Soldier Martyred, Comrade Injured In Ruthless Bannu Ambush

BANNU: A soldier was martyred and another injured when unknown assailants opened fire on them near Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Bannu district on Sunday, according to the police.

Recently, multiple areas of KP — including Bannu, Peshawar, Karak, Lakki Marwat and Bajaur — have seen a series of terrorist attacks, particularly targeting police personnel.

Spokesperson for Bannu Police Kashif Nawaz told Dawn.com, "A security personnel was killed and another was injured when they were attacked by unknown assailants near the Ayub fuel station on Miranshah road."

He added that the body and the injured were rushed to the District Headquarters Hospital in Bannu, while a



police team was dispatched to the site of the incident to collect information.

Pakistan has witnessed an uptick in terror activities over the past year, especially in KP and Balochistan, after the proscribed Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) ended its ceasefire with the government in November 2022 and vowed to target security

law enforcement agencies. Last month, a police constable was shot dead by unknown assailants in Bannu while he was on his way to work. On September 2, six soldiers were martyred, while five terrorists were killed as security forces thwarted an attack on the Federal Constabulary (FC) Headquarters in Bannu.—RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz Touches Down In Kuala Lumpur For Pivotal Malaysia Visit

MALAYSIA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif landed in Kuala Lumpur on Sunday for a three-day official visit to Malaysia at the invitation of his Malaysian counterpart Anwar Ibrahim, the Prime Minister's Office said in a statement.

Malaysia's Information Minister and Pakistan's High Commissioner to Malaysia, Syed Ahsan Raza Shah, and other diplomatic staff received PM Shehbaz upon his arrival at the Bunga Raya International Airport in Kuala Lumpur.

From there, the prime



minister was escorted with state protocol to Malaysian PM Anwar Ibrahim's residence, where the Malaysian leader welcomed him. PM Shehbaz thanked his

Malaysian counterpart for the warm welcome, stating that the visit would deepen bilateral ties between the two countries.

The Foreign Office had

said that a high-level delegation comprising Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, federal ministers and senior government officials, are also accompanying the prime minister.

Before his departure, the prime minister said he was looking forward to a comprehensive exchange of views with PM Ibrahim and expressed confidence that Pakistan-Malaysia relations will continue to flourish through enhanced economic and strategic engagement.

"I will be undertaking an

official visit to Malaysia from October 5-7 on the invitation of my dear brother, PM Ibrahim. Greatly looking forward to a comprehensive exchange of views on our common desire to enhance trade and economic engagement as well as bilateral cooperation in various fields," the prime minister posted on X.

During the visit, the prime minister is scheduled to hold bilateral talks with his Malaysian counterpart and will discuss key regional and global developments, the FO added.—RT/Agency

Israel Expels 29 More Gaza Aid Flotilla Activists

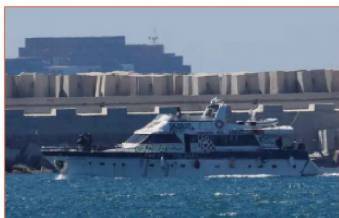
JERUSALEM: Israel has deported a further 29 activists detained by the navy last week for taking part in a flotilla that sought to deliver aid to blockaded Gaza, the foreign ministry said on Sunday.

The flotilla, which set sail in late August, marked the latest attempt by activists to challenge the Israeli naval blockade of the territory where Israel has been waging an offensive since Hamas' October 2023 attack. Israel says that the blockade is legal and has called the flotilla a provocation.

Israel has so far deported at least 170 of the more than 450 activists it detained. The government has faced accusations of mistreatment, including allegations that some activists were denied access to their lawyers — claims that the foreign ministry denies.

ISRAELI LEGAL CENTRE SAYS SOME ACTIVISTS ALLEGE ABUSE

The foreign ministry on



Sunday said that the legal rights of the activists were being "fully upheld" and that some had chosen not to sign deportation orders waiving

their right to a 72-hour delay, which would have allowed them to be deported sooner.

Adalah, a legal center in Israel representing the activists, said some of those detained have alleged abuse and physical violence while in Israeli custody. Other accusations of mistreatment include being denied medical treatment and medication, and in one case, a Muslim

woman was allegedly forced to remove her hijab and was offered a shirt as a replacement. Asked about the allegations, an Israeli foreign ministry spokesperson accused them of "repeating outright lies." "All the detainees' legal rights were fully upheld, and they were all given access to water, food, and restrooms. They were not denied access to legal counsel, and of course, no physical force was used against them," the spokesperson said.—RT/Agency

Pakistan Among 8 Arab States Backing Trump's Ceasefire Push On Israel



US: Eight Muslim Arab countries, including Pakistan, have welcomed US President Donald Trump's call for a ceasefire with Israel.

In a joint statement on the Gaza peace plan, the eight countries expressed approval of Hamas's positive response to the US peace initiative. The demand for a ceasefire with Israel was described as commendable.

The statement was issued by Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Türkiye, Qatar, Jordan, Indonesia, the United Arab Emirates and Egypt. It welcomed Hamas's readiness to release prisoners and urged immediate negotiations to implement the peace plan. The Arab Muslim countries pledged to play their role in the plan's execution.

US President Donald Trump has ordered Israel to halt bombing in the Gaza

Strip. This development follows Hamas's willingness to accept some elements of the peace plan.

Hamas declared its readiness to release hostages and transfer power to other Palestinian factions, though it emphasised the need for consultations on other points. Senior Hamas leaders indicated that significant differences remain and require further negotiation.

Meanwhile, talks are taking place today in Egypt to address peace in Gaza and prisoner exchanges. According to British media, delegations from Hamas, Israel, Qatar, the United States, Egypt and Türkiye are attending the talks.

The discussions are expected to focus on the implementation methods of the first phase of Donald Trump's plan.—RT/Agency

Rubio Warns Gaza War Far From Over, Hostage Crisis Still Priority

WASHINGTON: The war in Gaza has "not yet" ended, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said on Sunday, describing the release of the hostages held by Hamas as the first phase, while details on what happens after that still need to be worked out.

He told NBC's Meet the Press that Hamas had "basically" agreed to President Donald Trump's proposal and the framework for releasing the hostages, while meetings were underway to coordinate the logistics of that.

"They have also agreed, in principle and generalities, to enter into this idea about what's going to happen afterwards," he said. "A lot of details are going to have to be worked out there." Speaking later to Fox News Sunday, Rubio said that nothing was certain.

"No one can tell you it's a 100 percent guarantee," he said.

He described the second



Rubio told NBC the US would know "very quickly" whether Hamas was serious or not during the current technical talks to coordinate the release of the hostages.

"Priority number one, the one that we think we can achieve something very quickly on hopefully, is the release of all the hostages in exchange for Israel moving back" to the yellow line — where Israel stood within Gaza in the middle of August — Rubio said.

Pakistan Eyes Demolition Of Roosevelt Hotel For Towering Skyscraper Project

NEW YORK: Pakistan is considering options for the Roosevelt Hotel in Midtown Manhattan as part of the South Asian nation's efforts to meet its commitments to the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

One of the options is to raze the storied landmark and build a skyscraper in its place, said Muhammad Ali, adviser to the prime minister on privatisation.

The government is keen on a joint venture where Pakistan will contribute the land and the partner will bring in the equity, he told Bloomberg in Islamabad. The other option is to retain the hotel if it makes economic sense, he said.

Once a historic hotel owned by Pakistan International Airlines (PIA), it closed during the pandemic, briefly housed migrants, and has since



been shuttered.

"We will have clarity on this in the next few months after finalisation of the JV partner and market sounding," Ali said. The adviser is hopeful that the national carrier will be sold by November 2025.

He said the groups interested in buying PIA are among the largest business groups in the country and have the capacity to run it. Ali estimated that an investment of about half-a-billion

dollars would be needed to turn the airline around.

Pakistan is in the process of appointing advisers for the hotel transaction, dubbed by some as "the new Ellis Island" for its historical role as a migrant intake point.

The government will finalise a new adviser later in October 2025 after bids from seven groups, including Citigroup Inc, CBRE Group Inc, and Savills PLC.—RT/Agency

Ex-Senator Mushtaq Ahmed Held By Israeli Forces, Declared Safe: FO



ISLAMABAD: The Foreign Office has confirmed that former Senator Mushtaq Ahmed is in the custody of Israeli forces, but remains safe and well.

FO spokesperson Shafiq Ali Khan said the government was working for the early and secure return of all its nationals aboard the Global Sumud Flotilla. Following the detention of volunteers by Israeli forces from the international convoy delivering humanitarian aid to Gaza, the Foreign Office provided details regarding Pakistani citizens on board.

In response to media questions, the spokesperson confirmed that diplomatic sources in a friendly European country conveyed the information about Mushtaq Ahmed's status. He is expected to appear in court under local legal procedures. If deportation orders are issued, the Government of Pakistan will prioritise his repatriation.

The Foreign Office also confirmed that the Ministry facilitated the safe return of Pakistanis who disembarked from the aid vessel in the first phase. Pakistan expressed gratitude to all brotherly countries for their cooperation. The process to return the remaining Pakistani citizens is expected to conclude in the coming days, the FO spokesperson added.—RT/Agency



PESHAWAR: The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government has withdrawn all cases filed against Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leaders and workers in connection with the May 9 riots.

During the violence, triggered after former prime minister Imran Khan's arrest in a graft case, the miscreants targeted the civil and military installations including — Jinnah House and the General Headquarters (GHQ) in Rawalpindi.

The unrest has caused much legal and political woes for the former ruling party whose senior leaders, including founder Imran Shah Mehmood Qureshi, the Yasin Rashid and others, still remain behind bars over their alleged involvement in various incidents.

According to an official notification issued by the provincial Home Department, the decision was made after approval from the KP cabinet.

The notification also stated that Additional Advocate General Muhammad Inam Khan Yousafzai has been appointed as the special prosecutor to represent the government in court proceedings related to the matter.

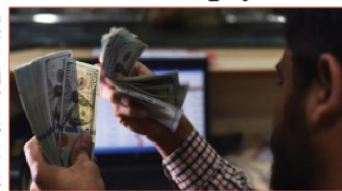
With the KP government's move, PTI sees a major legal relief for dozens of its workers and leaders in the province. However, the final decision on withdrawal now rests with the courts, which will review the government's request at the next hearing scheduled for October 15.

KP AG Utmanikhel, in a video message, said that all terrorism-related cases filed on May 9 were politically motivated, registered without evidence or proper investigation, and amounted to political victimisation by the caretaker government.

He added that the chief minister had ordered their withdrawal after cabinet approval.—RT/Agency

Finance Adviser Boasts: Pakistan's Default Risk has Plummeted Sharply

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has recorded one of the sharpest drops in default risk in Emerging Markets (EM), second only to Türkiye, said Khuram Schehzad, Adviser to the Finance Minister, on Sunday. Citing a Bloomberg report in his post on X, Schehzad said that the country recorded a 22% reduction in sovereign default risk over the last 15 months (from June 2024 to September 2025) as measured by CDS-implied default probability. The 22% reduction is the sharpest decline among major EMs, in contrast to rising default risks in countries such as Argentina, Egypt, and Nigeria, among others, he



stated. Schehzad was of the view that the drop in the default risk signalled strengthening investor confidence in Pakistan's economy.

He stated that investor confidence improved following structural reforms, timely debt servicing, staying the course with the International

Monetary Fund (IMF) programme, and positive ratings from global agencies. Pakistan is steadily rebuilding market credibility, Schehzad said, adding that the country was standing out as one of the most improved sovereign credit stories in the EM universe.—RT/Agency

Gaza Bleeds On As Israel Defies Trump's Call To Halt Bombing

TEL AVIV: Israeli planes and tanks pounded areas across the Gaza Strip overnight and on Sunday, destroying several residential buildings, witnesses said, as Palestinians desperately awaited implementation of a US plan to end the war.

US President Donald Trump, who had called for an end to the bombing, said on Saturday on his Truth Social platform that Israel had agreed to an "initial withdrawal line" inside Gaza and that "when Hamas confirms, the Ceasefire will be IMMEDIATELY effective."

The Israeli escalation comes as Egypt prepares to host delegates from Hamas, Israel and the United States, and Qatar, to kick off talks over the implementation of the most advanced effort yet to halt the conflict.—RT/Agency

Land Grab Showdown in Daur: Police Clash with Furious Residents

DAUR: Near Daur, residents of the village Ismail Bhundi staged a protest at the Daur Press Club against the alleged abuse by Kashmiri Police and influential local figures. Community members including Allah Bachayo Bhundi, Sajjad Ali Bhundi, and Saddam Ali Bhundi complained to journalists that powerful individuals from the Bhundi clan had illegally occupied their surveyed land.

They alleged that Kashmiri Police forcibly abducted two of their men, Sabir Hussain Bhundi and Mehmoor Chandi, last night, and their whereabouts



remain unknown. Furthermore, they claimed that SHO Asad Rajpar and senior clerk Muhammad Ali Otho of the Kashmiri Police Station accepted bribes from these influential people and registered false FIRs against 28 members of the Bhundi community. According to the protesters, they possess official revenue documents proving their ownership of 60 acres of surveyed land in Deh Bumbhai, which has been in their family for over 40 years. They accused Hajan Bhundi, Roshan Bhundi, Miri Bhundi, and others of forcibly occupying the land at gunpoint.

Meanwhile, Hindu trader Harish Kumar had gone to Sehwan over a business matter.

Spiritual Frenzy in Umerkot: Devotees Swarm Kamaro Dargah for Urs

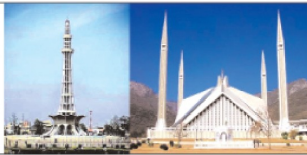

Senate chairman halts process on PTI resignations from committees

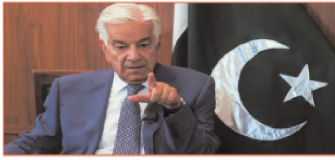

Motorcycle Theft Gang Crushed: 19 Bikes Recovered, 2 Arrested

HYDERABAD: In a significant breakthrough, Seri Police arrested two motorcycle thieves and recovered 19 stolen motorcycles during a targeted operation, following the special directives of SSP Hyderabad Adeel Hussain Chaudhry. The arrested suspects, Naseeb alias Dada Machhi and Dal Murad Chaudhry, residents of Hali Road, were apprehended while transporting four stolen motorcycles. Both were wanted in FIR No. 344/2025 under Sections 324, 353, and 34 of the Pakistan Penal Code, registered at Seri Police Station. Upon interrogation, the suspects confessed



to stealing motorcycles from various areas across Hyderabad and selling them in different conditions. Two of the recovered motorcycles were confirmed as stolen in cases No. 172/2024 and No. 202/2025 under Section 381-A PPC, both registered at Hali Road Police Station. Further investigation led to the

recovery of a total of 19 stolen motorcycles, five of which have already been returned to their rightful owners: Muhammad Sharif, Mujeeb Barfat, Ghulam Rasool Dars, Zain Qureshi, and Nadeem Qureshi. Efforts are underway to verify the ownership of the remaining bikes for their prompt return.

Hyderabad Union Demands Justice After HESCO Worker Gunned Down on Duty

HYDERABAD: The All Pakistan WAPDA Hydro Electric Workers Union (CBA) has strongly condemned an armed attack on Babar Larak, a HESCO employee and union chairman, during a bill collection operation in Hussainabad's Mir Hasan area. The union has demanded the immediate arrest of the culprits, registration of an FIR, and protection for all field staff.

During a union meeting at Labour Hall Hyderabad, Central President Abdul Latif Nizamani criticized both the law enforcement agencies and HESCO administration for failing to provide safety despite repeated warnings. He said this inaction has emboldened electricity thieves and demoralized workers, warning that the union can no



longer remain silent and may launch protests. According to Nizamani, Babar Larak and fellow staff were collecting bills when unidentified assailants opened fire. While others escaped unharmed, Larak was shot and seriously injured. He was rushed to a hospital and is now in stable condition. Despite this, police initially registered only a non-cognizable (NC) report, which the union slammed as unacceptable.

Union officials, including Provincial Secretary Iqbal Ahmed Khan, Azam Khan, Muhammad Hanif Khan, Noor Ahmed Nizamani, and Alaudin Qaimkhani, were present at the meeting. They emphasized that this was not an isolated incident, as HESCO employees frequently face threats and violence during recovery operations. Prior to the attack, Larak had received death threats from local power thieves.

Mercedes' George Russell clinched the Singapore Grand Prix from pole position while Max Verstappen finished in second ahead of the McLaren duo of Lando Norris in third, and Oscar Piastri in fourth here at Marina Bay Street Circuit on Sunday.

Russell crossed the line 5.4 seconds clear of Verstappen to win his second race of the season.

McLaren's drivers, Piastri and Norris, were able to bag the points required to seal a second consecutive constructors' title.

Norris put pressure on Verstappen but failed to

overtake him in the end.

Kimi Antonelli of Mercedes took fifth place with Charles Leclerc of Ferrari sixth, ahead of his teammate Lewis Hamilton.

Fernando Alonso was eighth for Aston Martin, while Haas driver Oliver Bearman was able to secure ninth, while Carlos Sainz of Williams took the final points in 10th. Piastri's lead over his teammate Norris in the drivers' standings was reduced to 22 points, while Verstappen is 41 points behind the Briton and 63 points behind the Australian with six races remaining in the season.—Agency

Inter Miami crushes New England with Alba and Allende on fire

FORT LAUDERDALE: threatened a comeback when Dor Turgeman fired a stunning strike in the 59th minute off a Carles Gil setup, narrowing the gap to 2-1, but Miami quickly responded.

Turgeman made his first career start in MLS and scored for New England.

Rocco Rios Novo got the start in goal for Miami, replacing Oscar Ustari, who conceded five goals in a midweek loss to Chicago.—Agency

Jase Richardson powers Magic past Heat in preseason showdown



Jase Richardson's dominant second-half performance powered the Orlando Magic to a 126-118 victory over the Miami Heat in their NBA 2025-26 preseason opener here at the Coliseo de Puerto Rico on Saturday.

Richardson spearheaded the Magic's comeback to overcome an early hole, and Desmond Bane and Tristan da Silva followed suit to ensure a successful preseason debut.

The American scored 13 points, two assists, and four rebounds in his 24 minutes of play.

However, the Heat entered the contest dominating as they led through the

first half behind solid efforts from Andrew Wiggins and Nikola Jovic, but were missing their key guards, Tyler Herro and Davion Mitchell.

Wiggins tallied 11 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including two from beyond the arc, while Jovic added 10 points, three rebounds, and two assists in limited minutes.

Jaime Jaquez Jr. was the only Heat starter to play more than 14 minutes, while Norman Powell contributed five points in his debut, and Bam Adebayo added seven points, all from free throws in the opening quarter.—Agency

Amir breaks silence on comeback buzz, weighs in on Sarfaraz as selector

Former Pakistan pacer Mohammad Amir has once again broken his silence amid swirling rumours about a potential return to international cricket.

In a candid video message, Amir clarified that he has no plans to revoke his retirement and emphasised that his decision to step away from the game remains unchanged.

He added that while his fans urge him to return, Pakistan cricket must continue to progress.

"For the past two or three days, I have been hearing that Mohammad Amir is making a comeback and taking back his retire-



ment. No discussion has taken place with me about any comeback or withdrawing retirement, nor do I have any such plan. The decision I made regarding retirement is final," Amir said.

"My fans say that I should come back, but Pakistan cricket also needs to move forward," he added.

It is pertinent to mention that Amir announced his retirement from international cricket for the second time on December 14, 2024, after the ICC T20 World Cup, stating it was time for the next generation to take

over.

This followed his earlier decision to retire in December 2020, from which he returned in early 2024 to be available for the T20 World Cup.

The left-arm pacer also stressed the importance of giving opportunities to young players.

"There are young players in the team. If the youngsters play consistently, in two or three years a strong team will be formed. I hope the team will be well-prepared for the World Cup. We played the Asia Cup final, now I hope we play the World Cup final and win as well," he stated.—Agency

Nashra Sandhu matches Sana Mir's World Cup milestone in India clash

COLOMBO: Pakistan spinner Nashra Sandhu on Sunday equalled former captain Sana Mir's record during the high-octane Women's World Cup 2025 clash against India at the R. Premadasa Stadium.

Nashra, who claimed the key wicket of Jemimah Rodrigues, now shares the record with Mir as Pakistan's highest wicket-taker in Women's World Cup history.

Both bowlers have 17 wickets each, with Nashra achieving the milestone in 15 matches, while Mir did so in 18.

Diana Baig, who picked up four wickets in the match, sits with 15 wickets in 14 matches, while former right-arm medium pacer Asmavia Iqbal ranks third with 14 wickets in 17 matches, followed by Nida Dar with 11.



At the top of the all-time chart, former Indian pacer Jhulan Goswami leads as the highest wicket-taker in Women's World Cup history, claiming 43 wickets in 34 matches.

Batting first, India got off to a promising start as openers Smriti Mandhana and Pratika Rawal added crucial runs to apply early pressure on Pakistan's bowling attack.

The partnership was broken when Pakistan skipper Fatima Sana dismissed Mandhana for 23 off 32 balls, which included four

boundaries, leaving India at 48-1 in nine overs.

After six more overs, India suffered another setback as Rawal was clean bowled by Sadiq Iqbal for 31 off 37 balls, which included five boundaries, ending a 19-run stand.

Harleen Deol and captain Harmanpreet Kaur then joined forces, scoring vital runs to stabilize the innings.

Diana Baig delivered the third blow for Pakistan, dismissing Kaur for 19 off 34 balls, which included two boundaries, leaving India at 106-4 in 24.4 overs.—Agency

Sri Lanka Cricket shakes up coaching staff after T20I humiliation against Bangladesh

Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) has appointed Julian Wood as the new batting coach and Rene Ferdinand as the spin-bowling coach of the men's national team, replacing Thilina Kandamby and Piyal Wijetunge, respectively.

Kandamby had been serving as Sri Lanka's batting coach since December 2023, while Wijetunge had been associated with SLC for nearly two decades, holding the spin-bowling coach role since February 2006.

According to reports, the decision to restructure the coaching setup came after Sri Lanka's home T20I series defeat to Bangladesh in July.

Wood has signed a one-year contract with SLC. Earlier this year, he conducted a week-long "power-hitting



programme" with Sri Lanka's national players, earning praise from the board for his methods.

In August, Wood briefly served as Bangladesh's batting coach, though his contract was not renewed in September.

He has previously worked with the ECB, Gloucestershire, Hampshire, Middlesex, and IPL franchise

Punjab Kings.

Ferdinand, meanwhile, has been appointed on a two-year contract. His role will include leading spin-bowling training, match preparation, performance analysis, and player development.

"Holding a PhD in biomechanics from the University of Waikato, Ferdinand brings extensive expertise in applying science to enhance cricket performance," SLC said in an official statement.

Ferdinand has previously worked with the BCCI's National Cricket Academy, where he delivered biomechanics-based coaching programs for elite players and coaches.

He has also served as a biomechanics consultant for New Zealand Cricket, conducting performance evaluations and injury-risk assessments for top-level bowlers.

Over the past decade, Sri Lanka's batting power and spin performance have often lagged behind international standards, particularly on flatter tracks.—Agency

Arne Slot calls for calm as Liverpool slump to third straight defeat



LONDON: Liverpool manager Arne Slot urged calm after his team suffered a dramatic 2-1 defeat at Chelsea on Saturday, marking their third loss in a row for the first time during his tenure.

Brazilian teenager Estevao scored his first Chelsea goal in the 95th minute, snatching a late winner in a fiercely contested match.

The result compounded Liverpool's recent woes, having also lost a 97th-minute thriller against Crystal Palace last weekend and a disappointing Champions League defeat to Galatasaray in midweek.

Liverpool looked disjointed, particularly in the first half, despite most of their starting lineup remaining unchanged from last season.

Slot attributed the narrow loss to fine margins and the

lingering effects of a turbulent summer, which included the tragic death of Diogo Jota and the departure of key players.

"If the result would have been better today with a draw or a win - which was both possible, I don't say we deserved it, a draw we definitely deserved - but then we would have had a great start to the season, if you take into account everything that happened in the summer in Liverpool," Slot said.

At the front, new signing Alexander Isak appeared off the pace after a limited pre-season, while Mohamed Salah's struggles continued. Salah, who has scored just five goals in his last 21 games, missed several chances and appeared underwhelming once again.—Agency

Mascherano shuts down Messi rift rumours at Inter Miami



Inter Miami coach Javier Mascherano dismissed rumours of tensions with Lionel Messi, international media reported on Sunday.

Mascherano and Messi were involved in a heated debate during the 5-3 defeat to Chicago Fire last week at the Chase Stadium.

Miami were 2-0 down in the match before Tomas Aviles put them back on track. They tied 3-3 in the second half when Luis Suarez scored a brace.

However, the visiting team scored two more goals to clinch the victory in the final phase of the game.

Miami's coach and Lionel Messi were captured by the cameras having an intense exchange, which sparked speculation of a rift between the two.

Mascherano has downplayed the rumours circulating, saying he was discussing tactics with Messi.

"There's no problem with Leo. It came out in the press that he was challenging me, which is really nonsense," said Mascherano.

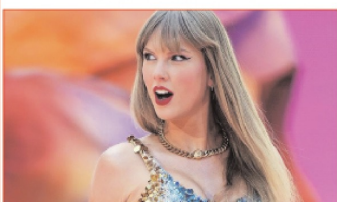
"We were talking about Chicago's low block. If you look at the game, after their first two goals, they played a very low block, and there was little space to find between the lines.

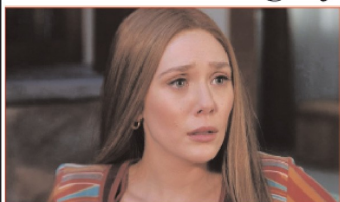
"And fun for them and feel like entertainment and also if you don't need Easter eggs then you can disregard that and that doesn't need to happen," the

Instead of installing sluice gates and regulators to control water flow, a two-foot pipe was installed, which is causing widespread flooding and damage to ready crops on thousands of acres, resulting in losses worth crores of rupees.

Badin Farmers Ready for Showdown as Sesame Crops Collapse

KADHAN: Farmers across the southern coastal belt of Badin — including areas such as Kadhan Sirani, Pir Fatah Shah, Qazi Wah, Tal Badi, Pur Stop, Garho Regulator, Qadiya Lunwari Shanf, Garhirdi, Ashrafabad, 50 Mori, Ahmadabad, and adjacent localities — are facing a severe crisis as their sesame crop (sarval) has been hit by disease and market exploitation. A bumper sesame harvest has ripened, but traders and mill owners have arbitrarily cut the price from Rs. 3,300

to Rs. 2,200 per maund, effectively forcing the price down to Rs. 1,300 in some cases. Merchants are also illegally deducting four to seven kilos per maund under the pretext of "moisture," leaving growers impoverished. Meanwhile a dangerous pest/virus — described locally as black patches, whitely and other infestations — is attacking sesame fields, causing thousands of acres to rot and burn, pesticides have proved ineffective and farmers estimate losses running into crores of rupees.

Digri Feud Turns Deadly: Kolhi-Jat Clash Leaves Three Wounded

DIGRI: A clash erupted between two factions of the Kolhi and Jat communities near Digri, resulting in injuries to three people from both sides after sticks and rods were used. The conflict started when a tractor trolley passed through a crop field belonging to the Kolhi community, causing damage to the crops. The incident took place near Ram Colony, Deh 164.

According to reports, a minor dispute escalated into violence between the two groups. During the



clash, five people, including Pancho Kolhi and his son Harish from the Kolhi side, and Intiaz, son of Saiful Gul from the Jat side, were injured. The injured were given medical letters

On the other hand, Intiaz from the Jat community stated that youths from the Kolhi community stopped their tractor trolley by pulling out a pin used for tipping, which led to the altercation.

Defence Minister Vows India Will Be "Buried Under Wreckage Of Warplanes"

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif early on Sunday responded sharply to what he called provocative statements from New Delhi's top security establishment, saying India would be "buried under the wreckage of its warplanes, Inshallah."

In a post on X, Asif described recent comments by India's military and political leaders as a failed attempt to restore their lost credibility. He said their statements showed pressure at the top.

"After such a decisive 6-0 defeat, if they try again, the [Pakistan's] score will only get better," the minister wrote. He added that public opinion in India had turned



strongly against the ruling party after that defeat, and that was reflected in the leaders' words.

The defence minister also said, "Pakistan is a state built in the name of Allah, our defenders are soldiers of Allah. This time, India, Inshallah,

forces warned that "provocative and jingoistic remarks" from senior Indian security officials risk fabricating pretexts for aggression and could lead to "cataclysmic devastation".

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said that such remarks suggested a renewed attempt to manufacture arbitrary pretexts for aggression that would have "serious consequences for peace and stability in South Asia".

A day earlier, Indian Air Force Chief Amar Prasad Jaisankar claimed that India downed five Pakistani fighter jets of the F-16 and JF-17 class during the intense fighting between the nuclear-

White House Sounds Alarm: Mass Layoffs Loom If Shutdown Talks Collapse

US: The Trump administration will start mass layoffs of federal workers if President Donald Trump decides negotiations with congressional Democrats to end a partial government shutdown are "absolutely going nowhere," a senior White House official said on Sunday.

As the shutdown entered its fifth day, White House National Economic Council Director Kevin Hassett told CNN's "State of the Union"

programme that he still saw a chance that Democrats would back down, averting a costly shutdown and federal employee layoffs that have been threatened by White House budget director Russell

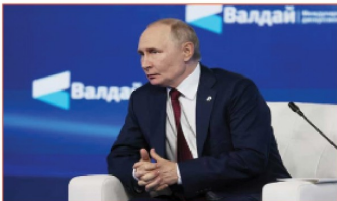
"President Trump and Russ Vought are lining things up and getting ready to act if they have to, but hoping that they don't," Hassett said.

Putin Warns Tomahawk Missiles To Ukraine Could Shatter US Ties

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin said that if the United States supplied Tomahawk missiles to Ukraine for long-range strikes deep into Russia then it would lead to the destruction of Moscow's relationship with Washington.

Less than two months since US President Donald Trump met Putin at a summit in Alaska, peace looks even further away with Russian forces advancing in Ukraine, Russian drones allegedly flying in NATO airspace and now Washington talking about direct participation in



striking deep into the world's biggest nuclear power. Trump has said he is disappointed with Putin for failing to stop Russia's advance as a "paper tiger" for

Trump Claims Israel Has Agreed To First-Phase Gaza Withdrawal

US: United States President Donald Trump has said that Israel has agreed on the scope of the initial withdrawal from Gaza, and the US is working to advance the ceasefire plan.

In a recent statement, President Trump said Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu is willing to end the bombing in Gaza. He expressed hope that the ceasefire plan would soon become a reality. He warned that if Hamas chooses to remain in power, it will be completely eliminated.

Meanwhile, the US Secretary of State said no one claims the issue is settled but expressed hope it will be resolved early this week. The US is close to an agreement ensuring Hamas holds no



hostages. It will soon be clear whether Hamas is serious.

Senator Marco Rubio said Hamas has agreed in principle on post-war arrangements.

He added that no government can be formed in Gaza by replacing three Hamas members in three days. He expects the ceasefire issue to be resolved shortly. Earlier, an Israeli government spokesperson said the Israeli army might continue operations in Gaza for defensive purposes. —RT/Agency

PM Urges Nawaz To Quell Maryam-PPP Rift Before It Explodes

LAHORE: Just a day before leaving for Malaysia on a two-day official visit, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif met his elder brother and PML-N chief Nawaz Sharif on Saturday and discussed with him the 'growing tensions' between the PPP and PML-N, requesting him to play his part in cooling off the tempers.

The meeting that took place at their Jati Umra residence covered governance issues, including the ongoing acrimony with the PPP-led Sindh government over flood and canal issues.

"The premier told the PML-N president that the PPP was its coalition partner and for smooth functioning



of the government bickering between the two parties should not linger on," a source privy to the meeting between the two brothers told Dawn.

The source said PM Shehbaz wanted his elder brother to speak to Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz and convince her "to let go and reconcile with the PPP". He said the premier "urged Nawaz Sharif to ask Maryam Nawaz to adopt a reconciliatory approach and end the ongoing acrimony with the PPP leadership over flood and canal issues. —RT/Agency

Justice Mansoor Ali Shah Declares Pension A "Constitutional Right, Not Charity"

ISLAMABAD: Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah of the Supreme Court (SC) has observed in a recent judgement that an employee's pension is not a matter of bounty, charity, or benevolence but a right protected under Articles 9 and 14 of the Constitution. Article 9 entails that no person shall be deprived of life or liberty save in accordance with the law, while Article 14 protects the dignity of a person.

He made the remarks while hearing a petition filed by Shakeel Ahmed Kayani challenging an Islamabad High Court judgment (IHC) dated February 2, 2022, which had dismissed his plea seeking entitlement to an additional pension. The SC heard the case on Sept 17, 2025, while the order of the judgement was released this week.



"[Pension] is inseparably linked with the right to life, dignity and livelihood, for without sustenance in old age, these rights ring hollow," Justice Shah observed in his judgement. According to the order, a copy of which was made available to Dawn.com today, the petitioner joined the erstwhile Oil and Gas Development Corporation established under the Oil and Gas Development Corporation Ordinance, 1961, as accounts assistant (BPS-14) on Feb 2, 1995, after earlier serving with the Pakistan Military Accounts Department Office, Wah Cantt. —RT/Agency

Jamaat-e-Islami Calls For Street Shows On Oct 7 To Back Gaza

ISLAMABAD: Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) chief Hafiz Naemur Rehman on Sunday addressed a massive rally on Karachi's Sharea Faisal and called on the nation to take to the streets on October 7 as a show of solidarity with Palestinians in the Gaza Strip. According to a press release from the JI, the participants of the "Gaza Solidarity March" chanted slogans against Israel and its supporters over the ongoing genocide in the enclave. They were also carrying placards and banners and people from all walks of life participated in the event and formed a chain to express solidarity.

"Any paradigm shift in Pakistan's policy on Palestine — [which was] set by none other than Quaid-i-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah — will not be tolerated at any cost," Rehman said in his keynote address, according to the press release. "On March 23, 2040, two resolutions were passed by the Muslim League — one called [the] Pakistan Resolution and the second one was for Palestine," he added. "There is only one state and that is Palestine, whereas there is only one leadership in Gaza and that is Hamas."



The JI chief demanded that the government recognise Hamas as the leadership in the Gaza Strip, while "warning them strongly" against joining the Abraham Accords, a series of normalisation agreements between Israel and Arab states. —RT/Agency

Four Indian Proxy Terrorists Slain In Fierce Clash In Balochistan's Korki

KORKI: Four terrorists belonging to Indian proxy Fina al-Hindustan were killed in a clash with the local tribe in Balochistan's Korki area, security sources said on Sunday.

They added that the Fina al-Hindustan terrorists attacked residents in the Korki area, sparking an armed clash with local tribes.

As a result, four terrorists were killed and a citizen belonging to the local tribe was martyred during the exchange of fire, the security sources noted, adding that



two Fina al-Hindustan militants were also injured in the clashes.

The sources further noted that despite repeated requests from the local tribes to vacate the area, the militants had refused to leave.

In response to the group's hostile actions and growing threats, local tribes decided

to defend themselves against the Fina al-Hindustan terrorists, the sources added.

The recent incident comes a day after security forces gunned down 14 terrorists linked to Indian proxy Fina al-Hindustan during an operation in Balochistan's Khuzdar. They added that the operation was carried out on the reported presence of terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy terrorists, resulting in the killing of at least 14 terrorists, while 20 militants were also injured. —RT/Agency

IMF Demands Full Briefing On Pakistan's Tax Exemptions

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has requested a detailed briefing from Pakistan on tax exemptions provided across various sectors, according to media reports. Officials from the Ministry of Finance are expected to brief the IMF on the export and re-import of sugar, shedding light on the fiscal implications of these practices.

In addition, a comprehensive presentation will be given on the tax concessions granted to the Reko Diq mining project. The IMF is particularly interested in understanding how these



exemptions are impacting the country's overall tax revenue.

The briefing will also include an assessment of tax collection shortfalls caused by sector-specific exemptions. The IMF delegation will be provided with data on taxes, royalties, and both local and international investment involved in the

Reko Diq project. Moreover, the Ministry of Finance will discuss the fiscal risks associated with the guarantees provided for the Reko Diq venture. These guarantees have implications for Pakistan's financial liabilities, and the IMF wants a clearer picture of potential future risks stemming from this project.

The focus on Reko Diq comes at a time when Pakistan is under increasing pressure to meet IMF loan requirements by enhancing transparency and improving tax collection mechanisms. —RT/Agency

Islamabad Presses Israel For Return Of Citizens Detained In Gaza Flotilla Raid

ISLAMABAD: The Foreign Office on Sunday said that Pakistan was actively engaged with international partners to ensure the safety and repatriation of its citizens detained by Israel in the Gaza aid flotilla interception. "Through the diplomatic channels of a friendly European country, we have confirmed that former senator Mushatq Ahmad is in the custody of the Israeli occupying forces and is safe and in good health," read the press release issued by the FO.

It further added that Pakistan authorities have been advised that the ex-senator



will be presented before a court and, upon the issuance of deportation orders, his repatriation will be facilitated on a fast-track basis.

The ministry's remarks come after the former lawmaker was detained by Israeli forces while taking part in the Global Sumud Flotilla on October 2, whose multiple vessels were carrying aid to the war-torn territory currently under Israeli blockade.

The ex-senator, who was leading a five-member Pakistani delegation, joined the flotilla alongside international activists and humanitarian aid groups.

However, the Israeli military intercepted more than 40 flotilla vessels, some 42.5 nautical miles (79 km) from Gaza and detained more than 450 activists aboard the vessels.

Tel Aviv has since faced widespread criticism from countries around the world. Meanwhile, the FO recalled that the ministry "had previously coordinated the safe return of individuals who embarked earlier. —RT/Agency

Iran Declares UN Nuclear Watchdog Cooperation Now "Irrelevant"

TEHRAN: Iran's top diplomat said Sunday that cooperation with the United Nations nuclear watchdog was no longer relevant following the re-imposition of international sanctions on the country.

"The Cairo agreement is no longer relevant for our cooperation with the IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency)," said Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi while referring to a September deal with the UN agency.

The deal had set up a framework to resume cooperation and allow the watchdog to inspect Iranian sites, after Tehran suspended cooperation following Israeli and US strikes on its key nuclear



sites in June. But the agreement lost its significance to Iran as Britain, France, and Germany — signatories to Iran's 2015 nuclear deal — triggered the return of the UN sanctions over Tehran's non-compliance. Tehran had threatened to halt cooperation with the agency if they sought to reimpose the sanctions. The three European countries thought they had a leverage in their hands, threatening to implement a snapback," Araghchi said during a meeting with foreign diplomats in Tehran. —RT/Agency

Horror In Punjab: Women Burnt Alive In Grisly Domestic Violence Outbreak

DASKA: In a wave of chilling domestic violence cases, three women were set on fire in separate incidents across Punjab, triggering widespread outrage and demands for justice.

In Daska, a newlywed woman was allegedly doused in petrol and set ablaze by her husband Sufyan and his mother. Married just five months ago, the victim told police her mother-in-law restrained her while Sufyan carried out the brutal act. An

FIR has been filed on her father's complaint.

In Sialkot, another woman was torched by her in-laws for insisting on attending her brother's wedding reception.

Suffering 80% burns, she was rushed to Lahore in critical condition. A case has been registered against her husband and extended in-laws.

Meanwhile, in Dhamial, a 50-year-old woman was killed after being set on fire

by her brother-in-law. Initially masked as a compressor explosion, police investigations revealed deliberate murder. The suspect has been arrested, and murder charges added.

Authorities are facing mounting pressure to take swift action as violence against women continues to rise alarmingly. CPO Syed Khalid Hamdani has promised strict action against perpetrators as investigations continue. —RT/Agency
