PML-N's Sanaullah Calls PTI for Dialogue After CM Afridi Signals Cooperation

ISLAMABAD: Senior Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leader Senator Rana Sanaullah on Sunday reiterated his party's offer to the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for talks, emphasising that democracy thrives through dialogue.

Speaking to the media in Faisalabad after casting his vote in the by-elections, he assailed jailed PTI founder Imran Khan, who "never engaged in politics".

"Democracy advances through dialogue, but they [PTI] created a deadlock," he said.

His comments came just a day after Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Chief Minister Sohail Afridi assured the PML-N-led federal government of his support for the "sake of peace" in the country.

In a statement, Afridi said that no meeting of the National Security Committee (NSC) had taken place since his election as the KP chief minister.

"I will attend a meeting of the National Security Committee," the KP CM said, adding that he would participate in any meetings convened by the Centre to "speak up" for the rights of the province.



Meanwhile, Sanaullah — while recalling Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's offer to the PTI for talks on the Charter of Democracy during and after the PTI's government in the Centre — said that his party was still in favour of sitting with politicians to resolve issues.

He lamented that the PTI founder was "solely focused" on filing cases against the opposition leaders, rather than engaging them in dialogue.

The PML-N leader asserted that his party would emerge victorious in the by-elections, stating that "the public will support the PML-N". On the voter turnout for the by-elections, Sanaullah said that the figure usually remains between 25% and 30% in the by-polls.

The PML-N leader stated that the by-elections were conducted in a peaceful manner, saying "no one was arrested or stopped anywhere in the entire constituency".

"Development projects were stopped due to the election. The planning for the development project has already been done," he added.

The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) held by-elections in six National Assembly constituencies — NA-18 (Haripur), NA-96 (Faisalabad), NA-104 (Faisalabad), NA-129 (Lahore), NA-143 (Sahiwal) and NA-185 (Dera Ghazi Khan). —RT/Agency

Mercurial Trump Slams Ukraine Over 'Ingratitude' Amid Geneva Peace Talks

US: Ukrainian, US and European officials met in Geneva on Sunday to discuss a draft plan presented by Washington to end the war in Ukraine, after Kyiv and its allies voiced alarm over what they saw as major concessions to the aggressor Russia.

United States President Donald Trump, who has championed the 28-point plan, said on Sunday that Ukraine had not been grateful for American efforts over the war, even as US weapons continue to flow to Kyiv via Nato and Europe keeps buying Russian oil.

On Friday, Trump said Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy had until Thursday to approve the plan, which calls on Ukraine to cede territory, accept limits on its military and renounce ambitions to join Nato.

For many Ukrainians, including soldiers fighting on the front lines, such terms would amount to capitulation after nearly four years of fighting in Europe's deadliest conflict since World War Two.



On Saturday, Trump said the current proposal for ending the war is not his final offer. With the US delegation led by Secretary of State Marco Rubio, the main talks between US and Ukrainian officials got under way in Geneva on Sunday afternoon in a stiff atmosphere at the US mission, soon after Trump complained in a Truth Social post that Ukraine's leadership had shown "zero gratitude" to the US for its efforts and Europe continued to buy Russian oil.

Since the US plan was announced, there has been confusion about who was involved in drawing it up. European allies said they had not been consulted. As officials began meeting, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said the goal was to craft a plan acceptable to Ukraine, which could be used in a negotiation with Russia. "Right now, I'm not yet convinced we're going to get the solution President Trump wants in the next few days," Merz said on the sidelines of a G20 meeting in Johannesburg.

Before heading to Geneva, Rubio insisted on X that Washington had authored the plan after remarks from some US senators suggesting otherwise.

Senator Angus King said Rubio had told senators the plan was not the administration's position, but "essentially the wish-list of the Russians." Europeans have submitted a modified version of the US plan for Ukraine that pushes back on proposed limits to Kyiv's armed forces and territorial concessions, according to a document seen by Reuters on Sunday. —RT/Agency

Pakistan Condemns Israeli Attacks on Gaza Civilians



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has strongly condemned the attacks by Israeli occupying forces on innocent Palestinians in Gaza. Foreign Office spokesperson, Tahir Hussain Andrabi, stated that the Israeli attacks have killed and injured innocent children and women, and Israel is committing a serious violation of international law and the recent peace agreement.

He said these attacks are sabotaging peace efforts and constitute a clear violation of the peace agreement reached in Sharm el-Sheikh. The government of Pakistan urges the international community to end Israeli impunity and violations of the ceasefire.

The Foreign Office emphasised that immediate steps should be taken to uphold international human rights and humanitarian law. The spokesperson reiterated Pakistan's principled position in support of the establishment of a free, sovereign, and contiguous State of Palestine. —RT/Agency

Hamas, Egypt Hold Crucial Talks on Ceasefire Amid Rising Tensions

HAMAS: A senior Hamas delegation met with Egypt's intelligence chief in Cairo on Sunday to discuss the fragile ceasefire agreement and the deteriorating situation in Gaza. The ongoing tensions between Israel and Hamas have seen both sides accuse each other of violating the truce that was brokered by Egypt, Qatar, and the U.S. last month.

In a statement following the meeting, Hamas reaffirmed its commitment to the ceasefire's first phase but accused Israel of continuing violations that could jeopardise the peace deal. The group, led by exiled Gaza chief Khalil Al-Hayya, called for a "clear and defined mechanism" to monitor and prevent further breaches.



under the supervision of international mediators. The talks also focused on resolving the issue of Hamas fighters trapped in Rafah tunnels, with communication reportedly severed with them. Mediators have been working to address the fate of these fighters, holed up in tunnels in Israeli-controlled areas of Gaza. The meeting comes on the heels of rising military tensions. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu confirmed that Israel's military had killed five senior Hamas members on Saturday after a fighter infiltrated Israeli-controlled Gaza territory and attacked Israeli soldiers. As the ceasefire teeters on the brink of collapse, the situation remains volatile, with both sides watching closely for any sign of escalation or compliance. —RT/Agency

Iran Warns of Threats Targeting Supreme Leader Khamenei

IRAN: Iran's intelligence ministry has warned of attempts by foreign adversaries, including the United States and Israel, to target supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and destabilise the Islamic republic.

The country's ISNA news agency reported on Sunday that intelligence minister Esmail Khatib cautioned "the enemy seeks to target the supreme leader, sometimes with assassination attempts, sometimes with hostile attacks." While it was not immediately clear if the minister was referring to a specific incident, and Iranian officials often allege foreign plots, statements on threats against Khamenei's life had been rare prior to a 12-day war between Israel and Iran in June.

"Those who act in this direction, knowingly or unknowingly, are the infiltrating agents of the enemy," Khatib added, referring directly to Israel and the United States.

During the conflict earlier this year, Israel targeted senior Iranian military officials, nuclear scientists and sites as well as residential areas, with the US later joining with strikes on key nuclear facilities.



Asked about reports during the war that US President Donald Trump vetoed an Israeli plan to kill the supreme leader out of concern it would escalate the Iran-Israel showdown, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was dismissive but said the move would "end the conflict".

At the time, Trump had also said that Iran's supreme leader was a "very easy target" and that "we are not going to take him out, at least not for now."

He later said in a post on Truth Social that he had saved Iran's supreme leader from "A VERY UGLY AND IGNOMINIOUS DEATH".

The 86-year-old Khamenei has been Iran's supreme leader since 1989 and has the final say on all state affairs.

Earlier this month, Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian said he was particularly concerned for Khamenei's life during the war and feared that the country's institutions "would start fighting among each other."

In July, Khamenei said Israel's attacks during the war were intended to weaken the Islamic republic, sow "unrest and bring people into the streets to overthrow the system".

A ceasefire between Iran and Israel has been in place since June 24, but both Israel and the United States have threatened new strikes if Tehran revives its nuclear programme. —RT/Agency

Trump Demands Jail for Democrats Over Military Message Controversy



WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump said that six Democrats involved in a video calling on military officers to refuse illegal commands "should be in jail."

The Republican leader's remarks came after he accused the Democratic lawmakers on Friday of "seditious behaviour, punishable by death." Democrats slammed Trump's comments as "absolutely vile" threats against the six senators and representatives, all of whom have served in the military or intelligence community.

The video posted on social media called on the military to "refuse illegal orders" and featured Arizona's Mark Kelly, Michigan's Elissa Slotkin, along with Jason Crow of Colorado, Chris Deluzio and Chrissy Houlahan of Pennsylvania and Maggie Goodlander of New Hampshire. They did not specify which orders they were referring to, but Trump has ordered the National Guard into multiple US cities, in many cases against the wishes of local officials, in a bid to bring alleged rampant unrest under control.

Abroad, Trump has also ordered strikes on a series of alleged drug-smuggling vessels in the Caribbean Sea and eastern Pacific Ocean that have left more than 80 people dead and which experts say are illegal.

Trump has alluded to the death penalty on previous occasions. In 2023, former US military officer Mark Milley told a journalist he had secretly called his Chinese counterpart after the January 6, 2021 riots at the US Capitol to reassure Beijing that the United States remained "stable" and had no intention to attack China.

Trump subsequently wrote on social media that "in times gone by, the punishment would have been DEATH!" —RT/Agency

Pakistan, EU Press Kabul's De Facto Rulers to Combat Terrorism

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and the European Union (EU) called on Afghanistan's de facto authorities to play a constructive role in achieving the shared objective of rooting out terrorism from Afghan soil. The demand came as Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar and EU High Representative and Vice President Kaja Kallas co-chaired the seventh Strategic Dialogue in Brussels on November 21.

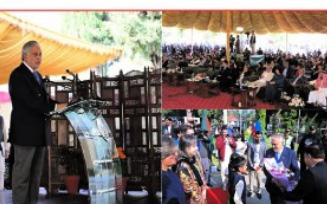
According to a joint statement issued by the Foreign Office (FO), the two sides also discussed Pakistan-Afghanistan relations amid

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Israel Strikes Gaza Again, 24 Killed as Hospitals Struggle

DEIR AL-BALAH: Gaza Strip Israel's military on Sunday launched airstrikes against Hamas militants in Gaza in the latest test of the ceasefire that began on Oct. 10, as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said five senior Hamas members were killed. Health officials in Gaza reported at least 24 people killed and another 54 wounded, including children.

The strikes, which Israel said were in response to gunfire at its troops, came after international momentum on Gaza, with the U.N. Security Council on Monday approving the U.S. blueprint to secure and govern the territory. It authorizes an international stabilization force to provide, health officials said, a transitional authority to be overseen by President



Donald Trump and envisions a possible future path to an independent Palestinian state. Israel has previously carried out similar waves of strikes after reported attacks on its forces during the ceasefire. At least 33 Palestinians were killed over a 12-hour period Wednesday and Thursday, mostly women and children, health officials said. One of Saturday's strikes targeted a vehicle, killing 11 and wounding over 20 Palestinians in Gaza City's Ramein neighborhood, said Rami Mhanna, managing director of Shifa Hospital, where the casualties were taken. The majority of the wounded were children, director Mohamed Abu Selmiya said.

SECP officials further identified a WhatsApp group titled "A103-Tipline Stock Strategies Hub," which is promoting a fake AI-based trading system linked to the fraudulent app. —RT/Agency

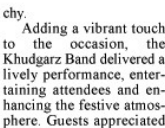

Pakistan Airport Authority Discloses Fresh Details on New Overflight and Airport Charges

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Airport Authority has disclosed fresh details regarding overflight and airport charges, confirming that the authority manages 400 to 450 overflights daily through Pakistani airspace. Overflight fees range from \$0.44 to \$1.3 per kilometre, depending on an aircraft's weight, with no tax imposed on passengers. The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) collects excise duties separately.

According to media reports, the Authority stated that domestic flight charges are set at Rs600, while international flights are charged Rs4,600. Revenue generated from airport fees is used for terminal upgrades, expanding facilities, and acquiring modern equipment to improve passenger services.

The Authority added that landing charges are weight-based, and parking fees are calculated per ton per hour, although the first two hours remain free of cost. Notably, no increase has been made in domestic tariffs for the past 10 years, underscoring the Authority's effort to maintain affordability. —RT/Agency

PML-N Minister Accuses PPP of Sabotaging Crucial Privatization Push

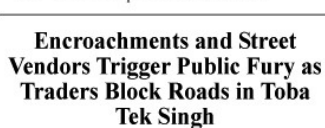

A Quiet Triumph at the Ballot Box

In a political climate where tension often simmers just beneath the surface, yesterday's high-stakes by-elections across 13 constituencies in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa delivered something truly remarkable: peace, order, and an electoral process free of the violence and controversy many had feared. In a deeply divided political environment, this calm was not accidental—it was earned. And it deserves to be celebrated.

The credit for this collective democratic success rests squarely with all stakeholders who worked tirelessly to ensure stability. The Punjab and KP governments played their part with diligence, but the true anchor of the day was the Election Commission of Pakistan. Under the stewardship of Chief Election Commissioner

Sikandar Sultan Raja, alongside the Provincial Election



Commissioners and the wider ECP team, the by-polls ran with a professionalism that inspires confidence. Their coordinated efforts, monitoring vigilance, and transparent procedures turned what could have been a flashpoint into a model exercise.

Yesterday proved that Pakistan can hold peaceful, transparent elections when institutions work together. Regardless of who wins the seats, democracy itself emerged stronger—and that is the success story worth celebrating.

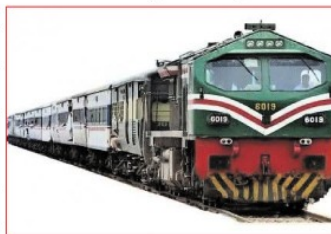

LAHORE: Australia's upcoming tour of Pakistan for the three-match ODI series may undergo potential changes, sources told Geo Super on Sunday.

According to the sources, the ODI series, initially scheduled for March 2026, is now unlikely to take place at that time, with discussions between the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) and Cricket Australia (CA) ongoing to finalise a revised schedule.

Sources also suggested the ODIs are now expected to be played after the conclusion of the Pakistan Super League (PSL) season 11. The Future Tours Programme had originally listed the series for 13–19 March.

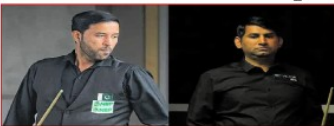
Meanwhile, Australia is

confirmed to visit Pakistan for a T20I series ahead of the T20 World Cup 2026 in India and Sri Lanka. The three-match T20 series between Pakistan and Australia is scheduled from 30 January to 5 February.

Speaking during an on-line press conference on 3 June, Cricket Australia CEO Todd Greenberg expressed optimism about the tour.

"I believe it will be another good tour of Pakistan. The series against Pakistan is an important part of our schedule. There has been good communication between Pakistan and Australia regarding both red-ball and white-ball series," Greenberg said.—Agency

The victory marked a remarkable achievement for Pakistan in the world of snooker, showcasing the skill and resilience of its top players.—Agency

Usman Tariq's Hat-Trick Powers Pakistan to Dominant 69-Run Win Over Zimbabwe



Usman Tariq produced a sensational maiden hat-trick as Pakistan crushed Zimbabwe by 69 runs in the fourth T20I of the tri-series at Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium on Sunday. Chasing a challenging target of 196, Zimbabwe's hopes were dashed early when opener Tadiwanashe Marumani was dismissed for just four runs by Naseem Shah in the opening over. The highlight of the match came from spinner Usman Tariq, whose brilliant hat-

trick shattered Zimbabwe's batting order. His magical spell left the visitors reeling, as Pakistan tightened their grip on the game. Pakistan's total of 195/4 was built on solid contributions from their top order, setting Zimbabwe a mountain to climb. Despite a valiant effort from the Zimbabwean batsmen, Tariq's heroics and disciplined bowling from the rest of the Pakistani attack ensured a comfortable victory for the hosts.—Agency

Maaz Sadaqat Sets His Sights on Batting Beside Babar Azam

DOHA: Pakistan Shaheens opening batter Maaz Sadaqat has expressed his dream of playing alongside star batter Babar Azam, calling it the best day of his life.

The 20-year-old all-rounder shared his excitement ahead of Pakistan's clash against Bangladesh 'A' in the ACC Men's Asia Cup Rising Stars final on Sunday at the West End Park International Cricket Stadium.

In a video released by the Asian Cricket Council (ACC) on their official social media handle, Sadaqat reflected on what representing Pakistan at the highest level would mean for him.

"My best day in life will be when I play in the Pakistan team alongside Babar Azam," Sadaqat said.

The all-rounder further elaborated on what this opportunity would mean for him personally and professionally.



"For me, it's a huge dream because to play with the number one batsman, to talk with him, learn from him, and then be part of the same match—it's a great honour for me," he stated.

It is pertinent to mention that Sadaqat previously shared the field with Babar Azam during Pakistan Super League (PSL) Season 10 while playing for Peshawar Zalmi.

In that season, the left-handed batter featured in four matches, scoring 78 runs at a

strike rate of 165.95, including a fifty.

Currently, Sadaqat is the second-highest run-scorer in the ongoing ACC Rising Stars tournament, amassing 235 runs in four matches at a strike rate of 185.03, including two fifties.

He has been instrumental in Pakistan's journey to the final.

In Pakistan's opening match against Oman, Sadaqat started with 96 off 54 balls, including five fours and nine sixes, helping

the team to a 220-4 in 20 overs.

Oman were restricted to 180-9, with Ubaid Shah taking three wickets and both Sadaqat and Saad Masood claiming two each, sealing a 40-run victory.

Against India, Pakistan bowled out their rivals for 136 runs. Shahid Aziz took three wickets, while Saad Masood and Sadaqat claimed two apiece.

Pakistan chased down the target in 13.2 overs, losing just two wickets, with Sadaqat hitting an unbeaten 79 off 47 balls, featuring seven fours and four sixes.

In the final group-stage match against UAE, Pakistan bowled out their opponents for just 59 runs in 18 overs. Sufiyan Mueem took three wickets, while Sadaqat and Ahmed Danial picked up two wickets each.—Agency

Virgil van Dijk Admits Liverpool Squad Is Letting Arne Slot Down



Liverpool captain Virgil van Dijk has said that players are letting down head coach Arne Slot and called on the team to start taking more responsibility.

Liverpool was defeated 3-0 by Nottingham Forest on Saturday at Anfield, which was their sixth defeat in seven league matches and left the defending champions 11th on the table. This is the first time in more than a decade that the Reds have fallen to the bottom half of the table.

Usually, Van Dijk reacts calmly to the results of the matches, even if it is not in their favour, but the latest defeat prompted a more apt response.

"We are definitely letting him [Slot] down but we've let ourselves down as well," Van Dijk said.

"You look at yourself first and then you help each other, you help each other get out of this mess because

at the moment it is a mess -- that's just a fact.

"As the champions we can't be in the situation we are in right now. What are we going to do about it? We're going to try to turn it around and that's the mentality everyone should have."

Van Dijk admitted there is frustration in the dressing room after the recent results, but turning on each other is not the solution; the team won the league together and will get out of the current situation together as well.

"It is easy to point fingers but you have to do it together," he added.

"What I want is for everyone to take responsibility on the pitch. We have to do that in order to push each other, to make each other better. It's easy to maybe just think about your own situation rather than the collective side when things are not going well.—Agency

QEAT Drama: Hayatullah's Seven-Wicket Burst Puts FATA on Top Against Lahore Whites

In reply, FATA closed the opening day at 86 for 3 in 23 overs, trailing by 119 runs. Noman Ali starred with the ball for Lahore, removing



Mohammad Usman for 15 and dismissing Hayatullah for 2.

Opening batter Mohammad Farooq made 28 off 45 balls, hitting three fours and a six.

Salman Khan Jr and Sirajuddin will resume FATA's innings on day two, unbeaten on 2 and 5 runs, respectively.

Meanwhile, Multan Region's opening batter Imam-

ul-Haq continued his fine run of form, smashing another century in the final round match of the QEAT against Abbottabad Region here at the Abbottabad Cricket Stadium.

Batting first, Multan dominated the opening day and piled up 360-5 in 84 overs, with Imam leading the charge through a magnificent 181 off 232 balls, studded with 21 fours and one six.

Imam's marathon knock eventually came to an end at the hands of Adil Naz, but not before he had put his side in a commanding position.

Shahroon Siraj further strengthened Multan's innings with a valuable 83 off 132 balls, hitting nine fours.—Agency

McLaren Duo Lando Norris and Oscar Piastri Break Silence on Las Vegas GP Disqualification

McLaren's Lando Norris and Oscar Piastri have reacted to the disqualification of the Las Vegas Grand Prix, describing it as a disappointing end to the race. However, they have now shifted their focus to Qatar.

The post-race development means Max Verstappen, who succeeded in Vegas, is now 24 points behind championship leader Norris and levelled with Piastri on 366 points with two rounds remaining.

Norris originally extended his lead over Piastri to 30 points by finishing second behind championship rival Verstappen, while Piastri came in fourth place on the streets of Las Vegas.

Piastri was hit by Liam Lawson on the opening lap, but did not suffer major dam-



age. However, he was not good enough to find a way past Andrea Kimi Antonelli to try and catch George Russell, who finished second after McLaren drivers disqualification.

FIA found excessive skid plank wear on both cars of McLaren in post-race analysis, with the minimum thickness allowed for a car after use being 9mm. As a result, the matter was referred to the stewards, who decided to dis-

qualify both cars from the race classification.

Reacting to losing his P2 finish, Norris said that it was a frustrating end to the race due to issues with their cars and added that their focus is now on Qatar, where they want to deliver their best performance.

"A frustrating end to today. We had to do some managing towards the end of the race, and now we know it was due to

some issues with our car, which have unfortunately resulted in us being disqualified," Lando Norris said.

"It's frustrating to lose so many points. As a team, we're always pushing to find as much performance as we can, and we clearly didn't get that balance right today."

"Nothing I can do will change that now; instead, full focus switches to Qatar, where we'll aim to go out and deliver the best possible performance in every session."

Piastri was also disappointed, saying they did not get it right in Las Vegas and will now try to get some points in the final two rounds.—Agency

Westbrook and Schroder Ignite Kings to Thrilling Win Over Denver Nuggets



DENVER: Russell Westbrook and Dennis Schroder played without Aaron Gordon due to a right hamstring injury sustained in Friday night's victory in Houston, were led by Nikola Jokic in the Kings' 128-123 in a high-scoring NBA thriller here at Ball Arena.

In just 18 minutes, Schroder scored 21 points off the bench. His relentless drives and timely shot-making kept the Kings afloat whenever Denver threatened to shift momentum.

Schroder's ability to control the pace was on full display, as he added seven assists and knocked down three field goals while committing no turnovers.

Westbrook, on the other hand, impacted the game on both ends with his trademark intensity, scoring 21 points, grabbing six rebounds, and dishing out 11 assists in 30 minutes. His physicality and tempo set the tone for the entire game, even though Sacramento's offense had several contributors.

Conversely, the Nuggets, who played without Aaron Gordon due to a right hamstring injury sustained in Friday night's victory in Houston, were led by Nikola Jokic with 44 points and 13 rebounds. Jamal Murray with 23 points, Cameron Johnson with 20, and Peyton Watson with 15.

The game was a back-and-forth affair, with the Kings holding a nine-point lead in the first half. Sacramento gradually chipped away, closing the half at 65-61. In the third quarter, a 15-3 run sparked by Keegan Murray tied the game at 84-84, and Schroder's late-quarter three-pointer gave the Kings a 91-90 lead.

In the fourth, Westbrook hit crucial late baskets, and DeRozan's three-point play with 12 seconds remaining sealed the victory. The Sacramento Kings will next face the Minnesota Timberwolves on November 25th.—Agency

Sharjeel Rolls Out Karachi's Mega Makeover with 756 Development Projects

KARACHI: Sindh Senior Minister Sharjeel Inam Memon announced that 756 development projects are currently underway in Karachi as part of the provincial government's plan to modernize the city's infrastructure. With Rs. 13 billion allocated for 76 Karachi Development Authority schemes and Rs. 18.36 billion for 200 projects by the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation, Memon



emphasized the government's commitment to upgrading facilities and ensuring the city meets contemporary needs. He assured the public that these projects would be completed on time, bringing much-needed relief to Karachi's citizens.—RT

Green Line Extension Revival Sets Karachi Up for a Major Transit Leap

KARACHI: Karachi's Green Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) extension is finally advancing after authorities resolved earlier disputes and approved a revised construction strategy. Officials from the Pakistan Infrastructure Development Company Limited (PIDCL) met Karachi Mayor Murtaza Wahab to share updated project plans, including alterations prompted by concerns from the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC).



Under the revised design, the extension will cover a 1.8-kilometre span from Numaish Chowrang to Municipal Park, featuring three new bus stations to enhance passenger accessibility across central Karachi. A modern Traffic Signal Priority system will be implemented to ensure faster bus movement, reducing delays during peak hours and boosting operational efficiency. The first phase of the Green Line already serves around 80,000 passengers daily, and officials anticipate a significant rise in ridership once the extension opens—offering thousands more commuters a quicker, more reliable transit option.—RT/Agency

Power Cuts Drain Karachi's Lifeline as City Loses 884 Million Gallons of Water in One Month

KARACHI: Karachi faced a staggering 884 million-gallon water shortfall in November as the city's major pumping stations repeatedly shut down due to prolonged power outages by K-Electric, the Water Corporation spokesperson revealed. According to official data, the Dhabaji Pumping Station suffered 132 hours and 20 minutes of electricity suspension, causing a loss of 424 million gallons of water. The Dumloti Station, hit by 146 hours of outages, recorded a deficit of 111 million gallons.



The North East Karachi Station reported a further 335 million-gallon shortage, while Hub and Pipri stations lost 6 million gallons each, and Gharo Station saw a 2 million-gallon reduction. Water Corporation officials have urged calls on K-Electric to ensure stable and uninterrupted power supply to all major pumping stations. They also demanded immediate action regarding repeated cable faults, which they say are damaging critical pumping machinery and worsening the city's water crisis.—RT/Agency

FIA Karachi Nabs Bangladeshi National Living Illegally on Fake Pakistani Identity

KARACHI: The FIA Anti-Human Trafficking Circle Karachi has arrested a Bangladeshi national who was unlawfully residing in Pakistan using forged identification documents. According to FIA officials, the suspect had obtained a Pakistani national identity card through fake paperwork, enabling him to remain in the country illegally.

An FIA spokesperson confirmed that the fraudulently issued ID card has been blocked and a formal investigation has begun to determine how the suspect managed to secure official documentation. Authorities are also probing potential links to wider human-trafficking networks or facilitators involved in preparing the forged documents. The arrest marks another significant step in FIA's ongoing crackdown against illegal immigrants and document fraud, as the agency tightens efforts to curb identity-related crimes across Karachi.—RT/Agency

Rangers Capture Key Frontman of Lyari Gang in High-Stakes Extortion Case

KARACHI: Karachi Rangers have arrested a key operative of Samad Kathiyawari's extortion gang during a raid in New Karachi. According to a Rangers spokesperson, the suspect Ameer Hamza was found in possession of a mobile phone, which helped investigators trace his connections to the gang. During interrogation, Hamza revealed that since 2019, he had been linked to Lyari gang commander Abdul Samad through frontman Yousuf alias Mota. He admitted to providing phone numbers of various factory owners to Yousuf and Abdul



Samad. In July 2024, Hamza accompanied Yousuf to demand extortion from a builder, during which a local associate supplied a pistol. Yousuf remained in constant WhatsApp contact with Abdul Samad. Rangers confirmed the arrest of both Yousuf and Ameer Hamza; however, Hamza was released on bail after three months, and Yousuf returned to his native village Phulji, Dadu, staying there for a week. Operations continue to apprehend additional gang members involved in extortion.—RT/Agency

Motorcyclist Dies and Another Injured After Deadly Collision with Truck in Karachi

KARACHI: In Karachi's Malir Memon Goth, a tragic accident occurred when a truck collided with a motorcycle, resulting in the death of one rider and injuries to another. Police reached the scene promptly and seized the truck, while the driver fled the spot.



Authorities confirmed that the deceased has not yet been identified, whereas the injured motorcyclist has been named Wahid Bakhsh. The incident highlights ongoing road safety concerns in the city and the urgent need for stricter traffic enforcement.—RT/Agency

Murtaza Wahab Challenged to Deliver Results Before Launching Criticism

KARACHI: New Karachi Town Chairman Muhammad Yusuf has fiercely responded to Karachi Mayor Murtaza Wahab's press conference. 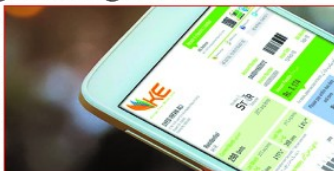

Continuous water seepage causes underground electricity cables to become submerged, leading to damage to the power infrastructure. The spokesperson noted that formal notifications regarding water leaks were sent to the relevant authorities on November 10, 2025, while a similar report was made in June 2025. Despite these warnings, no corrective measures have been taken, and the water leakage continues unabated.—RT/Agency

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BORDER CLOSURES CRUSH AFGHAN ECONOMY AS MONTHLY LOSSES SURGE TO 200 MILLION DOLLARS

KABUL: The Afghan Chamber of Commerce has warned that recurring Pakistan-Afghanistan border closures are inflicting massive economic damage, with losses estimated at \$200 million per month. Due to Afghanistan's heavy reliance on Pakistani trade routes, officials say the shutdowns are causing the country the greatest economic harm. According to Afghan media reports, prices of essential goods in Afghanistan have surged to alarming levels following the latest border restrictions. Economic experts caution that sharply rising food and fuel prices could make life even harder for Afghan citizens during the harsh winter months. They warn that if the border does not reopen soon, both humanitarian and economic losses will escalate. Data shows that Afghan transit trade witnessed a 78% annual decline in October, while the first four months of the current fiscal year recorded a 10% drop. From July to October 2025, transit trade totaled \$366.6 million, down from \$1.082 billion in September 2025. Over the past two fiscal years, Afghanistan's transit trade with Pakistan has fallen by \$6.7 billion, highlighting a deepening economic crisis.—Agency

FO Slams Indian Defence Minister's 'Revisionist, Delusional' Sindh Remarks

INDIA: The Foreign Office (FO) issued a strong condemnation on Sunday, denouncing Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's "delusional and dangerously revisionist remarks" about Sindh.

The FO's rebuke came after the Indian media quoted Singh as saying: "Today, the land of Sindh may not be a part of India, but civilisationally, Sindh will always be a part of India. And as far as land is concerned, borders can change. Who knows, tomorrow Sindh may return to India again."

According to Indian media outlets, Singh maintained that Sindh Hindus from his generation never



fully accepted the accession of the province to Pakistan.

The FO said in its response that such statements

revealed an "expansionist Hindutva mindset that seeks to challenge established realities and stands in clear vio-

lational peace and stability. It would be far more constructive for the Government of India to focus on ensuring the security of its own citizens, particularly vulnerable minority communities.

"It should hold accountable those who incite or perpetrate violence against them and address discrimination rooted in faith-based prejudice and historical distortions," the FO statement read.

It added that India would also "do well to address the persistent grievances of the peoples in its northeast, many of whom continue to face systematic marginalisation, identity-based persecution, and cycles of state-enabled

violence". "We call on India to take credible steps toward the genuine resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with UN Security Council resolutions and the aspirations of the Kashmiri people under occupation."

"Pakistan remains committed to [a] peaceful resolution of all disputes with India on the basis of justice, equity and established international legal norms. At the same time, as in the past, Pakistan is firmly resolved to safeguard its security, national independence and sovereignty," the FO statement said.—RT/Agency

Israel Claims Beirut Strike Killed Hezbollah Military Commander

ISRAEL: Israel claimed to have killed Hezbollah's top military official in an airstrike on a southern suburb of Beirut on Sunday, despite a US-brokered truce a year ago.

The strike, the first on the outskirts of the Lebanese capital in months, targeted Hezbollah's acting chief of staff, Ali Tabbatabai, the military claimed in a statement.

There was no immediate confirmation of his killing from Hezbollah, although senior Hezbollah official Mahmoud Qamati confirmed a central figure from the group had been targeted.

Speaking near the bombed-out building in the Haret Hreik suburb, he said Israel's strike crossed a "red line". Qamati said Hezbollah's leadership would decide on whether and how the group



would respond. Five dead in strike. The United States imposed sanctions on Tabbatabai in 2016, identifying him as a key Hezbollah leader and offering a reward of up to \$5 million for information on him.

The Israeli military statement claimed Tabbatabai "commanded most of Hezbollah's units and worked hard to restore them to readiness for war with Israel". Lebanon's health ministry

said the strike killed five people and wounded 28 more. It hit a multi-storey building, sending debris crashing into cars on the main road below. People rushed out of their apartment buildings out of fear of further bombardment, a Reuters reporter said. Following the strike, Lebanese President Joseph Aoun urged the international community to intervene to halt Israeli attacks.—RT/Agency

Government Denies Plans for 28th Constitutional Amendment

ISLAMABAD: Despite recent statements by some cabinet members, top government figures now insist that no proposal for a 28th Constitutional Amendment is currently under consideration.

Dr Tariq Fazal Chaudhry, Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, categorically denied reports suggesting that the government was working on the 28th amendment package. Speaking to The Media, both on his own behalf and on behalf of Law Minister Azam Niaz Tarar, he said: "There is no 28th Amendment under consideration."

A key official in the Prime Minister's Office also said that nothing related to a new constitutional amendment is being examined at the PMO. "There is no such proposal under review," the source said.

Dr Tariq clarified that no meeting has been held on the matter and termed the current discussion "a media-amplified issue." He explained that while some proposals, originally part of the 27th Amendment package but dropped due to lack of con-



sensus, might be revisited in the future, there is presently no move towards initiating a 28th Amendment.

"Right now, there is no consideration for a 28th Constitutional Amendment," he stressed, adding that he had confirmed this with the law minister. "Anyone asking about the 28th Amendment is being told the same. There is no such thing under consideration."

Speculation intensified after a few cabinet members talked about the 28th Amendment. Prime Minister's Adviser on Political and Public Affairs, Rana Sanaullah, was quoted a few days earlier saying that the government would "soon introduce the 28th Constitu-

tional Amendment."

In Chiniot, he reportedly told journalists that the proposed amendment would focus on local governments, the National Finance Commission (NFC), and health-related matters.

He added that consultations on these subjects were going on and that the government could move forward if a consensus were achieved.

State Minister for Law, Barrister Adeel Malik, was also cited in the media as having spoken about a possible 28th Amendment.

However, despite repeated attempts, during recent days, he neither attended mobile phone calls nor replied.—RT/Agency

Western Powers Seek Revisions to US Peace Plan Amid Ukraine's Review



UKRAINE: Ukrainian and US envoys will meet in Switzerland on Sunday along with European security chiefs to discuss Washington's plan for ending the war with Russia, officials said, after Kyiv pushed back on proposals seen as favourable to Moscow.

US President Donald Trump has given Ukraine until November 27 to approve the plan to end the nearly four-year conflict, but Kyiv is seeking changes to a draft that accepts some of Moscow's hardline demands. Trump's 28-point plan would require the invaded country to cede territory, cut its army, and pledge never to join NATO. He told reporters on Saturday it was not his final offer and he hoped to stop the fighting "one way or the other."

Ukraine's European allies, who were not included in drafting the

agreement, said the plan requires "additional work" as they scrambled at the G20 summit in South Africa to come up with a counteroffer to strengthen Kyiv's positions.

A US official told AFP that US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and diplomatic envoy Steve Witkoff were scheduled to arrive in Geneva on Sunday for the talks, and that US Army Secretary Daniel Driscoll had already arrived there after meeting with Zelensky in Kyiv.

"We will have an informal pre-meeting tonight for dinner" with Ukrainian delegates, the US official said on Saturday. Zelensky's decree said the negotiations would include "representatives of the Russian Federation", but there was no immediate confirmation from Russia whether it would join the talks.—RT/Agency

PTI Leader Salman Akram Raja's Election Tribunal Plea to Be Heard by 5-Member FCC Bench

ISLAMABAD: A larger bench of the newly established Federal Constitutional Court (FCC) is scheduled to take up on Tuesday a petition filed by PTI's Salman Akram Raja, who has sought the reversal of a court order on elections tribunals, which were formed to settle disputes of last year's general elections. According to a supplementary cause list on the FCC's website, Chief Justice Aminuddin Khan has constituted a five-member bench comprising Justices Aamer Farooq, Ali Baqar Najafi, Muhammad Karim Khan Agha, Rozi Khan Barrech and Arshad Hussain Shah to hear the petition that was originally filed in the Supreme Court (SC) on July 22, 2024.

However, the revision petition has now been fixed before the FCC, which was established under the 27th



Amendment, on November 24. In his petition, Raja requested the SC to revisit its earlier order suspending the Lahore High Court's (LHC) notification of constituting eight election tribunals in Punjab. He pleaded before the court that it should on July 4, 2024 had exposed the entire process of adjudication of election disputes in Punjab to the whims and arbitrary desires of the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP).

On July 4, a five-judge SC bench, headed by then-Chief Justice of Pakistan

Pakistan Shaheens Retain Asia Cup Rising Stars Title in Super Over Thriller vs Bangladesh 'A'



DOHA: Pakistan Shaheens defended a modest 125 to beat Bangladesh 'A' in a nerve-shredding Super Over thriller and successfully defend their Asia Cup Rising Stars title at the West End Park International Cricket Stadium in Doha on Sunday night.

In a final that swung wildly in the space of 40 minutes, Pakistan were bowled out for 125 after yet another top-order meltdown, only for their spinners to rip through Bangladesh 'A' and leave them reeling at 53 for 7.

A gritty 43-run eighth-wicket stand between Rakibul Hasan and SM Meherob threatened the unthinkable, before three huge sixes in the 19th over from Abdul Gaffar Saqlain took the game to a Super Over.

Ahmed Daniyal leant-bowled both batters in the first four balls of the Super Over to restrict Bangladesh to just six.

Ripon Mondol, Bangladesh's hero with the ball in the main game, started superbly with two yorkers but Saad Masood's flicked fourth off the third legitimate delivery sealed a famous victory for Pakistan.

Five IHC Judges Challenge Hearing of Judges' Transfer Case by FCC

ISLAMABAD: Five sitting judges of the Islamabad High Court (IHC) have filed a petition challenging the hearing of their intra-court appeal (ICA) scheduled before the newly formed Federal Constitutional Court (FCC) next week. Media reported on Sunday.

Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kiyani, Justice Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri, Justice Babar Sattar, Justice Sardar Ejaz Ishaq Khan and Justice Saman Riffat Imtiaz filed an application before the FCC, challenging its hearing of their ICAs. A six-member larger bench, headed by Chief Justice Aminuddin Khan, will hear the case, comprising Justice Syed Hassan Azhar Rizvi, Justice K K Agha, Justice Aamer Farooq, Justice Ali Baqar Najafi, Justice Rozi Khan Barrech and Justice Arshad Hussain Shah.



The five sitting IHC judges, while challenging the hearing of their ICA, contended that the titled appeal does not fall within Articles 175E or 175F, and consequently could not have been transferred to the FCC. They prayed the FCC that the ICA may be returned to the Supreme Court for determination.

"Without prejudice to aforesaid objections on the

constitutionality of the 27th Amendment, the titled appeal could not have been transferred to the Federal Constitutional Court under Articles 175E or 175F of the Constitution," the five judges submitted. They contended that the titled appeal was filed under Section 5 of the Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Act, 2023 (Act) before the Supreme Court.—RT/Agency

New York Mayor-Elect Mamdani Still Labels Trump a 'Fascist'

NEW YORK: New York's incoming leftist mayor Zohran Mamdani said on Sunday he still believes US President Donald Trump is a fascist, even after the two had a warm meeting at the White House.

"That's something that I've said in the past, I say it today," the mayor-elect said on NBC news.

The self-described Democratic Socialist on Friday met the Republican leader, setting aside months of mutual recriminations and promising to cooperate on the city's future.

Trump, who had previously suggested the conversation that I had with the president was that we were not shy about the places of disagreement about the politics that has brought us to this moment," he said.

Los Angeles Cargo Ship Fire Almost Contained After Shelter-in-Place Lifted

NEW YORK: A fire on a container ship docked at the Port of Los Angeles was nearly contained, though authorities were still assessing whether enough hazardous material burned to cause significant contamination.

The blaze, which broke out Friday night, prompted a shelter-in-place order for surrounding communities over concerns about hazardous materials in the One Henry Hudson's cargo.

The order was lifted in the morning, and the ship was moved out to sea. Fireboats sprayed water on the vessel to tame "a small section" that was still on fire. Los Angeles Fire Department spokesperson Adam



Van Gerpen said. The electrical fire apparently started below deck before spreading to several levels of the ship, leading to an explosion mid-deck, according to the fire department. The cause was under investigation. Roughly 100 cargo containers burned, and many of them carried dangerous materials, Van Gerpen said. Officials said some included lithium-ion batteries and other hazardous waste, though it was not clear if they caught fire. "We don't know specifically which ones burned," Van Gerpen said. A Coast Guard spokesperson did not immediately have more information on the hazardous materials and said the extent of potential contamination was not yet known.—RT/Agency
