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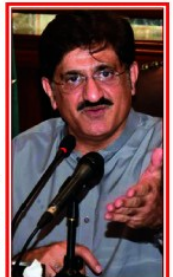

Key commanders among over 70 terrorists killed in targeted Afghanistan strikes

RAWALPINDI: Security forces carried out a precise and coordinated operation in Afghanistan's Paktika province overnight, eliminating more than 70 terrorists belonging to the outlawed Gul Bahadur group.

According to security officials, the strikes were based on confirmed intelligence and specifically targeted the group's hideouts across various parts of Paktika. The operation resulted in the deaths of several senior commanders and members of the militant network responsible for multiple cross-border attacks. Among those killed were key commanders identified as Farman alias Al-Karama, Siddiqullah Dawar, Ghazi Madakhel, Muqarrab, and Qismatullah. Officials confirmed that other senior figures



— Gulab alias Deewana, Rahmani, Adil, and Fazl-ur-Rehman — were also neutralised in the strikes. Fazl-ur-Rehman was reportedly a close relative of the group's ring leader, Gul Bahadur. Intelligence sources revealed that the action was conducted following credible reports of the militants' presence and operational planning within Paktika. The precision strikes, described by officials as "highly effective", inflicted heavy losses on the network, severely disrupting its cross-border operations. Five martyred, 4 terrorists killed as security forces foil suicide blast in North Waziristan. The Gul Bahadur group has been linked to several major terrorist attacks in Pakistan. On the same day as the Paktika operation, the group carried out a failed vehicle-borne improvised explosive device (VBIED) attack in Khadi, North Waziristan, which claimed the lives of three women. — RT/Agency

Taliban Must Rein in India-Backed Proxies Using Afghan Soil to Target Pakistan: Field Marshal Munir

Following heightened tensions between Pakistan and Afghanistan, Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir has issued a stern call to the Taliban regime, urging it to take firm and immediate action against terrorist proxies using Afghan soil to launch attacks inside Pakistan.

The army chief, who was addressing a passing-out parade at the Pakistan Military Academy (PMA) Kakul, Abbottabad, on Saturday, urged the people of Afghanistan to choose "mutual peace and security over violence".

The Taliban government in Kabul should act decisively against militant proxies operating from its soil for ter-

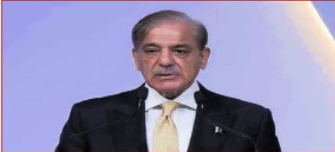


rorist activities in Pakistan, he said while attending the passing-out parade of the 152nd PMA Long Course, 37th Technical Graduate Course, 71st Integrated Course, and 26th Lady Cadet Course, as the chief guest. The COAS's remarks came a day after the extension of a temporary truce between Pakistan and Afghanistan, following days of fierce fighting that left dozens dead and hundreds wounded. In his address to the graduating cadets, Field Marshal Munir highlighted the armed forces' role in defending the country's internal and external frontiers since its creation. — RT/Agency

PM Shehbaz hails economic stability, diplomatic wins, military victory over India

KHANEWAL/JAHANIAN: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has declared that Pakistan has set a new precedent in achieving economic stability and diplomatic success, crediting tireless governance and unity of purpose.

Speaking to the media in Jahanian, Punjab, the Prime Minister said Pakistan's military victory against India was a result of the courage and bravery of the armed forces, as well as divine support. He emphasized that key initiatives in Punjab — including transport, education, healthcare, and road infrastructure — have delivered meaningful relief to the public. Shehbaz Sharif



added that through relentless hard work, Pakistan is now firmly on the path to progress and prosperity. "All economic indicators are improving," he claimed, noting that Pakistan has emerged from the brink of default within just 18 months. Recalling the state of the country when his government took over, he said the economy was in deep crisis. "We've stabilised it, but we must continue to work with honesty and diligence." He further emphasised that Pakistan's recent diplomatic and military achievements — including a significant defensive success against India — have enhanced the country's image globally. — RT/Agency

Mercurial Trump Admits 100% China Tariffs 'Unsustainable' but Vows to Meet Xi in Bid for New Deal

US: US President Donald Trump said his proposed 100% tariff on goods from China would not be sustainable, but blamed Beijing for the latest impasse in trade talks that began with Chinese authorities tightening control over rare-earth exports.

Asked whether such a high tariff was sustainable and what that might do to the US economy, Trump replied: "It's not sustainable, but that's what the number is."

"They forced me to do that," he said in an interview with Fox Business Network that was broadcast. Trump unveiled additional levies of 100% on imports of Chinese goods a week ago, along with new export controls on "any and all critical software" by November 1, nine days before existing tariff relief was set to expire. The new trade actions were Trump's reaction to China's dramatic expansion of its export controls on rare



earth elements. China dominates the market for such elements, which are essential to tech manufacturing. Trump also confirmed he would meet with Chinese President Xi Jinping in two weeks in South Korea and expressed admiration for the Chinese leader. "I think we're going to be fine with China, but we have to have a fair deal. It's got to be fair," Trump said on Fox's "Morning with Maria," which was taped later, as he was preparing to have lunch at the White House with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to discuss efforts to end its war with Russia, Trump said. "China wants to talk, and we like talking to China." The softening in tone and affirmation of his intent to meet with Xi helped stem Wall Street's early losses on Friday. Major US stock indexes, which have been rattled over the last week by Trump's abrupt re-imposition of steep levies on Chinese imports and by credit worries among regional banks, were up in afternoon trading. — RT/Agency

Pakistan Draws "Red Line" in Doha Talks: Demands Taliban End Cross-Border Terrorism or Face Consequences

DOHA: In high-stakes negotiations in Doha, Pakistan has sent a forceful message to the Afghan Taliban, demanding an immediate halt to cross-border terrorism and militant infiltration from Afghan soil. The first round of talks between the two nations has concluded, with the second round set to resume tomorrow under the mediation of Qatar. The talks come amid escalating border tensions, which have prompted Pakistan to take a firm stance. Diplomats sources reveal that Pakistan has outlined a clear "red line," warning



the Taliban that the presence of militant groups like Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) within Afghanistan is unacceptable. Pakistan also singled out extremist organizations "Fitna al-Khawarij" and "Fitna al-Hindustan" as direct threats to the region's security. At the heart of the discussions is Pakistan's demand for an immediate end to cross-border infiltration and militant attacks launched from Afghan

territory. Islamabad has made it clear that any future strikes originating from Afghanistan will trigger a robust and proportionate military response. Leading the Pakistani delegation is Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif, supported by senior security and intelligence officials. On the Afghan side, the talks are headed by Taliban Defence Minister Mullah Muhammad Yaqoob, with the Taliban's intelligence chief Mawlawi Abdul Haq Wathiq also present. The negotiations are being hosted and facilitated by Qatar's intelligence chief, underscoring the sensitive nature of the discussions. Pakistan's message to Kabul is unmistakable: patience is wearing thin. Islamabad has emphasized that Afghanistan must take decisive action against terrorist groups operating on its soil and prevent its territory from being used as a launchpad for attacks against Pakistan. Pakistani officials have stressed that the future of border peace hinges on the Taliban's verifiable commitment to combating terrorism. — RT/Agency

Pakistan Launched Precision Strikes on Gul Bahadur Terror Network, Confirms Tarar



ISLAMABAD: Amid ongoing hostilities with Afghanistan, Minister for Information and Broadcasting Attaulah Tarar on Saturday confirmed that the Pakistan last night, conducted "precision strikes" on verified camps of the proscribed Gul Bahadur group in the border areas of North and South Waziristan districts.

"In these precision strikes, [a] minimum [of] 60-70 Kharjis [terrorists] and their leadership have been sent to hell based on confirmed intelligence reports," the federal minister wrote on X.

The two neighbouring nations are witnessing heightened tensions amid the Afghan Taliban regime's reluctance to act against terrorist groups, operating from Afghanistan soil, in the backdrop of rising terror attacks in Pakistan.

The Taliban forces and India-backed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), alias Fitna al-Khawarij, resorted to an unprovoked attack on Pakistan on October 12.

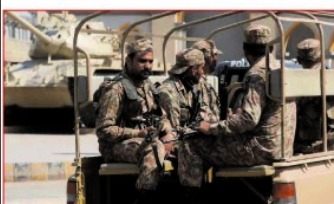
The Pakistan Armed Forces gave a befitting response to the aggression, killing over 200 Afghan Taliban and affiliated militants in a self-defence action. The military's media wing, Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), said that 23 soldiers embraced martyrdom in the clashes with the Taliban forces and the terrorists.

Furthermore, the security forces also conducted "precision strikes" in Afghanistan's Kandahar province and the capital Kabul, successfully destroying multiple strongholds in response to recent aggression.

A temporary truce between the neighbours — which Pakistan agreed to at the request of Afghanistan — on October 15 paused days of fierce fighting that killed dozens and wounded hundreds.

However, Tarar — in today's post — noted that during the 48-hour ceasefire, militants affiliated with the Khawarij group and operating from Afghanistan attempted multiple terrorist attacks inside Pakistan. — RT/Agency

Two Hardcore Khawarij Militants Sent to Hell in Successful Intelligence Operation in Bannu



BANNU: Security forces conducted a successful intelligence-based operation (IBO) in the Mughal Kot sector of Bannu, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, killing two Khawarij terrorists, including their ring leader.

According to media reports, the operation effectively targeted the network of Fitna al-Khawarij, which had been actively involved in terrorist activities over the past two years. Heavy weapons and ammunition were also recovered from the slain militants. Security officials stated that the operation dealt a significant blow to the group's structure and disrupted its future plans for terrorist activities in the region. They reaffirmed that Pakistan's armed forces remain fully committed to eliminating the remnants of terrorism and ensuring lasting peace and stability across the country. — RT/Agency

Iran Drops Nuclear Deal Restraints, Declares It's No Longer Bound by Any Restrictions

IRAN: Iran said on Saturday that it was no longer bound by restrictions on its nuclear programme as a landmark 10-year deal between it and world powers expired, though Tehran reiterated its "commitment to diplomacy".

The 2015 deal — signed in Vienna by Iran, China, Britain, France, Germany, Russia and the United States — saw the lifting of international sanctions against Iran in exchange for restrictions on its nuclear programme.

But the pact had already been in tatters after Washington unilaterally withdrew during President Donald Trump's first term, with Iran later pulling back from its commitments.

The reimposition last month of UN sanctions at the urging of three of the deal's European signatories rendered the accord effectively moot.

From now on, "all of the provisions (of the deal), in-



cluding the restrictions on the Iranian nuclear programme and the related mechanisms are considered terminated," Iran's foreign ministry said in a statement on the day of the pact's expiration.

"Iran firmly expresses its commitment to diplomacy," it added.

Western powers have long accused Iran of secretly seeking nuclear weapons — something it has repeatedly denied, insisting its nuclear programme is solely for civilian purposes such as energy production. The deal's

"termination day" was set for October 18, 2025, exactly 10 years after it was enshrined in the UN's Security Council resolution 2231. The accord capped Iran's uranium enrichment at 3.67 percent in exchange for sanctions relief and provided for strict supervision of its nuclear activities by the UN's nuclear watchdog, the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). But Washington left the deal in 2018 and reinstated sanctions, after which Tehran began stepping up its nuclear program. — RT/Agency

Field Marshal Asim Munir Applauds Trump's Global Peace Efforts, Calls Them 'Remarkable'

KAKUL: Field Marshal Asim Munir has lauded former US President Donald Trump's efforts and strategic leadership in promoting peace across several conflict-hit regions of the world. Addressing the passing-out parade at the Pakistan Military Academy in Kakul, the Army Chief said Trump's initiatives toward global stability deserve appreciation. He noted that the reactivation of Pakistan's strong and expanding relations with the United States is an encouraging and positive development. "We will con-



tinue to strengthen these ties with key global and regional leaders in the interest of peace, security, and prosperity," he said.

Field Marshal Munir reaffirmed Pakistan's commit-

ment to constructive international engagement, emphasizing that cooperation between major powers and developing nations is essential for ensuring a peaceful and stable global order. — RT/Agency

Khawaja Asif Calls for End to Pakistan's 'Soft State' Era, Urges Shift to a Hard Power Posture

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan must shed its "soft state" image and establish itself as a strong, law-enforcing "hard state," Defence Minister Khawaja Asif said, following a high-level meeting chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

The meeting, attended by Chief of Army Staff General Syed Asim Munir, senior military leadership, and the chief ministers of all provinces, reviewed the internal security situation, including the recent unrest in Punjab linked to the Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) protests.

Defence Minister Khawaja Asif praised the Punjab government for effectively handling the violent demonstrations under the leadership of Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz, saying the



province's decisive action set an example for others to follow.

"The way Punjab's administration, under Maryam Nawaz's leadership, controlled the situation is commendable," Asif said, emphasizing that all provinces should adopt similar resolve in dealing with extremist groups and lawless elements.

He noted that the Punjab government took a "decisive

stance" against TLP rioters and that this approach should form the foundation of a broader national counter-extremism framework.

"As a nation, we must end the image of a 'soft state.' Pakistan should now emerge as a 'hard state' governed by the Constitution and rule of law — Punjab has taken the first step," Asif stated in a post on X (formerly Twitter). — RT/Agency

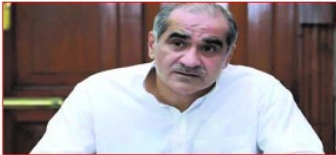

Khawaja Saad Rafique Urges Pakistan and Afghanistan to Set Clear Path for Peaceful Coexistence

Trump the Reluctant Peacemaker: A Blunt Maverick Who May Just Be Saving the World from Itself

Love him or loathe him, Donald Trump's self-declared title of "war solver" might not be as far-fetched as his critics would like to believe. The former reality star turned U.S. president—often dismissed as brash, vain, and unpredictable—has, through sheer force of personality and unorthodox diplomacy, achieved what many seasoned politicians could not: keeping the world from plunging into new wars.

In an age when fiery rhetoric fuels global conflicts, Trump's brand of ego-driven diplomacy has paradoxically produced calm. His latest claims of having "defused eight wars," from the Middle East to South Asia, may sound exaggerated—but the

record does show that under his watch, nuclear ri-



vals like India and Pakistan stepped back from the brink, and the Gaza conflict found a fragile but real truce.

For all his flaws—his temper, his self-congratulation, his mercurial unpredictability—Trump's instinct to negotiate rather than invade has spared countless lives. His abrasive style, often mistaken for recklessness, has forced adversaries to the table where smoother diplomats failed. Even his

critics must admit: the man loves making deals, not wars.

And perhaps, just perhaps, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's lavish praise—calling Trump "the man the world needed most" and crediting him with saving millions—wasn't sycophancy after all. It may have been an uncomfortable truth that much of the world refuses to acknowledge.

Trump's presidency remains divisive, but history has a peculiar way of favoring results over manners. If his blunt diplomacy continues to keep nuclear powers from colliding, even his harshest detractors might one day concede that beneath the bombast lies a peacemaker—an unlikely, unwilling, but undeniably effective one.

Shohei Ohtani's Two-Way Brilliance Propels Dodgers into the World Series

LOS ANGELES: Shohei Ohtani delivered a historic two-way performance and powered Los Angeles Dodgers to a 5-1 victory over Milwaukee Brewers in the Major League Baseball (MLB) match here at the Dodger Stadium.

The victory helped the Dodgers complete a 4-0 series sweep and secure their place in the World Series. The 31-year-old Japanese superstar stunned fans by hitting three towering home runs and striking out 10 batters in a dominant display rarely seen in MLB history. Ohtani added home runs in the first, fourth, and seventh innings.

Ohtani became the first



pitcher since 1942 to hit three home runs in a single game, achieving the feat that was last managed by Jim Tobin of the Boston Braves.

His powerful hitting display included a 446-foot homer and a 469-foot blast that bounced out of the stadium, breaking an eight-

game home run drought in emphatic fashion. His combination of elite pitching and explosive offence set a new MLB postseason record.

This latest achievement adds to Ohtani's remarkable resume, following a 2024 season in which he became the first player in

league history to record both 50 home runs and 50 stolen bases.

His performance was crucial in sending the Dodgers to their second straight World Series, where they will face either the Toronto Blue Jays or the Seattle Mariners, who currently lead their series 3-2.

Ohtani was named series MVP for his efforts, as the Dodgers cruised past the Brewers in a commanding fashion.

With four more wins standing between them and another championship, Los Angeles will look to ride Ohtani's momentum into the Fall Classic.—Agency

Liverpool Triumphs Over Real Madrid in Race to Sign Defensive Star Nico Schlotterbeck

Reigning Premier League champions Liverpool have edged out Real Madrid in the race to sign Borussia Dortmund's Nico Schlotterbeck, international media reported on Saturday.

The 25-year-old has established himself as one of the Bundesliga's top centre-backs, and his performances have drawn the interest of numerous European teams ahead of next summer's transfer market.

According to the reports, Madrid now expects Schlotterbeck to join Liverpool while the Spanish club focuses on Ibrahim Konate's contract situation at Anfield.

Liverpool's search for a new centre-back has become increasingly urgent as the club failed to sign Crystal



Palace captain Marc Guehi on transfer deadline day in September.

Adding further to their woes, new signing Giovanni Leoni is sidelined due to injury, leaving behind the senior trio of Virgil van Dijk, Konate and Joe Gomez in centre defence until at least January.

With Van Dijk aged 34, Konate's contract expiration, and Gomez nearly leaving the club during the summer

window, Liverpool is desperately in need of long-term defensive stability.

Reports further suggested that Liverpool have already started initial talks with the player's representatives. Dortmund, on the other hand, is eager to keep him and has offered him a new contract worth approximately €8 million (\$9.3 million) per year.

Despite that offer, Schlotterbeck is said to be reluctant to extend his stay,

prompting Dortmund's sporting director, Lars Ricken, to issue a major warning and stressing that focus should be on prospects instead of salary.

Enzo Maresca Hit with Touchline Ban Ahead of Crucial Nottingham Forest Showdown

WEST BRIDGFORD: Chelsea head coach Enzo Maresca will serve a one-match ban in the Premier League clash against Nottingham Forest at the City Ground on Saturday.

The suspension follows his red card misconduct during the 2-1 victory over Liverpool earlier this month.

The Football Association confirmed that Maresca admitted the allegations earlier this week after being expelled in the sixth minute of stoppage time for widely celebrating his side's late winner.

Speaking to Italian media, the 45-year-old described his reaction as 'instinctive' and joked that the sending off was 'worth it'.

Chelsea's preparations for the encounter have also



been disrupted by Cole Palmer's continued absence due to a groin injury, which is expected to keep the midfielder out for another six weeks.

The 23-year-old midfielder has not played since limping off in the 20th minute of a 2-1 defeat to Manchester United on September 20.

Maresca admitted his earlier optimism about Palmer's quick return was

misplaced.

"I was wrong. Unfortunately, he needs to be out probably six more weeks," Maresca said.

"We try just to protect Cole as much as we can, but the most important thing is that when he comes back he's fully fit—the medical staff are not magicians—we have to take it step by step."

The coach confirmed the injury would not require

surgery but said the club must monitor Palmer's recovery closely.

"He looks relaxed. He's doing all the therapy that he needs to do. He looks good," he added.

The 23-year-old's absence has been felt strongly this season, and the coach acknowledged that replacing a player of his quality is difficult.

"To replace Cole is difficult as probably one of the best in the Premier League. He is unique. We don't have another player like Cole," Maresca concluded.

Chelsea will aim to maintain their momentum this weekend, with assistant coaches taking charge from the technical area as Maresca serves his ban.—Agency

Former NBA Most Valuable Player Joel Embiid made a groundbreaking return from injury in the Philadelphia 76ers' final exhibition game, leading them to a 126-110 victory over Minnesota Timberwolves here at the Wells Fargo Center.

Embiid contributed 14 points, eight assists, and seven rebounds in just 19 minutes of play.

The 31-year-old centre has been limited to only 19 games this season and 39 in the 2023-24 campaign due to knee injuries. His last appearance was on February 22, following which, he underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee in April.

Selected third overall in the 2014 NBA Draft, Embiid missed his first two seasons due to injuries. Since then, he has become a seven-time All-Star, named to the All-NBA First Team and won MVP honours in 2022-23, when he led the league with 33.1

points per game, along with averages of 10.2 rebounds and 4.2 assists across 66 games.

Overall, in his illustrious career, Embiid holds averages of 27.7 points, 11.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists, and 1.6 blocks per game.

The Sixers are still awaiting the return of Paul George (knee) and Jared McCain (knee, thumb), who are not expected to be ready for the season opener on Wednesday against the Boston Celtics.

Philadelphia, frequently short-handed last season, finished with a 24-58 record, down sharply from their 47-35 finish in 2023-24 and back-to-back 50-win seasons two years prior. They missed the playoffs for the first time in eight years.

The Philadelphia 76ers will next play against the Boston Celtics on October 23rd.—Agency

Kazim Jatoi, Murad Shah said that the Karachi Fish Harbour has reached capacity, causing congestion and heavy post-harvest losses.

The proposed mini harbours will feature auction halls, storage, docking, and eco-friendly waste management systems. Shah said the initiative fulfills Shaheed Benazir Bhutto's vision of developing Keti Bunder as a new port and supports Sindh's sustainable coastal development goals.

Nasir Shah Says PPP Backing Federal Government for Stability, Not Power Politics

KARACHI: A suspected robber was killed in an alleged police encounter in the Korangi area of Karachi, officials said on Saturday.

According to police, the deceased suspect has been identified as Badar Aslam, who was wanted in more than 13 criminal cases registered at various police stations across the city. Law enforcement authorities said the encounter took place during a routine patrol when the suspects opened fire on the police team.

In retaliation, police returned fire, resulting in the death of one suspect, while his accomplice managed to escape from the scene. A search operation has been launched to apprehend the fleeing suspect.

Police recovered weapons and other items from the possession of the slain suspect and shifted the body to a nearby hospital for medico-legal formalities. Further investigations are underway.—RT/Agency

The association also reported a substantial decline in the international market, where gold prices fell by

Karachi Scorches at 39°C as Relentless Heatwave Shows No Signs of Easing

KARACHI: The city is experiencing very warm and sunny conditions, with temperatures soaring to 39°C on Saturday. According to the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD), the maximum temperature is expected to reach 38°C, while the minimum will drop to around 22°C overnight.

The RealFeel temperature also stands at 38°C, offering little comfort even in shaded areas where it drops slightly to 36°C. Light westerly winds blowing at 9 km/h and a high UV Index of 6.0 are intensifying the heat, making daytime conditions particularly oppressive.

Meteorologists have warned that the current heatwave pattern is likely to persist for the next several days, urging citizens to stay hydrated, avoid direct sunlight during peak hours, and take necessary precautions against heat-related illnesses.—RT/Agency

Trump Declares Pakistan-Afghanistan Conflict 'Very Easy' to End, Claims He Can Solve It

US: US President Donald Trump said he has defused eight global conflicts in the past eight months, citing Pakistan-India and Gaza, and called the Pakistan-Afghanistan clashes "an easy one" to resolve during talks with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky at the White House.



"...although I do understand that Pakistan attacked, or there is an attack going on with Afghanistan. That's an easy one for me to solve if I have to solve it," the US president said. He said that while he was responsible for running the US, he truly enjoyed ending wars and bringing peace to conflict zones.

He said that while he was responsible for running the US, he truly enjoyed ending wars and bringing peace to conflict zones. "All of these wars had nothing to do with us, but I saved tens of millions of lives. The Prime Minister of Pakistan said I saved millions of lives in interceding on Pakistan, and you look at Pakistan and India as an example. That would have

been a bad one, two nuclear nations, right?" he said. "I've solved eight conflicts, including the Middle East. This [Ukraine-Russia] I thought would have been among the easiest [Russian President Vladimir] Putin mentioned yesterday — Armenia, you know, all of the different wars."

He said it was amazing, but the big one that he was surprised that we were able to settle was the Middle East.

Zelensky came to Washington seeking arms to bolster his country's forces in Ukraine's three-year-old conflict with Russia. However, Trump frequently highlighted his peace summit with Putin, which took place just weeks earlier, as he and Zelensky spoke with reporters.

That meeting hastily came together on Thursday, making clear that Trump remains intent on brokering a peace deal and taking the air out of Zelensky's pitch for the missiles. Before his private lunch meeting with Zelensky, Trump said the two leaders would discuss his call with Putin the previous day. He again reiterated his belief that his efforts merit the Nobel Peace Prize.—RT/Agency

Afghanistan has become India's proxy: Khawaja Asif

ISLAMABAD: Defence Minister Khawaja Asif on Friday accused Afghanistan of becoming India's proxy saying that Afghanistan's Taliban government is "fighting a proxy war" on behalf of India.



In a post on social media platform X, formerly known as Twitter, Khawaja Asif launched a sharp attack on Kabul, saying all Afghans must return to their homeland and added that their land resources are for 250 million Pakistanis.

Khawaja Asif said India, Afghanistan and Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) were jointly "imposing terrorism on Pakistan." He lamented that elements who once sought refuge in Pakistan were now allegedly engaged in conspiracies against the country.

He said that Pakistan can no longer afford relations with Afghanistan as in the past and added that Islamabad's diplomatic and institutional efforts aimed at resolving the security problem had produced little positive response. He said that since the Taliban's takeover of Kabul in 2021, Pakistan's Foreign Minister visited Kabul four times, the Defence Minister and ISI Chief made two visits, the Special Representative for Afghanistan undertook five visits, the Foreign Secretary also visited five times, and the National Security Adviser went once. He revealed that the Joint Coordination Committee met eight times, 225 border flag meetings were held, and Pakistan issued \$36 protest notes and 13 demarches to Afghanistan. All these efforts produced no result.—RT/Agency

The finance minister highlighted the recent Staff Level Agreement (SLA) with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and ratings upgrades by international agencies as indicators of Pakistan's strengthening economic outlook.—RT/Agency

Israeli Forces Violate Ceasefire, Kill 11 Palestinians in Fresh Gaza Strikes

GAZA CITY: In yet another act of aggression, Israeli warplanes carried out an airstrike on Gaza, killing 11 members of the same Palestinian family, including seven children and three women, according to Arab media reports. The victims were targeted as they were returning home, in what Hamas has condemned as a blatant violation of the ceasefire agreement. The group stated that since the truce began, Israeli forces have killed at least 28 Palestinians through continued shelling and gunfire. The Arab media also reported



that Israel has returned the bodies of 15 more Palestinians, bringing the total to 135. Medical professionals in Gaza allege that the bodies showed signs of torture and execution, with evidence of handcuffs, blindfolds, and gunshot wounds. Doctors further stated that the returned corpses indicated severe mistreatment of detainees, fueling international outrage over the treatment of Palestinian prisoners.—RT/Agency

ICC Rejects Israel's Bid to Overturn Arrest Warrants for Netanyahu and Top Officials

UK: The International Criminal Court rejected Israel's bid to appeal against arrest warrants for its Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and former defence minister Yoav Gallant over the Gaza war.



In a ruling that made headlines around the world, the ICC in November found "reasonable grounds" to believe Netanyahu and Gallant bore "criminal responsibility" for alleged war crimes and crimes against humanity in Gaza.

The ICC also issued arrest warrants for three top leaders from the Palestinian militant movement Hamas but dropped these after their deaths. The warrants against Netanyahu and Gallant sparked outrage in Israel and also in the United States, which has since slapped sanctions on top ICC officials. Netanyahu described it as an "anti-Semitic decision" and the then US president Joe Biden slammed it as "outrageous".—RT/Agency

Fire at Dhaka Airport Cargo Terminal Disrupts Flights, Forces Massive Delays



DHAKA: Flights out of Bangladesh's main airport were delayed or diverted on Saturday after a major fire broke out in the cargo terminal, officials said.

Thirty-six firefighting units are working to douse the flames, Talha Bin Zaim, an officer at the Fire Service and Civil Defence Media Cell, told Reuters.

Operations at Dhaka's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport were suspended, airport official Masudul Hasan told reporters, adding all aircraft are safe.

There was no immediate information as to what may have caused the blaze. Both domestic and international flights were affected.

Pakistan Asks Qatar to Divert 2026 LNG Cargoes Amid Global Oversupply Concerns

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has urged Qatar to divert 24 of its contracted liquefied natural gas (LNG) cargoes to the international market in 2026, amid declining domestic demand and an oversupply of gas in the country. The News reported on Saturday.



The move comes as Pakistan's LNG infrastructure faces constraints, with storage and distribution capacities under strain due to lower-than-expected demand from the industrial and power sectors.

Austria Clears Final Hurdle to Approve EU's Tough New Russia Sanctions

FRANKFURT/BRUSSELS: Austria said on Saturday that it would agree to the European Union's latest sanctions package against Russia, in an about-face of its earlier stance and removing a key hurdle ahead of a vote early next week.



EU foreign ministers are due to convene on Monday in Luxembourg when they hope to finalise the bloc's 19th sanctions package against Moscow for its invasion of Ukraine. Reuters reported earlier this month the passage of the package was deadlocked because Austria was demanding that the EU unfreeze some Russian assets to compensate Austria's Raiffeisen Bank International for penalties imposed by Russia. But other EU governments would not go along. The package needs unanimous support from the EU's 27 member states. Austria supports continued pressure on Russia and will approve the 19th package of sanctions on Monday," the country's foreign ministry said in a statement. The sanctions package includes an array of energy and financial measures, including a ban on Russian liquefied natural gas from January 1, 2027, bringing forward the date from January 1, 2028.—RT/Agency

Trump Team Considers Possible Kim Jong Un Meeting During Upcoming Asia Trip



WASHINGTON: Trump administration officials are privately discussing a potential meeting between Donald Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un during the US president's upcoming Asia visit, on Saturday, citing sources familiar with the matter. Officials have not begun logistical arrangements or direct communications with Pyongyang, and prior outreach from Trump earlier this year was reportedly rejected by North Korea, the report added. China, North Korea to strengthen strategic cooperation, KCNA says. In August, Trump expressed interest in meeting the North Korean leader after hosting South Korean President Lee Jae Myung at the White House for the first time.—RT/Agency

Hamas Returns Another Hostage Body, Vows to Hand Over Remaining Captives Soon

HAMAS: Hamas handed over to Israel the remains of one more hostage on Friday night, after insisting it was committed to returning all the dead captives still unaccounted for under Gaza's ruins after two years of war.



"Israel received, via the Red Cross, the coffin of a deceased hostage who was returned" to its security forces in Gaza and would be identified at a medical analysis center in Israel, the prime minister's office said in a statement.
