PESHAWAR: Security forces have killed 17 terrorists, including three key commanders, during joint operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The operations were conducted by the police, Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) and military in different areas of Bannu and Lakki Marwat. A large amount of weapons and ammunition was recovered from the terrorists, and significant blows were dealt to local factions of the "Khwarij" (extremist) group, with the killing of top commanders. In a separate operation in the SheriKhel and Paka



Pahar Khel areas, 10 militants were killed, and five others were injured. Additionally, a facilitator was arrested during the operation. Although seven terrorist bodies were recovered, three others could not be retrieved due to their location in a difficult mountainous area. Among the killed terrorists were key commanders, including Niaz Ali, also known as Akasha, and Abdullah, known as Shapankoi, both of whom were wanted by security forces.

Further operations in Nasarkhel area of Lakki Marwat led to the killing of one more terrorist in a joint action by police, CTD, and the local peace committees. The local community also actively participated in the operations, showing strong support for law enforcement. In the Hawaid area of Bannu, police and local peace committees engaged in a confrontation with terrorists, but the militants managed to escape. Additionally, in Doda, militants from the Khawarij group fired on a police party. In response, Bannu police, CTD, and security forces launched an eight-hour operation, resulting in the death of six militants and the injury of dozens. Notably, notorious terrorist commander Rasool, also known as Commander Aryana, was killed in the operation. A large cache of weapons and ammunition was seized. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Inspector General of Police Zulfiqar Hamid praised the successful operations carried out by the Bannu region police, CTD, and security forces. He assured that efforts to rid the region of extremist elements would continue.—RT/Agency

LAHORE: PTI leader Hammad Azhar raised concerns on Saturday about missing Form 45s in the election materials provided to presiding officers by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) for tomorrow's by-election in Lahore's NA-129 constituency. Azhar, whose father Mian Azhar's death in July led to the seat's vacancy, alleged that several presiding officers have reported the absence of Form 45s, a crucial document in the



electoral process. In a post on social media platform X, Azhar called the situation a "serious violation" of the electoral process, highlighting the potential implications for the transparency and integrity of the election. Form 45 is essential for recording the vote count, and its absence could lead to complications in verifying the election results.—RT/Agency

President, PM Praise Security Forces for Eliminating 13 Militants in KP Operations

ISLAMABAD: President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif commended Pakistan's security forces for successfully eliminating 13 militants affiliated with the India-backed network Fitna al-Khawarij during intelligence-based operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. He applauded the effective intelligence-driven actions undertaken by the Pakistan Army and law-enforcement agencies, calling them a testament to their operational excellence. President Zardari said that the state was ensuring the complete and uncompromising eradication of militants operating under foreign patronage. "The elimination of India-sponsored extremists is being ensured with full force and firmness of state authority," he said.



He added that the total defeat of externally backed terrorism was being pursued with national consensus and unity of purpose. The president reaffirmed that Pakistan's security personnel continued to display remarkable bravery and commitment in safeguarding the nation, earning the gratitude of the entire country. The Prime Minister's Office, in a separate statement, said Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif also praised the security forces for carrying out successful operations against Fitna-ul-Khawarij terrorists in

Dr. Yasmin Rashid Gets Bail in May 9 Arson Case, Despite Multiple Convictions

LAHORE: PTI leader Dr. Yasmin Rashid has been granted bail in the May 9 arson and vandalism case by a special anti-terrorism court in Lahore. The case was filed under the jurisdiction of the Mughalpura Police Station. Dr. Rashid, currently detained in Kot Lakhpat Jail, had her bail petition heard by Judge Manzoor Ali. Her legal team argued that several co-



accused, including Ejaz Chaudhry, had already been granted bail in the same case, strengthening her case for release. After reviewing the evidence and hearing the arguments, the court approved her bail. Dr. Rashid, who has been sentenced to 10 years in prison for each of three separate May 9 cases, still faces hearings for bail pleas in three additional cases scheduled for November 27. Notably, she has already been cleared in the Jinnah House attack case.—RT/Agency

Foreign Minister Dar, Croatian FM Discuss Regional and Global Developments

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Senator Ishaq Dar on Saturday held a meeting with Foreign Minister of Croatia, Gordon Radman, at the 4th EU Indo-Pacific Ministerial Forum.



They discussed regional and global developments, advancing political and economic cooperation, enhancing Pakistan-Croatian engagement bilaterally and at multilateral forums. Foreign Office spokesperson said in a press release. Dar also invited the Croatian foreign minister to visit Pakistan. A day earlier, the deputy prime minister warned that India's illegal and unilateral decision to place the Indus Water Treaty (IWT) in abeyance poses a serious threat to regional stability.

He made these remarks while addressing the Indo-Pacific Ministerial Forum Roundtable in Brussels on Friday. Ishaq Dar recalled that New Delhi suspended its participation in the treaty in April following an attack in occupied Kashmir's Pahalgam, which killed 26 people — an incident India blamed on Pakistan without providing evidence. Islamabad condemned the move as an attempt to undermine its water rights, describing any unilateral suspension as an "act of war" and noting that the treaty contains no provision for such action. Pakistan has since said it is considering legal recourse, arguing the step violates the 1969 Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties.—RT/Agency

Dubai Investigates India's Tejas Jet Crash for Possible Breach of Flying Rules

DUBAI: Investigators are examining whether the pilot who died in India's Tejas fighter jet crash at the Dubai Airshow descended below the mandatory 300-foot minimum altitude for aerobatic manoeuvres or breached any approved flying protocols, aviation officials said on Saturday.



The inquiry is being led jointly by the UAE's civil aviation authority, the country's armed forces aviation division, and the Dubai Airshow's Flying Control Committee (FCC), which is reviewing all available technical data and display-routine documents.

Officials said investigators are analysing radar tracks, flight-path recordings, and high-resolution video

footage to determine the jet's altitude profile and maneuver sequence in the moments before impact. The FCC is also assessing whether the pilot performed any aerobatic manoeuvres that had not been formally cleared for the show.

A parallel technical investigation is examining whether the aircraft experienced a sudden loss of power, a control-system malfunction, or another mechanical failure that may have prevented recovery.

Pakistan, IMF Agree on Major Tax Policy Reforms and Budget Management Overhaul



ISLAMABAD: The government has agreed with the IMF on changes to tax policy, budget-making, and public finance management for the upcoming budget. Sources said that, according to the Ministry of Finance, the technical report on budget proposals for the next fiscal year will be submitted to the ministry in January. The IMF's technical mission has returned after giving recommendations for major changes in the budget.

It was further revealed that the Ministry of Finance will prepare and share final proposals with the IMF next month regarding changes in the budget implementation process. Fifteen proposals were discussed with the

IMF technical mission to improve the budget execution process. Recommendations from the IMF delegation include creating a digitized public finance management (PFM) plan, forming a committee to oversee the digitized PFM plan, implementing full e-office and e-PADs for budget preparation, and eliminating data inconsistencies. Sources added that preparing the budget on the basis of updated data and expanding consultations with all ministries during budget formulation were also part of the technical mission's proposals. The mission also provided recommendations for significant changes in tax policy for the new budget.—RT/Agency

Massive Blaze Threatens 50 Million-Year-Old Forests: Iran Calls for International Aid

IRAN: A raging fire in Iran's UNESCO-listed Hyrcanian forests, a site of extraordinary biodiversity, has prompted urgent international assistance. Iran has requested help from Turkey, which is sending fire-fighting planes and helicopters to aid in controlling the blaze. The fire, which reignited after a brief period of calm, is endangering the ancient forests along the Caspian Sea, home to over 3,200 plant species, some of



which are found nowhere else on Earth. The Hyrcanian forests, recognized as a World Heritage site in 2019, date back 50 million years and are considered a living museum of plant diversity. The fire, worsened by a severe drought that has left rainfall in the region 85% below average, is being fought by Iranian forces, including two flyfisher firefighting planes, seven helicopters, and 400 firefighters. Iran's Vice-President Shima Ansari confirmed that Turkey had mobilized two firefighting aircraft and a helicopter, with Russia also offering assistance if necessary.—RT/Agency

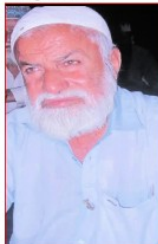

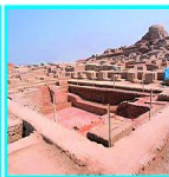
While some see this as mere theatrics, others hope it signals a more inclusive and stable approach. The U.S. and the world have long

Pakistan and India Poised for High-Voltage Clash in T20 World Cup 2026 Grouping

LAHORE: The ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026 is likely to feature the blockbuster Pakistan-India clash as the two arch-rivals are expected to be slotted in the same group, international media reported on Saturday.



According to a report by a renowned cricket news website, the 20 participating teams will be divided into five groups of four, with the top two teams after the league stage advancing into the Super Eight. This stage will further see the sides split into two contingents of four.

The report further suggested that defending champions are likely to be placed in the same group as their fierce rivals Pakistan, which may further include Netherlands, Namibia and the United States of America

USA). Meanwhile, the high-octane clash between two former champions is likely to be played at the R Premadasa Stadium in Colombo on February 15, with the complete match schedule of the tournament reportedly set to be announced on November 25.

Unlike fellow hosts India, Sri Lanka will be slotted in a tougher group, featuring three full-member nations — Australia, Zimbabwe and Ireland, besides Oman.

England, West Indies, Bangladesh, Italy and Nepal will form one group, while the remaining will be comprised of South Africa, New Zealand, Afghanistan, United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Canada.

Notably, it was reported earlier this week that the complete match schedule for the T20 World Cup 2026 will be announced during a ceremony in Mumbai, which, according to Indian media, will be attended by the International Cricket Council (ICC) Chairman Jay Shah, while several former and current cricketers will also be invited to attend the event.

The 10th edition of the men's T20 World Cup is likely to be played between February 7 and March 8. The final is likely to be held in Ahmedabad or Colombo, depending on whether Pakistan qualifies, given that India and Pakistan are currently not playing bilateral cricket due to political tensions.—Agency

Rashid Latif Apologizes, Ends Controversy with PCB Over Fiery Comments



Former Pakistan Test captain Rashid Latif has apologized for his controversial comments regarding the Pakistan Cricket Board's (PCB) policies, calling his remarks an "error of judgement." Latif's earlier criticisms, particularly on surrogate advertising and the removal of Mohammad Rizwan as ODI captain, had led to the PCB filing a complaint with the National Cyber Crime Investigation Agency (NCCIA).

Latif was summoned for questioning in Lahore on Nov 17, prompting him to challenge the inquiry in the Islamabad High Court, calling it illegal.

In a statement on X, Latif clarified that his primary concern was with possible violations of government advisories, not with implying any individuals or stakeholders in wrongdoing. His apology ends the legal and public dispute, bringing closure to a saga that had escalated tensions between the former captain and the cricket board.—Agency

Erik Swanson Ends Seven-Year MLB Run With Retirement Announcement



Former Seattle Mariners and Toronto Blue Jays pitcher Erik Swanson announced his retirement from professional baseball in an Instagram post on Thursday, marking the end of his seven-year career.

The right-handed pitcher spent four seasons with the Mariners from 2019 to 2022 before being traded to the Toronto Blue Jays in 2022 in a deal that sent outfielder Teoscar Hernandez to Seattle.

In his heartfelt farewell message, Swanson expressed deep gratitude to everyone who supported him throughout his career.

"My time in this sport has been incredible. Thank you to everyone who helped me along the way. These 12 years have truly been unforgettable," he shared.

32 years old, Swanson was an eighth-round draft pick by the Texas Rangers in 2014 and was involved in two major trades before making his MLB debut.

He was part of the trade that sent him from Texas to the Yankees in exchange for Carlos Beltran before the 2016 season. Later, he was traded from the Yankees to Seattle in the deal for James Paxton prior to the 2019 season.

Initially pitching out of the bullpen in the Rangers' organization and starting games with the Yankees, Swanson made his major league debut with the Mariners in 2019 as a versatile reliever.

Swanson emerged as one of the top relievers in the American League during the 2022 and 2023 seasons, posting a 2.39 ERA and striking out 145 batters while walking 31 over 120.1 innings.

However, his performance declined somewhat in recent years, partly due to arm injuries. Over his career, he compiled a 4.20 ERA across parts of seven MLB seasons.

His most successful season came in 2021, when he pitched just over 35 innings and posted a 3.31 ERA with nearly a 25% strikeout rate in 33 appearances.—Agency

Lauren Davis has announced her retirement from professional tennis at the age of 32 in a heartfelt, featuring a carousel of photographs highlighting key moments from her career.



In her Instagram post, Davis reflected on her 15-year career and expressed gratitude for the experiences tennis has given her.

"Tennis has given me so much, and I'm endlessly grateful for the memories, the lessons, and the friends I've made," she wrote.

"I'm deeply proud of myself for showing up day after day, and I can truly say I have no regrets—I left my heart out there every single time."

The 32-year-old, a two-time WTA Tour title-winner, also recounted her journey from Gates Mills, Ohio, to the top of the sport. She moved to Florida at 16 to train at Chris Evert's Evert Tennis Academy and turned professional less than a year later.

Standing just 5 ft 2 in, Davis described herself as "one of the shortest players on tour," but said she "never let that limit me" and hoped to inspire others along the way.

"I saw it as an opportunity to be an anomaly, and hopefully to inspire others—I hope I did just that," she added.

Over her career, Davis reached the third round of a Grand Slam six times, including at the 2018 Australian Open, and recorded five wins over top-10 players, most notably defeating defending Wimbledon champion Angelique Kerber in 2019.

She represented the United States in three Billie Jean King Cup ties, including the 2017 semifinals, the year the Americans last won the title.

For now, Davis leaves behind a 15-year legacy of dedication, resilience, and inspiration in women's tennis.—Agency

Cobolli Stages Stunning Revival to Fire Italy Into Davis Cup Final

BOLOGNA: Flavio Cobolli clinched a stunning comeback to beat Belgium's Zizou Bergs 6-3, 6-7 (5), 7-6 (15) in Bologna on Friday, saving seven match points and advancing reigning champions Italy to their third consecutive Davis Cup final.



The 23-year-old gave Italy an unassailable 2-0 lead, avoiding the need for a doubles contest. Earlier, Matteo Berrettini had set Italy on course with a 6-3, 6-4 win over Raphael Collignon, giving the hosts an early advantage.

Cobolli's victory came after a 17-15 final-set tiebreak, the sixth-longest in Davis Cup history, in which he missed six match points before clinching the win with a service winner.

The Italian praised his team's effort and the country's support for the country, calling it a dream realized.

"We fought for our country, for this win, but in the end, I realised my dream," Cobolli said.

"I played for all of my team, my family, and it's one of the best days of my life."

Team captain Filippo Volandri described the performance as an exceptional example of leadership.

"In my five years as a captain, I've never seen anything like that. It's 5% tactics and 95% heart," Volandri said.

Despite never having won a singles championship, Bergs, ranked 43rd, challenged Cobolli point for point and gave everything on court in front of a boisterous Bologna crowd.

Cobolli, ranked 22nd, remained composed under pressure, celebrating joyfully while consoling the distraught Belgian afterwards.

Italy, riding a 13-tie winning streak, will next face the winner of Saturday's semi-final between Germany and Spain in the Davis Cup Final 8, to be staged at a neutral venue. The team aims to secure a third consecutive title in the revamped tournament.—Agency

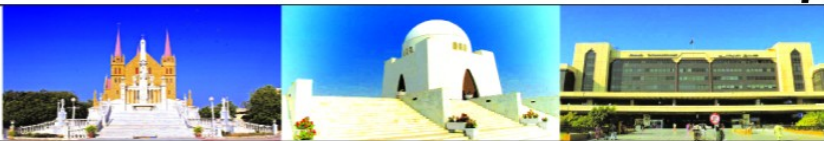

FIA Stops Saudi-Bound Passenger at Karachi Airport Over Fake Licence

KARACHI: Immigration authorities at Karachi Airport offloaded a Saudi Arabia-bound passenger after his Heavy Transport Vehicle (HTV) driving licence was found to be fake, the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) said on Saturday. According to the FIA spokesperson, the passenger, Muhammad Asif, was traveling to Saudi Arabia on an international flight for employment as a truck driver. During immigration checks, he presented an HTV licence purportedly issued by the FIA licensing branch, which was later confirmed to be forged. The spokesperson said the passenger admitted



he had obtained the fake licence through an agent for Rs 127,000, and further disclosed that he had never visited the Clifton licensing branch himself. FIA officials said the agent had prepared and provided the counterfeit licence to the passenger. Following the discovery, Muhammad Asif was handed over to the Anti-Human Trafficking Circle for further legal action. Earlier, Pakistan Customs foiled an attempt to smuggle a significant quantity of gold and foreign currency at Karachi's Jinnah International Airport, resulting in the arrest of two sisters.—RT/Agency

ABAD Chief Warns of Massive USD 20 Billion Capital Flight Abroad

KARACHI: Chairman ABAD Hassan Bakshi on Saturday said that around 15 to 20 billion dollars have been transferred to the UAE and apprehended more capital to shift over there. Addressing the 8th Pakistan International Property Expo and Tourism Investment Opportunities Conference here, the Chairman Association of Builders and Developers (ABAD) said that this system could not run owing to existing



financial and taxation policies in the country. He said there is 60 percent tax in Pakistan which is not even in Europe. "In Karachi's South district 100 construction projects have been prepared for building", he said. He said there is four percent property transfer tax in Dubai, while it is 40 percent in Pakistan.—RT/Agency

Karachi Comes to a Standstill as Transporters Block Roads in Customs Protest

KARACHI: Thousands of vehicles were stranded on the Northern Bypass on Saturday as transporters staged a sit-in protest against Pakistan Customs, blocking the key route for several hours. According to reports, the protest—led by the Transporters Association—has continued for more than 10 hours, causing long queues of traffic on the busy artery of Karachi. The road has been closed to all types of



traffic. The demonstration erupted following an alleged altercation between transporters and customs officials. Protesters accused customs personnel of smashing the windows of 20 to 25 vehicles, using abusive language during an argument, and even opening fire and using batons against transporters over a petty issue.—RT/Agency

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Pakistan Warns UN: Veto Power Paralyzes Security Council, Calls for Urgent Reforms

NEW YORK: Pakistan has told the UN General Assembly that the issue of the veto power, which gives the Security Council's five permanent members disproportionate sway in matters of international peace and security, should be tackled as part of the 15-member body's reform aimed at making it more effective.

Speaking in a debate on the use of the veto, Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad, permanent representative of Pakistan to the UN, said the Security Council has often been paralyzed by the strategic rivalries of its permanent members — Britain, China, France, Russia and the US — and the exercise



of the veto.

"It comes as no surprise therefore, and past and recent experiences have confirmed that the abolition, or restraint on the use of veto, will have to be an integral part of the reform of the Security Council," he added.

"We note that their proposals are designed to re-invigorate the Charter functions of the General Assembly, and are not related to, or impinge upon the IGV's (Inter-Governmental Negotiations) consideration of

Security Council reform."

The 2022 Assembly's resolution, adopted by consensus, calls for the General Assembly to automatically meet within 10 days if any of the five permanent members uses their right of veto.

The aim is to hold those countries accountable for exercising this special voting power, which allows them to block any Council resolution or decision.

This right is enshrined in the UN Charter, the Organization's founding document, because of their key roles in establishing the global body eight decades ago. In his remarks, Ambassador Asim Ahmad said that Pakistan — together with

the UFC (Uniting for Consensus) Group — remains opposed to the creation of new permanent members on an expanded Security Council.

"More permanent members and more vetoes will only aggravate the problem, and multiply the likelihood of paralysis or inaction by the Security Council," he told the 193-member Assembly.

"Let us be clear: The problem cannot be the solution," the Pakistani envoy added.

Progress towards restructuring the Security Council remains blocked as the so-called Group of Four — India, Brazil, Germany and Japan — continue pushing for permanent seats. —RT/Agency

Pakistan, EU Pledge Stronger Economic Ties via GSP Plus Scheme

BRUSSELS: Pakistan and European Union (EU) have emphasised the importance of further deepening trade and investment ties, including through the EU's GSP+ arrangement.

The emphasis was laid during 7th Strategic Dialogue co-chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar and EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, and Vice-President of the European Commission Kaja Kallas in Brussels.

The meeting provided a comprehensive review of the full spectrum of Pakistan-EU relations, building on the positive momentum of recent high-level engagements and sustained institutional interactions. Both sides reaffirmed their



commitment to a broad-based, multidimensional and forward-looking partnership anchored in shared values, the UN Charter, multilateralism, and the principles of mutual respect and cooperation. The dialogue also offered an opportunity to exchange views on regional and global developments, including South Asia, Afghanistan, the Middle East, and broader geopolitical developments. The two sides underlined the importance of coordinated approaches to peace, stability, sustainable development, and global challenges such as climate change and connectivity. They agreed to strengthen cooperation under the Strategic Engagement Plan (SEP 2019), advance work on ongoing dialogues, and identify concrete avenues to expand collaboration in the years ahead. —RT/Agency

Tensions Escalate: Air Strikes Kill 21 in Gaza After Ceasefire Breach

GAZA: In a dramatic escalation, Israeli air strikes killed 21 people in southern Gaza, following a reported ceasefire violation by Hamas. The violence erupted after an attack on Israeli soldiers in southern Israel, which Israel's military described as a breach of the truce. In retaliation, Israel launched a series of air strikes targeting what it called "terrorist positions" across Gaza. The strikes hit



multiple locations, including the Nuseirat refugee camp, where seven people were killed, and a residential building in Al-Nasr district, leaving at least four dead and several others injured. —RT/Agency

Tragedy Strikes: Roof Collapse in KP Kills 5, Including 4 Children

KP: A devastating roof collapse in Pabbi, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, claimed the lives of five family members, including four children, on Saturday. The incident occurred in the Dagg Jadedee area of Nowshera, trapping eight people under debris. Rescue 1122 teams, along with local residents, managed to recover the victims, but



three others were injured. This tragedy follows a similar incident earlier in the month, where a gas explosion in Harbanspura killed three and injured seven. —RT/Agency

Jamaat-e-Islami Chief Hafiz Naeem Vows Movement for Systemic Change Will Continue



LAHORE: Jamaat-e-Islami emir Hafiz Naeem-ur-Rehman has said that their movement will continue until the system is transformed.

Hafiz Naeem-ur-Rehman stated that neither a feudal nor a capitalist order will be allowed to prevail, and that public awareness about changing the system will be

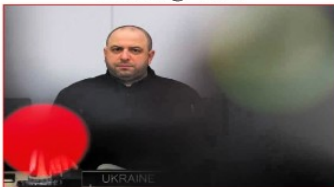
strengthened.

Ukraine to Meet US in Switzerland to Discuss Ending War



KYIV: Kyiv will hold consultations with the US in Switzerland on ending Russia's war in Ukraine, a top Ukrainian security official said on Saturday.

"...we are starting consultations between high-ranking officials of Ukraine and the United States on the possible parameters of a future peace agreement," Rustem Umerov, Secretary of the National Security and Defence Council, wrote on Telegram.

The announcement of talks comes as Ukraine and European allies scrambled to coordinate a response to the 28-point plan to end the war presented by the US this week.

US President Donald Trump told journalists he believed Thursday was an appropriate deadline for Kyiv to accept the plan.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy warned the nation that Ukraine risked losing its dignity and freedom if Washington's backing over the plan. Ahead of the upcoming talks he said peace was always based on guaranteed security and justice. —RT/Agency

IHC Judges Challenge Transfer of Intra-Court Appeal to Federal Constitutional Court



ISLAMABAD: Judges of the Islamabad High Court have challenged the hearing of their intra-court appeal in the Federal Constitutional Court.

In a petition filed by four IHC judges, they requested that the intra-court appeal be sent back to the Supreme Court. The judges argued that the appeal was transferred to the constitutional court due to the 27th Constitutional Amendment, but the amendment itself is contrary to the Constitution.

They stated in their petition that the legislature, executive, and judiciary were established under the Constitution of 1973, which is based on three pillars. The Constitution clearly defines the separation of powers and limits of each organ. They added that the power to amend the Constitution cannot be used to abolish or undermine the judiciary.

The judges further argued that Supreme Court judgments clearly outline the principles governing the separation of powers. —RT/Agency

Indian Media Blames US-Made Engine for Tejas Crash at Dubai Airshow

NEW DELHI: The Indian media once again attempted to deflect blame for a recent Tejas aircraft crash by attributing the incident to the American-made engine, instead of acknowledging domestic shortcomings.

General (ret'd) Bakshi and Indian journalist Amab Goswami repeatedly claimed that the crash was linked to the US-supplied engine, portraying it as the root cause while downplaying India's own defence issues.

Goswami alleged that delays in the delivery of GE-404 engines by the United States had created a dangerous gap in India's defence preparedness.

He said the Tejas fighter jet operates on US-made General Electric engines, insisting that "General Electric has never been a friend to



India."

He further claimed that the US government had intentionally slowed deliveries of next-generation engines for the Tejas programme. Gen Bakshi echoed these accusations, stating India should have received the GE-404 engines two years earlier despite having paid \$1 billion.

He asserted that India had received only two engines to date and warned that tensions could flare up again at any time. Critics argue that such narratives by the Indian government and its supportive media not only damage credibility but also distract the public from genuine defence and governance issues.

A day earlier, a dramatic crash occurred at the Dubai Airshow when an Indian Air Force Tejas fighter jet went down during an aerobatic display, killing the pilot. —RT/Agency

Frida Kahlo Painting Sells for \$54.7m, Sets Record for Female Artist

NEW YORK: A self-portrait by celebrated Mexican artist Frida Kahlo sold for \$54.66 million in New York, setting a record for the price of a painting by a woman, the auction house Sotheby's said.

The sale of Kahlo's 1940 artwork, titled "El sueño (La cama)" — which translates to "The dream (The bed)" — broke the previous record set by American artist Georgia O'Keeffe, whose 1932 painting "Jimson Weed/White Flower No 1" sold for \$44.4 million in 2014. Kahlo's painting is "the most valuable work by a woman artist ever sold at auction," Sotheby's said in a post on social media platform X.

The artwork depicts Kahlo sleeping in a bed that appears to float through the sky, beneath a skeleton with its legs wrapped in sticks of dynamite.



The work was painted during a pivotal decade in Kahlo's career, marked by her turbulent relationship with Mexican painter Diego Rivera, the auction house said on X.

The painting went on the auction block with an estimated price range of \$40 million to \$60 million.

The buyer's name was not disclosed. The work is a "very personal" painting, in which Kahlo "merges folkloric motifs from Mexican culture with European surrealism," Anna Di Stasi, the head of Latin American art at Sotheby's, told AFP. The Mexican artist, who died in 1954 at the age of 47, "did not completely agree" with her work being associated with the surrealist movement, Di Stasi said. However, "given this magnificent iconography, it seems entirely appropriate to include it," she said. —RT/Agency

CM Afridi Assures Centre of Support, Pledges to Attend All Federal Meetings

KP: Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Sohail Afridi has apparently lowered his rhetoric against his political rivals as he assured the PML-N-led federal government of his support for the "sake of peace" in the country.

"I will attend a meeting of the National Security Committee," the KP CM said in a statement on Saturday, adding that he would also participate in any meetings convened by the Centre to "speak up" for the rights of the province.

The ruling PML-N leaders have accused the KP Chief Minister of having sympathies for extremists due to his objections to counterterrorism operations in the province.

However, CM Afridi in today's statement, said he would cooperate with the federal government "for the sake of peace," emphasising that there would be no compromise on law and order.

"Terrorism has affected every sector of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Anyone who martyrs our soldiers is a terrorist," he added.

During today's meeting, the KP CM asserted that KP police were fully capable to deal with terrorists, saying that the Counter Terrorism Department "has made many sacrifices" in the fight against terrorism.

CM Afridi lamented the shortage of resources, which he said prompted the provincial government to slash development budgets to divert



funds to law enforcement agencies.

On reports about his absence from a National Security Council (NSC) meeting after his election as the KP chief minister, Afridi said that the meeting was related to wheat.

"I will now attend the National Security Council meeting. However, no such meeting has taken place since my arrival," added Afridi.

He also denied receiving an invitation to the National Finance Commission (NFC) meeting scheduled for December 4. —RT/Agency

Farhan's 80 Guides Pakistan Past Sri Lanka in T20I Tri-Series Thriller

RAWALPINDI: Sahibzada Farhan scored an unbeaten 80-run knock as Pakistan defeated Sri Lanka by seven wickets in the third T20I of the tri-series, also featuring Zimbabwe, at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium on Saturday.

The victory, which was Pakistan's second in the ongoing series, helped them replace Zimbabwe at the top of the standings, having four points in two matches. Sri Lanka, on the other hand, succumbed to the bottom after suffering back-to-back defeats.

Set to chase a modest 129-run target, the home side comfortably knocked out the winning runs for the loss of just three wickets and 27 balls to spare.

Farhan spearheaded Pakistan's pursuit with an un-



beaten 80 off just 45 deliveries, studded with five sixes and six fours.

He received notable support from fellow opener Saim Ayub and star batter Babar Azam, who contributed with 20 and 16, respectively.

For Sri Lanka, Dushmantha Chameera bagged two wickets, while skipper Dasun Shanaka could take one. Sri Lanka captain Dasun Shanaka's decision to bat

first backfired as his team could accumulate 128/7 in 20 overs despite Janith Liyanage's gutsy knock.

The visitors got off to a brief flying start to their innings, with opener Kamil Mishara taking on Pakistan bowlers for two sixes and as many fours during his 12-ball 22 until Faheem Ashraf drew curtains on his blazing knock in the fourth over. —RT/Agency
