range. The goal was to connect genes, traits, and environment without assuming a single driver.—RT/Agency

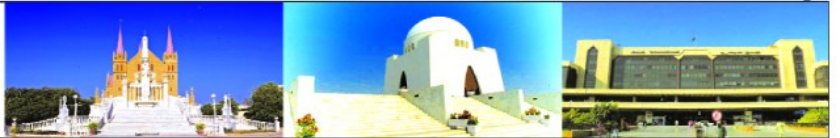

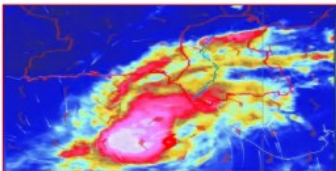

KARACHI: The cyclonic storm Shakhti over northern Arabian Sea further intensified into severe cyclonic storm moved westward during past 12 hours, PMD's Cyclone Warning Center said on Saturday.

In its alert PMD said that the storm now lay centered at around Latitude 22.0N and Longitude 65.0E at about 390km south-southwest of Karachi.

It is likely to move west-southwestwards and reach northwest and adjoining central north Arabian Sea by 5th October then it will recurve and move east-northeastwards.

Under its influence, light to moderate intensity rain likely in Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Jamshoro districts of Sindh and Hub, Lasbela, Awaran, Kech, districts of Balochistan. Rainfall is also likely at isolated places in Karachi division today, according to alert.

Sea conditions are likely to remain rough to very rough with squally winds 40-50 gusting 55km/hour near Sindh coast. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into deep sea till 5th October.—RT/Agency

Sindh Police Press British Authorities for Details on Stolen UK Range Rover Found in Karachi

KARACHI: The Sindh police have requested Interpol and the British police to share the detailed log of a tracker fitted in a high-end vehicle reported stolen from the United Kingdom and recently spotted in Karachi.

The black Range Rover Sport was stolen on Nov 11, 2022 from Harrogate, UK, and in February this year, with the help of its tracker, it was located in Karachi on

Korangi Road. Later, Interpol sent a letter to the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) in Islamabad, the Karachi police and the Anti-Vehicles Lifting Cell (AVLC), alerting them about the stolen vehicle.

Talking to Dawn on Friday, Inspector General of Police Ghulam Nabi Memon said that the Interpol's letter was received

two days ago at the office of AVLC SSP.

"We have sent an email to the UK police and asked them to send us a detailed log of the tracker fitted in the vehicle," he said.

The IGP said that the police also sought the source of the active location of the vehicle from the tracker, as the vehicle was last spotted in Karachi on Feb 11, 2025.—RT/Agency

PIA Set to Resume UK Flights From October 25

KARACHI: Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has officially announced the resumption of its air operations to the United Kingdom, with flights scheduled to begin on October 25.

In the first phase, PIA will operate two weekly flights from Islamabad to Manchester, scheduled for

Tuesdays and Saturdays. According to PIA's spokesperson, the flight from Islamabad will depart at 12:00 pm and arrive in Manchester at 5:00 pm local time.

The return flight from Manchester will depart at 7:00 pm and land in Islamabad at 7:00 am the next morning.

The airline has expressed plans to gradually increase the frequency of flights to Manchester. Additionally, London flights will be launched in the second phase of the operation. PIA has also opened bookings for these flights, offering competitive and affordable fares to attract passengers.—RT/Agency

Trump's \$100,000 Hike in H-1B Visa Fees Faces Courtroom Showdown

US: A coalition of unions, employers and religious groups filed a lawsuit on Friday seeking to block President Donald Trump's bid to impose a \$100,000 fee on new H-1B visas for highly-skilled foreign workers.

The lawsuit filed in federal court in San Francisco is the first to challenge a proclamation Trump issued two weeks ago announcing the fee as the Republican president moves to further restrict immigration to the United States.

Plaintiffs include the United Auto Workers union, the American Association of University Professors, a nurse recruitment agency and



several religious organisations.

They argued that Trump's power to restrict the entry of certain foreign nationals does not allow him to override the law that created the H-1B visa programme.

White House spokes-

woman Abigail Jackson, in a statement, said Trump's administration engaged in lawful actions "discouraging companies from spamming the system and driving down American wages, while providing certainty to employers who need to bring the best

talent from overseas."

The programme allows US employers to hire foreign workers in speciality fields, and technology companies in particular rely heavily on workers who receive H-1B visas.

Critics of H-1Bs and other work visa programmes say they are often used to replace American workers with cheaper foreign labour. But business groups and major companies have said H-1Bs are a critical means to address a shortage of qualified American workers.

Employers who sponsor H-1B workers currently typically pay between \$2,000 and \$5,000 in fees, depending on

the size of the company and other factors.

Trump's order bars new H-1B recipients from entering the United States unless the employer sponsoring their visa has made an additional \$100,000 payment. The administration has said the order does not apply to people who already hold H-1B visas or those who submitted applications before September 21.

Trump, in his unprecedented order, invoked his power under federal immigration law to restrict the entry of certain foreign nationals who would be detrimental to the interests of the United States.—RT/Agency

Russian Missile Strike on Ukraine Train Station Leaves One Dead, 30 Injured

RUSSIA: Two Russian drones struck trains at a station in Ukraine's northern Sumy region, killing one person and injuring about 30 others, officials said on Saturday, with Ukraine's foreign minister accusing Moscow of deliberately hitting passenger trains.

"A brutal Russian drone strike on the railway station in Shostka, Sumy region," Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy wrote on Telegram, posting a video of a wrecked, burning passenger carriage and others with their windows blown out.

Ukraine's foreign minister Andrii Sybaha accused Russia of deliberately conducting two strikes on passenger



trains.

"This is one of the most brutal Russian tactics—the so-called 'double tap', when the second strike hits rescuers and people being evacuated," he said in a statement released by his ministry on social media.

Sumy region governor Oleh Hryhorov said eight people had been taken to

hospital. "The Russians could not have been unaware that they were targeting civilians. This is terrorism, which the world has no right to ignore," Zelenskyy wrote. Moscow has stepped up its airstrikes on Ukraine's railway infrastructure, hitting it almost every day over the last two months.—RT/Agency

47 NUST Scientists Break Into Top 2 Percent of Global Rankings

ISLAMABAD: An impressive total of 47 researchers from the National University of Sciences and Technology (NUST-Islamabad) have been recognised among the world's top 2% research luminaries from over 100,000 leading researchers in 2025, as per the global rankings compiled by Stanford University and Elsevier.

The number of NUST researchers, featuring among the top 2% of the world's most celebrated researchers, has steadily increased in recent years, with 23 in 2022, 31 in 2023, 43 in 2024, and now 47 in 2025.

This upward trajectory reflects the conducive research environment and robust academic ecosystem at NUST, enabling scholars to produce



highly impactful work.

Notably, as many as 26 researchers from NUST have been consistently ranked in the list year after year.

NUST has consistently made headway in its R&D pursuits, strengthening its position as a leading institution in Pakistan and contributing to the nation's progress through transformative higher

education. According to the QS World University Rankings 2025-26, NUST stands at #371 globally, #67 in Asia, and #6 in South Asia. The ranking is based on a composite index that factors in multiple bibliometrics, including citations, h-index, and authorship positions across disciplines.—RT/Agency

Palestinian Islamic Jihad Rallies Behind Hamas Response to US Gaza Plan

GAZA: Palestinian Islamic Jihad, an ally of Hamas that also holds Israeli hostages, on Saturday endorsed Hamas's response to a U.S. plan to end the war in Gaza — a move that could help pave the way for the release of Israeli captives still held by both groups.

"Hamas' (reaction) to Trump's plan represents the position of the Palestinian resistance factions, and the Islamic Jihad participated responsibly in the consultations that led to this decision," the Iran-backed Palestinian Islamic Jihad, which is smaller than Hamas but seen as more hardline, said in a statement.

Hamas, the Palestinian group that controls Gaza, on Friday accepted certain key parts of U.S. President Donald Trump's plan, including ending the war, Israel's withdrawal and the release of Israeli hostages and Palestinian captives.

Hamas' stance, and its backing by Islamic Jihad,



may raise the spirit of Gazans, who had watched one ceasefire effort after another fail as Israeli strikes pulverized the strip over the past two years, created a humanitarian crisis, and displaced millions.

"It's happy news, it saves those who are still alive, it saves the people, and thank God that they (Hamas) agreed. This is enough, good people. We are tired, tired," said Palestinian Saoud Qarneyta, 32.—RT/Agency

JI Applauds Hamas' Response to Gaza Peace Deal as Dignified Stand

LAHORE: Jamaat-e-Islami has praised Hamas' reaction to the proposed Gaza peace agreement, calling it a "responsible and dignified step toward a peaceful resolution."

In an official statement, Jamaat-e-Islami chief Hafiz Naeem ur Rehman said that Hamas' response reflects the aspirations and wisdom of the Palestinian people.

He commended Hamas for showing maturity and responsibility in how it handled the proposed peace plan.

Hafiz Naeem emphasized that Hamas is not seeking a temporary truce but a permanent ceasefire. He called the group's demand for prisoner exchange under appropriate conditions



completely justified. He also backed the insistence on the complete withdrawal of Israeli forces and the establishment of a Palestinian technocratic administration, not one imposed by international powers — labeling both as fully legitimate demands.

He further stated that the finer details of these matters will be negoti-

ated through mediators, and praised Hamas for avoiding any unnecessary or inflammatory language in its official response. Hafiz Naeem ur Rehman urged Pakistan and all Muslim nations to welcome and support Hamas' stance, describing it as a rational and strategic step toward a just and lasting peace.—RT/Agency

Turks and Tourists Rush to Istanbul After Israel Blocks Gaza Flotilla

ISTANBUL: Thirty-six Turks and nationals from 12 countries were due to arrive Saturday by a special flight to Istanbul after Israel stopped a Gaza-bound aid flotilla and detained hundreds of people, Turkish officials said.

A Turkish diplomatic source said the plane carried 137 flotilla participants including 36 Turkish nationals and was expected to land at 15:40 local time (1240 GMT).

"The plane carrying our citizens and third-country nationals has taken off for Istanbul," the source added.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Onur Keceli announced earlier Saturday that a special flight had been chartered to fly the detained



activists back from Israel.

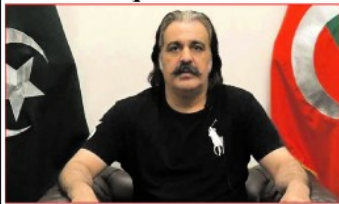
Turkey has called the Israeli interception on the flotilla "an act of terrorism" and on Thursday said it had opened an investigation after Israeli forces arrested Turkish citizens on board the flotilla.

Israel blocked similar flotilla attempts to reach the Gaza Strip in June and July.

The Turkish diplomatic source said nationals from the United States, United Arab Emirates, Algeria, Morocco, Italy, Kuwait, Libya, Malaysia, Mauritania, Switzerland, Tunisia, and Jordan planned to be on the Turkish Airlines flight.

Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani said 26 Italian nationals would be on the plane to Istanbul.—RT/Agency

Islamabad Court Upholds Arrest Warrant for Gandapur in Arms and Liquor Case



ISLAMABAD: A district and sessions court in federal capital on Saturday upheld the arrest warrants for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur in a case related to the recovery of alcohol and weapons.

Judicial Magistrate Mubashir Hassan

Chishti conducted the hearing, but Ali Amin Gandapur was absent from court.

The court maintained the arrest warrants and adjourned the case until October 18.

A case has been registered against Gandapur at the Bara Kahu police station.—RT/Agency

US Appeals Court Strikes Down Trump's Bid to End Birthright Citizenship

US: President Donald Trump's effort to curtail birthright citizenship was declared unconstitutional by a second US appeals court handing him another defeat on a core piece of his hardline immigration agenda whose ultimate fate may lie with the US Supreme Court.

A three-judge panel of the Boston-based 1st US Circuit Court of Appeals upheld in-

junctions won by Democratic states and immigrant rights advocates that have stopped the Republican president's executive order from taking effect nationwide. Trump's order, issued on his first day back in office on January 20, directs agencies to refuse to recognise the citizenship of US-born children who do not have at least one parent who is an American citizen or lawful

permanent resident, also known as a "green card" holder. US Circuit Judge David Barron said Trump's order violated the US Constitution's 14th Amendment, which states that anyone born in the United States is considered a citizen. He said the length of the court's 100-page ruling should not be mistaken for a sign that the fundamental question was difficult.—RT/Agency

Indus Conclave 2025: Miftah Ismail Pushes for New Provinces to Fix Governance Crisis

LAHORE: Former Finance Minister Miftah Ismail stated that matters would not improve until powers are transferred to the grassroots level while emphasizing that if decentralization is not possible, then new provinces should be created.

Speaking during a panel discussion on social sector development on the second day of the Indus Conclave, Miftah Ismail remarked that while faces in Pakistan have changed, development has not.

He stressed that if governance is not functioning properly, then it must be reformed. "Pakistan has not been running well for a long time. The government has



never truly delivered, nor provided quality education or healthcare."

27 Million Children Out of School The former finance minister highlighted that in the past six years, taxes have increased while income has declined. "There are 27 million children out of school — 11 million in Punjab and 7 million in Sindh."

He added that since 2019, Pakistan's Human Development Index has dropped by six points. "The government collects taxes but fails to provide basic services. We have failed in education and healthcare. India and Bangladesh have surpassed us. Purchasing power in Pakistan is declining rapidly."—RT/Agency

Senate Gridlock Deepens as US President Freezes Chicago Aid Amid Shutdown Crisis

US: US President Donald Trump's administration froze \$2.1 billion in Chicago transit funding starving another Democratic city of funds as a bid to end the government shutdown failed again in the Senate.

On the shutdown's third day, Trump ramped up pressure on Democrats to end the standoff and agree to a Republican plan that would restore government funding. But that failed in a 54-44 Senate vote, short of the chamber's 60-vote standard, ensuring that the shutdown will last until at least Monday.

The administration has now frozen at least \$28 billion in funding for Democratic cities and states, escalating



Trump's campaign to use the extraordinary power of the US government to punish political rivals. Budget director Russ Vought said the Chicago money, earmarked for elevated train lines, had been put on hold to ensure it was not "flowing via race-based contracting."

Trump has made Chicago,

the nation's third-largest city, a regular rhetorical punching bag and has threatened to send in National Guard troops.

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker, a high-profile Trump critic seen as a possible 2028 Democratic presidential candidate, said the funding freeze amounted to hostage-taking.—RT/Agency

Historic Shockwave in Japan: Sanae Takaichi Poised to Become First Female PM

JAPAN: Japan's ruling Liberal Democratic Party has elected hardline conservative Sanae Takaichi, 64, as its new leader, positioning her to become the nation's first female prime minister. The move aims to restore public trust amid growing anger over inflation and rising sup-



port for opposition parties

vowing economic relief and benefits immigration control. Takaichi's selection signals a sharp political shift that could unsettle both markets and regional powers. A parliamentary vote to replace outgoing PM Shigeru Ishiba is scheduled for October 15.—RT

LAHORE: Speaking on the second day of Indus Conclave 2025, former National Security Advisor Moeed Yusuf has remarked that the country needs to provide a feasible atmosphere to get any benefits attached with AI as this field is highly complex.

He said: "We are providing degrees not education; we are not providing learning. Right now, we have 260 universities in Pakistan but what is missing is the high-quality and learned faculty. Because at the end of the day, somebody has to teach artificial intelligence. Nobody will come to learn AI on his own."

He added, "We are talking about AI but first of all, there is need to provide the conducive environment. The country has to come out of mediocrity in order to get benefits from AI."—RT/Agency
