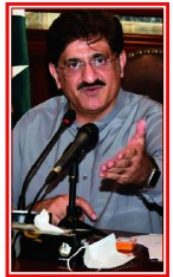

Security Forces Eliminate 23 India-Backed Terrorists in Kurram Operations

KURRAM: Security forces have successfully neutralised 23 India-backed terrorists during a series of intelligence-based operations in the Kurram district, marking one of the most significant counterterrorism achievements in the region in recent months. According to security officials, the operations were launched after credible intelligence indicated the presence of a well-armed militant network allegedly receiving support, training, and equipment from Indian handlers across the border.



The operation, conducted over several days, targeted multiple hideouts located in remote and difficult mountainous terrain. Officials said the terrorists had entrenched themselves in a network of caves and fortified positions, using the rugged landscape to evade detection. Despite the challenging conditions,

security personnel, supported by army aviation and surveillance drones, were able to close in on the militants and eliminate the threat through precision strikes. Authorities confirmed that the militants killed were involved in several recent attacks on security convoys, civilian supply routes, and local peace committee members. The group is also believed to have been responsible for the planting of improvised explosive devices (IEDs) in border villages, aimed at destabilising the area and disrupting ongoing development initiatives. Recoveries from the scene included a substantial cache of weapons, explosives, communication systems, and foreign-made ammunition, which officials say provide further evidence of external sponsorship. —RT/Agency

US Congress Report Confirms Pakistan's Victory Over India in May Conflict, Says PM

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday said that every speech by US President Donald Trump mentions "the downing of seven brand-new Indian aircraft by Pakistan", declaring it proof of the country's military strength and global recognition.

He made the remarks while addressing a foundation-laying ceremony for a Danish School in Bagh, Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK). PM Shehbaz said that the latest report submitted to the US Congress "stamped" Pakistan's stance on events of the May conflict, asserting



that "India had received a stinging slap from Pakistan's armed forces". "Allah Almighty has honoured Pakistan through the bravery of our soldiers," he added. A report presented to the United States Congress acknowledged Pak-

istan's "military success over India" in the four-day war in May this year, stating that Pakistan used Chinese-made weapons to down Indian fighter jets, including French-made Rafales.

The prime minister claimed that the Pakistan Air Force (PAF) and the army had forced India "to its knees within four days", arguing that Trump's repeated praise of Pakistan in his public speeches was further acknowledgement of that battlefield performance. "Trump praises Pakistan in every speech," he said.

Turning to education, PM Shehbaz said Danish Schools were transforming opportunities for children across the country. He noted that students at these institutions receive free education, accommodation, uniforms and support on merit, adding that the network, launched in Punjab, was now expanding nationwide. He announced that the Bagh campus would be inaugurated on March 23, 2026.

PM Shehbaz also indicated that a Danish School would be approved for Forward Kahuta, saying the dream of spreading such institutions to AJK was now close to fulfilment. The Pakistan-India conflict was instigated by India after launching strikes inside Pakistan following a deadly attack that killed 26 people in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgaon town. —RT/Agency

IMF Flags Corruption as Pakistan's Biggest Hurdle, Urges SIFC to Release First Report

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) stated that corruption remains a persistent challenge in Pakistan, urging the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) to publish its first annual report.

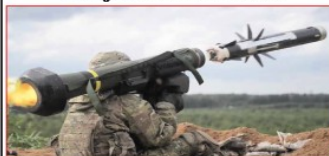


IMF, in its Governance and Corruption Diagnostic Assessment (GCDA), stated that corruption poses serious risks to economic development and public trust. The Fund urged the government to enhance transparency, strengthen governance structures, and immediately begin implementing a comprehensive reform agenda.

According to the report, the IMF has called on the SIFC to develop clear protocols for its operations and

significantly improve transparency to ensure effective oversight and accountability. It further recommended that the SIFC must publish its first annual report, detailing all investment deals it has facilitated, including any tax, policy, regulatory, or legislative concessions granted—along with the full rationale and the monetary value of each concession. US Approves \$93m Sale of Javelin Anti-Tank Systems and Excalibur Projectiles to India



NEW DELHI: The US State Department has approved the sale of Javelin anti-tank missile system and Excalibur guided artillery munitions worth \$93 million to India, the US Defence Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA) said.

The purchase of US defence equipment is India's first under Washington's foreign military sales programme since it soured in August after President Donald Trump doubled tariffs on Indian goods to 50% as punishment for New Delhi's purchases of Russian oil.

It follows a re-order this month of fighter jet engines made by General Electric to power more of India's home-produced Tejas combat aircraft.

"This proposed sale will support the foreign policy and national security objectives of the United States by helping to strengthen the US-Indian strategic relationship and to improve the security of a major defence

Trump Credits 350% Tariff Threat with Preventing Pakistan-India Nuclear Crisis

US: In a special address at the Saudi investment conference, US President Donald Trump once again claimed he stopped a nuclear war between Pakistan and India—a crisis he says could have killed "millions."

Trump expressed these views with a familiar boast about being able to settle disputes, before drifting into an anecdote about how he handled what he described as an imminent armed clash in South Asia.

According to Trump, both countries were "going



to go at it, nuclear weapons," and he said he had warned them that Washington would slap a massive tariff if they moved ahead. "I said that's okay, you can go at it, but I'm putting a 350% tariff on each country," he

told the audience, adding that he refused to "have you guys shooting nuclear weapons at each other, killing millions of people, and having the nuclear dust floating over Los Angeles." —RT/Agency

JF-17 Thunder Shines at Dubai Airshow 2025 as Pakistan Secures New Jet Deal

RAWALPINDI: The Pakistan-made JF-17 Thunder Block-III became one of the biggest attractions at the Dubai Airshow 2025, drawing widespread attention from global defence officials and aviation enthusiasts. According to a statement from the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) released on Thursday, the advanced fighter jet emerged as a "major focal point" of the event, culminating in the signing of a significant memorandum of understanding (MoU) with a friendly nation for its procurement.



Held from November 17 to 21 at Al Maktoum International Airport, the biennial airshow showcased cutting-edge aviation technology from

around the world. Yet the JF-17, jointly developed by Pakistan and China, stood out—particularly due to its proven combat record. The fighter demonstrated its operational effectiveness during Pakistan's clashes with India in 2019 and again in 2025, reinforcing its reputation as a reliable, modern multirole aircraft. ISPR noted

that several other countries also expressed strong interest in the JF-17 Thunder, signalling growing confidence in Pakistan's expanding aviation and defence capabilities. The new MoU marks another milestone in Islamabad's defence partnerships, bolstering the country's footprint in the global military aviation market. —RT

UNSC Panel Warns Afghan-Backed TTP Poses Serious Threat to Pakistan's Security

US: The head of the UN Security Council's Dashed and Al-Qaeda Sanctions Committee has backed Pakistan's position that Afghan territory is being used to stage terrorist attacks in the country, warning that the proscribed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) poses a serious threat to the regional security.

Denmark's Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN, Sandra Jensen Landi—in the capacity of the committee's chair—presented a report to the UNSC, stating that the terrorist group has conducted numerous high-profile attacks in Pakistan from Afghan soil, some of which incurred mass casualties. She said that the TTP, with its approximately 6,000 fighters, is a serious threat emanating from the region, receiving both logistical and substantial support from the "de facto" authorities. Landi made that statement as the 15-member Council was briefed by the heads of three of its subsidiary bodies—which relate to Dashed/Al-Qaeda, UN counterterrorism efforts and measures to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction to non-State actors—warning that the threat posed by terrorism continues to evolve, especially in Africa. —RT/Agency

ADB Greenlights \$330m Loan to Expand Pakistan's Clean Energy Transmission

WASHINGTON: The Asian Development Bank (ADB) said on Thursday that it had approved loans totalling \$330 million to Pakistan for the country's Second Power Transmission Strengthening Project. The ADB press release said the project was one of the government's "top priority investments to expand the national transmission network and enable the evacuation of low-cost renewable and hydropower to major load centres." The bank said a new 500 kilovolt trans-



mission line of approximately 290 kilometres would be constructed under the project, in addition to upgrading "critical grid infrastructure" feeding Islamabad and Faisalabad. "These investments will address long-standing constraints in Pakistan's north-south power corridor, enabling the transfer of up to 3,200 megawatts of clean energy from hydropower plants in the north of the country." —RT/Agency

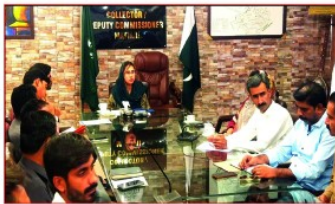

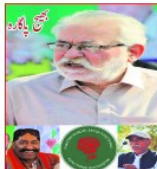

Extortion Reigns While the State Sleeps

Karachi is once again under siege—and not by foreign enemies or natural disasters, but by the very criminal networks that the government repeatedly claims to be dismantling. The latest horrifying incident, where a marble trader in Manghopir received a Rs10-crore extortion demand followed by a parcel containing two 9mm bullets, is yet another reminder of how deeply the cancer of extortion has metastasized in Pakistan's economic heart.

How can a government that is oblivious to the daily terror faced by its own citizens dream of attracting foreign investment? What credibility can officials claim when local investors—the backbone of Karachi's economy—are forced to operate under threats, intimidation, and sheer panic? The trader's ordeal, involving calls from international numbers and threats from gang-war

elements, exposes not only the reach of organized crime but also the hollowness of the state's security claims.



And if criminal extortionists weren't enough, Karachi's business community is routinely strong-armed by the very government departments tasked with facilitating them. From licensing to inspections to routine paperwork, harassment has become institutionalized. Many businessmen privately admit that the "official extortion" they face from within the system often matches, or even exceeds, what the criminal underworld demands. This dual assault—one from gang-

sters, the other from state actors—has turned Karachi into a battlefield where entrepreneurs must choose between compliance, silence, or flight. Another recent attack on a car showroom, carried out after the owner refused to pay Rs5 million in extortion, underscores the collapse of deterrence. When bullets become a language of negotiation, society is no longer governed—it is merely surviving.

Karachi cannot prosper under fear. Its citizens cannot thrive under threats. And its investors—local or foreign—will not commit capital to a city where bullets arrive by courier and officials look the other way. The government must decide: will it finally protect Pakistan's largest economic engine, or continue watching from the sidelines as extortionists tighten their grip on Karachi's future?

Zimbabwe Stun Sri Lanka in Rawalpindi Thriller, Seal Dominant 67-Run Statement Win



Zimbabwe delivered a ruthless, near-perfect performance to dismantle Sri Lanka by 67 runs in the Pakistan-hosted T20I tri-series clash at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium on Thursday. The Chevrans, showing intent from the very first ball, defended 162 with ferocity and precision as Sri Lanka collapsed spectacularly for just 95 runs — a stunningly one-sided start to their campaign.

Chasing a competitive but gettable target of 163, Sri Lanka never found rhythm. Their innings unravelled almost immediately under relentless pressure. Only captain Dasun Shanaka fought back with a gritty 34 off 25 balls, striking four boundaries and two sixes to momentarily resist Zimbabwe's charge. Apart from him, only Bhanuka Rajapaksa managed to reach double digits with 11; the rest of the batting lineup crumbled in the face of disciplined bowling.

Zimbabwe's attack was spearheaded by the brilliant Brad Evans, who produced a match-turning spell of 3 for 9 in four overs — the standout performance of the match. —Agency

Australia will field two new faces in the Ashes opener. Jake Weatherald is set to open alongside Usman Khawaja, bringing his aggressive style from first-class cricket where he has scored over 5,300 runs at an average of 37.47.

Brendan Doggett joins the bowling attack, replacing injured seamer Pat Cummins and fellow pacer Josh Hazlewood. Doggett has taken 190 wickets at 26.46 in 50 first-class matches, earning his reward for consistent performances in the Sheffield Shield.

Marnus Labuschagne has been recalled to bat at No. 3, prompting Cameron Green to move to the middle order. Stand-in captain Steve Smith will lead the team, with Travis Head, Alex Carey (wk), Mitchell Starc, Nathan Lyon, and Scott Boland completing the squad.

Gill Ruled Out of Guwahati Test, Pant Poised to Take Captaincy Helm



Shubman Gill is set to miss India's second Test against South Africa starting on Saturday after failing to recover sufficiently from the neck injury he suffered last week. Vice captain Rishabh Pant will stand in as captain in Guwahati.

It is understood that, according to medical advice, Gill is at risk of further neck spasms if he plays so soon. He has been advised more rest. The development could also impact his selection in the ODI squad for the three matches against South Africa starting on November 30. The squad for that series is expected to be picked on November 23.

With Gill set to miss out, India may have to choose one of B Sai Sudharsan, Devdutt Padikkal and Nitish Kumar Reddy as his replacement.

Gill was admitted to hospital after the second day of the Kolkata Test, following the decision to retire hurt after facing only three balls in India's first innings. On the morning of the third day, the BCCI said he would take no further part in the Test. India went on to lose the match by 30 runs, after getting dismissed for 93 in a chase of 124 on a pitch with uneven bounce. Gill had missed a Test against New Zealand in October 2024 due to a neck spasm too.

On Thursday, before ESPNcricinfo learned that Gill is set to miss the match, India batting coach Sitanshu Kotak had said in a press conference that the team would not risk playing him if there was any chance of the spasm recurring.

"He is definitely recovering really well," Kotak said. "Now, the decision [whether to play him or not] will be taken tomorrow evening. The physios, doctors, they will have to take a call that, [even] if he is fully recovered, [during the] game, he should not get that spasm again."

"[...] If we have a guarantee that, very likely, he won't have this issue again, then he will play. If there is a doubt, then I am sure, he will take rest [for] one more game, because it won't be helpful to the team [if he plays]." —Agency

Mushfiquir, Litton and Bowling Attack Drive Bangladesh Into Commanding Position

Ireland 98 for 5 (Stirling 27, Balbirnie 21, Murad 2-10) trail Bangladesh 476 (Litton 128, Mushfiquir 106, McBrine 6-109) by 378 runs

Ireland lost five wickets for 98 in reply to 476 to put Bangladesh in a strong position on the second day of the Dhaka Test. The day started with Mushfiquir Rahim reaching his century in his 100th Test, before the Bangladesh spinners got into their groove.

Hasan Murad took two wickets, while Mehidy Hasan Miraz and Taijul Islam picked up one each so far. Ireland's debutant Stephen Doherty and Lorcan Tucker were the unbeaten batters, on 2 and 11 respectively.

When Ireland bowled earlier in the day, Andy McBrine completed his second six-wicket haul in Tests, both having come at the Shere Bangla National Stadium.

Matthew Humphreys and Gavin Hoey took two wickets each, making it the first instance of Ireland's spinners taking all ten wickets in a Test innings.

UN Report Predicts Karachi Among World's Top 10 Cities by 2030

KARACHI: The United Nations has projected that Karachi will rank among the world's ten largest cities between 2025 and 2030 due to its rapidly growing population. According to the UN's World Urbanization Prospects 2025, the city's population could reach approximately 33 million by 2030, positioning it as the world's fifth-largest city.

Karachi is expected to surpass other major urban centers, including Cairo (32 million), Tokyo (31 million), Guangzhou in China (29 million), Manila in the Philippines (27 million), and Kolkata in India (24 million). The legal notice demands an unconditional public apology from Talha Anjum and warns that failure to comply could result in the filing of an FIR and criminal prosecution without further notice.—RT/Agency

NA-18 By-Polls: ECP Calls for Army Deployment Amid KP CM's Alleged Threats

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) is seeking the deployment of the Pakistan Army and the civil armed forces for NA-18 by-elections citing Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Sohail Afridi's "threats" and use of "provocative language" against public officials.

In separate letters addressed to the respective secretaries of the Ministry of Defence and the Ministry of Interior, the ECP drew attention to CM Afridi's recent speech at a public rally at Havelian, alleging that he



"clearly threatened" district administration, police officers and ECP officials engaged with the by-polls due on November 23.

"Regrettably, he [KP CM] used offensive lan-

guage which amounts to harassing and unduly influencing them which may prevent them [officials] from effective performance of their duties," the letter reads.

The electoral body's

concerns are linked with CM Afridi's speech at Chamba, near Havelian, in relation to the upcoming by-election for which the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has fielded Shehmaz Khan, wife of former National Assembly opposition leader Omar Ayub.

During his speech, the CM issued a stern warning to local political actors in Haripur, claiming that some individuals had "changed their votes" ahead of the November 23 by-election. Urging voters to support PTI in the upcoming by-election, he warned

the local administration and law-enforcement agencies against any attempt to manipulate results. "If the people's mandate is tampered with, the consequences will not be good. Any attempt at rigging will create a serious situation," he said. Stressing that justice was being denied and democratic norms were being undermined, CM Afridi said: "The situation now leaves only one option — and we will definitely adopt it," he cautioned, without specifying what that option might be. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Publishes Key Anti-Corruption Report Ahead of IMF Review



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has fulfilled a major condition ahead of the IMF Executive Board meeting by releasing the Governance and Corruption Diagnostic Assessment Report. The report identifies long-standing governance weaknesses and outlines reforms to strengthen anti-corruption institutions and economic performance. The report, prepared with technical assistance from the IMF and World Bank, emphasizes that corruption has plagued Pakistan for over 70 years, significantly hindering economic and social development. Weak governance and lack of transparency, and limited capacity in internal and external audits.

IAEA Demands Iran Grant Access to Nuclear Sites After June Strikes

UN: The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) on Thursday passed a resolution urging Iran to provide full access and information about its nuclear program, reinforcing obligations under UN Security Council resolutions. The move comes amid escalating tensions following a 12-day conflict in June, during which Israeli and U.S. strikes targeted key Iranian nuclear facilities.

IAEA inspectors have been blocked from entering critical sites such as Fordo and Natanz, though they continue to visit other locations. The resolution, adopted with 19 votes in favor, three against,



and 12 abstentions, calls on Tehran to cooperate fully and promptly with the agency, including granting requested access and information.

Director General Rafael Grossi emphasized the ur-

gency of inspections, telling reporters that while the agency has conducted checks at accessible facilities, visiting the sites attacked in June is essential for Iran to meet its commitments. —RT/Agency

Epstein Files to Become Public Following Trump's Bill Signing



US: US President Donald Trump announced that he has signed legislation requiring the Justice Department to release all files related to convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein.

The move comes after months of pressure from victims, lawmakers, and the public. The newly signed Epstein Files Transparency Act mandates that all unclassified materials from the Epstein inves-

tigation be made available in a searchable and downloadable format within 30 days. The bill cleared Congress with overwhelming bipartisan support: the House voted 427-1, while the Senate passed it by unanimous consent. Previously, Trump had opposed releasing the files but shifted his position after criticism from Epstein's victims and members of his own Republican Party. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Extends Ban on Indian Aircraft Until December 24 via NOTAM

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Airports Authority (PAA) has issued a notice to airmen (Notam) extending the airspace ban for Indian aircraft till December 24, it emerged on Thursday.



The new ban for Indian aircraft has been notified just four days before a previous one is set to expire. India and Pakistan have closed their airspace to each other's airlines since tensions between them escalated in late April in the wake of an attack in occupied Kashmir's Pahalgam that killed 26 people. Islamabad most recently extended the airspace ban in mid-October till November 24.

The latest restriction went into effect from 2:50pm Pakistan time on November 19 (yesterday) to 4:59am on December 24, according to a Notam issued on Wednesday.

The bar will apply to all Indian-registered aircraft as well as any aircraft operated, owned, or leased by Indian airlines or operators, including military flights. The airspace closure applies from ground level up to unlimited altitude. Pakistan's airspace is divided into two flight information regions (FIRs) — Karachi and Lahore, according to a Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority (PCAA) document from 2022. The Notam applies to both the Karachi (OPKR) and Lahore (OPLR) FIRs. —RT/Agency

Trump to Meet NYC Mayor-Elect Mamdani at White House Today

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump said he will meet New York City Mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani at the White House today in what would be the first meeting of the Republican leader with the democratic socialist who won this month's mayoral election. Mamdani and Trump have been critical of each other, with Trump having backed Mamdani's opponent, Andrew Cuomo. Mamdani, for his part, has been critical of the Trump administration's policies, including its crackdown on immigra-



tion and US support for Israel during the Gaza war. "We have agreed that this meeting will take place at the Oval Office on Friday, November 21st," Trump said

on social media. Mamdani told reporters earlier this week that his team had reached out to the White House to arrange a meeting. —RT/Agency

Two Police Officers Martyred in Dera Ismail Khan Blast



DIK: Two police personnel were martyred after an explosion near an armoured police vehicle in Dera Ismail Khan, according to police officials.

According to details, the blast took place in the Hathala area of Kulachi. The DSP said that a search operation is underway in the area. Earlier,

the Inter-Services Public Relations said security forces conducted two operations in Kurram district. In an exchange of fire during a targeted operation based on intelligence, twelve members of the Kharijites were killed. In a separate operation against another group, forces killed eleven terrorists. —RT/Agency

US: US President Donald Trump said he would work to help end the war in Sudan after Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman asked him to get involved in the matter. "We've already started working on that," Trump said.

Rawalpindi ATC Withdraws Arrest Warrants Against Aleema Khan in Terrorism Case

RAWALPINDI: A Rawalpindi Anti-Terrorism Court (ATC) on Thursday withdrew arrest warrants previously issued for Aleema Khan, the sister of PTI founder and former premier Imran Khan, in the November 26 protest case.



ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah withdrew the warrants after Aleema appeared before the court and submitted a compliance report. The court directed her to furnish fresh surety bonds worth Rs1 million each, following which the warrants were cancelled.

The case pertains to a protest staged by the PTI in November last year and the court has issued arrest warrants for Aleema multiple times over her repeated absence. Aleema has denied any wrongdoing, maintaining that the charges are politically motivated.

At a previous hearing, the judge had also directed the relevant authorities to block Aleema's national identity card (CNIC) and passport, and freeze her bank accounts.

During today's hearing, Aleema moved an application seeking a reversal of the freeze on her bank accounts, including joint accounts associated with the National University of Modern Languages.

She argued that the freezing orders had caused her

undue hardship and were issued without proper legal justification. In response, Judge Shah issued notices to the prosecution, seeking their response on the application. The court is expected to examine whether the freezing orders were warranted and whether there was a sufficient legal basis to maintain them. Subsequently, the judge adjourned the hearing until November 26, directing the prosecution to submit its reply before then. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Emerges as Dubai Airport's Fourth-Largest Market with 3.2 Million Passengers



DUBAI: Dubai International Airport (DXB) handled 3.2 million passengers from Pakistan in the first nine months of 2025, making Pakistan the airport's fourth-largest market, Dubai Airports Dubai Airports noted that millions of Pakistanis continue to use DXB for tourism, business travel, family visits, job opportunities, and transit to Europe, the Middle East and North America.

Pakistan remains one of the UAE's most important tourism and labour-mobility partners, with steady travel demand throughout the year.

Dubai airport recorded the highest quarterly traffic in its 65-year history, welcoming 24.2 million passengers between July and September — a 1.9% increase year-on-year.

Total traffic from January to September reached 70.1 million, up 2.1% from last year. While Dubai Airports said its 12-month rolling traffic hit 93.8 million passengers by the end of September, the highest ever, India remained DXB's top market with 8.8 million passengers, followed by Saudi Arabia (5.5 million) and the UK (4.6 million). —RT/Agency

CTD Thwarts Planned Attack, Kills Two Militants in Sarai Naurang

PESHAWAR: A joint Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) and police operation in the Sarai Naurang area late Wednesday ended with two suspected militants shot dead after what officers described as a tense, stop-and-start exchange of fire.



Officials from the CTD in Bannu and Lakki Marwat stated that their teams had been tracking the pair since early evening, after receiving information that the men were moving around the Nali Chak Road belt and possibly planning an attack there.

By the time the units reached the spot, the suspects had already shifted positions, and the situation, as one official put it, "turned hostile very quickly."

Gunfire broke out almost immediately, and after an intense but brief battle, both men lay dead. Officers later said the two had been on their radar for months.

sources, one of the dead, identified as Azmatullah, had been named in multiple cases linked to attacks on police and security personnel, including incidents in which DSP Gul Muhammad, Constable Naseem Gul and Lieutenant Arifullah were martyred.

The second suspect, Mohammad Sohail, had earlier been accused of the killings of Constable Mansoor Khan and LHC Hashim Khan.

Police said the bodies have been shifted for identification procedures, and further checks are underway to determine whether the men were part of a wider cell still operating in the region.

Earlier, Security forces eliminated four terrorists belonging to the Indian proxy, Fata al-Khawarij, in multiple engagements in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa from November 17 to 18, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said on Wednesday.

The security forces in Bajaur district conducted an intelligence-based operation (IBO) on the reported presence of terrorists. During the conduct of the operation, troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location, and after an intense fire exchange, one militant was killed. —RT/Agency
