## Security Forces Obliterate Terror Cell, Kill Six Militants In Dalbandin Operation

The Pakistan Armed Forces have killed six Fitna al-Hindustan terrorists in the Dalbandin area of district Chagai in Balochistan, according to security sources. Security forces launched a timely and precise operation after tracking the formation hiding in the mountains through aerial reconnaissance, they added. The operation completely dismantled the formation, reducing threats to forces and civilians, security sources said. In a separate operation in Bajaur, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan forces eliminated hideouts and tunnels of Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) alias Fitna al-Khawarij.



A terrorist was killed in an intense fire exchange when security forces conducted an intelligence-based operation at a cave in Shahi Tangi forest, security sources said. Several others fled the area after suffering injuries during the exchange of fire. During the operation, Pakistan forces also recovered weapons, explosive materials and communication equipment used by the terrorists. Pakistan has witnessed an alarming rise in cross-border terror incidents, particularly in the bordering provinces of KP and Balochistan, since the Afghan Taliban returned to power in Afghanistan in 2021.—RT/Agency

## Some Multinationals Exit, New Ones Enter As Pakistan Clears \$4bn Backlog: Finance Minister

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb said on Wednesday that while some multinational companies have exited Pakistan, several new investors are entering the market, reflecting renewed investor confidence amid signs of macroeconomic stability. Speaking on a media programme, the finance minister said the departure of certain foreign firms should not be seen as a sign of distress. "Such decisions are often part of global corporate strategies... if some companies are leaving, new ones are also arriving, particularly in the energy and digital services sectors," he noted. Aurangzeb admitted that some challenges for foreign investors persist, such as delays in repatriating dividends, but Pakistan has made significant progress. "As economic stability has returned, we have cleared \$4 billion of backlog in the last two years," he said. The minister acknowledged that climate change is impacting Pakistan's economy, noting that the frequency of floods and smog events has increased. "Before the recent floods, GDP growth was projected at 4.2%, but at least 0.4 to 0.5 percentage points will now be shaved off due to flood-related damage, of which 80% occurred in Punjab's agriculture sector, particularly rice and cotton," he said. Aurangzeb said the government was focused on self-reliance, adding that relief and rescue operations were being conducted from domestic resources. "We are standing on our feet today. Reconstruction might require global support, but rescue and relief are entirely managed through local means," he said. He said Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had instructed the Climate Change Minister Musadik Malik to prepare a 300-day plan for climate resilience, noting that the next monsoon may arrive two weeks earlier than usual. Highlighting fiscal progress, Aurangzeb said tax collection from wholesalers and retailers rose by 100% last year, with additional recovery made from the sugar, cement, and tobacco industries. He added that income tax relief had been extended to the lower and middle-income salaried classes, with plans to expand it to other segments. He also confirmed that the government is moving towards deregulation of wheat and sugar prices, with a comprehensive wheat deregulation policy expected in 2026, which would end inter-provincial movement restrictions. He added that the World Bank had appreciated Pakistan's tax reform presentation, and Egypt's finance minister had offered to send a team for knowledge-sharing.—RT/Agency

## Trump Claims He Warned Modi: 'War With Pakistan Must Never Happen'

US President Donald Trump said on Monday he had told Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi that there should be no war with Pakistan, stressing that he had helped avert several conflicts through diplomacy and trade pressure. Speaking to reporters in the Oval Office during Diwali celebrations, Trump extended his "warmest wishes to the people of India" and said he had "just spoken to your Prime Minister today." He described the conversation as "great" and said, "We talked about trade... He's very interested in that." Trump added that they also discussed avoiding conflict, saying, "Although we did talk a little while ago about let's have no wars with Pakistan." He noted the role of commerce in easing tensions: "The fact that trade was in-



involved, I was able to talk about that." The US president emphasised the outcome, saying, "And we have no war with Pakistan and India. That was a very, very good thing." He concluded by praising Modi personally: "He's a great person, and he's become a great friend of mine over the years." The US president claimed he had prevented eight wars so far through what he described as "deals and trade," including one between Pakistan and India. "During the Pakistan-India conflict, seven planes were shot down," Trump said. "I called both countries and told them that if they went to war, the United States would stop trading with them. Within 24 hours, they called back and said they didn't want to fight."—RT/Agency

## Pakistan Navy Smashes \$972 Million Narcotics Haul In Massive Arabian Sea Operation

KARACHI: In one of the largest anti-narcotics operations in recent years, the Pakistan Navy successfully seized narcotics worth over \$972 million (approximately Rs270 billion) during a major intelligence-based operation in the Arabian Sea. According to a statement issued by the Combined Maritime Forces (CMF)—a joint maritime coalition of several nations including the United States—the Pakistan Navy intercepted two suspicious boats and recovered a massive cache of illicit drugs. The seized narcotics included two tons of crystal meth, 350 kilograms of ice, and 50 kilograms of cocaine, making it one of the most successful counter-narcotics operations conducted in regional waters. The operation was executed by PNS Yarmook, which is part of the Saudi-led Combined Task Force 150, responsible for ensuring maritime security and preventing smuggling in the Indian Ocean region. Officials from the Pakistan Navy stated that the operation was carried out based on credible intelligence about the movement of drug-laden vessels operating in the high seas. Swift response and co-ordinated action by naval personnel ensured the complete capture of both boats and the recovery of all illegal substances on board. The U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM) and the Royal Saudi Navy commended the Pakistan Navy for its professionalism and commitment to global maritime security. Saudi Royal Navy Commander Fahad Al-Juwaid described the successful mission as "an outstanding example of international cooperation against transnational crime." A Pakistan Navy spokesperson reaffirmed the force's commitment to maintaining vigilance at sea and supporting global efforts to combat drug trafficking, terrorism, and organized crime.—RT/Agency

## Polish Deputy PM Sikorski To Arrive In Pakistan Today For Key Talks

Poland Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Radoslaw Sikorski will arrive in Pakistan tomorrow (Thursday) on a two-day official visit from October 23 to 24, during which both countries will discuss the full spectrum of bilateral relations. In a statement, the Foreign Office said that Sikorski will be paying a visit at the invitation of DPM Senator Ishaq Dar, which would be his second visit to Pakistan. His previous visit took place in 2011. During the visit, DPM Dar will hold a one-on-one meeting as well as delegation-level talks with his Polish counterpart. The two sides are expected to discuss the full spectrum of bilateral relations, and the talks will be followed by a joint press stakeout. The Polish high-up's visit "marks a significant milestone in Pakistan-Poland relations [...]. Pakistan remains committed to enhancing cooperation with Poland for the mutual benefit of both countries," it concluded. According to the Foreign Office, ties between the two countries have expanded across political, economic, defence, and educational spheres, marked by mutual cordiality and cooperation. According to the statistics, the volume of bilateral trade between Pakistan and Poland in 2023 was \$922 million. ## From Outlaws to Citizens: Sindh's Bold Surrender Policy Brings Hope to the Heartland

## Injury Blow: Novak Djokovic Pulls Out of Paris Masters After Setback



Novak Djokovic has withdrawn from next week's Rolex Paris Masters after showing signs of physical discomfort during a recent exhibition match, the ATP confirmed.

The 38-year-old Serbian announced his decisions on social media, expressing disappointment at missing one of his most successful tournaments.

"Dear Paris, unfortunately, I will not compete at this year's Rolex Paris Masters," Djokovic posted on X. "I have amazing memories and great success over the years, especially being able to conquer the title seven times. Hope to see you next year. Merci."

Djokovic appeared to be in trouble with a left leg injury during his Six Kings match against Taylor Fritz in Saudi Arabia, retiring after losing a 75-minute first set. Djokovic's withdrawal

follows a series of fitness concerns in recent weeks, including visible fatigue during the Shanghai Masters, where he was beaten by Valentin Vacherot.

The world No. 1 has featured in only eight ATP Tour events outside the four Grand Slams this season, reaching the semi-finals at all majors, the Australian Open, French Open, Wimbledon, and US Open.

Tournament organisers confirmed that Djokovic will be replaced in the Paris draw by a reserve player. His latest setbacks also cast uncertainty over his participation in the season-ending ATP Finals in Turin, which begin next month.

Djokovic has already qualified for the ATP Finals for a record-equalling 18th time, with the year-end tournament taking place in Turin, Italy, from November 9.—Agency

## Asif Afridi Makes History With Stunning Five-Wicket Haul on Test Debut Against South Africa

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan's left-arm spinner Asif Afridi got his name registered into cricket history on Wednesday, becoming the oldest player ever to take a five-wicket haul on Test debut, achieving the feat at 38 years and 299 days during the second Test against South Africa in Rawalpindi.



Afridi broke a 92-year-old record held by England's Charles Marriott, who took five wickets on debut at 37 years and 332 days against the West Indies at The Oval in 1933.

Advertisement Only four players aged over 35 have claimed a five-

wicket haul on debut in Test history. Apart from Afridi and Marriott, the two others on the list are Hines Johnson of the West Indies, who did so against England in 1948, and D.W. Carr of England, who achieved the milestone against Australia in 1909. Afridi is the only player to achieve the feat after turning 38, while the other three did it after crossing 37. Among Pakistani bowlers, Noman Ali had previously taken five wickets on debut at the age of 34 against South Africa in 2021. Bilal Asif achieved the feat at the age of 33.

Pakistan ended day three of the second Test at 94/4 in 35 overs, holding a lead of 23 runs.

The hosts will resume their batting on day four with Babar Azam on 49 off 83 balls and Mohammad Rizwan on 16 off 49.

Earlier, South Africa's lower order fought back strongly, with Senuran Muthusamy, Keshav Maharaj, and Kagiso Rabada leading a spirited recovery. At one stage, the visitors were 235-8, but the trio helped South Africa reach 404, taking the first-innings lead of 71 runs.—Agency

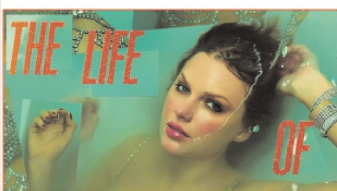

out there, and I think it's good."

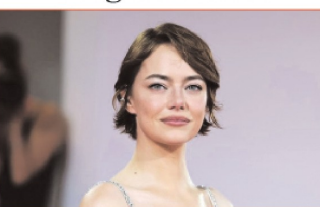

## Peace Breakthrough as 72 Dacoits Surrender in Sindh Under 2025 Policy



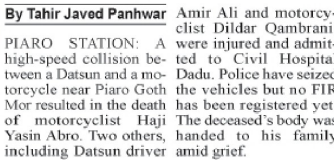

## CM Murad Celebrates Wheat Procurement Nod as a Landmark Victory

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah has termed the federal government's decision to allow provincial governments to procure wheat as a significant achievement. ## Justice Mandokhail: No Law Can Stop SC, High Courts From Hearing Cases

ISLAMABAD: Amid the ongoing debate in the Supreme Court's Constitutional Bench over the 26th Amendment, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail on Wednesday said that the apex court and high courts cannot be barred from hearing cases even if their powers are curtailed.



"If the powers of the entire Supreme Court are taken away by an amendment, who will hear the case? [...] the same court would hear the case, right?" Justice Mandokhail remarked.

During today's hearing, former chief justice Jawwad S Khawaja's lawyer Khawaja Ahmed presented his arguments and contended that the 26th Amendment does not prohibit the formation of a full court.

In his remarks, Justice Amin-Ud-Din noted that most senior lawyers, during the hearing, said to put the 26th Amendment aside altogether in their arguments.

Noting that, like judges, lawyers also disagree with each other, counsel Khawaja Ahmed said that he did not agree that a full court needs to comprise all 24 judges. "[I] have two questions: whether there should be a full court and if yes, then which one?" questioned Justice

Malik. Stressing that the Constitutional Bench is not barred from issuing directives to form a full court, the lawyer highlighted that Justice Mazhar had described a full court as separately in the Raja Amir case. To this, Justice Mandokhail observed that the CB will have to see whether they have the authority to order the formation of a full court or not.

Expanding on his arguments, the lawyer questioned whether the court will hear the case or not if a 27th Amendment were introduced, due to which an officer of the executive decides all the matters of the SC.—RT/Agency

## After KP CM's Outburst, Naqvi Diverts Bulletproof Vehicles To Balochistan

ISLAMABAD: After complaints by Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi regarding bulletproof vehicles provided by the federal government, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said on Wednesday that the vehicles in question would be sent to Balochistan instead.



On Monday, Afridi had blamed the "flawed policy" of the federal government for the resurgence of terrorism being witnessed in the province. He further claimed that the federal government was neither giving KP funds allocated under the country's ongoing war against terrorism, nor "other constitutional rights". He had also alleged that the bulletproof cars provided by Naqvi were "defective and old", adding that they should be recalled.

Late on Tuesday, Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti had commented on the claims and said that like KP, his province was also affected by terrorism. "It is an appeal to the interior minister that if the KP government is refusing to take the bulletproof vehicles, they should be transferred to the Balochistan government so that terrorism can be countered effectively," he said in a post on social media platform X. Today, Naqvi responded to Bugti's post and said: "CM

## Aurangzeb Confident Pakistan Will Hit 3.5% GDP Growth This Fiscal Year

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb has said he is "quite hopeful" that Pakistan could manage to achieve GDP growth of close to 3.5 per cent during the ongoing fiscal year despite the impact of recent floods.



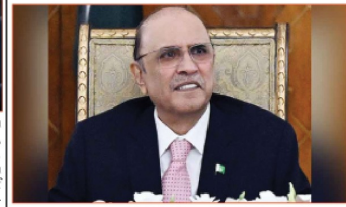

grow a little over 4pc this year, but now, given the flood situation, this will shave off a certain percentage around that. But, I am still quite hopeful that we can manage anything close to 3.5pc during this fiscal year."

To that, Aurangzeb began his reply by underlining that climate change was an "existential issue for Pakistan". "We are living it day in and day out," he said.

At the outset of the interview, the finance minister was asked about the efforts to restore Pakistan's economy and the main challenges being faced on that front. To that, Aurangzeb said Pakistan had "consolidated gains on the macroeconomic stability front [...] Inflation continues to be a good story, which is now in single digits. [The] policy rate has been halved. And as a result of that, what we have seen during the course of this year is [that] all global rating agencies have upgraded us during the course of this year. [I] started with Fitch, then S&P, and then two months back Moody's upgraded us. So it is after a hiatus of two and a half or three years, we have alignment between the rating agencies."—RT/Agency

## President Zardari Set To Attend Global Social Development Summit In Qatar



ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari will visit Qatar in early November. He will participate in the second Global Social Development Conference, scheduled to be held in Doha from November 4 to 6. ## North Korea Launches Multiple Missiles In First Major Test In Months

SEOUL, South Korea: North Korea fired multiple ballistic missiles on Wednesday, its first such launch in months just a week before world leaders, including US President Donald Trump, descended on South Korea for a summit.



Soul's Joint Chiefs of Staff said it had "detected several projectiles, believed to be short-range ballistic missiles". The missiles were fired around 8:10 am Wednesday (23:10 GMT Tuesday) from an area south of the capital Pyongyang, Seoul's military said. They flew for around 350 kilometres (217 miles), Seoul added.

of its kind since South Korean President Lee Jae-myung took office in June. Trump has said he hopes to meet North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, possibly this year, following several meetings during the Republican president's first term. The North's state media has indicated that Kim is open to future talks, with caveats that the United States give up its "delusional" demand that Pyongyang relinquish its nuclear arsenal. North Korea this month showed off what it called its "most powerful" intercontinental ballistic missile at a military parade attended by top officials from Russia and China.—RT/Agency

## ATC Reissues Non-Bailable Arrest Warrant For Aleema Khan In PTI Protest Case

RAWALPINDI: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Wednesday once again issued non-bailable arrest warrant for Aleema Khan in connection with cases related to the PTI's protest on November 26 last year. ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah, while presiding over the hearing, issued a non-bailable arrest warrant for Aleema for the fourth time after she failed to appear before the court despite repeated summonses on November 26 last year, PTI supporters entered Islamabad in defiance of a ban on public gatherings and clashed with law enforcement agencies near D-Chowk. Police used



teargas to disperse the crowd. The former ruling party's three-day protests were abruptly ended after fierce clashes erupted between the law enforcers and the protesters. The November 26, 2024, protest was aimed at building pressure on the government to release the PTI founder.

The 71-year-old cricketer-turned-politician has been behind bars since August 2023 after he was booked in multiple cases ranging from corruption to terrorism since his ouster from power via the opposition's no-trust motion in April 2022.—RT/Agency

## Netanyahu Fires Israel's National Security Adviser Amid Deepening Power Rifts



Israel's national security adviser Tzachi Hanegbi said on Tuesday that Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu sacked him, ending his tenure immediately. "Prime Minister Netanyahu informed me today of his intention to appoint a new head of the National Security Council," Hanegbi said in a statement. He also called for an investigation into security failures during Hamas's 7, 2023 attack on Israel that sparked the war in Gaza. Two years after the attack, Netanyahu's government has yet to set up a commission to investigate the matter, with Israel's opposition accusing him of stalling the process. Netanyahu's office published on Tuesday a statement thanking Hanegbi "for his service as head of the National Security Council over the past three years, and wishes him great success in his future path"—RT/Agency

## Japan To Tell Trump It Will Boost Military And Overhaul Security Strategy

TOKYO: Japan's new foreign minister said Wednesday his country plans to show its determination to further build up its defense to rapidly adapt to changing warfare realities and growing tension in the region when US President Donald Trump visits Tokyo next week.



Trump is expected to hold talks next Tuesday with Japan's Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi, who took office Tuesday after being elected Japan's first female leader. Takaichi, who had spent much of past few weeks embroiled in internal political wrangling, has to face major diplomatic tests within days of taking office — Trump's visit and two regional summits. "We are firmly preparing for President Trump's visit," Foreign Minister

Toshimitsu Motegi said. Motegi said he hoped Trump's first meeting with Takaichi during his Oct. 27-29 visit would serve as an opportunity for the two leaders to discuss further strengthening of the Japan-U.S. alliance while fostering their personal relationship of trust. He said Japan also hopes to further cooperate with South Korea, along with other regional partners including Australia and the Philippines, while seeking stable and constructive relations with China. Japan is currently undergoing a five-year military buildup through 2027 as part of its national security strategy, including doubling its annual defense spending to 2% of gross domestic product.—RT/Agency

## IMF Upgrades Pakistan's Growth Outlook To 3.6% Despite Flood Threats

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has revised Pakistan's economic growth forecast upward to 3.6% for the ongoing fiscal year, while cautioning that recent severe flooding in Q3 2025 may negatively impact growth, inflation, and the current account beyond present expectations. The News reported on Wednesday. In its Regional Economic Outlook for the Middle East and Central Asia, the IMF noted that while inflation in Pakistan has decelerated significantly this year due to lower food and energy prices, it is expected to rise again in 2026. This anticipated increase is attributed to the normalisation of prices and the phasing out of short-term electricity subsidies Pakistan's growth

is projected to increase to 3.6% in 2026, supported by steady reform implementation, improving financial conditions and growing confidence. This revised figure is an improvement on the Fund's earlier projection of 3.25% to 3.5% for FY26, which was announced last week after a staff-level agreement was reached with Pakistan under the existing Extended Fund Facility (EFF) and Resilience Sustainability Facility (RSF). Pakistan's GDP grew by 3.04% in the last financial year, 2024-25.—RT/Agency



Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's remarks appeared aimed at assuaging concerns that the presence of an envisioned international security force in Gaza could limit Israel's ability to strike in the devastated territory to thwart future threats. "We are not a protectorate of the United States. Israel is the one that will decide on its security," Netanyahu said in a statement issued by his office as he headed into the meeting. Speaking to reporters before the meeting's start, Vance acknowledged that the road to peace is strewn with huge hurdles but at the same time tried to maintain the buoyant tone he sounded Tuesday on his arrival in Israel. "We have a very, very tough task ahead of us, which is to disarm Hamas and rebuild Gaza to make life better for the people in Gaza, but also to ensure that Hamas is no longer a threat to our friends in Israel. That's not easy," Vance said. "There's a lot of work to do, but I feel very optimistic about where we are."

Vance is also meeting Israeli President Isaac Herzog on Wednesday. He is accompanied by U.S. Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner, U.S. President Donald Trump's son-in-law.—RT/Agency
