PM Shehbaz Praises Trump As 'Man Of Peace' For Role In Gaza Ceasefire Deal

Sharm El-Sheikh: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday praised US President Donald Trump for his "relentless and untiring" efforts to end global conflicts, including the war in Gaza.

Addressing a press conference alongside Trump, who thanked PM Shehbaz and his 'favourite field marshal of Pakistan', the premier called the Gaza peace deal "one of the greatest days in contemporary history".

Trump and his Egyptian counterpart Abdel Fattah el-Sisi co-hosted the peace summit in Sharm El-Sheikh, where Egypt, Qatar and Turkey signed with the US president a document on the



Gaza ceasefire deal.

PM Shehbaz said that peace was achieved in the region after Trump worked "relentlessly and untiringly" in recent months.

The prime minister said Pakistan had earlier nomi-

nated Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for his "outstanding and extraordinary contributions" in halting a potential war between India and Pakistan and securing a ceasefire between the two nuclear-armed nations.—RT/Agency

Trump Hails Dawn Of Peace, Thanks Muslim World For Backing Gaza Rebuild

JERUSALEM/WASHINGTON: U.S. President Donald Trump has expressed deep gratitude to Muslim and Arab nations for their support in the safe rebuilding of Gaza and hailed what he described as the end of a "long and painful nightmare" for both Israelis and Palestinians.

Addressing members of the Israeli Parliament, Trump welcomed a new peace agreement that he said would usher in an unprecedented era of regional stability and cooperation. "This is a very exciting time for Israel and the Middle East," he declared. "The forces of chaos that have plagued the region for decades are totally defeated. The long nightmare for both



Israelis and Palestinians is finally over."

Trump emphasized that peace and reconstruction efforts must go hand in hand, particularly in Gaza, where rebuilding is vital for ensuring lasting stability. "I want to thank Arab and Muslim

nations for supporting the safe rebuilding of Gaza," he said. "Regional cooperation is essential to ensuring peace that endures — peace built not only through diplomacy but also through compassion, development, and mutual respect."

The U.S. president underscored his administration's commitment to facilitating dialogue among all stakeholders in the Middle East and assisting in reconstruction efforts aimed at restoring livelihoods and infrastructure in Gaza. He added that the peace agreement should serve as a foundation for broader reconciliation and cooperation across the region.

"This agreement is not just about ending conflict," Trump said. "It's about creating a future where Israelis, Palestinians, and their neighbors can live side by side — in safety, dignity, and prosperity." During his address,

the atmosphere in the Knesset briefly turned tense when a left-wing member interrupted Trump's remarks with a protest, prompting security personnel to remove the legislator from the chamber. The disruption, however, did little to detract from the significance of the moment, as Trump concluded his speech with an appeal for unity and sustained peace. "This is the time to rebuild, to heal, and to move forward together," he said, reaffirming Washington's support for all efforts contributing to long-term peace and stability in the Middle East.—RT/Agency

PTI's Afridi Secures KP CM Slot As Opposition Walks Out In Protest

PESHAWAR: Amid controversy surrounding outgoing chief minister Ali Amin Gandapur's resignation, PTI's Sohail Afridi on Monday was elected as new chief executive of the province despite opposition's boycott of the process. Afridi secured 90 votes, whereas Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl's (JUI-F) Maulana Lutfur Rehman, Pakistan Muslim League-Navaz's (PML-N) Sardar Shahjahan Yousaf and Pakistan People's Party's (PPP) Arbab Zarak Khan got no votes at all as their members staged a walk-out from the session. The assembly session, chaired by Speaker Babar Saleem Swati, was boycotted by the opposition members who staged a walk out with opposition



leader Dr Ibadullah Khan saying that they do not want to be part of any "unlawful" process. The election of the new KPCM remains shrouded in controversy after Governor Faisal Karim Kundi rejected outgoing CM Ali Amin Gandapur's resignation, citing objections over the signature's authenticity. Speaking to the media after the signing ceremony, Trump said, "It is a great honour for me to have a Gaza peace agreement. The bloodshed in Gaza has stopped because of this accord. The time has come to rebuild Gaza, and we will all rebuild it together."

He emphasized that the peace deal will bring long-term stability to the region, thanking all countries that contributed to its success. "I am grateful to all the nations



that made this agreement possible. This is a historic day for the entire world," he added.

During his remarks, President Trump made special mention of Pakistan, referring to Field Marshal Asim Munir as his "favourite", while acknowledging the participation of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif at the summit.—RT/Agency

Muridke Restored As Authorities Clear TLP Protesters, Twin Cities Back To Calm

MURIDKE: Normalcy began returning to the twin cities of Islamabad and Rawalpindi on Monday, as the police reportedly cleared Muridke of Tehreek-e-Labaik Pakistan (TLP) protesters and reopened key roads to traffic.

According to police sources, the protest sit-in was brought to an end through a successful operation on Sunday night, after which the GT Road was cleared and reopened for regular traffic.

With the situation gradually stabilising, all connecting roads between Islamabad and Rawalpindi have now been reopened for commuters. In Rawalpindi, educational institutions resumed operations after a four-day suspension, while commercial activity also picked up, as shops and business centres reopened along Murree Road. Traffic on Murree Road and other adjoining



routes was reported to be flowing smoothly.

However, the road from Murree Road leading to Faizabad remained closed, and the Metro Bus Service linking the two cities was still non-operational.

Authorities confirmed that mobile phone and data services had been fully restored across Islamabad and Rawalpindi, facilitating improved communication for residents.

Additionally, several key arteries including the IJP

Road, Double Road, Expressway, and the route from Double Road to Ninth Avenue were reopened for vehicular traffic, easing movement across major junctions in the city. The clearance operation in Muridke followed several days of unrest after TLP launched a protest march from Lahore to Islamabad. The group's mobilisation prompted widespread concern among government officials, political parties, and the general public.—RT/Agency

PTI Warns Oath Of KP CM-Elect Must Be Held Without Delay

PESHAWAR: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Secretary General Salman Akram Raja on Monday warned that the oath-taking of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister-elect Sohail Afridi should not be delayed beyond October 14 (tomorrow).

The PTI secretary general made the remarks when he, along with other PTI leaders, arrived at the Peshawar High Court to submit a petition seeking the oath-taking of the newly elected KPCM.

PTI's Afridi, earlier in the day, was elected as the new chief executive of the province despite the opposi-



tion's boycott of the process. He will replace Ali Amin Gandapur as the KP chief minister.

The election of the new KP CM remains shrouded in controversy after Governor Faisal Karim Kundi rejected outgoing CM Gandapur's resignation, citing objections over the signature's authenticity.

Gandapur stepped down from the key office last week on the directives of incarcerated PTI founder Imran Khan on October 8.

Talking to journalists outside the Peshawar High Court, Raja said, "It is necessary to administer the oath to the KP CM-elect. Taking the oath cannot be delayed."

He said that KP Governor Kundi should have been in the province to administer the oath to the new chief executive. "Under the constitution, the chief justice can nominate anyone to administer the oath," he added.—RT/Agency

Israel Confirms All 20 Surviving Gaza Hostages Safely Returned Home

GAZA: Israel foreign ministry on Monday said that the last 20 living hostages released by Hamas had arrived in the country.

"Welcome home," the foreign ministry wrote in a series of posts on X, hailing the return of Matan Angrest, Gali Berman, Ziv Berman, Elkana Bobbot, Rom Braslavski, Nimrod Cohen, David Cunio, Ariel Cunio, Evyatar David, Guy Gilboa Dalal, Maxim Herkin, Eitan Horn, Segev Kalfon, Bar Kuperstein, Omri Miran, Eitan Mor, Yosef Haim Ohana, Alon Ohel, Avinatan Or and Moran Zangauker.

The Israeli military confirmed that Hamas had



handed over a second group of 13 surviving hostages to the Red Cross in Gaza on Monday, completing the release of all 20 living captives.

"According to information provided by the Red Cross, 13 hostages have been transferred into their custody and are on their way to IDF (military) and ISA (security agency) forces in the Gaza Strip," the military said in a statement.—RT/Agency

Armed Mobs And Roadblocks Are Blasphemy Against The State, Warns Asif

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister Khawaja Asif on Monday said that organizing armed hordes, blocking roads and making people hostage is equal to desecration of religion.

"When brutalities and bloodletting was going on in Gaza for two years no one remembered to protest, now when the ceasefire takes place, protests have been started," defence minister said.

Khawaja Asif urged for ceasing the practice to take the country's hostage and teaching violence in the name of religion.

Karachi police force has been on high alert after a religious party announced



protests at five spots in the city on Monday. Karachi police authorities earlier said that no protests are currently taking place anywhere in the city. However, heavy contingents of policemen have been deployed at various locations as a precautionary measure. According to officials, police are fully prepared to deal with any potential demonstrations or unrest. They warned that strict action will be taken against those violating Section 144.—RT/Agency

China Voices Alarm Over Escalating Pak-Afghan Border Tensions

BEIJING: China has expressed deep concern over the escalating tensions between Pakistan and Afghanistan, urging both neighboring countries to exercise restraint and prioritize regional peace and stability.

They lauded the historic and brotherly relations between Pakistan and Palestine, describing them as a source of pride for both nations and their peoples, said a statement. PM Shehbaz paid tribute to the brave people of Gaza for their courage and endurance in the face of immense hardship over the years. Both leaders expressed

satisfaction over the ceasefire in Gaza, calling it a vital step toward lasting peace and the future development of the Palestinian people. Macron Faces Political Storm But Refuses To Bow Amid No-Confidence Votes

FRANCE: French President Emmanuel Macron rejected calls to resign and blasted his opponents on Monday, as his latest government was threatened by two no-confidence motions that could bring it down by the end of the week.

France is in the midst of its worst political crisis in decades as a succession of minority governments seek to push deficit-reducing budgets through a truculent legislature split into three distinct ideological blocs. Macron has burned



through five prime ministers in less than two years, and

many of his rivals have said the only way out of the crisis is for the president to call fresh legislative elections or resign, both of which he has refused to do.

Shrinking confidence Shortly after arriving in Egypt on Monday to attend a meeting to end the fighting in Gaza, Macron was defiant, blaming his rivals for destabilising France and saying he had no plans to step down before his second and final term ends in 2027.—RT/Agency

SSP Umerkot Leads Aggressive Anti-Polio Push Across District



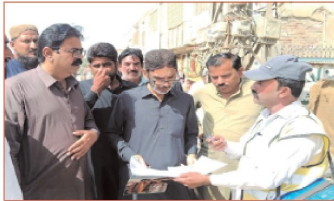

Inquiry Opens Against Former Karachi Matric Board Official Over Harassment Allegations

KARACHI: The Board of Secondary Education Karachi (BSEK) has launched an official inquiry against its former acting secretary, Dr Naveed Ahmed, after multiple female employees lodged written complaints accusing him of workplace harassment, according to an inquiry order issued by Chair-

man Ghulam Hussain Soho. The document, issued under the Protection Against Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2010 (Amended 2022), stated that the collective complaint was accompanied by audio recordings and transcripts submitted as evidence. The order alleged that Dr Ahmed made unwelcome remarks and coercive advances towards female officers, used abusive and derogatory language with staff, and created an unsafe and discriminatory workplace environment. 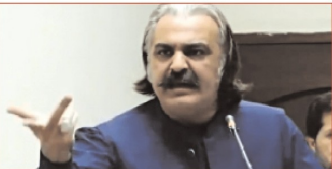
Ex-Sindh CJ Muhammad Junaid Ghaffar Named Chairman of Competition Appellate Tribunal

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Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Constitutional Fog Must End Immediately

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa — Pakistan's most strategically sensitive province bordering war-torn Afghanistan — now stands at the brink of a political storm that the country can ill afford. With PTI's Sohail Afridi taking oath as the new chief minister while confusion persists over whether outgoing CM Ali Amin Gandapur's resignation was ever validly accepted, the province has plunged into a constitutional fog — one that risks deepening Pakistan's internal fragility at a time of immense regional volatility.

This is not the hour for political brinkmanship or constitutional adventurism. When Afghanistan's soil continues to be used by anti-Pakistan elements and the region teeters on the

edge of instability, Pakistan cannot allow internal chaos to provide ammunition to its adversaries. Any undemocratic maneuver, procedural exploitation, or institutional overreach in KP today



would not only betray the will of the people but also play directly into the hands of those who seek to divide and destabilize Pakistan from within.

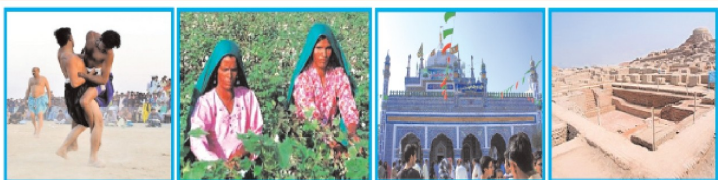
The Constitution must remain the only guiding force. Whether one supports Afridi or Gandapur, it is imperative that all sides allow due process, judicial clarity, and legislative integrity to deter-

mine the rightful leadership — not street protests or political muscle. Cooler heads must prevail among all stakeholders — the governor, the speaker, political parties, and the courts — to restore stability through democratic means, not confrontation.

Pakistan's democracy has survived countless crises because, ultimately, reason triumphed over rashness. The people of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa deserve governance, not gridlock. History will judge harshly those who toyed with constitutional sanctity for short-term gain. This moment demands restraint, dialogue, and respect for the democratic order — for if democracy falters in KP, it imperils not just a province, but Pakistan's unity, sovereignty, and credibility itself.
